Plymouth voters issued a mandate by selecting two former city commission members, a newcomer and an incumbent in Tuesday's city election.

Elected to four-year terms on the city commission were Stella Greene, who finished first with 1,268 votes, Phil Pursell with 1,219 votes, and Ron Loisel with 1,120 votes. Mayor Pro Tem Colleen Pobur gets a two-year term after finishing fourth with 981 votes.

At the same time, voters ousted incumbent David Byers, who is completing a two-year term. He finished a distant fifth with 867 votes. The rest of the field included Jerry Vorva, 838 votes, Peter Bunting, 751 votes, and Dennis Shrewsbury, 665 votes. Write-in candidate T. Mark Prose, who finished last in the primary, received only four votes.

"It just goes to show it doesn't take signs, and it doesn't take money. It just takes old-fashioned campaigning and getting in touch with the people,"

Jockeying for new mayor already underway

The first major decision the new Plymouth city commission will make at a special meeting Monday is who will become the city's next mayor.

Ron Loisel, moments after finding out he was elected to the commission Tuesday night, declared he believes Mayor Pro-Tem Colleen Pobur should succeed Dave McDonald as mayor.

"There's no reason why Colleen shouldn't be mayor," said Loisel.

"However, I think it should be discussed in a public meeting, not in secret groups."

The election of the previous two mayors were, for the most part, completed in closed discussions before the official vote at the first city commission meeting. This year commissioners say they want to avoid making any decisions without an open public discussion at Monday's session.

Commissioner Dan Dwyer said he'd like to see Pobur or Bill Graham.

City turns down DDA agreement with township

The utility polls along Ann Arbor Road may be unsightly, and the proposed streetscape design for the Ann Arbor Road corridor looks inviting.

However, Plymouth city commissioners voted 7-0 Monday night not to participate with Plymouth Township in a

downtown development authority to fund beautification and road improvements between I-275 and Sheldon Road. Commissioners liked the concept of improving intersections, removing overhead wires and cosmetic improvements along Ann Arbor Road. However, in the end, it came down to skepticism the DDA would raise enough money to

pay for the project. "This is a great idea in concept. The problem comes in when you look at the numbers and say the math doesn't make sense," said Commissioner Colleen Pobur. "The \$13 million worth of work over 25 years cannot be funded by the (tax increment) capture that's specified in the DDA. "We don't want to get into a

deal that appears to be not terribly feasible from a financial perspective from the beginning," she added.

Commissioner Bill Graham, the city's former finance director, also had doubts about the figures presented by the township.

"Initially, I thought it was a pretty good deal," said Graham. "But, when I ran the

numbers from the township, it didn't work. I've been a proponent of this conceptually, but I'm disappointed in these numbers."

Commissioners turned down a proposed Act 425 agreement, which would turn over properties along Ann Arbor Road to the township for the sole purpose of the creation of a down-

Grant allows cops to hire domestic violence officer

The Plymouth Township Police Department has added a full-time investigative position devoted solely to thwarting the growing number of domestic violence cases in the township.

The department promoted Detective Dave Hayes, a 14-year PTPD veteran, as the new family violence investigator, and is in the process of hiring a new officer, who will start at the bottom of the ranks.

To pay for the family violence position, the department is using a state grant awarded through the Byrne Memorial Grant fund. The grant, which is good for four years, will provide \$31,290 the first year, and slightly less during the subsequent three years.

Lt. Robert Smith wrote the grant application because of a backlog of cases involving domestic violence, including child abuse cases and sex offenses involving family members. By creating the position, Smith said the department will be able to handle the cases more efficiently.

"I saw a need in our community for the position, although this is not a unique problem to Plymouth Township. We saw an opportunity to get the grant, so we struck while the iron was hot," Smith said.

Hayes said his job will include following up on all family violence cases the department encounters. When an arrest is made, he will present the case to a prosecutor and then appear in court if it goes that far. His duties will also include making sure any conditions a judge places upon a defendant, such as a personal protection order, are followed through, and instructing victims about ways to protect themselves.

In addition, Hayes, 42, will coordinate efforts with groups such as First Step and Growth Works to implement programs meant to stop family violence before it ever occurs.

"The goal is to eliminate family violence and give

Students adopt Virginia firefighters

Plymouth-Canton high school students have adopted firefighters in Alexandria, Va., to show their gratitude for rescue and recovery efforts since the Sept 11 terrorist attacks.

On Sept 19, eight days after planes crashed into the World Trade Center and the Pentagon, Plymouth Salem High School social studies teacher Ann-Nora Hiram happened to be in Alexandria for a planned visit.

While sitting in a restaurant, Hiram met three firefighters who had spent countless hours at the Pentagon crash site. "They were powder-covered, and looked very exhausted. Like they had the heart kicked out of them," said Hiram. "I overheard how they felt no one paid

any attention to them, compared to New York, because it wasn't as big."

After talking with them, Hiram knew exactly what to do. When she got back to Salem High School, Hiram suggested to her students they write letters to help bolster their spirits.

"I wanted them to do this out of the goodness of their heart. That's the way it's supposed to be," she said. "Kids can reach out and touch so easily."

And, that's what 80 of her students did. Expressing their inner-most feelings of gratitude, admiration, sympathy and fear, they reached out to the firefighters who had been working around-the-clock.

"I wanted to thank them for putting their lives at risk and helping people," added Megan Martin of Canton. "They need to know people appreciate the work they're doing and that people

support them."

"They sacrificed their lives for people they don't even know," said Sally Kellman, a senior from Plymouth Township.

To their surprise, Bob Luckett, chief deputy fire marshal of the Alexandria fire department, sent back personalized letters to each of the students who wrote.

"You are a hero to me because you cared enough about our department to write and let your feelings be known," Luckett wrote to Brian Porter of Plymouth Township.

"Go up to a police officer or firefighter in Canton and thank them as you have us. We need people like you to remain strong," Luckett replied to Paul Flis of Canton.

In his letter to Hiram, Luckett said, "I hope your class will decide to adopt us as we have adopted them. They are now, in a small way, a member of our department."

Hiram's pupils have done just that. This week, students will be sending a goodwill package with artifacts, memorabilia and even baked goods from Salem and Canton high schools to their unsung heroes.

said Greene "We've been given a mandate take care of business and no bickering or back-fighting"

And, the mandate was evident as residents went to the polls at the Plymouth Cultural Center Tuesday Voters spoke more of the politics than issues

"I'm so sick of everybody fighting," said Kathy Goebel "This is a nice community and we don't need this I want people who are thoughtful and considerate"

"There's a lot of nastiness in the community, and we need people on the commission who aren't so nasty," added Craig Brass "People are always asking me 'What's going on in Plymouth?'"

Pursell feels the people of Plymouth made their message loud and clear

"The people are demanding stability and the end of the negativity, telling us to get down to business," he said "I think goal setting has to be number one We need to see where we want to go and how we will approach that as a commission"

Pobur, who was the target of many attacks throughout the campaign, said she believes the voters understood the truth

"It was hard to run a positive campaign when all the mud was thrown," said Pobur "It shows the right thing to do is stick to the issues and emphasize the positive things happening in this community"

"We need to deal with the street and sewer and water infrastructure, maintain the incredibly strong financial pic-

ture, and preserve the public health, safety and welfare wherever we can," she added

Ron Loisel, who has served 16 years on the commission, is back after a two-year hiatus

"I'm thrilled to be back," said Loisel "The very first thing I want the city commission to do is have a community goal setting session, getting input from the citizens, input from the department heads, input from the commission, and figure out what direction we want to go as a team"

Byers was not available for comment, but did issue a statement "I want to say thank you to each and every one of the vot-

ers who put their faith and trust in me, and to all my friends who supported me throughout the elections It has been an honor and a privilege to serve as Plymouth City Commissioner"

Voter turnout was higher than most recent years, with 31 percent of the city's 7,082 registered voters participating in the election City Clerk Linda Langmesser said since 1983, when she began working in the city clerk's office, only the 1989 election had a higher turnout with 37 percent However, that ballot also included two ballot proposals

Observer colleagues remember worker as 'wonderful associate'

Helen "Jane" Garner, 56, of Plymouth Township died Wednesday at St Mary Hospital in Livonia of complications from a stroke she suffered Tuesday morning

Jane was an administrative assistant at the Observer Newspaper Group, where she worked for the publisher, advertising, circulation and editorial departments

Visitation is scheduled from 2-9 p.m. Friday at the Schrader-Howell Funeral Home in Plymouth The service will be held at 10 a.m. Saturday at the funeral home Burial will be in Rural Hill Cemetery in Northville

"Jane was a wonderful associate and will be missed Besides being incredibly efficient and organized, she had a wonderful sense of humor and was always willing to learn and grow," said Susan Rosiek, publisher of the Observer

Newspapers "We've lost a valuable member of our team We are grieving for our loss and for her family"

In a memo to her supervisor earlier this year, Jane said, "I think three of the most important things I can do as an employee is be flexible, constantly update my skills and recognize that change is constant I enjoy my position, bosses, co-workers and working for the finest suburban newspaper in Michigan"

"Each person brings their own personal statement to the job and makes an impression on you I feel that each person who touches our life leaves something of themselves and takes a little something of you We all learn from each other," she wrote

Jane started her career at the Observer Newspapers in 1968 in the circulation department, where she worked for many years as a secretary, then as a supervisor She resigned in 1970 to stay at home with her then-young chil-

dren — two boys "She was devoted to her boys," said Gail Smalley, who began her 16-year career at the Observer working with Garner "I didn't know anything about the newspaper business, but she showed me the ropes She was really patient"

"Jane could tell a story and make it really funny," said Smalley "I used to tell her she could be a stand-up comic"

Garner returned to the Observer and the circulation department in 1980 She became an administrative assistant in the mid-90s and worked for former Observer Publisher Banks Dishman, and most recently for Rosiek

Survivors include her husband, Ken Sr., and sons Ken Jr. and Thomas, both of Canton Township, her mother, Violet Allan of Westland, and sister Judith Allan, of Westland She was preceded in death by her father, Paul Allan, sister, Carolyn Sue Goldberg, and brother Paul Allan

