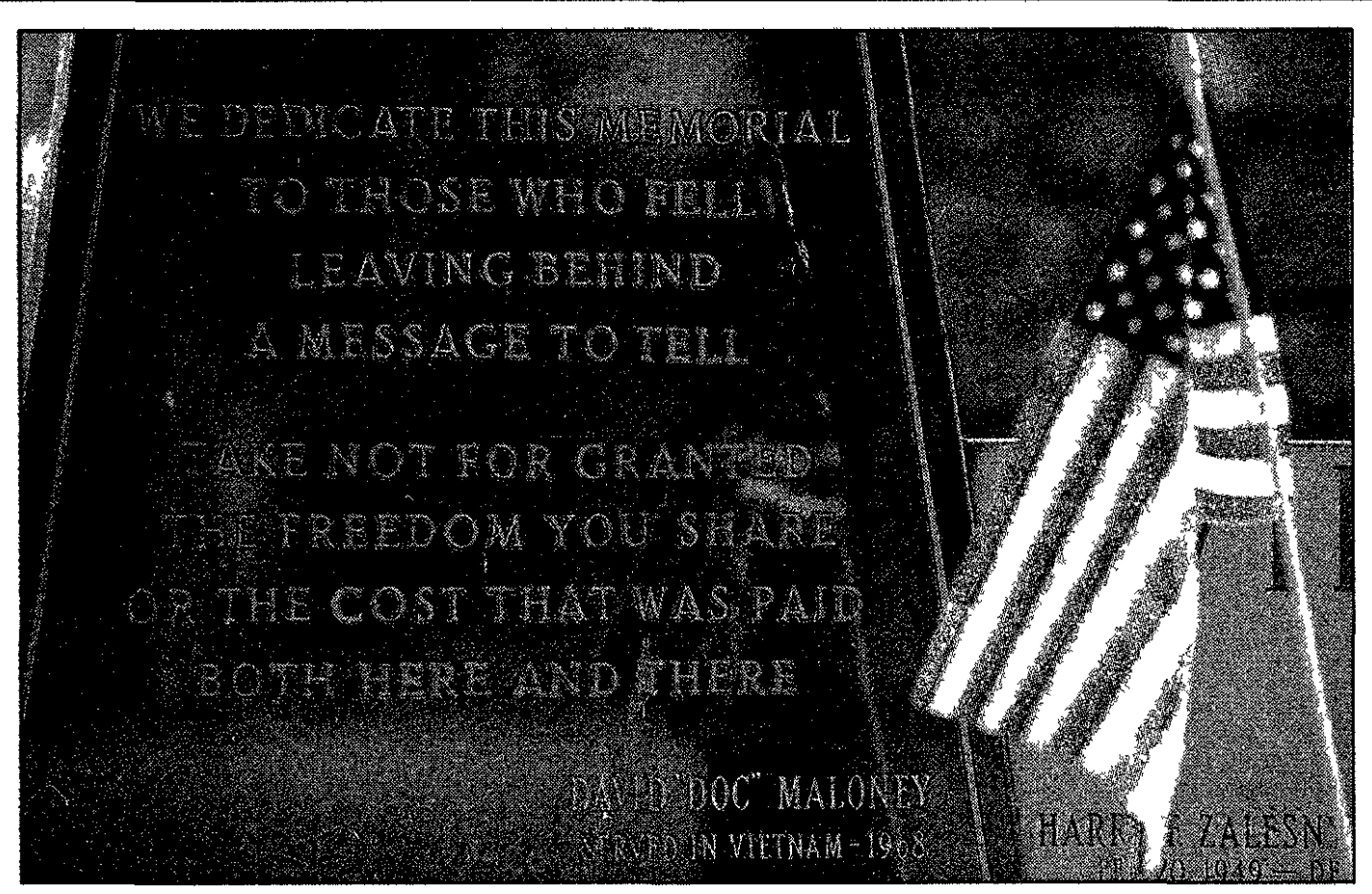

## Never forget Annual parade emotional reminder in wake of Sept. 11

Dennis Shrewsbury thinks he finally found the secret to having a great Memorial Day Parade. It starts with a warm, sunny day. Have the Vietnam Veterans Color Guard leading things off, and the Plymouth-Canton Marching Band as the closing attraction. Throw in the American Legion and the VFW doing the wreath ceremony, sprinkle in some Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts and, voila, you've got the perfect parade.

That's the recipe that provided an enjoyable parade Monday, as Plymouth joined the nation in honoring the sacrifices made by its military men and women and remembering

those who gave their lives for their country.

"I think this was the best parade," said Shrewsbury, a member of the Vietnam Veterans who was organizing his fifth parade. "I thought it was a real nice parade."

Yvonne Greenberg of Plymouth Township thought so, too. Blinking back tears after watching the wreath ceremony, Greenberg admitted she gets "very sentimental" on Memorial Day.

"I think these young men and women gave up their lives for us to be free," she said. "I try to come (to the parade) every year. If I don't make the ceremony, I come by the monuments alone and say a prayer."

The parade featured the usual participants, including another sterling

## DDA ready to whittle down list of director choices

The Plymouth Downtown Development Authority has received more than 100 applications for its vacant director's position, which has been open since Melanie Purcell left March 17 to become budget director for the city of Flint.

"The job has attracted attention from all over the country," said Tim McKercher, DDA board chairman, who

believes the new director will be stepping into a good situation. "There's already a pretty good foundation to build on, and still a lot of development remaining downtown, especially with the new Mayflower Centre and Wilcox condominiums."

While Purcell spent much of her time marketing downtown, McKercher believes the next DDA director will need a background in public administration.

"The person we choose will be deal-

ing with a lot of small business owners, and while we still want to focus on marketing, there are other issues like infrastructure and parking to deal with," said McKercher. "Parking will be a big issue the next couple of years. We're going to repair the parking deck, but we have to determine where we go from there, especially with more people living downtown."

The city administration will also be involved in selecting the new DDA director. In March it was determined

the new DDA director will be an at-will employee of the city, under the management of the city manager, but directed by the DDA board of directors.

At first, McKercher and DDA board member Jon Gary objected to making the new director an employee of the city, instead of fully responsible to the DDA. The issue became so divisive that both resigned. However, after meeting with Mayor Bill Graham and receiving assurances the city wasn't

## Union pickets township in effort to get contract

Frustrated by what they perceive as a lack of good-faith bargaining on the part of Plymouth Township negotiators, the township's clerical union Tuesday conducted an informational picket around the township complex.

More than two dozen people walked along Ann Arbor Road and Lilley before the township board meeting, carrying signs in an effort to win support for their position.

"There's been a breakdown in the process," said Angela Tabor, the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees official representing Plymouth Township's Local 2959. "Things are not flowing like a normal negotiating process would. We're not really reaching closure to a

contract."

The union, which certified in March 2000 and began negotiating in February 2001, says more than 30 negotiating sessions have been held, with no agreement in sight. There are 42 articles in the union's contract proposal, and union president Nichole Hunt estimates the sides have come to "potential agreements" on about 25 of them.

There are no "tentative agreements" on any of the 42 articles.

"The union has given its proposals to the employer, but the employer has not come back with counter-proposals," Tabor said. "With a new contract, I'm used to giving the employer a proposal and then discussing it. In this case, we've never been able to mesh the two together."

## Cops offer youth police academy

If you're an eighth-grader and you've always wondered what it's like to be a police officer, now's your chance to find out.

The Plymouth Township Police Department is sponsoring a Youth Police Academy in July. Designed to give youngsters a first-hand, inside look at the inner workings of their police department, the academy, which runs from July 15-19, is open to students who just finished

eighth grade and will be freshmen in the fall.

"The kids are important to us," said Det Sgt Steve Rapson. "As a police department, we want to interact more with the youth in a positive way."

The academy, which will run from 8:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. the whole week, will give students hands-on training with simulated firearms, shoot-don't shoot scenarios, defensive tactics and patrol operations, among other topics.

Applications are available

through school guidance counselors, or can be picked up at the Plymouth Township Police Department at Ann Arbor Road and Lilley.

"We want to give kids an opportunity to become familiar with our police department, how the court system works, and provide them with some structure for their summer vacation," Rapson said. "We want to give them a sense of ownership."

trying to take over the DDA, both decided to stay on the board.

McKercher said he hopes to whittle down the number of candidates to begin the interview process at the board's June 13 meeting.

"We would like to have an offer extended before

the end of June, and have someone on board in July," he said.

Purcell was hired by the DDA three years ago at an annual salary of \$50,000. She left earning \$62,000.

The current salary range, as advertised in the job posting, is \$46,800-\$56,160.





# Plymouth-Canton students help establish Lincoln exhibit

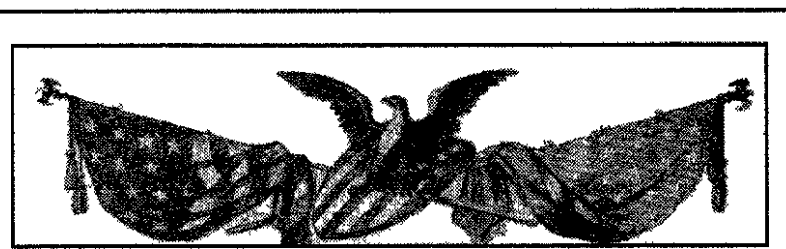

# Board could look into trustee's activities

While questions continue to swirl around Plymouth Township Trustee Abe Munfakh's involvement with Salem Township and Johnson Controls over water issues, one resident has asked for an independent investigation.

Township resident Carol Levitte suggested at Tuesday's meeting that the governor's office is the place any investigation should begin, and she urged the township board to forward information there.

"I'm asking the board to conduct a proper investigation," she said.

The controversy revolves around Munfakh's participation in talks with Detroit Water and Sewerage about adding Salem

Township as a customer. Munfakh's engineering firm — Ayres Lewis Norris & May — has been consulting with Salem Township in connection with a potential move there by Johnson Controls, currently located in Plymouth Township.

