

Water users won't see lower rates

Consumers in Plymouth and Canton townships and the city of Plymouth probably won't see lower water bills even though Detroit proposes to decrease wholesale water and sewer charges to those communities.

Canton residents may even face an increase despite the wholesale decreases, suggested finance director John Spencer.

That's because Canton absorbed a 70 percent increase in water charges from Detroit last summer without passing on costs to consumers.

Wholesale rates make up only part of total water and sewer charges.

All three municipalities tack on additional charges to maintain local systems.

Also, Wayne County, which manages connector sewer lines between Detroit and suburban communities, hasn't yet determined whether to change its rate.

"WE HAVE never maintained a direct relationship between wholesale prices and what our people pay for water," said Maurice Breen, Plymouth Township supervisor. "If there were, people would be paying a lot more for water today."

He foresees no change in overall

rates for consumers in Plymouth Township.

Detroit has proposed wholesale water rates of \$5.62 per 1,000 cubic feet to Plymouth Township, \$5.55 per 1,000 cubic feet to Canton, and \$4.46 per 1,000 cubic feet to the city of Plymouth.

Current rates are \$5.77, \$5.86 and \$4.52 respectively.

A new sewage rate for all three municipalities has been proposed at \$3.95 per 1,000 cubic feet compared to an existing \$4.26.

Those rates would take effect July 1 if approved during a two-step public hearing process.

One cubic foot equals about 7.5 gallons.

"MY GUESS would be, just off the cuff, is there would be no change," said Gordon Limburg, finance director for the city of Plymouth.

"In the case of water, it is not that much. To offset that, we've had labor increases.

"We have to maintain the system," Limburg said. "Changes in rates from Detroit, unless substantial, . . . won't be reflected in water bills, I would guess."

The Canton township board probably would have passed on an in-

Police explore shooting motive

A 13-year-old Canton Township girl was killed after apparently telling two juveniles charged in her death that she was pregnant.

Commander Carl Rinna of the Washtenaw County Sheriff's Department would not confirm the motive supplied by a reliable source and supported by other facts in the case.

"The final confrontation emanated from a relationship between all three people," Rinna said. "They were both acquaintances who she hung around with."

Mary Anne Hulbert's body was found Wednesday in a Washtenaw County field not far from her home

at Holiday Estates on Geddes Road. Dr. Donald Riker, Washtenaw County deputy medical examiner, said she was shot eight times with small-caliber bullets. There were no signs of rape.

Riker said the autopsy revealed "no evidence" the victim was pregnant, adding it would have been impossible to determine whether she had conceived a few weeks before her death.

Medical examiners determined Mary died sometime between Dec. 30 and New Year's Day and listed the date of death as Dec. 30.

Two 16-year-old Ypsilanti boys were detained on \$500,000 bond each

Local leaders predict 1987 events

A property tax cut this year for city of Plymouth residents?

Maybe, said City Manager Henry Graper.

An evaluation of fire and emergency medical services in Plymouth Township?

That's right, said Supervisor Maurice Breen.

Those and other nuggets were gleaned during interviews with the two about what they see in their respective communities in the year ahead.

"I anticipate we'll lower taxes," said Graper, emphasizing that the City Commission ultimately will make the decision.

A record year of development in 1986 — permits were pulled for an estimated \$13.8 million of construction — has boosted the city's taxbase and may prompt a small cut, he said.

THE CITY still has room for development, Graper said, especially offices downtown. "That's the biggest request we get from outsiders."

Graper said he doesn't know what to think about the status of the Wilcox condominium project. "Most serious developers would have started or backed out by now. I get a lot of phone calls asking, 'How can you

have a beautification committee in town and let that sit there?"

Lack of progress will eventually cause the city, said Graper, "to make a move as far as the health and welfare of the community is concerned."

The delay, a year now, has been attributed by principals to slowness of pre-construction sales and a painstaking desire to make sure all the paperwork is properly prepared

The city doesn't intend to abandon its summer Main Street Program to deal with young loiterers and trespassers, Graper said. Planning already is under way to deal with another cruise-in should one develop.

"I WAS surprised at the numbers we got last year and surprised at some of the attitudes — kids feeling they could be disruptive and defiant of law," Graper said.

"I don't think you'll see the num-

bers we saw last year. I think kids know the city of Plymouth will react and make it as comfortable for people who live here as possible."

The township, much larger than the city, faces some different concerns.

Because its property tax rate is comparably low and the township is still growing, a tax cut isn't likely, Breen said.

"We've never gone beyond 5 percent growth in the valuation of property in any one year and don't anticipate going more this year. We don't stand in the way of development but we're not proactive in that we go out and try to solicit it."

THE KEY now, Breen said, is to closely monitor services.

To that end, existing fire and emergency medical services will be evaluated. "Where are we? Do we need to expand it? Do we need to change the concept?" Breen said.

A survey will soon be mailed to every household in the township to

get a better handle on what residents know and want from local government.

"We hope they take the opportunity to look at it and give us an idea what's important to them."

A township census will be completed this spring.

Negotiations to enter a sewer authority in Ypsilanti rather than Detroit are progressing well, Breen said.

