### Wade-Trim expands

Wade-Trim Group Inc. of Plymouth is expanding operations to Taylor and Bay County.

State Sen. Bob Geake, R-Northville, recently announced the expansion, made possible by a \$4.67 million tax-exempt bond approved by the Michigan Renaissance Fund, a division of the Michigan Jobs Commission.

The Taylor project includes the acquisition of land and building a 24,000 square-foot professional office building. A 16,000-square foot office facility will be built in Bay County's Monitor Township.

"The expansions are expected to create 50 new jobs over the next five years," Geake said.

### Pay raise for attorney

Pay for Plymouth Township's attorney firm, Hemming, Polaczyk and Cronin, was increased Tuesday by action of the township board of trustees.

The new rate is \$100 per hour for partners and \$90 per hour for associates, up from the rate of \$85 for partners and \$75 for associates in effect since 1993 when the firm was hired.

The township has been paying roughly \$200,000 per year for legal services. Officials said the increase amounts to about 15 percent per year.

"The legal bills I have seen for this firm are very cost effective and I believe this is a reasonable increase," McCarthy said.

Township Supervisor Kathleen Keen McCarthy said the rate compares favorably to that paid for legal services in the Western Townships Utilities Authority - \$150 per hour. Plymouth Township is a WTUA member.

### Unflappable ice sculptors endure

The temperature was zero, but the sun was bright and ice sculptures were everywhere.

Maybe that's why so many people were smiling as they passed through Kellogg Park on Saturday, for the 15th Plymouth Ice Sculpture Spectacular.

"We've been coming here for the past five or six years. It's very pretty, it gets more interesting every year," said Julie Andrews of Novi.

Both women wore oversized down coats, boots and warm hats. "We came more prepared this year," said her friend Kelly McKinstry. "The first year we froze our butts off."

It was just after 9 a.m. Saturday at the ice festival, a good time to avoid larger crowds later, the women said.

Placed around the covered Kellogg Park fountain were ice animals carved by world champions Ted Wakar and Jim Bur Jr. The carousel included a camel, ostrich, horses and more.

While cold temperatures made for some difficult carving, they eliminate cloudiness and the ice shines clear - an effect heightened by the low morning sun.

"This is our first time - It's fantastic," said Mike Loeffler of Roseville, with wife Pat. Loeffler is helping to put on an ice show in Orchard Lake.

Pat Loeffler said they came early to avoid the rush. "We were really glad we could get around." To head off the chill, she wore four shirts, hose and long underwear, a big coat, boots and a hat.

## Youth choir director tunes in

The Plymouth Community Arts Council is searching for youngsters who are in tune with their musical talent.

Specifically, Soo Yeon Kim, choir director and Canton Township resident, is looking for children ages 9-13 for the newly created Plymouth Youth Choir. Participants do not need to live in Plymouth.

"Any student who loves to sing is welcome," said Kim, who has a doctorate of musical arts. "They only need to call the Plymouth Arts Council to set up an audition." Auditions will be held Saturday 1-3 p.m. and Monday 4-6 p.m.

"They just come in and sing for me," said Kim, 33. "It's nothing they have to prepare for or be nervous about."

The purpose of the youth choir, according to Randy Lee, executive director for the Plymouth

Community Arts Council, is to expand the arts for area residents and performers.

"We would like to showcase all of the arts at the Joanne Winkelman Hulce Centre for the Arts," said Lee, referring to the new Council Arts headquarters at Sheldon and Junction in Plymouth.

Kim came to know Lee through Kim's 10-year-old daughter, who is involved in children's theater through the Plymouth Community Arts Council. The pair sat down and started talking about music.

"They really wanted to develop a program for children," said Kim. Based on her educational background and past experience, she was hired to direct the group.

"We're very fortunate that she (Kim) was interested and available at this time," said Lee, impressed with Kim's "background and enthusi-

## Test scores concern schools

■ A report will be presented on district MEAP scores at 7 p.m. Feb. 4. School officials are analyzing scores.

Plymouth-Canton students scored lower on the Michigan Educational Assessment Program test than they did last year, and school officials want to know why.

The fourth- and seventh-graders who took the state standardized test in October showed an overall decline in math and reading.

"Truthfully, I don't think we can explain it," said Verna Anible, director of instruction for the school district. "We need to look very carefully, and do an item-by-item analysis. We want to take a look at our curriculum, and compare it to the state's suggested core curriculum, because that is what the tests are based on."

Plymouth-Canton scores reflected a statewide trend toward lower scores this year.

Parents will receive their children's scores with report cards before the end of the month, said Judy Evola, community relations

## Building plans approved

New Morning School of Plymouth plans to expand.

Plymouth Township's planning commission Jan. 15 approved a tentative site plan for a first expansion phase, and more plans could follow, said school executive director Elaine Yagiela.

"We want to create a multi-purpose room to house a space and science lab, and our music and band program," she said. "What it's going to do is give us very much needed space for our existing programs and our students."

The 1,200-to-1,500-foot addition would be built onto the southwest corner of school at 14501 Haggerty.

Founded in 1973, the school offers education for preschoolers through eighth graders. There are now 120 students at the non-profit school. Parents pay varying levels of tuition, depending on how much they help at the school.

Parents perform tasks including

director. "A complete report on the district scores will be presented to the Board of Education at the meeting on Feb. 4 at a 7 p.m. at the E.J. McClendon Educational Center," she said.

Overall in Plymouth-Canton, 66.6 percent of fourth-graders achieved a satisfactory rating in math. Among seventh-graders, 65.3 percent were ranked in the satisfactory category.

In reading, 57.1 percent of Plymouth-Canton fourth graders earned a satisfactory ranking. In math, 50.3 percent of seventh-graders were rated satisfactory.

Asked about variances in scores among schools in the Plymouth-Canton district, Anible said it's too soon to explain them.

"We certainly can't at this time. It's something we will look at as we do our item-by-item analysis," she said. "We'll look at what things were different in particular buildings that brought positive results, and those we'll continue to do."

"We'll also look at things done in buildings that we'll want to consider changing if we feel that they may have had some impact on the scores."

The good news is that while scores fluctuate from year to year "there still is a

trend in the district of continuous improvement, which is our goal," said Anible.

"But we are not satisfied with the scores; we're not pleased with them. We still need to strive for improvement."

A cross-section of school personnel will analyze the MEAP results.

"The process will involve assistant superintendent for instruction Pat O'Donnell, myself, the curriculum coordinators, principals, learning specialists, and all of the teachers," said Anible.

"We'll take a look at the tests and items students did well on, and items they didn't do as well on. We'll see if there are ways we can strengthen our curriculum so that students perform better in the areas of their weaknesses."

Teachers and administrators will target test questions that many students missed.

"We'll look to see whether the material is included in our curriculum; whether it's included at the appropriate grade level; and whether enough time, emphasis and review are allotted so that students stay current with that information," Anible said.

A cursory look shows another bright spot, she added.

"When this year's seventh-graders were fourth-graders, there were fewer kids in the satisfactory range. We were successful in moving some from the moderate into the satisfactory category. Not only did they keep pace in fifth- and sixth grade, but they were able to make some higher-than-average gains," she said.

Anible joined the district earlier this school year. Most recently, she worked in Monroe Public Schools as an elementary principal. She also taught in that district at the elementary and secondary levels.

"Plymouth-Canton is an outstanding district. A lot of work has been done on the curriculum, and Pat O'Donnell has been wonderful to work with," said Anible.

Evola noted that variables change each year, affecting scores. "Those variables include different groups of students; different test questions; and this year's earlier testing date which resulted in less time for review after summer vacation."

cleaning the building on weekends, taking responsibility for the annual auction, other fund raisers, and helping to run the school.

"By far the key ingredient par-

ents come to the school for is personalized attention for their children," Yagiela said. The student to teacher ratio is no higher than 21 to one, and falls closer to an average of eight to one, she said.

"The purpose of the school is to provide a learning environment where the child can flourish. Academics are tailored to the individual, we develop kids who can think, who can problem solve, who can make choices and decisions."

The expansion is the first phase of a more than \$1 million expansion. Yagiela said. DeMattia Associates were especially helpful by providing free architectural and project management services for the expansion.

"We eventually want to create a building with enough space to allow our program to flourish. We're really making do with less

than adequate physical space."

Once the planning commission approves phase one, construction would begin in April and be done by August in time for fall semester.

The school is raising money for a second phase. Interested donors can call New Morning School at 420-3331.

The school presents a Student Museum Open House from 2-5 p.m. Feb. 9 at the school, featuring student projects. Fall registrations are also taken at the event.

The annual New Morning School auction, the school's biggest fund raiser, is April 19 at Laurel Park Manor.

"It's something we're all excited about," Lee emphasized.

The program was initiated after residents called and inquired about a youth music program. So, organizers feel confident the interest is there, now they just need to find the talent. The director is optimistic.

"I'm sure there is a lot of talent in the area," said Kim.

It is her intent to find that talent and help it grow. "I want to teach them how to sing (better), how to project their voices, and how to read music," she said. "I also want to help them develop a classical repertoire."

The choir will cover everything from "Bach and Mozart to contemporary Broadway and gospel."

Kim looks forward to sharing her musical expertise with the 30 students selected for the first Plymouth Youth Choir. Perhaps, she will even inspire some child to make music more than a hobby. At the very least, she plans to cultivate a love for the art by providing solo and duet opportunities for the children.

In addition to directing the local group, Kim teaches private lessons at the Rochester Conservatory of Music and directs a community group of young adults at the Korean Presbyterian Church of Metro Detroit in Southfield. She also teaches private piano lessons from her home.

"I knew ever since I was little I wanted to go into music," said Kim when asked how long she focused on music as a career. By the sound of things, her daughter could take the same path.

"Yes, I teach her," Kim said. "She's at a good age, not so young" as not to understand, but young enough to learn and grow.

Kim and the students will meet 6:30-7:30 p.m. every Monday to prepare for the first concert next May. If everything goes as planned, there is talk of expanding the Youth Choir program into two sessions and adding a summer music camp.

"(But) we're just in the beginning stages now," Lee said. "So, we'll just offer it and see what the response is."

"We're hoping to enjoy a positive response."