Several people, including Plymouth Township Supervisor Steve Mann, have questioned Munfakh's involvement, since he serves as a Plymouth trustee. Adding Salem Township to the Detroit water system, Mann contends, would exacerbate water pressure problems Plymouth Township is already having.

"It's not in Plymouth Township's interests, with our water problems, for one of our own elected officials helping another community (to get water)," Mann said. "It's making matters worse for us, and he's profiting finan-

cially by doing it."

Munfakh's critics contend Ayres-Lewis is also working with Johnson Controls, the automotive supplier trying to get Salem Township to rezone land that borders Plymouth Township so they can build their new facility there.

Munfakh denies his firm has done any work for Johnson Controls, but a letter from Wade Trim, the consultant working with JCI, says, in part, "We hope our cooperation with Ayres, Lewis, Norris & May will be beneficial to both Johnson Controls and to Salem Township as we work together to advance the project."

"The company I work for has not done any work and does not do any work for Johnson Controls," Munfakh said.

Since the situation first came

to light, Mann said he has received correspondence from at least five residents, questioning Munfakh's involvement and asking for remedies ranging from an investigation to Munfakh's removal from the board.

According to Mann, the township's ethics policy allows the board to also sit as the Board of Ethics. He wouldn't comment on whether any kind of official investigation into Munfakh would be considered.

"I don't want to comment on that," Mann said. "The issue is not over. I'm going to bring all the information I have, the inquiries I've received, to the board and let them decide what they want to do with it. It's too early to make it a closed issue."

Munfakh had no comment at Tuesday's board meeting.

Steve Mann disagreed with that assessment, saying it's the union that's being unreasonable.

"They refuse to discuss economic issues," Mann said. "They insisted on ironing out the non-economic issues first, and there are a lot of those. If they would have given us an (economic) package when we started negotiations, we would have had a contract long ago."

Tabor said the union has asked the township to give raises to workers, who haven't had a pay increase since 1999, and then continue talking.

"That would be the right thing to do," Tabor said. "But (the township) said 'absolutely not'."

The union, which represents 36 clerical positions (two of which have remained unfilled), points to talks about health care

as an example. According to Tabor, the township has told the union they want to reduce health care costs by having employees pay an increased percentage of a certain expense, but fails to say what that number would be.

"They say 'a percentage of a number,' but don't tell us what that number is," Tabor said. "I can't read minds anymore."

Mann agrees the township is targeting health care, one of the rising costs in the township. It's been an issue in other contract

negotiations.

"You can look at the other unions we've reached agreement with," Mann said. "We have been targeting health care for cost reductions. It's an area that continues to rise."

Since negotiations began, the union has filed 27 unfair labor practice claims against the township. According to Mann, they've voluntarily dropped 14 of them.

"We believe many of the remaining claims will be proven frivolous," Mann said.

But Tabor said they were dropped simply because they no longer apply.

"The issues are no longer issues, some of them surrounded people no longer employed there," she said. "A lot of those were filed because of things they were doing to individuals, and

since those individuals are no longer working there, there is no remedy for us to seek."

While Mann touts recent agreements with other unions as proof the township is fair in its bargaining, the president of at least one other union supports the AFSCME position.

Chris Mack, president of the firefighters local, who recently agreed to a new contract, said the clerical workers are "doing what they have to do."

"It's a hard battle that people have to do," Mack said. "They deserve a contract, just like anyone else. It's a long, hard process. I support AFSCME in what they're doing. Their negotiations should be farther along than that. They shouldn't be at square one. They should be just about finished."

# Fire department set to buy 3 new rescue vehicles

The revolving door at the city's maintenance garage is about to close, at least as far as the Plymouth Community Fire Department is concerned.

The Plymouth Township board Tuesday night approved the replacement of three fire department rescue vehicles the fire chief says have been eating up thousands of dollars in repair costs.

The township will instead pay nearly \$406,000 to buy three medium-duty emergency medical vehicles to replace a pair of 1994 rescue vehicles and a 1992 model. The money for this purchase was placed in the township's last budget,

and will now be spent out of the improvement revolving fund.

"Emergency response vehicles are subject to more wear and tear than the average vehicle," said Fire Chief Larry Groth. "The rescues we have now have really outlived their usefulness."

The vehicles will be purchased from Rolland Specialty Vehicles and Products, the low bidder in the process who has serviced the township for more than 20 years, according to Groth. The \$405,752 purchase price is nearly \$50,000 below the estimated amount.

RSVP will give the township \$40,000 for trade-in of the old vehicles, plus \$9,000 in discounts for buying in quantity and a "continuing customer" dis-

count of \$4,500.

Under the joint operating agreement that established the fire department, the city contributes 25 percent of the department's budget. The township controls the purse strings, so city manager Paul Sincock said he didn't know anything about the purchase until late Tuesday afternoon.

"I knew this was a discussion item, but I didn't know they were in a purchase mode," Sincock said. "The fire chief hasn't even discussed the matter with me, so it's hard to make a determination as to whether the purchase is necessary or not."

Groth insists it is because of the repairs necessary to the three vehicles

in question, and Sincock agrees there "are a lot of repairs."

"New brakes are constantly going into these vehicles," Groth told the township board Tuesday. "We have put thousands of dollars into these vehicles."

In what may have been a record night for spending for the fire department, the township board also approved spending more than \$72,000 on equipment designed to clear Fire Stations 2 and 3 of exhaust fumes.

The equipment, to be purchased from Hastings Air Energy Control in Milwaukee, Wis., is designed to capture and remove 100 percent of exhaust fumes, a standard required by NFPA guidelines,

according to firefighter Scott Gross, who put the package together.

The equipment will be installed in Station 2 on Wilcox and Station 3 on Beck, but will not be installed in Station 1 at the township complex on Ann Arbor Road.

"We're anticipating a new home (for Station 1), so it would be a waste of money to put this equipment here," assistant chief Mark Wendell told the board, referring to the township's plans to build a new township hall complex. "This is a health and safety issue for our firefighters."

## Foundation picks up tab for skate park

City Manager Paul Sincock told city commissioners the foundation, established by the late

Jack Wilcox of Plymouth, will donate \$11,500 toward the purchase of the skate park.

"This is a great example of cooperation between two communities and their citizens," said Mayor Pro-Tem

Colleen Pobur.

The city commission earlier authorized Sincock to take the money out of the city budget until a donor could be found to fund the project. At that same meeting, Pobur, along with commissioners Ron Loiselle and Phil Pursell, each committed \$500 for the skate park.

Plymouth and Northville received a \$5,000 grant from the Michigan Recreation and Parks Association through its Get Michigan Moving program. Under provisions of the grant, each community was required to provide matching funds of \$13,000. Northville's recreation department received its share of funding from the Northville Friends of Recreation.

The mobile skate park will include ramps and other skating equipment, along with an enclosed trailer that will transport the equipment between Plymouth and Northville. Recreation officials are hopeful the skate park will be available sometime this summer.

The city's parks and recreation department will develop an e-mail notification system to advise youths when and where the skate park will be located.

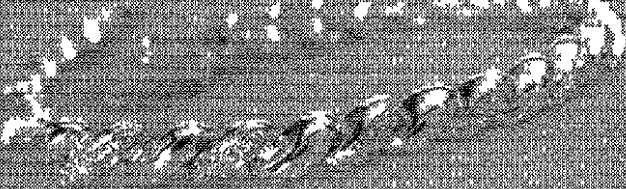

make cuts," added Davis. "I think we'll be challenged ever so greatly in the next few years unless something different happens in Lansing."

Booher, who noted it took eight weeks to come up with the first round of cuts, said the administration will be challenged to come up with more.

"I think it's going to be very difficult to stay away from any areas that will illicit a lot of attention because it will affect more employees, and perhaps students, in more ways that are more noticeable than the \$950,000 we were able to generate," Booher said. Those areas, mentioned during the meeting, could include athletics, transportation and curriculum.

Among the cuts already on the table are a reduction of four elementary teaching positions and a middle school teacher, \$250,000, the district's allocation of funds for field trip transportation, \$90,000, athletic expenditures, \$65,000, and general budget reductions, \$50,000.

Trustee Judy Mardigan said taking the additional money out of the district's fund equity would give the district time, but she would rather find the additional cuts immediately.

"Taking the steps now will be a lot less painful than doing them after school is open," she said.

Mardigan, who proposed the administration look for an additional million dollars in cuts, said the \$400,000 for a new elementary and middle school language arts program might be a place to start as well as selling old school buses.

"I don't have all the answers, but I'd like to chal-

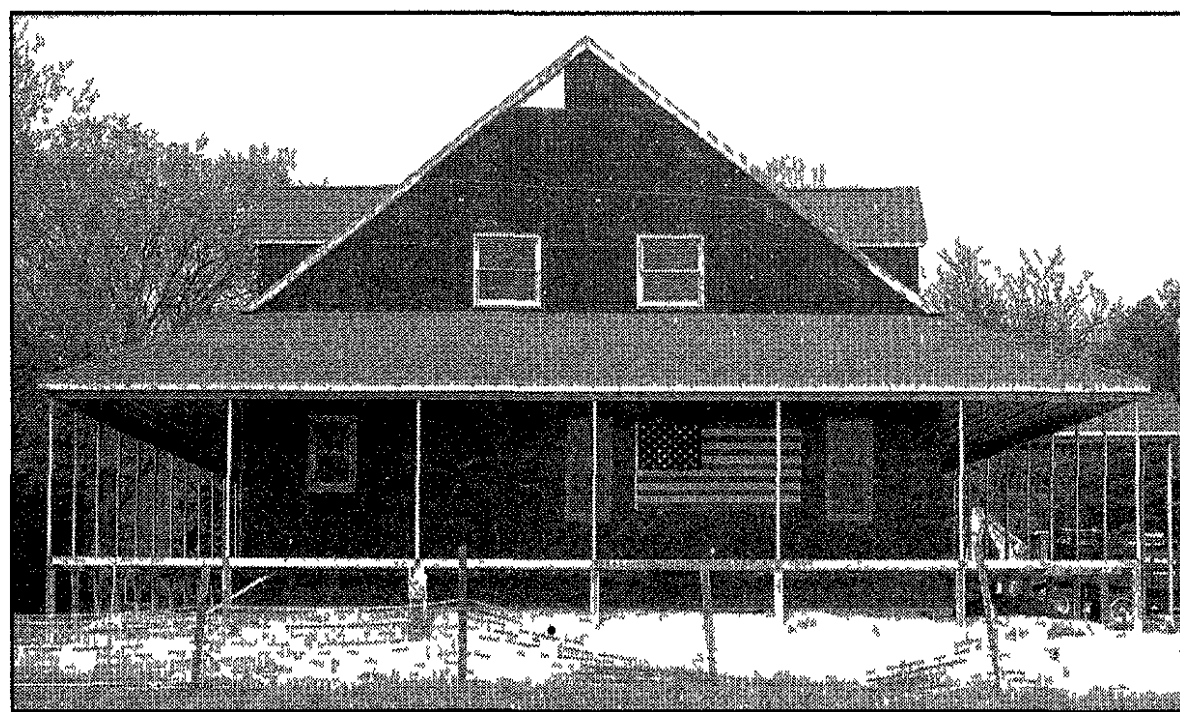

lenge the administration to go back and take a look at it, with the proviso that we don't look at classroom teachers first, that we do pretty much whatever else we can."

