chase of a new engine and generator. We have considered the several types of engine such as the steam turbine, the high-speed direct-connected engine, the Corliss belt engine and also the possibility of using compound engines. If the load were quite uniform and it were possible to run condensing we should consider the steam turbine, but neither of these conditions exist. The high-speed direct-connected engine is not economical in steam consumption. The direct-connected Corliss is too expensive. The compounding of any of these engines is scarcely justified. We have therefore decided to recommend the purchase of an engine and generator of the same type as the one you now have. This should be a 225 H. P. simple Corliss engine belted to a 180 K. V. A. Generator. This will require an addition to the present generator room, which addition should be made as shown on sketch No. 2.

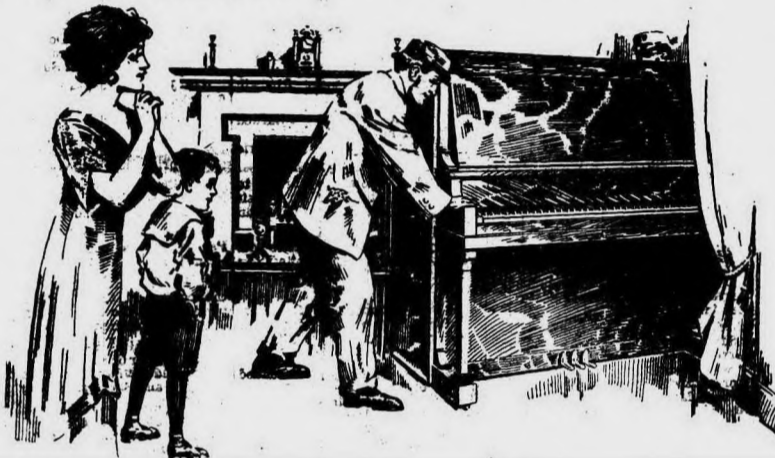

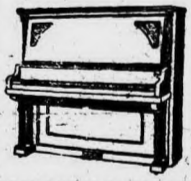

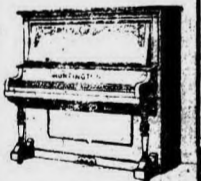
