

Man about town Grutza delivers community effort

Walk through the front door at Jim Grutza's Papa Romano's restaurant on Ann Arbor Road and the first thing you notice, stacked against the front wall is dozens of boxes of gourmet nuts being sold as a b Canton Kiwanis Chub

fund-raiser for the Plymouth Canton Kiwanis Club That tells you all you need to know about Grutza, a

community minded business owner who hasn t yet learned how to say no to a good cause 'I've never said no,' Grutza says with a laugh 'But

I've never said ho, Grutza says with a ladge But I've compromised a few times "

Not very often, though Grutza, a Canton resident, 1s

"I get around," he said, laughing again

It's been that way ever since he arrived in town when he bought his first Papa Romano's, the old carry out/delivery store at the corner of his current development He got into the pizza business by chance, after working for years as a plant manager for a titanium ser vice center in Farmington Hills and, before that, as a line supervisor at Chrysler's Warren Stamping plant

After getting divorced in 1986 Grutza found himself in need of extra money so he took a second job delivering pizzas for the Papa Romano's in Farmington Hills But when a promotion at his main job forced him to travel he had to give it up

But fate smiled on him Shortly after that a Papa Romano's franchisor called him and said the Plymouth store was available, with a catch — a \$120 000 catch Freshly divorced and devoid of that much cash, but with a desire to own his own business Grutza needed an angle

Appeal filed in Harvey lawsuit

Plymouth Township officials think Wayne County Circuit Court Judge Susan Borman was wrong to let the Whistleblower portion of Rosemary Harvey's lawsuit stand And they've filed an emergency appeal to the Court of Appeals to stop it

Township lawyers will ask Borman Monday to delay further court-room discussion until the Court of Appeals rules on their motion

"Obviously, we think (Borman) should have dismissed the suit in its entirety," Plymouth Township Supervisor Steve Mann said

Harvey is suing the township over her December 2000 firing, saying she should have been protected by the Whistleblower Protection Act after reporting alleged malfeasance on the part of township treasurer Ron Edwards to the state

The former township board reorganized township responsibilities, eliminating Harvey's position as director of administrative services in November 2000 At the first meeting of the new township board two weeks later, the new board declined to revisit the issue A month later, Mann followed up and terminated Harvey's contract

Harvey's original suit also sought to name Edwards as an individual defend dant (a claim that's still up in the air) and claimed her termination was wrongful Those were taken under advisement by Borman and later dropped by Harvey However Borman appeared to reverse herself in court last week on the issue of whether Edwards has governmental immunity

Edwards has governmental immunity Meanwhile there has been some movement over a possible settlement

one of the busiest, if not most visible, community activists He's been president of the Kiwanis, and now serves as a regional lieutenant governor He's on the board for the Plymouth International Ice Sculpture Spectacular He's heavily involved with projects involving the schools

Most recently, he accepted appointment to the new Plymouth Township Downtown Development Authority Board of Directors "I formed a corporation and sold stock to friends and relatives who had the money," he recalled "Then I paid them off and owned my own store"

Local museum seeks historical photos, artifacts

The Plymouth Historical Society is collaborating with a Chicago-based publisher to print a book detailing the history of Plymouth

As part of the effort, the society is looking for pictures and artifacts dating earlier than 1920 as it works with Arcadia Publishers to chronicle Plymouth's past

"Arcadia contacted us to publish a book about Plymouth for their *Images of America* series," said Liz Kerstens, the museum's genealogist, who has until April 30 to fill 128 pages with a photo history of the

Kerstens said the museum has thousands of pictures from 1890 and later. It's the history before 1890 where they're having difficulty filling in the gaps.

city "For such a small community, so much has happened here"

Kerstens points to the early saw and grist mills which dotted early Plymouth, the Civil War, in which Plymouth was well represented in the 1860s, the Underground Railroad of the 1870s, the 1880s and '90s during which Plymouth experienced several innovations that sold across the country, including the Wherry mole trap, Markham air rifle and Alter car, as well as later decades which showed the change from horses to automobiles, as well as politics, prohibition and World War I

Kerstens said the museum has thousands of pictures from 1890 and later It's the history before 1890 where they're having difficulty filling in the gaps