"May I take a picture?" asked a man with his three children looking on. He was speaking to professional carver Aaron Coslic, who said, "Sure."

Coslic, working with partner Greg Butarski, was putting the final touches on an ice depiction of Batman. Already finished and standing six feet high nearby was an ice replica of Batman's spotlight image, from the popular movie.

Coslic, of Cleveland, Ohio, said cold weather makes carving more difficult. "It's harder to

push your tools through the ice, it's brittle," he explained.

While some work straight through the 20-hour competition that started at 6 p.m. the day before, "I slept three hours in the trailer," Coslic said.

Opting for a warm up early Saturday in the command trailer near the Penn Theater was carving rules judge Mark Scofield of Livonia. Like the carvers, he'd been up all night observing the work.

"You just watch to make sure they're not violating safety rules, that they're not using ground snow besides the slush they make, or bringing in extra ice," he explained.

"I've never had to knock anybody down on points, I've had to warn a few people," he said. One year, he had to warn a carver who was on top of a step ladder on top of a table, using a chain saw.

"I love the artistry, to be able to make something out of a rectangular block of ice," he said.

"This has been the biggest show I've been involved in," said Mike Watts, event organizer. More sponsors this year meant more carvers and more ice sculptures.

"We've received a tremendous response from the media around the country; we can't even answer the number of phone calls," he said.

At the Masonic Lodge near The Gathering, Tom Werner, worshipful master of the Tyrian Lodge, was getting ready to offer warm drinks and food to the public at noon. "People come in and say we look forward every year to coming in here," he said.

Carving in The Gathering were Plymouth Salem High School senior John Levandowski and teacher Judith Braun. Both used metal comb-like tools to

create a textured effect on ice. They were trying to recreate the painting "The Scream," by Edvard Munch.

Braun said the hardest part about carving "was yesterday when three or four of us were

hauling the ice so we could carve."

Approaching the park from Penniman Avenue was Gerald McDonell of Plymouth, with grandsons Josh and Jeremiah of Hillsdale. "It's kind of a nice

break in the winter, to see some people display their talents," he said.

"Thank God the weather was with us this year," McDonell added.

festival from the start.

It was Scott Lorenz, former Mayflower Hotel co-owner, who founded the event in 1983 in Plymouth with then city manager Henry Graper.

In modern times, the Japanese had kept the art of ice carving alive. Japan is the site of an annual ice sculpting world championship.

"Scott Lorenz spent some time in Japan, he came back and said 'I could do that for the city,'" Teeple recalled.

The 1983 Plymouth Ice Festival was on one day, Feb. 12. There was a \$2,000 budget, and attendance was estimated at 25,000.

One notable occurrence was when a father, trying to coax his son out of a snow igloo built on near the Wilcox House, got stuck in a small doorway.

"We had to get a crane to lift the igloo up to get the gentleman out," Teeple recalled.

In 1984, the ice festival was plagued for the first time with warm weather. While the temperature on ice festival Saturday was 40 degrees - tolerable for displaying ice carvings - the ground in Kellogg Park had yet to freeze.

"All the hi-lo equipment got stuck in the park," Teeple recalled. Attendance swelled to 75,000.

As the event continued to grow in successive years, there have been visits from foreign chefs including Russians, Swiss and Japanese. The subjects of ice carvings have ranged from ballet dancers to castles to trains and Cadillacs.

In 1996, the first woman ice carver to win the professional division competition was Angela Snyder.

The carving team of Ted Waker, a former Teeple student, and Jim Burr has been a long-time Plymouth ice festival main-

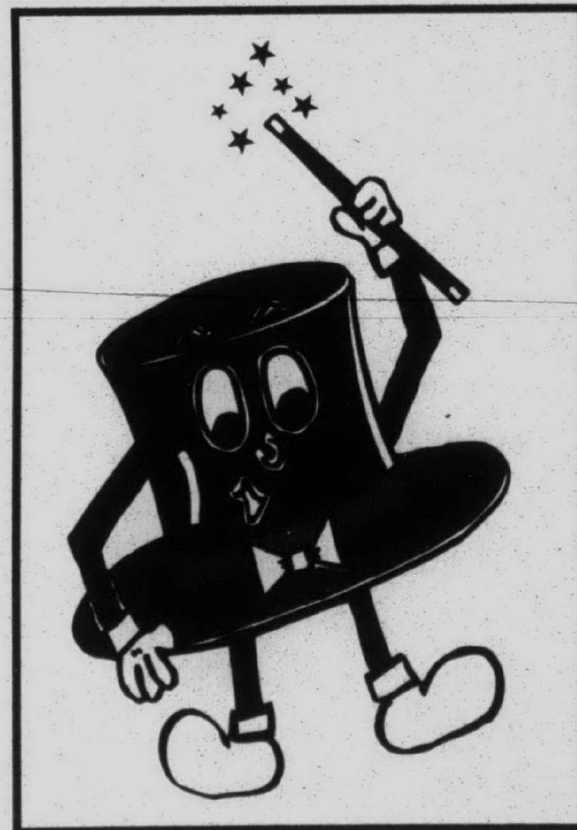
stay. They were the first Americans to win the world championship carving competition in Japan.

Teeple said this year they were scheduled to only do exhibitions, as they plan to try out for the first-ever Olympic ice carving competition.

Lorenz' decision to try an ice festival in Plymouth, Teeple said, has led to a resurgence of interest in ice carving in the United States. There are currently 27 such festivals and competitions within a six-week period in this country each year.

The last festival run by Lorenz and Graper was in 1989. Pam Kosteva organized the next two festivals, then Mike Watts took over for the 1992 event.

Watts continues at the helm for an event that now draws worldwide attention, evidenced in scores of newspaper and television reports each year.

## Hearing planned for commercial corridor

When strip malls go in along Ann Arbor Road, there needs to be plenty of room for parking - and lots of space between the mall and nearby homes.

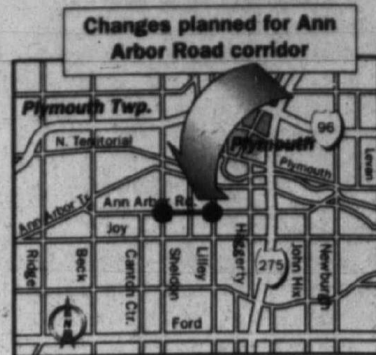
That's what Plymouth Township planning commissioners are proposing. But before putting concrete specifications to these concepts, they want some public comment.

Township planners say the public will be interested, as the plan could cause developers to seek to buy homes backing up to proposed strip malls.

To get opinions from the public, the planning commission has scheduled a special meeting for 7:30 p.m. March 5. The meeting site is yet to be determined, as the township board room at Ann Arbor Road and Lilley is probably too small to accommodate those who'll likely show, officials say.

Shirley Barney, community development director, said, "Under present day standards you don't have enough depth to accommodate the type of development that would be attractive."

Township officials say they want to amend the zoning plan to require strip malls to be set



farther back from Ann Arbor Road. This would create more parking and allow more room for landscaping.

A major feature of a new plan would be to increase space between the back of strip mall stores and nearby residences. To make this happen, developers could seek to buy and remove homes behind a proposed strip mall - only if homeowners agree.

Barney said township planners expect a large turnout because a public hearing last year on possible street closings along Ann Arbor Road drew a large turnout.

"We think people will have a lot of questions," she said.

#### Locker thefts

Plymouth Township police are investigating a new round of locker thefts at Vic Tanny, 40700 Ann Arbor Road.

Between January and July last year, there were 20 reported incidents of a thief removing padlocks from men's lockers while the victim was using Vic Tanny's facilities.

Police said the thief would then remove wallets, and replace the lock with another padlock. The victim would return, and unable to remove his lock, would seek out management to remove the lock with bolt cutters.

Police said this gave the thief time to head to nearby computer stores and buy equipment with stolen credit cards.

The first such incidents since July happened last week. A thief removed a locker padlock at 10 a.m. Jan. 13, and again at 8 p.m. Jan. 14.

Plymouth Township police Sgt. Steve Rapson said to head off the thefts, those using Vic Tanny lockers should leave credit cards at home.

#### Car chase

and entering of a dwelling Tuesday in Northville Township led police on a car chase through Plymouth Township, before authorities caught him in Livonia.

After fleeing Northville Township police at about 1 p.m., the thief headed south down Beck Road into Plymouth Township, police said. He then turned east on North Territorial Road, before eluding a police perimeter by passing through township subdivisions.

Livonia police then spotted the car at Ann Arbor Road near I-275, and arrested the man, police said. There were no traffic mishaps related to the incident.

Joseph Yatooma, 29, entered the plea before 35th District Judge Ron Lowe. Yatooma was referred to the court probation department for a pre-sentencing assessment.

# State lawmakers face key labor issues this term

Two major labor issues are back before the Michigan Legislature, despite the time lawmakers spent debating them in 1995-6.

First, minimum wage. The House passed an election season hike in the minimum wage, but it died in the Senate Labor Committee, chaired by Mike Rogers, R-Brighton.

Reason: House Bill 4180 hiked the restaurant server's mini-

mum wage, which is pegged at 75 percent of the base minimum, or \$2.52. Business argued that servers, with tips, were making far more than the minimum, and that no hike for servers was necessary.

This year, Sen. Loren Bennett, R-Canton, introduced Senate Bill 1 to raise the minimum wage from \$3.35 to \$5.15 an

hour. It would mirror the federal minimum wage change enacted by Congress last year. His bill reportedly didn't touch the server's \$2.52 minimum.

SB 1 was denounced immediately by the National Federation of Independent Business when it went to its first hearing before the Senate Labor Committee last week.

"Most businesses in the state already pay above the minimum wage in order to attract and retain quality workers," said Charles Owens, NFIB state director. "However, small businesses currently exempted under federal law should have the flexibility to determine wage levels that the current Michigan law provides."

"Small business owners believe the marketplace, not the government, should determine the wages and prices of business

and commerce."

Federal law doesn't apply to firms with less than \$500,000 in gross receipts that aren't in interstate commerce.

### Worker's comp

Second issue is worker's compensation reform.

