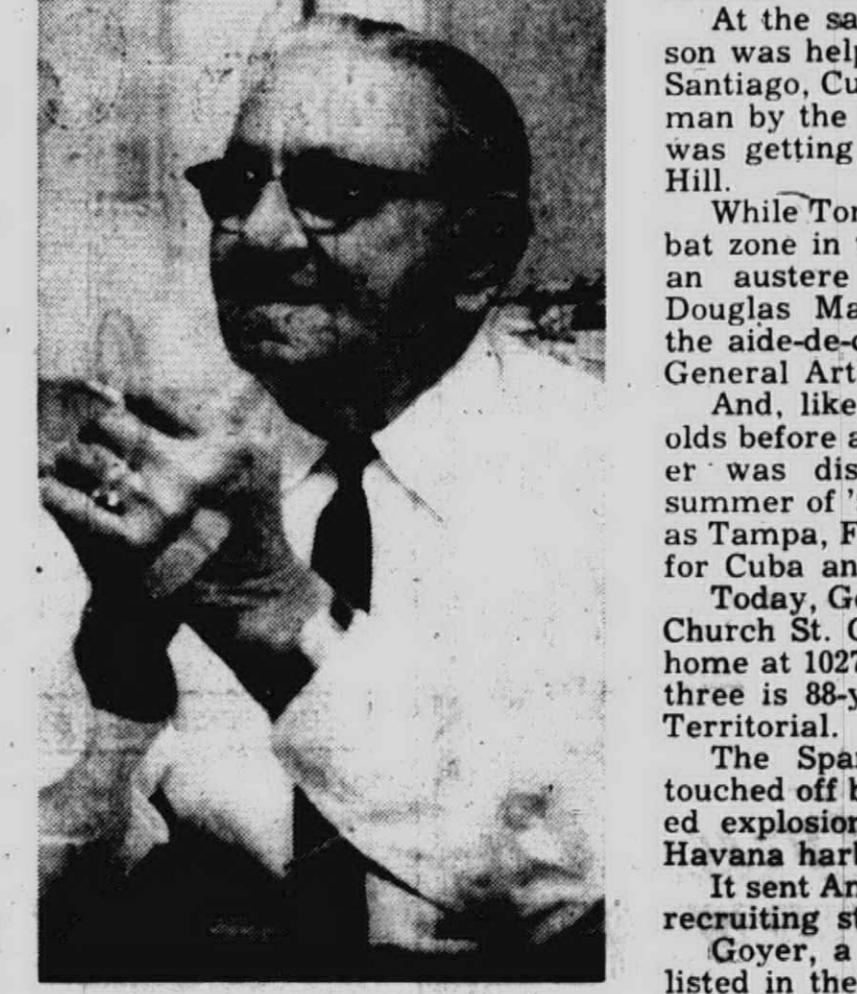

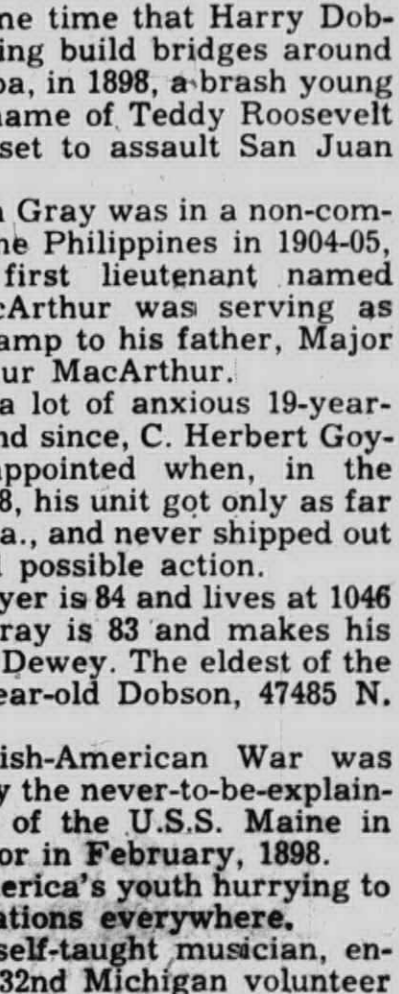

**Still Awaiting Okay on Federal Grant, Canton Sets Stage for Sewer Extension**

Hopeful of receiving a \$25,000 federal grant which would underwrite half the cost of the project, Canton Township officials have authorized engineer Edwin M. Orr to draw up plans for a three-mile sewer extension along the Rouge Valley.