"Probably in the long run rates will have less an impact on the consumer than if you stay with Detroit."

Township officials will remain diligent monitoring goings-on at the Western Wayne Correction Facility (formerly DeHoCo) and resist efforts to locate more prisons here, Breen said.

Major changes in the structure of local government aren't expected.

"We haven't had anyone beating our doors down to become a city or merge with Plymouth," Breen said. "I wouldn't anticipate that."

Realtor wants OK to go door-to-door

Toni Ivankovics, a real estate agent, wants to go door-to-door in the city of Plymouth hunting for clients.

City Manager Henry Graper, who doesn't think much of that plan, has asked City Attorney Ron Lowe to determine if she can be stopped.

IVANKOVICS, a Plymouth resident, works for Century 21 Suburban in Northville.

She's been an agent a year and has the idea that personal, door-to-door prospecting would be more productive than "farming" by mail or over the telephone.

"I think it's effective," she said. "Ninety percent of my mail I rip up before I even open it. First class mail is 22 cents. Rather than the

post office doing it, I could get fresh air."

Research has demonstrated that people wouldn't be put off by a personal sales approach, Ivankovics maintained.

"I figured I'd do 20 homes a week. I haven't got that definite. Most people don't have real estate agents. If they're thinking of selling their house, someone comes to the door it may be a big relief."

GRAPER SAID he doesn't believe that Plymouth residents would be as

receptive as Ivankovics suspects

"I think it's a disturbance to the people," he said. "We would like to discourage it because we don't think it's in the best interest of our community."

Graper raised another objection. "I look upon real estate as being a profession — like picking a doctor." Graper added he hoped agents would look at personal prospecting as not the most professional approach to use marketing property.

Graper cited one more concern in

a brief written report to the City Commission. "I am personally against the idea because I feel if this is granted to one individual, then we may wind up with all of the Realtors in the area wanting to have this privilege."

Other agents do it now, Ivankovics said, but don't bother informing city officials about the activity. She declined to provide names.

"I thought I'd be above board in case someone got upset I was bothering them, so to speak," she said.

Lowe declined to comment on whether Ivankovics can be stopped until he researches the city's solicitation/peddler ordinance, charter and state law.

"I don't even have a gut reaction now," he said. "It's a wide open question. Basically, I'm going to look at what regulations we can enforce."

Ivankovics admitted she'd be disappointed if she's denied but doubts whether she'd fight an adverse decision.

Stay tuned.

Jury awards \$425,000 in SEMTA case

A Wayne County Circuit Court jury hearing a case in a Plymouth District Court has decided that SEMTA owes Detroit's Bus Transportation Credit Union \$425,000.

SEMTA, in making way for the downtown Detroit's People Mover, condemned and demolished the credit union's two-story, 12,000 square-foot building on Michigan Avenue east of Cass in 1983.

The credit union was dissatisfied with SEMTA's \$192,000 reimbursement offer.

The case was heard by 35th District Judge James Garber as part of a year-long program to help Wayne Circuit Court relieve its civil case backlog.

An unusual, all-female jury deliberated for less than an hour before pegging the worth of the 100-year-old structure.

The credit union, whose members are Greyhound and independent bus line employees, gave up a good thing when forced to move to Royal Oak. It occupied the second floor of the paid-for facility, and leased first-floor space to two bar/restaurants.

About 1,100 circuit court cases have been heard in 35th District Court since the trial reduction program began last winter, Garber said.

Garber expects his two-judge court will hear nearly 100 more before the program ends in March.

In all, local district courts donated 400 trial days in assisting the circuit court. District judges normally hear misdemeanors and civil cases involving less than \$10,000.

The female jury — only the third Garber has seen in his 28-year legal career — is fortunate it wasn't sequestered, the judge said.

"One of the quirks in our law is that when the state was first formed, a juror had to be male," Garber said, as jurors had to be registered voters.

An antiquated law holds that one-gender juries had to be sequestered, added Garber. "It's an archaic thing, and in this era, day and age, it wouldn't be upheld (on appeal)."

Garber, nonetheless, asked attorneys trying the case for a waiver. Their answer meant jurors were able to spend Monday night at home instead of the Red Roof Inn.

The Bus Transportation Credit Union last made news when it was hit with a sex discrimination suit. A female employee who'd worked for the credit union for 28 years was awarded \$1.08 million judgment in mid-December.

Hank Graper (left) and Pat Donnelly place a sculpture at Main and Penniman.


THE weatherman cooperated and provided a cold, snowy climate for the opening of last week's Plymouth Ice Sculpture Spectacular.

Manager foils bank robber

A man who attempted a bank robbery Wednesday in Plymouth Township fled empty-handed when the branch manager started scuffling with him, according to a report filed with Plymouth Township Police.

The attempted robbery occurred at about 9:20 a.m. at First Federal Savings Bank and Trust on Sheldon Road north of Ann Arbor Road.

The manager, whose knuckles were bloodied and who later complained of a sore leg, wasn't seriously injured, police reported.

None of the tellers was injured.

The robber was described as black, 6-foot-1, 175-190 pounds, with a slender build and close-cropped, kinky hair.

He was last seen driving north on Sheldon in a two-tone blue, late-model Buick with a temporary license plate in the rear window, police said.