Booher made it clear she doesn't favor cutting the language arts program, but didn't count it out as one of the future recommendations.

"It would be very unfortunate to target a new curriculum development, particularly one that is the basic literacy for education," she said. "So, I think we're definitely going to have to look at what the other options are. And, because they get into such strong philosophy about what the public school is able to provide or should provide, they will be very difficult topics for the board."

The Board of Education will have to make some quick decisions because, as required by law, next year's budget needs to be passed by June 30.

## Home builder following the township's rules

Mark Lewis heard about it his first week on the job as Plymouth Township's new building official. The subject comes up every so often at township board meetings. It's even fodder for water cooler chatters.

What's going on with that huge house on Ann Arbor Road?

Lewis chuckles sort of ruefully when the subject is raised, because even he's not sure how to answer the question. It involves a house being built on Ann Arbor Road, across the street from Pioneer Middle School.

"My very first week here, it came up," Lewis remembered. "It's been asked about a lot of times. When they pulled the original permit, it was looked at because it's pretty big. But other than taking so long the

builder isn't breaking any rules."

The owner was unavailable for comment.

It's a huge house (4,640 square feet, reportedly with 10 bedrooms) and the permit to build it was pulled in July 1998. It doesn't appear, from the outside, like much is getting done lately.

But apparently enough is being done to satisfy permit requirements and township policies. According to Lewis, the permit is good as long as the builder can prove work has been done within a six-month period. Though progress has

been slow in this instance, work is being done.

In fact, some inspections have already been performed, and inspectors like what they've seen.

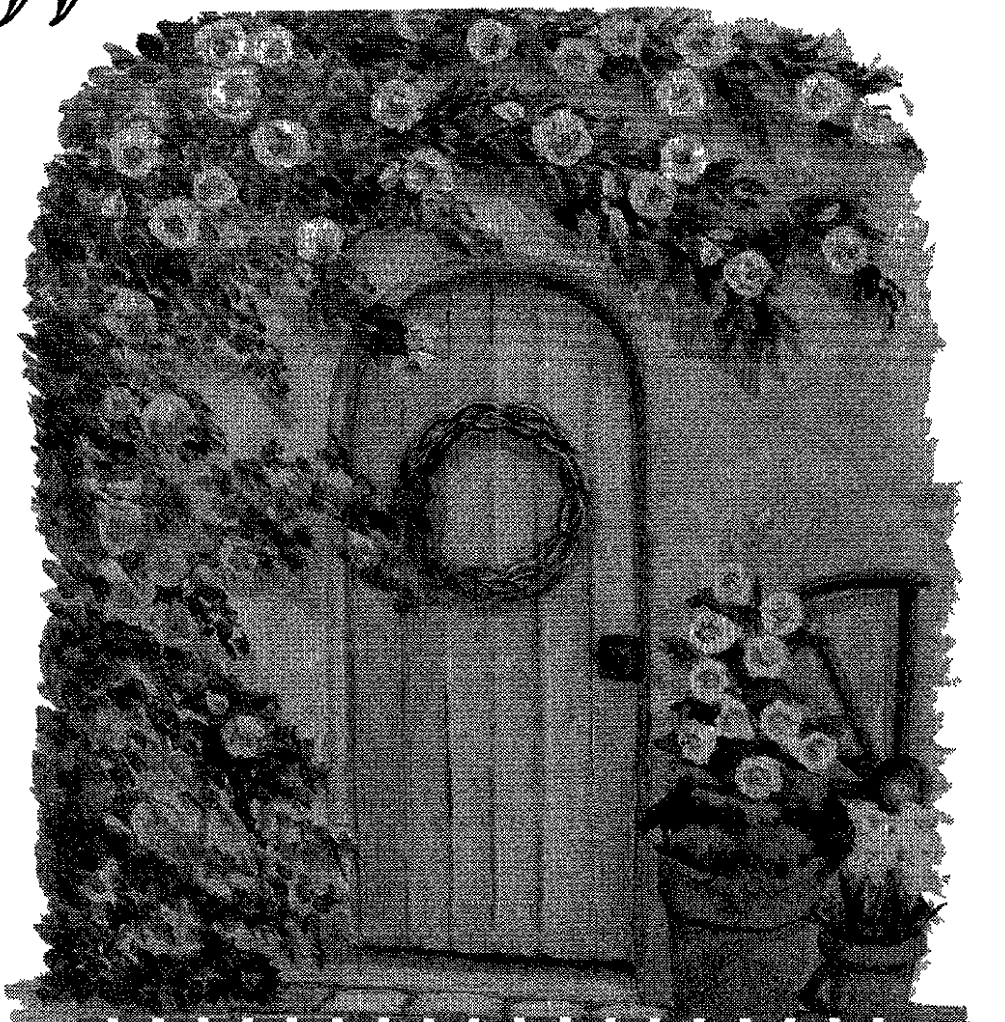
"It's very clean, it's a very nice job," Lewis said. "Everything was good as far as plumbing, electrical. Our inspectors were happy."

Rumors have floated since the enormous structure started going up that the owner was going to use it as a commercial operation, perhaps a bed and breakfast. Nothing of the sort has been communicated to the township. In fact, a letter to the township declared the building would be a single-family residence.

"That's another issue for another day," Lewis said. "He hasn't said it's going to be one. As long as he's following the codes and ordinances you can't infringe upon his rights."

# Canton women tackle life

The idea of women playing full-contact professional football may seem odd to some, but the creation of the Detroit Danger has provided the opportunity of a lifetime for two Canton women.

"Actually, this is a dream come true for me," said Lisa Ryan, 36, who plays outside linebacker for the Danger.

The National Women's Football League is in its second year with the Danger being a second season expansion team.

Ryan has had a lifetime love of football "I've always enjoyed playing and watching football."

She tried to play on the football team in junior high, but was turned down.

"I showed up with a group of girls and we were not given the opportunity to try out. It was treated like a joke," Ryan said.

The Dearborn Heights native also plays on special teams, both on kick-off and punt returns.

But she has duties not shared by her male professional counterparts.

Ryan juggles professional football with her career as an inpatient psychiatric nurse at Sinai-Grace Hospital, marriage and motherhood to three young children.

"I have a great supportive husband, Bill, who picks up a lot of the slack," Ryan said. "He allows me to be me."

She said her employer has also been very flexible. "I can't get over how supportive everybody is."

Ryan tried-out for the team in February. "I started training in January for tryouts next fall, but because some of the girls didn't like the terms of their contract, the team had some openings."

"I had only two weeks to prepare." Yet, she made the cut.

She describes her attitude as "relentless."

The National Women's Football League plays by the same rules as the NFL with two exceptions. "We play with a smaller football, and can complete a pass with only one foot in bounds."

She likes playing defense. "I enjoy tackling - it's a lot of fun."

Ryan admits the game has been hard on her body. "It takes quite a toll. I've had four broken fingers, jammed fingers and a knee injury."

She stands 5 feet 7 inches and weighs 146 pounds. "I'm not big, but I'm tough."

Her Canton teammate, Bev McManus, 39, is equally determined.

She attributes her presence on the Danger to "a lot of hard work and sweat. It was very time-consuming."

The married mother of three also operates a home-based business, In-Home Executive Services. She also gives credit to her husband Jim. "I couldn't do this without him."

McManus tired-out for the team with 225 other women. "To make it was quite an accomplishment."

She plays running back for the Danger, or did until a helmet to the knee placed her on the injured reserve list.

"At 5-feet-4-inches tall and 140 pounds, I was one lean machine."

McManus has surgery to repair a torn anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) in her knee last Friday. "I was just devastated that it required surgery."

The injury will cause her to miss the rest of the Danger's season.

McManus dreamed of playing professional basketball, but sadly, women's professional basketball did not exist at that time, she said.

She played varsity basketball for four years while in high school.

Even surgery to remove a benign tumor from her skull could not keep her off the basketball court.

"I have my surgery in July and played my first game in October," she said. "I had to play with protective head gear my whole senior year."

It was a full four years before her skull had healed sufficiently for her to play sports without head protection.

McManus said, "The moral of that story is the you can do anything you put your mind to."

She is determined to make a comeback from her knee surgery too. "You know, I'm going to beat the odds."

**Mixed reactions**  
Ryan said her involvement with the Detroit Danger team has met with mixed reaction from other women.

"I talk to some women who know and are excited about it, and others who don't have a

clue." Ryan said the women playing in the NWFL range in age from 18 to 58, with 21 teams in the league.