"We've broken it down into decades, from 1824, when the first land grants were purchased in Plymouth, to 1930," she said "We're lacking on pictures

Events, beautification among Old Village goals

Plymouth's Old Village Development Authority has taken the lead of the city commission, staging a goal setting session and developing five major objectives for the coming year at its Thursday night meeting

"It was a good brainstorming session, and I hope we take more time to distill the ideas into a pro-active action plan," said Jay Oberg, a member of the OVDA board "I'd like to see us further refine the goals for both the near- and longterm "

The planning session was facilitated by Michele Ruppal of HR Solutions, Inc of Plymouth, who worked with a previous city commission in developing goals for the city

At the end of the session, the goals established by the OVDA included

The Old Village area host at least three and possibly more events during the next year

■ Increased city code enforcement, related to zoning as well as property maintenance

Seek to identify sources of funding for projects

■ Work toward beautification of Old Village and celebrate those efforts

■ Begin work on the development of a unique master plan for Old Village

"The master plan lays out the groundwork for getting the other goals done," said Oberg "The rest will then fall into place"

OVDA board member Peter Bunting believes the goals will give Old Village direction

"I like the idea of holding more events in Old Village," said Bunting "We used to have an ice cream social and a (Halloween) Monster Mash which brought people to Old Village They were good for business, and helped bring neighbors together"

Bunting also wants to see more

building code enforcement "If they can see tangible accomyou make property owners fix their property, it will look nicer and more tenants will want to stay in Old Village," he said "We also need to enforce parking ordinances, and clean up the railroad crossings '

City Manager Paul Sincock, who attended the meeting, said the goals set forth by the OVDA are attainable

"It's a good start, and will put the group into a mode where plishments," said Sincock

The Plymouth Township Police Department is sponsoring a "Citizen's Police Academy" beginning in April in an effort to familiarize residents with what goes on in the department and to get feedback from



citizens on what they want from the folks charged with their public safety

"I'm looking for citizens to be involved in the police department," new chief Tom Tiderington said "I'm looking for input from them, and feedback We want to make them more aware of their department's responsibilities And, if they can suggest better ways to do things, that's certainly something we'd take a look at "

The nine week class will give participants a chance to do some hands-on police work, such as firing in the Firearms Training Simulator, as well as hear from some of the professionals who do the work on a day-today basıs







suggested would be what the case was worth to settle Harvey initially sought more than \$1.6

"There's been a little movement on both sides," Mann acknowledged "We're not interested in providing the health care "

million

Neither Harvey nor her lawyer, Marvin Stempien of Southfield-based Somers, Schwartz, Silver and Schwartz, could be reached for comment

The sides are due back in court Monday Borman is pushing both

sides to settle, but Mann said the township is as high as it's going, and is confident, should a settlement not be reached, the township could win in court

"I think the law is behind us in what the former administration did," in eliminating Harvey's position, Mann said "I think we'd be successful at trial, but it becomes an economic issue '

According to Mann, Stempien has filed several motions seeking to limit the time frame from which evidence can be entered,

should the case go to trial Stempien hopes to limit the case to the time between August 1996, when Edwards won a primary election, and November 2000, just before Harvey was fired

Mann said the strategy appeared simple to him

"They're trying to limit the time frame to focus on (Edwards)," Mann said "We don't agree with that We can show many of the accusations of wrong-doing that (Harvey) is making are hypocritical "

"I have a Golden Rule that I don't ask anyone to do anything I wouldn't do, and I think they see that," Grutza said "You get respect from the kids that way You have to earn that '

The kids seem to respond to Grutza's methods

"Just like any boss, he can get on your case when he needs to," said 21-year-old Mike Mayer, Grutza's second-in-command "He's always been a good guy, helped me out when I needed it ' Mayer lowers his head and smiles slightly "I'm not sure I want him to hear this," Mayer says quietly, "but he's probably the best boss I've ever worked for

People around town echo the sentiment Grutza frequently provides pizza for various school fund raisers He's bought hats

for hockey teams He provided the food for the afterglow event following a Plymouth Symphony Orchestra concert last weekend

"We've gotten the reputation that we're willing to help, Grutza said "The community helped make us, so it's important to give back