Police were alerted by alarms sounded by tellers. The man entered the bank alone at a hurried pace, according to police accounts, vaulted the teller counter and immediately announced a robbery.

The manager, who at first thought the incident was a prank, police reports said, confronted the intruder and the two began fighting. The robber fled shortly thereafter.

No weapon was seen, police said.

The FBI is attempting to enhance a couple of poor-quality pictures taken of the man during the robbery try, police said.



Police seek shooting motive

following a detention hearing Thursday in Washtenaw County Juvenile Court. The youths are charged with open murder. One of the boys is being held in a Washtenaw County detention center and the other in a Genesee County detention center, Rinna said.

"Any homicide is a tragedy," Rinna said. "Some of the methodology was shocking but I can't talk about it because it would reveal the motive."

"From talking to the people we believe are involved you'd have to believe that it was premeditated. But I don't know if it was."

THE WASHTENAW County Prosecutor's office is "seriously looking into the possibility" of having the suspects tried as adults, said Elizabeth Pollard, first assistant prosecutor. The determination will be made by a juvenile court judge.

Mary's grandfather, Normar McGarry of Canton, was asked about the report that the girl had told the boys she was pregnant.

"She might have said something to impress him," McGarry said, "and didn't think he would shoot her."

"When you're a teenager and lie beside someone for an hour or two

you could think you're pregnant," the victim's mother, Deborah Hulbert, said.

When asked if the suspects thought she was pregnant, Hulbert had no comment.

MARY WAS outgoing and involved in a number of activities including roller-skating, gymnastics, dancing, singing and cheerleading. She also took piano lessons.

She was not involved in school activities, her mother said, "so her family could keep a better eye on her." She declined to elaborate.

A friend told Hulbert that Mary would pass out packs of gum at school.

"She would do anything to get people to like her," Hulbert said. "She would sleep with me a couple of nights a week to cuddle and love."

"She always wanted to please — that was her downfall," her grandfa-

ther said. "She was too naive."

Deborah Hulbert reported her daughter missing at 8:45 p.m. Dec. 30. She said she last saw her daughter after returning from a fast-food restaurant. Mary had told her mother she was hungry and insisted they get a carry-out. However the girl left the house without eating and without any of her belongings, she said.

"She didn't have a chance, no one gave her a chance. The police didn't help me at all."

Canton Police Chief John Santomauro disagreed. He said Mary's description was entered into a missing persons' computer listing and an investigation was initiated immediately.

"This is a terrible tragedy," Santomauro said. "Even if the police department had been able to determine a crime had been committed, from our information it very well

could have been after the fact because the victim could have been murdered two to three hours prior to the police report even being filed."

MARY'S FATHER, Joseph Hulbert of Farmington Hills, said the last time he saw his daughter was the Sunday before she was reported missing. They went to lunch and watched a video movie.

"She played piano, she roller-skated, she did everything," Joseph Hulbert said. "She was from a good family. It's terrible."

Survivors, besides her mother and father, include grandparents, Norman and Margie McGarry of Canton.

The Rev. Jerry Yarnell presided at funeral services at Schrader Funeral Home in Plymouth. Burial was Saturday at Cadillac Memorial Gardens.

Water users won't see lower charges

crease to consumers last summer had it received information about what Wayne County planned to do with its rate, Spencer said.

As it turned out, the county maintained its charge of 48 cents per thousand cubic feet.

Canton didn't want to do increase rates twice, Spencer said.

"We had looked at a 27 percent increase last July. With the reduction in rates, it's a potential 24 percent."

CONSUMERS in Plymouth Township now pay \$13.77 per thousand cubic feet, Canton \$18.56 and city of Plymouth \$22.47. Those figures include wholesale water and sewer charges and all add-ons.

Plymouth city and Canton include debt retirement in water

bills. Plymouth Township funds debt retirement with a separate tax.

Detroit bases its wholesale rate on a formula involving several factors including how much water communities buy, amount used at peak hours and distance and elevation water must be pumped.

"The only thing we do is deliver water to the city limits," said William Carney, financial manager of Detroit's Water and Sewer Department.

He used a pie metaphor — with the size of the pie being Detroit's expenses — to illustrate how costs can fluctuate annually for individual communities.

"The size of the pie can change and each slice can change as well," Carney said.






Legislators debate merits of 'official language'

Legislation introduced earlier this month by U.S. Rep. William Broomfield, R-Birmingham, making English the official language of the United States received only mild reaction from most Michigan officials.

But U.S. Rep. Sander Levin, D-Southfield, called the proposal "unnecessary and punitive."

"This country was built on creating unity out of diversity and I think this (the legislation) goes in the opposite direction," said Levin, whose district includes Redford Township.

As proposed, Joint House Resolution 13 would prohibit the United States, or any state, from requiring the use of a language other than English.

The bill can not be enacted into law unless approved as a Constitutional amendment and must receive a two-thirds vote in the both the House and Senate and then be passed by the electorate of each state.

"I have been very concerned that this country could be heading down the road to multilingualism if something isn't done soon," Broomfield said.