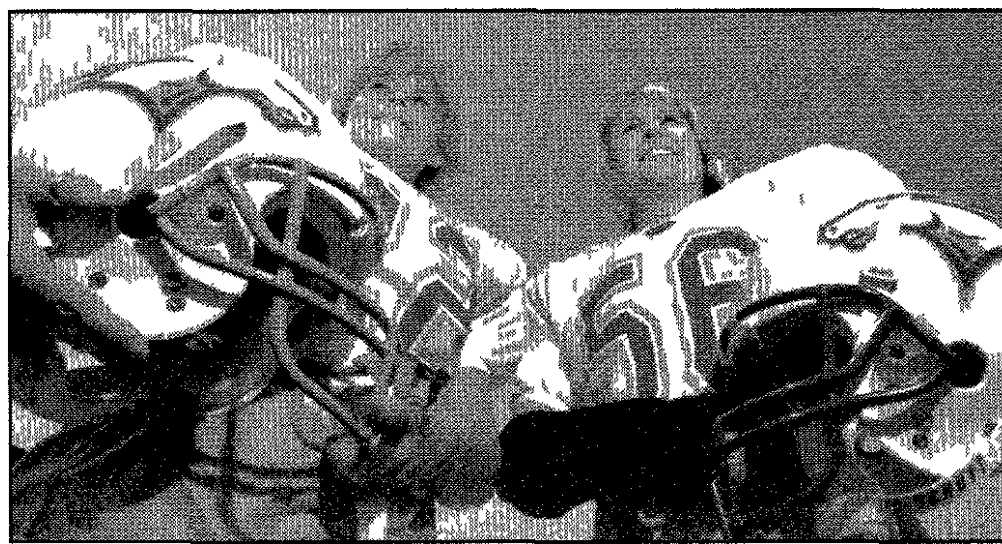
"It's so exciting to be on a team," Ryan said. She said she is reminded of the movie, *A League of Their Own*, about women's professional baseball during World War II.

She hopes there will be a time when women can actually make a living playing professional football. Currently, players receive a small stipend at the end of the

season. "The wages aren't that great," Ryan said. "It's nothing that you can make a living at, but there is hope."

"I just want everyone to know that this league is out there, and to come watch us play," McManus said. "You will be absolutely amazed. It's at a level that is incomprehensible."

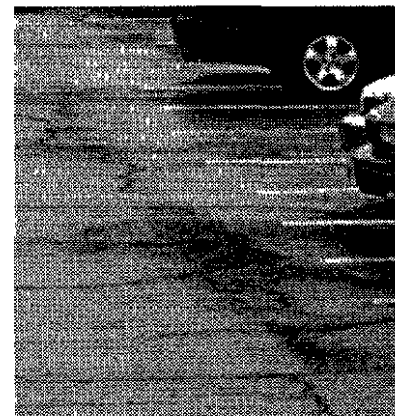
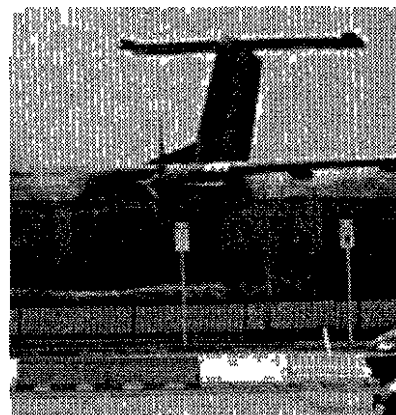

### City's lack of presence in parade was offensive

A beautiful day dawned Monday for Plymouth's annual Memorial Day parade.

The sun was shining, the Plymouth-Canton Marching Band was playing, Boy Scouts, Cub Scouts, Girl Scouts and Brownies were all over the place.

On the dais were a pair of state representatives, a state senator, the Plymouth Township supervisor, and members of several veterans organizations.

And not a city representative in sight. No mayor. No mayor pro-tem. Not a single city commissioner. Sure, city police officers helped keep the parade route safe, and municipal services workers were on hand to set up, take down and clean up.

But not one elected official from the City of Plymouth was on hand to honor the sacrifices the men and women of this country have made to make sure we live the kind of life Americans are used to living. Not one elected representative of the city was even in the crowd, much less on the dais.

Now, we understand people have choices to make and lives to lead. City commissioners certainly had the right to choose to go to the summer cottage, or get out on the lake, or go somewhere with family or to simply sleep in Mayor Bill Graham, for instance, can certainly be excused for being out of the state for a two-week vacation.

But the residents who lined the street for the 7:30 a.m. parade certainly also have the right to be put off by the commissioners' boycott of the parade.

Parade organizers who issued invitations certainly have the right to be upset by the lack of any response to those invitations.

Mostly, though, veterans from all over the area absolutely have the right to be offended by the callous disregard for them displayed in the lack of participation.

We understand the parade is organized by someone with whom city commissioners have battled, who is a regular contributor to and political ally of a tabloid publication that routinely blasts them for nearly every action they take. It's tough to swallow your pride and get involved in something being run by someone with whom you've had so many heated disagreements.

But it's a piece of crow that should have been swallowed, en masse, by city commissioners. If they wanted to make a statement, commissioners could have drawn straws or arm wrestled, with the loser standing in as the city's appointed face. The parade moves through the heart of the city, for crying out loud.

The Memorial Day parade should not be treated as a political football by anyone, not when the country is pulling itself up by its bootstraps post-Sept. 11.

What better time to show up, stand united and wear a look of American pride on your face?

It would have looked better than the egg that's there now.

### Voters best served with Horvath, Lamar, Staley

Over the next few weeks, voters have an opportunity to help shape the future of the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools district. With three open school board seats, 11 candidates and basic differences in philosophy between some and the current administration, the electorate's role looms large.

The Observer has previously endorsed Mark Horvath and Joanne Lamar for four-year terms on the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education, and Marcy Staley for election to the unexpired one-year term she was appointed to last fall.

We reiterate those choices today and remind those going to the polls on June 10, as well as those voting by absentee ballot, of our reasons behind them.

Horvath, 43, of Canton, is a former school board president who decided not to seek reelection four years ago. He will bring knowledge and experience — as well as a much needed critical eye — to the board.

Horvath has pledged to open up communication between the board, Superintendent Kathleen Booher's administration and the public. Horvath is sincere in his belief

that the district has moved off track in several key areas, including keeping the Talented and Gifted Program in magnet school form and pressing for smaller elementary class sizes.

We believe he will advocate these positions with a strong, yet reasonable style that encourages civil debate at the board table.

Lamar, 51, of Plymouth Township offers the board the perspective of a parent who has seen two children make their way through the entire K-12 experience.

We like her open approach to problem-solving. She is willing to listen to all sides and doesn't believe board members or administrators always have all the answers.

Staley, a 45-year-old Canton resident, has turned in a solid performance since her appointment to fill the vacancy created when trustee Steve Guile moved out of the district.

We support her election to the remaining year of his term and encourage her to be a more frequent participant in public discussions, as well as behind the scenes.

### River volunteers are making a difference

Saturday is River Day. It was 16 years ago that volunteers first gathered to clean up the Rouge River. The river was polluted with chemicals and blocked with debris. Volunteers dressed in waders and long rubber gloves climbed in to drag everything from tree branches to automobiles from the sluggish brown water.

Every year since, the Friends of the Rouge has gathered volunteers in Wayne and Oakland counties to work at making the Rouge a healthy waterway. The concept has expanded to take in the Huron and Clinton rivers in what has become an annual celebration of our vital water system.

Recent concerns about attempts to channel Great Lakes water to distant locations and the harvesting of Michigan ground water by Perrier, have made us more aware of just how important our water system is. The Rouge, Huron and Clinton rivers have been the lifeblood of our industrial development but they are also important for recreational use and for sustaining plant and animal wildlife.

This year, an estimated 1,600 volunteers will participate at 24 sites along the Rouge in Wayne and Oakland counties. The success in clearing out the river has shifted the focus for some areas to other projects such as streambank stabilization and the introduction of native plants along the river.

In recent years some non native plants such as the beautiful but strangling purple loosestrife have taken over the area. Volunteers will be removing these invaders and replacing them with native plants.

Other programs planned for this year include bird house building, storm drain stenciling, parkside clean up and environmental education programs.

Volunteer work and government programs have helped turn the fortunes of the Rouge around. Once regarded as one of the nation's most polluted river systems, the Rouge has shown dramatic improvement in water quality and the ability to sustain fish and wildlife.

More than 50 miles of the Rouge flows through public parklands, making it one of the most accessible rivers in the country.

"It seems every year, more communities are getting involved and trying to encourage as many volunteers as possible to come out and clean up the Rouge," said Carolyne Foster, managing director of Friends of the Rouge. "The communities are recognizing the Rouge does have problems, and it needs our help."

We have long supported these efforts and urge everyone to take some time on River Day to either volunteer or at least take some time to consider how important these rivers are to the health of our communities. Happy River Day!

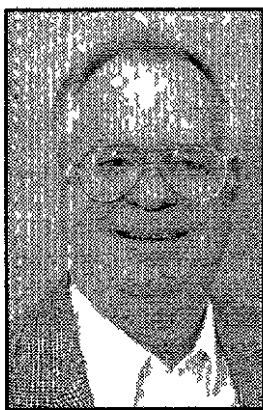

## Board should review policies to put them in proper context

Last week the Board of Education began putting its final stamp of approval on a new set of policies that will change the board's governance activities. The series of four policies are Organizational Purpose (series 1000), Executive Limitations (series 2000), Board/Staff Relationships (series 3000) and Board Governance (series 4000).

During this school year the board will put all these revised/new policies in place except for the Executive Limitations Series 1000, 3000 and 4000 are expected to take effect July 1, 2002.

During the last meeting several of us voiced serious concerns about the probability that these policies, as written, contained violations of the Open Meetings Act and a board member's right to free speech. After much discussion, the board committed to fixing those sections that would have violated these fundamental rights.

There are, however, several parts of these policies that we should be concerned with. First will the rewritten version of the policies, in fact, support the commitments made by the board? Only time will tell.

The Board Governance Policy was approved with changes and it does not have to come back to the board for a vote. Organizational Purpose and Board/Staff Relations will be given to the board to approve prior to the end of the school year.

Second, is there adequate board oversight to ensure the financial and operational integrity? Should oversight include both results and processes?

Quite frankly, we do not know because the policy on Executive Limitations is not done and probably will not be until well into the next school year. What we do know is that the board will only be measuring results, NOT processes.