When Plymouth Township Supervisor Steve Mann wanted to fill out the DDA board, Grutza was one of the first people he called Papa Romano's hosted Mann's victory party following his surprising upset in the 2000 election, and annually helps out the Plymouth Township picnic Mann figured one more thing couldn't hurt

Without a doubt, Jim is one of the most community-minded people I know," Mann said "If we had more people as dedicated and committed to the community as Jim Grutza, this would be an even better community "





Ask the Orthodontist "Cross-bites"

I frequently get asked about "Cross bites" Cross bite is an improper overlap of the upper teeth to the lower teeth There are anterior (involving the front teeth) cross bites and posterior (involving the back teeth)

cross bites In this article we will focus on posterior cross bites

A posterior cross bite is when the back upper teeth are on the inside of the lower teeth This can cause problems such as too narrow a palate for speech improper biting relationship which potentially can lead to jaw joint problems (TMD) insufficient room for teeth to erupt and subsequent crowding due to smaller size of the dental arch and a cosmetic issue due to a narrowness of the face and smile

The cross b te is easily corrected by an orthodontist so long as the pat ent s still growing and the palate has not fused meaning the bones of the palate having merged

together The correction involves a palate expander and is most commonly done between the ages of 6/2 and 13/2 Determining the best age for correction involves many options and is best discussed with an orthodontic specialist. In our office as





Democrats in driver's seat on airport authority deal

"All the old rules are out" when it comes to approval of the John Engler/Ed McNamara deal to put Detroit Metro Airport under the control of a state/county authority

Because the deal must be endorsed by lawmakers with a two thirds majority — in order to give it immediate effect so that Engler and McNamara can appoint its members - it puts the Democratic caucus in the driver's seat in a legislature where Republicans usually have full control

The issue may also divide the party Sen George Z Hart (D-Detroit) criticized the agreement saying it would give too much power to the Wayne County Executive

Hart said he will attempt to amend the proposal when it comes up for a vote, expected to come within the week, to increase the Wayne County Board of Commissioners representation on the new authority and diminish the executive's

McNamara said Friday that he had been predicting easy passage of the bill until members of the Wayne County Board of Commissioners voted Thursday, 11-0, to oppose the agreement

Ken Brock, spokesman for Sen Burton Leland (D-Detroit), said the senator was pleased with the deal overall Leland had been most concerned with avoiding anything like a state takeover of the airport Although the state gets a seat on the authority, he said it is not inappropriate for the state to have that say because Metro serves the entire state

Leland is taking the concerns of the Wayne County board seriously, but he doesn't see that as a deal breaker, Brock said Leland is encouraging commissioners and the executive to work out their differences so the legislature can pass the bill

The announcement that Gov Engler and Executive McNamara had reached an agreement took many in Lansing by surprise, unaware any talks were going on between the two regarding the air port

In fact. McNamara said that although they had talked about

the Wayne Board of Commissioners Legislative approval is needed to create the authority, and a two-thirds majority is needed to give it immediate effect. That would enable McNamara and Engler to name the members themselves. If lawmakers fail to give it immediate effect, the appointments would have to wait until 2003 and be made by their successors.

The independent authority would manage both Metro and Willow Run. aliports, although they would remain Wayne County-owned facilities The authority would have the power to adopt ordinances governing the airport

such a compromise "from time to time" they "only got serious about it last Friday," Feb 15 They met at a function for the opening of the new midfield terminal at Metro Airport, he said

Steil pleased

Sen Glenn Steil (R-Grand Rapids), who is chair of the Senate Airport Review committee that has been reviewing airport finances, said he is pleased with the deal

"This is exactly what I have been asking for," he said

"Right now, everything is under Ed McNamara's control," he said

He said the fact the deal includes requirements for competitive bidding, conflict of interest policies and an audit committee address his concerns about the operations of the airport in the past

"This and the new terminal will make the airport a first class facility for a long time to come," he said

Stell and McNamara may not have seen eye to eye on very much regarding the airport, but McNamara would agree with that point He said the combination of the new terminal and the authority will take the airport "to a higher level

He said his motivation for agreeing to the deal now was that

Sen Glerin Stell (R-Grand Rapids) had introduced that bill to put the airport under the control of an authority. McNamara said he expected the issue will come up for a vote as soon as Tuesday, Feb. 26.