"IF YOU GO into some sections of our large cities," he continued, "English is not even spoken or seen. While this is not inherently bad, the problem lies with the fact that many people never have to know English because of our ballot, education and other service programs which require, in many instances, a multilingual format."

Levin disagrees. "The pressures to learn English to succeed are already in place and they have worked well in the past. The process will continue to work well in the future, a natural process that does not penalize people," Levin said.

FEDERAL LAW now requires that voting materials be provided in languages other than English when

non-English speaking populations meet federally established formulas based on density and illiteracy.

Bilingual educational programs are required when students speaking English as a second language demonstrate they are not up to grade level or are doing poorly in school because they do not properly understand.

Just three communities in Michigan qualify to receive non-English printed ballots under the federal Voting Rights Act, according to Bradley Wittman, an election specialist with the Michigan Elections Bureau.


Clyde Township and Fennville City in Allegan County and Grant Township in Newaygo County each has a population of at least five percent that "does not understand English well enough to adequately participate in the electoral process and whose illiteracy rate is higher than the national norm."

WITTMAN ALSO said other communities such as Lansing have large non-English speaking populations but do not meet federal density requirements. But he said state balloting materials printed by the Elections Bureau are supplied to these communities as well. "We try and bend over backwards to serve the voters."

Wittman estimated the total cost of ballot materials printed in Spanish for the 1986 Michigan elections was approximately \$5,000. "It has very little impact on Michigan."

Presently, an estimated 15,000 bilingual students in Michigan receive special instruction in state funded bilingual programs or in federally funded programs called English As A Second Language.

These students represent 24 different languages, including relative unknowns like Gujarati, Marathi and Tamil that are different Indian languages; Togoal, the national language of the Phillipines; and the native American language of Ojibwa.

Currently receiving special instruction 7,666 Spanish-speaking students; 2,137 speaking Arabic; and 863 speaking Caldean. More than 400 Albanian students receive special instruction, as do 156 Finnish youngsters.

Students in these programs have demonstrated they are not at grade level or are falling behind in school, a requirement that is necessary for school districts to qualify for federal assistance under Title 7.

DR. MIGUEL RUIZ, chief of the bilingual migrant program for Mich-

igan schools, said districts in Michigan received an estimated \$4 million in federal funds last year. The state contributed an equal sum to various districts.

Plymouth-Canton Community Schools, for example, received federal and state funds totaling more than \$121,000, providing instruction to 143 students who represent 15 different languages.

In contrast, Bloomfield Hills schools identified 79 potentially eligible students, those who speak English as a second language. But all are

up to grade level in academic performance and none received special instruction.

RUIZ SAID the purpose of bilingual education is to mainstream students who speak English as a second language into an English curriculum once they "understand well enough to comprehend what they are learning."

"Bilingual has become a political and emotional problem. We look to our neighbors in the north and see a country divided by language. We fear it happening here."

"I suspect the reason we're not impacted more severely in Michigan is because we are not threatened by large numbers of non-English speaking people, like in places like California, Texas and Florida."

THE ISSUE whether English should be an official language was addressed last November by voters in California who passed by a wide margin a referendum making it the official language of the state.

This point is one reason why Broomfield said he introduced his legislation. "English is spoken because of tradition. There is no law

making it the official language.

Levin said there is no need for one. "This proposal carries all kinds of ramifications."

U.S. Rep. William Ford, D-Taylor whose district includes Garden City, Westland, Canton Township and part of Livonia, tells constituents who inquire about his position on the issue that he is "opposed to anything that repeals bilingual education. It would be a disservice to the voters of Michigan."

FEDERAL FUNDS now help pay for bilingual educational programs. Ford fears repeal of the law would cost Michigan and Michigan taxpayers.

U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell, R-Plymouth, whose district includes the northern two-thirds of Livonia, said he believes every person entering the United States (for residency) should be required to speak English, but adds, "I recognize the need for a strong second language program in our educational system."

Broomfield's proposal is presently under consideration by the House Judiciary Committee.

Plymouth in 1916 — the car replacing horse

(Part 2)

Harry C. Robinson, owner of the livery stable on Penniman Avenue, was president of the Village of Plymouth in 1916 when the Plymouth Mall published its special Booster Edition.

That was the year the Frank Millard Musical Instrument Company began producing bugles, trumpets and trombones at a plant on Amelia Street not far from Main. The Millard firm went out of business about 1924 after its contract to supply the armed forces with bugles ran out.

ONE OF THE advertisements in the Mall's special edition was run by the Alter Motor Car Company which began production in Plymouth only two years earlier.

Located on Farmer Street, across from today's Cultural Center, the firm employed about 50 men. At its peak, the factory produced 25 cars per week.

Alter used a full page ad in the Mall to promote its 1916 model. The car had a 27-horsepower motor, a

12-gallon gas tank located under the cowl, and a wheelbase of 108 inches. The 1916 model "embraced all of the very latest improvements in automobile design" and had "the classy look and finish of higher-priced cars." A medium-priced automobile, the Alter sold for \$685.

President of the Alter firm was an out-of-towner, Guy Hamilton. Orders for the car were outstripping production at the time the special edition of the Mall was published but on Jan. 5, 1917, when efforts to obtain additional financing for plant expansion failed, the company's directors voted to dissolve the company.