All of us have seen processes that achieve results, but they are efficient, effective, legal, ethical and moral. Operational oversight means being cognizant of how things are going to be done and making sure they are efficient, effective, legal, ethical and moral.

We elected our board members to make sure they watch over the operation and the finances of our schools. IT IS THEIR JOB!! We did not elect the board to be a rubber stamp for the superintendent. The Michigan Association of School Boards says that among a school board's responsibilities is "to monitor and assess the district's performance."

How can you assess the efficiency and effectiveness of the district without looking at processes? Third, none of the policies addresses the cold

shoulder citizens get when they ask a question or raise an issue at a board meeting. All they have put into their policy is the same old stuff. "During this time (public participation at a board meeting), the board listens to comments from the public but does not engage in dialogue or render decisions. In general, such issues will be referred to the superintendent for handling as appropriate. The Superintendent shall advise the Board of the final disposition."

Fourth, does the new policy place too much power in the hands of the board president? Is there a clear definition of the president's role and responsibilities? Without clear guidelines and definition of the president's role and responsibility we just don't know.

By law, board members have equal power, voice and vote. The "Duties of Board President" is written without clarity and definition. For example, there is no definition of what it means to "have general charge of the affairs of the board." While policies are generally meant to be written broadly, this one requires clarity and definition to prevent an abuse of power.

In addition, the president is to be "recognized as the official spokesman for the board." There are no guidelines, definitions or roles and responsibilities outlined in this policy. In the past, board presidents have acted as facilitators and each board member has had the right and obligation to speak for the board on those issues and items that the board has either voted on or reached a consensus on.

At least once in the past 22 months the president has acted on his own to establish a board position. This part of the policy needs to provide the president with clear role, guidelines, definitions and specific responsibilities.

Last, should the board, before implementing any one of these policies, review and approve all the policies? My 35 years of business experience and my 17 years on the Board of Education tells me that you cannot adequately review and approve policies in a whole context without all the policies being reviewed at the same time.

When the policies that we are presently using were first put into place, we reviewed all of them at the same time to ensure there was a logical sequence to what we were trying to accomplish.

These policies have some very well-written sections. However, I would urge the Board of Education to take the time to finish writing all of them and then read them all in context. Implement these policies when they are all completed.

## Rouge River project receives recognition

The American Academy of Environmental Engineers has awarded CDM the Superior Achievement Award for the Rouge River National Wet Weather Demonstration Project as part of the academy's 2002 Excellence in Environmental Engineering competition.

The restoration and rehabilitation plan began in 1992, addressing the more than 400-square-mile watershed. The project's main goals were to restore and protect water quality, control combined sewer overflows and other sources of pollution, and implement watershed management practices.

CDM assisted Wayne County throughout the project's duration with designing and establishing pollution abatement facilities, design criteria, and best management practices to restore the river's degraded water and animal habitats. Major reaches of the river that had not met water quality standards for dissolved oxygen for decades now do, and there are aesthetic improvements, recreational development and evidence of increased aquatic life.

## Schoolcraft board approves Jeffress' performance

Schoolcraft College's board of trustees gave President Conway Jeffress a favorable evaluation and approved raises for two groups of staff at its meeting May 22.

The executive administration, which includes Schoolcraft's highest-ranking officials, was given a 2.5 percent raise in salary. Full- and part-time non-union support staff also got a 2.5 percent raise.

"The evaluation of the board was very complimentary," said Jeffress, who makes \$130,000 per year.

The trustees said Jeffress, Schoolcraft's first-year president, has been very efficient. Jeffress replaced longtime Schoolcraft president Richard McDowell last year.

"The president's evaluation went extremely well," board

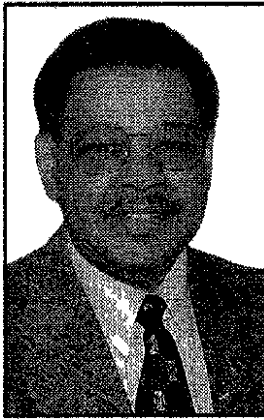
Chair Carol Strom said. "Board members were extremely pleased with his accomplishments."

"We're very pleased with the way the college has gone this year," Trustee Mary Breen said. "The transition was extremely smooth."

Jeffress will likely get a raise, although the board must vote on it and specific figures were not available. He said he thought his increase should be the same as the other groups.

"Philosophically, I think that's proper," Jeffress said.

Jill O'Sullivan, vice president of business and finance, said that the board gave the executive administration and non-union support staff raises to try to keep up with the cost of living

"I think it was a good decision on the board's part," she said.

Executive administrators make \$65,134-\$94,696 per year. The non-union support staff makes \$26,125-\$66,872 per year.

The board also discussed collective bargaining in closed session. Contracts with four of the college's unions end

this summer.

"If there are no big crisis issues to talk about, that implies things will go smoothly," Jeffress said.

Steven Berg, who took over as president of the Faculty Forum May 3, said he expects smooth negotiations over the summer.

"I think that they're going to go well and I anticipate that will continue," he said. "We surveyed

the faculty to find out what issues are important."

The Faculty Forum is Schoolcraft's largest union with more than 500 members. The college has not had a strike since the 1970s.

"We try to treat all employees equitably," O'Sullivan said.

In other action, Architects Tom Mathison and Harry Diamond presented a preliminary report of possible renovations for the campus.

"There was a classroom crunch," Mathison said. "We wanted to make sure we had both short- and long-term needs identified."

The possible renovations would make the layout of campus buildings easier for students.

The cost would be more than \$49 million. A final plan will be presented to the board in June.

"One of the issues is the prioritization of this," Jeffress said.

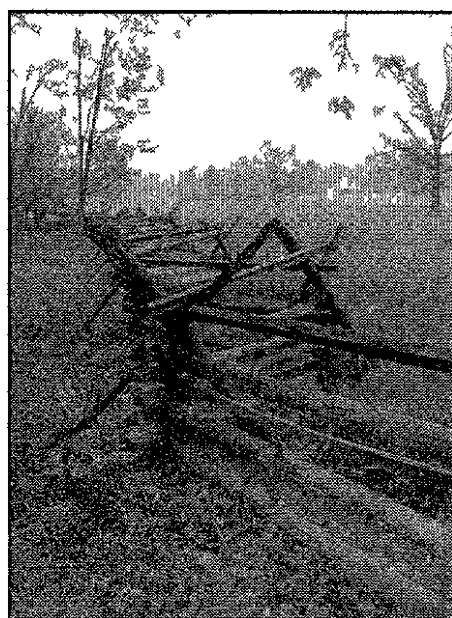

## On-line art auction offers chance to make a difference

The jagged line of the fence cuts like so many knives through the heart. In the background, an early morning mist sets a haunting tone. This is the battle ground in Gettysburg where 52,000 men lost their lives during the Civil War.

Even if Brother Vincent Reyes had n't relayed the story behind the photograph he took, the image left me wondering about the eerie landscape. That's the power of photography. It captures the history of places and people, or simply a moment in time. In the case of Gettysburg, the black and white print documents the sacred ground, and it's why Reyes chose to donate it to an on-line auction of photographs to benefit the Capuchin Soup Kitchen in Detroit where he serves as pastoral director.

## Maria's prepares old-style Italian specialties with amore

There is no Maria at Maria's Front Room, a romantically styled restaurant in downtown Ferndale

"There never was," said owner Buddy Orlando "It's just a good Italian name"

His parents, Joan and Carl Orlando, were the founders, 22 years ago, of what was then called Maria's Pizzeria in Detroit's Rosedale Park neighborhood. The family restaurant at Grand River and Outer Drive became legendary for its old-style Italian specialties.

That heritage has been preserved at Maria's Front Room, so named because

the "front room" of the old multi-room Maria's was where most diners requested to sit. The Ferndale restaurant, a storefront with seating for 65, is all front room.

The Orlandos, and Maria's "right-hand man" Mike Beauheu, transformed the Middle Eastern restaurant formerly at this spot. Table linens in white with red napkins dress candle-lit tables (there are three booths). Grapevines and lights are strung on wooden lattice-work screens. A nod to Buddy Orlando's previous career - rock guitarist living in California - are the musical instruments hung on stucco walls.

**Menu**

A Ferndale High School graduate, Orlando is delighted his destiny was this restaurant. He shares the cooking

duties with Beauheu, preparing fresh, house-made bread and all the fine Italian dining specialties that made Maria's famous.

The specialty of the house is the milk-fed Provim veal, Orlando said. Seven treatments are offered, with Scallopini alla Mare, including three large shrimp, the most costly entree at \$18.95. Scallopini alla Marsala and Spinach Tortellini are popular dishes on the menu.

Chicken, pasta and pizza are also available. Weekend specials might feature veal chop with veal glacé and Portobello mushrooms, or fresh salmon, swordfish, sole and sea bass.

Lunch hours were attempted but abandoned, Orlando said. The uneven customer response made staffing difficult. He also maintains that Italian food, being so heavy, is better suited to dinner. After eating lunch, "people were falling asleep at work," he claimed.

Dining at Maria's is an excellent value because of the extras, including garlic bread and choice of soup or salad. The veal and chicken entrees also include a side dish of pasta or vegetables.

"A lot of people don't give you a full dinner, but I believe the sides should be included. I don't believe in a la carte," Orlando said.

When Maria's came to Ferndale six years ago, the family couldn't find a way to get one of the city's coveted liquor licenses. Then inspiration struck. With guidance from St. Julian's Winery in Paw Paw, Mich., Orlando became a licensed small winemaker in the basement of his restaurant - perhaps the first in the state to make and serve wine on premises. Red, white and blush are the varieties.

"I figured as a microbrewery, we could let people have wine with their dinners," he said.