the county board's new procurement ordinance is too restrictive Had it been in place earlier and affected the construction of the new terminal, the terminal would not yet be done and construction would not have come in within budget

McNamara said his timing has nothing to do with the gubernatorial race, although Republicans believe that may be the reason Since Attorney General Jennifer Granholm served as Wayne County's Corporate Counsel for four vears while several of the questioned contracts were let, the airport has become an issue in her bid for the governor's office

The deal may end the legislative review of airport finances, but it will have no impact on criminal investigations of past airport contracts The Michigan State Police have been asked to review the information uncovered by the senate committee Federal investigators have been looking into loans issued to the county by a contractor and at a noise mitigation program "We haven't seen anything that you would call a smoking gun, but there have been a lot of questionable things that could lead to deeper investigations," Steil said

McNamara disagrees with that "It's so political that you'll probably never hear back from them," he said "They are investigating, but they will probably decide they don't want to have anything to do with it





This snowy February morning the soup kitchen's pastoral director would begin making his honey whole wheat bread with the old fash ioned sponge method – warm water, yeast, sugar or food for the yeast, salt and enough flour to make a batter Reyes bakes 17 loaves every Wednesday

Behind him a kettle of pea soup bubbles and simmers slowly Chef Alison Costello started the soup the day before by making a stock from 40pounds of ham, bone and shavings Nothing goes to waste at the soup kitchen Every scrap of meat and vegetable counts when making soup to feed 500 hungry people

"I love wheat bread," said Reyes "It's hearty with a wonderful crust I love the texture and flavor Soup and bread are comfort foods It reminds people of the time when they were a kid Most people love homemade bread"

Good-for-you ingredients

Like many comfort foods, soup, when made from the wrong ingredients, can ruin a healthy diet Dr Bob Roman knows first hand the devastating effect certain foods have on the body As a Farmington Hills pediatrician, he's seen a dramatic rise in the cases of Type II Diabetes and attributes it to a fast food diet Cooked from scratch doesn't necessarily translate to better for you A lean stock is essential not only for a tasty but a nutritious soup Save the water from cooking vegetables and potatoes It contains valuable nutrients Throw in the outer leaves of cabbage, lettuce, kale, the tops of celery, beets and chard

"Soup isn't always good for you," said Roman, a Bloomfield Hills resident who in his spare time takes cooking classes at Schoolcraft College in Livonia He began volunteering at the soup kitchen, chopping vegetables and ladling out soup, in August

"It depends what's in the soup Begin with a chicken starter, nothing too high in fat or salt Put in vegetables and meats, lean meat like chicken or turkey sausage No bacon A soup if cooked right can be your whole meal When we're having a 6 inch snow day and you come in, it makes you feel warm all over "

There's nothing like stirring a pot of soup and inhaling the steam rising from the mingling car-

rots, thyme and tomatoes Herbs and seasonings add flavor to a soup Costello says, "nothing's written in stone at the soup kitchen Ingredients vary depending on what's on hand Great soups require quality ingredients It's all about educating the palate "

Donations enable Costello to cook most of the meals from scratch using not processed, but whole foods because she believes "people poison their bodies enough"

"I make lentil, chicken noodle, mushroom barley, bean soup, vegan soup, as long as it has a lot of stuff in it," said Costello who's worked as a chef at the Moneytree downtown and Pronto in Royal Oak "But it's the seasonings that give it flavor – bay leaf, thyme, chervil, and of course fresh garlic Oregano has a tendency to be too strong, basil for sweet flavor I prefer using white pepper over black because it's stronger Lots of times I add sugar to tomato-based soup, and dill in chicken soup from Brother Rick Samyn's Earthworks Garden in summer (a program to grow food to feed the poor)





Caring for people is what the soup kitchen is all about The Capuchin Soup Kitchen opened Nov 29, 1929 in a hall on the north side of the monastery on Mt Elliott Friars Herman Buss and Frances Spruck were inspired by the work of friar Solanus Casey who was the doorkeeper at the time He fed people because they were hun gry, sometimes 200 300 people every day