In the three years the firm operated here it produced about 1,000 cars. One of the firm's cars, named after its designer, Clarence Alter of Manitowoc, Wis., is on display at the Plymouth Museum.

NO ONE KNOWS how many Alter cars were sold to residents but Plymouth residents were not limited in choice of automobiles in 1916.

Maxwell, Overland, Buick, Chevrolet, Case, Dort, Reo and Ford cars

were advertised in the Mall's special issue that year. Maxwell's were sold here by William Hirschlieb at the selling price of \$655.

Blunk Motor Sales had Overlands at \$695 and Willys-Knights at \$1,125. Shaw and McKinney had the New Case Forty at \$1,090. Rambo and Griffith wanted \$650 for their Dorts. Reo cars at \$1,250 and Reo trucks at \$1,650 were offered by Ira Wilson. Ford cars were available at Bill Beyer's Bonafide Garage on Main Street, opposite the Markham Air Rifle factory, but no price was given.

Maxwell cars were produced in the U.S. from 1904 to 1925. The Overland, forerunner of the Willys line, went out of production in 1909.

The Dort was manufactured from 1915 to 1924. Reo cars were sold from 1904 to 1936.

In spite of increasing encroachment by the automobile on the horse as a means of transportation, Plymouth still had a livery stable, two horseshoers and a harness maker in 1916. Harry Robinson's livery and sale stable was at 55 Penniman Avenue opposite today's post office. Robinson ran an omnibus to the local station, specialized in horse and stock sales, and was a general auctioneer known all over the State of Michigan.

ONE OF THE blacksmiths was J.S. Lorenz, located on E. Ann Arbor Street. Lorenz advertised himself as a practical horseshoer and general

blacksmith. He also did carriage and wagon repairing.

The other blacksmith was Henry J. Fisher whose shop was located at the north end of town on Starkweather Avenue. Fisher also dealt in agricultural implements. He began his business here in 1891, and had served on the village council.

The harness maker was George W. Richwine whose shop was on Penniman Avenue facing Kellogg Park. Richwine advertised that he had been making harnesses for 23 years. He also oiled and repaired harnesses and sold horse blankets. Recognizing the inevitable, he also had a stock of carriage and auto robes. Richwine was treasurer of the village in 1920, and again from 1925 to 1931. One of his customers in the harness business was Henry Ford.

The Booster Edition in 1916 also carried ads by a cigar maker, a candy store and a firm that made gravestones. The cigar maker was George W. Springer whose shop was on N. Mill Street. His advertisement promoted "Plymouth-made cigars" which went by the names of "The

Mail," "Our Senator," and "Springer's Best."

SPRINGER had been deputy sheriff of Plymouth Township in 1900, and village marshal in 1912. He was a one-man police force for a number of years.

The candy and ice cream store was Murray's, operated by H.W. Murray, who started in business here in 1908, occupied a large establishment facing both Penniman Avenue and Main Street. The store had a seating capacity of 100. Murray was said to be the originator of home-made candy in Plymouth. He advertised that he carried the town's largest line of postcards.

The gravestone marker was Asa Lyon, proprietor of the Plymouth Marble and Granite Works.

The Mall declared that some of the finest monuments in Riverside Cemetery had been erected by him. Lyon had his display of monuments and markers on Main Street not far from the Pere Marquette Railroad tracks.



Maturity affects a basketball team in subtle ways. Take Plymouth Salem for example. The Rock teams of the last two seasons displayed a tendency to play down to the level of their opponents.

Friday night, the 1987 Salem team played a 1-5 Farmington team. And rambled to a 63-37 victory.



Rout fails to dampen Borgess reunion

JOE GREGORY wore a hang-dog expression. His eyes were fixed on the ground, his voice barely audible. This was not the greatest moment in his young athletic career.

Lewis Scott, on the other hand, was all smiles. He was animated, restless, the adrenalin still shooting through his system. The only lull in his enthusiasm came when he talked about his friend, Joe Gregory. Deep down he sympathized with Gregory's pain.

This was the aftermath of a special reunion. It took place at Eastern Michigan University's Bowen Field House Wednesday night during the EMU-Bowling Green basketball game. It was, regardless of the outcome, a proud moment for followers of Redford Bishop Borgess and Oberverland sports.

Gregory and Scott, two of the most exceptional basketball players

people in sports

produced by Bishop Borgess, matched up against each other Scott, the point guard for EMU, against Gregory, the point guard for Bowling Green. For the first time in a college game, Gregory and Scott matched up man on man.

THE OUTCOME, from Gregory's perspective, was disastrous. EMU humiliated Bowling Green 95-52.

"This hurts," Gregory said after the game. "This hurts real bad."

Said Scott: "Playing against one of my high school teammates, I was definitely pumped up. And you know there was no way I wanted to lose this one. I talked to Joe after. I know he was down. I just told him not to stay down. He has really improved his game. He shoots the ball well and

passes it real well."

Actually, the individual battle between Gregory and Scott — though difficult to measure because of the team's differing offensive philosophies — was pretty even.