Last May Rogers got his SB 895, aimed at cutting fraud in worker's compensation, through the Senate on a 21-16 party-line vote, but it died in the House Labor Committee.

Rogers said his bill would halt fraud and "wouldn't cost injured workers a penny."

"If that's all it did," replied Democrat Ken DeBeaussart of Macomb County, "we could come to an agreement." DeBeaussart said Rogers' 895 tried to overturn two court decisions, rewrite workers comp eligibility standards, retroactively terminates benefits for those paid under the old standard — and generally

# Term limits have consequences, lobbyist warns

A former Speaker of the state House of Representatives believes term limits will eventually lead to a part-time state legislature.

"It will be an evolution. It will be difficult for someone to take six years out of their career, but there will be a natural evolution to a part-time legislature," Gary Owen said. That continual transition may lead to difficulty in reaching a consensus on long-debated issues.

Now a chief executive officer with Governmental Consultant Services, Owen was responding to a question from the audience at the Canton Economic Club at a lunch Friday at Summit on the Park where Owen was the guest speaker.

Owen was elected to the state House in 1972, and served for 10 years, then became Speaker of the House for six years. A native of Alabama, Owen was educated at the University of Michigan, receiving a bachelor's degree in economics and a master's in urban planning.

A Ypsilanti Township resident, Owen works for the second largest lobbying firm in the state. Lobbyists from both major political parties work at the firm, which represents Chrysler Corp., Consumers Power, Masco Corp. and Detroit Auto Dealers Association.

Owen believed term limits will carry some consequences for state lawmakers and the general public.

"Now you will have a new group of people who will control the House. (Voters) will be able to keep a group of reasonable group of people in the Senate," Owen said. "But that's just speculation."

In other state politics and policy, Owen predicted:

■ Uncertainty of what will happen with the gas tax, but believed there is a "tremendous need" for it.

■ It will take at least two years for state lawmakers to rewrite state statutes to govern deregulation of electric utilities.

"In the short-term there will probably be a lot of screaming, but once it's done, it will be better for everyone," Owen said.

■ The state will lose between \$600 million to \$3 billion in a lawsuit on special education funding to local school districts.

"It is clear it is a mandated program," Owen said. "We didn't pay for it."

"It will be a significant decision and it will change drastically what's going on in Michigan."

Canton Township Supervisor Tom Yack later asked what the likelihood that the state of Michigan would be "on the hook" for this money when it is the only state that mandated special education programs up to the age of 26.

Owen said the state probably would look for ways to trim the program's costs.

Another lunch guest asked Owen about the future of college education costs.

"I don't believe the state has adequately funded higher education," Owen said. "The state has funded many capital improvements on campuses, and the community colleges, which are funded locally, are doing an out-

standing job.

"But I think there will be less and less money available for higher education."

Student loans are available, but many Canton Township residents may not qualify for financial aid, Owen said.

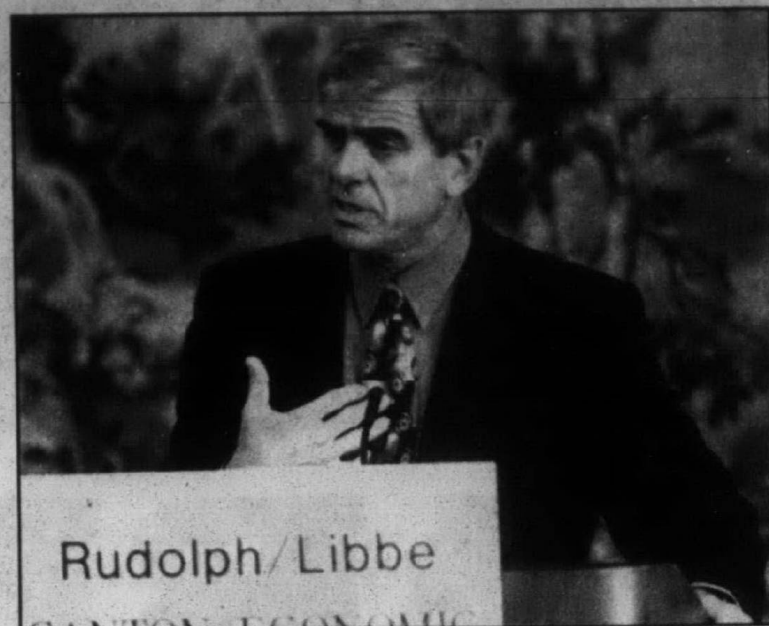
On campaign finance issues and in response to a question on possible reform, Owen remembered one of his re-election campaigns where he spent \$15,000 and his opponent delved out \$12,000. It was considered the most expensive campaign in the state at the time.

"Now, it's up to a half million," Owen said.

Raising campaign money was called "the most distasteful part of the job," Owen said. "But if you take the private sector out of the process, what do you have left?"

"We have a free enterprise system. We may have too much regulation in some areas and not enough in others. But it has

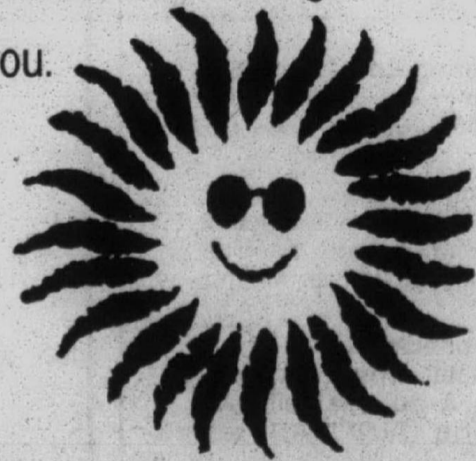

was rammed through by the GOP majority without giving Democrats time to study the measure.

And so worker's comp is back as an issue.

The Small Business Association of Michigan is making its reform a 1997 legislative priority. "Recent court rulings are threatening to drive costs even higher and drive away employers," said SBAM's Ann Parker, director of government affairs.

SBAM is calling on the Legislature to "end abuses and close loopholes that drive up worker's compensation costs. She cited Court of Appeals and Supreme Court rulings that have approved claims for workers who:

- Are able to return to work but who refused to do so because they chose to live in other states.
- Developed mental problems

from ordinary events of employment.

■ Were injured after starting fights or being drunk on the job.

SBAM, with 8,000 members, also said benefit should be calculated on a regular work week, not on overtime or bonuses.

## Heintz back

Susy Heintz is back at work for the Engler administration.

"Her title is business and education liaison with the Jobs Commission," said spokesman Jim Tobin. "She has great business connections, knows how to get things done in business and government, and knows our welfare policies."

Tobin said Heintz's jobs will be to "1) promote school-to-work initiatives with business leaders and 2) encourage private business to offer jobs to welfare clients."

"The Sooz" will be stationed in the Jobs Commission's offices in the Detroit state office building at 1200 Sixth. She started late in 1996.

Heintz, 47, moved to Macomb County in mid-1996 to be the Republican sacrificial ewe against Democratic U.S. Rep. David Bonior. She had to fight a primary against the late Gil DiNello and went down as the statewide GOP vote shriveled.

Heintz is the former Northville Township trustee, clerk and supervisor; two-term Wayne County commissioner; SEMTA public transit board member; and head of Gov. John Engler's Detroit office from 1991-95. She left to chair the state Republican Party and left that to make the congressional run in Macomb County after no other candidate could be recruited to tackle Bonior.

Her Christmas card had a return address of Clinton Township.

## Madonna OK'd

The State Board of Education has approved Madonna University's new early childhood program as an elementary education minor.

Madonna had its proposal

reviewed by two staffs in the state Department of Education — the Office of Professional Preparation and Certification Services and the Office of Health and Early Childhood Education.

The early childhood program has a minimum of 20 credit hours for the minor. The board gave it 8-0 approval without comment during the December meeting.

## DNA records kept

State Police may now keep DNA (genetic) records on people convicted of heinous crimes under laws sponsored by Rep. Gerald Law, R-Plymouth. The package was signed by Gov. Engler earlier in January.

The laws require records to be kept on convicted murderers and kidnapers, even if they are juveniles. They prohibit the release of a state prisoner without the taking of blood and saliva samples.

"The police have a new weapon in their fight against crime. They will solve more cases and do so more quickly," Law said.

always worked.

"When you look at it from that aspect, how can you argue with that?"

Owen said the right for individuals and groups to access government and address government was outlined in the Federalist Papers.

Owen was asked about casino gambling. Owen believed it needs enough regulation to keep organized crime out, yet not too much to make it restrictive.

"The obvious impact on Detroit is (casino gambling) will position it to be the convention center of the Midwest," said

Owen. "It depends on the city of Detroit and how Detroit focuses on it, and how the legislature sets up regulations to be sure it is run correctly."

Owen was asked whether some cities had better economic opportunities in urban areas than Detroit. "That is one of the most complex issues. You've always had the economically disadvantaged in the city.

"The issue always becomes a federal issue, because the state doesn't have the resources. If you're never able to address the K-12 problems, you won't address the urban problems."