"They served soup, bread and coffee," said Reyes "From the beginning we always had volunteers In the history of this place we never ran out of food '

That includes hot and steamy, whole wheat bread fresh from the oven

"Bread 1s always a surprise," said Reyes "For some it's the first time they've had bread come out of the oven that hasn't been processed Bread feeds the whole person Bakers are very fortunate because baking bread is very tactile I find myself wanting to share something very sacred and beautiful There's something about breaking bread with people You don't have meals with people you don't like There's something sacred about getting together and baking and breaking bread "

(AP) - There's good tangy taste and appealing crunch to this slimmed-down version of fish cakes But the ingredients are chosen with some thought, so there are only about 9 grams of fat per serving

Lime peel and sharp mustard are the high flavor elements for fish patties coated in cornmeal and cooked in a little oil

The recipe is from Better Homes and Gardens 3 Steps to Weight Loss (Meredith, 2001, \$19 95) The book is based on a healthy eating plan devised by Dr Lawrence J Cheskin, director of the Weight Management Center at Johns Hopkins Universitv

FISH CAKES WITH GREEN **GODDESS SAUCE**

(Preparation 30 minutes cooking time 8 minutes) 12 ounces fresh or frozen skinless white fish fillets (such as haddock or cod) 1 beaten egg



Packing with confidence is in the bag

I was overcome with a major case of anxiety last week on the way to the air

nothing to do with security concerns, long lines or missed connections In fact, I wasn't even the one taking the trip You see, I was

mid morning flight to Disney World It was a perfect day for flying and I was a little envious of my friend, hav ing not yet planned a winter get away myself At the same time, though, I was relieved I didn't have to concern myself with packing, which is a major thorn in my side

Whether traveling for business or just some R-and R, my intent is to pack efficiently, yet I find myself in the same predicament time and again It's the night before I leave, piles of clothes cover my bed, the luggage waits to be zipped shut and the ticks of my alarm clock sound louder and louder as if I need another reminder that I'm wasting time

So I've resolved that going for ward I'm shedding my baggage figuratively and literally - with a little help, of course, from some port and it had local packing pros

Get packing

Since 1975, Tumi has been designing luggage daypacks, handbags and travel accessories known for their patented, durable fabrics, modern styling and special touches like magnetic closures in lieu of cumbersome snaps or buckles, and a serial number registration system to

to pack for a trip of about a help reunite owner with lost baggage

Store manager David Poppe said most of what I liked would fit within the airlines' carry-on size limit of 22 by 14 by 9 inches

Textured glass is available in the viewers' many styles (even colors), so the attention and possibilities are endless Use your imagination to shoot other subjects through textured glass Another way to make the ordi nary different is to use a super wide angle lens 20mm or less The distortion you'll get by mov ing in close to your subjects will amaze you Move in close to a everyone likes friend or to your family pet Try sighting straight up a tree The resulting distortion will produce dramatic and unusual results

We're all so accustomed to photographing people so that we can see their faces How about shooting them from their backs or doing a photo theme of hands or feet? This would certainly

make the ordinary different

While we're talking about peo ple pictures, consider placing someone in an unlikely setting For example, shoot an elegantly dressed model in a junkyard or a friend in a tuxedo on a farm These photographs will definite ly get attention

Try taking a common prop such as a red rose and place it somewhere in the composition of a series of pictures This "com mon denominator" will tie a set of photos together and will earn you accolades from family and friends

Rather than just an ordinary picture of the famous windmill in Dearborn's famed Greenfield Village, I wanted to do some thing different





For the second-straight year, Madonna University's Kathy Panganis has been named the all-Wolverine-Hoosier Athletic Conference player of the year in basketball and coach Marylou Jansen was selected the conference's coach of the year

Panganis, a 5-foot-11 forward, led Madonna in scoring, averaging 161 points, she also grabbed 5 6 rebounds a game

Madonna's men's team finished its season at 6-26


"To hold her to nine shots is phenomenal," said Jansen "We knew we had to get out on some of their shooters

New procedure eliminates need for hysterectomy

Carol Maynard had menstrual bleeding for an entire month and was close to needing a transfusion when she met a doctor who performed a relatively new procedure that eliminated her need for a hysterectomy and dramatically cut her recovery time

