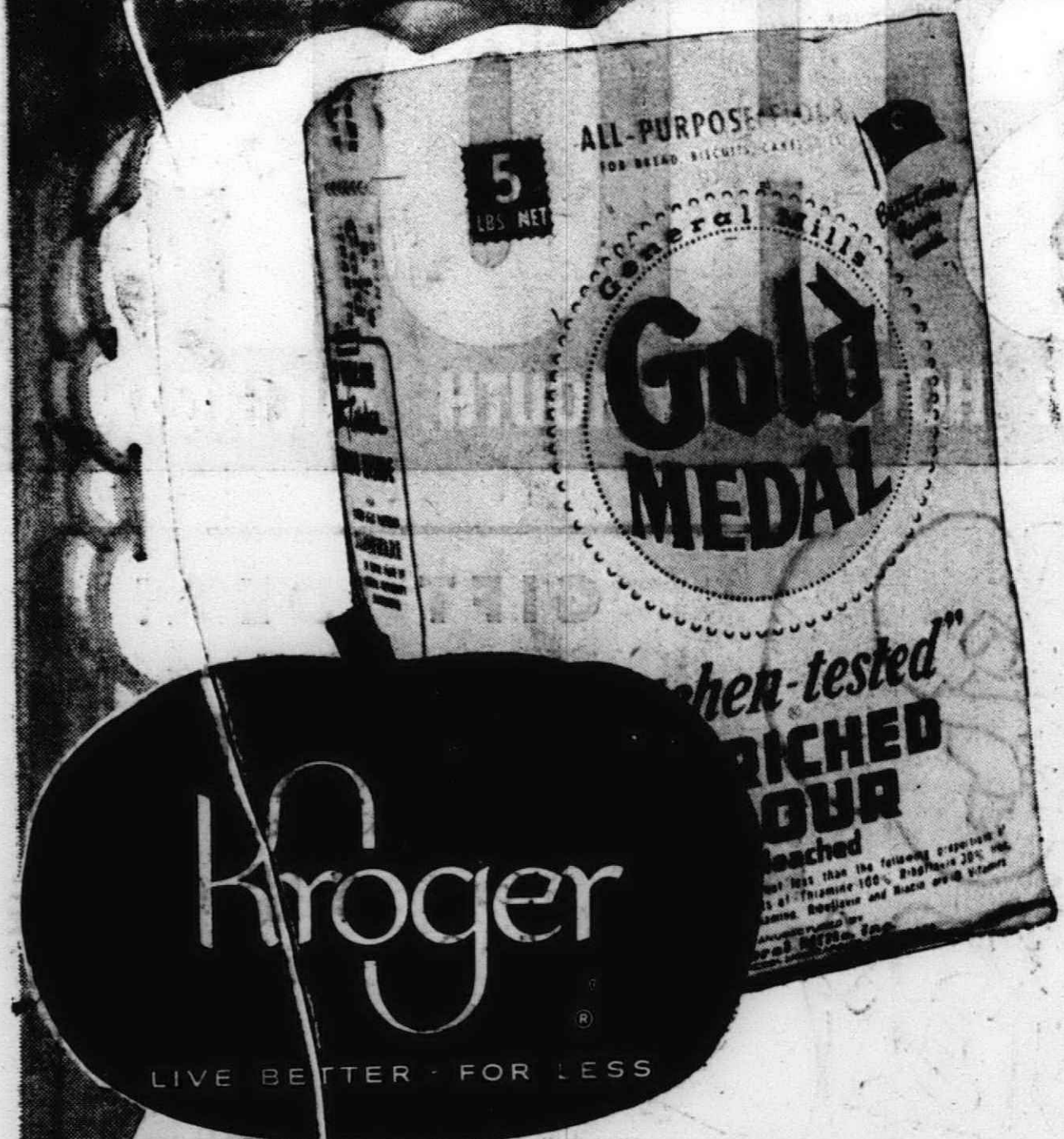

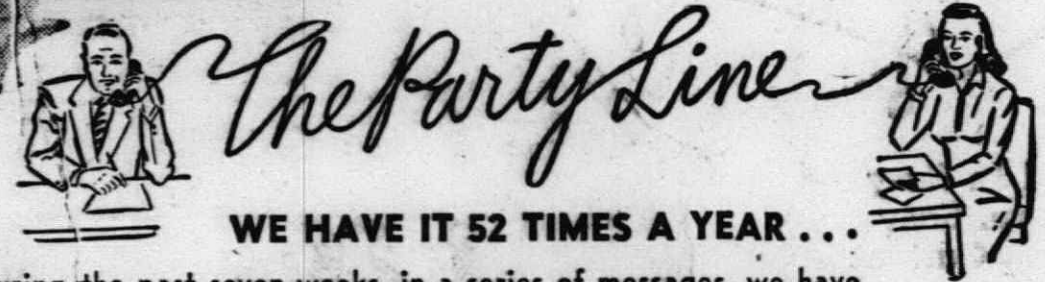

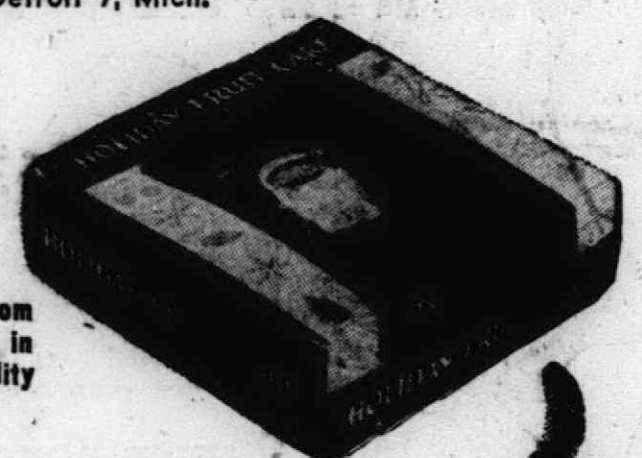

### Giant Willow Run Plant Has Open House Tuesday

On November 23, 1954 Detroit Transmission Division will open its doors to a public open house to be held between the hours of 1 and 9 p.m. Visitors will be provided with an opportunity to tour the huge Willow Run plant which covers an area of 4,332,000 square feet. The plant tour will include the following features:

An Engineering Exhibit Area which will include past and present models of Hydra-Matic transmissions, new 1955 General Motors cars and trucks equipped with Hydra-Matic transmissions, a military M-59 personnel carrier equipped with Hydra-Matic transmission, a cut-away model of the Hydra-Matic transmission. A general exhibit area which will include our Division's exhibit which will be used in General Motors Motorama for 1955. A factory exhibit which will explain processes used in the manufacture of each part of the Hydra-Matic transmission.

In addition, visitors will be shown many interesting machine operations including the huge transfer automation equipment on the Case Line, and an automatic screw machine and copying lathe will be demonstrated. Visitors will tour the modern Assembly Line and Test Room facilities. There will be an opportunity to visit the fire department hospital and the modern air conditioned plant cafeterias.

Movies illustrating the post-fire recovery activity and a movie featuring the manufacture of gears will be shown continuously during the open house.

An insignia commemorating the event will be distributed to visitors as will copies of the Hydra-Matic magazine; a booklet dealing with the principles of operation of the Hydra-Matic; and a brochure entitled "GM Builds Its 50 Millionth Car".

Visitors should enter the plant property from the north off M-17 which is part of the expressway system. Adequate parking will be available. We believe that many people in the general area of the plant will be interested in seeing the manner in which this large plant which was built for bomber production has been converted to the manufacture of Hydra-Matic transmissions.

As part of the GOLDEN CAR-nival celebration, the employees in the plant will be given an opportunity to see a movie which will contain a special message from Mr. Harlow H. Curtice, president of General Motors Corporation.

At approximately 10:45 a.m., on November 23, the 50 Millionth Car will be assembled. At this time GOLDEN CAR-nival Flags will be flown from the plant flagpoles, plant whistles will sound and appropriate announcements will be made over the plant public address system. Special invitations are being sent to all employees and their families, retired employees and their families, business leaders, service clubs, boards of commerce, schools and churches in the vicinity of the plant. In addition, ads will be run in all the papers in the area inviting the general public to this Open House.