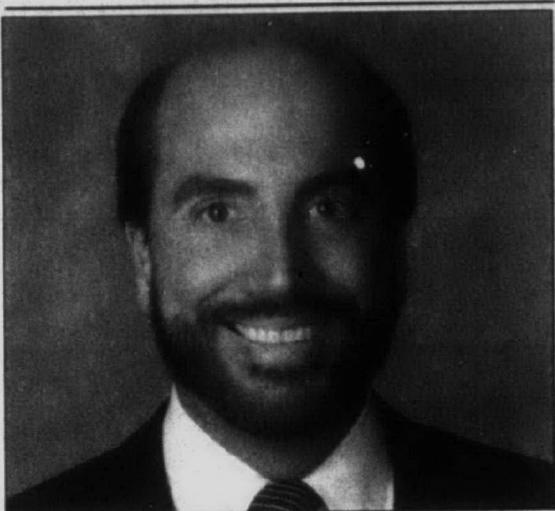

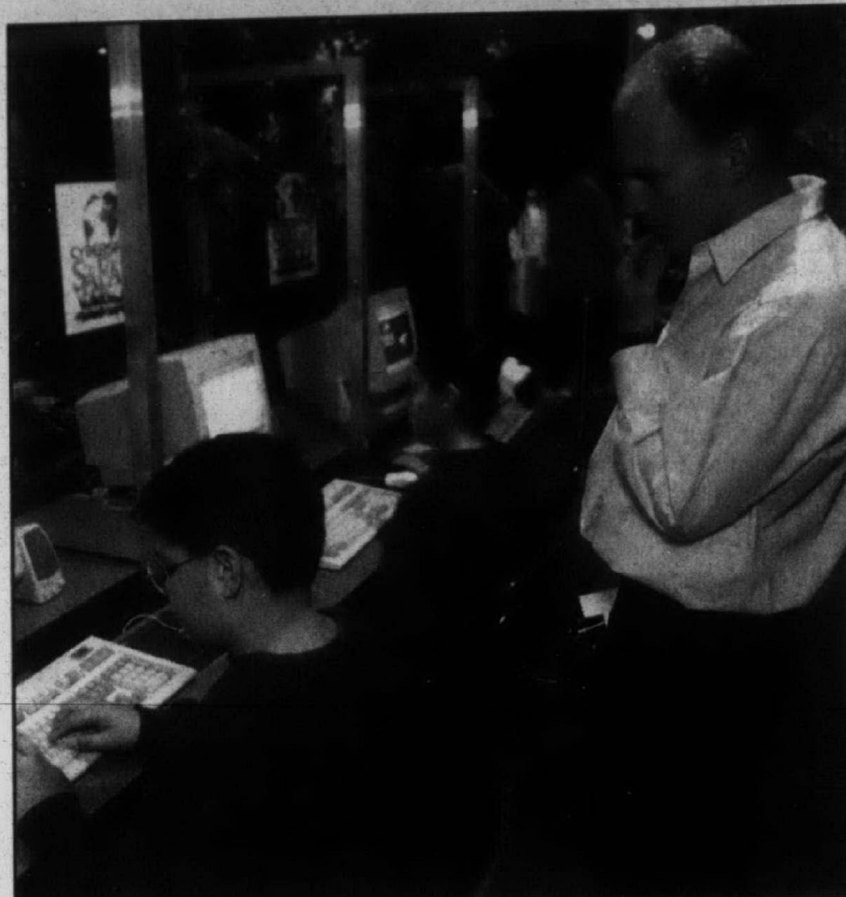
The safari is based on the Dinoscience exhibit in progress at the Detroit Science Center downtown. It was created by the same company (Research Casting International of Canada) that provided the skeletons used in the movie "Jurassic Park."

All presentations are conducted by trained Detroit Science Center staff. According to Mel Drumm, director of the center, more safaris are on the way exploring topics like Flight, Light, Lasers, Physics and the Human Body.

## N'land chief plans center's future

John Bemis is all eyes and ears as he strides through the Northland Center in Southfield.

The mall's new manager asks sales associates in a teen apparel store to "turn down the music," then makes note of which mall floors need more polishing.

He pauses to make sure a customer studying the mall directory knows where she's going, then he spies the "Half-Off" sign being hung over the leather jackets in one shop window.

"Those pieces should have sold during the holidays at full price," he muses. "That's quality merchandise and good design."

As Northland's new boss, Bemis is determined to take Michigan's oldest and largest shopping center into the 21st century. At 37, he is one of the youngest mall managers in the country, but responsible for one of the toughest properties at 2.2 million square feet of retail space across 160 acres.

The center is 93-percent occupied so Bemis, a leasing specialist, has been charged with filling the mall.

"I've targeted three categories; Northland needs a full-service bookstore, a quality sitdown restaurant, and some higher-end men's clothing stores," he said. "And we'll get them because this center is on the cutting edge of what's happening in our business."

"Northland is the first mall to redevelop in a quasi-urban center. We're neither urban nor suburban. We can't be lumped. We can have

our cake and eat it to, have all the hot fashion trends our shoppers want, yet maintain standard suburban merchants like Target and JC Penney.

"Our plan for the new year is to fully retain our share of the urban market while at the same time expanding and recapturing the office building trade nearby, in addition to wooing shoppers from north Southfield, Berkley and Oak Park.

"We want to get back our Detroit shoppers who have wandered over to Oakland Mall, Fairlane and Twelve Oaks."

Bemis arrived at Northland in November to replace Catherine O'Malley who left to manage Twelve Oaks in Novi. Bemis said he was recruited by Compass Retail Inc., the management subsidiary of Equitable Real Estate Investment Management Inc., (which owns Northland Center) from his position as regional manager of leasing for Schostak Brothers & Co.

A resident of Rochester Hills, Bemis and wife Michelle, have two children, Elizabeth 7, and Michael, 4.

"I bring them over to the mall on my day off, in my jeans, and we shop Northland," he laughed. "We're hoping to spread the word that Northland is a beautiful, safe, quality shopping environment. People who come back and see it since the big remodel last year have lots of good things to say."

Bemis graduated from Central Michigan and managed restaurants for Bennigan's before joining Homart Development where he held various positions in leasing and management. After a stint with Equity Properties and Development, he joined Schostak where he handled specialty leasing and redevelopment planning for eight shopping centers in four states.

He is the son of Don Bemis, former superintendent of Utica Schools and later State Superintendent of Schools. He grew up in Utica, the eldest of four children.

"We're a tight-knit family still," he said proudly. "In fact, my dad stops by the mall to visit and enjoys talking to the staff. I warned

them! The people at Northland are such professionals. I feel fortunate to have joined such a team."

Bemis reports that the Northland Center ended 1996 on a high note, with holiday sales up three-percent over last year. He is looking forward to Jan. 27 when he takes a seat on the Board of Southfield's Downtown Development Authority.

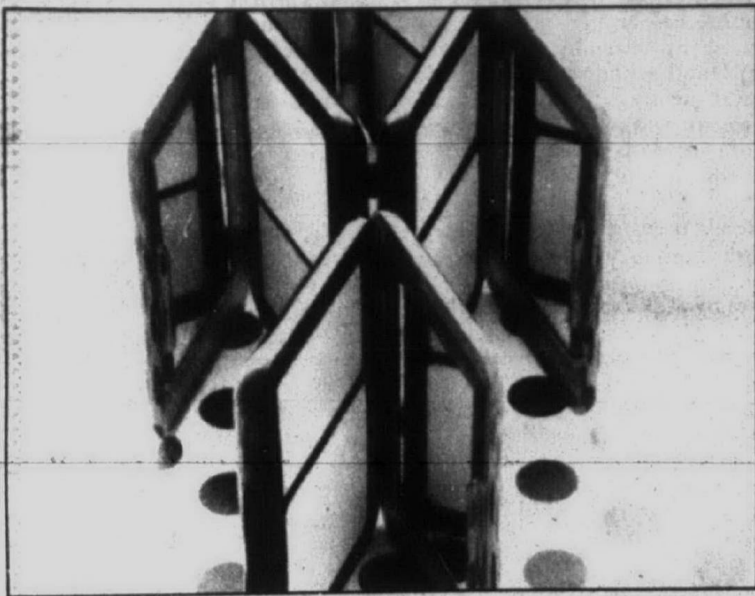

# Pond's celebrates 100 years with beauty biz history

It's possible that no other industry experiences the constant change that is witnessed in the beauty and fashion industry. New looks — and new companies — explode onto the scene rocking the status quo, and then, sometimes just as quickly, fade into vague memories.

The growth and expansion of this enterprise has been so amazing that the Pond's Corp. recently sponsored a special event at the Parsons School of Design in New York City to honor the beauty industry. "The Changing Face of Beauty" exhibited the fascinating advances in beauty and marked the 150th anniversary of Pond's.

Throughout time, women have been bombarded with home remedies, cure-alls and guarantees from contraptions that promised to reshape their noses and reduce their chins, foreign teas that assured the blooming of a fuller, more beautiful bosom, and modern-day acid washes and preventative moisturizers. For well over a century, the mass media has been successful at convincing women that natural beauty always can be improved upon.

Beauty rituals can be traced as far back as 51 B.C. to ancient Egypt, when Cleopatra would bathe in milk to soften her skin. In the early 1800s, a common practice among women was ingesting arsenic to whiten their skin!

The 1920s witnessed a short trend dubbed "cosmetic beading," when American movie stars like Theda Bara, applied drops of a hot wax-like material to the tips of their eyelashes for a sultry look.

Fifty years later, Farrah Fawcett's "feathered" hairstyle on "Charlie's Angels," took the country by storm. It was copied in some regions for more than a

decade. Today, laser and plastic surgery are available on an outpatient-basis for things like lip enhancement, tummy tucks, scar revision and breast augmentation or reduction. The future is sure to hold more amazing developments and discoveries.

The following timeline highlights some of the most amazing and memorable trends, discoveries and advancements of the beauty industry.

- **Elizabethan Age, the 1800s:** To hide smallpox scarring and to avoid the sunburned appearance of laborers, women apply whiteners to their faces.

- **Early 1880s:** Women ingest arsenic, vinegar and chalk to lighten their skin. Illness, and sometimes death, follows.

- **Circa 1850:** Fowler's Solution, a cream with an arsenic base, is developed as a treatment for acne.

- **1886:** A crude precursor to today's "peels," "skinning" with acid and electricity is popular for restoring a smooth, more youthful appearance.

- **1890:** The arrival of the *Gibson Girl* heralds America's new ideal. Drawn by Charles Dana Gibson, the model is beautiful, confident, wise and often accompanied by at least one besotted man. To many, she serves as a standard for the beginning of the feminist movement.

- **1910:** Makeup finally enjoys widespread use in the United States, 20 years after Queen Alexandra of England begins using cosmetics for evening events.

- **1920:** After a mention in a 1911 *Vogue* report on the beauty

habits of other cultures, *kohl* debuts in America as a precursor to mascara.

- **1928:** The suntanned look becomes popular and the first cosmetic sunscreen appears.

- **1938:** The Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act outlaws both the use of harmful ingredients in cosmetic products and misleading claims in advertising.

- **1943:** With stockings unavailable due to the war, women begin painting their legs with flesh-toned body cosmetics, which spot and blotch in the rain.

- **1952:** An amendment to the Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act is proposed, stating that all cosmetics should be chemically pretested and that all labels should list ingredients.

