

Board OKs 18 teacher layoffs

The Plymouth-Canton Board of Education voted 5-1 Tuesday to lay off 18 teachers, with the hope of calling them back before school begins in August.

The number is one less than had been reported earlier. District officials said one teacher stepped forward to announce a retirement, allowing for the call-back of an educator on the lay-off list.

"Leaves of absences, teachers exercis-

ing their rights to go from half time to full time, and a very small retirement pool this year has created a surplus of teachers," said Ray Bihun, executive director for human resources. "I know we're going to have more retirements, I just don't know when."

Trustee Judy Mardigian voted against the layoffs, saying she wanted more time to look at alternatives.

"The board needs to have a budget workshop. Waiting until May 21 is too late," said Mardigian to her fellow board members. "I would like to have more opportunity to look at alterna-

tives."

Superintendent Kathleen Booher said the layoffs "are not premature, and they are not irreversible. As our information gets clearer, we will call teachers back immediately upon knowing a position opens."

A total of 32 teachers were given notices last week, indicating they will either be moved to an assignment in another building or be laid off. The administration, according to the contract with the Plymouth-Canton Education Association, must notify teachers of layoffs at least 60 days before the

school year ends. Bihun said the layoffs will affect 14 K-12 teachers, and four English as a Second Language teachers at Starkweather Education Center.

"There's no way we can present the budget to the board for next year with out modest layoffs in employees. We don't see any way around it," said Booher.

Booher added the 2002-2003 budget is a difficult one, considering the \$200 increase in the state foundation

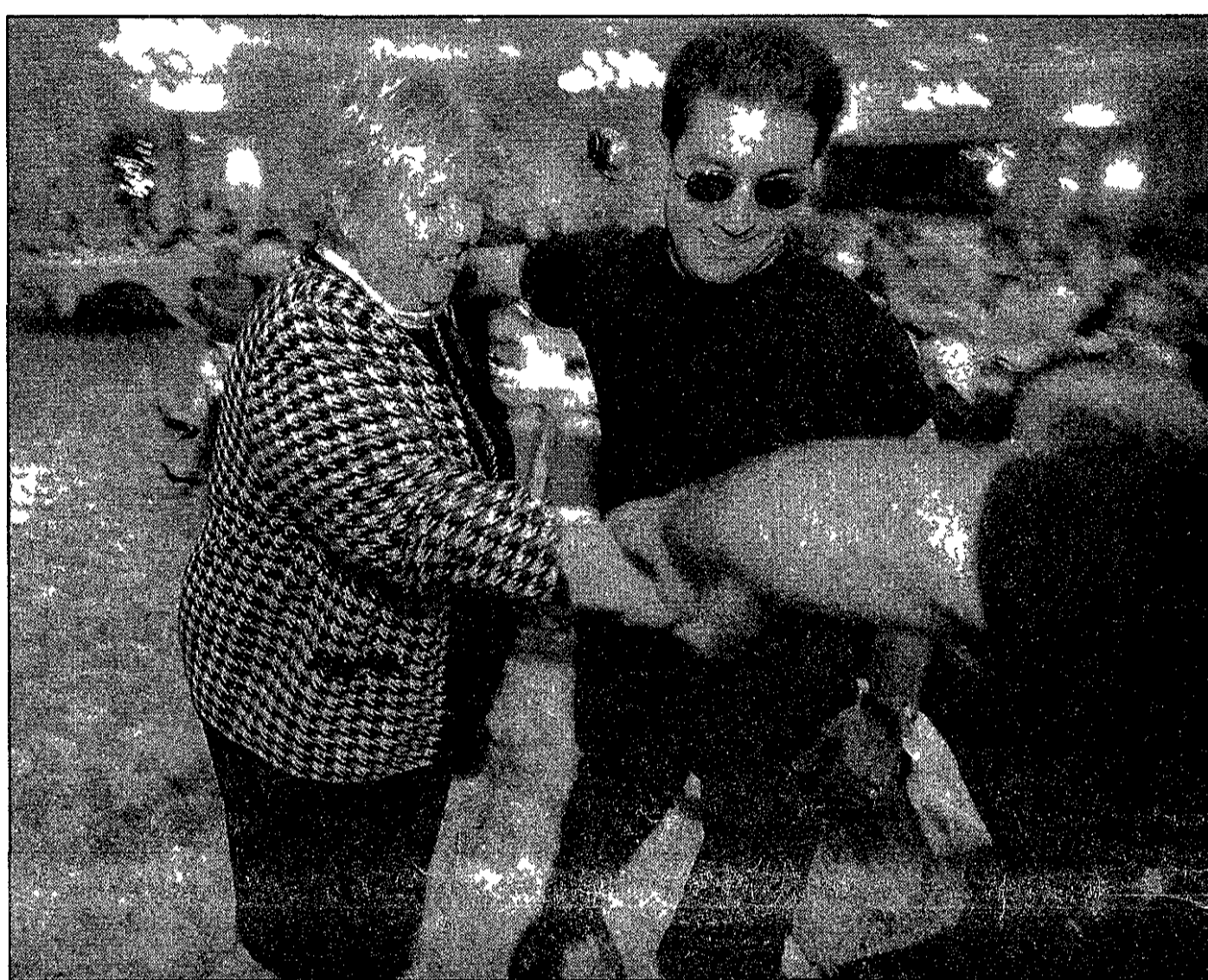

"Education has been my life, it's important to me," said Saunders, 63, of Plymouth Township, and the former adult education coordinator for the Starkweather Education Center. "I want to make sure people in Plymouth-

"I also believe we need to be able to hold a millage election," added Saunders. "I don't know if it would be passed by voters, but right now we don't even have the possibility to enhance our funding through a millage

Robert Nelson believes there's a strong fit between the objectives of the Plymouth-Canton school district, and his interests in becoming a member of the Board of Education.

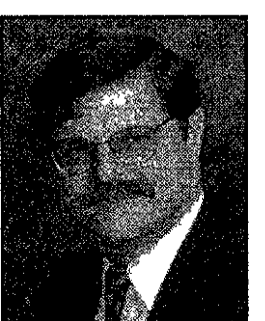
"Setting vision, financial oversight, making sure key people are in the right place. These are the things the

As Nelson puts it, "This district is

facing some serious challenges financially. Over 85 percent of our budget is fixed, with 85 percent going out in salaries. That presents a huge challenge."

"Our largest expense is also our largest asset, the people in our schools," he said. "It's one of the things that makes people want to move to Plymouth-Canton. We have a highly talented, skilled and motivated staff, and I'm glad we're working with them on interest-based bargaining in an attempt to have a cooperative solution."

Plymouth walk set for Westland's Nankin Mills

The WalkAmerica for the March of Dimes scheduled for the Plymouth area will really step off from the softball fields across from Nankin Mills Nature Center in Westland this Saturday.

It's called the Plymouth walk because it started at Haggerty and Hines Drive last year. The bridge work over the river had just started and it was too late to change the location, according to March of Dimes event coordinator Enna Whitted.

The charity is still calling it the "Plymouth" walk location, however.

This year's walk starts at 9 a.m. and will go from the Nankin Mills area to Haggerty Road through Livonia and back

(about eight miles round trip) along Hines Drive. Registration starts at 8 a.m.

Hines Drive will be shut down for the event.

Wayne County executive Edward McNamara is honorary chairman and will kick off the event at about 8:20 a.m. About 1,500 to 2,000 walkers are expected.

Checkpoints offering refreshments will be sponsored by Durr Industries, Comcast, Federal Express, Sprint and Kohl's. Panera Bread is running the VIP tent, and Rock Financial is sponsoring the registration tent. Home Depot is also helping as a sponsor.

"We are expecting several walk-ins and many people have already registered," Whitted said. "We are also dog-friendly, so people can bring their pets."

Other area walk sites include Troy, Metro Beach Metropark and Detroit, there are 43 sites state wide. The charity expects to raise \$3 million during the various local walks. Since 1970 the national group has raised \$1 billion with WalkAmerica. Walkers seek donations and pledges to raise funds during the walk.

The walk events raise funds to help families with babies born prematurely through life-saving research and innovative programs. Nearly 500,000 babies are born too soon every year according to the March of Dimes.

The four area walks are being operated by the Southeast Michigan Chapter of the March of Dimes in Southfield, phone (248) 359-1550 for information about their work or about joining the walk.

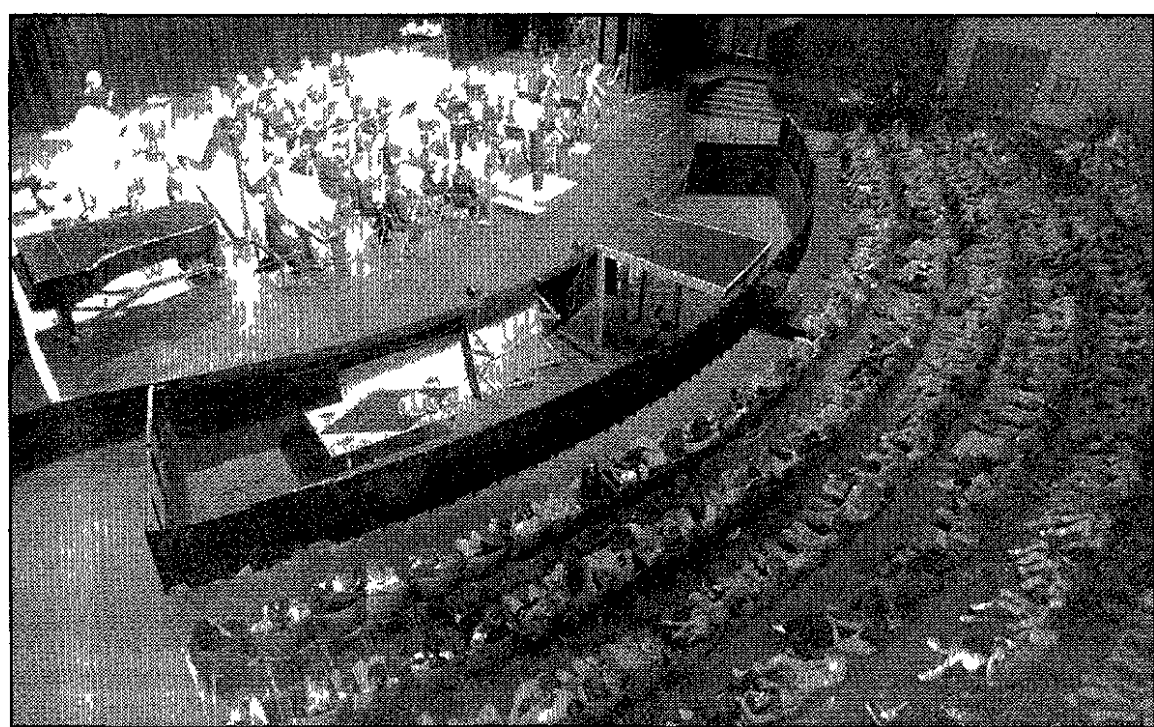

City cop sends letters, warning ticket scofflaws

For the past several years, getting a parking ticket in Plymouth meant nothing more than getting a piece of junk mail for hundreds of motorists.

However, that is expected to change as Police Chief Wayne Carroll has sent more than 700 letters to people who, over the course of several years, have failed to pay their parking tickets.

"We've been able to set up a list of individuals who are behind on their parking tickets, and have sent them a notice giv-

ing them a little time to come in and take care of their problem or it will be sent to 35th District Court," said Carroll. "They've already had their two-week grace period, plus some. Once we go through this initial phase, we'll see who doesn't respond and send them over to court."

Carroll estimates there is approximately \$10,000-\$14,000 in unpaid parking tickets. The average ticket is about \$15, plus a \$5 late fee.

Court Administrator Kerry Erdman says after the fine and late fee is assessed in Plymouth, there could be another \$25 late fee added by the court, as well as

a 20-percent statutory fee on top of that.

"And, if someone has six or more parking tickets, their driver's license could be suspended until they pay the fines," said Erdman.

Carroll admits it's taken a long time for his department, which has gone through several administrative changes over the past couple of years, to catch up with ticket scofflaws.

"Our priorities have been more in the manning of the streets and taking care of those kinds of problems," said Carroll. "Now, we're catching up."

Township approves treating roads

Plymouth Township officials will once again provide calcium chloride on its dwindling number of unpaved roads.

The Plymouth Township board Tuesday approved spending up to \$15,000 to hire Wayne County contractors to provide the calcium chloride, used to dispel the dust on unpaved roads.

Contractors will chloride 5.85 miles of roads in various subdivisions.

■ **Tomlinson Estates (1.0 miles)** — Southworth Avenue and Gold Arbor Avenue

■ **Eastlawn subdivision (.6 miles)** — General, Eastside, Micol and Firwood drives

■ **Robinson subdivision (1.7 miles)** — Russell, Morgan, Brownell, Francis, Butternut, Gilbert, and Ferguson

■ **Plymouth Colony (.5 miles)** — Governor Bradford,

John Alden, Priscilla Lane and Turkey Run

■ **Plymouth Hills (.9 miles)** — Amherst Court and Nicholas Lane

■ **Plymouth Gardens (.3 miles)** — Parkhurst, Lakeland Court and Phoenix Court

■ **Finch (.3 miles)** — Lakeland Court and Finch

■ **Phoenix Park (.3 miles)** — Hammill and Garland avenues

■ **Hilltop Golf Course Drive (.25 miles)** — Beck Road east to the parking lot

It's the lowest total of chloride the township has done in at least nine years. In 2001, 6.15 miles of roads were treated, at a cost of nearly \$13,000.

In other action, the board

■ **Adopted a proclamation** honoring Clerk Marilyn Massnegill as part of Municipal Clerks Week. Township Supervisor Steve Mann drew a laugh, when

reading the proclamation, he read "The office is the oldest in municipal government." He stopped and said, "That's the office, not Marilyn," drawing a laugh from the dozen or so people in the audience.

■ **Adopted the by-laws** of the new Downtown Development Authority, and also conducted the first reading of the ordinance detailing the tax increment financing and development plan for the authority.

■ **Approved a \$24,000 amendment** to the contract with CTI to continue monitoring Fire Station #2, which is being monitored for a gasoline spill that took place years ago.

Township engineer Mike Bailey recommended the amendment to the contract, pointing out the only other real option was to do nothing, in which case the township could be subject to substantial fines from the state.

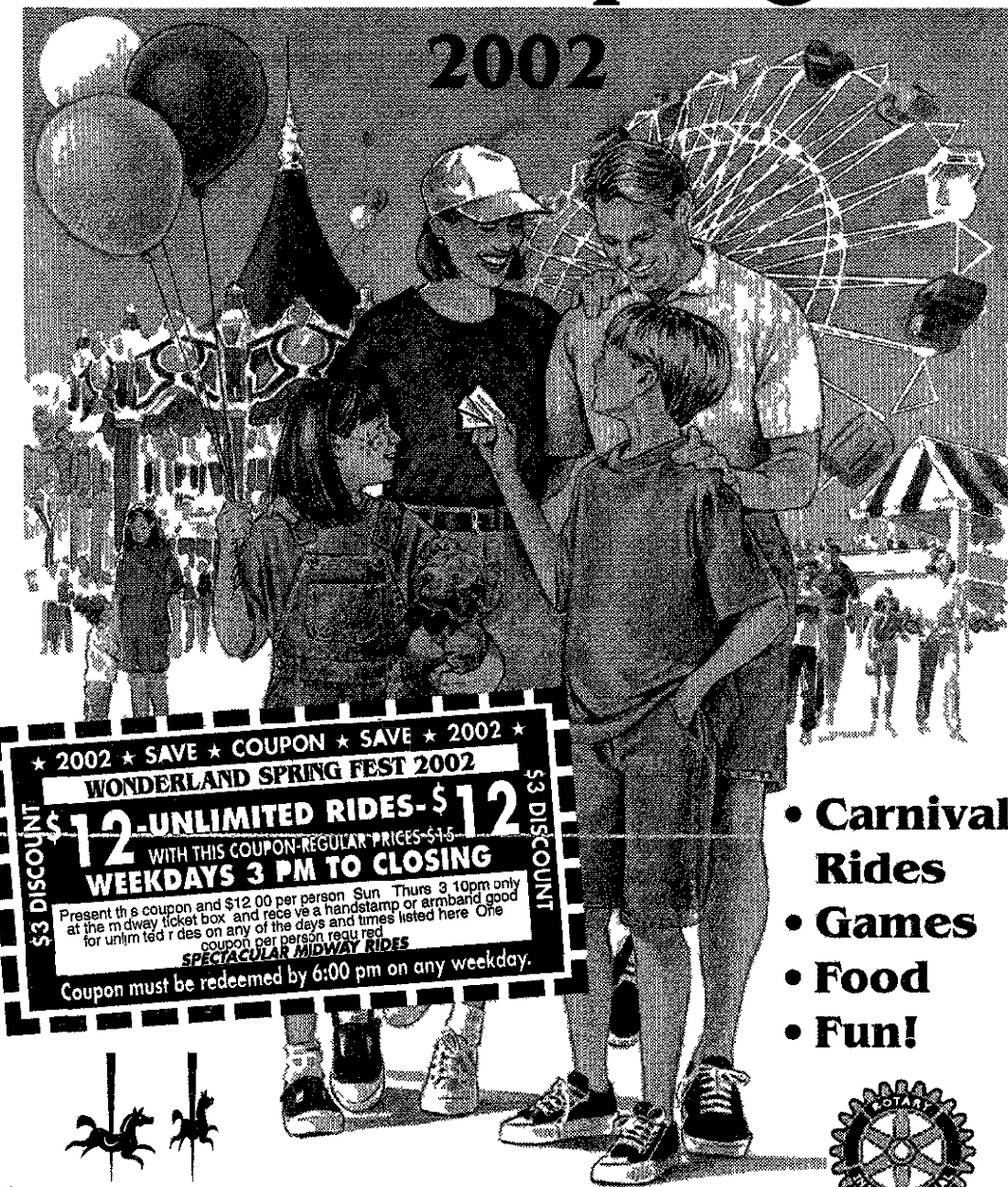

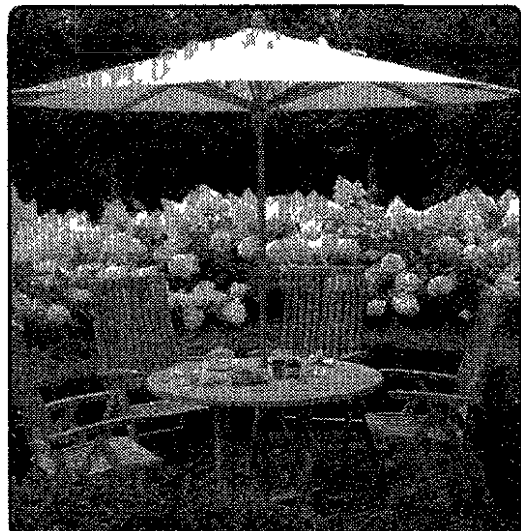

Credit union partners with Smith

A recycling program pioneered by Smith Elementary School Principal Peggy Brooks recently got a big boost from local business.