## OUTDOOR NOTES

From The MICHIGAN DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION



About 350,000-400,000 firearm deer hunters went afield November 15, opening day of Michigan's 1954 general buck season.

Before the season ends on November 30 an expected 455,000 persons will purchase deer hunting licenses.

Conservation department field checks made during the spring, summer and fall indicate that the northern lower peninsula season will be as good as it was last fall when hunters took 41,000 bucks.

In the upper peninsula, some increase appears possible from last year's buck kill of 26,000. Observers report seeing more deer this year and apparently the herd is coming back somewhat from the heavy winter starvation loss of 1950-51.

During the December 1 special season, department workers expect hunters will take an additional 10,000-15,000 deer from northern lower peninsula woodlands. About two-thirds of the 70,000 special season permit-holders are expected afield during that hunt.

Wet fall weather may help muskrat trappers in Michigan during the coming seasons.

Trappers need generally high water on marshes for a successful season.

The season opened in the upper peninsula on November 1 and will open in the northern lower peninsula on November 15. Early reports show muskrat numbers down from last year in the western UP but about the same elsewhere in the north.

Pelt prices are expected to be low again and the total take will, as usual, depend heavily on weather conditions.

The season in the southern lower peninsula gets under way December 15. Generally, about 60-70 percent of the total state take comes from the southern region.

Though sea lampreys have nearly wiped out lake trout populations in Lake Michigan and

Huron, conservation department and U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service workers are continuing hatchery and research work with an eye toward the future of the fish.

There is hope that combined efforts of man and nature will control future lamprey deprecations.

If this occurs, conservationists want to be ready with additional research knowledge and "brood stock" fish for inland and Great Lakes plantings.

Specialists from the Fish and Wildlife Service are making a long-range study of the little-known fish.

At the conservation department's Marquette hatchery, a pilot brood stock experiment has been under way about six years. A number of the fish, raised from eggs hatched in 1948, have reached maturity and the important question of whether or not they will spawn in captivity is expected to be answered in the next few weeks.

Lake, or Mackinaw trout experiments are also being conducted from Higgins Lake. Conservationists want to know if wild fish netted from this lake can be used to provide spawn should the remaining stock of lake trout in Lake Superior disappear as it has in Lakes Huron and Michigan.

A pocket-sized illustrated folder, "Are We Shooting Too Many Deer?" has been published and made available for the general information of anyone interested in Michigan's deer situation.