"I think more women would go to the doctor sooner if they thought there was an alternative to a hysterectomy," said Maynard, 52

After weighing options, Maynard chose to have the thermal balloon procedure that has been used locally for about three years to treat functional menorrhagia

"If I can do this for a patient and accomplish the required results, most times they can go back to work the next day," said Maynard's physician, Dr Charles Cash, an obstetriciangynecologist with Oakwood Healthcare System

"This makes sense for patients and they need to know about it and decide if they want to pursue it," he added "They can go on-line or talk to friends Patients need information and educa tion

'This solved my problem without altering my body. My uterus is still there and intact and I haven't changed anything. I feel good about that. I guess the thought of a hysterectomy would make me feel old.'

There are some 650,000 hysterectomies done in the US annually About 25 percent of women, or 150,000 patients, who get hysterectomies need it to treat menorrhagia, which is caused by a build-up of the uterine lining that produces excessive blood loss during the menstrual cycle

Cash defines excessive blood loss as having to use more than eight sanitary pads every day and menstruating for more than seven days

The recovery time for hysterectomies can range from eight hours to five days in the hospital with an additional two to six weeks before returning to regular activity

Maynard went to the hospital at 6 a m and returned home at noon Aside from cramping for a short time after she left the hospital, she didn't experience any pain and could have returned to work the following day

"I haven't had any bleeding since," the Northville resident said "I don't have to worry about where I'm going to be when the bleeding starts I would go days where I could go through an overnight pad every hour Once it was gone I didn't have to worry about anything"

Non-invasive

The procedure is a non invasive technique that involves a Federal Drug Administration approved balloon device that is inserted into the uterus, inflated and filled with heated sugar water The water is warmed to 188 degrees Fahrenheit and cooks the cells in the uterine lining

Before the month-long period began, Maynard didn't have a period for nine months and she thought she wouldn't have one again Then the bleeding began and wouldn't stop By the time she saw Cash, Maynard was told she had lost half her blood

Maynard had to stay off her job as a high school teacher at Wyandotte Pubhc Schools for five weeks to rebuild her strength Cash told her that if she had lost any more blood she would have needed a transfusion

"A lot of other women I talked to had a lot of bleeding, but it stops," she said

Cash first gave Maynard hormone pills, but a month later she had her period and was flowing somewhat heavy again More importantly, she didn t want to take the hormones, because she felt they were artificial and she was worried they might cause cancer

When they did the procedure from that day on I had no bleeding," May nard said "For me it worked perfectly Dr Cash told me there was a chance it might not solve the problem, but I wanted to do it because I didn't want to stay on the hormones I don't trust them Id rather let nature do it



"I wouldn t want to have to go through the surgery and the thought of a hysterectomy," Maynard, 52, said "This solved my problem without altering my body My uterus is still there and intact and I haven t changed anything I feel good about that I guess the thought of a hysterectomy would make me feel old '

The thermal balloon procedure made sense to her, because it had fewer risks and a quicker recovery time

"The procedure offers an alternative for women who don't want to undergo treatments such as hysterectomy, which can result in other problems,' said Cash, adding that the thermal balloon insertion is considered an easier and less invasive procedure than other techniques

The thermal balloon procedure 1s considered successful if the woman has normal or less periods

"Eighty five percent have much lighter periods and a third of that 85 percent don't have any at all," Cash explained

The thermal balloon technique isn't used to treat fibroid, adhesions or endometriosis, which is a normal uter-

Drug-coated stents New fix for coronary artery disease

Joseph Mercy Health System of Ann Arbor (SJMHS) has been named as one of 70 sites nationwide in a trial to evaluate a new treatment for patients with coronary artery disease

The trial will evaluate the safety and effectiveness of a stent treated with Paclitaxel, a medication that may prevent the artery from closing back up

Typically, a patient with coronary artery disease (buildup of plaque in the artery) is treated with angioplasty — a procedure where a balloon is inserted into the artery and a mesh-like tube, or stent, is placed in the artery to relieve the blockage For 20-26 percent of these patients, the artery closes back up, a condition called restenosis, due to scar tissue

Michigan Heart and Vascular Institute of Saint that grows through the mesh Arteries can close back up within a year of angioplasty, for some patients it may occur in six months or even within one month