Auditors praise school district's fiscal practices

The Plante & Moran audit report for the fiscal year that ended June 30 hands out praise for the fiscal responsibility shown by Plymouth-Canton Community Schools

According to the Plante & Moran synopsis, "In the prior year, we noted significant deficiencies in the financial books and records maintained by the district The business office,

including Ms Patricia Brand and Dr Dave Kaumeyer, made a significant effort to address these deficiencies in the current year and we noted significant improvement in the records that we audited for June 30, 2001 We are pleased to report that as a result of our audit, no items came to our attention that would require specific board action"

According to a memo from Patricia Brand, the district's executive director of business

services, to Superintendent Kathleen Booher, there are significant improvements in the financial records, which is in sharp contrast to the condition of the department and record keeping that was inherited by Booher when she was hired in February 2000

According to the audit, the district revenue at the end of the fiscal year was in excess of expenditures by \$1.7 million, which indicates a contribution to the fund balance

become the city's next mayor

"I think either would make a great mayor," said Dwyer "However, we need to have a very open and cordial discussion in public We have to be very careful in not making any behind-the-scenes deals I'm not going to commit my vote to anyone before Monday"

Stella Greene, re-elected to the commission after stepping down for two years, said no one has yet talked with her about who should become mayor

"I've always felt that the top vote-getter should be mayor," said Greene "However, I'm not sure how I feel about that now It may sound a bit self-serving

since I finished first But, the important thing is we discuss it among ourselves in an open meeting"

town development authority The preliminary financing plan also included a two mill tax increase to all properties along the Ann Arbor Road corridor

Plymouth Township Supervisor Steve Mann had hoped for participation from the city, but said the township will move forward

"They have to do what's best for their community, but it's not going to keep us from a beautification project that makes Plymouth Township more presentable," he said "I'm more than confident the figures we have stand up"

Another concern for commissioners was the make-up of the proposed DDA board, in which

the city would have only three of the nine members on the board

"The city is giving up a much larger percentage of incremental financing than the township is, but yet we get only a third representation on the board," said Commissioner Michele Potter

In the end, it came down to using the city's long-term money for more immediate concerns

"It's \$1.6 million the city won't have for 25 years for things like street and sewer improvements, pay for police officers, and all the things the city does," said Commissioner Sean FitzGerald



Say it with Flowers

WELL IN HAND

To make a handheld bouquet trim your selection of flowers to about seven inches and arrange them in a tight cluster grasping the stems at one point. As you add a flower to the cluster angle it so that the cluster takes on a rounded shape. If you like, complement the bouquet with a ring of leaves around the perimeter of the cluster. Wrap florist's wire around the stems starting just below the leaves. Trim any uneven stems level. As an intermediate step cover the wired area with green florist's tape to camouflage the wire and lock in moisture. (Do not cover the ends of the stems if you later want to put the bouquet in a vase.)



Home break-ins

Plymouth Township police are looking for a Plymouth Township man accused of committing two separate home break-ins, including one at the home of his stepfather, Oct 22.

The first incident occurred around 3 p.m. at a home on the 40000 block of Schoolcraft. The homeowner, who is the suspect's stepfather, reported to police the man gained entry into the home by breaking a second-story window.

The same man is suspected in another home break-in, which occurred around 6 p.m. on Farmbrook. According to the police

report, the man entered the home when the female homeowner left to go pick up a pizza.

The woman's daughter, who was downstairs, told police she heard someone walking around upstairs. Believing the person to be her brother, who occasionally visits the home, the girl came upstairs to greet him. She heard someone in the bathroom with the door closed and called out thinking it was her brother. She told police the suspect responded with a "garbled" voice.

Realizing it wasn't her brother, the girl ran back downstairs. When she did, she heard footsteps. A few moments later, she returned upstairs and observed

an unknown white male running outside toward the driveway. The girl told police she saw the man get into a burgundy vehicle and flee the scene.

Home invasion

A former Plymouth Township man reported to police that someone broke into a home he is trying to sell on the 8000 block of Briarwood.

According to the police report, the man, who now lives in Newport, Mich., said the break-in occurred sometime between Oct 18 and Oct 19. He reported a Beretta handgun, worth \$400, and a bag of coins missing from the home.

Hayes said he will also focus some of his time on combating workplace violence, which has


claimed four lives in the township since 1995.

New commissioners have plenty to ponder

The voters have spoken, loud and clear, in giving the four spots up for grabs in Tuesday's Plymouth City Commission election to Stella Greene, Phil Pursell, Ron Loiselle and Colleen Pobur

After listening to outgoing Mayor Dave McDonald in City Hall moments after totals were announced, though, we hope commissioners, new or old, were listening

McDonald couldn't wait to announce to anyone who was listening that the new mayor was "a done deal" This despite the fact selection of a new mayor is supposed to be done in a public setting at a special meeting the Monday after the election

McDonald has made no secret of the fact he thinks Pobur should be the next mayor, presumably, that's who he was talking about Tuesday night

While Pobur, an avid Plymouth cheer leader and excellent spokeswoman for the city, would almost certainly do a good job, her fourth-place finish in Tuesday's election isn't exactly a resounding mandate from the people That's what elections are supposed to be about - giving the people what they want

We think Commissioner Bill Graham, a calming influence on what has frequently been a chaotic commission, would be a better choice, if he'd accept the job

But more than anything, such backdoor dealing is exactly what voters in this town have repeatedly said they don't want People are tired of that kind of politics, it's what gives politicians a black eye

Certainly talk abounds in situations like this Some commissioners have openly said Graham would make a good mayor

Hopefully, rather than the "done deal" McDonald bragged about Tuesday, the new commission is ready to accept the challenge of listening to its citizens before making any decisions Anything else taints a process that is supposed to reflect the will of the people

Having said that, there are several issues on which the new commission is going to have to concentrate

Cohesiveness - Six of the seven commissioners on the outgoing commission pointed to David Byers as the bad apple that threatened to spoil the whole bunch For the last six months, the acrimony has been palpable

While Pobur, an excellent spokeswoman for the city, would almost certainly do a good job, her fourth-place finish in Tuesday's election isn't exactly a resounding mandate from the people.

With voters having cast Byers from the commission, the new board won't have that scapegoat To paraphrase a former US president, "The commissioners won't have Dave Byers to kick around any more" Continued disharmony would not only force them to admit it wasn't all Byers' fault, it might also force them to look in the mirror for the source

Goal setting - The outgoing commission waited 18 months to sit down together and set goals for themselves, leaving a scant eight months accomplish any of them We suggest the new commission be a bit more pro-active A goal-setting session should be a top priority

Charter review - This is something we've called for in the past, and we renew our plea The range of reasons for changes to the city charter is too vast to enumerate When five new commissioners were elected two years ago, everybody talked about reviewing the charter, but nothing was ever done The outgoing mayor talked about establishing a commission, but nothing was ever done

Something needs to be done, and done quickly This is a city charter that still calls for elections to be held in April, for crying out loud

Selection of the mayor - Outgoing Commissioner Sean FitzGerald's voice was the loudest two years ago in calling for a revision in the process by which the mayor is selected If the moot court to install Pobur as the new mayor happens at Monday's special meeting, it will prove FitzGerald was right two years ago the process needs an overhaul

There are other issues - an aging infrastructure, selection of a new police chief and potential development among them That's plenty to chew on for a new city commission just sitting down to the table

Let the dinner bell ring

Don't forget about local charities and their needs

Following the tragic events of Sept 11, Americans responded with an outpouring of generosity The American Red Cross, the Salvation Army and numerous specially dedicated funds have received millions of dollars in contributions to aid the victims of that tragic day In addition, many people found time to donate their skills in New York's massive cleanup efforts

While all of this is commendable, many local charities are reminding us that they have immediate needs much closer to home Those needs could become much greater in the months ahead as the economy continues to weaken and companies find it necessary to lay off their employees In the last month, unemployment figures had the biggest one-month spike in more than 30 years

Just as the country was reeling from the terrorist attacks, the United Way was launching its annual Torch Drive campaign on Sept 17 The campaign ends Nov 15 with a goal of \$75 million As of Friday, the United Way reported it had raised pledges for nearly \$21 million They have a long way to go and many needs to fill in their support of 130 local health and human service agencies

The declining economy may increase the need for food, shelter clothing and counseling in the metro Detroit area In addition, should we face problems from a terrorist attack, many United Way agencies would be involved in providing emergency assistance

United Way reports that last year it allocated \$3.9 million to the local American Red Cross and almost \$4.1 million to the local chapter of the Salvation Army, two agencies heavily involved in the recent rescue and relief efforts

While some may find it difficult to give as much this year, any help that can be given the United Way, the Red Cross, the Salvation Army, the Goodfellows and other charities will help those even less fortunate.

Those charities and others have obligations here as well

Karen Guerreso, office manager of the local Salvation Army, said in a recent HomeTown Life story, "I want to say that we appreciate all the donations made to New York through the Salvation Army, but don't forget our own community We'll need help here too There are a lot of new cases this year Many people live paycheck to paycheck Getting laid off puts them over the edge"

The United Way says that for every dollar contributed, 91 cents goes directly to help those in need, leaving approximately 88 cents to cover fund raising and administrative costs This money assists more than 1.4 million residents in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties, or about one in three residents

While some may find it difficult to give as much this year, any help that can be given the United Way, the Red Cross, the Salvation Army, the Goodfellows and other charities will help those even less fortunate

The next few months will be difficult times for all of us and whatever we can do will help smooth the rocky road ahead



Want DSL in Michigan? You're in for a long wait

Isn't it fascinating how hard-line ideologues can simplify otherwise complicated matters to correspond to their biases

Ask a confirmed Right-to-Lifer about teenage pregnancy, and you'll get a lecture on the benefits of abstinence. Or listen hard while a hard-left liberal discusses poverty, you're not likely to hear much about personal responsibility. Staunch conservatives, both economic and social, are united in the view that cutting taxes is the universal cure for all ills.