Community Federal Credit Union recently donated a large supply of pencils, made of recycled products, to Smith Elementary in recognition of the school's recycling efforts.

In October 2001, Brooks launched a program to promote recycling at the school. In addition to paper and corrugate, Brooks recognized an opportunity to recycle the nearly 1,500 polystyrene lunch trays that are used each week.

When Brooks proposed the lunch tray recycling idea to the student body, third-grader Garrett Layman volunteered for the task.

"The program is a success because of Garrett," Brooks said. "Each lunch period he routinely collects the trays and prepares them for storage for the weekly pickup."

The city of Plymouth provides bins and a dumpster for the recycled prod-

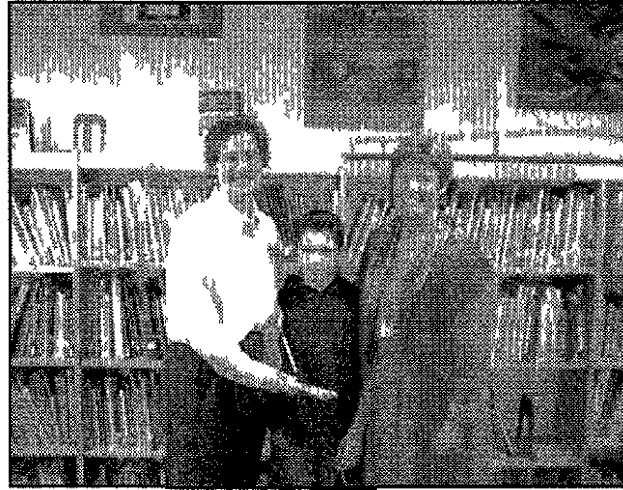
ucts on the school grounds.

Natalie McLaughlin, Community Federal's Business Partnership Coordinator, explained the credit union's donation.

"We wanted to show our support for the school's efforts by giving them a supply of pencils that are made from a minimum of 60 percent of the polystyrene post consumer lunch trays and reclaimed sawdust," McLaughlin said. "We are thrilled to sponsor Garrett and Smith School by providing them with these pencils that bring awareness to the importance of recycling."

Brooks has developed a program for Garrett to distribute the recycled pencils as a reward to students, faculty and staff that he, in turn, sees doing a good deed.

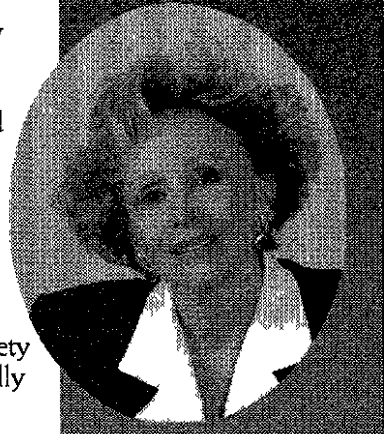
McLaughlin said that Community Federal has a number of school partnerships in the communities where its members live or work.

allowance "isn't keeping pace with inflation, or the Consumer Price Index, or any of the measures we use to look at our economy. Our district has costs that are rising much more rapidly."

"Last year we made significant reductions in spending, and modest reductions in the year

prior to that," added Boher. "It is clear to us that reductions every year forward are likely to be deeper and deeper until the State of Michigan adjusts the funding formula."

"One guideline we held golden as we worked on how to go about with reductions was no increase

in class size projections, and we believe we're accomplishing that."

George Mozurkewich of Plymouth Township told board members that without good teachers, the education system will suffer.

"Layoffs are very hard on people who are let go, but it also has an adverse impact on the morale of the people who stay," he said. "I hope the board looks at all possible sources and options."

Board members who voted in favor of the layoffs are hopeful

most, if not all, the educators will be called back to work.

"We're very disappointed that we have to do any type of layoffs," said Trustee Marcy Staley. "It's always the last thing any board wants to do. We're very hopeful we can call these teachers back."

Boher said the layoffs represent about 30-40 percent of the \$1 million in cuts that will be presented to the Board of Education at its May 14 meeting, and will be discussed at a workshop budget session May 21.

election.”
Saunders said the district's current financial problems present a challenge, but it's one she believes the district can, and has, learned to deal with.

“Do we have the money to give our students an excellent education? If you look at the MEAP scores, and the number of Merit Scholars, and the number of students going to college, obviously we're doing it,” she said. “We just need to tighten our belts.”

Saunders also said she'd like to confront diversity issues in the district.

“If you want to talk about a diverse population, we had it at Starkweather,” said Saunders. “But, we worked on respect and responsibility, no matter what color your hair was, what color your skin was, or your political viewpoints. We do have programs helping students to learn respect and responsibility, but I think we can do more.”

The renewal project at the high school complex is designed to keep freshmen and sophomores in their home schools, while developing smaller schools within schools. Will it work?

“I think they still have some

logistics to work out in having smaller education communities grouped in their own schools,” said Saunders. “I'm concerned that if we have a student assigned to Plymouth High School that they're going to be able to take advantage of classes in other buildings.”

Saunders has heard the complaints concerning the lack of communication to parents from the school board and administration.

“If some people are perceiving there isn't an openness, then there's a problem,” she said. “If people perceive they can't get the information they want, let's make it a little more open, a little more approachable.”

In the end, Saunders believes her biggest contribution to the school board may be her outlook on education.

“I'm the only professional educator in this election, which is a different point of view,” she said. “I've been around here and in other districts, and I've seen some things that work and some that don't which gives me somewhat of a different perspective.”

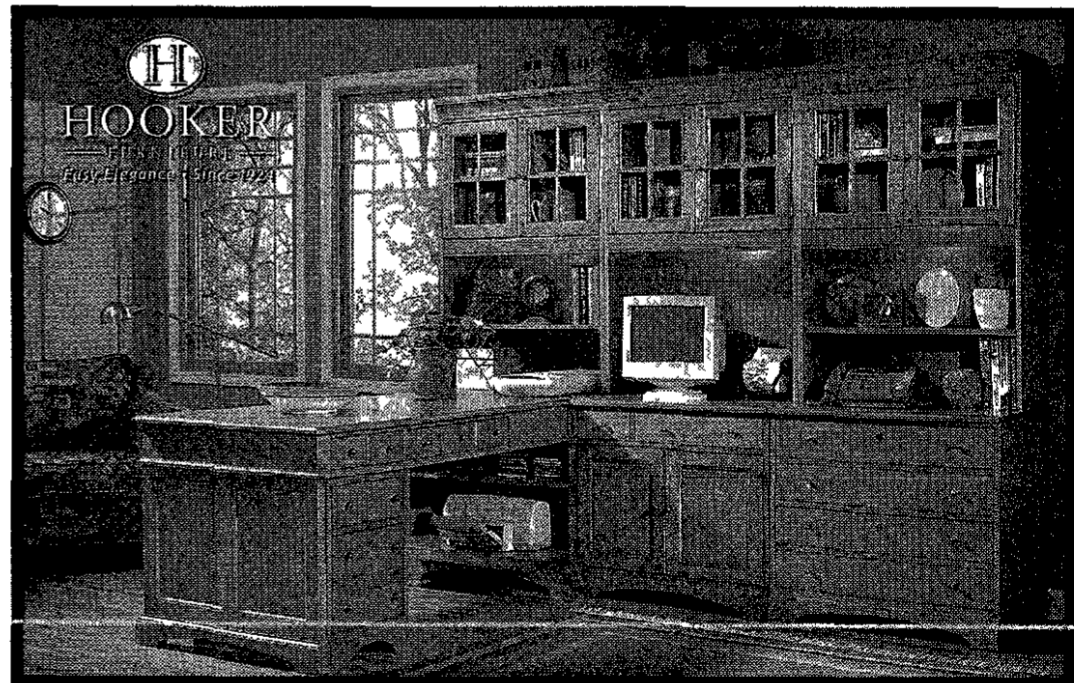

to this very hard (financial) problem."

As a business owner, Nelson said he works continually at communicating ideas to his clients. And, to that extent, he believes there needs to be more communication between the school district and its customers.

"The electronic communication is a joke," said Nelson, referring to the district's Web site. "I can't go to it and drop e-mails to teachers or look for assignments I'd like to have the schools' finances available."

"We should investigate making the Web site an educational opportunity, like putting together the yearbooks at the high school."

Nelson does give credit to the schools for recently televising regular school board meetings for those who can't make the sessions.

Nelson, whose daughter participated in the Talented and Gifted (TAG) program, said he's done considerable research into administration thoughts of changing the magnet school program to one based at each elementary school.

"The research I see indicates that while we may be serving more kids (with programs at each grade school), it may be a less effective program. That may not be the direction we want to go."

Nelson looks forward to the changes at the high school complex which will emphasize putting smaller groups of students together instead of the large, campus-like atmosphere.

"For highly motivated kids, the high school complex is a great opportunity," said Nelson. "But, for others, it's a great opportunity to get lost among

5,000 people on campus. The idea of smaller schools, groups of 800 and later fewer, is a really good idea. We might find that we have less kids falling through the cracks."

The 18-year Canton resident is also concerned about the future of the district's facilities, calling it a major challenge.

"We're a growing district with aging buildings. That's a tough combination, and a key challenge," he said.

And with the challenge, according to Nelson, comes a balancing act to determine which buildings in the district best fit the needs of the community.

"The biggest question is does each facility best serve the needs of our kids?"

District must explore options before layoffs

The news wasn't quite as gloomy at Tuesday's school board meeting as was previously reported

School Superintendent Kathleen Booher reported Tuesday night that the district is notifying 18 — not 19, as originally thought — teachers that they may not have jobs when the next school year starts

Unless you're that 19th teacher, though, the news certainly isn't welcome. And it raises some troubling issues, and questions

But not all the news is doom-and-gloom, there's even a possibility no teachers will be laid off. It sounds like Midas himself will have to make his way through the district's budget to turn some things into gold, but Booher pointed out some things that could happen to make the future a little brighter for those about to get pink-slipped

And, lest we be purveyors of doom, let us point out that the announcement of the possible layoffs was required by a contractual language that obligated the district to inform teachers 60 days before the current contract expires. As Booher is quick to point out, the announcement of the possible layoffs is not the same as actively laying teachers off

But the district has been saying for months now that dark financial clouds loom, that's not a surprise. While there is currently a fund surplus, district officials are hesitant to tap it. Proposal A doesn't do Plymouth-Canton many favors, district officials have been lobbying Lansing forever about making changes to allow the district to raise more money from its residents

At the same time, though, it should be pointed out the district approved spend-

ing more than \$300,000 on a new science program. That's all well and good, we believe the district should strive to provide the best curriculum possible within its budget constraints

But there have to be teachers available to teach it, or it's like buying a \$300,000 treadmill for the district to hang its laundry on

The larger picture is this: What better evidence of the flaws in the state's education funding formula than the fact that a quickly growing district — Plymouth-Canton expects somewhere in the neighborhood of 100 new students or more next year — being forced to lay off its most important asset?

Before P-C officials cry too deeply into their beer, though, perhaps they should look at the bright side. They're better off than Redford Udon, which is losing students, and Livonia, which is talking about closing buildings. Neither of those is the case in Plymouth-Canton

Laying off teachers, especially in a district that has worked as hard as Plymouth-Canton at lowering class sizes, should be a drastic, last-resort step. Teachers are the face of the district for students and their parents, and the district's most valuable asset

We understand that a huge chunk of the district's \$125 million budget is eaten up in personnel costs. And we believe the administration has worked hard at keeping costs in all areas down. We hope — and believe — Booher, financial director Patricia Brand and the rest of the administration are searching for every way possible to avoid teacher layoffs

This is a district that believes kids come first. Not laying off teachers would be a great way to show it

Proms and drinking are a combination to avoid

Prom time again, time to send out a warning

But it's a pretty good bet that the people who need to hear this most will not be reading an editorial in The Observer

It's also a good bet that even if they did read it, they wouldn't be deterred from doing what they're going to do

Still, every year we make the same appeal in the hopes of reaching someone. It's selfish, really, because we'd rather not be covering yet another story of a prom night gone terribly wrong because of drugs and alcohol. Anyone who has been in community journalism for any amount of time is all too familiar with young lives ended too soon or ruined by a careless and stupid decision to give over self control to mind altering substances

It's not as if the message isn't proclaimed loud and clear

Since early in their school years kids have been exposed to DARE and other sincere anti-drug programs. Schools have exhibits with mangled cars and pictures of mangled bodies. Groups like MADD and SADD distribute literature repeating the effects of just one beer, one glass of wine, one shot of liquor. Young girls are warned that the possibility of unwanted sexual attention increases dramatically when alcohol is involved

But too many young people turn a deaf ear because "We want to PARTY, DUDE!" "Adults had their fun and they just want to deny us ours" "I can handle it, everything's under control" "A few beers can't hurt anybody" "Whaddya want us to be, a bunch of nerds" "Girls just wanna have fun" "Boys will be

boys"

We could counter with "Dead is dead" Paralyzed, raped and criminally liable are other ideas we could suggest to the young and hope they understand

Parents look forward to proms. They love seeing their daughters in pretty gowns, their hair swept up, giddy with anticipation. They love seeing their sons awkward in tuxedos and ruffles, cracking jokes to hide their anxiety. Parents take pictures. They give warnings. Then they send their young adults off with a fervent prayer that everything will be fine

The sad thing is there is no telling who will make that fatal mistake. Sometimes it is the child of inattentive parents who set a bad example and encourage reckless behavior. But often it is the straight-arrow children of loving but strict parents, who once out of sight decide to take another direction

As futile as it sometimes seems to be, we do urge parents to sit down with their children and tell them once again that drugs and alcohol are dangerous. Driving under the influence will endanger them, their passengers and others. Drinking and drugs can lead to dangerous and unhealthy sexual situations. Drinking and drugs can lead to potentially violent encounters

Tell them and tell them again. Keep the conversation going. Be informed. Teach, don't preach. Be a good example. Show them that a happy life and a good time don't need to be fueled by alcohol and drugs

Perhaps they lash out because they know that Dick Posthumus has a plan that is right for Michigan taxpayers

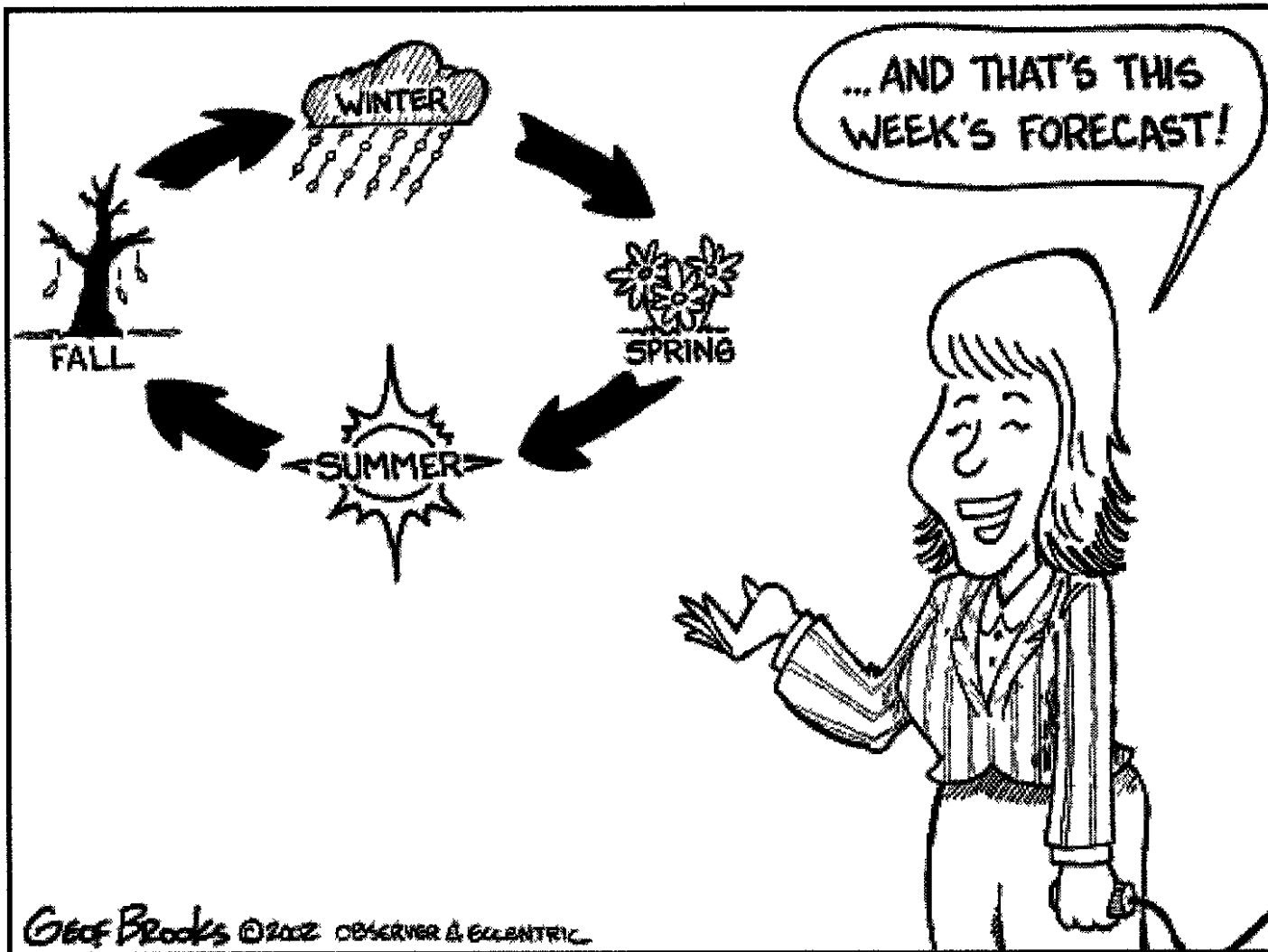
Maybe the reason they strongly oppose his plan is that they've lost sight of what the voters want for themselves and their families

Who are we?

The Transportation Department of Plymouth-Canton Schools is one of the most valuable assets in our community. The people involved in taking your children to and from school are one of the most precious groups we have around us

Work at the bus yard starts between 5-5:30 a.m. while most families are still fast asleep in their beds. It's still dark outside. At times you can still see the moon and stars. The roads are almost empty of cars. The weather conditions could be horrific with ice, snow and sleet

or absolutely beautiful, depending on the season

Some winter months we are out before the salt trucks, springtime, before we have been alerted of 50 mph winds!

