## More school cuts may be coming

■ Superintendent Kathleen Booher made her pitch for cuts at a budget session Tuesday, but board members want to take a closer look, perhaps at some of the academic items, before deciding on a final budget.

The announced \$950,000 in staff, program and equipment cuts to balance the 2002-03 Plymouth-Canton Schools budget may be just the tip of the iceberg.

The Board of Education began its discussion of the cuts submitted earlier this month by Superintendent Kathleen Booher during a Tuesday night budget workshop session.

At the end of the nearly three-hour meeting, board members appeared to have more questions than answers. However, it was clear to several trustees that the cuts presented by Booher may have to be expanded.

"It's possible they could be accepted. But it's also possible, after more information, we might ask for a little bit deeper, whether that be in expense line items or people," said board secretary Darwin Watts.

The biggest problem for trustees in determining the final cuts is the impact of raises for the four employee groups which are currently in negotiations with the district, the largest of which is the Plymouth Canton Education Association with more than 1,000 members.

"It's going to be tight, there's no question about that," said Watts. "Until we apply the numbers of what we agree on with those folks, I'm cautiously optimistic."

Next year's budget projections show expenditures

## Trustee disputes conflict charges

Plymouth Township Trustee Abe Munfakh's attempts to help Salem Township land a water deal with Detroit Water and Sewerage has apparently landed him in hot water with his own board members.

Munfakh's engineering firm — Ayres Lewis Norris & May — has been working with Salem Township officials to get water hookups so that Johnson Controls, a Plymouth Township auto parts manufacturer, can move its facility into Salem.

However, Plymouth Township Supervisor Steve Mann has been working to hold off water to Salem Township until Detroit Water officials can fix a perpetual water pressure problem in Plymouth.

It all adds up to a conflict of interest in Mann's eyes.

It's not in Plymouth Township's interests, with our water problems for one of our own elected officials helping another community (to get water), Mann said. "It's making matters worse for us, and he's profiting financially by doing it."

Mann's irritation stems from Munfakh's participation in at least one meeting to help Salem get water. He attended a meeting in February that included Salem Township officials and people from Detroit Water. In a follow-up letter dated May 1, Gary Fujita, the interim deputy director of the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department, told Salem Township Supervisor Fred Roper that Detroit Water was "very interested" in having Salem Township as a customer.

The service would be limited to Salem's "Urban Services District" at M-14 and Gotfredson, which is where Johnson Controls is looking to build. "This will confirm DWSD would be willing to provide water service to

## Potential race cut short after Law quits

What appeared to be potentially one of the most interesting Aug. 6 primary races in the state fizzled before it ever got started.

Former State Rep. Gerald Law (R-Plymouth Township) pulled out of a possible battle with current State Rep. Bruce Patterson (R-Canton Township) in the race for the newly created 7th

District Senate seat.

Law, who served in the House of Representatives from 1983-1991 and again from 1995-2000 before being term-limited out, decided not to challenge Patterson for the Senate on Friday afternoon, pulling out just hours ahead of the deadline for filing.

"I've been in the legislature for 15 years, and Bruce is starting his career and doing a good job," said Law. "This is the right thing for me to do."

"Bruce and I appeal to some of the same contributors and supporters," added Law. "It's better that we don't waste a lot of resources in the primary and work toward the general election. I will be there to campaign for him, and help him in any way I can."

The newly drawn Senate district represents Northville, Northville Township, Plymouth, Plymouth Township

## City tosses pair from Old Village board

In a statement that lasted only 45 seconds, and with no discussion, Plymouth Mayor Pro-Tem Colleen Pobur announced at the end of Monday night's city commission meeting that Old Village Development Authority members Peter Bunting and Matt Cardwell will no longer serve on the OVDA board.

The two apparently drew the line in the sand when they discussed the possibilities of Old Village being annexed by Plymouth Township because of what they considered the lack of attention given that part of town by the city commission.

"I don't think they had the city's best interest at heart," said Pobur, who indicated she had the support of Mayor Bill Graham, who was not present at the meeting. "It was destructive, and many citizens and other members of the board asked us to do this."

"Our goal is to constitute these bodies with people who are working for the good of the city," added Pobur. "This doesn't have anything to do with trying to insist

someone agree with what I say, it's a matter of filling those boards with people who have the city's best interest at heart."

Bunting, who gave a fiery speech during the citizen comments portion of the agenda at the beginning of the meeting, wasn't around for the last item on the agenda. However, he made known his displeasure with previous comments made by Pobur.

"I'm not going to stand up for people that are going to try and oppress this city," said Bunting.

The next day, Bunting, as is allowed by the city charter, requested a hearing concerning his removal.

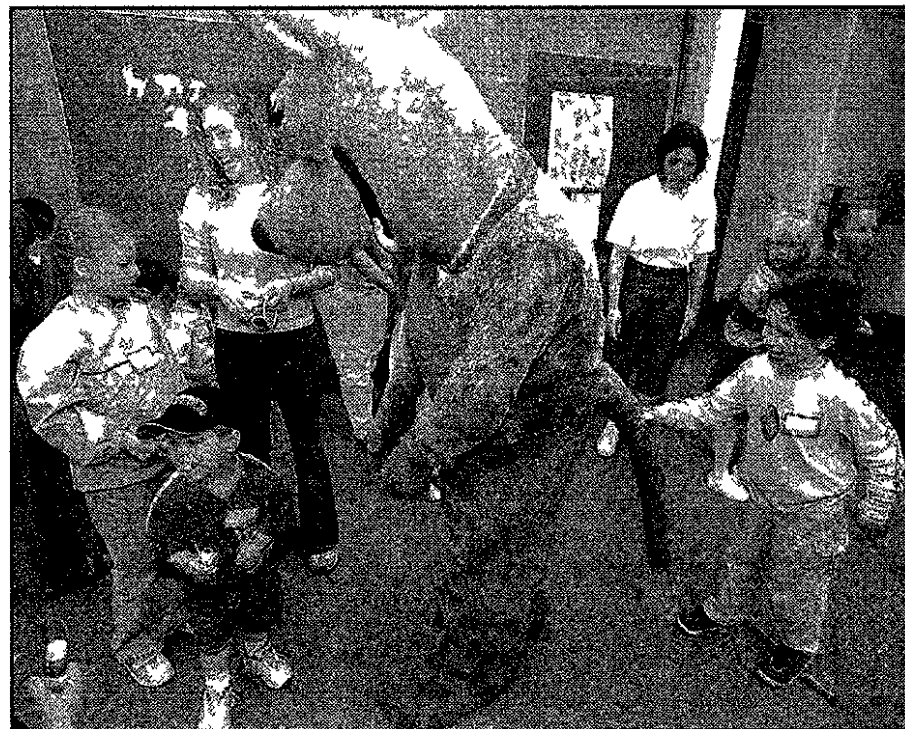
"I want back on," said Bunting. "I actively brought things to the table, and they're afraid of it. I don't know why. If Colleen Pobur feels I'm not the person for the neighborhood, that's a real shame."

Cardwell said he'll also ask for a hearing to find out the exact reasons he was removed from the OVDA board, but won't seek to be put back on.

"This suggests the city might purge cit-

# Patches of unity

## East quilt honors 9-11 emotions

On Sept. 11, no one was immune to the myriad of emotions associated with the shock of the U.S. being attacked on its own soil, and the thousands of lives that were lost and changed forever.

It became a time when people reflected, wondering what they could do to help those affected by the tragedy, as well as to calm their own fears.

"I was sitting in church the following weekend dealing with all the emotions of what went on, and on the wall was a quilt," said Diane Kimball of Plymouth Township, a foreign language teacher at East Middle School in Plymouth. "I thought about doing something positive to amplify the sense of community we have in our school, especially with the diversity we have. I was wondering how to display that when I saw the quilt, and knew that was it."

For nearly seven months, students composed essays detailing their thoughts, and designed patches for the quilt, which was recently sewn together and will soon be on display at the school.

In her essay, Meredith Beems of Canton wrote, "If something positive has come from the September 11th attack, it has been our unified spirit as a nation. People today seem to be friendlier, more

patient, and display a greater sense of tolerance for one another."

Rabia Naqvi of Canton is an Arab-American, and she understood the significance of her message, which is displayed on the quilt.

"I drew a peace sign, with peace written in Arabic and English," said Naqvi. "Not all Arabs are Muslims and most people are thinking that all terrorists are Arabs."

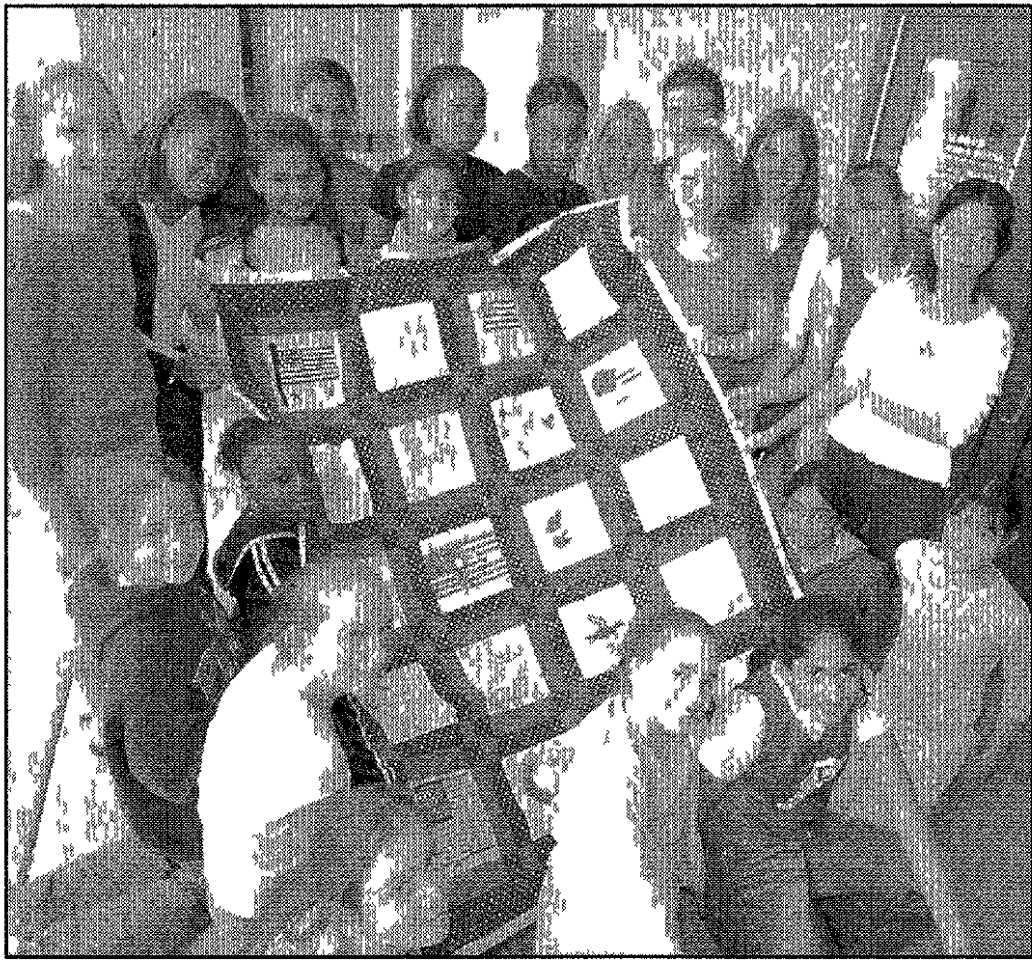
Nivedhitha Subramanian of Canton drew a flower with 66 petals, representing the number of nations who lost countrymen in the World Trade Center collapse.

"Each petal on a flower is like a single country in our world," wrote Subramanian. "When the petals stay together, the flower is a beautiful part of nature. When all of the countries stay together, the world is a peaceful part of the universe."

Angela Hogan, an East math teacher, said the essays and quilt helped students deal with the tragedy surrounding them.

"They didn't know how to react, so this was a positive way for them to react," said Hogan.

"What was really nice was that we had such a diverse group of kids working on this project," added East teacher Danielle Wren. "It was a way for the students to unite."

## Residents take advantage of hazardous waste day

Score one for the environment. On the first joint hazardous waste day at which both Plymouth Township and City of Plymouth residents could dispose of waste at the same time, nearly a thousand of them took advantage of the opportunity Saturday.

With workers from Environmental Quality Co., handling things, 987 cars made their way to the township's municipal services complex on Port. Nearly two-thirds (63 percent) were township residents, with city residents making up 37 percent, according to township supervisor Steve Mann.

"A lot of people showed up, and the city people had quite a bit of stuff stored up, because I think it's been awhile since they've had a day," Mann said. "Environmental Quality did a great job, as did our people and the workers the city sent. It was a very successful event."

Mann said cars began lining up around 7:30 a.m., even though the gates didn't open until 9 a.m. Last year's hazardous waste day event, which was only open to township residents, drew 643 cars.

## Students cited for funny money

Canton police have cited two 14-year-old township youths in connection with the passing of counterfeit money at Discovery Middle School May 6.

Meanwhile, Plymouth police continue their investigation into a similar incident at Central Middle School.

Canton police Sgt. Todd Mutchler said the two Canton teens will be cited under a local ordinance involving fraudulent schemes for their part in passing a counterfeit \$20 bill in the Discovery cafeteria.

"The parents are very receptive and concerned with the act their sons did, and we're confident they are also dealing with the incident at their level," said Mutchler.

Mutchler said one of the teens made the fake money with the help of a computer and scanner

"He made several bills and passed them to a friend at Discovery," said Mutchler. "He obviously knew the severity of what he did because he destroyed the other copies."

Mutchler said the other teen "knew the money was counterfeit" when he tried to pass it off in the cafeteria.

The U.S. Secret Service had been called in to investigate, but because the incident involved juveniles the federal agency handed the case back to Canton police. Mutchler said the two boys will be sentenced through 35th District Court and could receive a maximum 90 days in jail.

School officials said the teens were given five-day suspensions.

Mutchler said detectives determined the incident was not connected to a similar incident at Central Middle School April 24.

"We believe someone heard about what happened at Central,

which may have prompted the Discovery incident," he said.

Meanwhile, Plymouth police Det. Lt. Ed Ochal said there are no dispositions yet involving a 13-year-old boy who reportedly took five fake \$20 bills to Central. The teen reportedly asked two students to exchange some of the money into smaller denominations.

Police said several students came into possession of the fake bills, which were used to buy items in the school cafeteria.

The Central investigation also resulted in police questioning the teen's 16-year-old brother and their 18-year-old friend. A computer was confiscated at the home of the oldest suspect.

Judy Evola, director of communications for Plymouth-Canton Schools, said five Central students were given suspensions, ranging from 3-5 days.