So it is with the developing debate over state policy concerning high-speed Internet, commonly known as broadband. Last week Gov. John Engler held a press conference to urge the legislature to help develop a plan to accelerate the spread of broadband throughout the state. Not surprisingly, The Detroit News attacked the plan as a "new tax" and therefore bad.

By now, it's pretty clear that access to high-speed Internet service is crucial to developing a high-tech economy in Michigan. Engler pointed out that investment in information technology was responsible for two-thirds of the economic growth and more than half of the productivity increases we experienced during the 1990s.

But it's also clear we lag behind other states in deployment of broadband.

With nearly 4 percent of the country's population, Michigan has just 1.3 percent of high-speed broadband phone lines (ADSL).

We are 37th in the nation in families and small businesses using high-speed lines.

Michigan is dead last among the states in capital investment per phone line.

Much of this situation has to do with the lousy record of providing broadband service of Ameritech, the state's dominant phone line provider. Customers used to be irritated at slow and inept Ameritech performance in responding to ordinary telephone service requests. Today, anybody who is trying to get a high-speed DSL (Digital Subscriber Line) from Ameritech is in for a long wait. And Ameritech won't tell anybody where its broadband lines are located or where it's planning on putting them in.

Engler's plan is aimed at jump-starting universal access to broadband throughout Michigan. It would

Set up a uniform permitting process and fee system for providers who want to lay broadband cable in local communities. Companies trying to run cable face today a bewildering maze of local requirements. Some communities - dubbed "broadband bandits" by the governor - have decided to make broadband fees into a lucrative revenue stream. Regularizing both the permitting process and leveling the playing field for fees will make it easier (and maybe more profitable) for private companies to distribute broadband services.

Create a public financing authority to provide grants and loans and to work with private telecommunications vendors to make investments in laying broadband cable, especially in rural areas. Best estimate is that something like \$300 million worth of infrastructure is needed to spread broadband throughout Michigan - far more than monopoly phone companies are willing to spend.

It's this last point that is drawing fire. In addition to calling the proposal a new tax, and therefore intrinsically evil, opponents argue that governmental intervention will create a big bureaucracy and stifle other technologies for distributing broadband, such as satellite (like DirecTV) or wireless (like cell phones).

As to the "new tax" argument, I'd respond that some times government action - and the taxes to support it - is essential in improving the lives of all citizens. Precedents exist, especially in telecommunications. State and local government subsidized telephone companies to spread service in the early days of phones. The Federal Rural Electrification Administration (REA) brought tax-supported electric service to rural areas. Most people today would agree phones and electricity are pretty essential for families in the 21st century.

With respect to the stifling-technology argument, any state financing authority worth its salt would have to be "technology neutral." That is to say, it would provide financial and regulatory help to all kinds of companies offering all kinds of broadband distribution technologies, whether cable, wireless or direct from satellite.

Opposition to Engler's plan is not just ideological, though. I'm told lobbyists representing Ameritech were sniggering in the back of the room at the governor's press conference. Perhaps some part of the opposition has to do with self-serving behavior by giant, monopolistic companies afraid of increased competition.





Sprawl proposals draw fire as violation of local control

Republican leaders in Lansing are trying to make good on their promise to address urban sprawl this fall, but now the main bill in their package is beginning to draw fire from community officials.

The concern That legislation mandating cities and townships to have "clustering" or "density shifting" options in their zoning ordinances would diminish local control.

"Clustering is a wonderful concept but it doesn't mean it is going to work everywhere in the state," said Bill Anderson, spokesman for the Michigan Townships Association and a former supervisor of Brighton Township. "I'm getting calls from communities up north where 80 percent of the land is dedicated state and federal land. The last thing they are worried about is preserving open space. They are going to have to squeeze development into what's left just to get a decent tax base."

What kind of tool?

Dar VanderArk, supervisor of Leighton Township in Allegan County, told state senators that "cluster options" are a land use and planning "tool."

"If I have to nail it to the wall, fine, I can do that. But I can't do it if somebody is telling me I have to use a saw to do it," he said. The state shouldn't tell communities which tools to use, he contended.

That argument gets little sympathy from builders and developers who favor the legislation, said Lee Schwartz of the Michigan Association of Home Builders.

"By passing this (bill), are we telling the locals what to do? Yes, but every time a developer steps into a community, he is told what to do by those same

local officials," he said.

Schwartz agrees with state Rep. Ruth Johnson, R-Holly, that every community in the state should be required to have a clustering option available for use by developers.

Every community would if lawmakers approve a three bill package - House Bills 4995, 5028 and 5029 - sponsored by Ruth Johnson and Reps. Chris Kolb, D-Ann Arbor, and Randy Richardville, R-Monroe.

Clustering allows a developer to shift homes into a portion of land in order to preserve another portion as open space. For example, in a zoning designation requiring one acre lots, the clustering option would allow the builder to take all the homes in a 20-acre development and put them into half of that land.

Although this would result in half acre lots, Ruth Johnson said, 10 acres would be permanently preserved as open space.

It's a way of saving significant environmental features, such as woodlands or wetlands, and still not violate the property rights of the developer, she said.

Low-growth communities

Many communities already offer developers a cluster option, but communities away from high-growth areas often do not. It would have to be added. Communities that do have the option available now would have to make sure their ordinances allow for enough density shifting to preserve 50 percent of the land in the development.

The idea has won the support of groups such as the Michigan Environmental Council as well as builders because it will preserve open land and encourage saving environmentally significant features of the land.

Anderson and VanderArk pointed to several other concerns about the bill.

The ordinances would be subject to referendum if residents

object.

VanderArk argued that townships could be caught in a bind if they are required to have a cluster option but voters locally toss out that ordinance in a referendum.

They also said that most communities that have cluster options in their ordinances now took several years to write them. The bills require the ordinances to be in place in one year.

"Ultimately we are back to the issue of local control," VanderArk said. "For the legislature to presume that it knows best what tools to use for land use planning across the 83 counties of this great state is ludicrous. Most legislators have never had the opportunity to serve as a member of a local planning commission. They have not had to face the property owner and his neighbors one on one in a public meeting."

Overwhelming support

Representatives voted 97-10 for passage of the main bill. The package is not pending in the Senate. Its Farming and Agribusiness Committee voted 5-0 Wednesday, Oct. 31, to send it to the floor for a vote.

House Speaker Rick Johnson, R-LeRoy, touted the land use bills as a high point and a major accomplishment of the fall session.

But it isn't the only land-use package pending. Also moving through the legislature is another three-bill package sponsored by Ruth Johnson and Rep. Patricia Birkholz, R-Sagatuck, which calls for coordination of land use and planning. The bills - House Bills 5038, 5267 and 5252 - require communities to share with and receive comments from neighboring communities on their master plans and zoning ordinances. The bills require communities to go through the process at least once every five years.





Farmington Players tackle a British farce

Emily McSweeney warns parents not to bring children under age 12 to see the Farmington Players production of *Habeas Corpus* when it opens Friday, Nov. 16, in the West Bloomfield Civic Theater inside Barnes & Noble Booksellers.

Judging from response to the same disclaimer the Farmington Players made when they presented the British farce in 1984, record crowds should once again fill the theater. Set in the silk stocking district of Hove, the comedy focuses on the English obsession with class, sex and death.

"After we said it's not recommended for children under age 12 due to sexual innuendo, it completely sold out," said McSweeney who plays Mrs. Swabb the housekeeper narrating the play. McSweeney played Muriel Wicksteed, the female lead in 1984. "It's nonsensical filled with sexual innuendo, mis taken identities. Connie gets talked into buying an appliance - false breasts - and the fitter mistakes several other women for the client. The characters are outlandish in and of themselves. Men lose their trousers. It's a physical show. There's a lot of running around the stage and in this day and age it's good for a laugh."

Linda Killewald compares *Habeas Corpus* to Vaudeville. The White Lake resident takes on the role of the female lead married to Dr. Wicksteed (played by

Jim Snideman who was also in the 1984 production.) This is her first show with Farmington Players even though she has a long list of credits with Clarkston Village Players, Stagecrafters and Village Players.

"It's very up front humor," said Killewald. "If it was America, it would be Vaudeville. There are Benny Hill overtones. It's blatant sexuality not meant to be offensive. They're extremes. I do a caricature of a very frustrated woman. Muriel is frustrated because her husband has ignored her for eons and her son is a big disappointment to her."

"The challenge is trying to stay in character. When doing British dialect it's easy to sound haughty. I'm trying to sound ditzy."

Vicki Grukke doesn't have to worry about putting on a British accent. She has bigger problems to solve. One of Alan Bennett's characters keeps trying to commit suicide throughout the play. It's Grukke's job as director to make sure the harness is in working order when actor Brett Mlnek attempts to hang himself.

The problem is finding a spot up in the rafters to hang him," joked Grukke. "I keep telling him not to worry. We'll find a way to hang him."

"But there's always that fear of what could happen," added McSweeney.

Timing is everything in the play, being in the right place at the right time, in addition to having properly functioning equipment.

"It's a hard show in that the pace is fast," said Cynthia Tupper who plays Lady Rumper Tupper and McSweeney also designed costumes for the production. "Dialogue is not that easy. It's very pompous. It's not like learning conversational dialogue. It's not as easy to memorize as things I've done before."

"It's upper class British to the point of absurdity. We're costuming my character as part of the horse set, dressing her to the nines in jodhpurs. We're dressing all of the cast to the extremes. They're very tweedy and British."

And like David McCabe's character, they're very serious about their position in life. McCabe plays Mr. Shanks, the fitter.

"He's an appliance adjuster working for a firm that furnishes appliances for women's chests," said McCabe of Farmington Hills. "Through a series of mistakes, he's adjusting the wrong people. He's a traveling salesman serious about his job."

"It's very funny, for mature audiences, an English bawdy show, a lot of laughs in the show."

The comedic element of the play is what attracted John Yono to the production. The Livonia actor plays Canon Throbbing. He was seen in *Stag 17* last season.