We usually know before anyone that a traffic light is out or where the black ice is or that a car is in the ditch, or an animal has been hit and needs help, downed electric wires, etc. We are the first to know and see most everything going on in the early hours of the day. The bus yard lights are on along with the bus garage. Over 100 buses are getting ready for the journey of picking and dropping off your most precious possessions — your children

One by one we pre-trip our buses which includes entire inspection of the bus from outer to inner to under the bus. Everything must be perfect during the pre-trip or the bus doesn't leave the yard

Sometimes drivers see and report situations that have just happened that police and fire departments are not yet aware of. These drivers reports are called into dispatch, who, in turn, call the proper authorities. They have probably saved some lives, patrolling your community day and night during the bus route drive

We have many substitute drivers to accommodate routes when drivers call in sick. They are very efficient and well trained

Drivers and staff are all dedicated to making things run as smooth as possible. Drivers and staff are so proud and happy when they are able to turn a bad situation into a good one with the children

Drivers have sick children. Calls are made to dispatch and parents are called and school principals get involved in getting your child the help they need

Drivers have small children who miss their stop on the way home. Drivers contact dispatch to notify this and that if parents call, the child will be dropped off a little later than usual and not to worry

Special Ed drivers are the greatest people. They are transporting some children who are terminally ill and drivers are truly affected by their early departures

Drivers in conversation call the riders, "My kids." They are proud of "Their kids." They brag that the kids on their bus "are the best" and "their kids are polite and good to them." They like bragging about "Our Kids"

If you have a concern or any questions regarding your child's bus ride, please feel free and comfortable to call and ask to talk to the staff at (734) 416-3000. They all are very wonderful people anxious to please. They are good listeners. No concern is too small

Be kind to the staff when you call. They care about your children. They are your best friends

All transportation drivers and staff are a wonderful group of people who love their jobs and love your children. Be good friends, call as often as needed. We are one big family when it comes to caring and protecting your children. The Plymouth-Canton transportation group reminds me of "Guardian Angels"

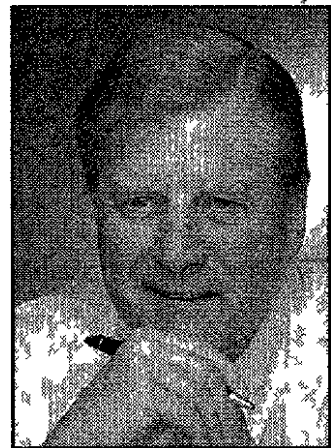

Local papers, readers owe a lot to Staley T. McBrayer

It was just a standard obit in last Saturday's New York Times. Staley T. McBrayer, who died at 92, was a smalltime Texas newspaper publisher and tinkerer.

But McBrayer took an unwanted German press and figured out how to adapt offset printing technology to making newspapers. In so doing, he revolutionized the newspaper industry and made possible the success of hometown newspapers like this one. His life is conclusive evidence of how a small innovation can spawn profound consequences that were completely unimagined at the time.

McBrayer started out working as advertising and business manager of The Commerce Journal, a weekly newspaper in Commerce, Texas. After a while, he bought several other small newspapers in the Fort Worth area. But the salaries of the linotypists, who set in hot metal news stories and ads using a Rube Goldberg-like contraption called a Linotype machine, were "killing us," according to his partner, Jenkins Garrett.

So McBrayer and some employees in the back shop started tinkering around with how to set the type and print the newspapers cheaper than current technology allowed. They paid \$10,000 for a castoff press and figured out how to adapt offset printing to the production of newspapers. Abandoning the industry-standard but slow and clumsy Linotype machine, they perfected "cold type" photographic typesetting. Then they learned to transfer the image of a newspaper page to a thin metal plate. Ink adhering to the images on the plate was transferred — offset — to a rubber blanket which then transferred the image onto newsprint. And, eureka, offset printing!

At that time, most newspaper press manufacturers believed offset would never click for the fast rotary presses required to print newspapers. But the technology worked. Within 30 years after McBrayer's first press was developed in 1954, virtually all the newspapers in America were printed by offset.

His invention made the skills — and the high wages and the workplace stranglehold — of Lino type operators irrelevant, thereby setting off a

long, fierce struggle over the future of linotypists and other workers in the letterpress crafts.

"Cold type" typesetting was far easier, quicker and cheaper than the old "hot type" system. For example, when I started out in this business back in the 1960s, I used to write my column on a Linotype machine. If I was really flying, I could set it in around an hour. Today, I'm writing this column on a computer, which transfers the file to a phototypesetter that converts bits and bytes to readable copy (I trust) in seconds.

Since photographic negatives were cheaper, more maneuverable and easier to use than heavy trays of lead type, newspapers using offset technology could join together to set type and print in cooperative plants. The cost savings were considerable.

Moreover, because photographic typesetting was so much faster and cost efficient than hot type methods, home town newspapers like this one could localize their coverage economically, focusing on one community at a time without having to jumble local news from several different towns into a big regional newspaper like the metropolitan daily newspapers still do.

I never met Staley T. McBrayer; indeed, I had never heard of him before I read his obituary in The New York Times. But I owe him a great debt of gratitude. And so do countless readers whose lives are enhanced by reading their hometown newspaper like this one.

So the community newspapers, arguably the most innovative and entrepreneurial part of the newspaper industry, really got their start as a result of Staley T. McBrayer's innovative genius way back in the mid 1950s. Like many of my publisher colleagues, I adopted phototypesetting and offset printing in my newspapers in the late 1960s.

I never met Staley T. McBrayer, indeed, I had never heard of him before I read his obituary in The New York Times. But I owe him a great debt of gratitude. And so do countless readers whose lives are enhanced by reading their own hometown newspaper like this one.

Michigan unique in debating issue of judicial activism

"We are dealing with only the hairballs, if we are doing our job right," said Michigan Supreme Court

ers here, having had a chance to decide between the two schools of judicial thought, chose to keep the traditionalists.

I'm not convinced. Once voters get a chance to view the traditionalists in action, I think, they may have a different reaction.

It's fine to argue, as Young does, that the law is just what it says it is in writing when you are talking about legislation that applies to the general public.

Provisions that limit government, such as those in the constitution, I think should get a broader view.

We've all dealt with the used car salesman who can come up with a contract that appears to say one thing, and then treats it in a completely different way once the signatures have been placed on the dotted line.

In fact, the law recognizes that contracts can be "deceptively written." Contracts written in that way are prohibited under Michigan law.

But the "constitutional traditionalist" philosophy, in my view, lets the used car salesman get away with his fraud.

We saw it in the Supreme Court's most publicized case last year, its ruling on the new concealed weapons statute. We all thought we had a right to referendum, the ability to petition to overturn laws passed by the Legislature. But lawmakers found a loophole, an exception for bills that allocate money.

The "traditionalist" majority on the court interpreted the words of the constitution literally, and thus found that it was irrelevant that a "legislative subterfuge" was being used. The constitution doesn't stop "the legislature from capriciously exercising its power of appropriation," they said.

Scary stuff from a court whose job is to be the final say on a document like the constitution, written in large part to place controls and limits on what government can and cannot do.

Young has to run again this fall. He'll be on the ballot along with Justice Elizabeth Weaver seeking re-election.

So the debate over traditionalism versus judicial activism will continue. And it should.

Justice Robert Young Jr.

In Howell to talk to Livingston County Teenage Republicans on their Legal Career Day, he also took a few minutes to chat with journalists of the HomeTown Communications Network.

He was explaining about the quiet revolution the current Supreme Court majority is taking our state through. Calling himself a "constitutional traditionalist," he believes the "judicial activism" of justices in the past has made for an inconsistent application of the law. Only if the court interprets the constitution and laws literally — according to just what the words are as they have been written down on paper — will the rest of us really know what our rights truly are, he said.

Activism — the philosophy in which judges try to decipher the meaning of the laws, as Young describes it — has led to inconsistent rulings and case law. So the rest of us can't really be sure how a judge will rule in a given case once it reaches the trial stage.

What the Supreme Court is going through is a process of "judicial hygiene," said Young.

And that's where the hairball analogy came in. "These are the areas where the fabric of the law has become gnarled, the fabric itself frayed, and our job is to go in and say, 'no, this is the pattern,' so that you can understand what the next step in that pattern will be."

"So we are dealing with the hardest cases in the state, and to do it fluently, in understandable English, to do it persuasively, and to have a comprehensible result is a very high goal of this court."

Young's conservative view of the role of the judiciary — interpreting what the law says, not what it should be — was the big issue in the race for the Supreme Court in the 2000 elections. He contends Michigan is unique among states in having dealt directly with it. He gives credit to Gov. John Engler — one of the few governors, according to Young, who really understands the issue — as having brought it to the fore through his appointments to the bench.

Of course, Young also feels the outcome of the election vindicated his traditionalist views. Vote

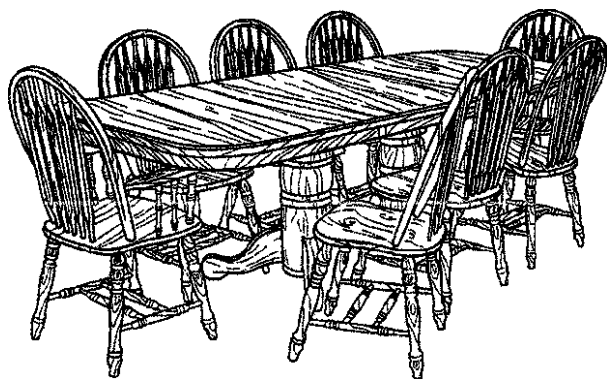
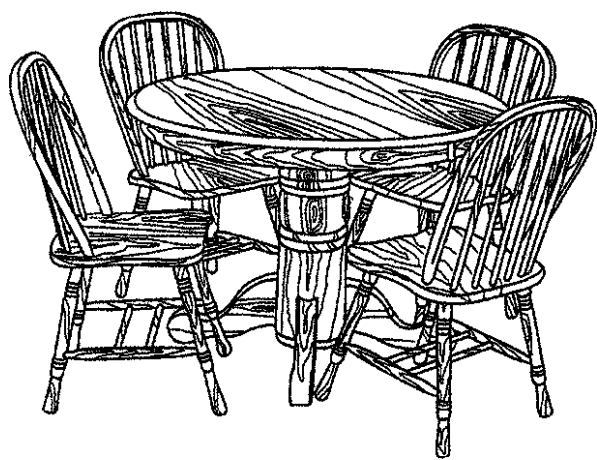

Commission takes Metro fight to court

The ongoing battle between the Wayne County Commission and County Executive Ed McNamara over future control of Metropolitan Airport intensified this week, and has even threatened the future of a massive mixed use development south of the airport.

On Monday, the commission filed a lawsuit in the U.S. District Court in Detroit challenging the legality of the state Legislature's decision last month to transfer the license to operate Metro and Willow Run airports away from the county to a seven-member independent authority.

According to Senate Bill 690, which was endorsed by McNamara and signed into law by Gov. John Engler March 26, all seven members of the authority are to be appointed, four by the Wayne County executive, two by the governor, and one by the commission.

While McNamara and Engler have already appointed six members to the authority, the commission has refused to appoint the final member.

Authority meets

Despite the lawsuit and the lack of a seventh member, the authority held its first public meeting Wednesday at Metro's Marriott Hotel. The authority's first action was to name itself the Wayne County Airport Authority.

Named in the commission's lawsuit are McNamara, Engler and the Federal Aviation Administration, which must approve the transfer of power to the new airport authority. The commission is also expected to file a restraining order today in federal court to prevent the FAA from making a decision until the court hears the lawsuit.

According to Commissioner Kay Beard, who represents Westland, Garden City and Inkster, McNamara and Engler had no right to go around the commission and strike the deal that led to the formation of the authority.

"The idea to give seven people that kind of authority without ever having any public hearings is unlawful. These people are all

appointed, which means they will not be accountable to the tax payers of this county," she said.

McNamara said he disagrees with the commission's lawsuit, because the county has no choice but to abide by the actions of the state Legislature.

"I don't think the commission understands we are creatures of the state Legislature," he said. "They are wasting their time and county dollars with this lawsuit. It is a desperate act."

According to McNamara, the new authority will run the airport much more efficiently than the commission, which he doesn't believe has the business savvy to do the job.

"The people on the commission don't have a lot of business training, whereas the members of the authority have long careers and success in the business world," he said.

"Governor Engler and I have worked hard to make sure we have proven leaders on this board. These individuals will give the airport the leadership and direction to function as a business does and become a competitive powerhouse for this region and this state."

Development stalled
The feud between McNamara and the commission over operations at the airport is spilling over into the development of the Pinnacle Aeropark of Wayne County, a 1,300-acre mixed-use development just south of Metro Airport in Romulus and Huron Township. If completed, the Pinnacle will be the biggest development of its kind in the state.

More than a year ago McNamara asked the commission to approve the creation of an authority to oversee the county-owned development but the commission has refused to vote on the issue. McNamara said the

commission's failure to act could mean losing as much as \$60 million in state funding for the project.

"This is the second most important project in the state, and the commission walked away from it," he said.

Commissioner John Sullivan, who represents both Romulus and Huron Township, as well as Canton, said the mistrust between the commission and McNamara over the airport has been a factor in the commission's lack of action on the Pinnacle project.

"That's definitely part of it. Some of our legal counsel has said creating an authority for this project will look bad in our fight against the airport authority. But I feel this is a totally different ballgame. I just don't see how it is going to hurt us with the other issue," he said.

"Personally, I've always been in support of this project. But I'm not sure we have enough votes to get it approved. Whatever the case, I think we need to move forward. Either we're voting for it, or we're not."

Beard said McNamara hasn't given commissioners enough time to fully evaluate the issue, and doesn't believe there should be a vote until they do.

"We're not elected to be a rubber stamp for Mr. McNamara. It is our responsibility to carefully weigh the issues in front of us and vote on them. If we were to do any less, we would be neglecting our duty to the people who elected us," Beard said.

Young pianist happy to be home again

It's not that Sanjay Mody doesn't love Paris. Who wouldn't enjoy going to the Louvre or attending concerts whenever you feel like it? Culture is everywhere but after nearly a year away from his Birmingham home the young pianist longs to spend time with his friends.

Mody is eager to tell them all about his adventures. He has plenty of stories about preparing for the entrance exam to the Paris National Superior Conservatory of Music after studying since June with graduate level piano professor Marie Francoise Bucquet. In March, Mody passed with flying colors, placing first among 200 applicants.

The 15 year old returned to Birmingham at the beginning of April for a four week stay. I just wish I had all my friends here over there. They've asked me if I regretted moving. I said 'no' because I'm going to get to visit more."

Festival serves up films for reflection

What would have happened if Hitler had won the war? David Magidson throws out the premise of *It Happened Here*, an underground classic in the fourth annual Lenore Marwil Jewish Film Festival presented by the Jewish Community Center April 28 to May 8.

It's half past nine on a Tuesday morning and Magidson, between bites of breakfast, wonders as film director Kevin Brownlow did what the fate of Jews would have been in England where the movie takes place. He pauses to reflect.

As festival director, Magidson and a committee spent hundreds of hours reviewing more than 100 films for the thought-provoking content found in Brownlow's film that took six years to

make in the late 1950s and early 1960s. Brownlow allows British fascists to share their views of the Jews, sounding warning bells nearly two decades after World War II.

Of the 25 films showing at theaters in Birmingham, Commerce Township and Ann Arbor, the majority deal with historical events and the struggles of Jewish people in Europe and the U.S.

Magidson begins to list the highlights of the festival — *One of the Hollywood Ten* stars Jeff Goldblum as Herbert Biberman in a fictionalized feature about the period in American artistic/political history when writers were blacklisted.

"These are well-made movies about important issues. I don't think there's a bad movie in the bunch," said Magidson, a Bloomfield Township resident. "It's difficult to find 25 movies for general entertainment let alone to find 25 good Jewish movies."

Not content to send audiences home thinking about what they've seen, the film festival committee has invited guest speakers such as U.S. Rep. Barney Frank (D-Mass.) who brings contemporary issues such as homosexuality to the forefront. Frank will answer questions after showings of *Let's Get Frank*, a film currently in production and featuring him as one of the openly gay politicians who are Jewish, and *The Times of Harvey Milk*, an Oscar-winning documentary. The film chronicles the life and murder of Milk, a San Francisco supervisor who was gay and Jewish, and Mayor George Moscone of San Francisco. Filmmaker Bart Everly will lead the discussion along with Frank.

Producer/director Monique Schwarz is traveling from Australia to talk about *Mamadrama*, a documentary

that challenges the way Jewish mothers are portrayed in film. The film dispenses negative stereotypes of Jewish mothers as controlling, manipulative and guilt-inducing.

Magidson expects movies like these to draw even larger crowds than last year. In anticipation of the demand to see *In Search of Peace Part One 1948-1967* and other films in the festival, the committee expanded the number of venues from one to three. *In Search of Peace* brings the history of the founding and defending of Israel to life. Narrated by Michael Douglas, the film is a timely documentary in light of the current conflict in the Middle East.

The Power of Good: Nicholas Winton is sure to attract hundreds of viewers as well. The documentary about an Englishman, who saved 679

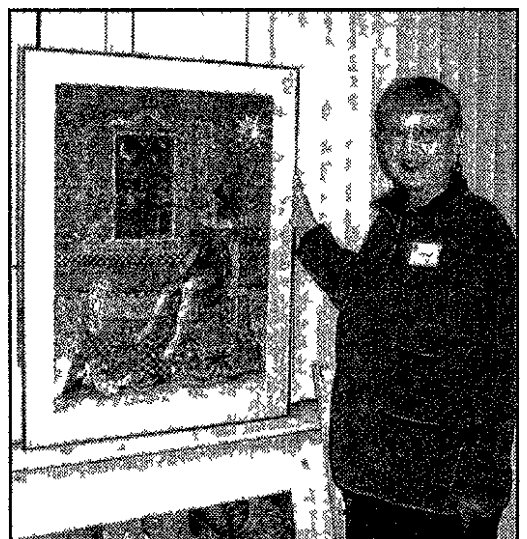

Seventies musical returns with a message of hope

The Meadow Brook Theatre stage is deserted as if waiting for the lively musical *Godspell* to bring it to life on opening night Saturday, April 27. It's lunchtime and one of the crews is taking a break from laying the floor, the first step in setting the scene. They've been working around the clock since *Cat on a Hot Tin Roof* closed on April 14.

Debra Wicks isn't worried about it coming together for previews Thursday-Friday, April 25-26. This is her second time directing the musical after acting in it four times. She knows Stephen Schwartz's music and lyrics. In fact, she'd probably still be performing in the John-Michael Tebelak musical if not for the realization that this is a show for young actors. The last time Wicks acted in the play was in a 1985 summer stock production in Missouri where she was working as a freelance actress.

"I got down in one of the dance positions and couldn't get up," said Wicks, who also serves as Meadow Brook Theatre's interim artistic director. Wicks hesitates to say how old she is but has spent the last 28 years acting and directing professionally and teaching at universities.

"I love this musical. It makes me feel good. It's one of those musicals that resonates with people my age, baby boomers. We grew up with it. As humans we like to go to musicals. We're familiar with it. It's hummable and something parents can share with their kids."

