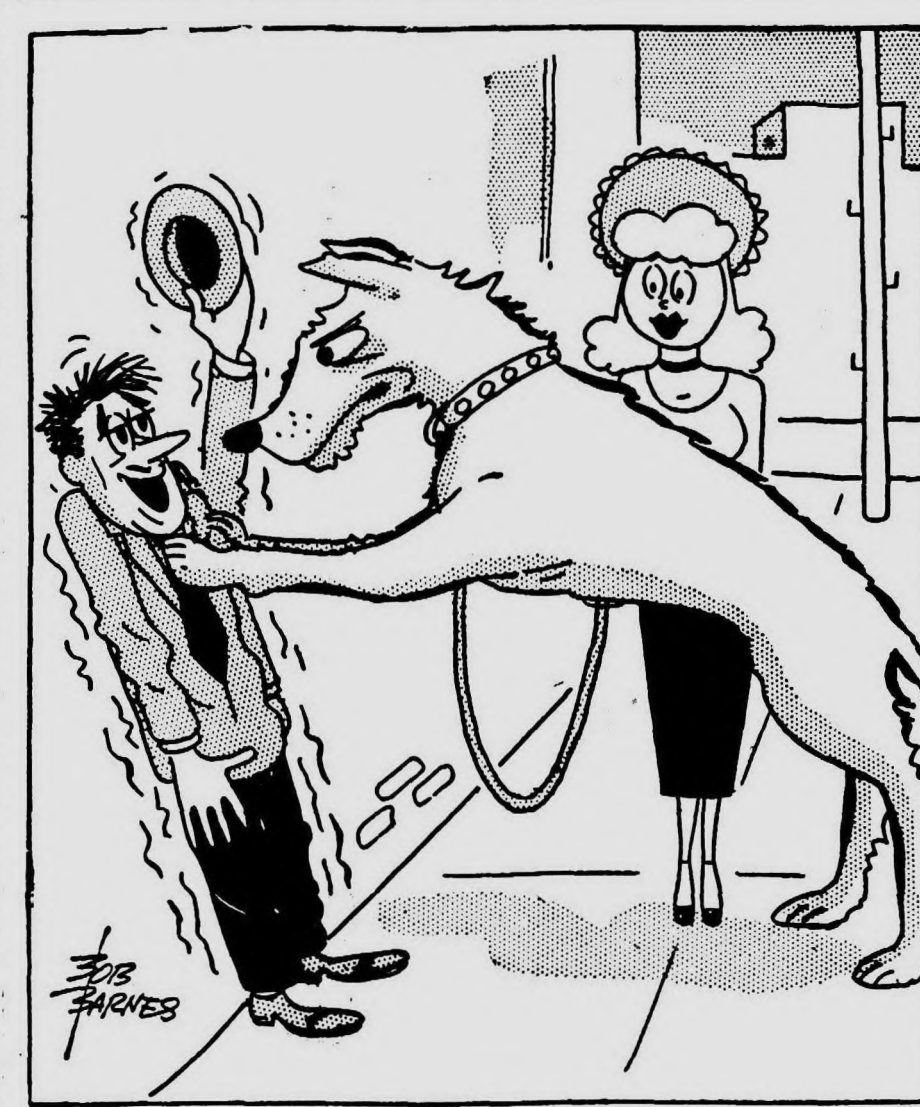

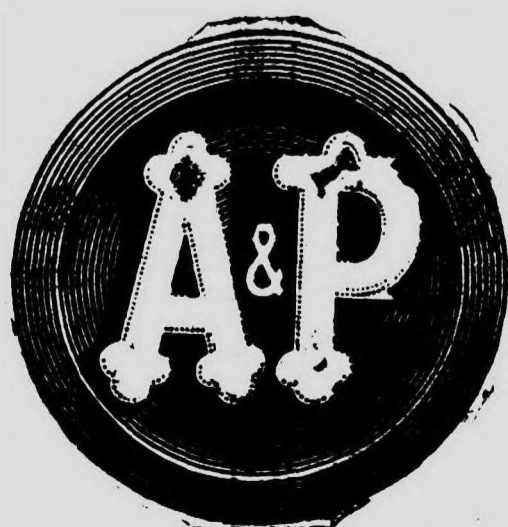

HERE'S SOME ADVICE from a man well qualified to give it: Dr. Robert Tyson of Hunter college, New York City. Dr. Tyson has dealt with problems that have taught him what he has taken years to learn, but which you, if you will heed him, can learn in a few minutes. In an article in Your Life Magazine, Dr. Tyson said, among other things, "Most people can develop and learn skills of leadership if they want."
Think of that. Most people can become leaders if they really want to. How? Well, Dr. Tyson gives you some fundamental techniques for becoming a leader. Here are some of them, not quoted in his exact words in every instance, due to lack of space, which if you put them into practice and watch your results will make of you a much happier and more successful person. I say this without hesitation.
1—Let people you deal with feel important. When it comes to those you work with, talk over your problems with them, ask for advice. If you can't use the advice, explain why; if you can use it, do so, and show your appreciation for the suggestion.
2—Earn loyalty by being loyal. Remember that a leader is a "substitute father."
3—Put in a good word for another whenever you can.
4—Don't scold or criticize harshly; instead guide. Do nothing and say nothing merely to show your importance. You won't seem very important to the other fellow if you do. Big men don't have to strive to be important, they just are. Watch yourself closely in this.
5—Set an encouraging example. Don't ask of others what you scorn to do yourself.
6—Don't expect perfection, but praise anything well done. The next effort will be an improvement.
7—Explain yourself. You may have a wonderful reason for wanting something done a certain way. If you make that plain, the worker can work with more intelligence, and with a greater desire to perfect his work.
8—Listen to the grievances of your associates, always with a view to encourage them.