"He's a cleric who's over-sexed, a perverted jerk. He's very jealous, doesn't like to see other relationships work out," said Yono who works for Performance Staging and Lighting in Plymouth, which recently built the set for the new Kid Rock video.

"But when I first read it, the play sounded great and it's just a lot of fun."

Detroit's produced a bevy of household names in hip hop and rap rock - from Eminem and Kid Rock to Uncle Kracker and now D-12. The next in line is Livonia's own Paradime.

Fresh from a successful stint at Detroit's State Theatre - 1,300 people showed up for his recent CD release party - and supporting his first national release, *Vices*, Paradime (known as Freddie Beauregard) is poised to explode. He appeared on Uncle Kracker's debut *Double Wide*, and followed it touring as an opening act with Uncle Kracker and co-headliners Sugar Ray last summer.

Give him love and he'll never forget it.




It's not every day you want to catch a cold, but what about a fever? *Saturday Night Fever - The Musical* is sure to make your temperature rise.

The 1977 movie-turned-stage play is running at Detroit's Masonic Temple through Nov. 18.

It's hard to say what is so appealing about this show. The acting as a whole is mediocre, some of the singing and some of the dance routines need work, yet this is an exciting performance. It has the audience singing, tapping their feet and at one point, even dancing in the aisles.

Director and choreographer Arlene Phillips, together with Nan Knighton - who wrote the stage adaptation - did a wonderful job keeping the integrity of the film version while toning down the language and less-than-family-friendly scenes. Just the same, parents need to realize their children will hear vulgar language and be confronted with issues such as teenage pregnancy, drugs and attempted rape as members of this audience.

On the flip side, children may have a better understanding of and appreciation for the disco era after seeing this play. As someone who was born in the '70s, who has always appreciated the talent of the Bee Gees, the music has more impact when combined with the strobe lights, fog and disco dancing. Richard Blake, who plays the lead, is an excellent Tony Manero. He has the audience watching his every move from the moment he strips off his shirt. More than a few cat calls reflect audience approval.

Like young John Travolta in the movie version, Blake emanates sex appeal without giving up his boyish charm. He plays the sensitive boy aspiring to improve his life while also retaining his rough-around-the-edges street bravado, complete with a Brooklyn accent.

Though his dance moves include more gyrating than Travolta ever did, Blake mesmerizes the audience as he sways from one end of the stage to the other. With or without a partner, he is always on the move making the three-hour play feel like it's done in half the time. In addition, he is singing throughout the dancing, giving the audience every ounce of energy he's got. It's a wonder he can move at all in those tight polyester pants and silk shirt.

Jim Ambler also gives his all

to this performance. Ambler, who plays the supporting role of Bobby C, is a talented singer, able to hit those high notes for which the Bee Gees are famous. He also did a great job portraying a confused teen who dies in a drunken stupor while trying to prove his courage to friends.

Joseph Ricci provides the comic relief as Monty, the wild, womanizing, spandex-wearing dance studio owner/2001 Odyssey disc jockey. While it's not a big role, Ricci plays the part so well it is worth mentioning.

The female talent, Jeanine Meyers, who plays Manero's love interest Stephanie Manago, and Aileen Quinn, who plays Annette, played their parts well. Meyers came across as a materialistic, socialite-wanna-be, while Quinn delivered a good performance as a needy, starry-eyed girl never destined to get the man of her dreams - Tony Manero.

Whether you were born in the '30s, '40s or later, this play is something to see.

Schoolcraft's production leaves you full of laughs

"The Man Who Came To Dinner" by Moss Hart and George S. Kaufman is one of the great classic screwball comedies in American Theatre. Schoolcraft College dishes up a tasty feast of tart-tongued barbs and succulent one-liners by the lead characters. The play is loosely based on a collection of literary luminaries and show business friends who often met for lunch at the famous Algonquin Hotel in New York, to engage in witty repartee and acerbic fast-paced banter in the 1930s.

The show in some sense is a time capsule, and has been revised in some later TV and stage productions. Schoolcraft's director, Professor James Hartman, gives us the original 1939 version, and though some references to people and events may

miss their mark with younger audiences, the comedy builds to a funny ending.

The focus of the play is on the acidic Sheridan Whiteside, famed critic, radio personality and friend of the great and near-great. It is said to be a take-off on critic Alexander Woolcott. During a speaking tour in Ohio, he breaks his hip on the doorstep of the Stanley's home. Whiteside threatens a lawsuit for \$150,000 and takes over the household.

We are treated to a parade of outrageous characters stopping by for a visit. Ray Van Hoeck is terrific as Whiteside and sets the tone for the evening when he is wheeled on stage in a wheelchair, looks with disdain on his very average Midwest surroundings and says, "I think I'm going to vomit!" He savages everyone, from his hosts (Mr. and Mrs. Stanley) played nicely by Ryan-Iver Klann and Rebecca Himm, to his nurse, played by Sabrina Sanchez. Whiteside is even nasty to his secretary, Maggie Carter, especially when she becomes romantically involved with a local newspaperman and threatens to leave.

Andrea Smith gives a strong performance as the secretary and Jayse O'Brien is appealing as Bert Jefferson, an unworlly

young man being fought over by two women. Whiteside hatches a plot to keep his secretary by bringing a famous actress to town to read Bert's play. Brenda Lane is alluring as Lorraine Sheldon (a woman with a reputation for seducing her leading men) and a totally theatrical character.

Ginny Rajda creates a consistently weird sister of the Stanley's who appears to have just escaped from a Frankenstein movie. Larry Rajda is very good as the Doctor who appears at odd times, attempting to get Whiteside to read his manuscript for a book. The strangest characters, however, are some of Whiteside's friends.

Don Quigley scores as Professor Metz, who shows up with house of cockroaches. Others show up with penguins, eels and assorted animals. Benjamin Karl is brilliant as Beverly Carlton, (who was said to be Noel Coward). He looks nothing like Coward, but he creates an absolutely vivid picture of an urbane British sophisticate.

And then there is Brian Taylor, as fine a performer as you'll find in the Detroit area. He plays Banjo (said to be Harpo Marx) with the wild abandon of a young Dick Van Dyke. He

appears near the end to save Whiteside from himself, and brings the house down with his physical and well-timed comedy.

The younger and less experienced performers would do well

to pay attention to how he isn't afraid to go for it and create the extreme characterizations required by screwball comedy. Others in the large cast include Jeff Krupinski, Kellie Monthei,

Danny R. Patrick, Lindsey R. Hall, Sandra Eggers, Carol Lipski, Kyle Kopy, Jarod Robert, Benjamin W. Karl, Carl Buchin and Sarah Moeck.

Another change, Paradime's backing band now includes Jay Bodley on guitar and keyboards, Dros Adamson on bass and Drew Schmieding on drums. The musicians were discovered almost without looking. "They came to one of my shows," said Paradime. "The previous band didn't show up. They knew my stuff." Paradime invited the musicians on stage and that's where they've remained.

Bodley, who lives in Ypsilanti, said he's happy to be performing with Paradime. "Freddie was really cool," Bodley recalled. "He was so happy to find some people who were into hip hop. We all get along great."

Those behind the scenes understand a little perseverance will go

a long way. Scott Cavanary, a Mount Clemens resident met Paradime while working lights for Kid Rock around 1996. Once Atlantic Records nabbed the "American Bad Ass" Cavanary kept working with Paradime and is now considered an integral part of the live show. "Freddie was just the obvious choice," he said. "I enjoyed his music. I thought he was a great guy and I knew he was an up-and-coming talent."

Paradime understands the importance of putting on a memorable show.

"It looks more professional than a lot of the national acts," Cavanary said.

It must be working. Mark E.P. said they've earned more respect

and street credibility over the years. "Once we're onstage it's always about doing our best."

Paradime has been a featured artist and winner at the Detroit Music Awards. He's practically a staple in local music media. "It doesn't change anything except it reminds me that something is happening," he said.





Claire Holley offers simple pleasures in song

On her self-titled Yep Roc Records debut, the songstress wanders through very American territory as if on a roadtrip through her past, taking snapshots of everyday life. It's evident in titles like *Abilene*, *Pennsylvania Town* and *Mississippi*. Even up here in the Great Lakes, the trip sounds inviting.

Holley's music carries a strong story-telling quality. "I'm one of those people, I can't tell a story while I'm talking," she explained. "My husband is

very good at that. When I write songs I go on what pleases my ear more than anything. Many of them do end up like stories. I'm kinda baffled about that."

The CD, much of it written or polished during a year she spent in her grandmother's old house in Mississippi, is her third effort, but first to receive the widespread national distribution offered by Yep Roc, a label based in Chapel Hill, N.C.

"I remember when I was a little girl that would be one of my favorite things to do, go and sing with the class," said Holley. Maybe it was the array of instruments around the house when she was growing up — the autoharps, a favorite music box — or that treasured Tchaikovsky album she can still picture, whatever the reason music comes naturally to her.


"I was all but forced to take piano lessons," Holley recalled. But by the time she enrolled at Wheaton College in Illinois, she shifted focus to English literature. When an influential teacher urged her to keep a journal for class, Holley made her first attempt at writing original songs. While music had been a part of her life since childhood, creating it for herself was something new. "I got into songwriting late," she said.

Holley echoes her surroundings in song, admitting she's inspired by "the heart and the mind." For her, writing is an outlet for emotion. And while her own lyrics are the sort to stick in your mind, she admits the artists who truly inspire her do so purely with sound. Some favorites range from Radiohead, to Diana Krall, Lauryn Hill, Joni Mitchell and Stevie Wonder.

These days, Holley's been writing more instrumentals and getting a bit more personal with her music. She's begun playing electric guitar at her solo shows and feels it adds a "nice dynamic." Whether it's just Holley's gentle voice and wistful guitar or the full sound of a backing band, familiar feelings come shimmering through.