Wicks chose the musical about the last seven days of Jesus' life because of its popularity since opening Off Broadway in 1971, and on Broadway in 1976. The underlying theme appeals to people of all faiths.

"What the play gives you is hope," said Wicks. "There's no

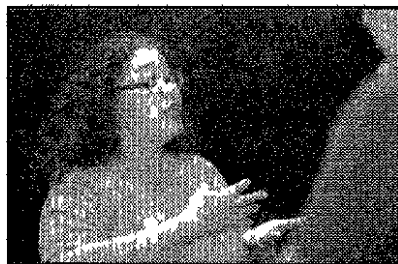
resurrection in the play. Whether the character is Jesus or not is not important. He is someone with a message of hope and willing to sacrifice himself for greater good. There's something I think everyone is thinking about."

Wicks is taking the musical to the rooftops of a big city to set the scene. Designer Peter Hicks's brick walls and vivid blue sky provide the perfect backdrop for the 10-member cast who start the musical in the audience and eventually leap up and down ladders on stage.

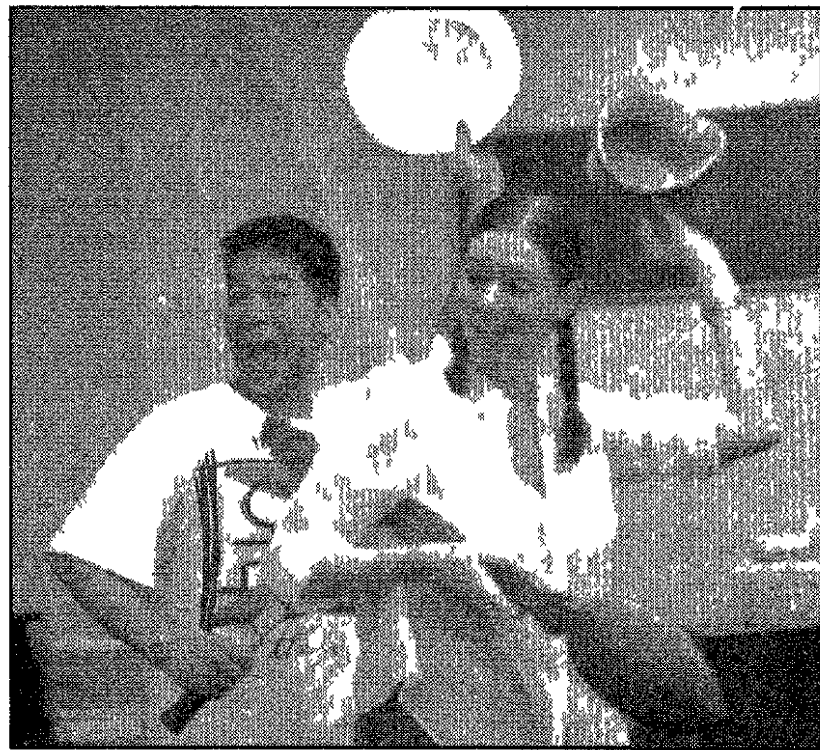
Ensemble

"It can be set anywhere - a junkyard, subway or playground," said Wicks who lived in the Bronx for three years while working as an actress in New York. "What you need is an open area and debris. I grew up on a farm. There's a different stress level in the city. People are looking for something or someone to make sense of it all. In a city if

you're going to go someplace to think it's up on the rooftop."

After rehearsing the cast six to eight hours a day, six days a week for the last three weeks, Joey Bybee agrees with Wicks that the rooftop is the place to be. The 21-year-old Pontiac actor enjoys moving around the stage as Herb, one of the characters. This is his first professional production, one he can list on his resume after graduating with a degree in musical theater from Oakland University in May.

"I wasn't familiar with *Godspell*," said Bybee who wasn't even born when the musical took Broadway by storm. "My roommate has every musical on the planet and I was playing it and fell in love with the music. Then we began rehearsals and I found it's a process of coming up with bits and fun things like doing voices of Maurice Chevalier."

Like Shannon Locke, Bybee thinks the reason the musical's remained fresh over the last 30 years is because it's based on improvisation.

Artistic freedom

"It's really an exercise in imagination," said Locke, who's understudying all the female roles.

"There's more artistic freedom because we're playing ourselves and get to improvise," added Bybee. "I like climbing around lots of levels on stage. I get to explore them all. I leap and perch. It's liberating."

It's the exact opposite for Denise Costello who's cast as the introverted Peggy. The West Bloomfield resident's been acting since age 11 in the performing arts program at Abbott Middle School and then at West Bloomfield High School where she did three shows a year and was president of the Thespian Society. She furthered her talent at Interlochen Arts Camp for

five summers before earning a bachelor degree in musical theater performance at Western Michigan University.

"I'm not a shy person so I have to be reserved until the point where she breaks out of her skin," said Costello. "What excites me about the show is the words are for everyone. It has a message of faith. For some it might be a message of hope. It's fun for two hours and keeps the audience asking more questions at the end."

While Alonzo Luzod appreciates what the musical is saying, he's more impressed with the quality of the production. The Farmington resident plays Jeffrey, an insightful character. In the past Luzod's performed with the Plymouth Canton Ballet Company and Tinderbox Productions based in Redford.

New season

The professionalism of the cast is what Wicks counts on year after year. It will be especially important to find the brightest talent next season when Meadow Brook Theatre

presents a variety of productions including *The Foreigner*, *Wait Until Dark*, the latest musical comedy *Meshuggah Nuns* by Dan Goggin, and Agatha Christie's *Witness for the Prosecution* which opens on Oct. 16. While Wicks is very excited about the Shaw Festival's January residency for a production of *Candida*, she can't stop talking about *A Thousand Cranes* which kicks off the theater's new Family Series on Sept. 28. The family-oriented shows continue with the return of the popular *A Christmas Carol* Nov. 29 to Dec. 22.


"It's a true story about a young girl who gets leukemia after surviving the bombing of Hiroshima," said Wicks explaining the plot of *A Thousand Cranes*. "She learns of the legend that if a person folds a thousand cranes a wish will be fulfilled and begins folding the paper birds. Even though she doesn't complete them, it turns into a wish for peace when school children finish the task. It's an exciting piece of theater, an important piece of theater for now. This is a lesson to be learned and relearned a lesson from 60 years ago we haven't learned yet. It's about the children - that they can make a difference. You can achieve anything if you put your mind to it."

C'MON C'MON - SHERYL CROW

Thank goodness for the skip button

It'll get a workout when listening to Sheryl Crow's latest release, *C'mon C'mon*. About half of the tunes are worth hearing, the rest should have been left on the cutting-room floor.

Musically, *C'mon C'mon* has no cohesiveness. Numerous guest stars don't help the album gel.

Lyrical, Crow doesn't score points for originality with lines such as "life is what happens when you're making plans" — a line recorded by John Lennon more than 20 years ago.

Equally insipid is this painful couplet: "I'm just like the weather/I keep changing my mind."

The album opens promisingly enough with *Steve McQueen*, a tightly knit three-minute rocker. And the next song, *Soak up the Sun*, is a catchy Beatlesque ditty that benefits from backing vocals

But the Don Henley duet on *It's So Easy* sounds like it was cut at a karaoke bar by pop-star wannabes.

Speaking of karaoke, why is Gwyneth Paltrow singing on *It's Only Love*? Thankfully, her vocals are so low in the mix it could be Miss Piggy singing and no one would be the wiser.

The best song on the album is its last, *On Weather Channel*. Crow turns down the volume and finds an easygoing vibe with the help of Emmylou Harris.

But Crow's uneven effort leaves the listener in awe one minute and screaming 'C'mon!' in frustration the next.

HEART TO YOURS - MICHELLE WILLIAMS

R&B artists usually don't venture into gospel music at the height of their careers, generally, it's a step taken when their secular careers are losing steam.

Michelle Williams of Destiny's Child bucks the trend with her debut solo project, the gospel album *Heart to Yours*. But it seems Williams is not ready to fully shed her secular influences.

Dance beats abound on this album, making it sound more like a Destiny's Child remix record than a religious disc. *Heard a Word* would be unrecognizable as a gospel record if it weren't for the occasional utterance of the word "Lord." In addition, the song *Rock With Me*, with its wailing electric guitar, is a little much here.

The disc even features Destiny's Child doing the same *Gospel Medley* that's on their own *Survivor* disc, an odd choice because it serves as a vocal showcase for lead singer Beyoncé Knowles, not Williams.

The song selection only underscores the album's main problem — Williams is no Knowles. She cannot deliver vocally — her voice is too nasally and often

sounds whiny

It's no surprise that the better songs are *So Glad* with Mary Mary and *Steal Away to Jesus* with Shirley Caesar. These artists overpower Williams, and make you realize what real gospel singers — and music — should sound like.

HAMMERED - MOTORHEAD

Motorhead's new album, *Hammered*, is a metal primer for budding rock bands. It provides a "how-to" on metal-music basics — and some good lyrics.

This band has been around since 1975, so these guys are more grizzled than a biker-bar regular — which is exactly their appeal.

Brave New World is a layman's take on the state of the world corrupted by power and greed. It has the fast pace and guitar growl of the band's better-known songs such as *Ace of Spades* and *Eat the Rich*.

Down the Line is a good tune

about getting out of a stagnant relationship. It's the closest thing to a love ballad that lead singer/headbanger Lemmy Kilmister can muster.

Kilmister will always be the force behind Motorhead. His vocals are still limited to strained yelps, but there's musi-

cal sincerity when he belts out lines such as "And religion, like the monster that it is/Keeps telling you to turn the other cheek/God is on your side, but I don't think that you're on his/If Jesus showed up now he'd be in jail by next week."

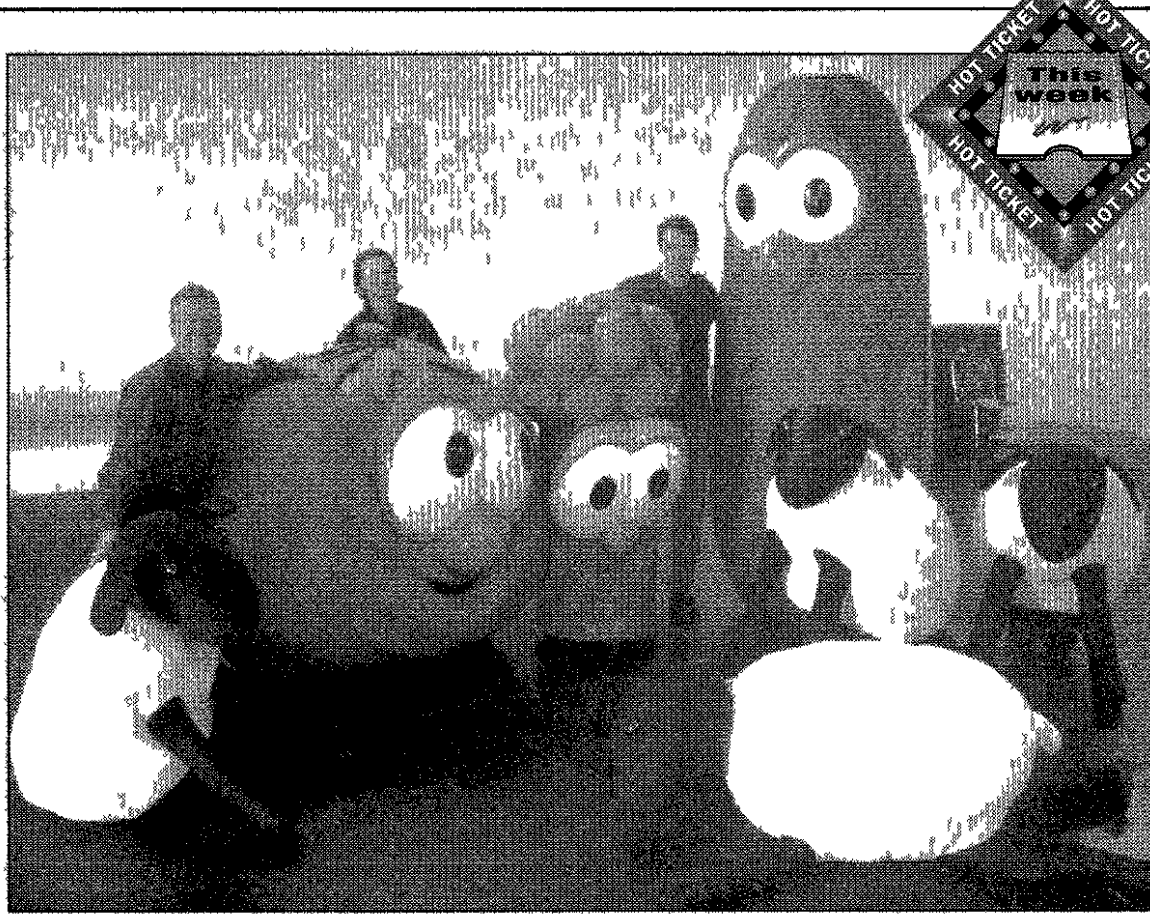

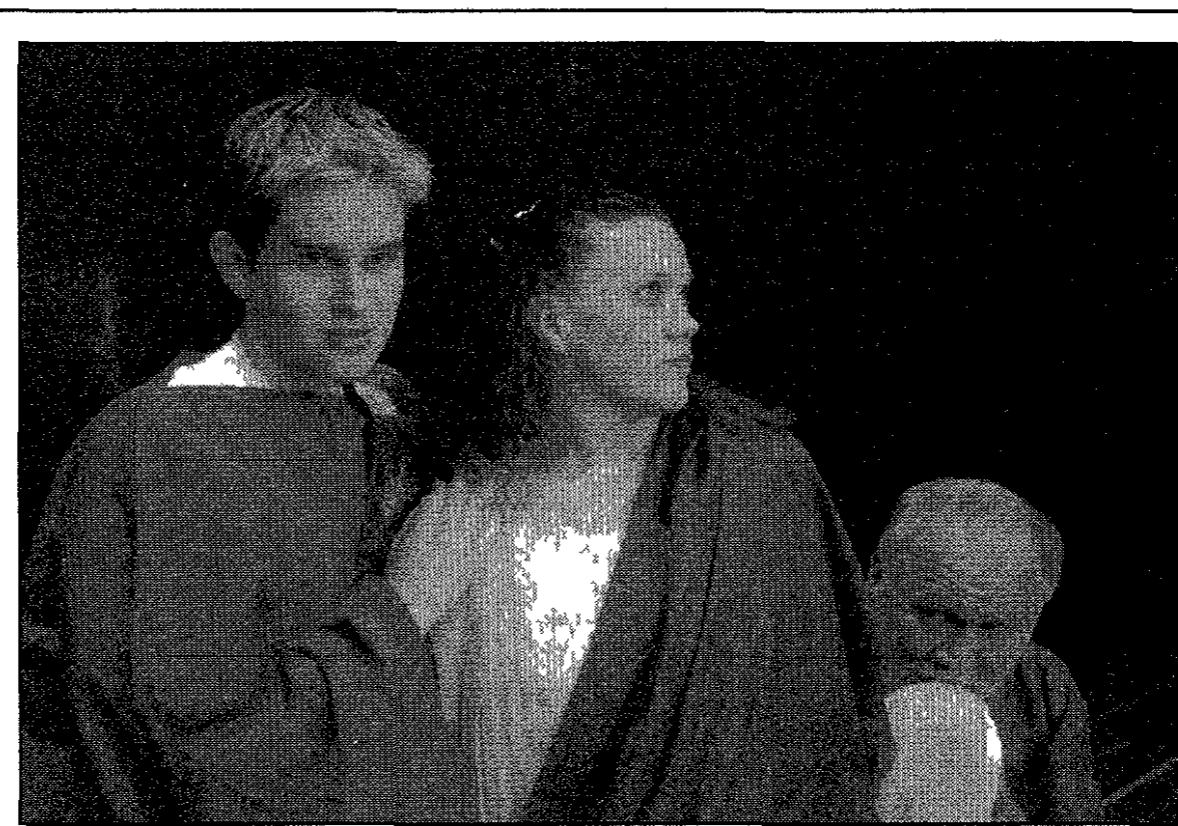

Realizing the impact that hearing about the risky venture first hand could have on an audience, Czech director Matej Minac made the film after finishing *All My Loved Ones*, a fictionalized version of Winton's heroic effort. Both will be shown on Sunday, May 5, *All My Loved Ones* in Birmingham in the afternoon, *The Power of Good: Nicholas Winton* in Ann Arbor in the evening. As a special bonus Winton and Minac be present for a reception before the evening showing and after the film. Collaboration

The showing and event are a result of a collaboration between the Jewish Community Center of Washtenaw and the Jewish Community Center of Metropolitan Detroit. "We had 8,100 people view last year's films. Ninety-eight percent of the seats were filled so we added more seats, more performances," said Magidson. "It takes nearly a year of planning and holding feedback meetings to ask audiences what they like then in July we gather films to preview and try to pick by December. "We're looking for films of interest to general audiences with Jewish interests - things that are entertaining but not just entertainment, things that are thought provoking and go beyond the issue. We would like it not to be over when people leave the theater." There's comedy too, Crunch Bird cartoons and other lighter fare. A new re-mastered print of the 1942 Jack Benny movie, *To Be or Not to Be*, tells the story of a Polish acting troupe that foils Hitler's plan and saves thousands of lives. *The Ballad of Ramblin' Jack* tells the story of folk singer Jack Elliot who along with Woody Guthrie, Peter Yarrow and Joan Baez tried to change the world with song. All of the films are probably ones Milton and Lenore Marwil would have loved to watch before they were married. The legend goes that the two courted at the movies and that was the reason Milton created a \$250,000 endowment for the festival four years ago in honor of his late wife Mil-

ton died in January but their love of movies lives on through the festival because of his generous gift. Each festival costs more than \$85,000 to produce, and while ticket sales make up a major portion of the budget, grants from Michigan Council for Arts & Cultural Affairs and the Oakland County Cultural Mm Grant program along with several sponsors make the movie extravaganza possible. "It's a community effort. We have 80-100 volunteers, a committee at large and a small committee of four to view the films," said Magidson who was a volunteer the first year and now in his third year as festival director. Magidson considers himself a part of the entertainment business which has as many failure

stories as successes. A theater professor at Wayne State University and director of the Center for Arts and Public Policies, Magidson has taught film and TV writing, directed nearly 100 plays and produced 250. *His Sisters Rosen zweig* is currently in rotating repertory through Saturday, May 4 at the Hilberry Theatre. Magidson will direct the season opener, Neil Simon's *The Good Doctor*, there in fall. "I like the movies. My business is show business," said Magidson. "We try to make it as exciting as we can but as a business-like as we can. There's a perception that this is easy. You put on a film festival and walk away with a pocket full of money."