# Plymouth police target motorists not using seatbelts

Plymouth police Sgt Ron Bianchi learned the hard way the dangers of not wearing a seatbelt

Nearly seven years ago, Bianchi was on his way home from a police training seminar at Eastern Michigan University in Ypsilanti

when his Ford Explorer was hit broadside by a car

"For a split second I saw something in the corner of my eye that shouldn't have been there, then all of a sudden it hit me," said Bianchi "I held on to the steering wheel, but eventually let go and I was ejected from the vehicle

"I had black and blue marks on

my back and shoulder from where I bounced off the road, but I didn't have any broken bones," he said "I was lucky to live to tell about it Now, I'm a firm believer (of seatbelts)"

Bianchi and the rest of the Plymouth police department will be targeting motorists not wearing seatbelts during the three day

Memorial weekend holiday as part of the state's Office of Highway Safety Planning

For the most part, motorists are wearing their seatbelts because they can see the damage being done without them," said Bianchi "We can't stress enough that parents buckle their kids in properly Anyone under four

years old needs to be riding in the back"

The law doesn't tolerate children not being buckled in a moving vehicle A child restraint violation is \$115, while an adult seatbelt violation is \$50

The special enforcement of the seatbelt law will run Friday through Monday

Plymouth Township Police Lt Robert Smith said township officers aren't running any special program for the holiday, but will continue their vigilance in regards to seat belt use

"We do it as an educational tool, it's not a punitive thing," Smith said "The idea is that it really does save lives"

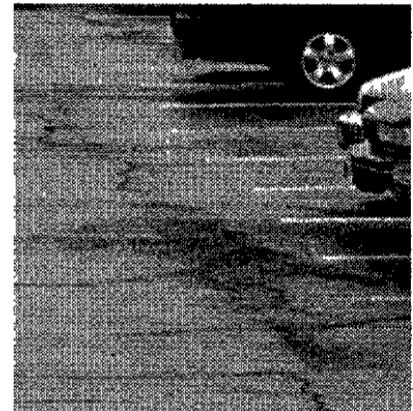
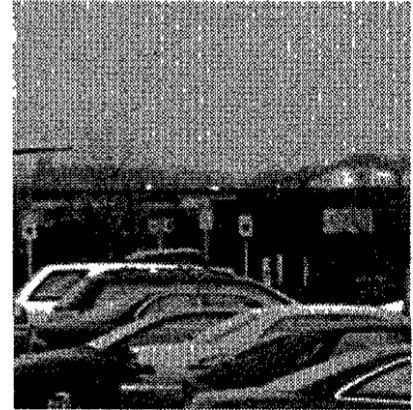

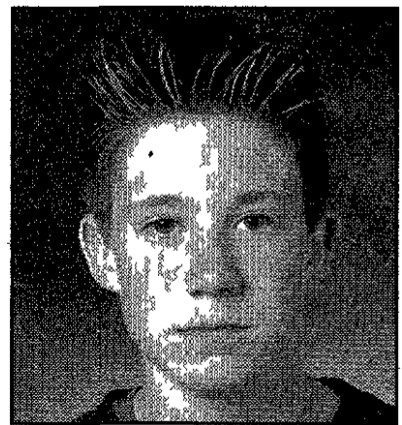

Salem Township, and Salem Township would not be required to contract for water beyond its Urban Services District," Fujita wrote.

According to Mann, adding Salem Township as a Detroit Water customer not only paves the way for Johnson Controls to leave Plymouth Township, but will also exacerbate pressure problems in Plymouth.

Munfakh admits Ayres Lewis works for Salem Township, but someone else in the firm handles the work Munfakh took particular exception to a published report that said Ayres Lewis is also consulting with Johnson

Controls, which he said isn't true. In fact, according to Munfakh, another engineering consultant, Wade-Trim, is working for Johnson Controls, and does a great deal of work with Detroit Water. In a letter from Wade-Trim to Ayres Lewis, Bruce Wairad spelled out the work his company was doing for Johnson Controls.

"The company I work for has not done any work and does not do any work for Johnson Controls," Munfakh said. "We're absolutely not under contract with them for anything."

Mann said the township has already spent between \$30,000

and \$40,000 on engineering and design for a possible new \$1 million water tower to help the township with its pressure problems. Those are decisions, Mann said, on which Munfakh has already voted.

"I don't feel I have a conflict of interest because none of the issues have been presented before the (Plymouth) township board," Munfakh said. "I have not voted to spend any money that I'd be benefiting from."

Mann says Munfakh's work with Salem Township, which Mann says is at odds with his responsibilities as an elected official in Plymouth, violate the

township's ethics policy, which states, in part, "a public officer shall not engage in or accept employment or render services for a private or public interest when that employment or service is incompatible or in conflict with the discharge of the officer's official duties on behalf of the township."

But Munfakh disputes there's any conflict at all.

"I don't personally have any conflict," Munfakh said. "I'm not involved personally with Salem in any manner I've never been to board meetings or planning commission meetings. I don't even know the major issues

there."

Mann contends adding Salem Township to Detroit Water could pose a health hazard in Plymouth Township.

"It's a health issue," Mann said. "If water pressure drops down enough, our residents will be boiling water to make it safe."

Munfakh agrees, and says he supports the administration's handling of the water situation.

"Plymouth Township has a contract with Detroit to deliver water to us at certain pressures," Munfakh said. "Whatever Detroit does with someone else, they have to meet their obligations to Plymouth Township."

exceed revenues by nearly \$188,000 before negotiated wage increases are factored in.

However, estimates of negotiated wage increases could put the district back in the red. According to financial predictions supplied to the board by Patricia Brand, executive director of business services, one scenario indicates a 2 percent wage hike would leave the district \$740,000 in the red, after the \$950,000 in proposed cuts. At 3 percent, the deficit would be nearly \$1.7 million, after the proposed cuts.

"What we're looking at is an incomplete picture because we don't know the impact that staff raises will have," said trustee Judy Mardigian. "Once those get finally approved, we're going to have to look back and factor those in to see where we are."

"It seems to me that we're going to take another look at things and dig a little deeper," added Mardigian. "It's going to depend on two things, the number of new students that arrive, which is our revenue, and the percentage of the (wage) increases."

Watts said he's satisfied with the original cuts outlined by Booher, but he still has questions regarding some expenditures in the proposed budget.

"I think some of the curriculum purchase recommendations are a little large," said Watts, referring, in part, to a proposed \$400,000 expenditure for a new elementary and middle school language arts program. "I'm not going to say there are large cuts there, but I need to understand better the rationale behind those decisions."

Among the cuts outlined by Booher earlier this month are a reduction of four elementary teaching positions and a middle school teacher, \$250,000, the district's allocation of funds for field trips, \$90,000, athletic expenditures, \$65,000, and general budget reductions, \$50,000.

The board will continue its discussion of the budget at its May 28 regular meeting.



### Low turnout means every voter counts on June 10

It might sound simplistic and obvious, but voters are in complete control of the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools election, and they can control it in two different ways

Number one, they could get out in force and actually vote. However, recent poll performance suggests that isn't likely. Last year, only about 1,800 of the 73,000 registered voters in the district bothered to make it to the polls, although another 800 cast absentee ballots.

But that would lead to the second way voters can control this particular election. Staying home will almost certainly allow the teachers union to decide who gets the two four-year seats and the single one-year term up for grabs.

Teachers are already martalling their forces. Local union president Chuck Portelli says there are roughly 2,000 teachers living in the district. He's taken a look at the numbers, he's been around a long time, and he knows what anyone who hasn't slept through the last several election cycles already knows: It won't take many votes to win.

Last year, in a race for one seat, Tom Wysocki needed just over 1,100 votes to win. The runner up, Fred Libbing, got 873 votes. You don't have to be able to pass the math MEAP to figure out the numbers. Anything approaching a 50-percent teacher turnout, and the teachers elect the people they want.

Now, there's nothing wrong with that, in fact, we encourage anything that will get the numbers up at the polls. The teachers are doing what they need to do to support their agenda, to try to get their candidates (for the record, they're supporting Joann Lamar, Carol Saunders and Marcy Staley) elected.

Of course, this is nothing new. Teachers historically turn out to support school board elections. That's great for the democratic process as a whole.

But how good is it if one group can control an entire election? We don't think it's the best thing in the world. Mostly, it means not many other people are turning out for the vote, and that's bothersome. A local school board election is arguably the most important election in which voters can cast their ballot.

Quality of schools has a tremendous effect on property value, on the quality of the education and, ultimately, the life we give our children.

Yet, school board elections are by and

large ignored by the voting public, as last year's paltry turnout suggests. That's why an extraordinarily small percentage — if you take Portelli's word for it, teachers make up less than 3 percent of registered voters in the district — can have such a major impact.

So it's up to us to repeat a plea we

make on an annual basis, in the hope that the adage about the squeaky wheel getting the grease is true. Get out and vote, which isn't all that difficult.

In fact, the school district makes it easy to cast our ballot, either at the polls or ahead of time. Absentee ballot applications are available from the district offices at 454 S. Harvey in downtown Plymouth. They will be accepted by mail through Election Day (Monday, June 10), or can be dropped off in person through 8 p.m. on June 10.

Residents can also vote absentee 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday June 8 at the district offices. However, they won't be able to take absentee ballots home that day, according to elections clerk Elizabeth Adams.

It's time for voters in the Plymouth-Canton school district to take ownership of their school board.

Three open seats on a seven-member board sparked a great deal of participation, with 10 candidates vying for the four-year seats and two more for the unexpired one-year term.

Let's hope that carries over into the voting booths, where we hope to see voters taking control the best way they can. By turning in an absentee ballot or going to the polls on June 10.

### After 9-11, Memorial Day holiday means even more

Monday marks our annual celebration of Memorial Day, that day we break out the barbecues, cook up some chicken or ribs and take the day off work.

In recent years that's what Memorial Day has become for a lot of people. That's not what it's supposed to be about, of course. The holiday is designed to honor the folks who have paid the ultimate price, given the greatest of all sacrifices in service to their country to ensure Americans continue to live a life of freedom and prosperity.

Proclaimed May 5, 1868, by Gen. John Logan, national commander of the Grand Army of the Republic, Memorial Day was first observed 25 days later, when flowers were placed on the graves of Union and Confederate soldiers at Arlington National Cemetery.

The South refused to acknowledge the day, honoring their dead on separate days until after World War I, when the holiday changed from simply honoring Civil War dead to remembering anyone who perished in any war. Congress established Memorial Day as the last Monday in May in 1968, ironically to ensure a three-day weekend for federal workers. Maybe Congress had a huge barbecue that year.

Since then, most states recognize Memorial Day as the last Monday in May, although a bill was introduced in 1999 to establish May 30 as the official day. Several southern states also still observe separate days on which Confederate dead are honored.

Most communities honor the day with a brief ceremony, or a parade. But watch the crowds at such events. They're made

up largely of old-timers, veterans remembering comrades in arms, a more patriotic time. It touches their hearts because it touched their lives. We wonder: Can young people today have the same sense of pride, the same patriotic feel?

If not, it would be easy to understand, because they have no frame of reference. After all, it's been nearly 10 years since the United States has been involved in any kind of military conflict. And, before the Gulf War of the early 1990s, it had been some 20 years between armed conflicts.

Two major military operations in 30 years probably aren't enough to demonstrate to people — particularly young people no longer subject to the draft or any sort of required military service — just what a sacrifice military people are called to make.

All of that should have changed in the wake of Sept. 11, when thousands of innocent people died in an act of war perpetrated by a coward holed up in a desert hideout. Opinions should have changed, understanding sharpened, sacrifices made more clear in the days since, when Americans have died trying to ferret out a monster and wipe out the network with which he terrorized a nation.

The terrorist attacks of Sept. 11 seemed to pique a renewed zeal for American patriotism. Sure, we'll still barbecue our steaks and have our picnics and take our day off. But let's hope we all do one more thing Monday.

For the sake of those who died last year, and in all years past, let's remember

### Bill hurts poor

Through the HealthChoice program, Wayne County has helped local businesses provide health care coverage to more than 22,000 low-income workers. These are hardworking individuals who choose work rather than collect welfare. Another 30,000 of the county's indigent receive health care through the county's PlusCare program.

With his airport parking tax legislation, State Rep. Bruce Patterson (R-Canton) has told these low-income workers and the indigent that improving outstate airports and putting more concealed weapons on the county's streets is more important than health care. House Bill 4454 strips nearly \$15 million a year from Wayne County, without cutting any state-mandated services the county must provide by law.

The current airport parking tax was created in 1987 to close an annual budget deficit caused by state-mandated services including indigent health care services. This county has recorded 14 straight balanced budgets while providing cost-effective services such as HealthChoice and PlusCare to our residents. The county is already struggling to balance a \$20 million budget deficit primarily due to other state funding cuts. How many cuts in services should Wayne County taxpayers shoulder because of the legislature's misplaced priorities?

It's time to ask our legislators in Lansing why they feel Wayne County's indigent and low-income working people should be forced to lose their health care coverage so that the state can fund airport improvements in Traverse City and Marquette. We must also ask our legislators why it's more important to put more concealed weapons at our children's soccer games and on our crowded roadways at the expense of our local businesses and workers.

Wayne County has worked hard to build a solid economic foundation and a good quality of life for our residents. As Rep. Bill O'Neil (D-Allen Park) said, "We're going to lose a lot of those quality of life facilities that are so very important." Reps. Laura Toy (R-Livonia) and John Stewart (R-Plymouth) also showed their leadership by stepping away from partisan politics and voted against Patterson's bill. They clearly understand that their constituents need the services Wayne County has been providing. It's time some of their colleagues put their partisan politics aside and do what's right for local working families and businesses.

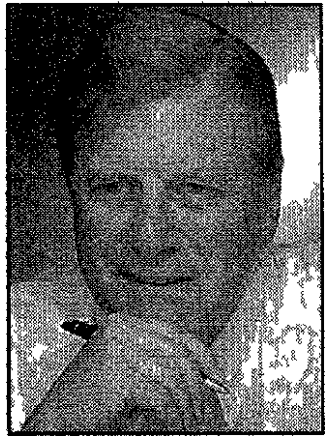

## Recreation proposal on ballot deserves support

Memorial Day weekend is coming up. It's the first spring holiday of the year, and for many families it's the first time to get out in our magnificent parks and recreation areas. If you're looking for good places to get out into nature over the weekend, I suggest three:

- **Bald Mountain Recreation Area**, near Lake Orion in Oakland County. The 4,637-acre area was originally acquired for public use with money from the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund Development is controlled, so folks can swim, hunt, fish and go boating. Hiking in the hills covered with early wildflowers is especially nice at this time of year.

- **Deerfield Hills Natural Area**, a spectacular 400-acre park in Deerfield Township, located in north central Livingston County. Visitors can enjoy nature trails abundant with wildlife in the rolling hills and fishing in the lake. The land was acquired for preservation and public use with \$2.8 million from the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund.

- **Near Lansing**, the Lake Lansing Park North contains more than 400 acres of natural recreation area, including five miles of nature trails through mature oak and maple woodlands. The park was created largely with funds from the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund.

Attentive readers will have noticed one thing in common for each of these great places. The land was acquired for public use with money from the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund, one of Michigan's most vital devices for preserving our wild woods and waters. What's most remarkable about the Fund is that it doesn't cost taxpayers a single cent!

Since its start back in 1976, the Fund has become Michigan's principal source of state funding for conservation and outdoor recreation projects. Revenue for the Fund comes from the sale of oil, gas and mineral leases and from royalties from oil, gas and minerals take from state-owned land. According to the state Constitution, the interest and earnings from the Trust Fund are to be used for "the acquisition of land or rights in land for recreational uses or protection of the land because of its environmental importance or its scenic beauty, (or) for the develop-

ment of public recreation facilities."

The Fund is perhaps Michigan's most important conservation tool. Since its start, it has distributed more than \$537 million for 1,200 conservation and recreation projects touching every county in Michigan. Earlier this year, for example, \$12 million from the Fund helped the Michigan chapter of the Nature Conservancy buy and preserve for public use and enjoyment some 6,000 acres of unspoiled land at the tip of the Keweenaw Peninsula in the UP.

The Fund, however, urgently needs protection and improvement. So while you're driving north this Memorial Day weekend, I urge you to think kindly about the best way to do this. It's Proposal 2, an amendment to the state Constitution, which will appear on the ballot in the August 6 primary election. If passed, the Proposal would allow Trust Fund assets to be invested at a higher rate of return than possible now and raise the cap on funds from \$400 million to \$500 million.

Taken together, the value of Proposal 2 to conservation and outdoor recreation in Michigan would be more than \$500 million over the next 20 years - all without costing the taxpayer a single cent! This is a sensationally good deal, one that will strengthen the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund and assure that Michigan wild woods and waters are preserved and our state parks and recreation areas are strengthened and improved.

Because it's such a good deal, Proposal 2 is receiving support from an unprecedented range of constituencies and organizations, from the Michigan Chamber of Commerce on the right (good state parks and conserved wild lands make for good tourism) to the Michigan Environmental Council on the left (conservation is a holy grail of the environmental movement). Hunters and fisher folk are represented by support from the Michigan United Conservation Clubs, while even the Michigan Oil and Gas Association is greasing (ahem) the skids in support.