Frothy 'Serendipity' romance is great PR for Manhattan

(AP) How apropos that *Serendipity* takes its title from an Upper East Side (New York City) restaurant famous for its decadent desserts. This story of destined lovers is as sweet and frothy as the frozen hot chocolate the place is known for — and just as likely to give you a tummy ache afterward. It takes place in a Manhattan that is so idyllic, so romantic, it probably never existed — and it certainly doesn't now. Shots of the World Trade Center towers in a version that screened at the Toronto Film Festival have been excised since the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks for maximum moviegoing happiness.

What's left is practically a promotional video for New York tourism, wrapped up as a chick flick. Snowflakes gently fall, birds take flight and lampposts come alight at the most opportune moments. Reveling in all this splendor are Jonathan (John Cusack) and Sara (Kate Beckinsale). They meet cute over the last pair of black gloves in the Bloomingdale's shopping rush a few days before Christmas. It's 1990, and Jonathan and Sara are both seeing other people, but experience such a cosmic connection that they feel compelled to spend a few magical hours together, ice skating in Central Park and gazing adoringly at each other over frozen hot chocolate at — you guessed it

— Serendipity. Sara tells Jonathan she likes this restaurant because she likes the meaning of the word — fortunate accident — then proceeds to bang us over the head with all kinds of mumbo jumbo about fate and destiny and how each of us has a special someone out there, waiting. They acknowledge they're attracted to each other, but can't do anything about it. So they agree to a little game. She writes her name and number in a book (*Love in the Time of Cholera* by Gabriel Garcia Marquez), he does the same on a \$5 bill, and they put these items into circulation. If the money comes back to Sara, or the book comes back to Jonathan, they'll know they're meant to be together.

Flash forward several years later. Jonathan's still in New York, works as an ESPN producer, and is about to marry the beautiful Halie (Bridget Moynahan). Sara has moved to San Francisco, works as a counselor and is about to marry a self-absorbed New Age musician named Lars (John Corbett from *Sex and the City*). Jonathan and Sara start thinking about each other and seek each other out, with Jonathan's best friend Dean (Jeremy Piven) helping him and Sara's best friend Eve (Molly Shannon) helping her. If you've seen the ads for this movie (or seen the movies it rips off, including *An Affair to Remember*, *When Harry Met*

Sally and *Sleepless in Seattle*), you know there will be a series of excruciating near-misses before our two lovebirds are reunited. Director Peter Chelsom redeems himself somewhat from the debacle that was *Town & Country*, which also took place in a romanticized New York. *Serendipity* is lively and plucky and, thankfully, short. There are a few funny moments, most of which come from Eugene Levy as a scheming Bloomingdale's sales clerk, and he livens every scene he's in simply by showing up. Lars' self-important stage performance and music video also are good for a couple of laughs. But many of the laughs from first-time screenwriter Marc

Klein feel painfully forced. Cusack and Piven have as easy chemistry — no surprises, having grown up together in Chicago and performed opposite each other for years. But Piven's role is so large, he threatens to overtake the leads. And as an obituary writer for *The New York Times*, some of his jokes about dead people are especially uncomfortable now. Individually, Cusack and Beckinsale are charming. He's back in that lovestruck, over-the-top puppy-dog mode of *Say Anything* and *High Fidelity*. She's lovely, flirty and elusive. But they have so little in common, it's hard to figure out what binds them together. Maybe it's the sugar rush from the frozen hot chocolate.

The Gem invites you to 'Dinner'

Dinner With Friends is about love, marriage, friendship, and betrayal revolving around the lives of two 40-something couples with a long history.

This Pulitzer Prize-winning play written by Donald Margulies and now on stage at Detroit's historic Gem Theatre through December is funny, serious, sarcastic and thought-provoking.

It opens with married couple Gabe (Phil Powers) and Karen (Michelle Mountain), food writers and world travelers, hosting dinner for their friend, Beth (Barbara Coven). Giddy Gabe and Karen act like the happily long-married couple, finishing each other's sentences, serving up some good-natured ribbing along with the risotto.

At first Beth plays the good sport guest, but - maybe the wine is to blame - she eventually breaks down and reveals her husband Tom (John Lepard) has left her and their two children for another woman.

After Beth drops the bomb, she leaves for home and a stunned Gabe and Karen dissect the news from every conceivable angle. Later that evening, during a driving rainstorm, Tom comes calling to state his side of the story to Gabe, his old college

buddy, and Karen, who by now is stand-offish and siding with Beth.

In two acts, and with just the four characters, a multi-layer story is woven touching on all kinds of relationships - between husband and wife, male friends, and women who've been lifelong friends. Jealousy, rage, passion, love - all the complex emotions that together make a person who they are - come expertly into play.

The caliber of acting is so high on the part of all four principals, it's easy to become mesmerized by the story, which in the second act goes back in time 12 years earlier to the day Tom and Beth met at Gabe and Karen's summer house on Martha's Vineyard.

Powers is a veteran of the Gem's *Escanaba In Da Moonlight* in which he played Reuben Mountain is a resident artist with Jeff Daniel's Purple Rose Theatre Co where she recently completed *Orphan Train*.

Coven, as half of the warring couple, returns to the Gem stage after appearing as Peggy Lee in *The Tropical Pickle*. Lepard's long list of credits include *Orphan Train* with the Purple Rose Theatre Co and a recurring role on ABC's *General Hospital*.

The play is directed by Guy Sanville. The clever set design is



My telephone still rings several times a week. People call to ask if I can tell them what is wrong with their water heaters. They have problems such as running out of hot water while taking a shower, not enough pressure at the faucets or they've had to purchase a new dishwasher or washing machine because the old one didn't do the

The courts have ruled. The cost of having a plumber change the dip tube is anywhere from \$150 to \$200. You also want to make sure that the technician flushes out the tank the proper way or you have just spent your money for nothing.

You also have the option of buying a new tank instead of repairing and the cost is not much more.

What's wrong with this whole picture? I've stated before, all manufacturers got off cheap for a problem they created and kept secret for too long. Not only did they get away with it but they also created a market for new sales well into the millions. The six manufacturers of water tanks — yes, there's only six — have left millions of their customers boiling mad. This incident in American production is just another example of how we spend our hard-earned dollars on products which have a built-in obsolescence. Stay tuned.

I have felt very sorry for these folks. This water heater problem was a national news story going back to October 1998. It bears repeating for those of you who may be first-time readers of this column or those who simply forgot about the problem.

Bad tubes installed

Between 1993 and September 1996, most water heaters produced in this country had a defective dip tube installed in them. The total number of these units is estimated to be around 22 million and these defective dip tubes created some serious expenses for the American public. These defective tubes deteriorate inside the tanks and plug up screens on water valves located in dishwashers and washers. If you remove the aerator on your kitchen or bathroom sink and find little chalky fibers, you probably have the problem.

In the beginning everything was kept secret by the manufacturers of these tanks and not until this writer and this newspaper broke the story did the

American public know. Lawsuits were threatened or filed until a class action suit was filed in Missouri. That lawsuit superseded the other suits filed independently.



This means that if you're having the problem now, you are out of luck. Michigan Attorney General Jennifer Granholm tried desperately to help others with the problem, but she is bound by the class action settlement. The residents of Michigan are in the same position as the rest of the country. Everybody will spend their own money to resolve the problem of a defective water heater.

Fix it or buy new

It is estimated that some 18 million homeowners have this problem which now cannot be fixed at the company's expense.

GARDENING

Backyard contains surprises

Emanuel Abela of Troy retired in 2000 and has been busy with his gardening endeavors ever since. Oftentimes there are surprises in backyards that aren't seen by passersby. His garden is proof of that.

At the edge of a cement patio, Emanuel constructed a garden that is both pleasing and innovative, which he calls the rock garden. After the grass was removed, the soil was leveled before planting began.

A tall board fence serves as a perfect backdrop for the garden and holds trellises for vines and planters. Two tall evergreens grow at the end of this garden with a water fountain featured nearby.

A beautiful hibiscus blooms with bright pink blossoms, adding a bright spot to this corner. Another white hibiscus grows close by Emanuel edged his garden with 12-inch brick pavers to give it more prominence.

Marigolds, tall lilies, gerani-

ums, and purple and white alyssum add color. Two trellises sport vines with purple blooms. Emanuel has filled different kinds of planters with an array of flowers. For instance, the strawberry jar at his feet in the photo is surrounded by white alyssum. It is filled with the succulent Hens-and-Chicks.

On either side of a tall wrought-iron arch at another edge of the patio, two angels stand amid succulents with a large hanging planter of deep pink and purple Million Bells petunias above them. One angel is a little girl, the other a little boy.

"My wife Maggie loves angels," Emanuel said.

Several more angel figures are strategically placed along with whimsical ones, such as a panda bear, deer, a windmill and a birdbath. Around the edges of the yard are colorful plants with several bird feeders and birdhouses that entice birds to the yard. Nearby is a small pond that

the couple built together. It is a source of much pleasure and also loved by the birds.

Watering each day took about an hour. Miracle-Gro fertilizer was used. When fall cleanup time arrives, the beautiful hibiscus is cut down to the ground, it comes up each year.

"It is very easy to care for," Maggie said.

Benches and chairs sit on the patio so that the couple can easily enjoy their garden.

Emanuel was a winner in our High Hopes Sunflower Contest last summer, with a plant that was 13 feet, 2 inches tall.

Many gardens are small and sometimes present a challenge when designed. Peter Loewer, author of *The New Small Garden* (Stackpole Books), has five garden maxims for such a design.

1. Plan for the eventual size of a plant. Visualize what it will become five or 10 years from the day you plant it.

2. Match the plant to the con-

ditions. A bush that requires perfect drainage won't be happy in heavy clay.

3. Avoid straight lines unless you're planting in an area that has a direct relationship to an adjoining building. They are never found in nature and soon become boring to look at and impossible to maintain. A gentle and sweeping curve looks much better and is easier both to install and to keep up.

4. Break the rules. Although all the books tell you to put the large plants at the back of the border or garden area, then slot the medium plants for the middle, and place the shortest in the front, there are times and places to try the unexpected.

Put a tall plant at the front, for example, so its stems can artfully drape over the smaller plants, lending an air of mystery to the border.