"You have to work and collaborate with people who have new ways of looking at things. But first you have to give yourself permission to explore," said flutist Ginka Gerova Ortega, artistic director of Musica Viva! which will present a Festival of World Music and Dance, Friday, May 10 at the Smith Theatre on Oakland Community College's Orchard Ridge campus in Farmington Hills. music now," said Ortega who was trained as a classical flutist and studied with Jean Pierre Rampal. "I like the melodies and rhythm. The soul of Latin music is flute. I am surprising myself by how much of what I love is so

easy - it just comes to me."

World music was not popular when Ortega started the Musica Viva! World concert series 20 years ago. Now it's norm.

"My silent gesture has a loud voice," she said. "We are part of a universe that is awakening. We are the ones who make a difference. Our lives are a white canvas. Every day I ask myself, 'how am I going to make a difference?' We are small but we can do big things."

Each Musica Viva concert is like a microcosm of the world, she says. This concert will showcase music from three continents and 10 countries - from the mysteries of African drums, to the lush melodies of China, and Latin American tango.

Ortega heard Biakuye in Ann Arbor and was very impressed

with the group's authenticity. One of its members, Mark Stone, is a scholar who has studied west African music.

"What I am trying to do is create new sounds and instrumentation," said Ortega as she explained the music of Grupo Musica Viva. "This kind of combination of instruments is very rare, therefore you hear a new kind of sound with a classical base, but a new twist that explores different colors of the instrumentation. We are exploring the music of Latin America and taking it to another level."

Ortega just returned from Paris where she performed a tribute concert in memory of the one year anniversary of Rampal's passing. This summer she will perform for the International Festivals in Spain and in Mexico

composition," Pujdowski said "It was very inventive."

styles of playing in every country. Trying to learn a Rachmaninov sound is difficult. It's powerful and intense. Your fingers have to be strong. In Paris I'm working on different forms of style. My teacher believes all pieces should be played in their own style. She's not really a Parisian teacher even though there is a French school.

"Studying in Russia and Paris has made me realize how strong Michigan is for music. The young students here are excelling fast."

Success

Mody attributes his success to teacher Donald Morelock. Since beginning his studies with Schoolcraft music department chairman, Mody has won first place in the Rochester Symphony Youth Artist Competition and Michigan Music Teacher's Association solo and piano concerto competitions. On June 20, he'll perform as a soloist at the Con-

certgebouw in Amsterdam, Holland.

"We have a chemistry," said Mody about Morelock. "We can do things fast. We're very close. I needed that support from him. I think a pianist, if they're focused, can do something in two weeks. They have to be absolutely consumed. Chopin wrote the concerto I'm playing with the Livonia Symphony when he was 19."

Morelock is as fond of Mody as the young pianist is of him. Morelock's been traveling back and forth to Europe since finding out Mody's father was being transferred to Paris. Morelock helped the family research music education offerings in France.

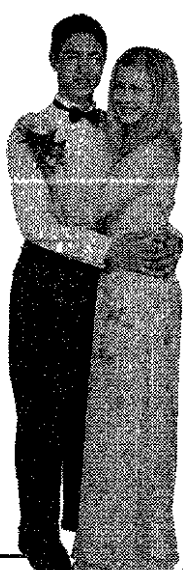

DINING OUT

Authentic MEXICAN CUISINE lies north of the border

True or false? You have to travel to the Southwest for authentic Mexican cuisine. Definitely false, compadre, especially when it comes to Camelia's Authentic Mexican Cuisine in Farmington Hills.

"We are actually more Tex Mex," said owner Camelia Flores. "The reason we say 'authentic Mexican' is because all of our foods are made from scratch."

Mexican or Tex Mex, the food at Camelia's is authentically delicious. The taco shells are parchment-paper crisp, the rice flavorful, and the refried beans taste nothing like the mush you get in cans. They're wonderfully "beany" with a savory bacon flavor. Need to know more? The salsa, which is made every morning and allowed to blend several hours in refrigerator, is chock-full of fresh cilantro.

"People have asked me if I would jar the salsa and sell it in a market. I think I'd have to put vinegar in it to preserve it, and I don't want to do that," said Flores.

Some people judge a Mexican restaurant by its tortilla chips. Camelia's homemade chips rate high.

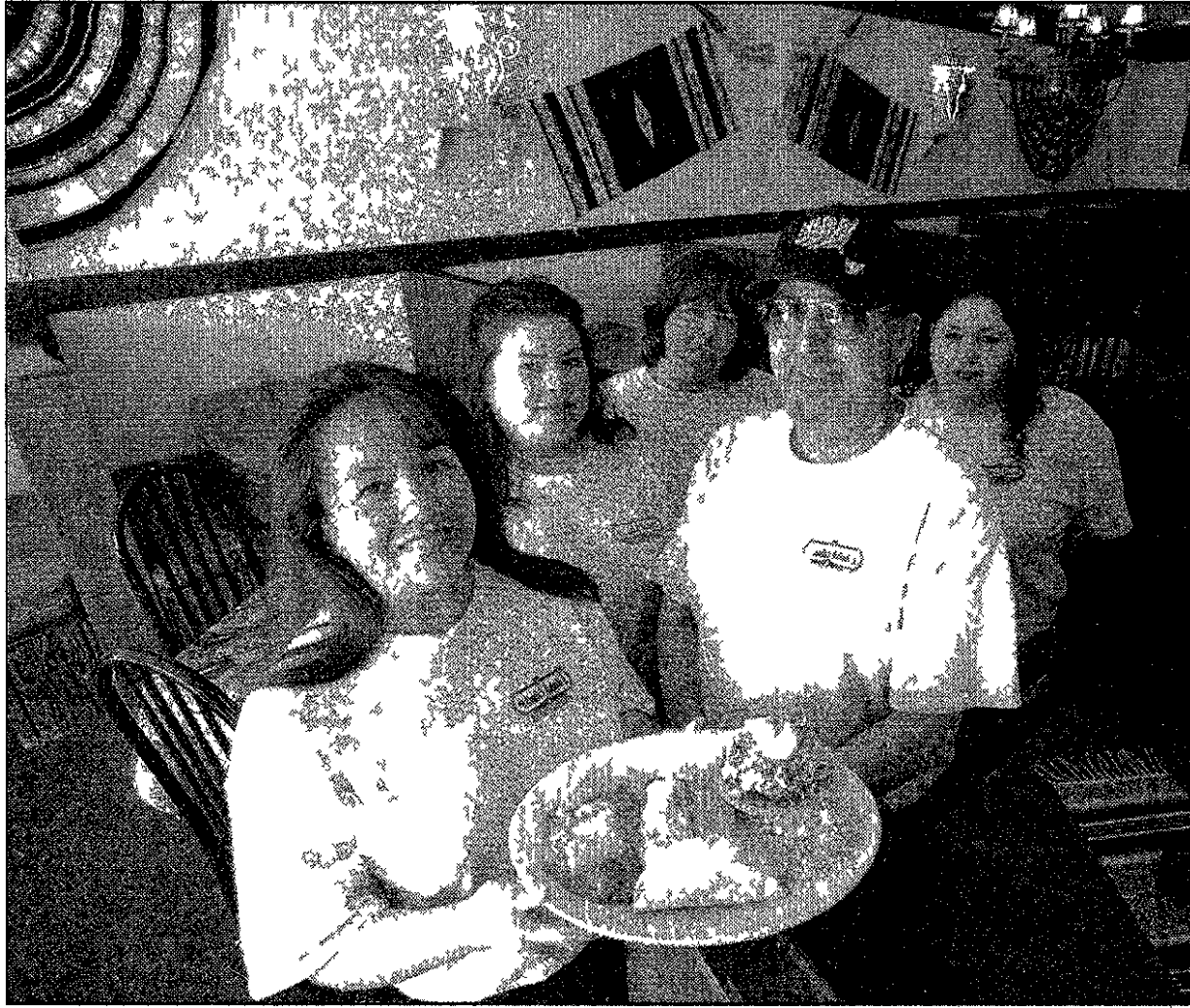
"We always made them at home," said Flores. "I said I'm going to try these here. Now I couldn't go back. People love them. We have one person back in the kitchen deep frying all day."

Opened just eight months, Camelia's is a family affair, with everyone involved - husband Tony, son Greg, and Flores mother, Dominga Garcia, who taught Flores how to cook.

"Now I'm teaching my granddaughters how to cook," said Garcia. "I learned from another Dominga, my father's mother. She was born in Mexico."

Camelia's is small and com-

fortable and the large front window lets in lots of sunshine. Colorful ponchos and paintings add just enough accent to the off-white walls. However, it's difficult to miss the huge framed photograph of Flores' father in the entranceway. There, in all his glory, is 17-year-old Jesus Garcia fighting a bull. Besides being a matador, Jesus was a cliff diver in Acapulco.

"He was very brave," said Flores. Quite an understatement.

While you don't have to be brave to eat at Camelia's, the

salsa is not for timid taste buds. Otherwise, order all the tacos, burritos and enchiladas you want and rest assured your heart burn will remain south of the border.

"I always tell people who come here for the first time to get the combination plate for variety," said Flores. "But my favorite is the Enchilada Suizas or the Camarones Rancheros. That's whole shrimp, and they're pretty good size, in our homemade ranchero sauce."

Flores' son, Greg, who plays in

a Mexican band and can sometimes be heard singing from the kitchen, recommends the Milanesa Dinner - steak or chicken breaded in special Mexican seasonings and topped with melted cheese and avocado. But then, everything tastes good at Camelia's, he said.

I took Flores' advice and ordered the combination plate - one flauta, chalupa and quesadilla with lots of rice and refried beans. Delicious. My dining companion ordered the taco salad. She loved the shredded

chicken and claimed the taco shell bowl definitely was not the hard, flower-pot variety served in other Mexican restaurants.

"And the cheese is white," she exclaimed. "When you go to Mexico there is no orange cheese."

Catering

Flores doesn't do large-scale catering, but she does make up "fiesta trays." Each tray contains 100 items - 20 each of tamales, hard tacos, soft tacos, enchiladas and burritos. The trays, which also come with rice, beans, four large bags of chips and two large containers of

sales, cost \$250.

"It's a real hot seller for baby showers and graduations," said Flores.

Flores hopes lots of people visit Camelia's on Sunday, May 5, in honor of Cinco de Mayo, which celebrates Mexico's victory over the French during the Battle of Puebla in 1862. She plans to have live entertainment, special give-aways, virgin Margaritas and daiquiris (they have no liquor license), as well as run specials on steak fajitas.

But don't wait until May 5 to visit Camelia's. Stop by anytime. A bowl of tortilla chips and salsa will be waiting.

Bridge to the world

Ramp program is blessing for those with disabilities

Five years ago, Rosie Hutchinson's family planted spring flowers in front of her home. She didn't go out to see them. Four years ago, they planted spring flowers. She didn't go out to see them. Three years ago, two years ago. And last year. This year, Hutchinson will go out to see the new flowers. This year, she's determined to help plant them.

This year, you see, for the first time since illness and disabilities locked her into a wheelchair, the 63-year-old grandma will roll past the barricading front steps that had barred flowers, fresh air, roller-skating grandchildren, and waves to new neighbors.

This spring, Hutchinson's chair, rather than continuing to confine her, will glide down the ramp just built at her front door. It will take her into a world she hasn't seen all these years.

She'll see the front of her house the same color as five years ago, but probably in need of painting, she said.

She'll see families who have moved in, she'll see the sidewalk where the kids play, and she'll see the flower beds filled in times past with plants she could only enjoy in photos the family brought in for her.

"I missed a whole lot," said the long-divorced mother of five and grandma of 16.

Her first time out, helped only as far as the head of the new ramp by one of her granddaughters, the world opened to her. "Oh, I loved it. I smelled the fresh air."

Soon, she'll make the ride down the ramp. One goal. The flower beds.

"With their help, I can just bend down and plant."

'Overwhelming need'

With the freedom the ramp promises, Hutchinson recognizes responsibility, as well, especially for the safety of the children who constantly visit. She's told them, "No roller skates on my ramp. They can walk down, but no skates, no bikes. They started to, but I stopped them."

Hutchinson, of Pontiac, had been stopped from going to church, at New Springfield Baptist, and is eager to rejoin her friends there. For anyone wondering how she got to

File mail right away in designated 'homes'

Q: I do not know how to efficiently deal with all the mail we receive each day. I never know where to put everything, so it usually ends up stacked on the kitchen counter.

A it will be easier to deal with the mail if you create a home for each paper before it enters your house. Anticipate the kind of mail you receive and create a place for these papers ahead of time. Some mail you will not be able to foresee, so you will need to make a file for these items after they arrive at your house.

If you receive an abundance of unwanted mail then call or write organizations and ask for your name to be deleted from their mailing list.

Homes for the Mail

Bills - Make sure there is a specific home for the bills, such as a specific box labeled 'bill box' or file folder. The location should be in a place that you would look at often so you remember to pay the bills on time.

Spouse's mail - Assign a basket for your spouse's mail. Ask him to deal with it immediately or before the basket overflows.

Children's mail - Place their mail in their room on a desk, dresser, or designated basket.

Junk mail - Immediately place these papers in the trash

Coupons - Store this information in a labeled file folder. When it is time to do your taxes, you will not have to hunt for the necessary papers because you will have them organized in one folder.

Invitations - Write the date on your calendar and then place the invitation on the refrigerator, file folder, or accessible drawer. After the event either discard or file the invitation so you do not clutter your refrigerator or drawer with unnecessary information.

Cards, letters, announcements - Designate a keepsake box for items you want to save. You may choose to save some of these memorabilia for only a few days.

Charitable organizations - Create a folder to keep information from an organization you would like to support. If you do not plan to contribute a donation, discard the letter.

Tax information - Store this

information in a labeled file folder. When it is time to do your taxes, you will not have to hunt for the necessary papers because you will have them organized in one folder.

Invitations - Write the date on your calendar and then place the invitation on the refrigerator, file folder, or accessible drawer. After the event either discard or file the invitation so you do not clutter your refrigerator or drawer with unnecessary information.

Cards, letters, announcements - Designate a keepsake box for items you want to save. You may choose to save some of these memorabilia for only a few days.

Voter cards - This is your reminder to vote. Put it in a visible place until after the election.

Catalogues - Only save the

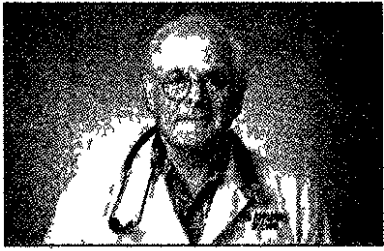
catalogs you intend to order products from. Put them in a container or file folder. Discard the old catalog when you receive a new one.

It is important to deal with the mail immediately when you bring it into your house. Piles of homeless papers are an overwhelming task to deal with. If you have been on vacation, you will need to designate extra time to sort through the stacks of mail.

the doctor all this time, she explains that she's fortunate to have a doctor who makes housecalls

And now that she's reclaimed her right to outdoors, Hutchinson dreams of a van with a chairlift "Maybe God will hear my prayer," she said

It was a local social organization that heard her prayer for a way out of her house Oakland Livingston Human Service Agency, headquartered in Pontiac and serving throughout the two counties, included Hutchinson's home in its pilot program of five ramps

Jerry Sedick, OLHSA's associate director, said the need for this service is "overwhelming" The agency built its first ramp last December using grants from the United Way of Oakland County and the Area on Aging

As much as OLHSA needs funds, Sedick said, it needs volunteers to do the construction work Willingness, he said, can be more important than skill While it takes about a week or so to do the job, he said, volunteers who can give any amount of time are vital to the program's operation

tions, of Farmington Hills

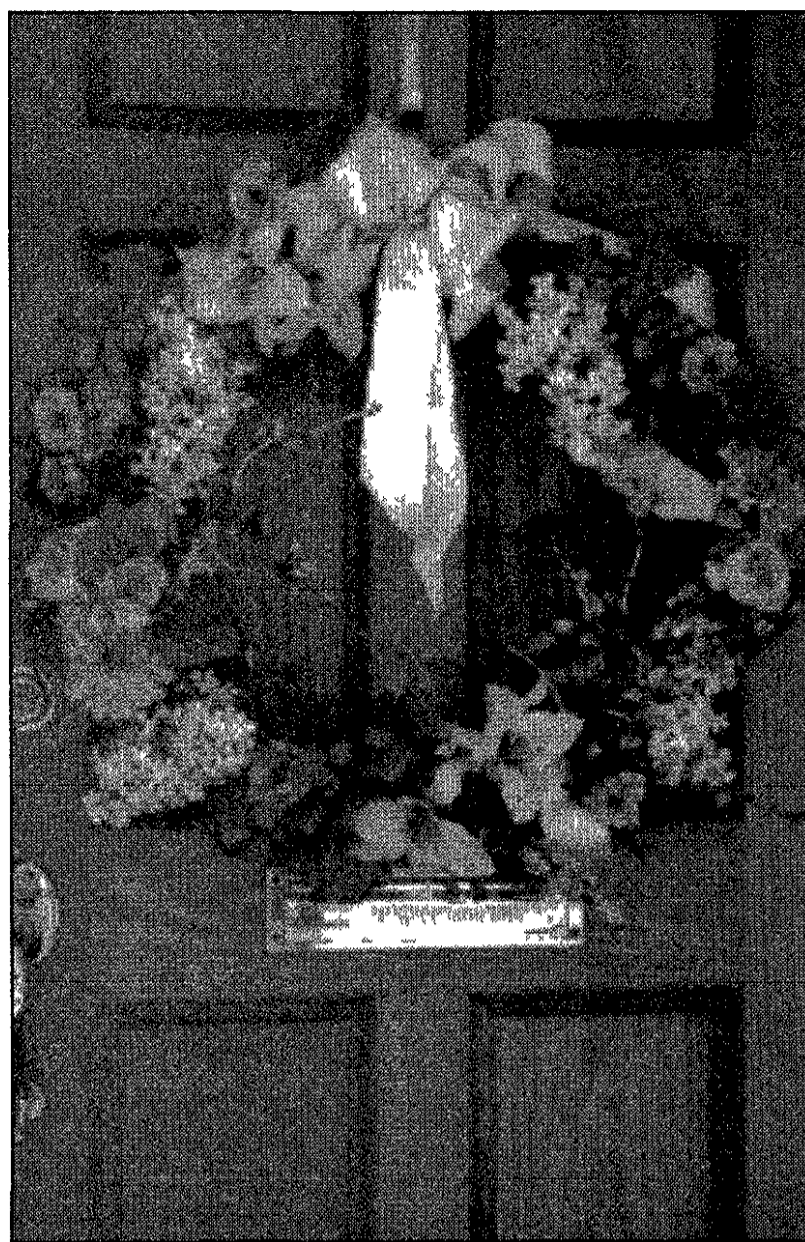
A J Filippis, CEO of his company, said cost of an average ramp without complicated turns is about \$3-4,000 His company generally uses treated wood for permanent installations Temporary ramps are priced at a fixed fee for installation and removal and a minimum of three-months rental, totaling about \$1,700 \$2,200

Filippis points out that city building permits are required and various state regulations must be followed Do-it-yourselfers ought to know that every inch of rise necessitates 12 inches of ramp, every 30 feet of ramp require a resting platform Railing spindles must be on a maximum of 4 inch centers to prevent child head entrapment

At Caring Solutions, executive assistant Janet Parker said her company likes to build the ramp at the rear of the house whenever possible, for appearance and security When the ramp must be at the front of the house, "We try to integrate landscaping to reduce the harshness of the appearance" She said her company even has built ramps inside attached garages Her company's average ramps, she said, can be in the \$2-5,000 range

Both companies say that under certain conditions, some insurance plans can help with the cost of the ramp

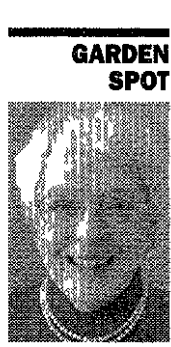

Books bring ideas for backyard to forefront

Many people are staying closer to home now and consequently many are gardening. Here are some books that should help all gardeners achieve their goals.



