Henry Ford has become so powerful in business circles of the world that anything ne says is aimost as important as what the President of the United States says. Therefore his comment about President Herbert Hoover's address last week in which the President oulined his policies, is of wide public interest. Mr. Ford said:

"President Hoover's speech of acceptance was a strong utterance. He gave evidence of a comprehensive grasp of attairs, and his work in the last four years shows that he has tackled his problems with courage and energy. From what I have heard from all parts of the Country I think that the people feel rightfully proud of their President, and that his speech has had a tremendous effect in building National confidence in our ability to weather this long depression and to emerge stronger for the experience.

"I was particularly interested in the evidence which President Hoover gave of his knowledge of the weak spots in our money system. No man without knowledge or without a determination to tackle this most crucial defect, could have spoken as he did.

CLIMATE OF SOUTHERN MICHIGAN