5. Trust your own esthetic judgment. After all, it is your garden and should reflect your likes and dislikes, not those of some expert you don't even know and would never invite home to dinner.

Winterize your sprinklers yourself

The underground sprinkler is another story, however. As usual, I waited until after Halloween

Some never winterize

I know several people who never winterize their under-

ground systems. They say most of the water drains from the system through the sprinkler heads and the supply lines are flexible enough to handle expansion from the little bit of water left in there when it freezes. So they say

Though professionals get the job done much faster, being frugal (cheap), I use my little 3-horsepower air compressor with its 5-gallon tank to do this job myself. And it really doesn't take that long. It usually takes me no longer than the time to drink a cup of coffee (maybe two, if it is really cold outside)

I guess there may be some truth to this, I mean it seems to work for them. But the thought of digging up and repairing damaged supply lines in the spring is enough to get me out to blow out my sprinkler lines

Turn off the water supply to the sprinkler. To put the air pressure through the system, I've threaded a quick connector (the kind used on air-powered tools) into the lower test valve on the vacuum breaker. This connector mates with the quick connect fitting on the end of my air hose

Fill the air compressor tank to about 120 pounds per square inch, before the automatic shut-off turns off the motor (I set the regulator to about 60 psi and connect the air hose to test valve. Be certain the test valve is in the open position)

Open each zone manually, one at a time, at your control box. Let the air flow through the lines until the last head in that zone is clear of water, then move on to the next zone. I've found it usu-

Clean 'em out

ally takes two or three tanks of air per zone

When the pressure at the regulator falls below 40 psi (the compressor motor will start at about 80 psi), close the test valve or disconnect the hose from the test valve until the tank refills. Repeat the process until the zone is clear. A reading of 60 psi is usually enough pressure to push to water out of the supply lines without damaging equipment

When the sprinkler lines are clear, leave all valves in the half-open position, except the main shutoff, which is left in the off position. Remove and store the drain cap, if there is one on your system



After years of rigorous practices and high hopes, five local skaters from Riverside Roller Rink in Livonia are realizing their dreams by being selected to compete in the Junior and Senior World Artistic Roller Skating Championships this month in Florence, Italy.

Each of the young women are from Artistic Club and have collectively broken a record for being the largest group from the skating rink to go to the world championship in one year.

"They all came in at 5 and 6 years old and said 'I want to be a world class skater,' and they've all, through hard work and dedication, made their goal to be on a world team representing the United States," explained Vickie Hudson of South Lyon who teaches the skaters with Petra Dayney, who lives in Toledo, Ohio.

Team effort

Tracey Wilson, 19, of Livonia and Marie Hayden, 20, of Northville will compete in world class ladies figures on a senior level during the event Nov. 13-24. Both women are former junior world champions.

Sarah Baldwin, 15, and Christine Jarrett, 17, both of Livonia, will skate in the junior world and figure skating competitions.

Heather Menard, 16, lives in Garden City and will compete in the junior level of the international dance section with her partner, Matthew Finlay, from LaGrange, Ohio.

Tracey's mother, Sue Wilson, reflected on the incredible commitment her daughter has made during 15 years of skating and what seemed like endless practices.

"It's lots of hard work and lots of money because we have to pay the entry fees for her to skate," Sue Wilson explained. Tracey was the gold medalist in the United States national competition this year and captured the junior world championship in 1998 and 1999. She also won third place in the senior division last year.

"She's hoping to win this year," Sue Wilson said. "This is wonderful. It's been a good experience for her and she's made a lot of friends. She's the greatest kid. She's never gotten into trouble and I think it's because this has kept her busy."


Tracey Wilson practices daily for at least four hours. She also works at Westland Convalescent Center and attends Schoolcraft College, where she's studying to become a registered nurse.

"There was a lot of nagging when she was younger and now that she's older, the past 10 years, she's devoted her life to it," Sue Wilson said. "Pretty much the whole family (which also includes her father, Larry and brother, Larry, Jr., 13) has devoted their lives to it. We take no family vacations."

Hayden, a student at the University of Michigan working toward a major in communications and a minor in statistics, won a silver medal during the national competition this year.

She will be competing for the seventh time on a world level. The first two of those competitions were junior world and she won both. She also won one silver medal at the world level.

"I'm really excited about going to Italy, because I've heard how beautiful

it is there," Hayden said. "Skating wise, I'm a little nervous, but hopefully, everything will turn out well. It's very nerve-racking, because the judges stand right over you to look for mistakes and to see that you're doing everything that you're required to do. Over the years I've gotten nervous, but it's a little better every time."

Skating develops perfectionism in all aspects of life, Hayden said, "because it's so precise." Every little mistake you make, you are deducted for it. Trying to be perfect in that rubs off on every day things.

Working toward perfect skating is something Menard, an 11th grade student at Garden City High School, does during practices that she refers to as difficult, "but well worth it."

"It takes a lot of hard work, and a lot of time and effort, but there's so many rewards," she said. "You get to travel. There's also invitationals, regionals and national championships all over the United States, as well as other world competitions."

In nine years of competitive dancing, Menard has won first place at the national championship and 10 awards during elementary and junior world class events.

Jarrett, 17, a Stevenson High School senior, won fourth place in the world championship last year when it was held in Massachusetts. She has practiced three hours a day seven days a week for 11 years and hopes to coach other skaters someday. Jarrett said she would also like to earn a degree in teaching.

"If you keep your head up and keep trying, eventually you will achieve your dream," she said. "This is what we've been dreaming of since we started. It's a lot of work and a lot of concentration and dedication. If you work for it, you will get it."

Baldwin, a 10th grade student at Churchill High School in Livonia, said she has been working toward this competition since she started skating. If she doesn't win, "that's fine too — it's just the fact that I can go."

She hopes to attend U of M and apply her talents in art at a future job someday.

"I'll probably still be skating for a few years after high school," she said. "Maybe I can teach new kids who are learning how to skate. I'd like to do that."

Accomplished

Each of the girls have already reached a high level in roller-skating competitions. There's a lot of levels to climb before getting into the world competition, including local, state, regional and national competitions.

Hudson, who has been teaching roller skating for 40 years, said the self-discipline it takes to reach the level these girls have attained, spills over into other areas of their lives.

"All of these kids are all A students, are in accelerated classes at school and are on the honor roll," she said. "In any sport, when you do it 100 percent, they have goals set when they're young."

A typical day in the life of a skater is attending school all day, going straight to the roller rink, skating for three hours, returning home, doing homework and going to bed. Some of the elementary school students skate before school from 6-8 a.m.

"I've been really lucky, because I've worked with the best coaches in the world and I've learned a lot," she added. "There's always something to learn. My goal was that all these kids, who eight years ago were in my Saturday class, would go to the world level and they're all going. It's really nice for me that they all made it together at the same time."

Lionel LaMay, who owns the rink with his wife, Debra LaMay, said teachers Dayney and Hudson used a lot of talent and fortitude to help the young skaters come this far. "What they've done is quite an accomplishment," said Lionel LaMay.

Beauty is in the eyes of a child

One of the nice things about having kids is that you get to re-live your childhood in little bits and pieces.

I was thinking about this the other day after I looked at the mess Mother Nature had left on our front lawn. The day before I had spent the better part of two hours raking mounds of leaves into the street. I felt a small sense of accomplishment when the yard finally resumed some semblance of looking neat and tidy.

But here it was the next morning, and you never would have known the difference. The grass was carpeted with even more leaves than there had been the day before. I peered out the window at the two majestic maple trees towering overhead and sighed. They were only about half-done. Multitudes of golden leaves were still to come, not to mention all the hordes that lay in waiting in the backyard. My back and arms ached from all that raking. My hand still smarted from the splinter that I got from holding the rake.

But my children had a completely different reaction.

"Cool!" my 5-year-old daughter said upon seeing the latest blanket of leaves to cover our tiny parcel of earth. "Let's make a pile!"

And there lies the great divide between adulthood and childhood. We tend to look at things like leaves and automatically think of the work they represent, or worry about how long it will be before they're gone for good. But when you have children running, jumping and burying themselves in mountains of leaves with glee, you can't help but stop and enjoy the gorgeous spectrum of autumn color.

When your kids don't inner tubes from the drained kiddie pool and actually plunge into the leaves like it's shimmering, cool water on a sweltering summer's day, you have no choice but to toss aside any cynicism for the moment and enjoy fall's brief beauty unfold.

Funny how simple, everyday things like leaves, or clouds, or bugs can sometimes allow you to see the world through the eyes of a child. To them, leaves aren't a mess to clean up or an obligation to fulfill. They're just crisp, colorful, irresistible piles of play. When you're a kid, clouds don't get in the way, to borrow a phrase from the classic Joni Mitchell song. They're "mysterious and fanciful, they come in wonderful shapes of animals and fairy tale characters. When you're a child, fire flies are magic. Ladybugs are fascinating creatures, not annoying pests that invade your home."

Once we were walking through a parking lot when my daughter suddenly stopped dead in her tracks. "Moomm," she oohed in pure amazement, "look at the rainbow!"

I gazed up, but it was a sunny day and I didn't have the slightest idea what she was talking about. Then I realized she was staring down at the pavement. It was just an oil stain, but she was mesmerized by the blurry watercolor-like rings inside of it.

Something similar happened again recently when my 2-year-old came up to me in the kitchen and kept saying, "Shooting star. Shooting star." I gazed out the window into the darkness, but it was a misty night with heavy clouds and patchy fog. There were no stars in sight.

"Shooting star. Shooting star." Finally I picked her up and held her so we could look out the kitchen window together. "There are no stars out tonight. Ern. See?"

Then she pointed her finger at the street light in the distance. "Right there," she whispered in awe. "Shooting star."

I looked again. The combination of the haze outside and condensation on the window made the street light appear like a beautiful star radiating streams of light.

"Wow, you're right. Ern," I told her. "It is a shooting star."

Sure, raking leaves is a royal pain. But at least I can occasionally return to the wonder years through the eyes of my children and appreciate the splendor of fall.

Winter's coming soon. Maybe they'll help me appreciate snow.