MARTY FIGLEY

The book gives steps necessary to create a user friendly backyard, beginning with a simple design process the reader can follow.

All aspects are covered such as composting, utility areas, water (use a rain barrel) lawns, fertilizers, pruning, tools, hardscapes and plant selection. Organic approaches to pest and weed control are also included. I predict this book will be one that is used extensively.

Annuals, perennials

Two other new books will, I predict, also be used on a regular basis. Nancy Szerlag, columnist for *The Detroit News*, and horticulturist Alison Beck have written two books especially for our gardens. They are *Annuals for Michigan* and *Perennials for Michigan* (Lone Pine Publishing,

\$18.95 each).

Both books follow the same format, beginning with a general overview of the plants, proper soil conditions, composting, seedling and planting instructions, and more. Annuals (443 of them) and perennials (681) are described and photographed beautifully.

The authors feature height and spread ranges, flower color as well as bloom times and hardiness zones for each, plus growing tips, recommended hybrids, and pest and disease problems.

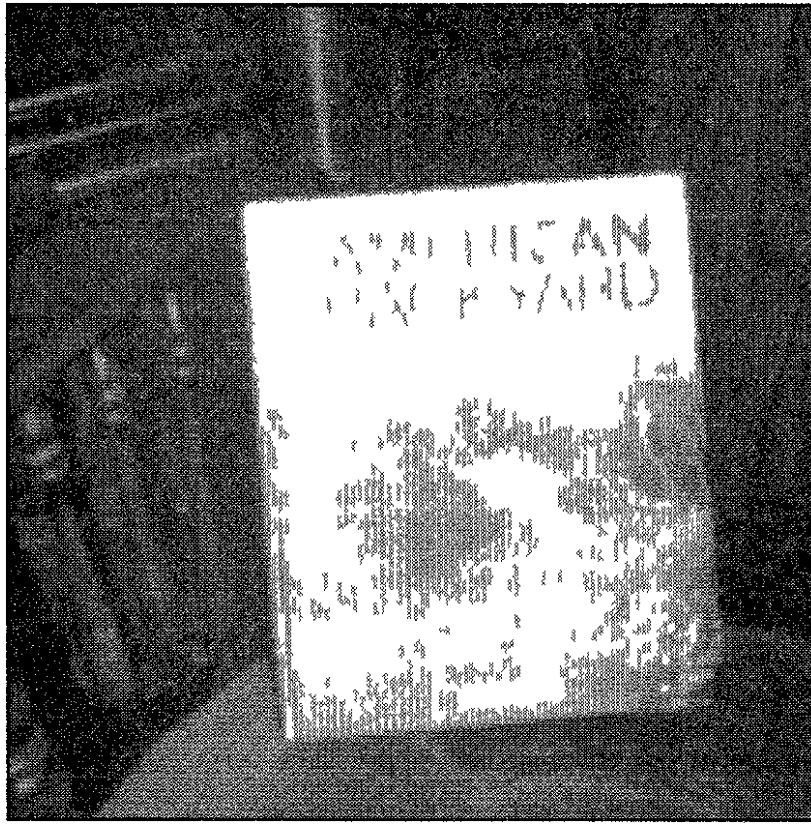
The information is clearly written, direct and to the point. Both books include quick reference charts that really save time. The soft, waterproof covers will resist damage so you won't hesitate to take them to the garden.

Another offering from Taylor's Guides series is *Ground Covers*, Nan Sinton and David C. Michener (Houghton Mifflin, \$23). This book profiles many of these versatile plants.

Practical information about new cultivars and many old favorites will open a new world of ideas for the gardener. The encyclopedic section describes more than 4,000 plants with growing tips and how to use them in the landscape, suitable companion plants and how the plants got their names. Plants are listed with botanical names, pronunciation guides and the families to which they belong.

Herbs, art

Herbs, Lesley Bremness (a

easy. The book is full of information and Bremness explains how herbs have been used in cooking, as medicinals, in cosmetics and grown in herb gardens.

The first American edition was published in 1994, this edition was reprinted with corrections in 2000, the editorial consultant was Holly H. Shumizu.

Native Trees, Shrubs and Vines: A Guide to Using, Growing and Propagating North American Woody Plants, William Cullina (Houghton Mifflin, \$40), has a publication date of June 12, 2002.

This has excellent advice for any wildflower enthusiast. Cullina is the nursery manager and propagator at the Garden in the Woods of the New England Wild Flower Society.

"For the purpose of this work, 'native' means plants growing in North America prior to European settlement, and the term 'woody plant' means any species with at least a woody trunk or base," he writes.

Also featured are instructions on how to attract specific species of birds and butterflies to supply food and shelter and how to restore habitats by using land type-specific woody plants, and where to find the right "native" for a garden. Look for this win-

ner soon.

Painting Flowers in Watercolor: A Naturalistic Approach, Coral G. Guest (Timber Press \$19.95), is a treasure of beautiful art work using "a modern style of flower painting."

Guest's aim is to capture the spirit and luminescence of the flower while still being botanically correct. She has organized her techniques so that an artist of any skill can follow the instructions and has included practical advice, such as materials, equipment and ideas of where to find subject material.

The book is published in association with The Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew.

Last Saturday St. Kenneth Catholic Church in Plymouth held a Blessing of the Bikes ceremony My friends, Dan and Kerri Sarb, who own Harvey's Old Village Deli in Plymouth, organized the event After the blessing, Dan asked me if I wanted a ride on his Harley Dina-Superglide Thus began the internal conversation that opened this column

I felt like the Shakespearean version of a wannabe Hells Angelette To ride or not to ride I rode And let me tell you, there's nothing like wind in your face and two fast wheels under your butt on a glorious Saturday afternoon

"There's a old Harley saying," said Dan, as we rounded out of St. Kenneth's driveway "If you have to ask what's so great about a riding a Harley, then you don't understand" He's right

The sky was blue and the trees were green when I drove to St. Kenneth's, but were they really that blue and that green? How come I never noticed that patch of flowers before? And why did downtown Plymouth seem so much more "alive?"

Rain or shine, area participants in the Avon Breast Cancer 3-Day have stuck to their training schedules They know the walk - a 60-mile, three day trek from Ann Arbor to Detroit from May 31 to June 2 - is for the tough and the determined

Noreen Loper of Livonia has been walking 15 miles several times a week through Hines Park with her daughter, Debbie Pluff, who also signed up for the Avon 3 Day

"When my daughter said I had to walk, I said, 'Are you out of your mind? Do you know how old I am?'" said Loper, who is 69

Like many other participants, Loper has a story She is a breast cancer survivor When her breast cancer was detected by a mammogram in December 2000, she was totally surprised The lump had not been palpable, and there was no breast cancer in her family

"At the time I said, 'Where in the world did this come from?'"

Loper underwent an initial lumpectomy then additional surgery after her cancer was diagnosed as invasive ductal Twice-daily bouts of internal beam radiation for 10 days at Beaumont Hospital followed

Loper is now cancer free She is walking out of gratitude

"The good Lord brought me through this This is how I can give back," she said

Linda Taub, 52, a nurse from Garden City, also is walking because she is thankful

"I'm walking partly for a personal challenge and in gratitude that my family is not afflicted by this"

Taub, who has a hefty sense of humor described herself as a "fat little middle age woman when first interviewed in January By the end of March she had lost 28 pounds, and she

Such generosity motivates Preman, who has walked in the Karamanos Race for the Cure, to continue doing

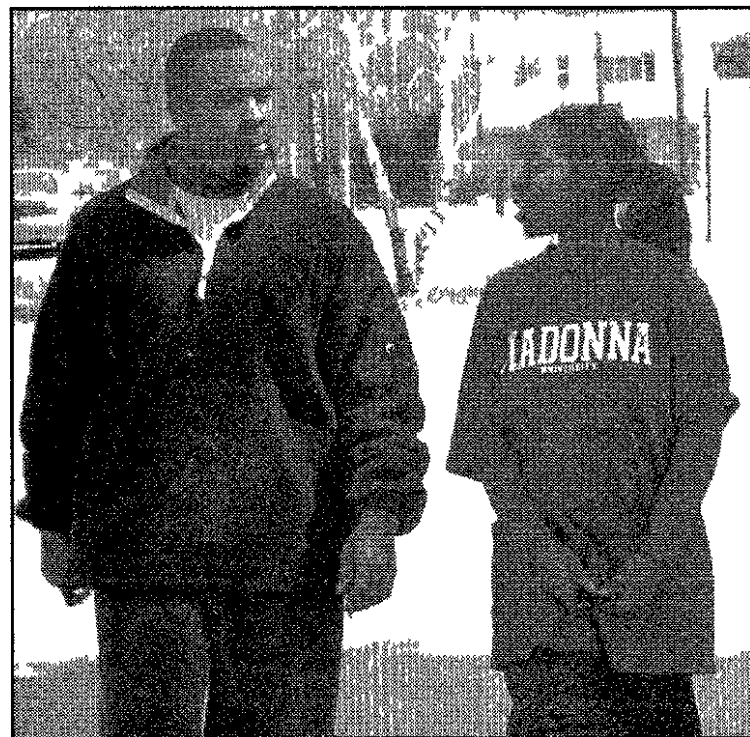

"Parents and teens work together in teams as a way to teach

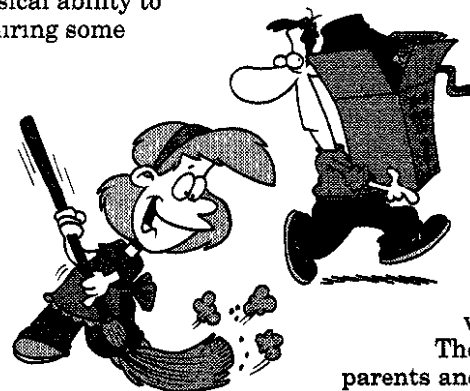
children valuable lessons in home maintenance and respecting elders while providing an important community service," said Adair "It also gives teens a chance to be with the elderly, who often are not part of their lives"

One of Gary's aunts took a picture of me and Jay on his motor-

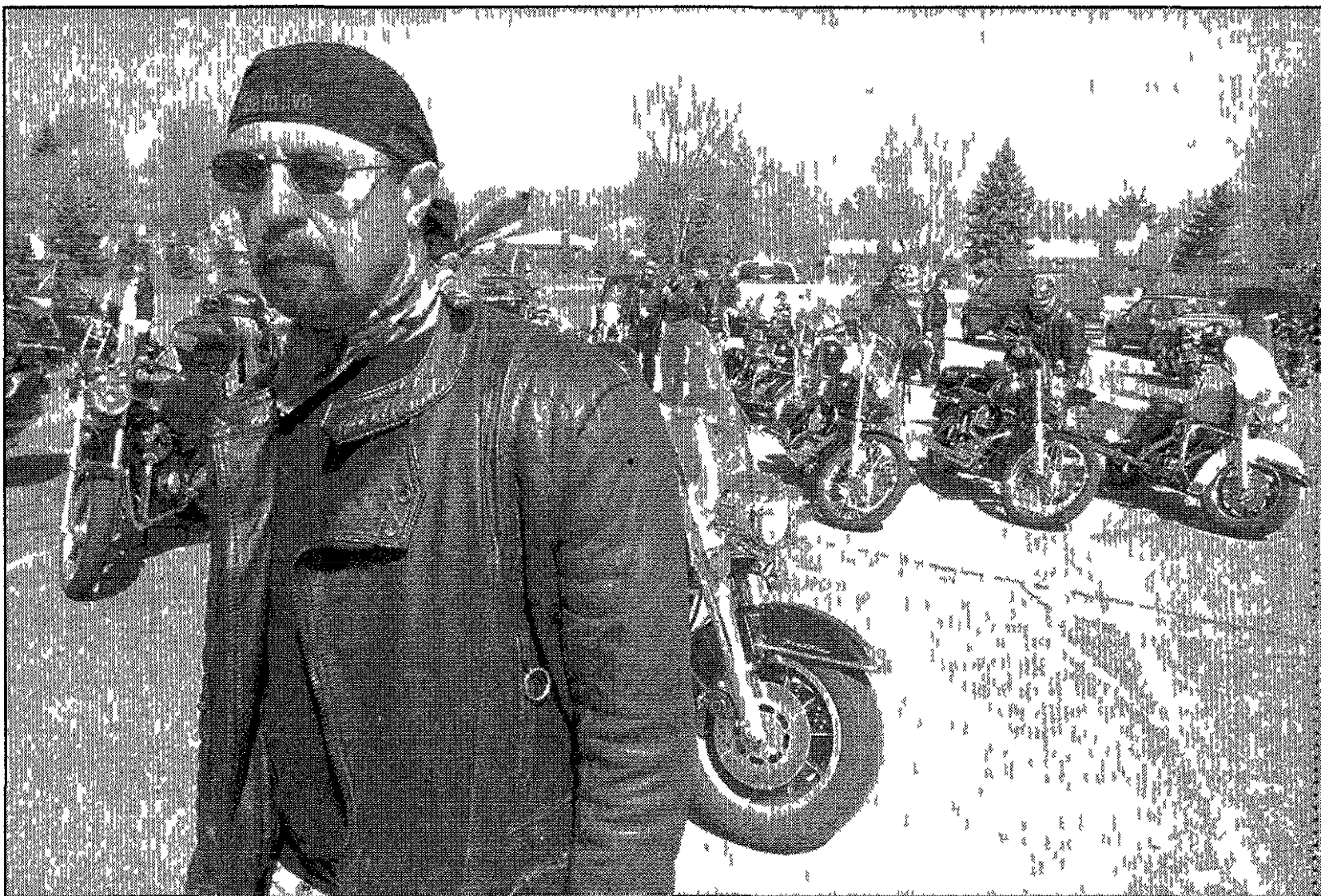
cycle after our ride. For many years, I kept it pinned to my refrigerator door. It eventually disappeared, just like my yearning for one more motorcycle ride.

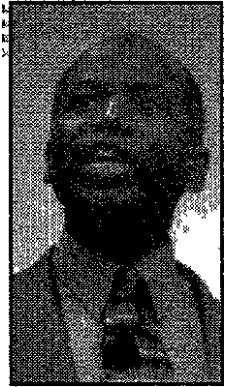

out there and screen themselves. We need to prevent cancer before it happens. When they find out they have cancer I want the women to act on it, to get the best care possible," she said.

"The wonderful thing about the Avon breast cancer walk is it's for women who don't have insurance, don't have transportation, don't have spouses," she added. "It funds all sorts of programs that help underprivileged women with things like transportation and childcare."

It didn't take much coaxing on Madonna University student Tara Eddington's part to get her boyfriend, Wayne Wright, 24, of Detroit to join her in walking the Avon 3-Day Wright's mother, Erlene Wright, lost her battle with breast cancer a few years ago.

"As soon as I mentioned the walk, he said he'd definitely do it because of his mom," said Eddington, 24.

The two of them have split their training ground between Northville and Belle Isle. Their motivation has been sustained by the walk's purpose.

"Everybody has someone in their family who has died of breast cancer," said Eddington. "Every day I think why am I doing this, and I just think that every day someone will die for this if I don't help."

A generous response. When asked why she was

walking the 3-Day, Lin DeVore, 48, a registered dietitian who lives in Livonia, had a direct answer.

"Because I can do it. It's important to change how things are done - the screening, the treatment, the money behind it. I've seen co-workers struggle. It's a constant threat for all of us."

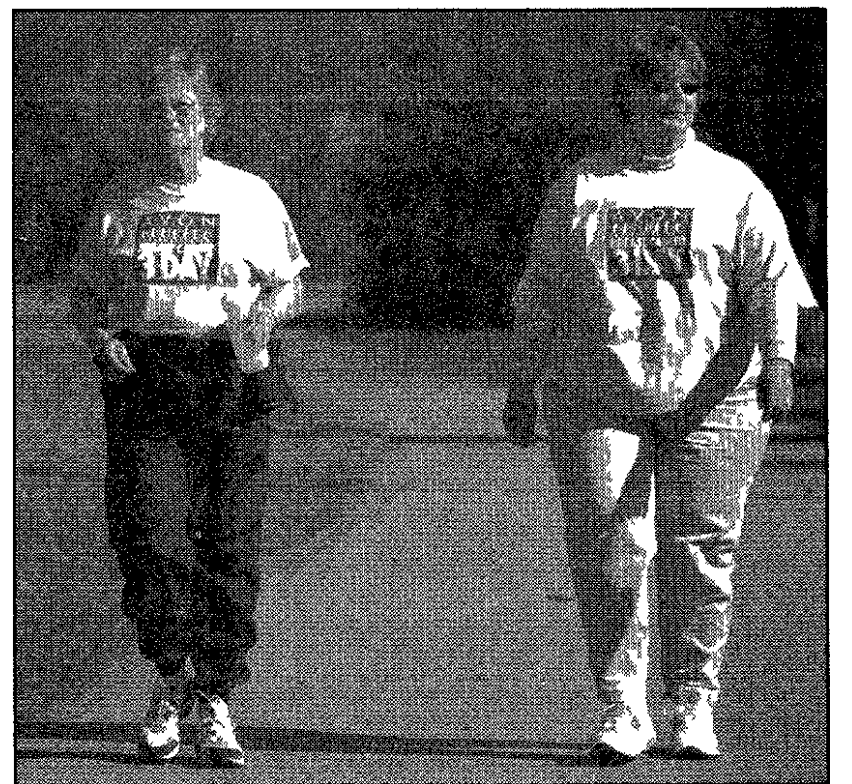
By March, DeVore was walking 35 miles a week. "It's amazing what the body can do," she said.

While sending out a form letter to help raise the \$1,900 has brought a poor response, co-workers and "friends of friends" have been generous," said DeVore.