Scott, slowed some by a flu virus, played 23 minutes. He made two of three shots for four points, grabbed two rebounds and dished out two assists. He also made a steal (off Gregory). In fact, Scott's and EMU's hounding man-to-man defense was the difference in the game. The badgered Falcons hit on just 19 of 60 shots from the floor.

Gregory played 26 minutes. He hit two of four shots and one of two free throws for five points. He had a rebound, four assists and two steals (one off Scott).

It should be pointed out that Scott is 6-5 and Gregory 5-9. But where Scott had the advantage of height and reach, Gregory had an edge in quickness. It made for an intriguing individual battle, a welcomed one considering the one-sidedness of the game.

For Scott and Gregory, Wednesday was merely a continuation of the friendly individual battle the two began some five years ago at Borgess.

Gregory was a sophomore in 1983 when Scott, a senior, was establishing most of the Bishop Borgess scoring records. Two years later, Gregory had eclipsed all of Scott's records.

The two players still get together over the summer and play pickup games at Borgess.

THE TWO have taken different paths through college.

Scott has emerged as one of EMU's most versatile athletes and one of the team's premier defensive players.

After seeing limited action as a freshman, Scott was asked to play small forward as a sophomore. He responded by averaging 8.8 points and 4.5 rebounds per game.

As a junior Scott was asked to play shooting guard. He averaged nearly 12 points a game and shot nearly 50 percent from the floor.

This year, Scott was asked to play point guard and again he has responded to the challenge. Prior to Wednesday night, he has averaged 13 points and three rebounds per game. In 11 games he has 36 assists and 22 turnovers.

When asked if EMU was a better team with him at point guard, Scott said, "I'd like to say so. I'd be in trouble if I didn't. I think I've been able to provide some leadership at the point."

"I'd say the toughest part of it is defense. In the MAC (Mid-American Conference) a lot of the guards are smaller. When we played against Notre Dame and Cleveland State the point guards were my size. Some of the guys are quicker, but I have decent quickness and my long arms really help."

From all accounts, Lewis Scott is completely content with his basketball life at EMU.

THAT HASN'T been the case for Gregory at Bowling Green. Last year was somewhat of a nightmare. He and coach John Weinert didn't exactly hit it off, and Gregory spent a lot of time on the bench.

Things are different now. New coach Jim Larranaga has won Gregory's confidence and trust.

"The coaching is great and we have a good team," Gregory said. "This was just one of those nights for us. We are a lot better than this. I'm just happy to be playing for a coach like Jim Larranaga."

Gregory's game is far different now than it was back at Borgess. Gregory rarely shoots, although he has hit seven of 15 shots from three-point range this season. He seldom drives the lane, something he did brilliantly in high school. His job with Bowling Green is to get the ball into the hands of the designated shooters.


"I'm not unhappy with my role. I do whatever I'm asked to do and

whatever it takes to help us win," Gregory said. "I wasn't really a scorer at Borgess. I was just asked to do it, so I did it. We've got guys on this team that can score, and I'm more than happy to get them the ball. If a shot is there for me, I'll take it."

Gregory was understandably upset with the way the game turned out Wednesday. But he was still able to find a silver lining.

"You know the only thing good about this is we get to play them again in our gym (Feb. 4). Hopefully, it'll be a different story," he said.

If not, it could be somewhat disconcerting for Gregory this summer when he shows up at Borgess for open gym.



- 1 pouch Onion Soup and Recipe Mix
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 1 package active dry yeast
- 3/4 cup very warm water (120° to 130°F.)
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 pound Italian sausage, casing removed
- 2 large cloves garlic, minced
- 1 can (11 ounces) Condensed Zesty Tomato Soup/Sauce
- 1 teaspoon wine vinegar
- 2 cups thinly sliced green, red and yellow peppers
- 2 cups shredded mozzarella cheese (8 ounces)

1. In medium bowl, combine soup mix, 1 cup of the flour, sugar and yeast; mix well. With mixer at low speed, gradually pour warm water and oil into dry ingredients; beat until just mixed. At medium speed, beat 4 minutes, scraping bowl often.

Tex-Mex

South-of-the-border cuisine is savory, sure to please palates

San Antonio is the home of a singular style of Tex-Mex food, unique not only in the country, but within the state, as well.

Each section of Texas has been influenced differently and each has developed its own brand of Texas cuisine. The northern part of the state, including the Dallas/Ft. Worth area, has its Mexican food, but it has a more cowboy, pioneer influence, being the section farthest from Mexico.

In the east, the Houston area, there is a hint of Cajun/Creole influence and a definite "deep South" feeling to the Mexican food. In El Paso and the desert-mountain region of the state, the Indian influence is strong, giving this area's Tex-Mex food a character all its own.

South Texas, and primarily San Antonio, is the "Gateway to Mexico," where the most authentic Mexican-influenced Tex-Mex food is found.

Tex-Mex Stew is a culinary example of the cultural melding that defines San Antonio cuisine. A chili-like dish, the stew contains the tomatoes and corn enjoyed by the area's original Mexican settlers, ground beef, which was introduced to Texas by Spanish conquistadores, pinto beans, a staple in the Mexican diet, and cumin, Mexico's favorite spice.