Seminar to help people better understand Islam

In an effort to help individuals and families better understand the similarities and differences between Islam and Christianity, the Rev. Fouad Masri, founder of Arab International Ministry, will appear during a day-long seminar at NorthRidge Church in Plymouth.

Masri, who started the ministry in 1993 to help Americans "understand Islam" and assist Christian Americans to "better communicate with their Muslim friends and neighbors," will follow up with a second visit to the church Nov. 17 in response to the events of Sept. 11.

"I know some of the pastors there and spoke last year on understanding Islam," said Masri. "Since Sept. 11 we connected again, and I'll be lecturing with additional information and a new presentation."

Masri will highlight Islam, Islamic rituals, Islam

divisions and understanding militant Islam.

"Responsible Americans should know about militant Islam," added Masri.

Organizers hope that the one-day seminar be "specifically designed for Americans and Christians to help dispel misconceptions and get a clear understanding that is not always presented," a NorthRidge spokesman said.

Misunderstanding

Masri said two of the biggest misconceptions he encounters are that "all Muslims and Arabs are the same," and that "Islam and Christianity are the same." There are some similarities and differences, he said.

Masri, who is also executive director of AIM, holds a master's degree in Islamic studies. He said he hopes the seminar dispels misinformation held by both the church and Americans.

"People who attend the seminar will leave with information that is comforting and with a better

understanding of how to talk to their Muslim friends. I hope people take this chance to invite their Muslim neighbors and see it as a goodwill opportunity."

■ Building bridges: Communicating with Muslim neighbors
■ Open question-and-answer session

These were the best two basketball teams during the Western Lakes Activities Association's regular season. In Wednesday's WLAA Tournament final, they played like it.

Plymouth Salem emerged with the title, outlasting Farmington Harrison 51-45 in an overtime nailbiter played Wednesday at Farmington HS.

The win gave the Rocks something else they'd never had: a perfect 20-0 season, first in school history. The tournament title was also their third straight.

Harrison ends the regular season at 11-9.

"They deserved a game like that," coach Fred Thomann said of his Salem team. "They deserved to win a game like that."

It was a game filled with pressure, the Rocks trying to maintain their unbeaten status, the Hawks trying to upend the regular-season champs. Both teams played to their capacity, indeed, as the pressure grew, their determination increased.

In the end, the game was decided by free throws and defense. Harrison kept Salem from scoring a basket in the game's last 7:37, however, the Rocks forced their Hawk counterparts into 2-for-12 shooting from the floor in the final 12 minutes.

There wasn't a basket scored by either side in OT.

But Salem made 8 of 12 free throws in the extra session to Harrison's 2-for-2. The Rocks took just one shot at the basket, the Hawks were 0-for-5.

"We were getting the ball into Ayana's hands," said Harrison coach Pete Mantyla, referring to his all-conference senior point guard, Ayana Richmond. "Once it left her hands, we couldn't get it back to her. They were denying that."

The Hawks' full-court pressure caused problems for Salem, at least at the start. The Rocks' first four possessions ended with turnovers. But that

stopped when Kelly Jaskot started draining three-pointers — three of them in the first quarter, as Salem opened up a 15-5 lead entering the second.

"Three threes in the first quarter," said Mantyla. "We didn't do a good job of talking (defensively) in that quarter."

The Hawks didn't do a good job shooting, either. They were just 1-of-9 in the opening quarter. But that all changed in the second period.

Salem's biggest lead of the game came courtesy of a MaryLou Liebau basket with 3:36 left in the second quarter that made it 18-7. It was all Hawks the rest of the half, they closed the quarter with a 9-2 run, Richmond's three free throws after a foul on a desperation three-point try at the buzzer cutting the Rocks' lead to 20-16.

The third quarter was everything the

rest of the game was not. All offense, with Harrison winning this duel, outscoring Salem 20-15 in the period to take a 36-35 lead into the fourth. Bryanna Porter, a 5-foot-11 senior center, came off the bench to ignite Harrison, scoring nine points down in the post. She finished with 10 in the game.

The Rocks tried to keep pace with Liebau, who netted nine of their 15 points in the quarter. Still, they trailed entering the fourth — which was a war of nerves, start to finish.

Salem started well, outscoring Harrison 6-2 in the first four minutes to take a three-point lead. But fouls were taking a toll on both sides, Liebau drew her fourth with 6:01 left in the fourth, while Maggie Condeni got her fourth with 1:23 left in the third.

A Condeni basket pulled Harrison to within 43-41 of Salem with 3:21 left. After that, the Rocks did something

they hadn't done all season. They put on a display of four corners offense that would have made Dean Smith proud. Despite Harrison's hounding defense, Salem ran it effectively enough to take 2 1/2 minutes off the clock.

"We never had to use it this season," said Thomann. "But we worked on it all year."

Problem was, the Rocks didn't convert their free throws when they needed to, when the Hawks fouled Jaskot missed two and Marissa Sarkesian and Stephane Philips each misfired on the front ends of 1-and-1s in the final minute.

That left the gate open, and Harrison walked through when Jamila Fair rebounded a Richmond miss and converted the putback, knotting it at 43-all with 22 left and ultimately led to

Canton slips at state; Salem's Hajduk 6th

Perhaps too much was expected. After all, Plymouth Canton's boys cross country team had accomplished more this season than people anticipated, winning the Western Lakes Activities Association and finishing second to eventual state champ Redford Catholic Central at the regional.

"I thought on a good day, we'd have a chance to break into the top 10," said Canton coach Bill Boyd. "I knew we had the potential."

The Chiefs had displayed both talent and determination in winning the WLAA meet and placing second at the regional. But they couldn't quite pull it together at last Saturday's Division I Boys State Final, run at Michigan International Speedway in Brooklyn.

A pair of WLAA records went down the drain Saturday when Livonia Stevenson swam away with the league championship at Plymouth Salem.



At the start of the 2000-01 men's basketball season, Madonna University did something it hadn't done before — it won its first two games

For a team that has never won 10 games in a season, a 500 campaign would be a success And that is certainly attainable

It starts with returnees Mike Massey, a 6-foot-2 senior guard who set a school record by averaging 21.4 points a game last season, Aaron Cox, a 6-foot junior guard, Dan Kurtinaitis, a 6-3 junior guard, Chad Nadoln, a 6-7 sophomore forward, John Bennett, a 6-5 sophomore forward (from Livonia Churchill), and Joe Greene, a 6-foot sophomore guard

Not much size there, but there wasn't much to lose Of the four players from last year's team not returning, only 6-5 center Narvin Russaw — who graduated — saw appreciable minutes

"When he was gone, we were in trouble," said Holowicki of Russaw

Holowicki's new recruits should help the inside game Top in the size department is Jimmy Woodworth, a 6-6 sophomore

center from Corunna, and Tony Jancevski, a 6-8 sophomore from Plymouth Salem who played a year at Schoolcraft College

Madonna's planning a re-run for the title

Rough start, great finish — almost. That summarizes Madonna University's 2000-01 women's basketball season. After a 5-8 start, the Fighting Crusaders went 13-4, finishing first in the Wolverine-Hoosier Athletic Conference — only to lose to Cornerstone College in the WHAC Tournament final.

"It felt good because Cornerstone went on and won two games in the (NAIA) Tournament," said Madonna coach Marylou Jansen. "But the girls never thought they lost to a better team."

This season could start much the same for the Crusaders, but for a different reason. Last season's team, with six seniors and loads of experience, was pretty much established. Those six seniors — starters Kristi Fiorentz, Melissa Poma and Michelle Misla, and subs Lori Enfield, Jackie Kous and Jamie Bobrowski — are gone.

Which means it's a whole new ball game — almost.

The Crusaders do have some very prominent players returning. At the top of that list is 5-foot-11 senior forward Kathy Panganis, an All-American selection last season who averaged 15.7 points and 6.3 rebounds a game.

"She does things in practice that make me drop my whistle and just watch for a while," said Jansen.

Panganis will share the team's captaincy with fellow seniors Mahogany Fletcher, a 5-7 guard (from Farmington Harrison), and Carissa Gizecki, a 5-6 guard. Fletcher averaged 8.7 points and 2.5 steals. Gizecki averaged seven points, 5.9 assists, 4.3 rebounds and 2.8 steals while being named second team all-WHAC.

Also back are junior guard Lorian Tschirhart, sopho-

more forward Tera Morrill (Westland/Livonia Franklin) and junior guard Nikki Blaszak. Morrill could be a major factor once she joins the team, she is currently playing for Madonna's volleyball team. So is Hayley Myers, who played for Madonna two years ago, allowing her to retain sophomore status.

The six players lost to graduation will leave holes that must be filled by newcomers. Most prominent is 5-11 junior center/forward Lindsay Simmon, a transfer from Aquinas College. As a freshman, she was named to the WHAC's all-rookie team.

Another post presence will be Courtney Rehbine, a 6-2 sophomore. Rehbine hasn't played much basketball, but at Macomb CC last year she averaged six points and 18 rebounds a game.

"She's going to play that big girl's role," said Jansen. "She really runs the floor well and she wants the ball. Every week she's improving."

Jansen is also relying on freshmen Stacy Brinkman, Jennifer Hunley (Redford/Livonia Ladywood) and Marwa Ayoub to produce. "All three are going to contribute," the Madonna coach said. "I'm so excited about our freshmen group. All of them can run the floor. They will play and be an integral part of the team."

Rehbine and Simmon will be relied upon early in the season until Morrill (a 5-11 forward) and Myers (a 6-1 center) are ready. Which means that, with new faces in the lineup and some late additions to the team, it may take until January before the team begins to jell.

Just like last year — hopefully.

SC has championship stuff

It's a new season, and Schoolcraft College women's basketball coach Karen Lafata hopes this one will pick up where the last one left off.

Last March the Lady Ocelots reached the NJCAA Tournament, finishing sixth in the nation. They were 27-6 overall, 14-2 in the Michigan Community College Athletic Association's Eastern Conference.

Gone from that team are some key contributors Angelica Blakely, Ra'Sheida Edwards and Janell Olson. The question now is Can the incoming make up for the outgoing?