"It's the cause that brings out the checkbook." Loper agrees. "I was wearing an Avon 3-Day walk pin the other day as I was walking out of Archie's restaurant on Plymouth Road. Another woman was walking in and spotted my pin. She gave me money on the spot."

She added, "People have been so generous. It's absolutely overwhelming."

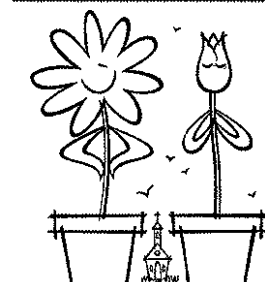

The Arc of Northwest Wayne County and Community Opportunity Center provide services to assist people with developmental disabilities and their families in the pursuit of an independent and semi-independent lifestyle. The organizations serve people in Livonia, Canton Township, Northville, Plymouth, Westland, Garden City and Redford Township.

Demise King, executive director of COC, said more people are waiting for services but funding is an issue. The COC manages homes that serve about 100 residents ages 25-70.

"We have a lengthy waiting list — about 200 people — but funding is an issue," said King who has worked at COC for the last 22 years.

Over the years she has seen living models change — from large group homes to many more family-like settings. Many more developmentally disabled residents are remaining semi-independent and living in apartments while utilizing the services of COC and Arc.

COC provide staff support while Arc administers funding and provides social and recreational activities for developmentally disabled children and adults.

King said COC most recently worked with four women from Our Lady of Providence Center in Northville Township to provide 24-hour assistance in a Livonia home. The Northville Center is closing and residents had to find placement elsewhere.

The women, who range in age from 25-35, with help from their families and COC have rented a home in Livonia. COC is providing 24-hour staff support to help with such everyday activities as meal preparation, laundry, home maintenance and planning social activities.

King said the women's new arrangement is based on the self-determination model being used to service developmentally disabled adults throughout the country.

In this case, the women decided who they wanted to live with, where they wanted to live, what school and/or programs they

wanted to attend and who they wanted to staff the home. Families helped paint, decorate, do repairs and yardwork. The home opened a few weeks ago and residents and staff are pleased with the results.

King said money raised from Sunday's fund-raiser will help to enhance the lives of developmentally disabled children and adults throughout western Wayne County.

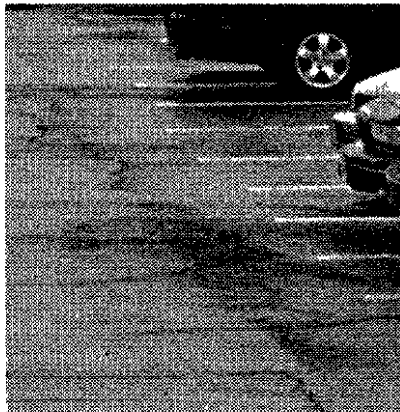

Volpe a record-setter

She's certainly making the most of her final season. Stefanie Volpe, a senior third baseman for the University of Michigan's softball team and a Plymouth Salem graduate, set two team records last weekend in leading the Wolverines to an 11-1 win over Northwestern Saturday.

Volpe slugged two grand-slam home runs, driving in eight runs, in the victory — both of them school records. That and another home run hit in Sunday's 3-1 win at No. 21-ranked Iowa earned her Big Ten Player of the Week accolades.

Volpe went 5-for-12 (.417 batting average) with three homers, 10 RBI, six runs scored and four stolen bases for the week.

It was the fourth time in her U-M career she earned Player of the Week honors.

For the season, Volpe is batting .405 with seven homers, 43 runs scored, a .649 slugging percentage, a .549 on base percentage, 36 walks and 18 stolen bases — all of them team-highs. She also has 32 RBI, which is tied for second on U-M.

The Wolverines are ranked 12th in the NCAA with a 36-9 overall record, their 10-3 mark in the Big Ten puts them in second place, trailing only Ohio State (13-3). U-M plays single games at Illinois Friday and Saturday, then finish the weekend with a double header at Purdue Sunday.

Track standouts

Nick Allen set one meet record and won two events at Sunday's third annual Detroit Track and Field Classic at the University of Detroit Jesuit.

Allen, a Plymouth Salem graduate now attending Wayne State, won the mile in a meet-record 4:20.2. He also finished first in the 3,000-meter run in 8:55.3.

Ian Bedford, another Salem graduate and former UDM standout, finished 16th in the mile run in 5:03.8.

Ian Searcy, a senior at Central Michigan and a Salem graduate, led the Chippewas with two first-place finishes at the Western Michigan University Quadrangular April 20 in Kalamazoo.

Searcy won the 800-meter run in 1:51.12, then anchored the first-place 4x400 relay team (3:12.73).

CMU finished second in the meet with 152.5 points, with WMU first (263).

Tucker sparkles

Ben Tucker, a junior righthander at Kalamazoo College and a Plymouth Canton graduate, handcuffed the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association's only unbeaten baseball team — Calvin College — in leading the Hornets to a 2-1 victory.

The win raised Tucker's record to 3-2 overall with a 1.60 earned run average. He has allowed seven earned runs in 39 1/3 innings pitched with 30 strikeouts, in the MIAA, he is 1-2 with a 2.49 ERA and 24 strikeouts in 25 1/3 innings.

Unfortunately for both Tucker and Kalamazoo, he was diagnosed with a strained ligament in his elbow after the game, which will sideline him for the rest of the season.

Through Sunday, the Hornets were 3-6 in the MIAA, 6-18 overall.

Figure skaters are finding their niche

It is, after all, a sport of individuals. Figure skating in a team sense goes no further than pairs, unless you're talking about some sort of team synchronized skating.

But individual figure skaters competing in some sort of team concept? No, never heard of it.

Before this past winter season, Plymouth-Canton Educational Park did have a figure skating team, and this team did qualify for the Michigan High School State Figure Skating Championships, which were held March 23 in Dearborn. If that was a surprise, consider this: The PCEP team didn't just compete, it finished seventh in a field of 32.

Considering what a team had to do to qualify, and considering that the PCEP team was in only its second season, that was quite an accomplishment.

FIGURE SKATING

"Some people think these girls don't work that hard that this isn't that difficult a sport," said team organizer Ellen Kolarik. "These girls train year-round."

Trying to understand the team scoring system can be difficult, even to those familiar with the sport. But let's try anyway.

First, there are two levels of team competition, High Teams and Low Teams. To compete in the High Teams, skaters must be qualified for the Juvenile Freeskating Division or higher (there are nine Freeskating divisions, ranging from Senior to Beginner Compulsory Moves, to move up a division, a skater must demonstrate certain skills).

In both the High Teams and Low Teams competitions, team members vie in three events: jumps, spins and moves. Each skater's score in that event is

then averaged together to determine the team's score in that element. A team's scores in those events — jumps, spins, moves — are added together to find the final tally.

To make the state finals, a team had to finish in the top three in its district during the season, comprised of three meets. PCEP's High Team placed eighth in its district out of nine teams, but its Low Team edged Northville for third place, scoring 26 total points during the districts compared to Northville's 24.

"This is just the second year in existence," noted PCEP team coach Barb Miller. "This year there was a lot more interest from kids of all levels."

The reason why is what makes the future of figure skating as a high school team sport so promising.

"Most of the kids on the team have skated five, 10, 12 years," said Kolarik. "But once they got to high school, they didn't have a place to compete, not for

Salem stops Canton in 8

Any coach'll tell ya — win your one-run games and you'll stay in the title hunt. Of course, if you have a team of mostly underclassmen, you might want to avoid those close games.

Experience is the key factor in that type of game. Isn't it?

If it is, don't tell Plymouth Salem's baseball team. "We only had three seniors start today," said Rocks' coach Dale Rumberger a few minutes after his squad twice overcame two-run deficits in the late innings, then scored the game-winner in the eighth to upend Plymouth Canton 6-5 Wednesday at Canton.

It wasn't the first time something like this has happened to Salem. Matter of fact, Wednesday's one-run win was the sixth one-run game in a row for the Rocks.

With the win over Canton — by the way, it was Salem's second straight extra-inning affair — the Rocks were 4-2 in that stretch. With such a senior-lacking lineup, that shouldn't happen.

But it did. "We had plenty of chances," said Canton coach Scott Dickey. "But give them credit. Their hitters got hits when they had to."

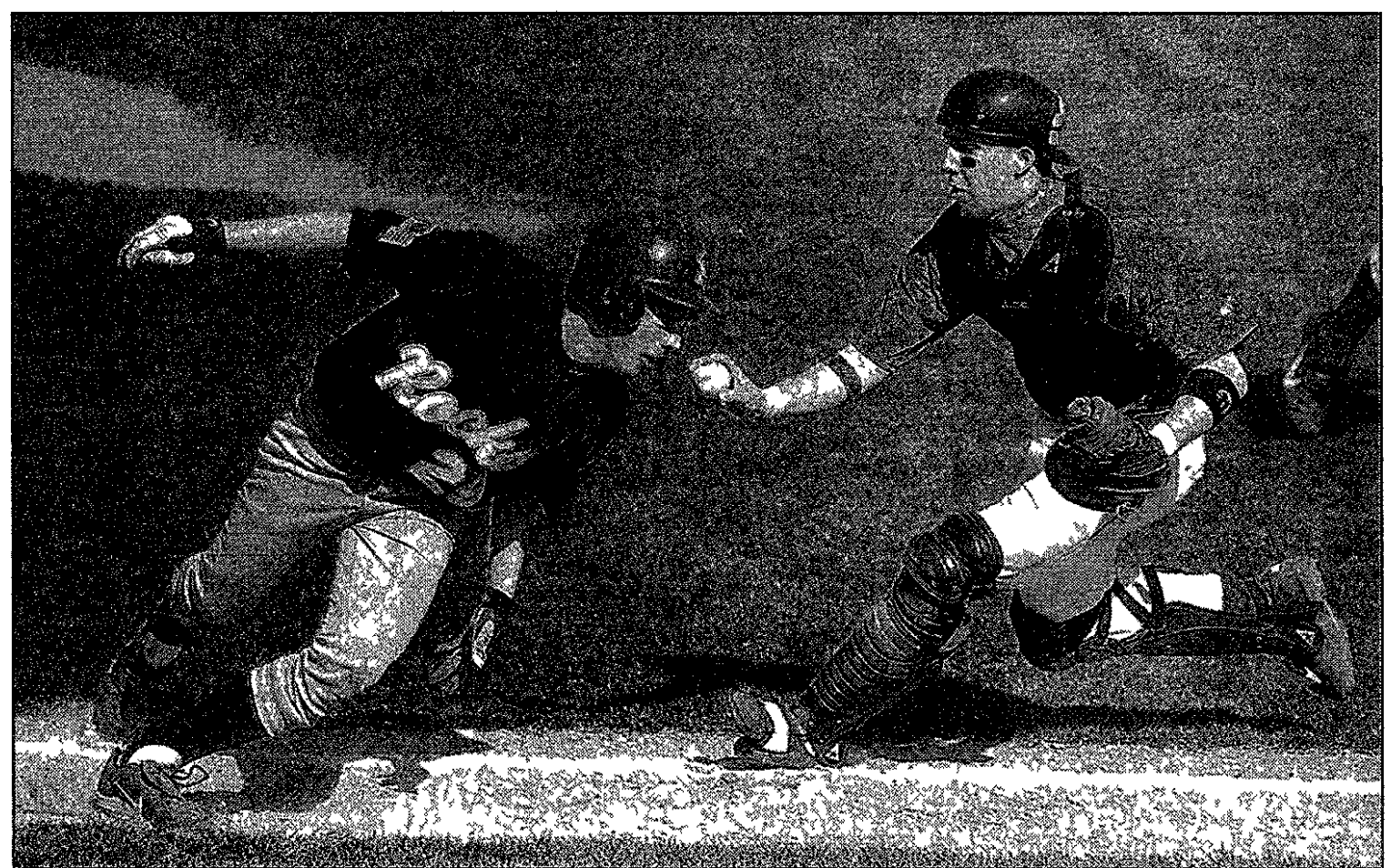
That's true. In particular in the bottom of the seventh inning when, with two out and no one on base and Canton on top 5-3, Steve Cox (a sophomore) worked Chiefs' starter Matt Staley for a walk, the first walk issued by Staley in the game.

The next two Salem hitters, Mike Antich (a junior) and Drew Parling (a sophomore), bounced singles through the Chiefs' infield, Parling's hit scoring a run to make it 5-4. Dickey summoned Carl McDevitt to the mound, his diminutive (5-foot-9, 140 pounds) junior righthander who had not surrendered a run in 23 previous innings this season.

McDevitt got two strikes on Andy Thackaberry (a sophomore) before Thackaberry lined a base hit to left field, tying the game at 5-5.

"Thackaberry struck out five times at (Westland) John Glenn Monday," said Rumberger. "Yesterday he stayed after batting practice and we spent a lot of time working on his hitting."

The extra work paid off, allowing the Rocks to bounce back a second time. In the eighth inning, no more rebounding was necessary, Andy Boyer opened the inning with a walk, Cliff Thomas singled and Ryan Leach

laid down a sacrifice bunt to move them to second and third.

After Cox struck out, Antich walked to load the bases for Parling, who had shredded Glenn's pitching two days earlier for five hits. Parling lined a base hit to left to score Boyer with what proved to be the game-winning run.

"I think good teams win one-run games," said Rumberger. "That seems to be our M.O. (modus operandi). With this team, every game is exciting."

Wednesday's victory gave Salem a 7-4 overall record, 4-1 in the Western Lakes Activities Association. Canton is 8-4-1 overall, 2-3 in the WLAA.

The pitching win went to Rickey Calleja, who relieved starter Kevin O'Berne and allowed no runs on four hits and no walks in 2 2/3 innings. McDevitt, allowing his first run of the season, was the losing pitcher in relief of Staley, giving up one run on three hits and three walks in 1 1/3 innings.

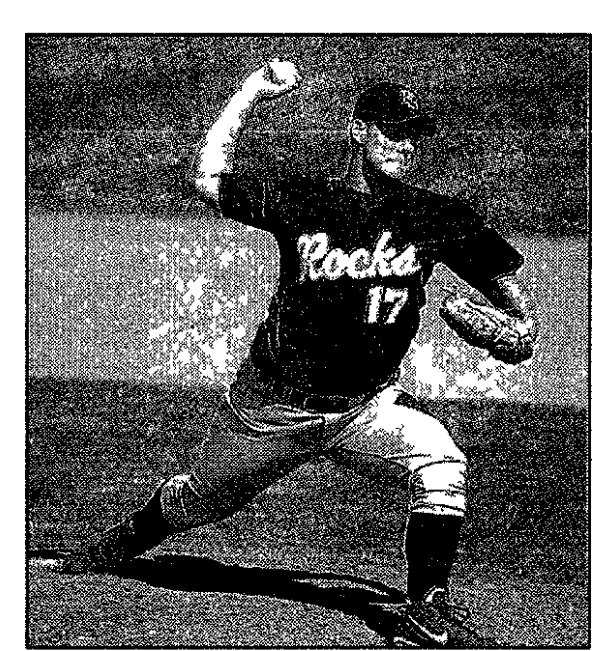

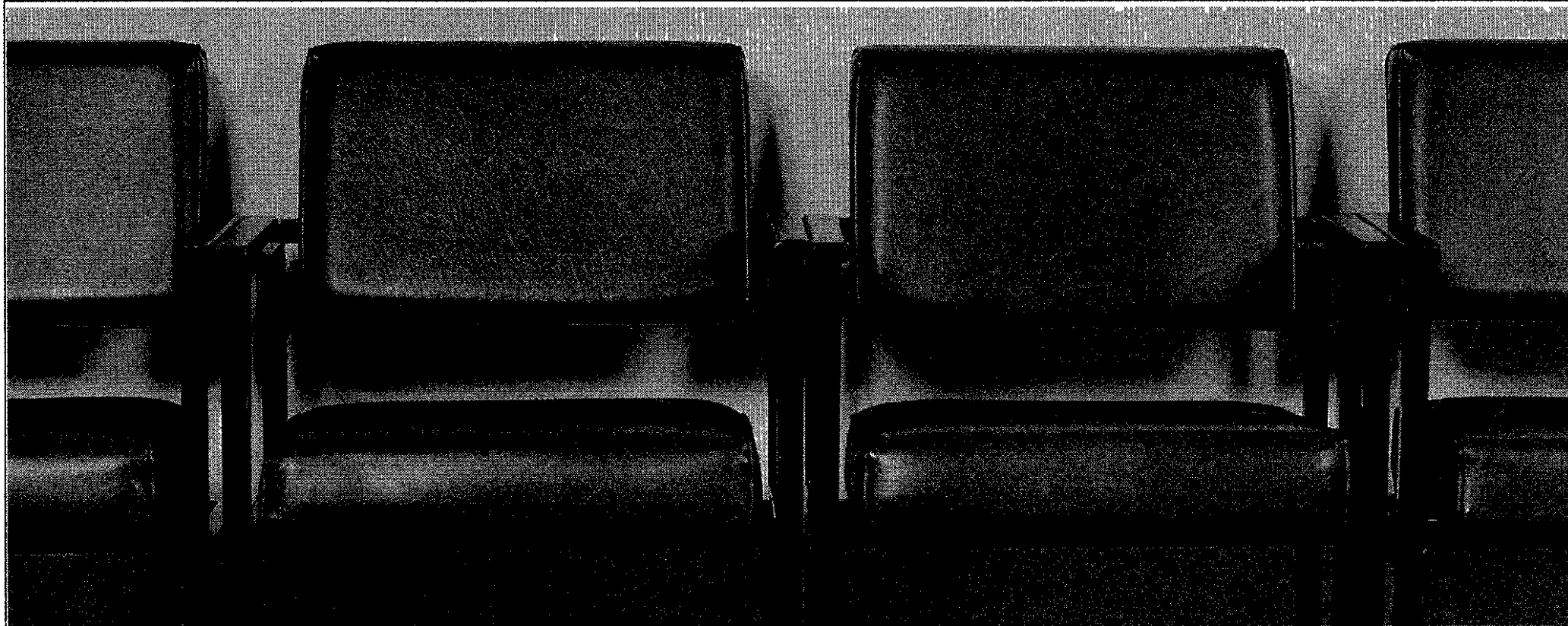

Jeff Niemiec pitched all seven innings, getting the win with nine strikeouts and just three walks.

