Rain Doss Not Bring Worms

Worms appear on the surface of the ground after a heavy ratinstorm, not because they have been brought down by the rain but because they have come out of their former retreats to avoid being drowned. There are rare instances of small animals, toads, tishes, etc., having been lifted from the ground or from poole by high winds and deposited some distance away with rain. There is no foundation for the popular helief that worms, insects, toads, small fishes, etc., can be drawn up by the sun into the clouds, to be later rained down upon the earth.