In true San Antonio style, the cook's choice of mild, medium or hot picante sauce replaces tricky-to-handle jalapeno peppers, streamlining preparation, providing garden-fresh flavor and adding just the right amount of tongue-tingling "heat." A sprinkling of fresh cilantro, the Southwest's favorite herb, adds its own distinctive flavor.

Crowd-pleasing Fideo, San Antonio Style, is a typical Mexican "dry soup," served as a side dish in place of rice or potatoes. The savory dish is "dry" only in the sense that almost all liquid is absorbed by the fideo or vermicelli as it cooks. Cilantro enhances the flavor of the dish, which is typically served at San Antonio barbecues in place of potato salad.

Brown meat with garlic in oil in Dutch oven, drain. Drain and coarsely chop tomatoes, reserving juice. Add tomatoes, juice, picante sauce, salt, pepper and cumin to meat mixture. Bring to a boil, reduce heat. Cover and simmer 20-30 minutes. Add corn, beans and onions; continue cooking, uncovered, 10 minutes. Top with cilantro, if desired, and serve with additional picante sauce. Makes 6-8 servings.

FIDEU, SAN ANTONIO STYLE

- 10 oz. vermicelli (fideo), broken into pieces
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 2 large garlic cloves, minced
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- 1 can (16 oz.) whole tomatoes
- 1 1/4 cups water
- 1/2 cup picante sauce
- Salt to taste
- 1 tsp. sugar
- 1/4 cup minced cilantro or parsley

Cook vermicelli, onion and garlic in oil in large skillet over medium heat until vermicelli is lightly browned. Stir in remaining ingredients except cilantro. Simmer, stirring occasionally and breaking up tomatoes, until vermicelli is tender and most of liquid is absorbed, about 6-8 minutes. Add cilantro; mix well. Serve with additional picante sauce. Makes 8 servings.

TEX-MEX STEW

- 2 lbs. ground beef
- 2 large garlic cloves, minced
- 3 tbsp. vegetable oil
- 1 can (28 oz.) whole tomatoes
- 1 cup picante sauce
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 1 tsp. ground cumin
- 1 can (17 oz.) whole kernel corn, drained
- 1 can (15 1/2 oz.) pinto beans, drained
- 8 green onions with tops, sliced (about 1 1/2 cups)
- Chopped fresh cilantro (optional)

Sensible nutrition in the fast lane

Bigger is not better, skip the giant hamburger laden with cheese, sauce and bacon. Choose a small burger with no sauce and ask for extra lettuce and tomato. Ask for the nutritional information at your local fast food restaurants.

Time consuming cooking has passed its prime. Light, fresh, simple meals are "in." Frozen entrees are gaining in popularity; add a salad, a glass of milk and a piece of fruit for dessert for a fast meal at home. Don't forget to read the nutritional information printed on the box.

Remember, whether it be fast foods or foods made at home, the key is moderation and variety for good health.

The play is performed on a bare stage without any scenery. The lack of a set can make performing the play a bigger challenge, Weibel said.


"In this one, there's nothing up there. The characters are more important."

From stage to screen, 3 appealing new films

Three entertaining, well-done movies adapted from stage presentations currently are playing around the metro area: "Little Shop of Horrors," "Crimes of the Heart" and "Brighton Beach Memoirs." (all PG-13).

Inevitably one hears departing viewers bemoaning how badly Hollywood mangles Broadway properties. "Crimes of the Heart" seems the focus of this complaint, in particular led by the New York Times and Time magazine. "Why can't they make a film as good as the stage show?" "Why does Hollywood always ruin books and plays?"

The questions that ought to be asked are, "Why do we expect so much of Hollywood?" and, "When will we realize that a film is a film and a book is a book and a play is a play and even two-out-of-three don't match?"

Each of those media have their own unique characteristics, their particular forms and techniques for creating images and stimulating the human imagination. When we read, our mind forms mental pictures generated by what those words represent. Just look them up in the dictionary and find out what most people agree those words mean.

The resulting images will be good, bad or mediocre, depending upon how well the author has arranged his words.

A THEATRICAL presentation is something else again, no matter whether it's an original script or adapted from a novel. When we go to the theater, we experience a live presentation, real people, really doing things before our eyes, and with very few tricks.

A motion picture is a third kind of experience, a remarkable and very effective series of mental illusions

created by a complicated and interesting technology.

All three of these media have their own strengths and weaknesses. They stimulate our minds in different ways, so it's a pretty shaky proposition to expect all three to tell the same story in the same way with the same impact.

That's the end of the sermon, the point of which is, take each experience for what it is and accept the fact that plays are adapted for the screen and not translated directly.


"Little Shop of Horrors" complicates the matter since the current film was adapted from the Broadway show which, in turn, was based on Roger Corman's 1960 "Grade Z" movie shot in two days and a night in a storefront set left over from another movie.

Corman's effort, which featured a then-relative newcomer, Jack Nicholson, as a masochistic dental patient, has become something of a cult classic and spawned the award-winning Broadway musical which has now been adapted for the screen.