- **1954:** The first cream concealer is introduced to the relief of teen-agers nationwide.

- **1969:** Hair is long, and hair dryers go from portable bonnet cases to hand-held blowers.

- **1974:** Model Beverly Johnson creates a stir from coast to coast as *Vogue's* first black cover girl.

- **1980s:** The body is sculpted to perfection via aerobic exercise.

- **1981-1988:** Baby boomers begin to sag and plastic surgery experiences a 63-percent rise


- **1985 to today:** Suntans give way to sun protection.

- **1990:** Dermatologists use lasers to help erase lines and fine wrinkles.

### Heavenly cake food for angels

Food for the angels, yes indeed! Angel food cakes get their height, volume and lightness from egg whites (which have no fat and no cholesterol). There are calories in angel food cakes so you'll still need to plan for those. Enjoy eating some glorious desserts that can be made with angel food cake.

You can make them from scratch, buy commercially prepared mixes or find cakes ready made in the grocery store. Here are a few tips for making an angel food cake from scratch:

- The more air in the batter, the higher and lighter the cake will be. Handle the fragile foam gently so it doesn't deflate.
- Beat egg whites that are at room temperature.
- Keep the bowl and utensils completely free of fat. Any fat inhibits the development of foam.
- Cream of tartar is an acid that helps stabilize the egg foam. This helps to develop a finer texture and make the cake white.
- Superfine sugar can be used for angel food cakes to give it a finer texture.
- Work quickly when making an angel food cake so you don't lose the lightness of it.
- Always cool an angel food cake upside down.

#### Dress them up

Cherry Angel Food: Fold in 3/4 cup of maraschino cherries cut in half and add 2 to 3 tablespoons of cherry syrup.

For chocolate lovers: Add 2 to 3 tablespoons of unsweetened cocoa, 1 teaspoon chocolate extract, 2 to 3 teaspoons instant coffee and 1 to 2 tablespoons finely grated semi-sweet chocolate.

Cinnamon swirl: Fold in 1 teaspoon cinnamon and 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg

Candy striper: Gently fold in 1/2 to 2/3 cup finely crushed peppermint candy (add more or less depending on your preference).

Lemon zest: Add 1 tablespoon grated lemon or orange peel, or 2 tablespoons fresh lemon or orange juice and/or 1 teaspoon lemon or orange extract.

Very berry: Fold in 1 cup fresh raspberries or frozen, drained raspberries or 1/2 cup fresh pureed strawberries.

#### The Layered Look

If you want to dress up a commercially bought cake or if you simply go for that layered look and taste, try these suggestions for more height and more flavor; make layers of:

- Low-fat or nonfat pudding.
- Fruit fillings made by spreading 1 cup of any fruit preserve or jam.
- Low-fat or nonfat frozen yogurt, ice milk or non-dairy whipping cream.
- Whole berry cranberry sauce or other ready-prepared cranberry combinations, such as crushed orange cranberry sauce or raspberry cranberry sauce.
- Apple, cherry, blueberry or peach pie filling.
- Powdered whipped topping mix made with skim milk and flavored by adding 1 to 2 tablespoons cocoa to every cup of whipped topping. Crown your angel food creations with any of the following:
- Flavored syrups made by heating 1/3 cup water, 1/4 cup sugar and 3 tablespoons of vanilla or other extract, coffee or your favorite liqueur until the sugar is dissolved. For lemon or orange syrup, heat 2 to 4 tablespoons lemon or orange juice with 3 to 4 tablespoons sugar over low heat until sugar is dissolved. Poke the warm cake with a toothpick or tines of a long fork. Slowly pour or brush the syrup over the cake, letting the syrup soak in.
- Fruit sauces made from pureeing 1 to 2 cups fresh, frozen or canned fruits, adding sugar to taste (approximately 2 to 6 tablespoons) and 1 tablespoon lemon juice. Extracts and liqueurs can also be added.
- Fruit glazes made by mixing 3/4 cup confectioners sugar with 2 to 3 tablespoons lemon juice or 2 to 3 tablespoons orange juice concentrate.

Any of these delicious desserts can be a wonderful ending to a meal or as a snack. Be really adventuresome and use slices of angel food cake to make French toast, a great way to start the day.

## POT MEALS

Bundled up against the winter cold, people go undercover in Michigan during the winter. This is no time for fancy meals, or fussing. Many of us are still recovering from holiday indulgences. We're tired, and fighting colds and flu. Simple one pot dinners fit the bill perfectly.

Pot roast tops the list of possibilities. "When you think of American favorites, pot roasts immediately come to mind — they're part of our culture, and everyone has a favorite," said Betty Rosbottom, author of "American Favorites" (Chapters Publishing, 1996).

In creating Pot Roast with Rich Root Vegetable Sauce, Rosbottom said she wanted to preserve the traditional pot roast — gently simmering a beef round tip roast with aromatic vegetables, herbs and seasonings until the beef is fork-tender — but give it a contemporary twist.

Instead of the flour-thickened gravy that mom made, Rosbottom's features a savory sauce — a puree of vegetables and cooking liquid. This richly flavored sauce tastes delicious drizzled over slices of beef and mashed potatoes.

Anna Theresa Callen serves up "One-Pot Italian Classics," in her newly published cookbook (HarperCollins Publishers, 1997). The book offers more than 125 recipes for hearty meals with Mediterranean flavor. From "Soups Like 'Mama Mia' Used to Make," to chicken, beef, veal, seafood, pasta and pizza, Callen's recipes are "tailored to the American kitchen and, for the most part, to ingredients you will find easily in your supermarket."

She recommends making enough soup for at least two meals because soup freezes well. You'll be prepared when the next blizzard hits.

"The more of the meal that goes into one pot — be it a saucepan, skillet, baking dish or casserole — the less there is left of the meal to prepare, cook or clean up," Callen writes.

Each chapter contains an introduction sprinkled with helpful hints. For those of you who add oil to the pot when making pasta, take note. Callen recommends cooking pasta in plenty of water in a large pot. The water in the pot should be heavily salted, and the salt should be added after the water boils.

"I add 2 tablespoons of coarse kosher salt to every 4 quarts of water," she writes. "Never add oil to the water. It will make the sauce slide off the pasta, and you want the sauce to

adhere. After the salted water comes to a boil, add the pasta and stir with a long fork or pasta spoon. Cover the pot and let the water return to a boil. Then uncover and cook the pasta at a constant boil according to the time given in the recipe or in the instructions on your pasta package.

Peggy Fallon's "Chicken Dinner In One Pot," (HarperCollins Publishers; 1997) contains over 128 recipes for cooking chicken in a single pot. Chicken Skillet Suppers, Chicken in a Wok, Chicken in a Stew Pot, and Chicken in a Soup Pot are some of the delicious possibilities.

Like Callen's book, this one contains helpful tips and hints, and recipes made with readily available ingredients. "In this book, you will find a chicken recipe to cook in every pot of your 'batterie de cuisine,'" she writes. "In fact, you will probably be inspired to reactivate a few pots that had been relegated to the back of the cupboard."

"Cooking Under Cover: One-Pot Wonders — A Treasury of Soups, Stews, Braises and

Casseroles," by Linda and Fred Griffith (Chapters Publishing, 1996) is another book winter weary cooks should check out.

This collection of 175 globally-inspired recipes is a good reference for cooks looking for cover. All of the recipes are prepared by poaching, simmering, braising, roasting, stewing, smothering or steaming. The wine recommendations, which follow each recipe, are something you don't find in many cookbooks.

Linda and Fred Griffith's introduction explains different one pot cooking methods, and includes memories of their favorite comfort foods.

"Virtually every immigrant group brought its own versions of covered dishes to this country, using cuts of meat that improved in the pot," they write. "In Europe, covered cookery was for centuries the primary method of food preparation. Dishes were cooked for long hours so working families could come home to a hot, hearty meal."

## Single malts gain popularity among many wine drinkers



Single malt scotches have attracted today's wine drinkers with unparalleled enthusiasm. Understanding the essentials of single malts enhances their enjoyment. The traditional method of producing any whisky involves steps known as malting, mashing, fermentation, distillation and maturation. But several other factors affect a single malt whisky's character:

■ **Water:** the most important element determining the taste of a single malt whisky. If water is clear, spring water that runs over granite on route to the distillery, the malt will have a fine, elegant flavor. If water percolates through a peat bog, it carries amber color and smoky character to the whisky.

■ **Malting:** Barley, the grain used for single malt whisky, is steeped in water for two days encouraging germination and production of an enzyme (maltase) that converts barley's starch to fermentable sugar. Malted barley is dried over a fire. If

that's peat, a Scottish household fuel, it contributes a distinctive smoky character.

■ **Climate/Air:** Oak casks used to age whisky are porous and "breathe" air as alcohol evaporates. A warm, dry climate encourages early maturation, while a sea-side atmosphere produces a salty or seaweedy taste.

■ **Age:** There is no perfect age for single malts, but there is usually an optimum age. Like people, single malts reach maturity at different ages. Choosing the right single malt to match a mood is also an ingredient of enjoyment.

The following are some favorites listed from light to heavy.

■ **Glenkinchie 10 year** — classic Lowland single malt, the heart of Haig & Haig Pinch blend, has medium-to-light body, pale amber color, soft aromatic nose, palate smoothness and a slightly dry finish. A pure spring water source, soft and slightly chalky, explains Glenkinchie's char-

acteristic dryness suiting it to an aperitif pour.

■ **Glenfiddich Special Reserve 8 year** — a Speyside whisky whose water source is Robbie Dhu spring. So important is the water that Glenfiddich owners purchased 1,200 acres of the surrounding hillside to protect it. Aged in Spanish sherry butts and American bourbon barrels, it has pale golden color with elegant aroma of vanilla-oak and just a touch of smoke. A smooth dram, best with a touch of cool water, is an excellent aperitif malt.

■ **Dalwhinnie 15 year** — from the Northern Highlands is full-bodied with a light, fruity aroma, sweet taste and soft, heathery honey-like finish. The distillery has the highest elevation (over 1,000 feet) of any distillery in Scotland, where water is pure snowmelt running over granite.