Proposal 2 and the vote in August won't make big news between now and the August primary election. Everybody's for it, it's non-controversial, it makes incontrovertible sense, it costs the taxpayers nothing. But it is a vital tool in the effort to preserve forever Michigan's great places for public use and enjoyment before it's too late. It deserves your support.

When I took a Psychology of Stress and Relaxation course, I had realized my desire to quit smoking. My professor gave us his holistic technique that was guaranteed, as long as we put forth our effort. I was willing to take that challenge.

I decided to use some of his ideas that I thought would work best for me. I first decided upon a date to start and a date to quit. I started on June 5 and planned on quitting two weeks later - June 19. I decided to try the prescription drug, Welbutrin, again for extra help with the process. I was on my way and scared that I would regret this. After all, I did love smoking!

On June 5, I e-mailed my friends to let them know of my plans to become a nonsmoker. There was no turning back now, they all knew I got great support through this and happened to see almost everyone I e-mailed within the first three days. They were supportive and watched me closely. I needed that. I worked a plan out that on June 10, I would smoke nine cigarettes and then cut one cigarette each day until my quit date. For reinforcement, I told my dad that I would give him \$20 for every cigarette I smoked over that day. How is that for pressure?

For motivation, I left Post-It notes in my car and at work, reminding myself of my quit date. I decided at the end of my hard work that I deserved a gift. Look how much money I would have now! At least an extra \$140 per month! I decided that I wanted a cellular phone, so I made sure to leave brochures in random places to remind me of my goal.

As expected with my luck, trouble came my

way. The Welbutrin was backfiring on me. I became ill. On June 8, I had to make a decision. I couldn't stay on the Welbutrin because of the side effects. But could I not smoke without it? This moment was a life-altering decision. I would have to quit smoking now. I was determined. On June 8, 11 days before my quit date, I became a nonsmoker. I quit the most addictive drug.

**When I took a Psychology of Stress and Relaxation course, I had realized my desire to quit smoking. My professor gave us his holistic technique that was guaranteed, as long as we put forth our effort. I was willing to take that challenge.**

The hardest thing was keeping my inspiration to stay a nonsmoker. I had to keep on focusing on what I wanted. Life. I realized that I would always crave cigarettes at times in my life, and I was willing to take that as another challenge.

After about two months, I felt extremely powerful about quitting smoking. I felt that there was nothing that could stop me now from getting what I wanted. I wanted to break all my bad habits. I started coming up with more goals to maintain this energy.

I became more financially stable, I bought my own car, and I am taking a kickboxing class. All of which I could never have done when I was a smoker because I couldn't afford the payments or the breath. I sleep better, I sing better, I feel better, and, believe it or not, I actually am not as stressed out anymore. Smoking was my stress.

It didn't take long for someone to approach me and tell me that I smell good. That was what made me realize that what I did for myself was really something I could be proud of for the rest of my life. I smoked for seven years at a pack and a half a day. I have never looked back.

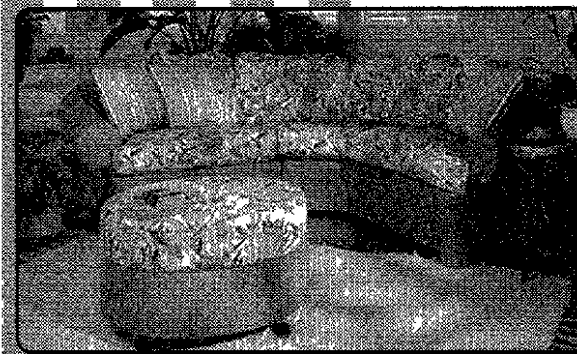

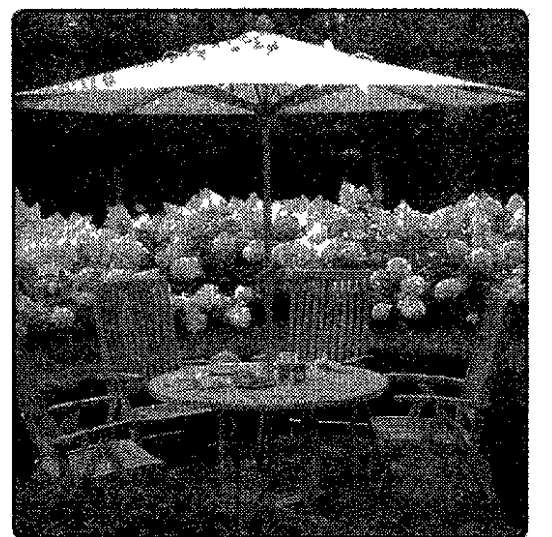

# County health care efforts would feel brunt of tax cut

Detroit Metropolitan Airport patrons could save a few bucks on parking with passage of a bill that cuts the current 30-percent tax in half.

But critics of the legislation, including Wayne County Executive Ed McNamara and some local state representatives, say the move will come at the expense of providing health care for low-income workers and indigent county residents.

Others suggested Thursday that the proposed repeal of the 15-year-old Airport Parking Tax Act was just another skirmish in the ongoing battle over money and attention between state legislators and Wayne County officials.

Wayne County Commissioner Lyn Bankes of Livonia called the parking tax money "absolutely necessary."

"This couldn't come at a worse time for the county," she added, referring to a possible budget deficit and restrictions on spending other general fund money for the health care programs.

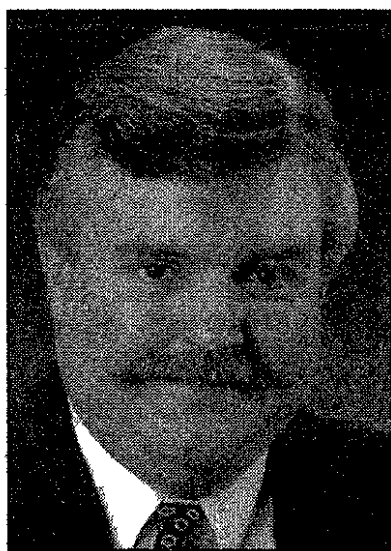
McNamara was unavailable for

comment Friday. He called the bill an example of "the legislature's misplaced priorities," and was critical of its sponsor, Rep. Bruce Patterson (R-Canton), in a letter appearing in today's Observer.

June West, a spokeswoman for McNamara, said loss of the parking tax revenue also endangers federal and state matching funds that make up the balance of the \$44 million budget for the county

backed employer health insurance program.

The Michigan House of Representatives passed HB4454 on a 55-41 vote late May 15 after several amendments. The bill will likely

be approved in the Senate this summer and could be signed by Gov. John Engler before holiday travelers descend on Metro's terminals in the fall.

Patterson has been pushing for a repeal of the parking tax since his election in 1998. The bill that passed this week was first introduced in March 2001.

It reduces the parking tax to 15 percent and redirects most of the remaining money it will generate to a bond program for security improvements at airports throughout the state.

The parking tax was originally approved by the legislature in 1987 to make up a county budget deficit and pay for state mandated indigent health care services. Money from the tax is also used to pay for the county's HealthChoice program, developed in the late 1990s so that small businesses can provide low cost health insurance to their employees.

The law had no sunset provision

but Patterson said it was designed as a one-time fix. He also said finding additional money for anti-terrorism efforts is a priority.

"Wayne County never saw a tax it didn't like. It's time to finally put a stop to that," Patterson said Thursday.

The tax cut would cost the county about \$15 million a year in revenue, according to McNamara, a figure that Patterson disputes. Patterson said county officials aren't taking into account higher revenues from the garage at the new terminal and an increase in overall parking rates at the airport.

Parking at the airport, including the 11,544-space garage, runs \$8.26 a day, including the tax. Those rates are \$1.54 higher than before the new terminal opened in February.

Off-airport lots charge \$5-\$7.75 per day, including the tax.

There is no guarantee parking rates will drop if the tax cut is

approved. Three Wayne County legislators supported the bill, along with several representatives from Oakland and Macomb counties.

"I think this is going to hurt people, people that I deal with all the time (as a member of the Family Independence Agency appropriations subcommittee)," said Rep. Laura Toy, R-Livonia.

Toy was a supporter of the original legislation but took her name off the bill that passed Wednesday.

Reps. John Stewart (R-Plymouth Township), Glenn Anderson (D-Westland) and James Plakas (D-Garden City) voted against the bill. Rep. Bob Brown (D-Redford) didn't vote.

Bankes said in addition to hurting people who can least afford it, politics played a prominent role in the push to pass the bill. "This is just one more 'I don't like Ed McNamara' piece of legislation," she said.

# Weathering time: Stagecrafters revive Gene Kelly classic

When Dean Gaboury dances across the stage as the lead character in *Singin' in the Rain* he won't have to worry about slipping in a puddle. The Bloomfield Hills actor trades his tap shoes for ones with rubber soles before the first rain drop falls in the Stagecrafters musical opening Friday, May 24 at the historic Baldwin Theatre in Royal Oak. Based on the film starring, directed and choreographed by Gene Kelly, the production features new choreography by Valerie Mould and assistant director John Luther of Farmington.

Gaboury plays Don Lockwood, Kelly's character in the movie celebrating 50 years of popularity.

"We've only run rain once. It's a lot of fun but for the moment the rain's cold," said Gaboury who performs four tap numbers

in the show. "They're talking about filling the drum with hot water a couple of hours before the show starts."

It's Dolly Scheibelhut's job to eliminate any problems created by the famous scene where Kelly swung around lamp posts as he tapped through the street after dark. That hasn't always been easy. It takes four crew members just to move the rain machine incorporated into the set to the front of the stage. After the rain falls and gathers in the gutters they must mop up the water before moving the set back.

Scheibelhut spent hours learning about the system that re-circulates the rain water back to a 55-gallon drum. So far, none has ended up in the pit, where the 12-member orchestra will sit but another area of the theater was not as lucky.

"The first time we made it rain, it flooded the basement where costumers work," said Scheibelhut, Stagecrafters treasurer and one of the costumers for the 25 member cast. "It's quit leaking in the basement now."

"I'm happy we resolved the problem because this theater was built in 1922 as a Vaudeville house that members worked very hard to restore after a fire."

Purchased from a theater group in Grand Rapids a year ago, the rain machine sets the mood for the boy meets girl, boy falls in love and uses all his powers of persuasion to ensure a happy ending.

"It's a funny script," said director David McIntosh of Beverly Hills. "It still makes me laugh. It takes place in 1927 when *The Jazz Singer*. Al Jolson's talkie movie came out and the silent movie business knew they had to adapt. Lina is a big silent movie star and she had a horrible voice. We're incorporat-

Broadway numbers and the rain is something people don't expect to see on stage. If people enjoyed the movie, they'll love being up close and watching it rain at night."

Kelly Janney and her late father loved the movie. That's why she's thrilled to be playing Don Lockwood's love interest.

"As a kid I watched the movie with my father. He's gone now, so it's very special," said Janney, a Rochester Hills resident. "It's like a dream to perform in it. The three of us (Gaboury and Doug Clark, who plays Donald O'Connor's character in the movie) are friends off stage and it helps the chemistry on stage. The movie and music are incredibly famous. It's going to get applause."

ing a film portion that shows the progression from silent film to talkie.

"I love the scene where Lina is trying to aim her voice toward the microphone. It made me laugh in auditions, it makes me laugh now."

Mary Ann Redhage has as much fun playing the part of the fictitious movie queen as the audience does watching her strut through the play in a flashy white flapper costume.

"She's the epitome of annoying, completely full of herself," said Redhage, who acted in her first play at Troy High School before going on to study theater at Wayne State University. "Her looks have gotten her through life. She's not able to make the transition because of her voice and she's in love with her co-star Don Lockwood. It's the role of a lifetime. There are big

"I think the audience will see this explosion of music on stage," added Clark who puts all of his dance lessons to use in the part. "The audience doesn't expect it for community theater."

Bob Czaplcki's sound design sets the mood for the upbeat show and scene where the Gene Kelly character twirls his umbrella while laying down fancy footwork.

"There's a tremendous amount of sound effect - rain, thunder," said Czaplcki, a Plymouth resident who's worked with the Plymouth Theatre Guild. "The hardest part as a sound designer is you can't have as many microphones as people so you try to group these body mikes around the leads. There are also floor mikes and shotgun mikes projecting from the walls in the house, all controlled by a brand new sound board with 16 adjust-

ments for each mike. This is the first practice to hear how Don sounds singing in the rain so I can make all the tonal characteristics blend."

Scheibelhut said Czaplcki's behind-the-scenes contribution is what makes the 300-member Stagecrafters community theater group a sell-out with audiences. Next season, promises to top this one with five main stage productions which include the musicals *Pirates of Penzance*, *Chicago* and *A Secret Garden*, 2nd Stage productions of contemporary shows - *How I Learned to Drive*, *Floyd Collins* and *Cowgirl*, and for younger audiences the musical *Pippin*. But first, *Peter Pan* flies into the theater for a July production.

"Some members never set foot on stage," said Scheibelhut. "We're always looking for people to join. We always need people to help."

Over the last 10 years Arlene Frank's seen certain themes appear again and again - abuse, divorce, memories of a troubled family. These are all issues Frank faces as director of the Womencenter where counseling, scholarships, seminars and workshops help women find their way in life.

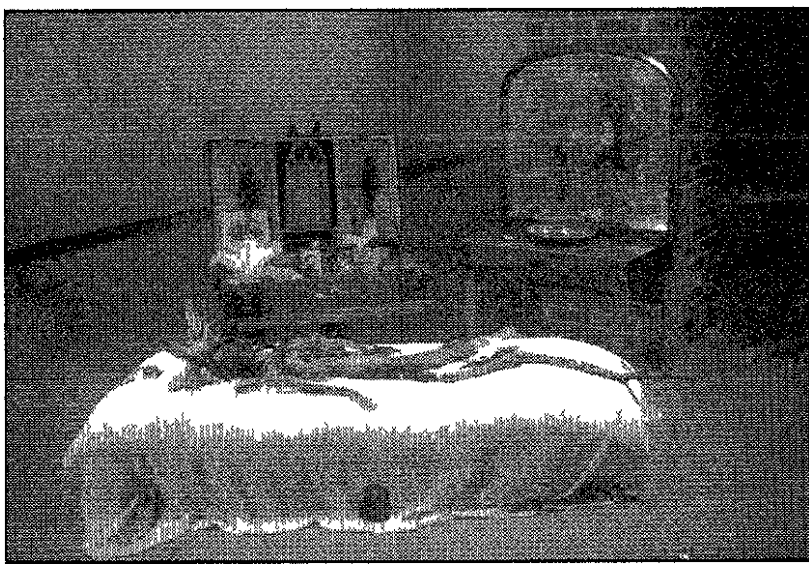
Artists in the exhibit use paint, clay, photography, and sculpture to do the same. Carole Snizek Vogler fractures a woman's body in her ceramic wall piece. Canton artist Connie Lucas takes apart the body of a baby doll to make a statement about the promise of education. Inside a box which represents the babies torso, Lucas places a pouch filled with dozens of miniature dolls. At the base of the assemblage is a toy fireman, soldiers, baseball player, and a lone female teacher. On a brighter note, Livonia artist Regina Dunne created a pastel drawing of a nude model whose hair takes on the vibrancy of a red pillow lying nearby.

"Women often do their art from a different perspective," said Frank. "When the exhibit began 30-years ago as *Our Visions* women were under represented in galleries and shows."

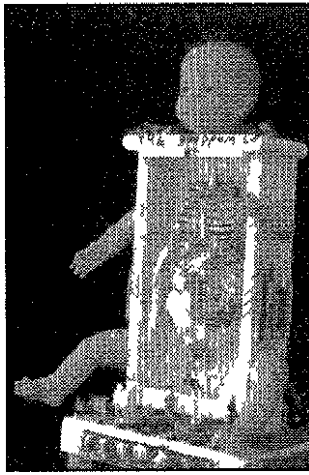
Darcy Scott is able to show her acrylic painting *Lost Souls* (9/11) because of efforts on behalf of women artists. Currently, she has work on exhibit in the Alfred Berkowitz Gallery at the University of Michigan-Dearborn and Huntsville Art Museum in Texas. On May 25, she'll be in the Michigan Water Color Society show at the Ella Sharp Museum in Jackson.