Orlando was married last year to Emily, who had served him his birthday dinner at Forte's in Birmingham. He's a fan of different restaurants and cuisines. Four years ago, when Orlando couldn't find Mexican food in Ferndale, he opened up Jalapeno Pete's across the

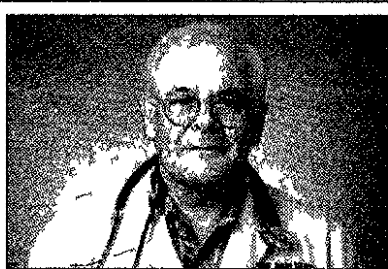

### Too good to be true? He'll put this washer to the test

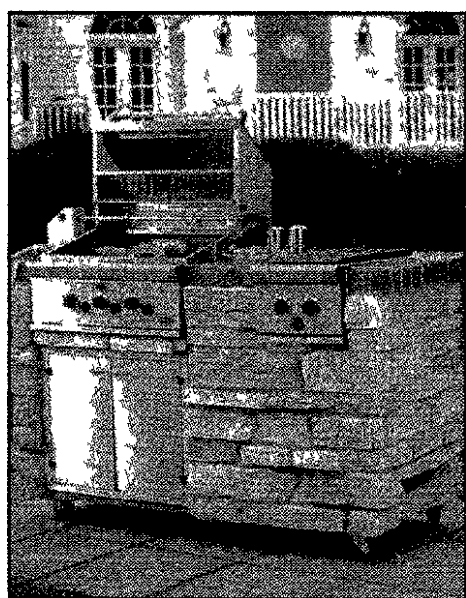
A few months ago I received a call from a company in Ohio that manufactures a washing machine not available in any store across the country. They only produce around 500 of these washers per year and sell them to people who call them or find out about the product. In business since 1976, they started making this washer in 1994, and are well known in the commercial laundry industry. They are now seeking my assistance to help them launch this product in the regular retail industry.

At this point I must tell you that I am not going to give you information on this company, not until I do a lot more research. So far, they have come to my home with the washer in a trailer and they showed me the inner workings. It is so amazing that anyone can build a washer this simple that I asked the important question of who they have in different areas authorized to do the warranty repairs if needed. The answer given me is one that I've never heard before in the appliance industry: "We have no service personnel in the country nor do we feel a need for them. This washer can be repaired by any person that can hold a screwdriver." And folks, he was n't kidding.

They give you a book on how to make necessary repairs and a direct phone line to an engineer at the factory. Can you believe it? A washer so simple that you can do all the repairs yourself. You have read my thoughts on how expensive the cost is today of electronic controls on major home appliances. Well, this washer uses an old-fashioned timer with the three necessary cycles to do any wash load plus they have, can you believe it, two rinse cycles. Simple turn knobs for water temperature and load size like the old days. And it is not a front loader like everybody is coming out with. It meets the energy star rating set forth by the US Energy Regulation Agency, holds sixteen bath towels and uses only 1 ounce of detergent. The tubs are stainless steel and you can even get the washer cabinet in brushed stainless steel.

The wash cycle is only 32 minutes long, which means finally, there is a washer that does the job faster than the clothes dryer. I'm telling you that this thing is just out of this world and yet today as you are reading this, I still am not ready to give you a name or place to contact. Wait, I forgot something. It spins so smooth that you can balance a nickel on its edge, and the nickel will not fall down. Try that on your current washing machine. The next chapter is to be written in several weeks concerning this best kept secret. I am going to the factory to see it made and make sure I didn't get a con-job. I am going to buy one of these and put it in my basement to make sure it does everything they say it does. I am going to get a list of 20 consumers who have owned one of these for the past 5 years and call them with their opinions. 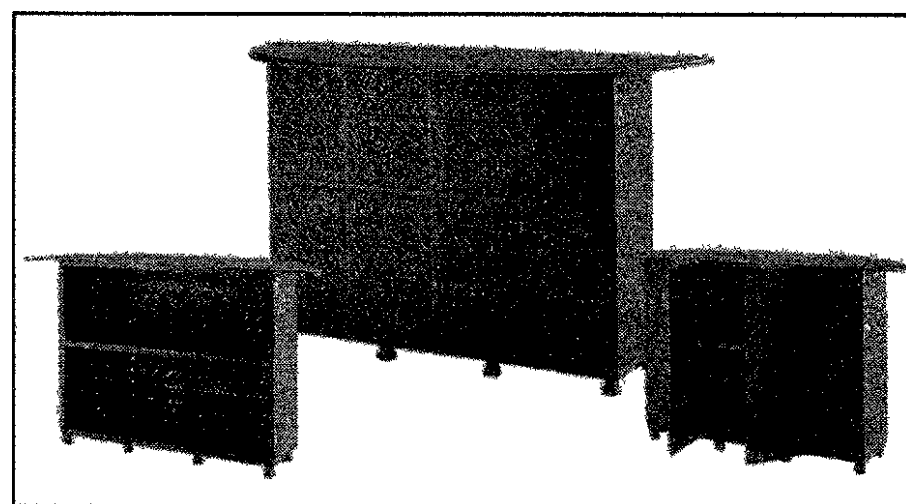

## Propane or charcoal, barbecuers have many choices

Along with robins, weeds and worms, spring brings renewal of the great barbecue debate: Charcoal vs. propane. The decision might be in your wine glass.

If you want to sip and chat with your guests, go with charcoal, said Maria Alberti, manager of the Thisist Shop, a grill store in West Bloomfield.

Barbecuing "is not just about the food," Alberti said. "It's a social thing. So stick with the grill that takes longer to get ready. It's about enjoyment."

Visit with your guests, she said, talk about the Red Wings while you wait for the coals to glow.

But Alberti isn't blindly loyal to charcoal. "Charcoal people think

they're doing something true, but if I didn't see what kind of grill the food was cooked on, I couldn't tell the difference."

On the other hand, she knows that charcoal people believe their method gives the food extra flavor, and she recommends briquettes that haven't been chemically treated in any way or natural lump charcoal.

She also likes wood chips added to charcoal for "an extra notch of flavor: Cherry and hickory. Mesquite for chicken and ribs."

And she likes propane. "When you talk about gas, there are three different kinds. One that uses special briquettes, one that uses flavor bars, and the infrared."

"Devoted charcoal users tell me that infrared gives the best steak taste. The high temperature infrared energy pierces the

### That which we call a barbecue

"Barbecue" is the name of an open-fire stove-like cooking unit, such as an outdoor grill, open pit or brick hearth, used for cooking food. (Some communities prohibit in-ground fire pits, so check local regulations before you make your pig-roast luau plans.)

"Barbecue" also is the name of what is being cooked, and the name of the event where a fire is cooking something. "To barbecue" is the name of the action of broiling or roasting seafood or landfood over fire.

"Texas barbecue" is beef brisket overcooked to shredding and then covered in a tomatoey sauce.

The word likely comes to our back yards from the American-Spanish *barbacoa*, in the language of the Taino tribe of the Arawak people of the Greater Antilles, the West Indies island group that includes Cuba, Jamaica, Hispaniola and Puerto Rico.

## Outdoor kitchens

Chris Talbot, cookout expert at Town 'n' Country, self-proclaimed as "Michigan's Largest Grill Shop," in Garden City, said that lump charcoal can light with the touch of a match and there are many ways to light briquettes

He can show you how to use a chimney device to set the briquettes burning, and there are fire-starting tablets and electric fire starters. Some charcoal grills have built-in propane fed fire starters.

Working well beyond the aver-

age patio grill, Talbot's company builds outdoor kitchens. He said they recently completed an \$8,400 installation.

"There's no limit," he said. "You could spend \$20-\$30,000 without trying hard. An island grill of your choice built into a tile and stucco counter. Tiffany lighting, refrigerator, side burners, fireplaces, stereos and more."

Is the food better in a \$30,000 outdoor kitchen?

"It's the same basic barbecue," Talbot said, "but they're doing it with more style."

Talbot also can show you smokers, which he describes as "outdoor convection ovens" providing extended low-heat cooking.

And outdoor deep fryers, which he said can be used for anything that can be cooked in oil - turkey to potatoes - and also can be filled with water to boil lobsters and other seafood.

## New regulation

If you go with propane, you ought to know that a new safety regulation requires use of a tank with a valve which prevents "overfilling," limiting content to what is considered a non-hazardous quantity. If you have an older tank without the new safety valve, you'll have to modify it or replace it.

Dennis Wright of Wright Hardware in Livonia said tanks made since October 1997 meet the requirements. He isn't allowed to fill tanks made before that date. An older tank, he said, can be fitted with a new valve "at a nominal cost" and re-certified for five years' use.

"A new tank is set up for 12 years and costs about \$29."

A refill, Wright said, giving 20 to 25 burning hours, is about \$12.

## Gas

Gas grills are the specialty of Michigan Fireplace and Barbecue in Troy, said Michael Super, store manager. Half of his sales are propane, half are natural gas, he said.

Gas, he said, offers "the convenience of getting ready to cook quicker. As little as three minutes compared to 25 minutes to heat the charcoal."

## You'll be OK with an OPD

An Overfilling Prevention Device is now required on propane tanks used for barbecue grills. This is a new provision of the existing safety code developed by the National Fire Protection Association.

According to information from NFPA, "the OPD shuts off the flow of gas into a cylinder when 80-percent capacity has been reached. This limits the potential for release of gas when the cylinder is heated, averting a fire hazard or personal injury."

NFPA advises that many filling outlets have the capacity to retrofit or recycle obsolete cylinders.

If your cylinder has either a round or star-shaped handwheel, it does not have the required valve. A new OPD valve has a triangular handwheel, according to the NFPA information, although early production OPD cylinders weren't triangular but were stamped OPD on the brass valve body.

In cooking time, Super said, charcoal has an advantage over propane.

"Charcoal heats to 800 degrees and gas to 650. Infrared heats to 1,600."

Natural gas, Super said, eliminates the need to refill tanks.

"You can hook up a natural gas grill on a cart with a quick-disconnect hose at a wall outlet so you can store the grill in the garage and take it when you move."