Lafata thinks yes — well, maybe. "We'll be a little bit quicker than last year," she said. "The question will be their mental toughness. That is yet to be determined with this team."

To that end, Lafata started this season playing a pair of four-year Canadian schools. On Friday, they were clubbed by Carleton College 70-50, on Saturday, they bounced back to top Windsor College 63-56.

"I wasn't pleased with the second half of the first game," she said. "We shot something like 20 percent from the floor (actually, it was 6-for-38, 15.7 percent). Offensively, we just couldn't score."

"The second game was completely different."

Which was nice to see. Last season, the Ocelots started with two easy games in Chicago. Lafata was hoping this year's tougher start would reap a tougher team. The Ocelots' bounce-back in the second game buoyed her hopes.

"We have a solid core," she said. "We're just trying to piece it together."

It starts with Rachel Eley, a 5-3 sophomore guard who was an NJCAA All-American last year. Two other returning starters are 5-10 forward Devin Francois and 6-0 center Keysa Hamilton.

Krystol Dennis, a 6-3 center (from Redford St. Agatha), and Kelly Grenan, a 5-8 guard (from Redford Thurston), both saw considerable action off the bench

last season and should be major factors this year.

There are others. Like Kera Hill, a 5-5 sophomore guard who played for Lafata when she coached Macomb CC four years ago and has one year of eligibility left. And Pam Wingate, a 6-1 center from Southfield-Lathrup who Lafata said "played very well for us" over the weekend.

A pair of freshmen guards from Detroit Murray Wright, Shneisha Jackson and Monacal Peoples, will help as well.

The team's strengths start with its "speed and quickness," Lafata said. "And our perimeter play. We can also go deep into the bench. Our bench play will be solid."

"Right now, we're just putting things together as a team — our offensive execution, fitting people into the rotation, that kind of thing."

Difficult to predict who will challenge the Ocelots, the conference champions in two of Lafata's three seasons as coach. Both Delta CC and Mott CC, which finished just behind SC, have lost a lot. The question is, how well have they recruited?

Henry Ford CC has size and speed. The question is, can any of them match the talent Lafata has assembled at SC?

Don't count on it.

SC splits

Call it first-game jitters or whatever, Schoolcraft College simply looked awful in the second half of its season-opener against Carleton College Friday, played at the St. Denis Centre in Windsor.

Carleton outscored the Ocelots 36-15 in the second half to win 70-50. Rachel Eley led SC with 14 points, she also had nine steals. Pam Wingate added 11 points and nine rebounds, Kera Hill scored nine points, and Devin Francois finished with five points and 11 boards.

Carleton got 19 points from Anne McDonnell and 16 from Dasa Farthing.

Things went better for the

Ocelots on Saturday. They evened their record at 1-1, extending a two-point halftime lead to 10 in the second half before settling for a 63-56 win.

Hill's 10 points topped SC, she also had five assists and three steals. Rachel Eley added nine points, eight rebounds, seven

assists and four steals, and Francois had nine points and nine rebounds. Kelly Grenan and Wingate chipped in with eight points apiece.

Karie Jackson had 16 points for Windsor. Sam LeClair contributed 11.







The Northville foursome of Carr, Hogan, Erin Schubert and Dierdre Schwirring improved their first-place clocking of a year ago with a time of 1:40:11 after going 1:41:66 last year.

"This team is pretty good," he said. "The kids swam very well. It's always nice when they do that."

One of the team aspects that

worked for the Spartans was its depth.

Stevenson had 17 different swimmers place in the top 12 of an event. Salem had 10, North Farmington nine and Northville eight.

The meet scored to 12 places in the relays and to 18 in individual events.

"Our team was very pleased to finish second," North's Duthie said. "Quite honestly, anybody with a reasonable view on the meet knew that second place was going to be about as good as anybody was going to get except for Stevenson."

"We wanted our kids to do just as well as they could. There are a lot of factors you can't control that determine what place you take."

"I was proud of our kids that qualified for state," Phill said. "(Jessica) Lis dropped over 4 1/2 seconds to qualify for states in the 200 free," Phill said, noting her 2:01:01 in the preliminaries got her into the state meet.

Teammate Stephanie Cummings qualified in two events, the 200 IM, where her 2:17:08 in the prelims got her in, and in the 100 backstroke, where she was clocked in 1:07:70 to make the meet.

"Erin Cook came from behind to win the 500 (freestyle), in 5:21:54 and qualified for the state."

Andrea Giczewski finished second to McErlan in the 100 backstroke and her 1:01:69 qualified her for the state meet. Julie Ward was runner-up to Hurn in the 100 breaststroke, also qualifying for the state meet.

"We had four events where we had three in the top six and two more where we had two in the top six," Phill said. "We've got a pretty deep team."

"And when they swim well like that, we're tough to beat."



Canadians act to limit residency

Is the Canadian government taking any action to enforce "need to reside" regulations?

The concept of eligible residence was introduced in the 1960s. The intent was to ensure residential lands in national parks were occupied by people who needed to live in the parks for their jobs.

Enforcement has been problematic because of difficulties with the regulations. The Canadian government is trying to change the regulations to ensure that action can be taken against lease holders who are in contravention of the Canadian National Park regulations.

The strategy apparently will focus on people who do need to live in the national park communities at Banff, Jasper and Lake Louise.

The government will conduct an annual random audit of all residential leases.

All three share ideas on what makes for a successful Realtor, advice to newcomers and the future of their profession.

On success

Taylor: "I think being a successful Realtor is more a way of doing business than the business you do. The way you treat people in the industry, the way you treat the public, the way you treat yourself."

Nowak: "Honesty, integrity, being willing to work hard is likely to please people. You need to be motivated somewhat by money."

"Success is based on the individual, what they're looking for."

Spiro: "I think success is a balance of your professional, personal and family life. A good Realtor finds that balance."

Advice to newcomers

Spiro: "Contact your entire sphere of influence and let them know about your new career."

"I'd try to find an agent in my office that has a work ethic, qualities I admire, and I would ask them if they'd be willing to mentor me."

"I think it's important to find an office with a good support system. Some offices are geared to experienced agents, others may work with newcomers better."

"They should get involved early on with their association. Educational programs and networking is everything in this business."

Taylor: "I would touch on two things I would encourage people to get involved in (in office and association activities). You'll get the opportunity to meet some incredibly successful people."

"The other thing is we are independent contractors to the point where literally you are your own boss. Since you're your own boss, be a taskmaster."

Nowak: "The failure rate is over 50 percent."

"You should have six months to a year of income tucked away. It will take a while to earn money. It will take two or three years to develop things, to get the ball rolling."

What's ahead

Nowak: "I think in the future, we'll do less (personal) showing and still accomplish the same amount. Twenty percent of my calls last year were generated by the computer and it's growing. Agents need to be computer literate."

Spiro: "Most of my communication with clients, following up with someone, is e-mail."

"I still believe this is a people business where transferees are dependent

on a Realtor for tying everything together - communicating information, visiting schools, touring neighborhoods."

Taylor: "Consolidation in every way we do business - whether it's brokers, associations or multiple listing services. It's the only way to economically address needs."

Nowak, 56, has been in the business 24 years. He's a director of the North Oakland County board and serves on its professional standards and technology committees.

He's also a director of the Realcomp II multilisting service and serves on its user committee.

Nowak is dad to Sarah and Becky and enjoys fishing, hunting and cooking - "not necessarily in that order" - when not working.

Refinancing looks good now, later

The question is not "if" you are going to refinance, it is "when." The Fed cannot give banks much more in the form of rate cuts. The prime is almost bottomed out. Mortgage lenders have lowered interest rates on most long-term products and nearly all short-term loans. In the wake of the last week's announcement that the US Treasury

will cease issuing 30-year bonds, it seems that even lower interest rates may become a reality soon.

There is no proven method to predict how far mortgage rates will drop. Many thought that after Federal Reserve Chairman Alan Greenspan's first half-dozen rate cuts we would be seeing much better long-term interest rates than we are currently seeing.

Perplexed customers incessantly ask me why the rates are not lower and often follow up with a query of when we can expect them to drop again.

I am not an economist nor am I a board member of a major bank. As a loan officer looking in from the outside, however, it seems that in this time of uncertainty few investors - especially those markedly conservative types in authority positions of major lending institutions - are willing to lend long-term money based on short-term conditions.

So what does it all mean to us? Well, practically speaking it means nothing. If you feel inclined to refinance right now, you would be well served to do so because the rates are very good. If you choose to wait to see what effect the changes in federal monetary and fiscal policy will have come spring, you probably will not go wrong there either. If you hedge your bet by doing both, you may just win twice in a row.

Borrowers buying homes should be equally enthusiastic with current mortgage rates. Notwithstanding the seasonably low number of homes on the market, those who are able to find their next abode will certainly have an easier time qualifying for it. In most cases, these homebuyers will be able to get much more home for their money than they would have just a few short months ago.







Rates for 30-year, 15-year mortgages edge downward

Mortgage rates around the country edged down this week except for one-year adjustable rates which crept up. Rates on 30-year mortgages dipped to their lowest level in three years.

The average interest rate on 30-year fixed-rate mortgages fell to 6.56 percent, down from 6.64 percent last week, according to the nationwide survey released by Freddie Mac, the mortgage company.

It marked the 12th week in a row that 30-year mortgages have been under 7 percent and was the lowest level since Oct. 9, 1998, when rates averaged 6.49 percent.

Fifteen-year mortgages, a popular

option for refinancing, edged down to 6.04 percent this week, compared with 6.13 percent the previous week.

A year ago, rates for 30-year mortgages averaged 7.73 percent and rates for 15-year mortgages averaged 7.41 percent.

On one-year adjustable-rate mortgages, lenders were asking an average initial rate of 5.26 percent, up slightly from 5.25 percent from the previous week. Last year at this time, ARMs stood at 7.12 percent.

These rates do not include add-on fees known as points, which averaged around 1 percent of the loan amount for all three types of mortgages.