Scott's surreal *Lost Souls* painting won an honorable mention for portraying the loss of thousands of lives in the devastation wrought by the terrorists attacks on America. Oak stools and a lone fireman's helmet swirl through an abyss.

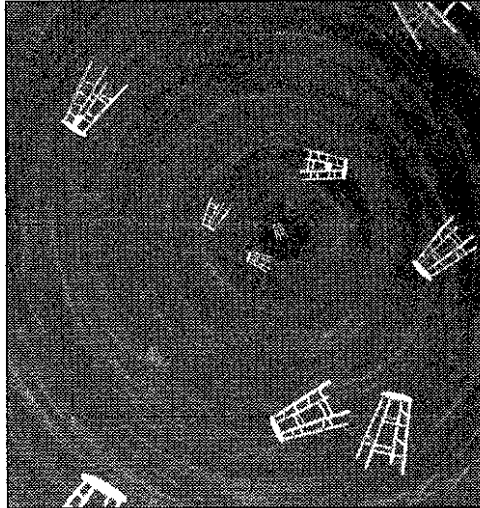
"It's my reaction to everything that happened," said Scott, a West Bloomfield artist who's shown work at the Birmingham Bloomfield Art Center and Cary Gallery in Rochester since the

early 1980s. "I wasn't ready to show it emotionally before. It helped me to get my emotions out."

Mary Danko Schraffenberger used mixed media to express her feelings as well. The Livonia artist fears Cajun and Zydeco music is dying. She hopes to draw attention to the music she came to love while learning to play the triangle, rub board and Cajun accordion at a camp in West Virginia last year. Energetic ink lines flow from an accordion in her photographic litho print which blends computer technology with watercolor painting and pen and ink.

"I have a feel for the music, the excitement that comes out of it," said Schraffenberger who graduated with a bachelor of fine arts degree from the University of Michigan last December. "There is such a small amount of musicians doing this in south west Louisiana. I don't want it lost. I've been photographing musicians about a year and a half to document who's playing the music."

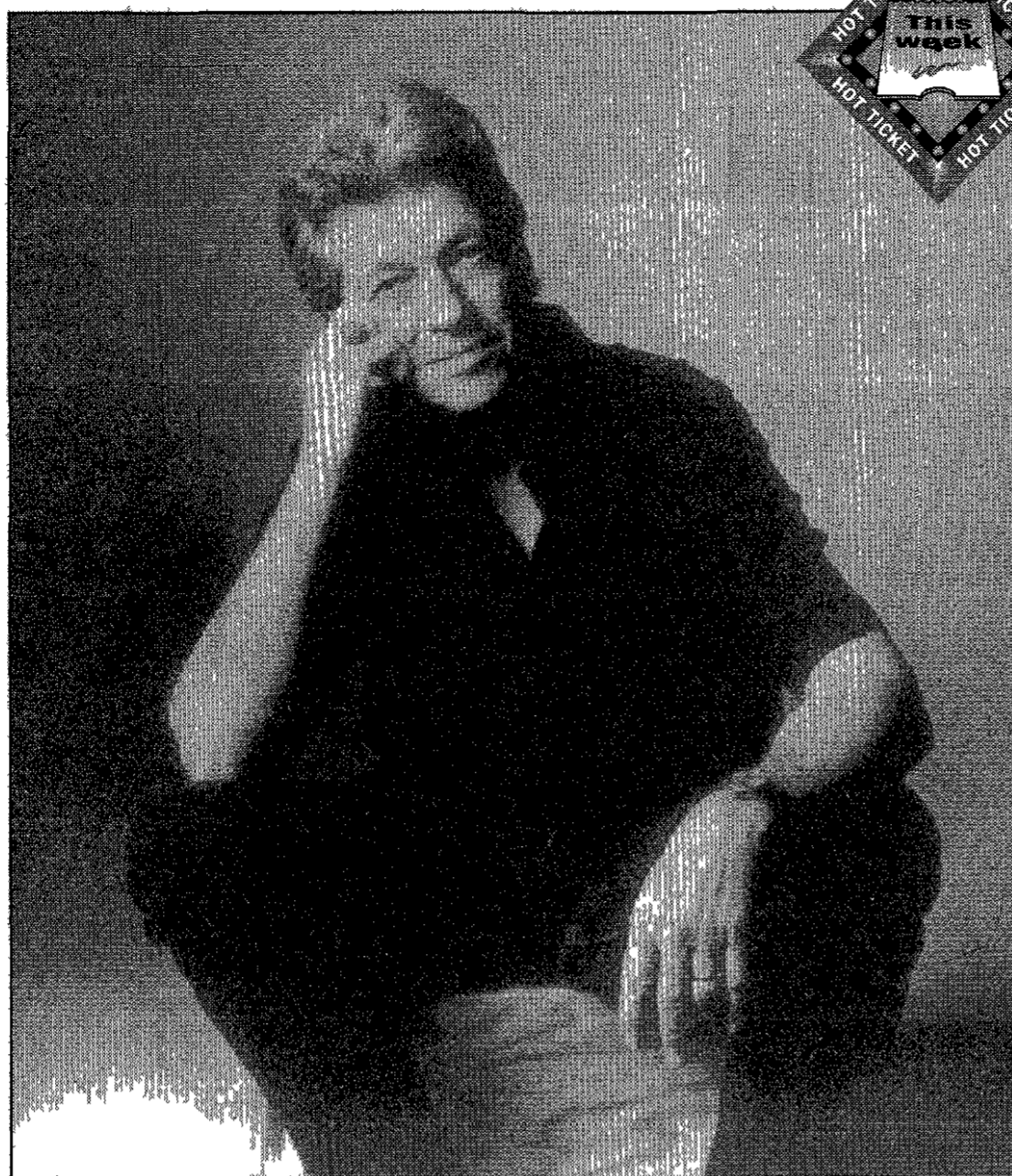

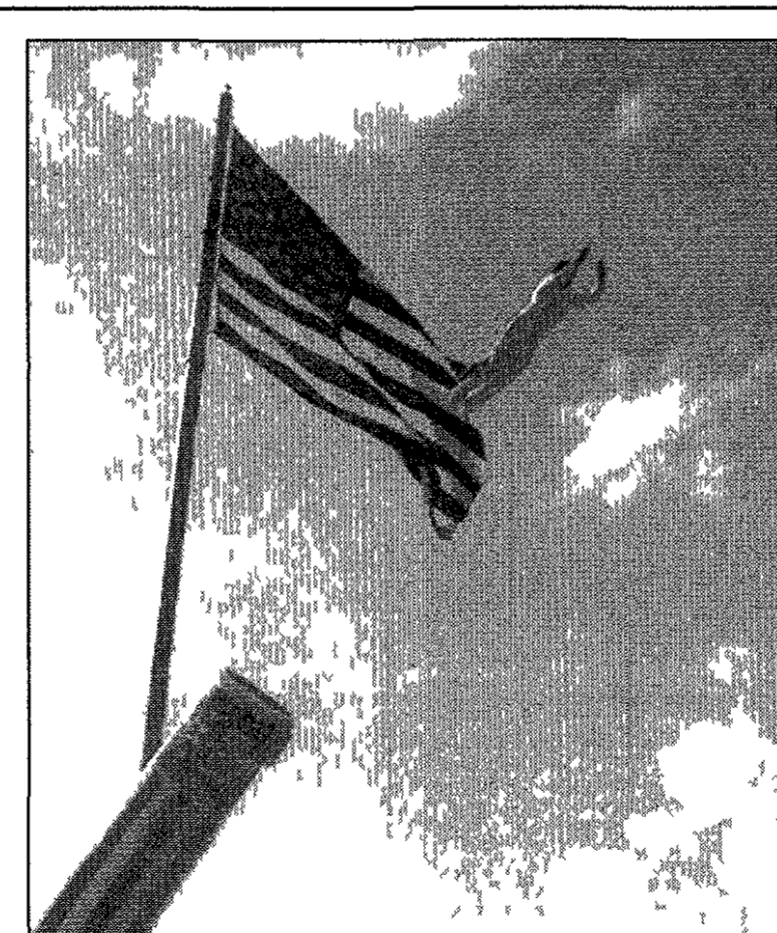

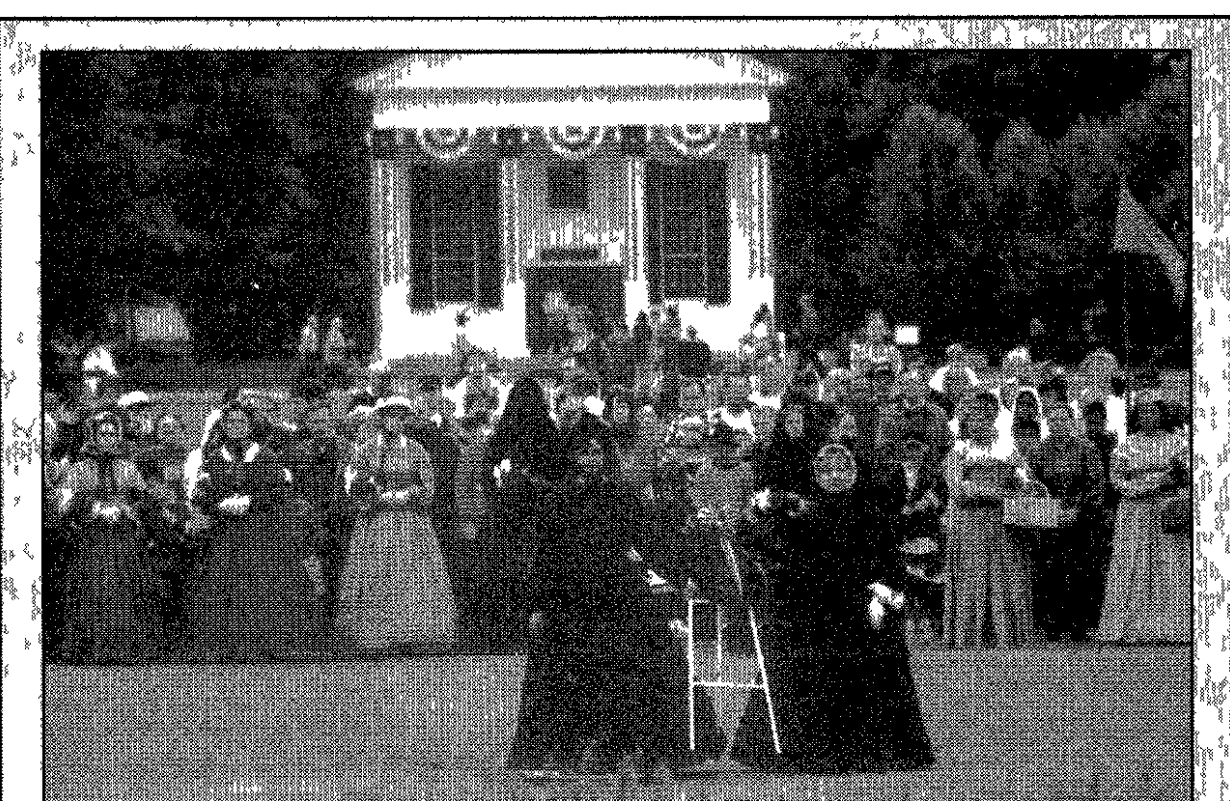

# Theatre Guild looks to a brighter future

Maxine Parshall knew the minute she read the script for *No Comment*, the drama would draw crowds to the Theatre Guild of Livonia Redford Berl Falbaum's commentary on ethics in journalism would not only increase ticket sales but be a perfect vehicle for a fundraiser. It's no secret the Theatre Guild has struggled to remain a viable venue in the community. What better way to announce the turn around than with a world premiere Saturday, June 1, at the Livonia Civic Center Library Theater.

"We've decided to use it as a fundraiser because we've had some financial difficulties in the past couple of year," said Parshall who directs *No Comment*. "The Theatre Guild's been in

operation since 1953 and over the years produced first rate shows. We were the first in the area to do shows like *Chicago* back in the 1980s.

"I think the play addresses important issues. It's very exciting to be involved in an original play. The last 10 years we've made the stage available to local playwrights for one acts festival *No Comment*, a full length play, addresses the public's right to know versus privacy issues important to every one."

Assistant director Genevieve Terry believes the play will give audiences reason to pause and reflect on the practices of media in this country. Terry is a Farmington Hills resident who frequently works with SRO Productions in Southfield.

"I like the play because it gives you something to think about," said Terry who's been with the Theatre Guild 15-years. "It tells you about issues that should be corrected."

Examining the facts is one of the steps the Theatre Guild took to ensure a brighter future. Last fall the 90 member organization began redecorating the interior and box office, organized cos-

tume and prop inventory, and purchased new packs to power theater lighting.

"We have a new board as of last September," said Joe Aglone of Farmington Hills. Aglone is treasurer and producer of the current production. "We now hold open auditions. You don't have to be a member to be in a play."

Aglone's experience in the field will help guide the Theatre's Guild to success. As manager for the Federal Bureau of Entertainment, he develops and promotes one person shows which includes Steven Berkoff playing Shakespeare's villains June 26 at the Power Center as part of the Ann Arbor Summer Festival.

"We're celebrating our 50th anniversary season in September and I see the future as stable," said Aglone. "In early October we're opening with the musical *Clue*, *Gaslight* a romantic mystery follows in December when we'll also do *Babes in Toyland* for children, and we're offering a summer camp for children in theater beginning in June. It's for second grade to high school students. Morning, afternoon and

early evening hours will make it convenient for parents to fit the camps into their schedules."

Like Aglone, Debbie Tedrick's years in theater should help attract new interest in the Redford venue. Her InterACT business is presenting children's theater camps at The Community House in Birmingham June 24 July 12 and July 15 to Aug 2, at First Presbyterian Church in Farmington Hills Aug 5-16, and at the Theatre Guild of Livonia-Redford June 10 to Aug 30. The two week camps will spotlight beginning and advanced acting, vocal training, improvisation, and a pop and rock opera workshop with full electronic band as accompaniment.

"I've known they've been in trouble for a couple of years and have turned themselves around," said Tedrick, a Farmington Hills resident. "In May 2000 I produced a show for them, *Cabaret Calypso*, as a fundraiser and wanted to help them again to make some money and to attract people."

Laura Jerome's mind She was required to take a class in it to complete her MBA at the University of Michigan. Flint Jerome plays Sue Little, a young reporter who casts doubt on Castle's presumption of guilt.

"She's a fascinating character and I'm able to relate to her," said Jerome, a Royal Oak resident who works for a performance management firm in Farmington Hills and frequently acts with SRO Productions in Southfield. "Most of the newspaper people are focused on getting the exclusive. She accesses the conscience. Should we be doing this? What if he's innocent? She's the only one to raise the question and discuss the line between what is legal and what is ethical?"

"In the class we learned that whenever in doubt ask yourself would you be comfortable telling your mother what you've done?"

Yvonne Thomas thinks probably not in the case of the student accusing her character's hus-

band of sexual harassment. Thomas confronts the young girl in a riveting scene. There's more at stake than the political aspirations of her husband.

"It's tense," said Thomas of Southfield. "I'm pleading for my husband's life with this girl. I'm a family woman strong with a lot of faith in my husband and faith in the system."

Unfortunately faith isn't enough to save Thomas' character from the heartache she endures as a result of the allegations.

"I like the subject matter," said Thomas. "It's relevant and provocative. You go home thinking about it and discussing it."

After playing the role of the prosecutor in *No Comment*, Jim Charles says he'll read articles with a sense of skepticism.