> The new procedure utilizes drug-coating technology Patients would receive a stent treated with Paclitaxel, an antiproliferate drug that inhibits or reduces restenosis

> The initial data looks promising, ' says Dr Michael O'Donnell, a cardiologist with SJMHS Studies in the United States and Europe have shown very few patients to have restenosis two years following the implementation of the stent '

> One difference about this study from other stent trials is that the Paclitaxel-coated stent will be used

on patients without prior intervention on narrowed arteries

"Other advancements such as the recent vascular brachytherapy where the site is treated with a small amount of radiation were limited to patients who previously had stents This new study will involve patients who have never been treated for coronary artery disease, ' adds Dr O'Donnell

If the coated stent proves successful, it could increase long term survival rate and reduce the number of open-heart procedures That, in effect, could reduce costs



ine lining that is in an abnormal location Also, women who want to have children shouldn't have the thermal balloon

"The person would likely be sterile, but this is not a form of sterilization," said Cash, adding that a tubal ligation is often done at the same time as the thermal balloon procedure to ensure sterilization

In Michigan, the procedure takes place in the hospital while the patient is asleep or under a local anesthetic In other states, like California, however, the procedure is often done in doctors' offices

Oakwood

Cash introduced the thermal balloon procedure to Oakwood Hospitals in 1999 Since then approximately 150 patients have received the treatment

"There were trials worldwide three or four years before that," Cash said "A lot of people aren't aware of this alternative to a hysterectomy," said Cash, who is director of education for Oakwood's OB-GYN Residency Program and

chairman of its Institutional **Review Board** 'What's neat about gynecology is that it's high-tech driven," he added "Patients need to ask their doctors what s available The days are gone when a doctor said, 'This is what you need to do,' and walks out of the room When you have an informed patient it makes for an easier care of that patient and it makes for a rewarding interaction Many women don't want a hys-

terectomy " There are psychological and physiological results from a hys-

terectomy that must be considered, he added

For instance, after a woman has a total hysterectomy, with

the uterus, ovaries and tubes removed, the woman will go into menopause Many women experience depression because they've lost an organ

"The beauty of (the thermal balloon procedure) is that the patient still has her uterus and there are no complications or side effects with respect to damaging bowel, bladder and blood vessels," Cash said "It's a very clean procedure in that sense It's much more economical in terms of cost and the price the patient has to pay out of her daily life

Opting for the new procedure gave Maynard a new outlook

"It's the best I've felt in my life," she said "I look younger I don't have the same worry I can get up in the morning and I know I'm not going to have any bleeding After five weeks of bleeding you get depressed and you say, 'When is this going to stop?'

Aspirin: more effective than other drugs in preventing heart attacks

Giving heart attack patients a combined low dose of the anticoagulant drug warfarin with low-dose aspirin does not prevent second heart attacks or strokes better than aspirin alone, researchers report in today's Circulation Journal of the American Heart Association

A study among heart attack patients at 78 Veterans Administration medical centers found the blood-thinning benefits of daily aspirin are not enhanced by concurrent treatment with low doses of the more expensive blood-thinner warfarin (Coumadin), which is given to reduce risk of bleeding, report principal researchers Louis D Fiore, MD, and Michael D Ezekowitz, MD, PhD

"We had hoped this might

drugs, but it didn't," says Fiore "Lower anticoagulant levels of warfarin simply had no effect on preventing subsequent heart attacks or strokes It was a bust "

Both drugs slow blood clotting Blood clots can block vessels that carry blood to the heart, causing a heart attack, or to the brain, causing an ischemic stroke Aspirin affects the blood platelets Warfarin inhibits circulating clotting proteins in the blood

Fiore and colleagues at the **Department of Veterans Affairs** Cooperative Study Program, in New Haven, Conn, conducted a randomized, open-label study comparing aspirin alone with combined aspirin and warfarin in preventing death, second

double the effectiveness of the heart attacks, strokes and major hemorrhage in 5,059 heart attack survivors, average age 62

> Patients were given warfarin (15 to 25 International Units) and 81 mg of aspirin administered daily, or 162 mg of chewable aspirin alone daily That latter dosage is in accordance with antithrombotic therapy guidelines The standard dose of warfarin for treating heart attack patients is 25 to 35 units

