CLEAN HANDS

CLEAN HANDS Probably one of the most disgraceful affairs in Michigan's political history is the recount flasco that for several weeks passed has filled the first pages of the newspapers. It is not so much the idea of having the recount but it is the way the whole mess has been handled, and the fact that rules of decency and even state laws have been smeared by the very men who ought to hold our public regulations and laws in the highest respect. We are making no defense of either the Republic-ands or Democratis, but it the Democratis had come into the affair with clean hands, if they had pur-sued the recount procedure with semblance of de-cence.

When one turns back the pages of Democratic legislative action on recounts to but two brief years ago, and notes what the Democratic did at that time, surely they have not the slightest reason in the world to object to any legitimate ef-forts to block what they have altempted to do themselves this time. Lawrence O'Neil a Democrat, two years ago was elected a member of the state legislature from the Lake Mecosta district by just one more vote than received by Walter Jackson, his Republican opponent.

He followed the procedure pres-cribed by law and compiled with every regulation necessary for a recount. The Democratic legislature, without a single dissenting vote, turned down Jackson's request. Therefore it does not put the members of the old legislature in a very favorable light when hey have sought by every trick under the sun to count out a Republican secretary of state who won by over 10.000 votes and an attorney general who won by something like 60.000 votes. especial-ly when they refused to let a Republican have a recount when his opponent had won by only one vote.