Ralph is pretty sharp with a definite plan about where he's going with his career, said Charles, a West Bloomfield builder who's doing his first

show with the Theatre Guild of Livonia Redford. "He will do whatever it takes. He's not a bad guy but bends the rules."

"The show isn't about choreography, staging. It's about the words. Berl has written it reinforces the fact that I have no interest in politics. It's an interesting show. I think the audience will be entertained but it will make them think when they pick up certain articles."

Jason Romero refrains from using the word entertaining but admits the play does make an impact on audience members, especially when it's revealed the university president is innocent and has taken matters into his own hands. and tourists from age 9 to 90 visit the hall simply to listen to the music. There's no food or drink, but admission is still only \$5 for the evening.

"New Orleans was a hotbed of jazz," said Jaffe, age 31. "The band's original members were founders of jazz in America. I've lived in New Orleans my whole life and grew up listening to and observing musicians play the music. The music is a testament to the history of New Orleans and its survival. It's a pure representation of the culture of New Orleans. The music is something you absorb as a child. It's never formally taught. You stand next to people who are playing it. It's an oral tradition."

"It's a music that serves a social function. It's a music we play at funerals and parades at appropriate tempo, not so fast people can't walk to it, not so slow people can't dance to it. I love that the hall and music brings people together, lets them share in the happiness we get to experience every day."

The hall brought joy to Jaffe long before he played in the band. Though like he said he spent hours listening to veteran musicians. One of his favorites will be at the concert if her

health holds up. Sadie Peterson Goodson played piano with Preservation Hall Jazz Band from the 1960s to 1990s. The 101-year-old musician now resides in Detroit.

"I remember Sadie being one of the great piano players in New Orleans," said Jaffe. "She's a small person but you can't imagine the sound she can get out of a piano."

Son Nathaniel Peterson has a few memories of his own.

"My mother, Aunt Willie, Ida, all the sisters played music when I was a boy in New Orleans," said Peterson, age 81. Sadie played on the paddle boats. There was always music in the house. My father played sax which I later took up. There was always music in the house.

"The special part about the music is it's the beginning of jazz. New Orleans jazz - Louie Armstrong played it. Anywhere you walk around, Rampart Street, they've got music. There's music on the streets. It started after slavery, not in Chicago but New Orleans and then the music moved north."

I took mom back four years ago to New Orleans. She played a few nights there (Preservation Hall). She tore the house down

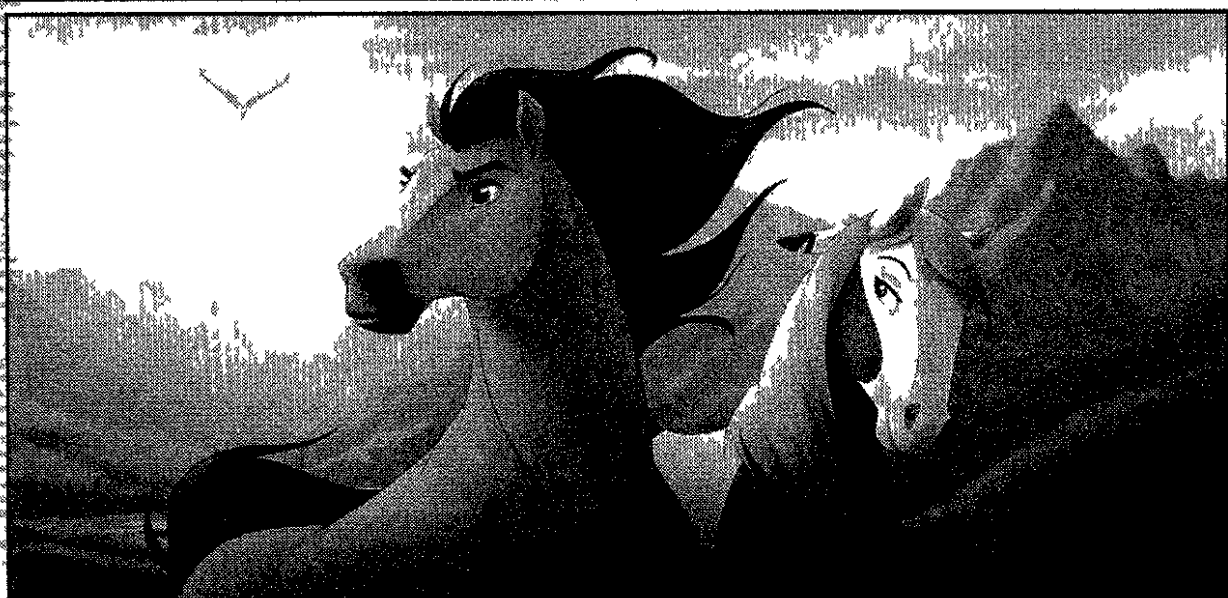

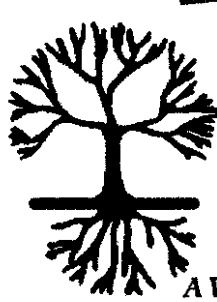

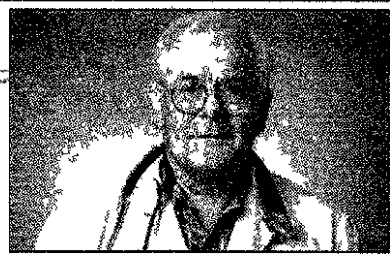

### Be an informed consumer to avoid repairs

A day doesn't go by without me getting two to six voice mail messages about hot water tanks and defective dip tubes. These people haven't heard about the problem nor do they know that the whole thing was settled in court. Manufacturers are no longer paying for repairs.

An estimated 18 million homeowners did not replace their dip tubes when they should have — by the end of the year 2000.

I've learned that many of these folks purchased a new washer or dishwasher during the past few years. If they cleaned the screen on the water valve they wouldn't have had to replace their appliance. I tell them the defective dip tube sends out little white flakes that plug up everything hot water flows through. These conversations prove over and over that an uneducated consumer is a confused one.

**Most people aren't, which helps explain why 18 million consumers didn't get the dip tube repaired on their hot water tank repaired for free.**

I'm now going to tell you a little story to explain the importance of being an informed consumer. The story concerns General Electric or Hotpoint washing machines from the 1960s through 1980s. If I should happen to come down with cancer in my coming years and

a doctor can prove that it was caused by asbestos, I am going to file suit against the General Electric Company.

For many years I repaired the clutch assembly on these washers which had several brake shoes made of asbestos. Every time I did this I would blow out the fine dust that accumulated during the years of wear. I used compressed air like all appliance shops do in the repair business. The dust I was breathing was pure asbestos, the same stuff that was introduced into millions of laundry rooms across America for 25 years.

In the past 10 years General Electric hasn't used a clutch assembly like I describe, and in the 1980s, they changed the material on the brake shoes. They had to because asbestos was proven dangerous, but do you think anything was ever publicized about the subject? I don't think so. Folks and what you are reading here today is very similar to the way the defective dip tube story in hot water tanks was revealed to the American public. The story was published in this paper before it appeared on national TV across the country. Be an informed consumer. Most people aren't, which helps explain why 18 million consumers didn't get the dip tube repaired on their hot water tank repaired for free. Stay tuned.

# Weak skills make strong lessons for life

I don't consider myself a strong skier. I enjoy the green hills and manage some of the blue hills, but forget a black diamond or the moguls.

My 6- and 8-year-old are already way beyond my skill level, and my toddler is waiting in the wings. But I no longer think I'm a terrible skier nor do I steer the kids toward a different activity when skiing is an option.

I've conquered my lack of confidence on the ski hill because I've come to the realization that it's acceptable to make mistakes - occasionally fall down when I go beyond what my mind believes are limitations - in front of my children.

My children care about being together on the hills (even if it means I only see them at the bottom of the hill where the blue and the green marked hills cross paths), whether it's with Mom or Dad. Each time they traverse a hill they know we are sharing in their victories, no matter how big or small.

Our chats on the chair lift are memorable whether we talk about what we can do better on the hill or share everyday experiences.

I love to play tennis. Each time I'm on the court, I'm learning something new. I gain more confidence. It's a sport my husband and I enjoy playing together. My two older children are just starting to like the sport.

When one of them has an "off" day on the court, he might not jump at the chance to go to the next week's lesson. But I encourage him to get out there and try again.

When we're not good at something, we lack confidence and self-esteem. We shy away from it, and gravitate to our comfort zones. When we do that, we miss out on a slice of life we may never get the chance to experience to the fullest extent.

The key is to try something more than once. If the first experience left an unfavorable impression, try it again. Maybe the surrounding circumstances

contributed to the lack of success. We might retreat when a mentor or peer infers we need more work on something.

Perhaps we blame our lack of interest on age -- the older we get, the more often we gravitate to what we're good at and refrain from what we're not.

Teacher falls under a parent's job description.

My children and I talk about how there is nothing wrong with making a mistake because you just get right back up and keep trying.

I'm not concerned about how well they think I can ski. I think it's good for everyone in my family to see each other learn new skills.

Some of my family may be better at one thing, while the rest of us are good at another. I'm more interested in helping my children learn something they have a passion for as an early age. The

last thing I want to do is hold them back because I'm not good at something and don't want them to see me make a mistake.

There is no such thing as being embarrassed on the ski hill or elsewhere.

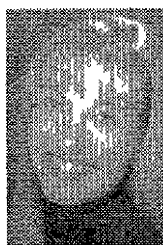

Most of my family isn't quite so adventurous about water skiing yet - maybe that's something my husband will teach us to try again this summer!

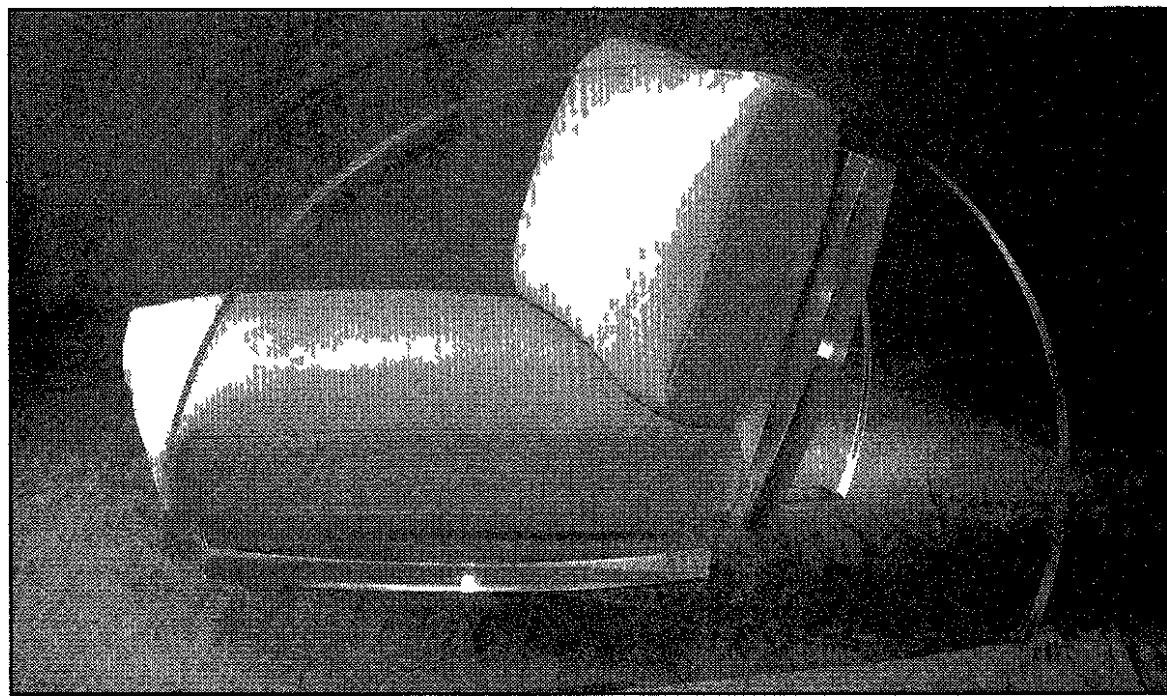

# Remote control switch for lamp is a bright idea

We have a decorator lamp in our TV room. It is colorful and rests atop a tall floor speaker in a corner between the entertainment center and the wall. The lamp is unusual and, therefore, a conversation piece. That's the good part. Turning it on and off is the bad. The lamp switch is on the cord instead of on the lamp itself. Getting to the switch is awkward because we drape the cord over the back of the speaker to keep it concealed. And, the area surrounding the lamp is congested — television cabinet, speaker and lamp all crammed in a corner. That's why getting to the switch is a big pain. We've found a solution to our problem, one we think you will find interesting. Recently, a company that makes unusual electrical products contacted us about their wares. This company makes,

among other things, motion-activated light switches. We checked out their products. There were switches galore. As we were rummaging through them, we noticed a box that looked like a wall receptacle. It was packaged in a plastic container side by side with a device that looked like a garage-door opener — gray with a white button. We realized it was another form of an electronic switch. However, it wasn't motion-activated. It was button-activated — remote button-activated. Wow! What a discovery — an adaptor for a wall plug that could be switched on and off remotely. A few hours later, the two-piece contraption was in our house and plugged into the receptacle where our showpiece lamp with the inconvenient switch control was connected. All we had to do was plug the adaptor into the receptacle and the lamp cord into the adaptor.

The switch on the lamp cord was turned to the on position, and from that point the remote control did all the work. It was nice to have a remote control for lights and other small appliances. Come December, it was time to put up a tree. Only that year we had help from a device we previously didn't know existed. It was a kick to arrange the lights on

the tree, plug them into our adaptor and flick the tree lights off and on with a remote control. By the time Christmas rolled around, we were intimately familiar with their other products. We had learned that they also offer a similar unit that was developed for use outdoors. Want to turn your decorative house lights on and off at the flick of a switch — without opening the front door? And that's not all. Did you ever wish that a certain light fixture in your home could be controlled from more than one location? You know, like from a three-way switching system? It's possible, and without any wiring. You now can purchase devices that look exactly like wall switches. They can remotely control lamps, ceiling lights, wall lights — practically any kind of electric fixture — and from up to 10 locations. Not that one would likely want to con-

trol a light fixture from that many places, but it's possible — and without wiring. Remote-control switching uses radio-wave technology to turn household power to a specific appliance on or off. We couldn't believe it when we discovered how inexpensive these units were — a mere \$12. ever starts. Strangers will be in your home for an extended period, your family and social life will be disrupted, a general lack of privacy may grate on nerves, services may be severed — television, plumbing, utilities, etc., there will be dust, lots of dust. Turner advises homeowners to host a pre-construction conference with workers, including subcontractors, to establish verbally and in writing what he calls the "rules of order." Discussion items include your expectations for daily cleanup, work start and stop times, rooms the family can use, work schedule changes to accommodate in-home social functions, how to control dust, no smoking, work schedules and who has access to the house and when.

This last point, security, should be of significant concern to homeowners. Turner says contractors should conduct criminal background checks on workers and subcontractors. One home entry key should be kept in a lock box with access limited to key staff. Valuables, jewelry and guns should be removed from the home. Then there is ongoing communication. In most two-wage-earner homes, no one is around during the day to answer inevitable questions. Turner suggests a dry erase board or cell phone — even a custom e-mail address per job — to create daily give-and-take between homeowner and contractors. Convene a sit-down with the contractor once a month. Don't talk about work in progress but how the family — children, too — is holding up under the strain. This usually causes a big sigh of relief, says Turner. It keeps everyone up to speed on what's going on. It's an eye-opener.

## Use good manners at bed and breakfasts

One of the most exciting aspects of traveling is where you will be staying

Whether you are going to another state or visiting a foreign country, taking a cruise or spending a week at a dude ranch, planning a weekend trip or simply relaxing at an overnight retreat, part of the fun is where you will be lodging. Who hasn't walked into "their room" and checked out the closed space, bathroom facilities and what channels you can get on the television set?

With hotels vying for our patronage, they have made all types of services available to their guests — from new exercise equipment to shuttle buses from and to the airport.