Patients began therapy within 14 days of suffering a heart attack and were followed for an average of 2 7 years

Among the combined therapy group, 176 percent of patients died, compared with 173 percent in the aspirin-only group

Cabins allow escape from life as usual

Whether nestled by the mountains, woods or water, a cabin is both a cozy form of shelter and a rustic approach to architecture And it's all the more snug when jam-packed into not much more than a few hundred square feet

Architect Dale Mulfinger and writer Susan E Davis, authors of The Cabin (Taunton Press, \$34 95 hardcover) ---which nearly begs the question why any one would want to live anywhere else say that everyone has a cabin memory

Maybe it's a childhood summer camp cabin, with memories of bunkmates and toasted marshmallows Maybe it's a secluded honeymoon cabin Or maybe it's the humble getaway to which the family retreated when the kids were young

Whatever its purpose a cabin is typi

cally constructed from basic materials But a cabin is more than the traditional log structure of Abraham Lancoln lore

The authors found that a cabin can be converted from a picture postcard Vermont country school or even an abandoned garage, or rigged from a doit-yourself cabin kit Several cabins pictured in their coffee table book were built by the owners, themselves

What gives a cabin its cabin-ness? The authors say a cabin offers simple shelter its location is selected for its connection with nature, overlapping activities occur within the compact space, and everyone feels right at home

Typically a crackling fireplace or wood stove enhances the welcoming environment Poised to live in harmony with nearby nature, some cabins include a prominent porch invit

ing activities to expand into the outdoors

'Back to nature Solitude Sim-

plicity Escape Intimacy Self-sufficien cy Romance Refuge Resourcefulness Nostalgia

"These are the feelings that cabins evoke, and they're at the root of my passion for this elemental building form," writes Mulfinger in the intro duction

He's based in the Midwest where he started researching cabins with his students at the University of Minnesota and subsequently became known as a "cabinologist "

"I ve had an intimate connection with cabins my entire life," says his coauthor Davis, based in New York When I was four in 1947, my parents put my brother and me in the back of a little Chevy coupe and we drove to Cape Cod from Rochester, NY I spent my entire childhood all the way through college staying in cabins in Cape Cod

After her brother moved to Minneso ta, lakeside cabins there enticed her

"A cabin is among the most basic forms of shelter," Davis says "You walk outside and you are immediately in nature A cabin allows you to realize Thoreaus dream of escaping from the hectic pace of urban life The cabin is a classic American getaway that offers a place for dreaming, inspiration and relaxing

The log cabin became an American icon when its symbol was adopted for William Henry Harrison's 1840 presidential campaign, says Davis "After that, various other presidents built on that heritage

Log cabins were among the first structures that were built in the US, says Davis, adding that the earliest American log cabins were made by Scandinavian settlers

One cabin featured in the book takes its inspiration from the owner's Scan dinavian background showing off a diamond shaped window and primary colors The owner is Kristina Lind-

bergh, whose grandfather, aviation hero Charles Lundbergh.



built cabins for her grandmother Anne

When it came time for architect Jeff Shelden, who designs cabins for clients, to create his own, he used wood recycled from an abandoned railroad trestle

That cabin, featured in the book, has less than 500 useable square feet "A cabin is a pretty conceptual term," said Shelden "One guy will think of a cabin and by the time he is done with what he wants, he has built 9,000 square feet And somebody else like us would have a lot less "

"Doing the book really made me think about small spaces," Davis says "We limit ed our book to cabins no larger than 1,200 square feet That was hard, because there were many beautiful spaces up to 2,000 square feet

"Some of the socalled cabins in the Adırondacks are actu ally 40-room extravaganzas, even though they are made out of logs But we felt that the essence of a cabin is intimacy in a very small space It's shar ing warmth and shelter in a very small, enclosed space," Davis savs

A guest cabin featured in the book with just 210 square feet, including bathroom shed, cozies up to a Wisconsin forest

"A cabin is a place to live differently from your normal life at home," Shelden says "Its hard to say that about a lot of places because most people want to take it all with them There's less space, there are different things to do"