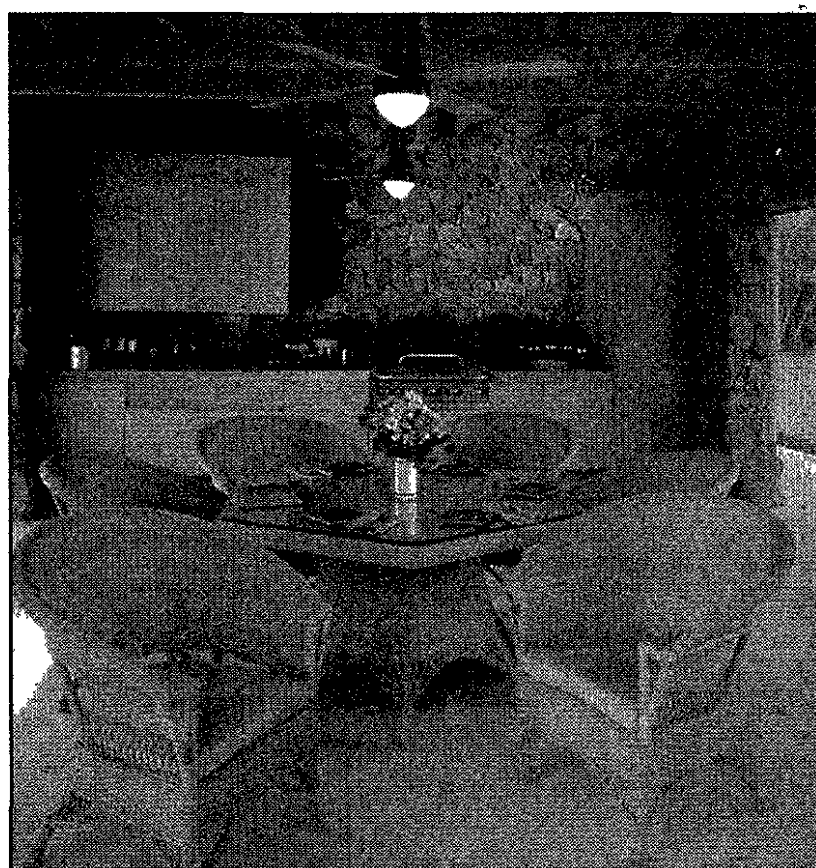
At Super's store, propane grills range from a basic model at \$300 up to a completely stainless steel infrared unit at \$6,000.

"You could serve 80 or more with no trouble," he said.

It's possible, he said, to run up the cost of the \$300 grill with accessories.

"Sideburners are nice to have. Warm the beans or the sauce. Cook the corn. You can get a griddle for pancakes and eggs. Deep fryers, steamers, woks. You can get an electric rotisserie for \$45. A cast-iron dish to hold damp wood chips under the cooking grids."

But consider how much money you'll save buying a gas grill because you won't have time for wine.

very popular for the past eight or 10 years," Chila said. "It always comes up with fashion."

Added Krawczyk: "They are now made with sunblocker rather than just sun filters to protect against skin cancer."

Chila and his family own the 21-year-old Casual Concepts and see many fast fads. What was considered "in" a while back has now become the "in" thing again.

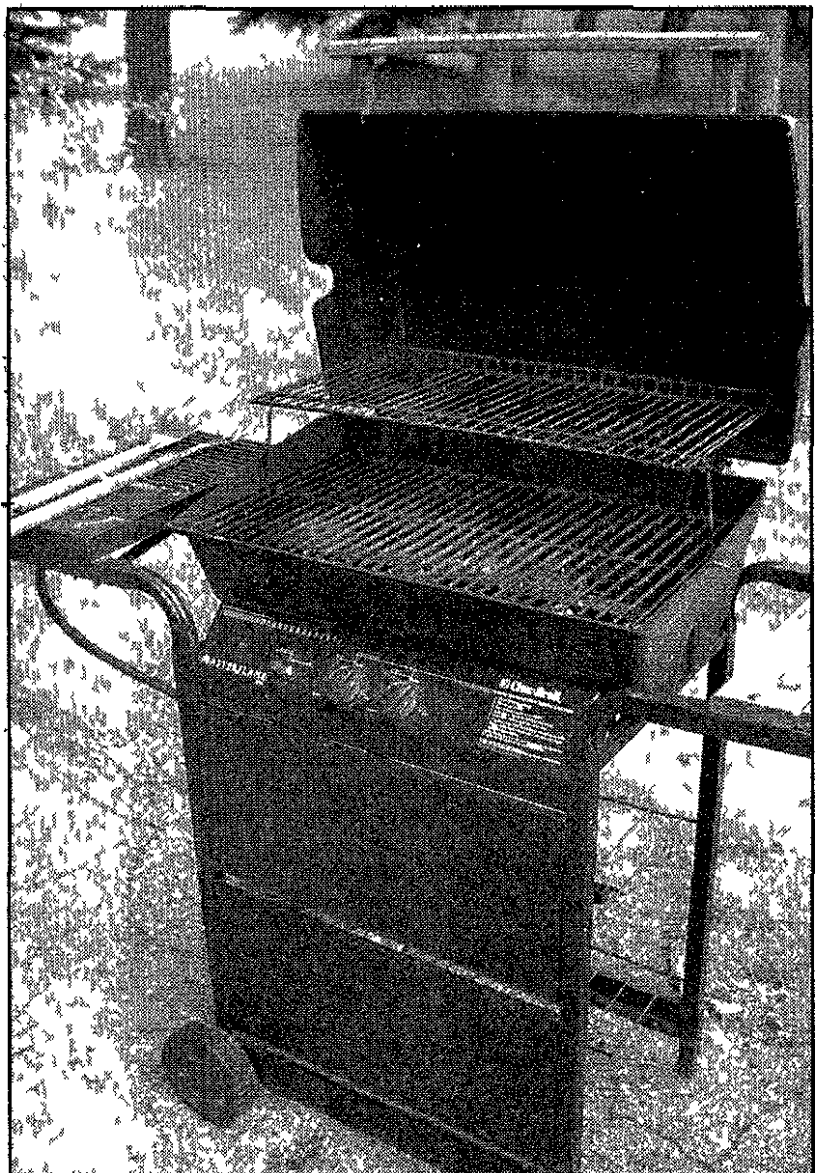
"They are reverting to the classic looks," Chila said. "Cast aluminum furniture has been very popular in the past few years. It doesn't rust. It's almost like toothpaste. It's hollow in the middle and lightweight. People want something lightweight that they can move around."

Krawczyk said brighter colors are popular too. The classic hunter green and black iron fur-

niture is still stylish, but shoppers are looking for brighter colors like silver, light green and taupe in that material. For slings and cushions bright colors and patterns are replacing solid patterns and beige tones. Sling-back style recliners that are LazyBoy style, complete with ottomans are a new fun trend, Krawczyk said. Consider them the modern-day hammock.

The other trend Krawczyk noticed is that because the backyard is a cherished sanctuary for today's family, people are willing to spend a little extra money on the furniture. Quality intricate tables with faux slate, or even real slate tops, aluminum mesh, rattan, and other materials aren't necessarily cheap.

"People aren't looking to replace their furniture every two years," said Krawczyk.

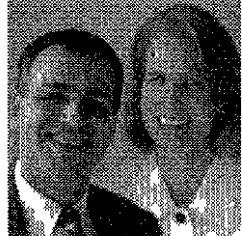

# Dogs should also be screened for elbow dysplasia

**Q. Our 8-month-old Labrador retriever was recently diagnosed with elbow dysplasia. We chose a breeder very carefully to avoid getting a dog prone to hip dysplasia. We didn't know we should have asked the breeder if her dogs had elbow problems, too. We are very concerned as we learned that our dog needs elbow surgery. What can you tell us about elbow dysplasia?**

lameness in juvenile large and giant breed dogs. Elbow dysplasia has received a great deal of attention in recent years due to the realization that elbow disease has a hereditary basis.

Elbow dysplasia is a disorder of the elbow joint which involves formation of bone fragments or cartilage tears within the joint. These lesions form due to abnormal growth of the bones of the front legs when your dog is approximately 4-6 months of age. These abnormal pieces of bone and cartilage, when present in the elbow, cause your dog discomfort.

A dog with elbow dysplasia is

usually lame in one or both front legs and may limp after activity or following a long nap. Arthritis of the elbow joint is a complication of elbow dysplasia and unfortunately is a life-long condition. Your veterinarian may be able to diagnose elbow dysplasia based on a physical examination and elbow x-rays. Even with x-rays and an orthopedic examination, the diagnosis is sometimes hard to establish.

Elbow dysplasia is a broad term which includes several conditions: fragmented coronoid process, ununited anconeal process, or osteochondritis dissecans. These may occur alone or in conjunction with one another.

Treatment of elbow dysplasia involves surgical removal of the bone fragments or cartilage tears. Surgical specialists use arthroscopes to explore the

elbow joint and remove the offending pieces of bone or cartilage. Arthroscopic surgery is less invasive than traditional surgery and results in a faster recovery and less arthritis.

Does your dog need surgery? If you elect not to have surgery performed to treat elbow dysplasia, your dog's arthritis will become more severe over time. Once arthritis of the elbow becomes extensive, surgical treatment is of little benefit as the troublesome pieces of bone or cartilage cannot be removed. Unfortunately, this usually results in a lifetime of lameness. Medical therapy consisting of weight management, anti-inflammatory and joint protective drugs, and exercise restriction is used in conjunction with surgery or when surgery is no longer an option. When arthritis

is severe and conventional surgery is not effective, elbow joint replacement surgery can be performed.

Both hip and elbow dysplasia are congenital problems and we discourage the breeding of animals affected with these conditions. Most breeders conscientiously screen their dogs for hip dysplasia and don't use dogs with questionable hips in their breeding lines. Breeders should also screen their dogs for elbow dysplasia!

The Orthopedic Foundation for Animals evaluates x-rays of canine hips and elbows for the presence or absence of hip and elbow dysplasia. The OFA keeps a registry of dogs 24 months of age and older with hip and/or elbow dysplasia and will grade your dog's hips and elbows based on the severity of changes within

the joint. Breeds that have been shown by the OFA to be at high risk for elbow dysplasia are rottweilers, Bernese mountain dogs, German shepherd dogs, and Newfoundlands. In addition, we have seen a great number of Mastiffs with dysplastic elbows.