Lobbies and guest rooms have been redecorated and dining rooms have added low-cal meals and elegant cuisine by top chefs.

Despite all this, one of the fastest growing "cottage industries" in recent years has been the emergence of the bed and breakfast business. Throughout the country, old homes, some of them dating back to Victorian times, have been lovingly restored and converted into multiple bedroom dwellings. Perhaps that is the reason they are so compelling, with their three or four stories, their gingerbread trimmings, their verandahs — all reminders of days gone by. It draws out that nostalgia in us and brings back warm thoughts of yesteryear.

Before the Holiday Inns and Hilton Hotels, people simply stayed at coach stops in small inns or other people's homes. In Biblical times, visitors to the city were welcomed into homes and greeted with food and hospitality even though they were strangers.

In colonial America, slow traveling by horseback or carrier required overnight stays if it was a long journey. Lodging, even at inns, was at the loss of privacy and sanitation. It was not unusual for you to wake up in the morning and find someone else in bed with you because there was no room for them elsewhere.

Fortunately, times have changed considerably and bed-and-breakfasts today are charming and inviting and increasing in popularity. If one is being considered as part of your travels, however, there are certain items that should be remembered.

■ It is usually an older house where bedrooms may be close together, so you will want to keep noise and loud late-night talking to a minimum.

■ Accommodations sometimes include shared bathrooms so you may want to check this out when you make your reservations.

■ Greet the owners by introducing yourself and with a handshake. Their greeting to you will be warmer and friendlier than at a hotel or motel.

■ Remember you are staying in someone's home so abide by their rules of breakfast hours, smoking policies, eating in rooms, etc.

■ When you are staying at a friend's home as a houseguest, it is courteous to make up your own bed if no maid is present. However, at a bed-and-breakfast this is not necessary as this service is included in the cost of your room.

■ If you are traveling with children or pets, check beforehand if there are proper accommodations for them. Some do not allow young children for lack of necessary equipment. Some places will not allow pets while others allow dogs but not cats. It would be wise to clarify these items before making reservations.

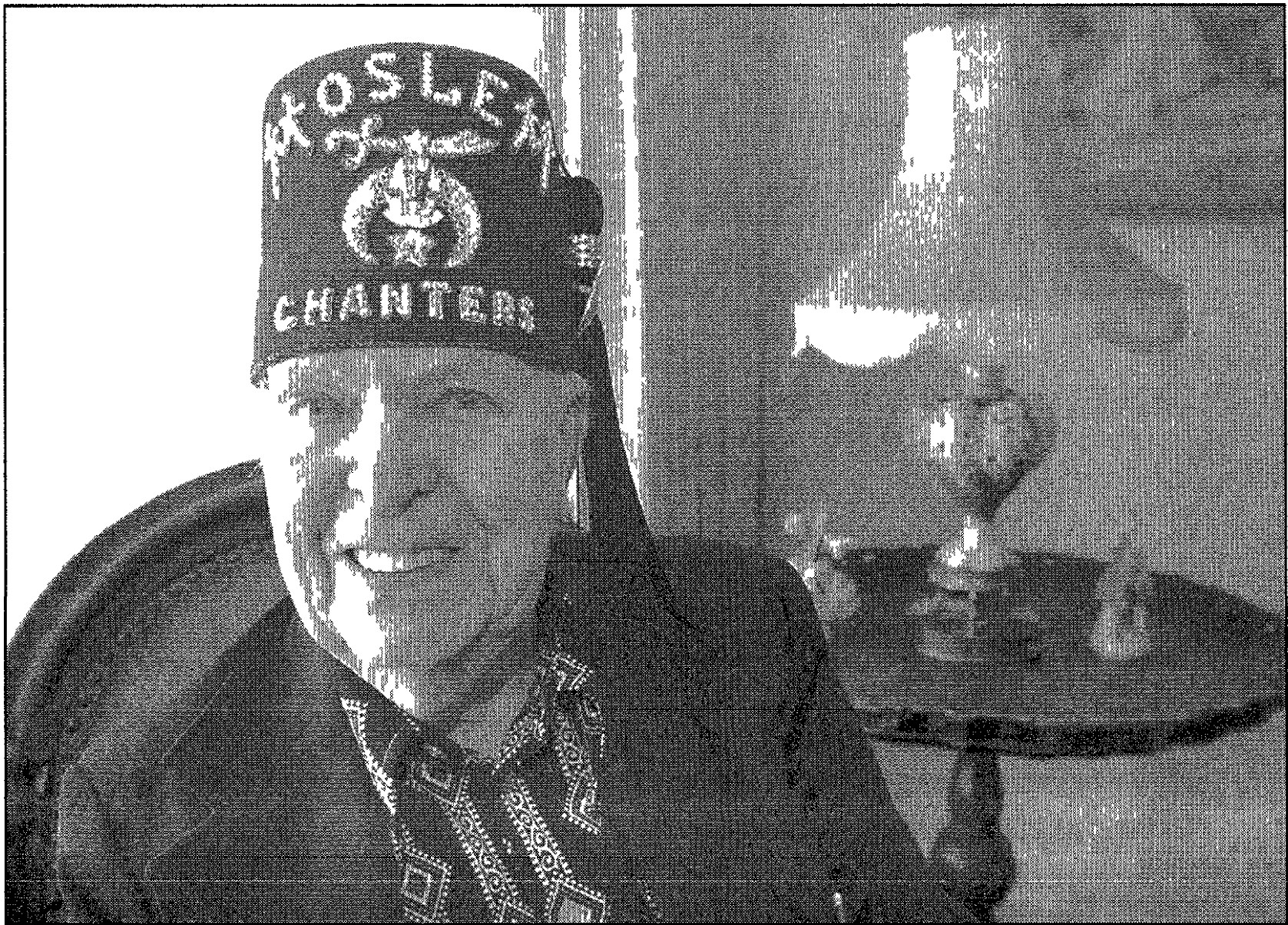
■ Laundry facilities may or may not be available. Do not assume it would be permissible to use them without inquiring first.

■ You will most likely be invited to feel free to use the television set, usually located in the large living room or parlor. If other guests also wish to view it, be courteous and reasonable in your decision as to which programs to watch.

## Redford man marks 50 years with the Shrine Circus

Herb Martin doesn't believe in quitting — ever.

At 92 years old, he has been a member of the Moslem Shrine Chanters in Detroit for 53 years. And the only way Martin said he'd stop singing at the many Shriner engagements throughout the year is when he dies.

"That's something that I never do is quit from places that I belong," said Martin, a Mason for 65 years.

For more than half a century, the 23-year Redford resident has sung the National Anthem and other chanter favorites, like the popular 1920s tune *The Band Played On*, every year when the Shrine Circus comes to town.

This year is no different. The T&C Federal Credit Union Shrine Circus Xtreme, the largest in North America, celebrates 94 years of family circuses in the Detroit area and offers five rings of

acts, a carnival with a petting zoo, elephant and pony rides, games and a runaway.

Along with singing for the Shriners, Martin also had the responsibility of overseeing ushers on the west side of the stadium, as well as selling candy, a job he stopped doing, he said, pausing a moment and laughing when the price of candy went up from five cents.

Most of all, Martin is proud to be part of an organization that helps children. Shriners Hospitals for Children is a network of 18 orthopedic hospitals, three burn hospitals and one hospital that provides orthopedic, burn and spinal cord injury care where children up to their 18th birthday receive free medical care.

"That's what it's all about," he said. "It's rewarding. It makes you feel real good inside."

Several times, Martin said, the Shriners also performed for nursing

home residents and shut-ins.

Being in the spotlight comes naturally for a man who decades ago played community theater, spitting out one-liners in the George Burns Gracie Allen style, according to Moslem Shrine Chanters director Harold Lanning, who talks about Martin with a solid tinge of admiration in his voice.

Lanning said in the 10 years he has directed the singing group he has appreciated Martin's kind nature.

"He's very active, very energetic and always in a good mood," explained Lanning. "He's a great-hearted person and sings well, especially for someone his age."

Last weekend, Martin prepared for a busy engagement performing in Traverse City at a Shriner convention. Every year Shriner programs, like the one in Traverse City, take him to cities around the country.

Martin's mind is quick and his

thoughts are focused on the future. The summer months on his calendar are already marked with a dozen or so parades around the state, where the chanters are invited to bellow out their songs from a bus.

"A lot of people sing right along with us," said Martin, with the enthusiasm and vigor of someone half his age.

Martin has seen a lot of changes over the years as a Shriner and as a retired 44-year employee of the City of Detroit. Martin checked gas records for police and fire departments. He also worked with the City of Detroit auxiliary police for 25 years.

"When you sign up with people you stick around," he said. "That's what you're supposed to do, isn't it?"

These days, when he's not volunteering his time with the Shriners, Martin likes to golf and shoot pool at the Red-

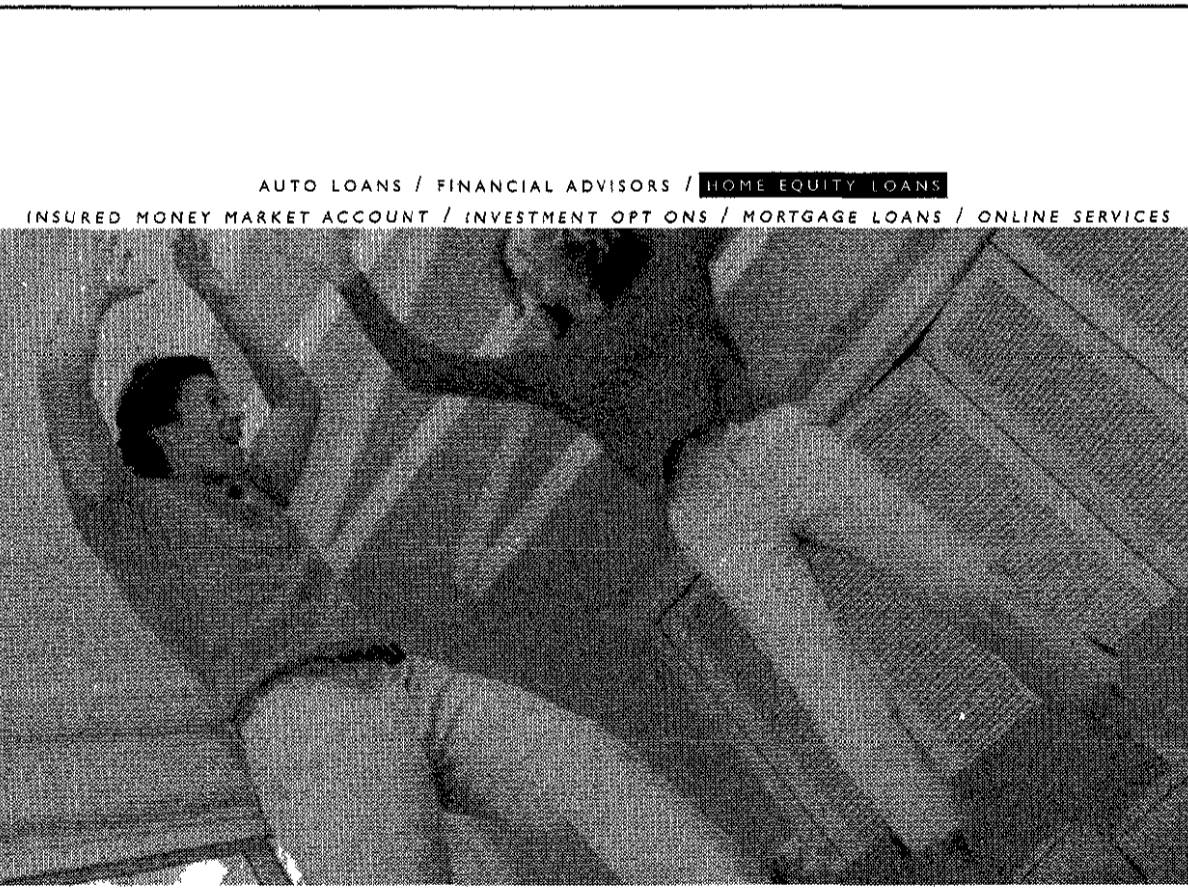

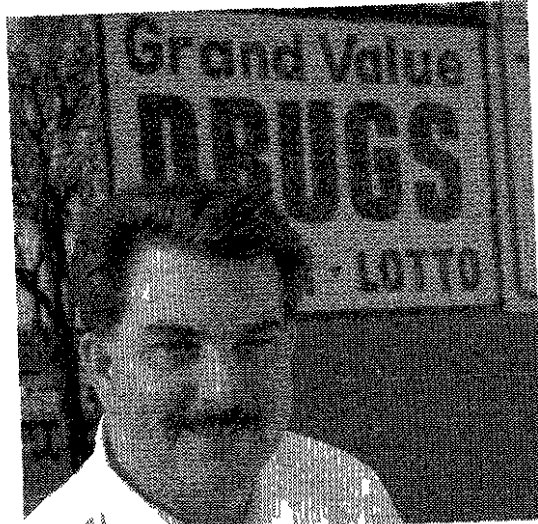

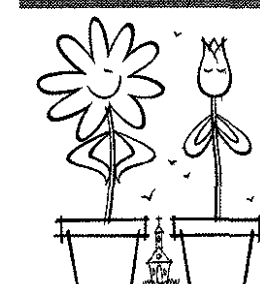

# Role of religion in health care

When I first began this series of articles over a year ago I wrote first about the role of faith as a factor to help bring one to healing and wholeness. I wanted to revisit that topic just recently to share some of what is going on there.

Two important arenas where healthcare professionals and religious professionals work together are in general wellness and in medical care. In many hospitals across the country there are Spiritual or Pastoral Care Departments, they may be called Chaplaincy offices. Chaplains can be of several faiths but are very often Jewish, Muslim, or Christian, either Protestant, Catholic, or both. Most Chaplains are certified by any one of a number of a professional bodies which have national standards to accredit chaplains.

The chaplain works with both patients and staff to not only understand the physical and emotional pain present in with each patient but to offer spiritual support through visits, prayer, the offering of religious resources and religious services. The chaplain is often a crisis counselor with patients, their families, and staff. National standards of medical care in medical settings require the availability of spiritual or pastoral support. General wellness, or raising awareness of lifestyles, patterns of living and habits which may inhibit good health and its maintenance also include the integration of one's spiritual or religious perspective as contributing to

a healthy body, mind and soul. Another area where the integration of healthcare and wellness is seen is in the network of Parish Nurses present not only in many local congregations but in hospitals as well.

Parish nurses do a variety of important tasks, they conduct education and training on various health issues, they assist the pastoral staff in the visiting of members of the congregation with health related issues, either physical or spiritual, and offer particular interventions where one's spiritual needs are integrated with emotional and physical needs. The parish nurse is a trained medical professional with advanced training in religious and spiritual study. Healing services take on a new dimension in congregations with the input of a parish nurse. Health education for family members of all ages becomes part of congregational outreach to families with parish nurses on the staff.

In congregations where there is a mental health professional on the staff, such as the congregations in the Southeastern Michigan area where the Samaritan Counseling Center has an office, parish nurses and our pastoral psychotherapists, trained mental health professionals, work together on the specific issues around mental and spiritual needs of a congregation and its members. One area that is important to recognize and integrated both medical and psychological interventions around would be the kind of stress that a physical illness or a sudden death might bring to a family. A person with a serious medical problem often has a coexisting depression, which a medical and mental health professional together can recognize.

The final area to look at already suggested in the preceding paragraph, is the pastoral psychotherapist, that mental health professional who is not only trained in psychotherapy and counseling but also has done religious study as well. The advantage of such a professional is that this person is sensitized to the importance of faith, spirituality and belief systems in the overall mental health and stability of an individual, couple or family. As a lay or professional member of a congregation him/herself the pastoral psychotherapist brings to the counseling situation not only a professional understanding of the place of faith or spirituality in a person's life but also a personal experience which brings understanding of why faith is important.