■ **Oban 14 year** — rich body, pale amber color and assertive aroma, especially its

peaty smokiness. Palate is smooth, striking a balance that is dry and smoky with malty, fruity undertones. The distillery lies on Scotland's West Coast and creates interaction of sea air as the casks breathe during maturation. It begins the malts more suited for after dinner.

■ Cragganmore 12 year - golden-colored with a slightly smoky character, dry palate and just a hint of peat. Its origins are Speyside (after the River Spey), Scotland's most famous whisky-producing region located within the Highlands. Taste of this great malt is most influenced by

the unusual T-shape of the copper stills.

■ Glenmorangie Madeira Wood 12 year - is a new product in our market. Nosed neat, it smells madeirised, with a burnt-tangy trace. With a drop of water, fresh black pepper emerges with toffee, mint, citrus orange, peach and that intriguing burnt character.

■ Glenmorangie Port Wood 12 year - finishes its aging process for an additional two years in port pipes. The result is a malt with an antique copper color, a complex, sweet-dry flavor and nose with hints of port wine and

walnuts.

■ Glenmorangie Sherry Wood 12 year - also new to our market. The nose has full-bodied sherry wine notes with traces of honey and mead. With a few drops of water added, nuttiness develops with scents of vanilla and caramel.

■ The Macallan 18 year - Speyside malt deriving much of its distinctive character from the sherry butts in which it is aged. According to Macallan, whisky has traditionally matured best in oak casks that have contained sherry. Due to the increasing expense and scarcity of these

vessels, other distillers no longer insist exclusively on sherry casks. To ensure their supply, The Macallan directors journey annually to the bodegas of Jerez to buy fresh oak casks and pay the sherry producers to age their best oloroso and fino sherries in them for three years. Afterward the casks are shipped to Scotland where The Macallan is matured for 10, 12, 18 and even 25 years.

■ Glenmorangie 18 year - a Highland Malt. The distillery is one of the smallest and most northerly in Scotland. In the late 1980s, Glenmorangie own-

ers, believing that their whisky had a unique bouquet, conducted research with some of the best noses in the world - French perfumers. They identified 17 distinct aromas in the 18 year old. The most common six are: chocolate, cinnamon, honey, mint, rose and vanilla.

■ Talisker 10 year - the only whisky made on the western Isle of Skye, has a dark amber color and powerful bouquet with hints of seaweed and spice. An intense, tantalizing initial taste finishes big, warm, peppery and peaty. Like everything on Skye, it is touched by the sea, and its

character is profoundly affected by dark, peaty water.

■ Lagavulin 16 year - distilled on Islay, one of the Inner Hebrides Islands. It is noted for its very firm body and is the most complex of all Islay malts. Initial taste is robust and slightly sweet, offsetting the whisky's dry, salty note. Finish is astonishingly long and powerful, with a peaty, smoky taste.

**POT ROAST WITH RICH ROOT**

**VEGETABLE SAUCE**  
4 pound boneless beef round tip roast

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
  - 3/4 teaspoon salt
  - 1/2 teaspoon pepper
  - 1 medium onion, coarsely chopped
  - 4 medium ribs celery, cut into 1-inch pieces
  - 3 medium carrots, cut into 1-inch pieces
  - 1 teaspoon dried thyme leaves or 1 tablespoon fresh thyme
  - 3 sprigs Italian parsley
  - 2 bay leaves, broken in half
  - 3 large cloves garlic, crushed
  - 1 can (28 ounces) Italian-style tomatoes, drained, coarsely chopped
  - 1 can (13 3/4 to 14 1/2 ounces) ready-to-serve beef broth
  - 1 cup dry red wine
- Heat oven to 350 degrees F. In 5-quart ovenproof Dutch oven, heat oil over medium-high heat until hot. Add beef roast; brown evenly. Remove roast; season with salt and pepper. Add onions, celery and carrots to same pan; cook and

- stir until onions are tender, about 5 minutes. Add thyme, parsley, bay leaves, garlic, tomatoes, beef broth and wine; stir to blend. Return roast to pan; bring to a boil.
- Cover tightly; transfer pan to oven. Cook in 350 degree F. oven 3 hours or until beef is tender, turning roast over halfway through cooking.
- Remove roast; keep warm. Strain cooking liquid; reserve. Remove and discard bay leaves from vegetables. Puree vegetables in blender or food processor fitted with metal blade. Add 2 cups cooking liquid through feed tube with the motor running. (Sauce may be kept warm or reheated in a saucepan, over low heat). Carve roast into thin slices; serve with sauce. Makes 6 to 8 servings.

- CHICKEN AND VEGETABLE RISOTTO**
- 2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil, plus more as needed
  - 1 garlic clove, crushed under a knife
  - 1 small red bell pepper, seeded and cut into 1/2-inch squares
  - 1/2 teaspoon dried rosemary
  - 1 medium onion, chopped
  - 1 medium carrot, chopped
  - 1/2 cup canned crushed tomatoes
  - 1 1/2 cups Arborio rice
  - About 6 cups hot chicken broth
  - 1/2 cup thawed frozen peas
  - 1/4 teaspoon salt
  - 1/8 teaspoon freshly ground pepper
  - 2 cups leftover cooked chicken cut into 1-inch pieces
  - 2 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese, plus more for serving
- In a heavy-bottomed Dutch oven, heat the olive oil over medium heat. Add the garlic and cook until fragrant, about 1 minute. Add the bell pepper and cook, stirring often, until tender, about 10 minutes. Using a slotted spoon, transfer the pepper to a bowl, discarding the garlic.
- If necessary, add a little more oil to the Dutch oven. Add the rosemary, onion, and carrot. Cook over medium heat, stirring often, until the vegetables soften, about 5 min-

- utes. Add the tomatoes, reduce the heat to medium-low and simmer until slightly thickened, about 10 minutes.
- Add the rice. Cook, stirring constantly, until it absorbs the cooking liquid, about 3 minutes. Add 1 cup of the broth and reduce the heat to medium low. Simmer, stirring constantly, until the rice almost completely absorbs the broth, about 3 minutes. Continue adding the broth 1 cup at a time, stirring constantly, waiting until it is almost completely absorbed before adding more. When 1 cup of the broth remains, stir in the bell pepper, peas, salt, and pepper. Place the chicken in the center of the rice. Pour the remaining broth over all and cover. Reduce the heat to very low and cook until the rice is tender and slightly creamy and the chicken is hot, about 5 minutes. Sprinkle with 2 tablespoons of the cheese. Serve immediately in warmed bowls, with a bowl of Parmesan cheese on the side. Serves 4.

  - 1 garlic clove, minced

  - 1 large russet potato, peeled and coarsely chopped
  - 5 cups chicken stock

  - 1 tablespoon minced fresh chives
- Heat oil in a large, heavy-bottomed pot over low heat. Add leeks, shallot and thyme, tightly cover and braise over low heat until leeks are very tender, about 10 minutes.
- Add cauliflower, potato and 4 cups stock, increase heat to medium-high and cook, uncovered, until stock just begins to boil, about 5 minutes. Tightly cover pot, reduce heat to low and cook until cauliflower is very tender, 20 to 25 minutes.
- Let soup cool slightly, about 15 minutes. Carefully spoon solids into a food processor fitted with the metal blade. Add 1 cup warm stock and process until solids are very smooth.
- Return puree to pot and whisk in remaining 1 cup stock and milk. Cook over medium heat until soup is hot but not boiling. Season with salt and pepper. Ladle into heated soup bowls and sprinkle with chives. Serves 6.

AP - Light Potato Dipper is a low-fat snack for Super Bowl Sunday - or any gathering of friends and family. The dipper is made with Jarlsberg light cheese, instant potato flakes and vegetable broth.

**LIGHT POTATO DIPPERS**

- 1 cup (4 ounces) shredded Jarlsberg Lite cheese
- 1 cup instant potato flakes
- 1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 cup vegetable broth

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F.

Mix cheese, potato flakes and seasonings well. Add broth, mix.

clean hands to make an even layer. Bake in preheated 375-degree F oven for 35 minutes or until beginning to brown. Invert on wire rack, peel off parchment or foil and replace in oven to bake another 10 minutes. Cut into 2-inch squares. Makes 25 pieces.

Serve with a tomato sauce (jarred marinara) or your favorite salsa.

007's Aston at Ford Museum

James Bond's Aston Martin DB-5, the gadget-loaded spy car that starred in 1964's film phenomenon "Goldfinger," will be on display at Henry Ford Museum Jan. 11 through March 9, 1997.
Sometimes described as the car that made James Bond famous, the DB5 appeared in "Goldfinger" for only 13 minutes (ending with bond wrecking the car) but still captured the imagination of audiences worldwide. It proved so popular that it was resurrected for the next Bond film, 1965's "Thunderball."
This particular DB5 - the DP/216/1 - is far more than mere transportation. It is equipped with both offensive and defensive weaponry to assist its driver, James Bond - Agent 007 - whose business was spying on behalf of "Her Majesty's Secret Service."
The car is a film representation of author Ian Fleming's original philosophy about 007: "Bond may go wildly beyond the probable, but not beyond the possible." "On film, the car was an extension of Bond himself," said Donna Braden, a museum curator and one of the planners of the DB5 exhibit. "The cleverness of the car's accessories parallels Bond's clever, quick wit and amazing, unorthodox ways of achieving goals."
Braden points out that the high-tech nature of the DB5 was extraordinary for its time, and is even amazing today. The current DB5 is a restored version, with all the "bells and whistles" of the original car in place but not necessarily in working order.
Museum hours are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. all week. Admission is \$12.50; senior citizens 62 and older \$11.50; youth ages 5-12 \$6.25; children under five and members admitted free. Special group rates are also available.

### A Head-liner

So far, the season could hardly have been better for Eastern Michigan University's men's basketball team, despite last Thursday's disappointing loss at Boise State.

The Eagles' record fell to 12-2 with their loss on national TV early Friday morning (the game started at midnight in Boise) — which isn't too bad at all.

One might think that despite the team's success, Plymouth Salem graduate James Head isn't real happy. After all, he lost his starting position; he comes off the bench now.

This was supposed to be his year.