THE HORROR in the "Little Shop" is a blood-eating plant from outer space (Audrey II) brought to Mushnik's Flower Shop by a schlep-py employee, Seymour (Rick Moranis). Business is bad and Mushnik (Vincent Gardenia) is about to fire Seymour and his one other employee, Audrey (Ellen Greene), a dizzy blonde with a masochistic biker-dentist boyfriend, Dr. Scrivello (Steve Martin). The plant changes all that!

Sounds like fun? Right you are, no matter how much you may have loved the Broadway show.

The same is true for "Crimes of the Heart" based on Beth Henley's Pulitzer Prize winning play. The film features Diane Keaton, Jessica

Lange and Sissy Spacek in an unconventional comedy about the three McGrath sisters and their reunion.

"Brighton Beach Memoirs" was adapted for the screen by Neil Simon from his 1983 prize-winning (two Tonys among others) Broadway success.

The film was shot on location in New York's Brighton Beach near Coney Island in Brooklyn. Various buildings there and in Queens were

restored to create the film's 1937 atmosphere in this semi-autobiographical memoir of Neil Simon's adolescence.

The Jerome family struggles to make ends meet as (Blythe Danner), and sons, Stanley (Brian Drillinger) and Eugene (Jonathan Silverman). There's also his widowed sister-in-law Blanche (Judith Ivey) and her two daughters, Nora (Lisa Waltz) and Laurie (Stacey Glick).

All of them struggle with life, love and the problems of growing up as the Depression winds down and World War II winds up.

PERFORMANCES ARE uniformly excellent, and among the supporting roles, Steven Hills is particularly effective as Mr. Stroheim, a pressured Prussian reduced to running a hat business in bad times. But in every role, major and minor, the actors realistically portray the pride and problems of family life.

The film is well-photographed (John Bailey — "The Big Chill" and "Ordinary People"), in soft, warm images befitting a nostalgic reminiscence, and directed with a deft touch

by Gene Saks ("Barefoot in the Park," "The Odd Couple" and "Mame," among others).

Of course, the main attraction of "Brighton Beach Memoirs" is Simon's writing. His superb grip on the essentials of comedy, his fond recollections and his writing skill provide a marvelous, witty film experience.

When you are growing up did you snatch cookies from the kitchen, hide your liver under your mashed potatoes and wonder why boys and girls were different? Whether or not you saw the Broadway version, you'll love Neil Simon's answers, on the silver screen.

Motown wasn't the only soul sound back in the '60s

Is there anybody here who doesn't love Motown?

I don't mean our gritty city. I mean the record company and the music — the Supremes, Four Tops, Marvin Gaye, the Temptations and more.

Songs like "Where Did Our Love Go?" "Bernadette," "I Heard it Through the Grapevine" and "Can't Get Next to You."

Maybe it's because of the film "The Big Chill," which featured all those over-30 folks yuppies around a kitchen while Motown records blared. Or maybe it's because most of us grew up just outside the Motor City. But when the subject of soul music comes up, we tend to talk Motown, Motown and only Motown.

Thanks largely to the Blues Brothers, there's been a revival of interest in that other major soul record company of the '60s, Atlantic.

Headquartered in Memphis, Atlantic's stars included Otis Redding, Sam and Dave, Aretha Franklin (who lives in Bloomfield Hills) and Wilson Pickett. Songs like "Sittin' on the Dock of the Bay," "Soul Man," "Respect" and "Mustang Sally."

In contrast to the Motown sound, Atlantic soul had more guitars and less orchestra backing, more emphasis on solo singers than groups and



riffing horns rather than Motown's bell-like vibrate accents.

THE ATLANTIC sound was less dense and a bit wilder. Smokey Robinson cooed his "Oooh, Baby, Baby," while the Wicked Pickett shrieked, "Get it! Get it! Get it! — OWWW!"

The Blues Brothers understood the fun side of Atlantic soul. They borrowed the rollicking horn intro from Redding's "I Can't Turn You Loose" for their own stage entrance theme. Now, college marching bands even play it at football games.

Earlier this year, Atlantic released seven two-record sets of its best soul and rhythm and blues from the '40s through the '70s. For those not initiated in the joys of the Atlan-

tic soul sound, Volume Six — it covers the mid-to-late '60s — stacks up to most any Motown collection.

Side one opens with Pickett's "Land of 1,000 Dances," featuring those trademark Atlantic horns, Pickett's playful vocals and that catchy "Na-na-na-na" chorus.

Then there's "Sweet Soul Music" ("Do you like good music? — Yea, yea"). Like several songs in the collection, it's one you may have passed

over back in the '60s in deference to the latest Beatles record. Rediscovering it is a joy.

And what about Redding singing his "Sittin' on the Dock of the Bay" — an elegant melody underscored by gentle guitar runs?

Booker T and the MGs knew the value of restraint, of making each note count. Eddie Van Halen could learn a lot from MGs guitarist Steve Cropper.

Aretha Franklin is represented

with "Chain of Fools," and "Respect," revived of late by that loony on TV's "Moonlighting" lip-synching to this Aretha classic. Side three also includes her "You Make Me Feel Like a Natural Woman."

My favorite in this volume is the

Bar-Kays "Soulfinger." This exuberant, wacky instrumental number also was included in the soundtrack to the recent film "Spies Like Us."

It's just one more example of the staying power of this soul music from Memphis.