Samaritan Counseling Center of Southeastern Michigan is accredited by the Samaritan Institute of Denver, Colorado. Samaritan is the only accredited Service Center and Approved Training Program in Michigan of the American Association of Pastoral Counselors. By holding these accreditations the public can be assured, as with chaplains and parish nurses of competent care held to the highest standards.

When concerns of health arise it is important to acknowledge what your own particular spiritual or religious perspective is and understand how is a resource for you on your journey for health, healing or relief of pain.

# 'Group' pregnancy born in nurse's program

Pregnant women's tongues often move much faster than their swollen feet. There are complaints about too-tight clothes and the too-hard kicks coming from the inside, and there are dozens of questions — always asked aloud — about nutrition, behavior and medical issues both before and after their babies are born.

But who really wants to listen? Other mothers-to-be, of course.

This is how group pregnancy, known as The Centering Pregnancy Program at the Staywell Clinic in Waterbury, Conn., was born.

Run by Sharon Rising, a Yale University School of Nursing graduate and former faculty member, the program takes women out of the clinical environment, aiming to give them more control over their pregnancies.

"More than answering questions, I thought that this would really help empower women," she says. "And I think that the group setting is key to achieving that goal."

Rising was a certified nurse midwife at the Staywell Clinic in the early 1990s when she realized she was answering the same questions again and again. She had an idea. What if she brought together a

group of mothers at the same points in their pregnancies so they could all discuss their concerns together? Along the way they could get to know each other, feel less isolated, and create a sense of camaraderie and community.

So far, 23 clinics in the United States and Canada have adopted Rising's Centering Pregnancy model. The expecting mothers meet monthly during the first four months and then biweekly for the remainder of their pregnancies.

The idea tempted Sabrena Wilson away from the routine doctor-office visits she'd gone through a decade ago, when she had her sons.

There were some things about giving birth that she'd never forget but Wilson says she was sure some of the "rules" might have changed since she was last in the game. She needed someone to teach her.

Wilson signed up for a new program at the Staywell Clinic, where she met new people and heard new ideas.

Rising makes an effort to mix the races and ethnic backgrounds of the women in the program, so they can learn from each other's cultures and traditions. She found that while Latinas sometimes had different ideas from Asians about when to take a baby out of the house for the first time, for instance, they all still had the same basic concerns when it came to newborn

The women are grouped together at the same stage in their pregnancies, which doesn't mean they are at the same stages in their lives. As a 33-year-old mother, Wilson was one of the older women in her group. The youngest was 14.

"I think having the older women there really helped the younger girls," Wilson says. "I think we helped the new moms feel less tense. They have someone to dispel all the wives tales they're hearing."

But even the veteran moms took something away from the classes.

Wilson, whose sons are 12 and 10, says that the last time she had babies at home, doctors thought it was OK to put babies to sleep on their stomachs. When she went into the group sessions, she learned that's no longer the standard advice. (Babies are supposed to sleep solely on their backs in an effort to prevent sudden infant death syndrome, according to the Consumer Product Safety Commission.)

Wilson also was surprised to learn about the emphasis on prenatal nutrition — something she had overlooked in the past.

"With my other two I thought that you just ate more when you were pregnant and that would be enough," Wilson says. "But in the classes I learned that different foods give you the different minerals you need more when you are pregnant."

The best part of the program was the stress relief that the other women offer, Wilson says. "It's good to listen to other people who are having the same problems as you and say to yourself, 'Wow. This is normal.'"

Another difference between the Centering Pregnancy model and more typical prenatal doctor visits is that the women are in charge of their charts. When they come into the meetings they fill in their weight and fetal growth charts, and take their own blood pressures. They also are in charge of keeping track of all their tests results.

Rising thinks the responsibilities give women a sense of accomplishment. She believes in the power of the group and that women can help each other when they have questions along the way.

Most of the women involved in the Centering program have normal pregnancies, but if medical complications arise, they are referred to specialists.

And when the classes are over, naturally, there is a reunion where the new moms coo over the babies and share their widely varying tales of labor. Even though they are all armed with the same information, some opt for birthing centers, others for the hospital.



"That's a lot of points," Reed said. He sacrificed himself for the team. Agim really showed some leadership. He doesn't normally run the 400 in the big meets."

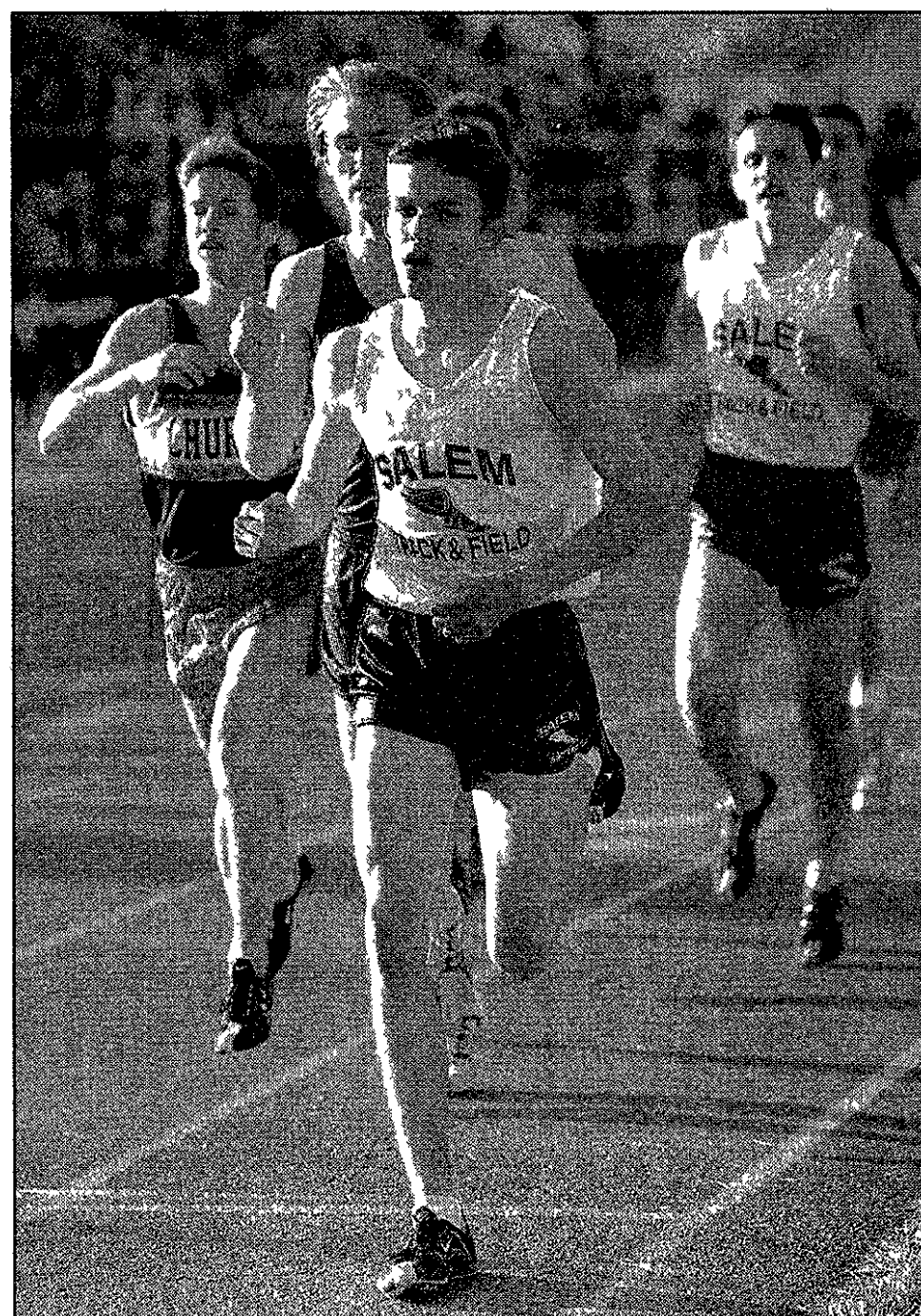

## Salem can't quite catch Central

## TRACK

No one figured it would be easy. Running the conference track meet three days after the state regional meet is asking a lot. Peak performances are going to be short in supply.

Which is what made the Western Lakes Activities Association Girls Track Finals, held Tuesday at Farmington HS, more of a survival test than a clash between top teams in exceptional competitive shape.

And when it all worked its way out, the team that had been the best during the dual-meet season — Walled Lake Central — was the fittest of the survivors, finishing first with 121 points. Plymouth Salem was a distant second with 104, followed by Livonia Churchill in third with 83.5. See statistical summary.

"We knew it would be tough," said Churchill coach Kelly Graham. "We

tried to do what we could. We put a lot of pressure on our distance runners, and they did all that they could."

"Walled Lake Central has too much depth. They scored 21 points in the pole vault alone."

Just three days earlier at the Dearborn regional meet, the Chargers had been exceptional, finishing first with 112.25 points. They had state qualifiers in the 800-meter run, the 1,600 and the 3,200, as well as two relay teams.

However, matching a performance like that in so short a span of time proved too much to ask. Churchill had beaten Salem by nearly 20 points at the regional, at the WLAA finals, it was the Rocks who finished on top by more than 20 points.

"We did a great job today," said

Salem coach Mark Gregor. "We had us seeded to score 101 points and we scored 104."

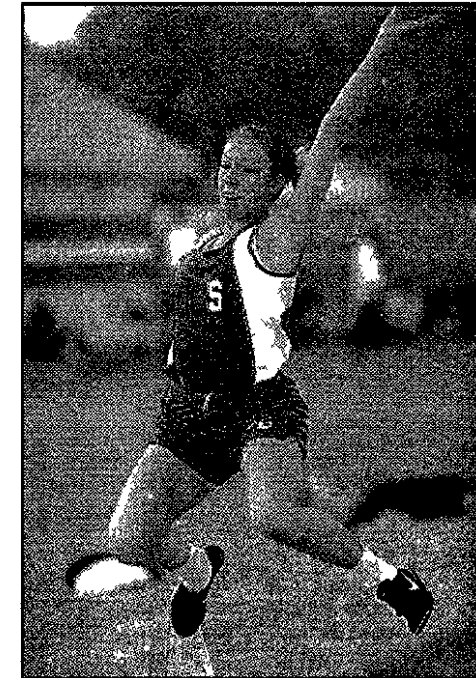
"We didn't score enough points in the field events, and we didn't score any in the pole vault."

Which was the difference in the final standings. If the Rocks match, or offset, the Vikings' 21 points in the pole vault, they finish first.

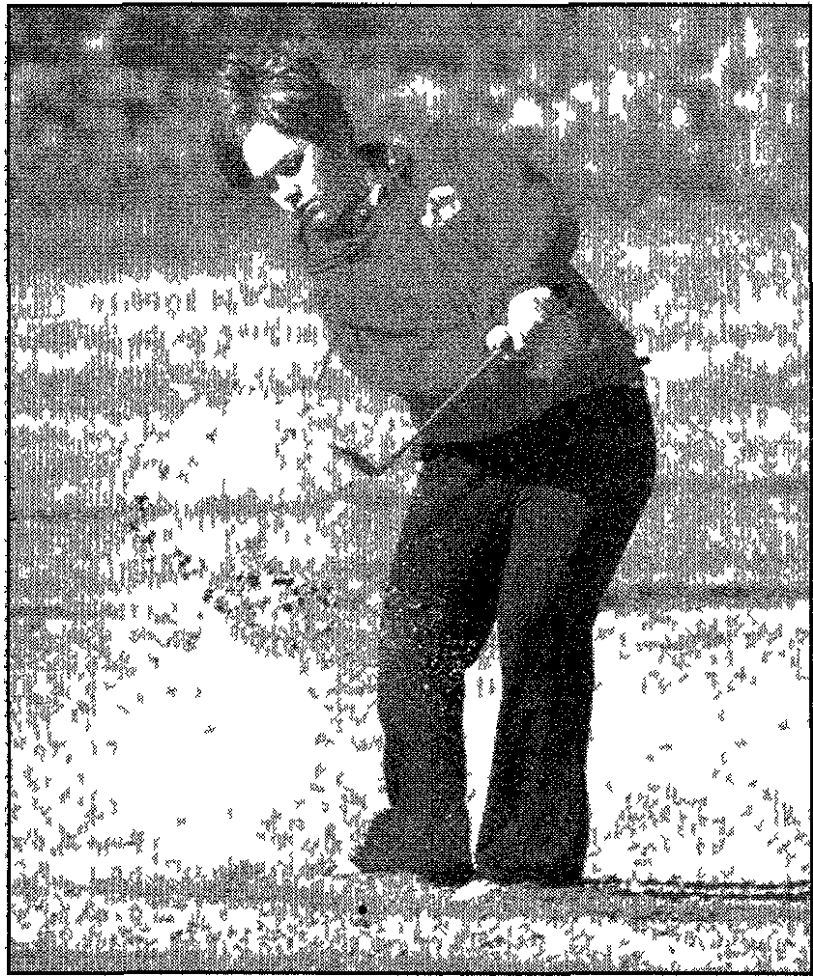
The loss dropped the Mustangs to 12-15 overall, 5-5 in the WLAA Western Division.

Harrison also won the title in the final year of WLAA competition by the three Farmington schools, which will move to the Oakland Activities Association beginning next fall.

"This is an incredible league and we were happy to be in it," Reed said. "We wanted to make a solid statement that we're really proud to run in this meet."

"We're going to miss all the teams in the league, because it's a real competitive meet and always a lot of fun."

In addition to Mayberry, Stevenson's Hady Rahman (shot put and discus) and Plymouth Salem's Justin Hajduk (1,600 and 3,200 runs) were double winners. Canton had two winners in Dane Kobus (110 hurdles) and Brad Waidmann (high jump). Churchill's Howard Whitefoot won the pole vault, Walled Lake Central's Brian Chrzanowski the 300 hurdles, Western's Kyle Gordon the long jump and Northville's Tim Dalton the 800 run.

## Qualifiers

Salem's Justin Hajduk was a state-meet qualifier in both the 1,600-meters and 3,200-meters at Saturday's Division I regional hosted by Dearborn HS.

Hajduk won the 3,200 in 9:44.6 and was second to Redford Catholic Central's Ryan Lowry in the 1,600. Hajduk's

time in the 1,600 was 4:33.7.

Canton also had a couple of qualifiers. Brad Waidmann finished first in the high jump (6-2) and in the 100 dash, Corey Waiser — hobbled at the conference meet by a strained hamstring — equaled the school record, finishing fifth in 10.9. The Canton record was set by Elijah Rogers in 1984. Waiser's time earned him a state-qualifying berth.

Several others just missed qualifying (top two are automatic picks, others must meet standards). In the high jump, Canton's Mike Lanus placed third (5-10 3/4), in the long jump, the Chiefs' Ken Page was third (20-8 3/4), and Canton's Dane Kobus, the 110 hurdles champ at the WLAA meet, placed fifth in the long jump (19-5 1/2) and sixth in the 110 hurdles (15.1) at regional. Salem's Chris Vraniak was fourth in the 1,600 (4:36.3) and Canton's Aaron Lanning was fourth in the 3,200 (9:55.2).

Other local athletes to place in the top six individually were Canton's Dan Driscoll and Jon Chapman, fifth and sixth respectively in the pole vault (both 11-3). Canton 4x100 relay was fourth (44.82) and Salem's was sixth (45.6), the Chiefs' 4x200 relay was fifth (1:36.1), and their 4x800 relay was sixth (9:03.7) while Salem's 4x800 was eighth (10:00.0).