Don't think for a moment it hasn't been. Head has flourished in his sixth-man role, and — although he's started just twice this season — he's getting in the same amount of court time (24 minutes a game) as last season.

And he's making the most of it. Head is third in scoring among the Eagles, averaging 12.1 points a game, and his 6.0 rebounds-per-game average is slightly behind team-leader Derrick Dial's 6.1 (all statistics prior to the Boise State game).

Head also leads EMU and ranks second in the Mid-American Conference in field-goal shooting (62.2 percent); leads EMU and is fifth in the MAC in steals (2.5 per game); and leads EMU and is 10th in the MAC in blocks (0.7 per game).

Head's proven he can hit from outside, too; he's converted 8-of-19 three-pointers, and his three-point percentage (42.1) is best among the Eagles with more than 10 triple attempts.

Last season, Head averaged 6.6 points and 6.4 rebounds a game in helping EMU win a MAC title and reach the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

The Eagles return to MAC action tonight, hosting Bowling Green State at 8:30 p.m.

### MSU swimming

Michigan State's men's swim team won its first dual-meet season-opener, beating West Virginia Wesleyan 121-71 Jan. 3. The Spartans lost their second dual, 154-88, to Eastern Michigan Jan. 11.

Mike Orris, a Plymouth Canton graduate, recorded season bests in the 200-yard (1:48.06) and 500-yard (4:49.57) freestyles against EMU. Both are the second fastest times turned in by a Spartan this season.

Orris was also part of the 400 free relay that posted MSU's second-fastest time this season (3:17.45) against EMU. Earlier this season, Orris swam legs on the 200 free relay (1:31.11) and the 800 free relay (7:13.06); both were MSU's second-best times of the season.

Fred Locke, from Plymouth Salem, swam with Orris on the 400 free relay. Locke also is tied for third among the Spartans for the fastest 50 free (22.45), and he's also swam a leg on the team's third-fastest 200 free relay (1:31.567).

## Good effort for Chiefs, but Rocks reign

Isn't it wonderful when both sides in a dual meet end up winning?

No, there were no major surprises during Thursday's swim duel between Plymouth Salem and Plymouth Canton. The Rocks won, as expected; but the score was a good deal closer than anticipated, which pleased Canton fans — 104-82, at Salem.

The result left Rocks' coach Chuck Olson a bit concerned. "They swam well, and we swam well," he said. "That's as close as I want them to get. They're one of the better teams in our league. They're going to win a lot of meets."

Canton may indeed be one of the better teams in the Western Lakes Activities Association, but Salem remains the defending champion — for the past four years.

And as Olson noted, the last time Canton beat Salem in a dual meet was, well . . .

"It's never happened," he said. "I

don't think they've ever beaten us in a dual meet, or in the conference meet."

Thursday's result could provide the Chiefs with a glimmer of hope, that the end of that seemingly endless streak could be near at hand.

"In terms of dual meets, we're pretty tough," said Canton coach Kyle Lott. "We're a lot better this year than we were last year."

"I think we have one more step to take. But if our times continue to drop like they did against Salem, we may take that step this year."

"Time will tell. We'll have to wait and see."

Canton had depth last year, Lott's first as coach, but the Chiefs were lacking the top-level swimmers needed to score big points at large meets, like the conference championships. That's changed somewhat this year.

It was evident against Salem, a team that always seems to possess great talent and loads of depth.

The Rocks did harness most of the firsts, winning five individual

events and two of three relays. But Canton's performance was still better than anticipated.

Especially after reviewing their dual-meet opener against Ann Arbor Huron. "The kids did not have a real good meet against Huron," said Lott. "So I really didn't know what to expect against Salem."

Lott figured a heavy workout schedule during Christmas break was part of the reason for the Chiefs' flat showing against Huron, a 30-point loss. Still, when Salem knocked off the very same River Rats' team last Tuesday by 24 points, Lott was more than a bit concerned.

"We went into the meet with the attitude that, yes, Salem is a better team than we are, but we're going to get our times back on track," said Lott.

The Chiefs did more than that. They may not be ready to challenge Salem for the WLAA title just yet, but they're in the league's top echelon.

Of course, that rating's a bit

deceiving. The gap between Salem and the rest of the conference is wide.

Mark Dettling was part of four firsts for the Rocks against Canton. He won both the 200-yard freestyle (1:51.97) and the 100 butterfly (55.58), the latter bettering the state cut.

He also teamed with Kyle Petroskey, Tim Buchanan and Nick Corden to win the 200 free relay (1:32.93), and with Petroskey, Corden and Brent Mellis to capture the 400 free relay (3:27.72).

Petroskey won the 100 free (50.88), Otto Geiseman was first in diving (257.20 points) and Luke Woodcock took top honors in the 100 back (1:01.26).

For Canton, Alex Roettgers was the biggest star. Roettgers won both the 200 individual medley (2:05.82) and the 500 free (5:06.54), and combined with Don LeClair, Pat Krause and Curtis Hornick for a first in the 200 medley relay (1:46.06).

There are still a few kinks to work out, and they are looking for more help in the food service and lounge, need a pin jumper and snack bar help as well.

Since this is really mid-season opening, there are new leagues being formed. This will be something for everyone. From Youth Leagues to Senior Citizens.

There will even be an instructional league for beginning bowlers of all ages.

Greg Sicilia grew up in the bowling business, having the erstwhile Cass Sicilia for a father. Cass is well remembered by oldsters for having been the proprietor of Crest Lanes, and later serving the bowling community for many years as Executive Director of the Bowling Centers Association (BCA).

In recent times, the Sicilia family has owned and operated Airport Lanes in Jackson. Greg knows that this house needs a lot of hard work to restore a good public image and he knows just what it takes to bring back the bowlers.

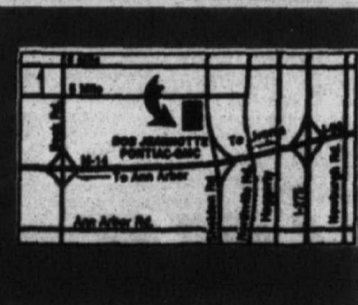

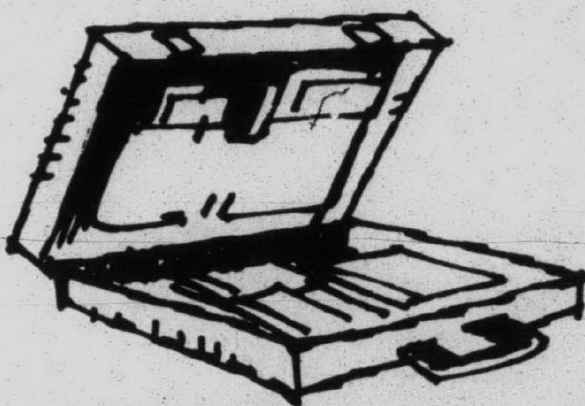

# WRITE IT AND REAP!



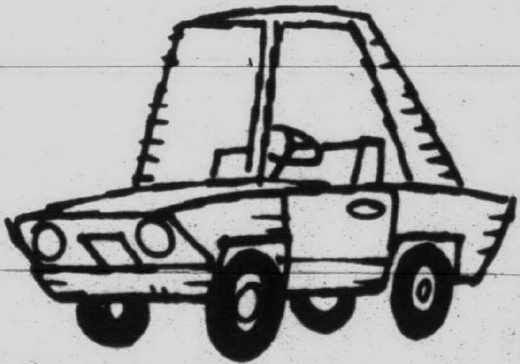
**1. Give the reader specific information.** Pretend you are someone reading the classifieds. What would you like to know about the item, service or job you are advertising? Be sure to add details such as color, size, condition, brand name, age, features and benefits. Be accurate! Don't embellish your ad with misleading information. Stick to the facts and reap the rewards!



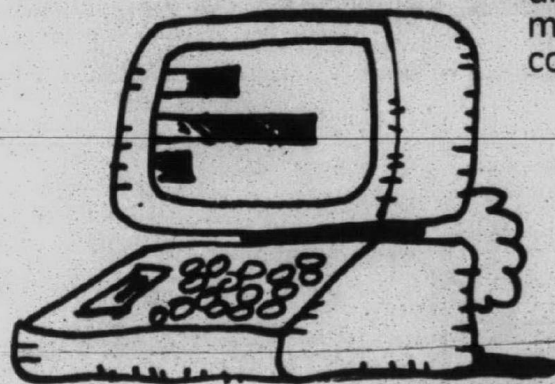
**2. Include the price.** Don't waste your time or a potential buyer's time. If you advertise the price of the item or service you offer, the people who respond to your ad will be those who are genuinely interested. Surveys show that readers are more interested in those items and services they know are within their price range.



**3. Avoid abbreviations.** Don't make a potential customer work too hard! Although you may be tempted to cut down on the cost of your ad by using abbreviations, surveys indicate that many people don't understand such abbreviations as EIK (eat-in kitchen) or WSW (white side wall) tires and won't take the time to figure them out. A confused reader is a disinterested reader. Get the most for your money and use complete words.



**4. Include phone number and specify hours.** Be sure to let potential customers know when and where to call. Surveys show that even if a person is very interested in your item or service, he or she will not call back after the first attempt. Stay near the phone during the hours you indicate you will be available. Don't risk missing a sale!



**5. Run on consecutive days.** Your ad will not get results if people don't see it! Therefore, it is important to set up a consistent and consecutive ad schedule with your telephone salesperson or outside sales representative.

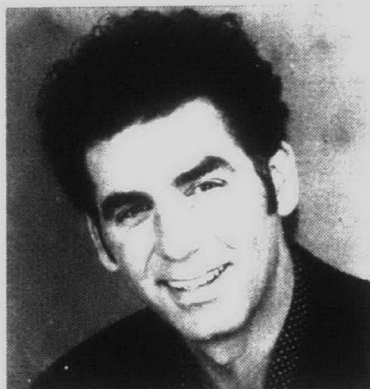
**A:** No. Hunt was 5 years old in 1950.

# Critics claim voting policies taint Golden Globe Awards

Some call it glitzy, prestigious and the best way to predict who will win Oscars. Others say it's a fraud, a marketing ploy for movie studios and a disgrace to serious journalism.