Total cost of the project, as estimated by Township officials, will be close to \$500,000.

The actual extension will follow the route of the Rouge Valley, running parallel to Michigan Ave. from Hannan Rd. to Canton Center Rd.

Canton authorities, in recent weeks, have heard nothing as to the status of their request for the federal grant through the accelerated public works program.

The application was filed several months ago with the Chicago regional office of the Housing and Home Finance Agency, which handles requests from communities for accelerated public works funds.

Canton Supervisor Louis Stein was making plans to journey to Chicago sometime this month to learn more on the state of the request.

**College to Break Ground June 8**

Ground-breaking ceremonies for the new Schoolcraft College campus at Seven Mile and Haggerty Rds. will be held at 2 p.m. Saturday, June 8, it has been announced.

Work will begin on at least three buildings at that time. Target date for the college's actual opening is September, 1964.

A problem over financing the construction of a college library has arisen, but trustees this month are resolving the matter.

A one-mill tax levy passed in June, 1962, physically established the course of the college. The Schoolcraft College district is comprised of four local high school districts, Livonia, Garden City, South Redford and Plymouth.

Despite a delay in the ground-breaking, college authorities maintain that a tight time-table previously established is being followed.

The move of the college offices from the old Newburgh School, Newburgh Rd., to new headquarters at the Seven Mile and Haggerty Rd. site is expected to take place in July of next year.