**PROPOSED 2002 CITY MILLAGE RATES:** The property tax millage rate proposed to be levied to support the proposed budget will be a subject of this hearing. The following statements are provided concerning the 2002 proposed millage levies for the City of Plymouth:

- The 2002 tax rate for City operating millage is proposed to be 11.3941 mills, which is .0982 mills less than the 2001 operating tax rate. The City Commission has the authority under the City Charter to set the operating millage rate within the maximum allowed rate of 11.3941 mills, as adjusted by the Headlee millage rollback formula.
- The 2002 tax rate for debt service millage to fund debt service requirements for the 1997, 1998 and proposed 2002 General Obligation Street Bond issues is proposed to be 2.35 mills, an increase of 3800 mills from the 2001 tax rate.
- The 2002 tax rate for City solid waste and recycling millage is proposed to be 1.50 mills, a decrease of .0600 mills from the 2001 tax rate.
- The total City millage for all purposes is proposed to be 15.2441 mills for 2002, which is 2218 mills higher than the 2001 total City tax rate of 15.0223 mills.

**EQUALIZATION FACTORS:** Wayne County established a tentative 2002 equalization factors of 1.1330 for residential classes of property, 1.1183 for commercial classes of property and 1.0917 for industrial classes of property. Since the City has increased assessments for the residential, commercial, and industrial classes for 2002 by the proposed factors, all 2002 equalization factors will be set at 1.00

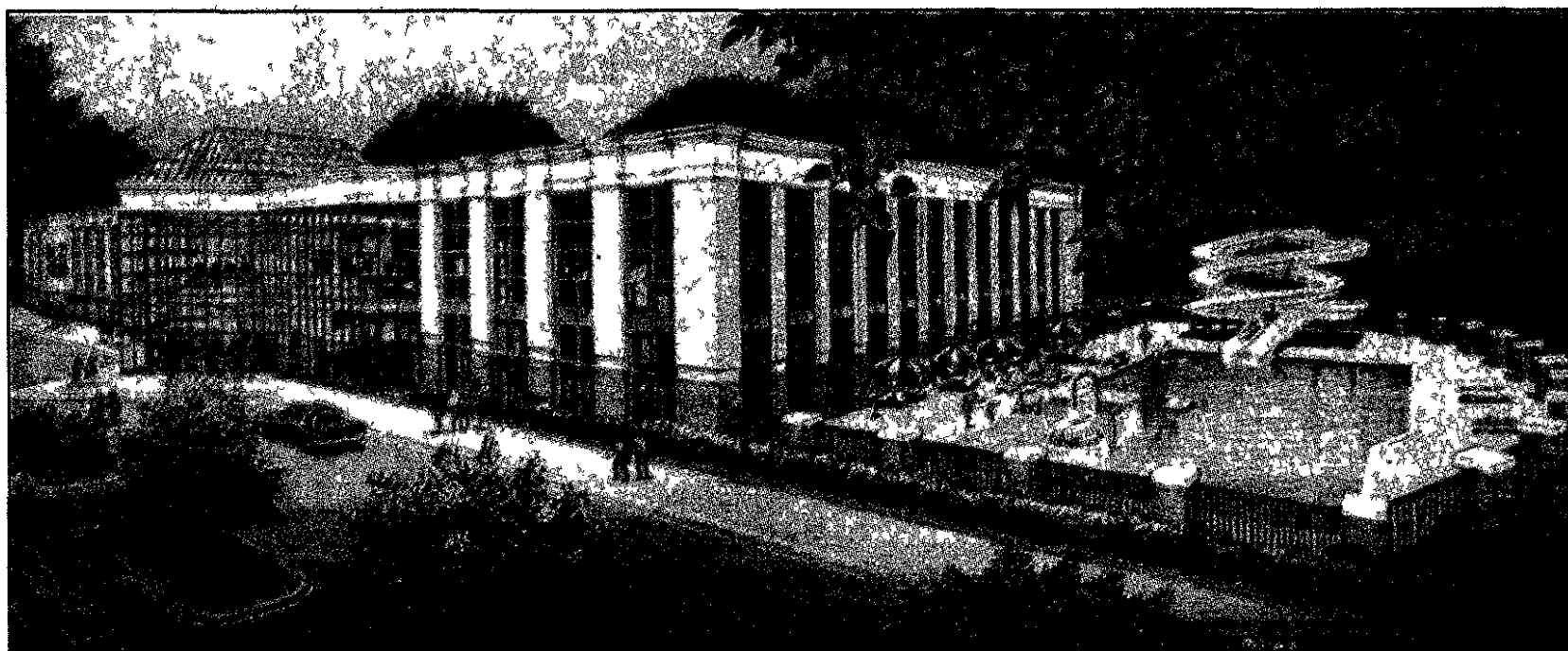

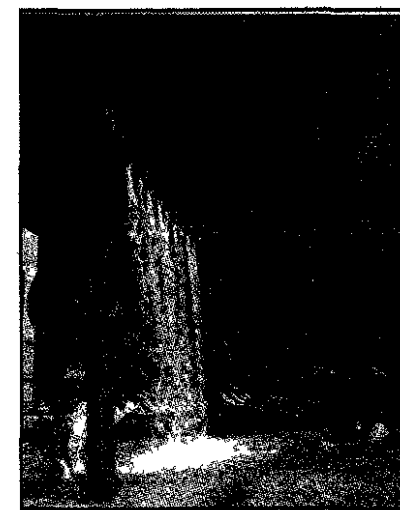

## Association must deal with mold woes early

I am a community association president and I'm wondering what you can tell me about avoiding mold lawsuits. I'm very concerned about this.

As well you should be. Molds are naturally occurring, airborne organisms which grow in indoor and outdoor environments.

Mold spores can enter a building through doorways, windows or HVAC systems. The most common trigger for indoor mold growth is moisture from water damage, leaks, flooding or excessive humidity.

Associations, as well as developers, are being sued for damages because of mold which could have serious health risks. Your association should set up a preventative maintenance program concentrating on preventing elevated moisture levels which could cause mold growth in common areas.

It is suggested that you set up a water leak hotline to ensure that your association is apprised of situations which would cause mold growth. You should also consult with your lawyer in terms of other preventative measures in order to avoid potential liability.

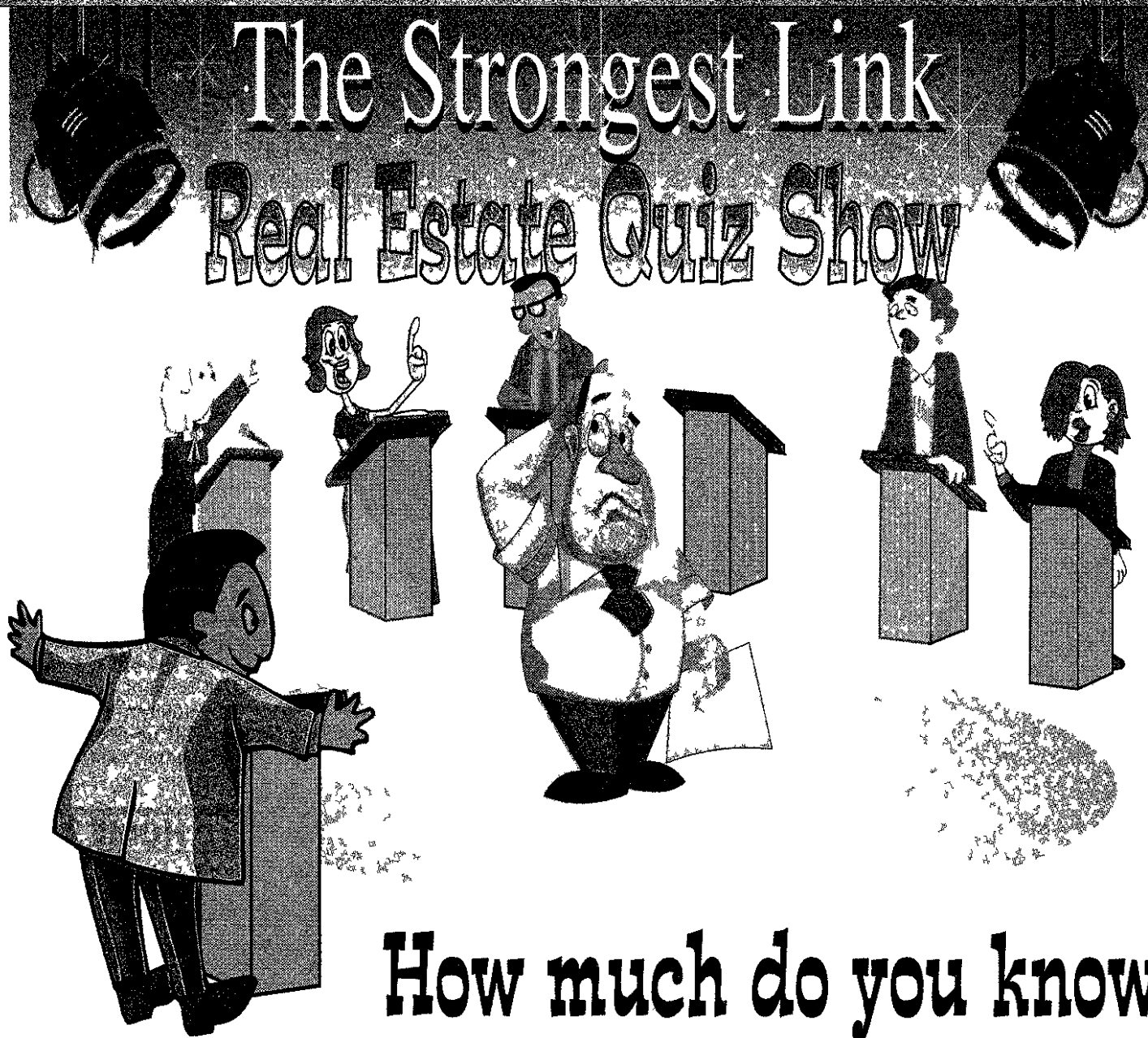

Learn from your mistakes. It will be a lot less painful here than in the field.

### Answers

- 1) C — Putting a home on the market isn't the time for extensive, expensive updating. You won't recoup your investment. A thorough cleaning inside and out, repainting, re-carpeting and maybe some inexpensive landscape improvements is the way to go.
- 2) False — Chances are newcomers will pay more by several hundred or even thousands of dollars. Assessment increases are limited to 5 percent or the rate of inflation, whichever is less, as long as you stay put. When a home sells, its assessment is recalibrated upward to selling price and the process starts anew. During times of skyrocketing sales prices and low inflation, newcomers get socked.
- 3) B — Not to exceed 1½ months

- 4) A — Real estate commissions paid aren't deductible for federal tax purposes.
- 5) True. But additional legal fees may be needed to compel a sale if a seller gets cold feet.
- 6) D — A property officially changes hands at closing when buyers and sellers and/or their agents get together and sign all the papers.
- 7) B — The state portion of the property transfer tax is three-quarters of one percent of selling price. That means the sale of a \$250,000 home would result in a tax of \$1,875, usually paid by the seller. An additional county property transfer tax of \$1.10 per \$1,000 of sales price is charged in Oakland and Wayne counties. So figure on paying another \$275 in "sales tax" there.

- 8) A — While buyers and sellers traditionally pay different fees and costs, everything in the process is open to negotiation. Keep in mind, though, that the goal is sealing the deal, which can get problematic if either party feels insulted during the process. Offers and counter-offers arise through exchanges of the purchase agreement.
- 9) B — An owner's equity or personal financial stake in a property is fair market value minus mortgage(s) owed.
- 10) C — Home warranty insurance, usually offered by a seller to cover repairs to major mechanical systems for the year after sale as an enticement for buyers, isn't required. Mortgage issuers insist on the others.

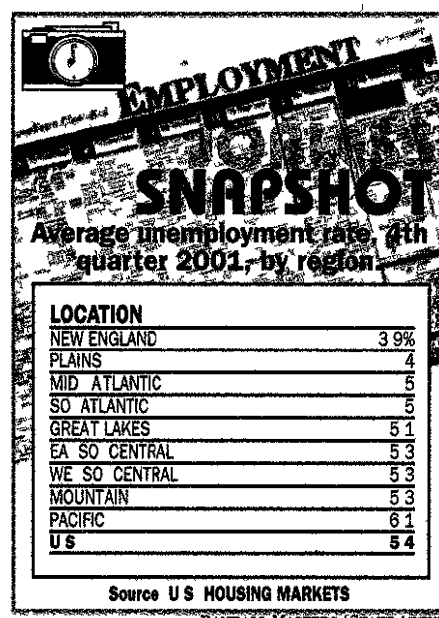

# Change in lodging type can impact lifestyle

(AP) — A small change on the real estate landscape often leads to bigger changes, affecting lifestyle, jobs, property values and tourism.

Here's one story that's unfolding now.

The Majestic Motel and Resort, once symbolic of the laid-back, no-frills style that made Panama City Beach (Fla.) a favorite of spring break visitors, is making way for progress.

The Majestic, known for its "cheapest rooms" advertising, bar, clutter and noise, is being torn down along with four other small, mom-and-pop motels in this Florida Panhandle resort city.

Others are slated to follow. Motels totaling 600 low-cost rooms currently are slated to be demolished and that number could push past 1,000 by year's end.

Plans call for replacing them with pricey condominiums that's long been a dream of city officials, who have been trying to undo their town's honky-tonk

image through ordinances limiting garish signs, adult businesses and tattoo parlors.

Thousands of affordable motel rooms still will be available for students, but spring break will change, too, say city and tourism officials.

"We'll see a change in the caliber of tourist," said City Manager Richard Jackson. "I don't think you'll have quite the beachy atmosphere. Some of these beach bars and nightclubs are on their way out."

That's sad news for Jayne Thomaston, who works at the Party Shack, a bar across the street from a pile of rubble where the Twin Palms Motel once stood.

She's worried the loss of low-cost motel rooms could shorten the tourist season by driving away spring break visitors. Instead of \$35 per night at the old motels, tourists can expect to shell out \$150 to \$200 a day for condo rental.

"It could all be dead season until June," Thomaston said.

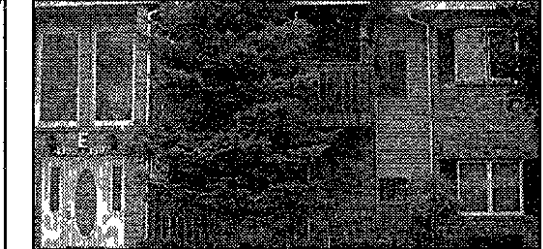
"And that's not exactly our clientele," adds co-worker Vernon Dwier, gesturing toward condos already lining the shore.

The small motels were doomed by everything from low interest rates to a general gentrification of the beach, but the biggest factor has been rising property values, say motel owners and tourism officials.

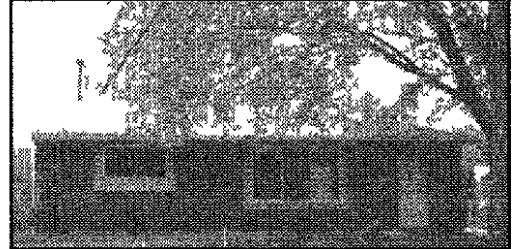
Panama City Beach has miles of waterfront real estate that are undeveloped or underdeveloped compared with other coastal areas, particularly the Panhandle west of here.

"There was no other place to go," said Jerry Wallace, one of the developers of Majestic Towers, which will replace the Majestic Motel with more than 550 condo units. "Destin is built out, Gulf Shores (Ala.) is built out."

"The beach ain't going to be the same no more," said Theresa Taylor who cleaned rooms at the Majestic Motel. "But it's progress."

How to avoid mosquitoes around your property

■ Empty standing water in old tires, urns, buckets, plastic covers, toys and any other containers

■ Change water in bird-baths, fountains, wading pools and potted plant trays at least once a week

■ Drain or fill temporary pools with dirt

■ Keep swimming pools treated and circulating and rain gutters unclogged

■ Use mosquito repellents when necessary and follow label directions and precau-

tions closely

■ Use head nets, long sleeves and long pants if you venture into areas with high mosquito populations

■ If there is a mosquito-borne disease warning in effect, stay inside during the evening when mosquitoes are most active

■ Ensure window and door screens are "bug-tight"

■ Replace outdoor lights with yellow bug lights