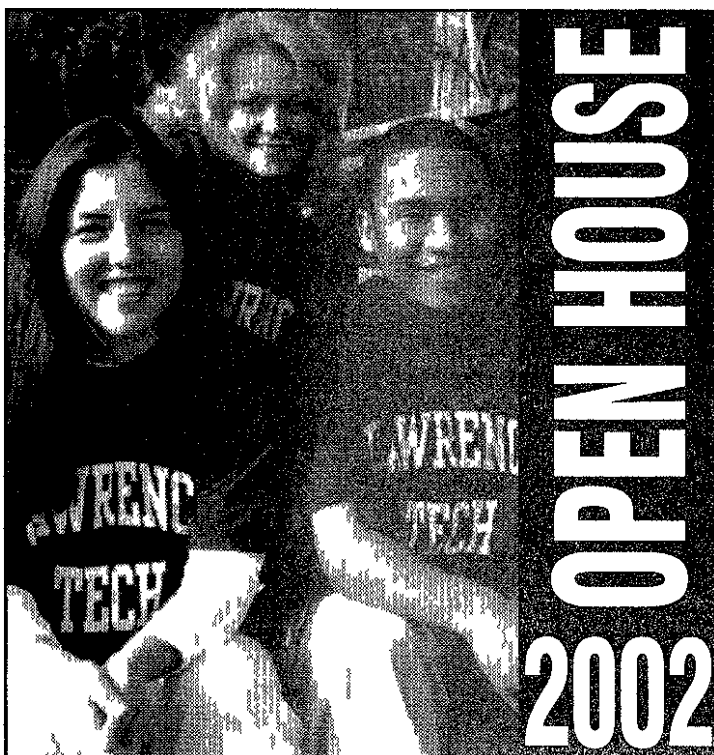
Salter said he was impressed with the way he could pitch out of early inning troubles to make enough pitches to help his team be in position to win.

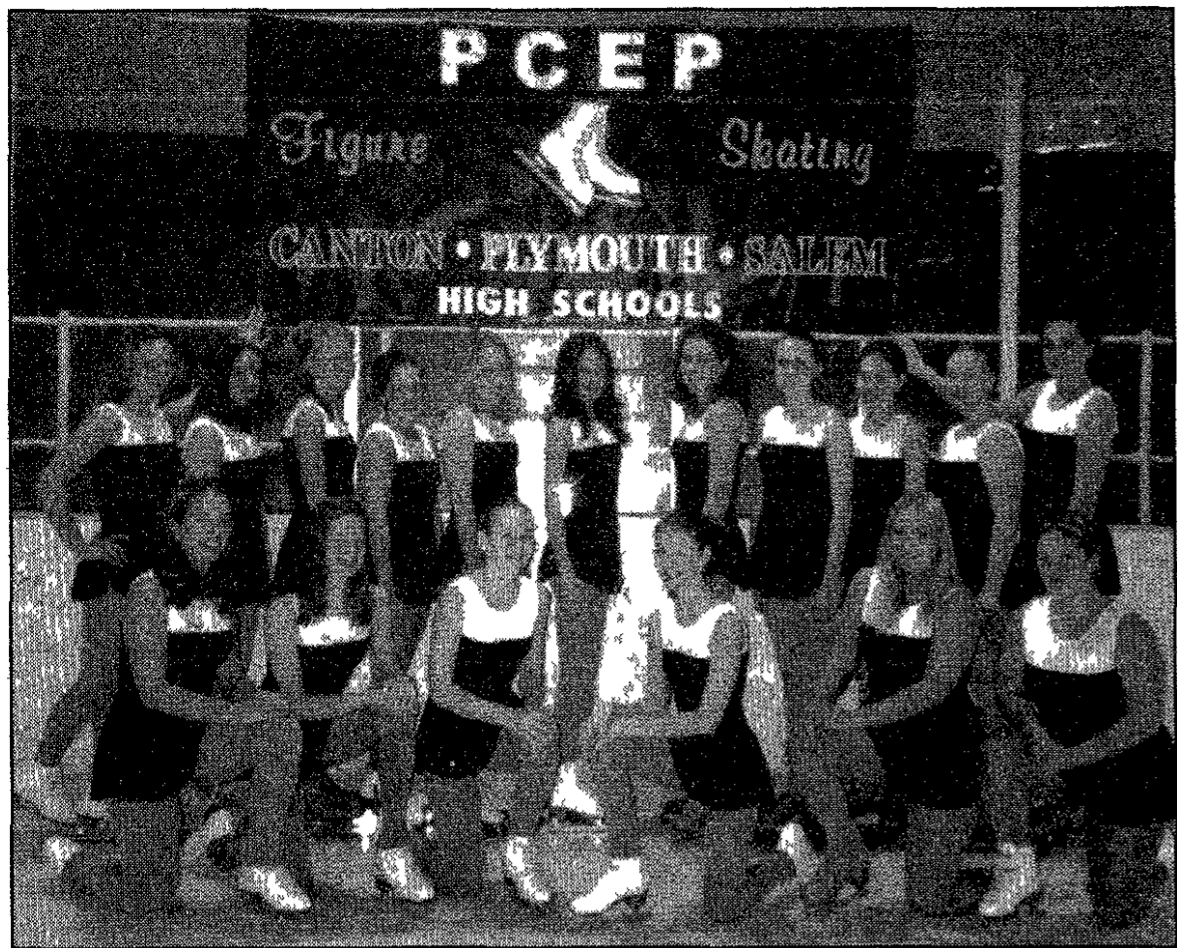

their school? Which is all they wanted. As Kolarik explained, "To have an opportunity to represent their school." Indeed, being a figure skater can confine a high school athlete. "The biggest thing about having a high school team," explained Miller, "is that skaters usually can't be part of other high school sports. They put so many hours into skating, they don't have the chance." What this sport has done — with just 32 schools statewide involved, figure skating is far

below the number needed to be considered an MHSAA sanctioned sport — has replaced the 'me' of figure skating with 'we'. "It's a team event," noted Miller. "Some of the skaters have really come out of their shell. There's not as much pressure (in the team concept) as in the other." Can figure skating reach enough of an audience to become a sanctioned sport? That's difficult to predict, but certainly Michigan may be the place for it to flourish. Team figure skating got its start in

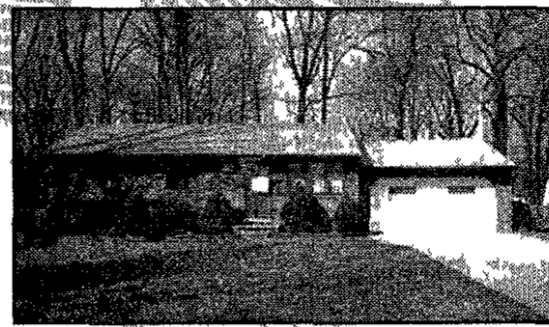
Massachusetts six years ago, it's been in Michigan for four years. But Michigan has the highest number of schools with teams. At PCEP, the outlook for the future is bright. A seventh-place finish at state by the Local Team helped assure that "Next year will be much better because kids will move up (a division)," said Miller. "And we have a couple of real strong skaters coming to the high school that will help the team." Sounds promising, all the way around.

Young players stepping up for Crusaders

The Madonna University softball team continues to battle, defying its lack of experience. The Lady Crusaders entered the season with one senior and one junior on their roster which meant coach Al White would be forced to rely heavily upon his younger players.

They've come through like veterans. Led by the steady pitching of their two upperclassmen — senior Missy VanDoorn and junior Jenny Tenyer — the Crusaders have managed to stay in the chase in the Wolverine Hoosier Athletic Conference.

On Tuesday at Livonia Ladywood, Madonna handcuffed Spring Arbor, allowing just one run and six hits in two games. But the Crusaders could only manage a split, losing the opener 1-0, before winning the second game with an 11-0 mercy.

The split left Madonna with an 11-11 record in the WHAC, 19-21 overall. Spring Arbor is 16-12 in the conference, 21-25 overall.

Through Tuesday, Cornerstone led the WHAC with a 16-5 mark. However, the second-through-sixth spots were bunched. Aquinas is second only 2-5 games ahead of sixth place Madonna.

VanDoorn absorbed the hard luck loss in the first game against the Cougars. She tossed a five-hitter, giving up one earned run, issuing four walks while striking out two, her record is 12-9. Spring Arbor's Holly Davidson was even better, however, stopping the Crusaders on three hits and four walks, striking out three.

In the second game, it was Tenyer's turn to step forward — and she did, frustrating the Cougars with a one-hit gem. Tenyer did not walk a batter in her five innings on the

ground striking out two as she improved to 7-12.

Bobrowski had two hits to lead the offense, including a home run (her sixth), and three runs batted in. Tara Turner contributed two hits (including a double), two runs scored and two RBI, and both Kathy Day (from Livonia Ladywood) and Krystle Shina (from Farmington Mercy) had a hit and two RBI.

Last Saturday at Ladywood HS, Madonna and Tri State University divided their WHAC double header. Tri State winning the opener 5-4 and Madonna gaining the victory in the second game 9-4.

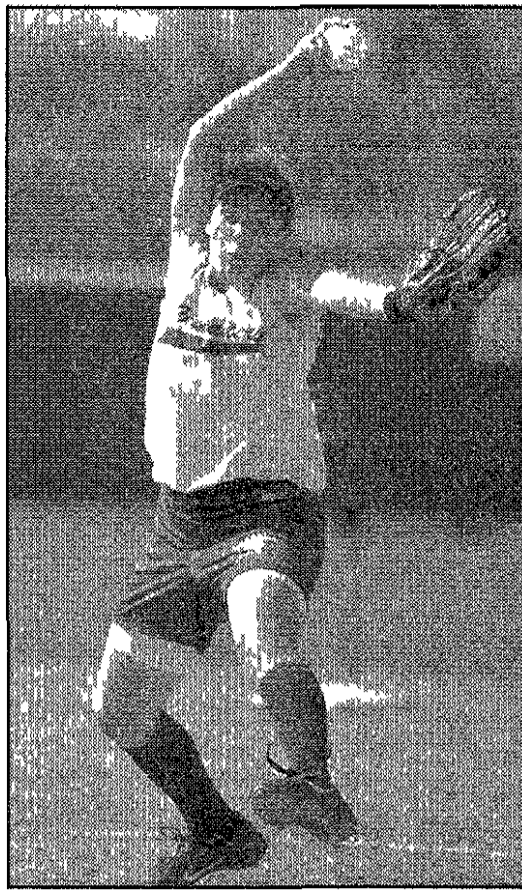
The fifth place Thunder won the first game Saturday thanks to eight Crusader errors. All five runs allowed by Tenyer, who took the loss, were unearned. She gave up nine hits and no walks in 6 1/3 innings.

Offensively, Bobrowski had a triple and a single with two runs batted in and Autumn Batyuk had two hits and scored two runs. Turner also had a hit and an RBI.

Madonna led 3-0 after four innings, but gave up five runs in the next two.

In the second game, VanDoorn benefitted from an 11-hit Madonna attack, allowing four runs (one earned) on 11 hits and three walks, striking out four.

The Crusaders scored eight runs in the first two innings to take command. Bobrowski again led the offense, collecting two hits including a home run and three RBI. Arin

Madonna moved over the 500 level in the WHAC at 9-8, its overall record is 16-18. Concordia is 7-35 overall, 1-17 in the conference.

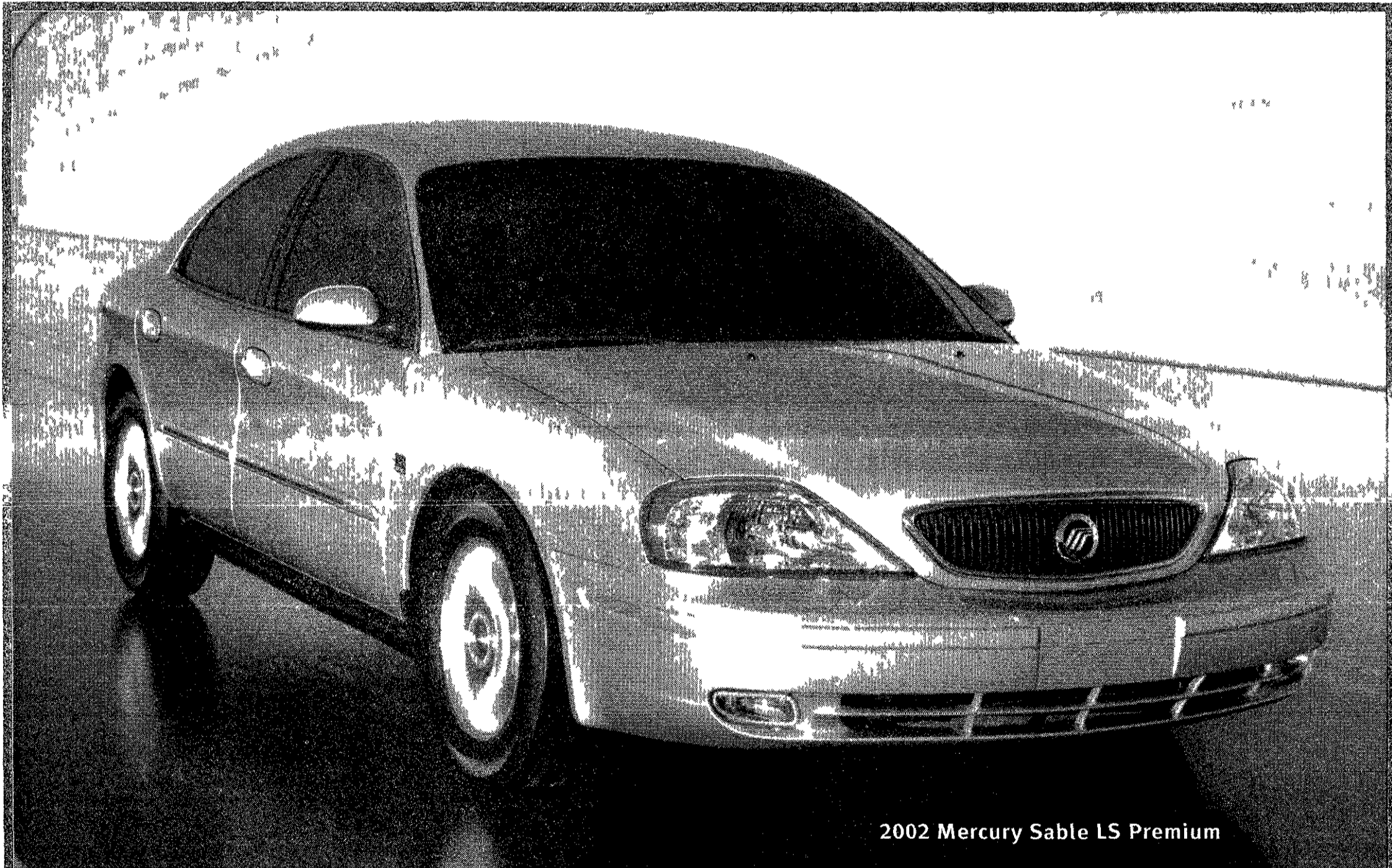

Fix problem of incorrect assessment square feet

We have just learned that several of our members had the amount of their square footage listed incorrectly in their master deed. They're concerned about seeking reimbursement for their assessments since they've been paying for a larger number of square feet over the years. What should we do?

While obviously the association has a responsibility to correct the error, assuming that the assessments were based upon the percentage of value determined by square footage, the co-owner may have a sympathetic cause for reimbursement.

However, in a recent Tennessee case on similar facts, the court said that even if the math used in determining the proportionate share was flawed, the member in that case, who had lived there for 20 years, had notice of it when she bought before and had to pay what is required.

While there is no guarantee of that result in Michigan, it is at least a basis for you to start over again doing right without any readjustment for past errors.

Realtors find they can't constantly run at breakneck speed and succeed

Most real estate professionals know they can't be like Wonder Woman or Superman and perform at full throttle day in and day out over an extended period of time. "Sometimes we try, but it doesn't seem to work," said Gary Jones, broker/owner of RE/MAX Village Professionals in Bloomfield Hills, Rochester Hills and Clarkston. Burnout awaits those who don't or won't develop interests beyond the next deal. "If you get stressed out, you don't do your clients any good," said Joan Bessinger, a Realtor with Prudential Chamberlain Stehl in Farmington Hills. Experienced agents find that a hobby, activity or avocation can keep the personal/business life balanced, the grind manageable. Jones, long involved in community theater before getting into real estate 13 years ago, is active with St. Dunstan's Guild in Bloomfield Hills. He's always enjoyed theater since

taking a drama class as a kid. Now, he finds the experience relaxing, the social aspects rewarding. "Being on stage, directing, takes a lot of time," Jones said. "Since I've been in real estate I'm more behind the scenes - stage managing changing sets whatever needs to be done. Real estate, of course, is a people business," he added. "It can be pretty intense sometimes. At the end of the day, if you don't have something else to do, something else to think about, you might not be able to relax until the wee hours of the morning," Jones said. Which doesn't exactly make for a smooth-running human machine. "As I'm speaking to you, I just finished working out and that's so important," said Carol Eisenshtadt, a Realtor with Max Broock in West Bloomfield and a 20-year real estate veteran. "Working out gives me energy and increases my ability to endure the hours of work of a Realtor. I feel healthier and stronger physically and mentally," she said.

Eisenshtadt works out five days a week and substitutes golf one morning a week during summer. "And my clients know it," she said. "Your whole life cannot be real estate," Eisenshtadt added. "Real estate can be consuming, 29 hours a day, nine days a week. You have to have your own life some outside interest." You won't get any argument on that from Bessinger. "You have to take a little break now and then," she said. "With deals that have a lot of difficulty, you have to step back for a day or so, remove yourself from the situation. When you come back, you're clear." Bessinger's mini-break priorities - "take care of grandkids, cooking, going to casinos." On a more regular basis she's involved in church activities. Nadine and Jerry Henderson, a husband-and-wife team affiliated with Quality GMAC in Livonia, have been in business a combined 32 years. "You have to have other interests," Jerry said. "You just have to get away from it. You get stale. You really do." "We play golf and I go hunting and fishing. We both do a lot of gardening, get outside and breathe fresh air," he added.

Inventory, organize cluttered garage

(HIT) - It's easy to make the garage a room for all those things we don't really have a place for That goes for a new home, as well as existing "We tend to use the garage as a catch-all for many of the items we need, but don't know what to do with," says Marc Shuman,

founder of GarageTek, a company that specializes in organizing garages

The company's products include cabinets, shelving, activity racks and accessories Clients run the gamut from down-sized tech executives to developers who incorporate high-tech garage systems into the homes they build

Shuman says the garage is the most "abused" room in the house and can easily be turned into a high-value asset

Use an organizing opportunity to take inventory of items you will need for spring such as musing garden tools

To get the process of spring cleaning in the garage going, Shuman recommends the following

- Arrange items you want to keep in piles
- Determine what kinds of containers will best store these items
- Hang pegs to organize certain items

Even lawn chairs can be stored on long pegs

■ Bicycles can be hung from the rafters when not in use When bicycles are in season, assign a certain place for them to be parked

■ Keep as many items off the garage floor as possible so it's easy to sweep often Twice a month is a good schedule Remember that dust from the garage often ends up in the house

■ If you have bare studs in the garage, place slats of wood across the studs to create bins for items like sports equipment and gardening tools

■ Hammer nails into the wall or into the studs for tools and other articles

■ Keep similar items together in marked containers and go through them once a season to clean things out you're not using any more