Both sides agree, however, that the 54th annual *Golden Globe Awards* telecast, airing Sunday, Jan. 19, on NBC, means big stars and big ratings. Last year, the first time the show ran on network television, 40 million viewers tuned in, and NBC won the night and its time period.

This year's production features awards in 24 categories (13 for movies and 11 for television), with a centerpiece honoring Dustin Hoffman, and promises to be a lavish affair.

But lately the Hollywood Foreign Press Association, which awards the Golden Globes, has come under scrutiny from critics. Some challenge the number of voters involved in choosing award winners, the qualifications of those voters, and association policies that exclude highly regarded journalists who write for large and respected newspapers in other countries.

The association has only 85 members, and at least one-third of them are not full-time reporters.

Many association members write for small, obscure publications in such countries as Lithuania and Bangladesh, where the market for American films is minuscule. Regardless, members need only show they have written four articles a year of any type to maintain membership.

"They qualify as journalists because they do write for a publication overseas and they are the Hollywood correspondents of their publications," says Philip Berk, association president and a reporter for the Argus Group, a South African syndicate.

"Many journalists are struggling," he says. "Many of them have to supplement their income in other ways."

But if association members spend time teaching or running an auto referral service, to name just two outside jobs held by members, do they have the time to watch every new film and sample every TV show, movie and miniseries?

"I think it's a farce," says Mirjana van Blaricom, a Yugoslavian-born film writer who was president of the Hollywood Foreign Press Association in 1992 and 1993. "If you ask me, it's a big joke."

Van Blaricom, a full-time journalist, last year founded a rival organization, the International Press Association, open to qualified journalists of all nationalities. It already claims a membership of 150 and will issue its own awards, the Golden Satellites, at a luncheon four days before the Golden Globes telecast.

The former association president estimates only about half of the Hollywood Foreign Press Association even bothers to vote for the Golden Globe winners. But that charge can't be verified: Ballots are counted by an accounting firm and the actual number of votes is kept secret, even from the association president.

Berk said he did not know how many votes were recorded this year but, based on attendance at screenings, he thought most association members cast ballots.

Even if all 83 eligible members voted (two are not qualified because they failed to turn in enough stories last year), participation is lacking compared to the Oscars.

"Our voting membership is somewhere in the neighborhood of 5,000," says Leslie Unger, publicity coordinator for the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences.

In Oscar competition, except for picture of the year, each Academy branch makes its own nominations: Actors nominate actors, directors nominate directors, and so on.

"My job isn't to question the integrity of another association's awards," Unger says. "Every ounce of my soul believes in the integrity of our awards. I don't think there are a lot of organizations that can make that claim."

Critics also denounce Hollywood Foreign Press Association membership policies. Only five new members are allowed each year and a single veto from any member can prevent another journalist from joining. Writers from the *Times* of London and *Le Monde* of France have been denied membership without explanation.

"There are hundreds of cases of

people who are qualified but who are not allowed to join," van Blaricom says.

The tight grip on membership keeps the association from growing too large to serve the needs of members, Berk says. This way members get more of a chance to talk to stars at press events held exclusively for the association.

"If we were to absorb the other so-called hundred credible journalists in Hollywood, it would be impossible to provide opportunities for all of our members to get access to the stars during press conferences," Berk says.

Whether the Golden Globes are early Oscar indicators also is open to debate.

"I don't think we position ourselves to have an impact on the Oscars," Berk says. "But our awards reflect the attitudes of the Academy more so than some of the other bodies that present awards."

Twelve times during the past 17 years a Golden Globe winner for best motion picture also won the Academy Award. In Golden Globe competition, however, movies and TV shows are divided into two award categories: drama and musical/comedy. That doubles the chances a Golden Globe winner also will win an Oscar.

Still, the *Golden Globe Awards* show gives studios and stars a chance to plug their films in front of millions of viewers. The show also launches the unofficial campaign for Oscar votes.

Oscar nominations are announced on Tuesday, Feb. 11, and the ceremony airs Monday, March 24, on ABC.

The NBC sitcom *Frasier* received a 1997 Golden Globe Award nomination for best musical or comedy series. The 54th annual *Golden Globe Awards* telecast airs Sunday on NBC.

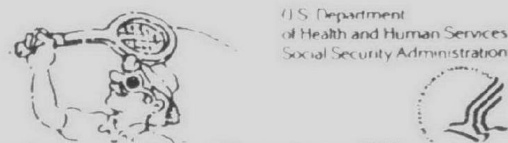

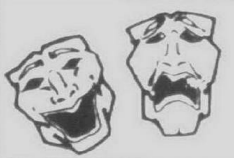

Guiding Light celebrates 60 years

For more than 60 years the beacon on Guiding Light has been shining on daytime, and it has attracted generations of fans.

GL began as a 15-minute radio show created by Irna Phillips in 1937, and hit the small screen in June 1952. It is the only radio drama to make the transition to television and remain on the air today.

"For something to last six months in this business is amazing," says Jerry Ver Dorn, who plays Ross Marler. "For a show to last 60 years it is phenomenal."

The set on GL is like no other set in daytime. Ver Dorn says part of that is due to a very special woman: Charita Bauer, who played Bert for 40 years, just took every new person under her wing," Ver Dorn says. "I think she sort of established the familylike tone of our set. She often maintained that there was a GL kind of person. They were hard workers with sense of humor.

"On our set you are very much invited to make a fool of yourself, which makes for a wonderful, creative atmosphere. What we are doing is not brain surgery. If someone makes a mistake, we move on."

Through the years GL has seen its share of changes in writers, producers and actors. Recently, Paul Rauch was hired as the new executive producer.

To celebrate the milestone, Rauch has a special week planned. "We have a gala ball celebrating the 60th anniversary of Cedars Hospital on the show," Rauch says.

"It will be attended by the entire cast and the audience will be treated to visits by favorites from the past. The lighthouse, which symbolizes GL, will play a prominent role when friends and adversaries cross paths to keep the light shining."

There also will be changes in the way the show looks. "We will be re-designing and redecorating all the sets with a lushness and romanticism not seen before on GL," Rauch says.

A president's wish: Family leave act hits prime time

The first bill President Bill Clinton signed into law, the Family and Medical Leave Act, inspired the first drama to include a current president as an actor.

Tuesday, Jan. 21 on CBS, John Ritter, Tess Harper and Anna Chlumsky star in *A Child's Wish*, about a family that falls into debt and disarray after daughter Missy is diagnosed with cancer.

The story is notable because it was similar real-life instances that prompted President Clinton to sign the controversial act into law in 1993.

Ritter (*Hearts Afire*) and Harper (*A Summer to Remember*) play Missy's parents, Ed and Joanne Chandler. The family goes into financial and emotional decline when Ed loses his job because of performance problems caused by Missy's illness.

*Wish* highlights the difficulties many families faced prior to passage of the Family and Medical Leave Act, which mandates up to 12 weeks of unpaid leave in a 12-month period to care for a seriously ill parent, spouse or child.

Though the film is heavily partisan in its depiction of the political process behind the passage of the Family and Medical Leave Act, the Chandlers' personal tragedy movingly demonstrates the need filled by such protective legislation.

John Ritter and Anna Chlumsky work well together in the many scenes they share, especially during their joint testimony before a congressional review board and in a difficult scene in which Ed Chandler tells his daughter her leg will have to be amputated.

To prepare for her role, Chlumsky met with families who lost children to cancer to hear about their experiences. "It made me realize how lucky I am," Chlumsky says, "and how unlucky some kids are."

Lawrence Horowitz, co-executive producer, says this is the "only time ever that an actual movie has been filmed in the Oval Office, and the only time that a sitting president has been in a movie other than a documentary."

Clinton, Horowitz says, was "gracious" and "put everyone else at ease."

Chlumsky recalls, "It was weird to see him (Clinton) come into the Oval Office," but once the president started casually talking to the assembled cast and crew, she realized that he was just "a totally normal guy."

Austin City Limits pushes boundary of country's music

*Austin City Limits* has never been hemmed in by musical boundaries. The long-running PBS series may have once been regarded as a program that catered to country music, but its 22nd season, which begins on Saturday, Jan. 25 (check local listings), presents a range of styles as broad as the Texas horizon.

The season opens in traditional fashion with a special one-hour performance by country superstar Wynonna, but subsequent episodes will offer everything from folk and bluegrass to alternative rock and blues.

In February, audiences will be treated to tributes to "father of bluegrass" Bill Monroe and the late songwriter Walter Hyatt. Kyle Lovett, Shawn Colvin, Jimmie Dale Gilmore, Junior Brown and Marcia Ball are among almost a dozen stars who honor Hyatt, who died in a plane crash in May 1996.

*Austin City Limits* will showcase acclaimed alternative rock acts Son Volt in March and Sheryl Crow in April. The new season also will feature guitar virtuoso Eric Johnson, blues-rock guitarist prodigy Kenny Wayne Shepherd and the funky, funk rhythms of the DeJanders and Dale Watson.

In this, the film's dramatic culmination, it is both disconcerting and moving to see the president re-enacting for the screen a scene that has actually taken place many times privately during his tenure.

The line between real life, good TV drama and political speechmaking is blurred.

"When you believe something in your heart, it's not acting," Horowitz says, referring to the president's dramatic debut.

Nonetheless, by enlisting the country's most powerful political figure to tell this story, the makers of *A Child's Wish* are mixing true-tale dramatization with reality television in a manner destined to be controversial.

The issues brought up in *A Child's Wish* - including but surpassing its focus on the Family and Medical Leave Act - will undoubtedly reverberate long after its airing.

Chapin Carpenter and Wade Hayes, as well as a new "Songwriters Special," featuring Waylon Jennings, Kris Kristofferson and Willie Nelson, airing on Saturday, Feb. 1.

*Austin City Limits* was inspired by the burgeoning music scene of Austin, Texas, in the early 1970s, and has featured more than 250 regional and internationally known artists on its stage over the past 21 seasons.

*Austin City Limits* has become one of television's longest-running music series largely thanks to its continuing association with traditional country music. But as this season's diverse and distinctive lineup illustrates, the series' scope has expanded beyond its titular borders. "It's not just country music," the program's catch phrase proclaims, "it's this country's music."