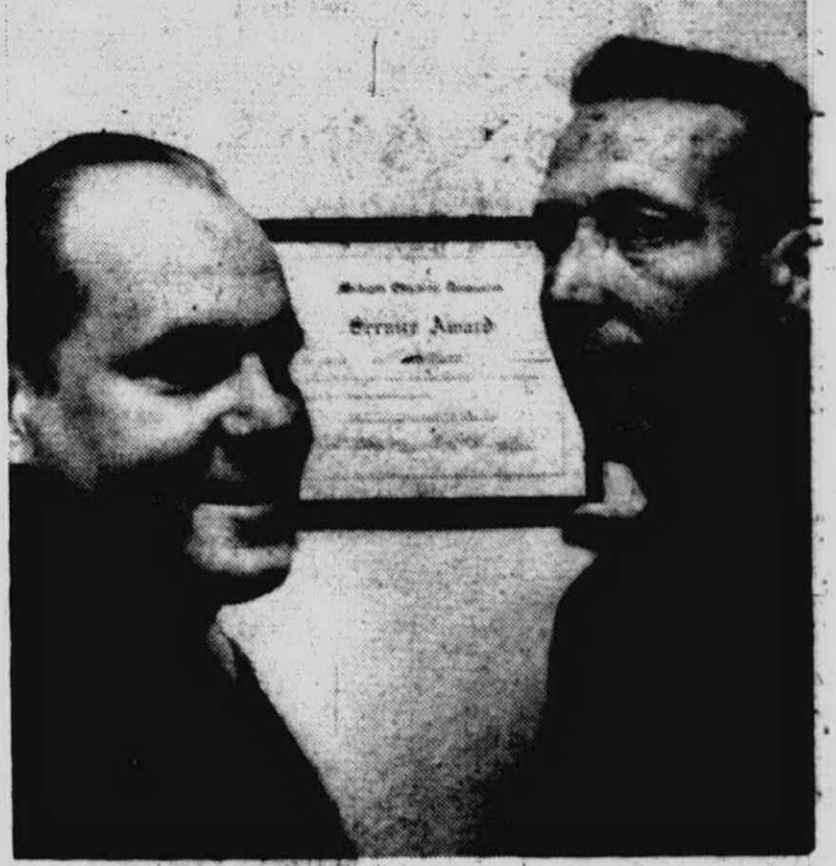

Micro-Tech assembles special electrical harness devices under government contract. The problem exists since the former Kroger building is zoned for commercial use, but Micro-Tech is an industrial operation, technically.  
If it were to sell its product retail on the premises, the problem would no longer exist.  
The issue arose last week as a result of a letter from Chamber of Commerce President John Herb.  
He stated that the zoning problem should not be permitted to continue beyond the

length of the one year temporary occupancy permit issued late last year.  
Herb was on hand for the committee meeting Monday night, as were Joe Bramble and Ed Galpin, owners of Micro-Tech, and Jay and Bill Rucker, owners of Stop & Shop Supermarket and the former Kroger building.  
The original temporary permit was allowed by the previous City Commission on the grounds that it — hopefully — would lead to Micro-Tech's permanent residence in other suitable quarters in the Plymouth area.  
"If the occupancy of the former Kroger building by Micro-Tech is a violation," said Herb, "we feel it would be unwise to continue the permit."  
Jay Rucker cited the contribution of Micro-Tech to the

tax base here and the fact that it presently employs 45 workers and has a sizeable weekly payroll. Galpin, one of the owners, said that his firm has grown from three employees to 45 in six months.  
Rucker mentioned that two years ago he and his brothers had turned down an opportunity to lease the building to a large discount store, feeling at the time it would not be a good addition to the business community.  
Also attending the meeting was Mayflower Hotel Manager Ralph Lorenz. He spoke up on the bad effect that arises over empty places of business here. "Empty stores are a detriment," he said.  
In last week's regular meeting, Commissioners also touched upon two other items of significance, but deferred action.  
One concerned the request for a private liquor license for the Knights of Columbus new clubhouse, 150 Fair St. Commissioners are studying the situation.  
The other concerned a bill for \$965 in "extra charges" arising out of a \$35,000 contract awarded the Gay Bros. Construction Co. for work in the City's industrial park on Plymouth Rd.  
This, too, is being studied.

a candidate this year, placed third behind Henry and Soth. Schultheiss polled 1,031 votes.  
Never before last spring had the turn-out here surpassed 3,000.  
In 1961, only 1,727 voters trekked to the polls to elect Robert Utter to office. Utter polled 641 and George Conover, another candidate this year, had 462.  
A request asking the formation of the Community College failed to attract a significant number of voters.  
The School Board race in 1961 was the one instance every four years when only a single term on the board is filled. Two of the seven seats expire each of the other three years, until the single vacancy occurs again.  
A total of 2,332 voted in the 1960 school election here when Gerald Fischer and Esther Hulsing were elected. Fischer had 1,721; Mrs. Hulsing, 1,441, and out of the running in third place was Clarence M. Wilson with 871 votes.  
Still, it was not that aspect of the election that was attributed to the relatively heavy voter response.  
Instead, voters were believed to be far more interested in the outcome of a five-million, five-year building and site sinking fund proposal. It passed by almost 500 votes.  
While no millage proposal will provide additional voter-appeal June 10, the prospects for a millage election here are becoming increasingly good these days.  
At the very latest, voters in the Plymouth School District may expect a millage election sometime next spring. It could possibly take place this fall.  
Meanwhile, candidates in the forthcoming School Board race must rely entirely upon themselves to encourage even the slightest suggestion of a heavy turn-out. No matter how much work is put toward the goal, a heavy response just isn't in the cards, it seems.

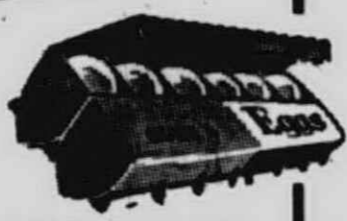
