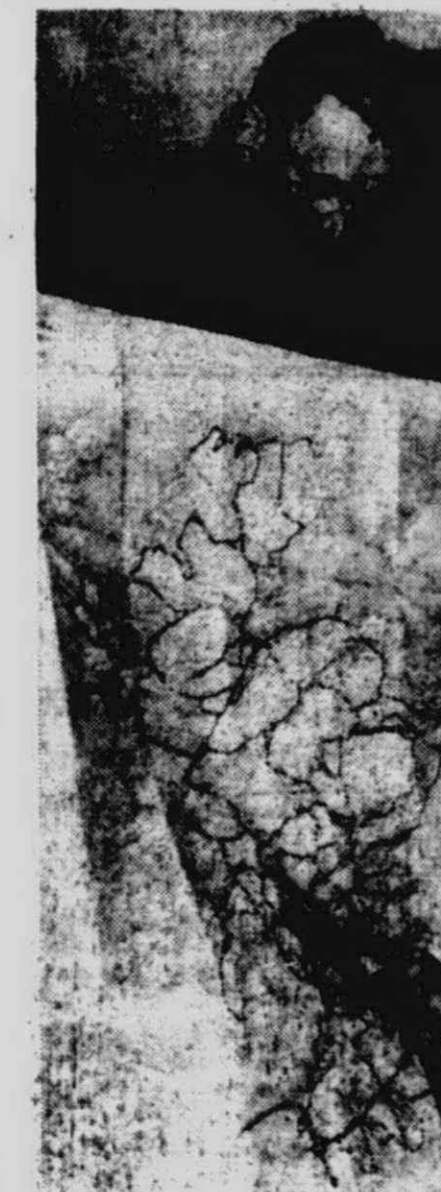
Norton, son of Mr. and Mrs. Trevor T. Norton, 47487 Joy Rd., plans to study at the University of Lausanne.

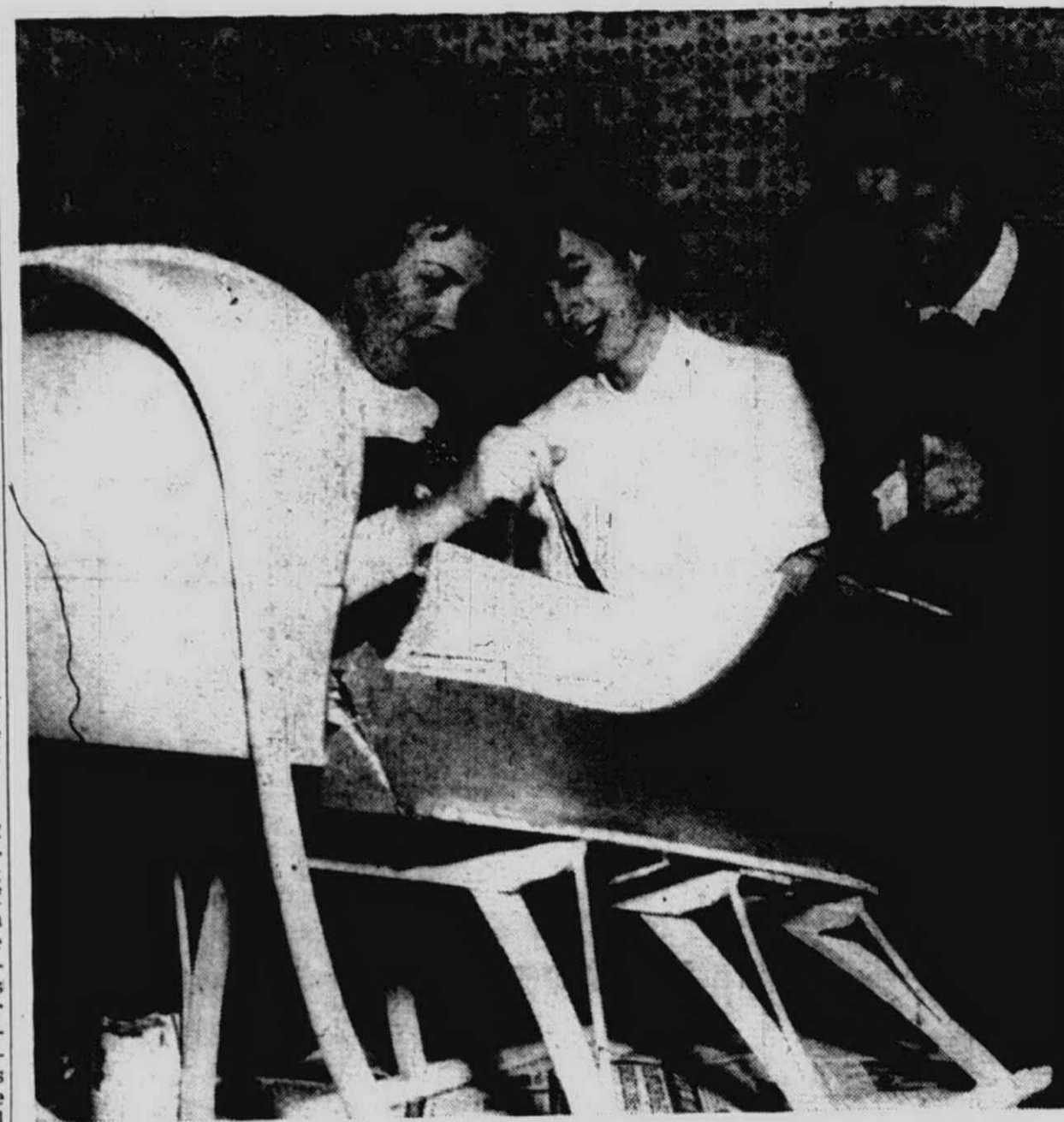

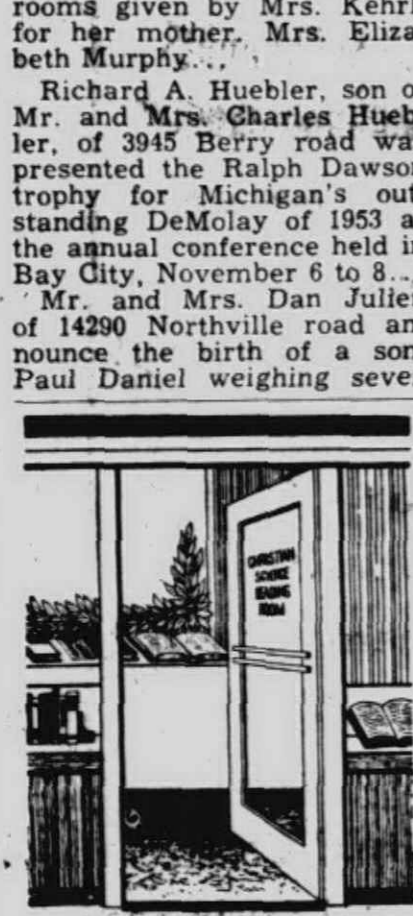