As always, if your dog is limping with what may appear as a sprain, we advise that you consult your veterinarian as soon as possible. Early treatment of elbow dysplasia results in fewer long-term complications.

His approach is unusual as he discusses color, scale, time, light and architecture as we visit the featured gardens. This book will probably change the way you look at plants and design.

Hartlage, currently curator and director of the Elisabeth C. Miller Botanical Gardens in Seattle, Wash., shares many private and public gardens that he has admired and carefully designed, and explains how they evolved. I was intrigued with the garden that contained 1,800 bowling balls!

The ideas are indeed bold and dramatic, while the bright photographs shout at you and encourage the use of something different, all the while following good principles of garden design.

Did you know that when Thomas Edison needed a suitable material for a light bulb filament, he used carbonized bamboo? This, and many other uses for the plant, are included in *Bamboo for Gardens*, Ted Jordan Meredith (Timber Press, \$39.95), the complete guide for growing one of the more than 354 varieties that grow in this country, in the garden or as houseplants.

Meredith tells how to choose, grow, buy, propagate, harvest, control and dispose of this versatile plant. He began to study and grow bamboo because he wanted a privacy fence. From that small beginning, this informative book resulted.

**Informative series**

I never cease to be amazed at the amount of information packed in the Brooklyn Botanic Garden's 21st Century Gardening Series.

The books (\$9.95 each) generally follow the same outline with guest writers sharing their expertise. A collection of these handbooks makes an excellent library without too much expense.

*Essential Tools* gives the lowdown on what tools do, which are the most necessary, and those that are helpful even though they aren't used often. Equipment for seed starting, to irrigation, to lighting rounds out this book. Look for my friend Kip Smith's comments about her favorite tools.

# Avoid contractor disputes with clear communication

(AP) - It's the regrettable underside of home repair and improvements: homeowners and contractors who disagree with each other on any of a variety of issues.

So, how can disagreements be resolved to everyone's satisfaction?

According to The Home Service Store, conflict resolution can be avoided with clear expectations and good communication. Should arguments end up in front of a court, a paper trail of what was done and said could make all the difference.

Usually a job starts off pretty well. Homeowners are excited, the estimates are in and everyone has signed off on the job," says Laurie Gammell of HSS.

But things don't always go as planned.

When homeowners clearly state their expectations for workmanship, job schedules, and budget, it sets a clear limit for contractors to follow. Such pre-emptive communication is the best answer to head off arguments before they start. During the interview process, homeowners and contractors do well to level with each other on expectations and rules of the job for the project.

Typical areas of complaint involve workmanship, scope of work to be done, and budget.

Workmanship issues can be resolved by involving outside inspectors to independently assess the quality of work.

Homeowners should defer to the judgment of a professional on many scope-of-work jobs. For instance, a homeowner might think a leaky roof is easily fixed.

yet it might involve much more than is visible to the untrained eye. A contractor might find a poor subsurface or materials at fault.

Both sides should stick to a detailed budget that is agreed upon in advance. Homeowners can avoid extra expense if they steer clear of expensive change orders. A change order is a mid-project change in materials or work that drives up the material and labor costs of the job. Homeowners often are shocked by these new expenses and the contractor usually is blamed - even if the request is out of the contractor's control.

Gammell recommends homeowners solve problems as they occur. Trying to solve workmanship, schedule or budget issues after the fact is always tough. It's easier to create a win-win situation if you deal with things at the point of the problem.

Gammell suggests homeowners avoid payment of the entire job before it starts. Pay contractors in phases, or as certain materials are needed to complete portions of the work. ## A new name, a new life, I'm moving on

**"H**1, this is Keely Wygonk, no Kaleski, how can I help you?"

Excuse me, I'm having a little identity crisis - a new name, a new life

My husband David and I would have been married 20 years on June 26. He was diagnosed with Acute Myelogenous Leukemia on Labor Day weekend nearly two years ago. We were shocked, and hopeful when he went into remission on Oct. 2. But he was readmitted to the hospital for more treatment Oct. 24, and died Dec. 17, 2000. His death was unexpected. Instead of planning Christmas dinner, I planned a funeral, and buried David on Dec. 21.

On Dec. 22 my brother Mike took me to the emergency room at Henry Ford Hospital. I was devastated, having trouble breathing, and wondered how I would get through Christmas without David. Leukemia strengthened our marriage, and caused us to re-evaluate our priorities. We made plans to travel, spend more time with family and friends, and talked about how precious and fragile life is.

After being examined by a doctor who wrote prescriptions for drugs to calm my anxiety and help me sleep, I talked to a therapist. It was the beginning of my journey to discover - "who is Keely?"

She told me that part of my life had ended, and another begun. "Look at photo albums to try and remember the person you were before you got married," she suggested. "What do you like to do? Are there things you used to do that you stopped doing after you got married?" Women don't mean to, but they give up pieces of themselves after they get married. It was the truth, and it hurt.

As a child I enjoyed camping with my dad and brothers, but stopped because David wasn't a camper. When I went back to school to work on my MBA I stopped playing clarinet in the Hamtramck Community Band because it meant one more night away from home. I wanted my marriage to work because most of the marriages in my family failed. My parents are divorced, and so were their parents. I allowed a distance to grow between me and my family because David wasn't comfortable around them.

But that changed after the funeral. My family rallied around me, and it felt good. I got together with my family more now than I did when I was married. Every Friday there's a card in the mailbox waiting for me from my dad. He's always telling me I'm doing great and that he's proud of everything I have and will accomplish.

I've started to build a new life and reconnect with parts of me that got lost. I joined the Farmington Community Band, bought a touring bicycle and biked across Wisconsin with my dad, Mike and about 1,000 other people, lost over 60 pounds, replaced all my size 16 clothes with size 8, and let my short hair grow long. I was always the tall skinny girl, but I gained weight after I got married because we didn't lead an active lifestyle.

When I tell people I'm 43 they don't believe it. I've gotten carded at bars, and have begun dating. Six months ago I decided to go back to my maiden name - Kaleski. It's not easy, you have to go to court, and prove you're not changing your name for fraudulent purposes.

My hearing was Thursday, May 16. The judge asked me why I wanted to change my name, and I told her because my husband died and I wanted to go back to my maiden name. Then I cried. She wished me luck, and I left the courtroom feeling happy and sad at the same time.

David and I never had children. I graduated from Michigan State University on June 12, 1982 and walked down the aisle with him on June 26. At the time I said "oh well, I'm just trading one Polish name for another." Kaleski is my family name, and I'm proud of it. In 1998 I met my Polish

## High hopes for high notes

### Plymouth voice teacher is a hit with students

A Plymouth business woman may have just what you need if the sight of a microphone makes your heart flutter and you long for a moment in the spotlight whenever you see a karaoke machine.

Norma Atwood, owner of Village Music, expects to meet a lot of "wannabe" singers who never had the chance to develop their voices in a new class she's offering, *Shower Singing in Public*.

The three-hour seminar is geared toward amateur teenage and adult singers, who will learn technical exercises using playful games in jazz, pop and show music to understand breath control, alignment, resonance, articulation, free breath flow and performance anxiety.

"Maybe they've been singing in choirs or in the shower and they want to learn how to use their voices properly and perform, but they aren't confident enough to call a voice teacher," explained Atwood, who bought the national franchise two months ago and will begin classes this summer.

Atwood, who lives in Canton, has taught private voice lessons for more than 15 years in Ohio and Michigan. She has taught Kindermusik, a playful approach to teaching rhythm and basic music skills for newborns to 7 year olds for 11 years.

*Shower Singing in Public* is to encourage people to sing and to 'have fun,' said Atwood, who last year battled two bouts with cancer. During the treatments, she vowed to achieve two goals - develop a singing class and cut a CD, with a mix of musical theater and classical songs, that she hopes to release in September.

Atwood comes to these challenges with what she often refers to as a "passion" experience that began when she was 8 years old and attended the New England Conservatory of Music.

She spent much of her married life raising three daughters with her husband, David, who was forced to relocate the family many times while he was in the Army and later when he accepted transfers with Ford Motor Company.

#### Miss Norma

While in Michigan Atwood's students know her as "Miss Norma" for her work as director of music and children's music ministry at several local churches, including Prince of Peace Lutheran Church in Westland and First United Methodist Church in Ann Arbor.

More recently Atwood worked as director of music education at Arnoldt Williams Music in Canton until it closed. She needed a place to continue teaching and decided to open Village Music in Plymouth's Old Village in 1998.

Nautical decor fill the walls of the studio and is a visual reminder of Norma and David's motto "We live on Cape Cod and we work in Michigan." They recently bought a summer home in their beloved East Coast. Meanwhile, Atwood continues to bring music to peo-

ple of all ages and ability levels.

Carina Gaynier of Livonia learned about Atwood and Village Music from reading an article in the *Observer & Eccentric* Newspapers a few years ago and has become a big fan.

Her son, Mitchell, 7, recently graduated from the Kindermusik program Atwood taught. Her daughter, Hannah, 5, is taking classes and her youngest child, Benjamin, 18 months, was enrolled in his first class.

Music isn't just for the children in the

Gaynier family. Gaynier recently took voice lessons because she was asked to sing at a wedding.

"Her reputation precedes her," Gaynier said. "Everywhere I go I hear about Norma."

Atwood's oldest student was 75.

"He came here, because he wanted to make a taped cassette for his daughter," she said explaining the man was battling cancer. "He said, 'If I can learn one thing, it would be worth it.' He got his tape and reinforced everything that I

was doing."

Charlie Fleetham, of Farmington Hills, began taking singing lessons with his daughter, Chelsea, a 15 year old North Farmington High School student who perfected her singing so well she was given a solo performance during a school concert last winter.

Fleetham decided a couple of years ago during a Hawaiian cruise that he wanted to take singing lessons when he watched his son, Derek, 10 at the time singing karaoke.

"He was so bad I finally went up and helped him, and I felt like a frog being dissected," said Fleetham. "I started calling around and Norma told me to come in. She said, 'Let's see how we get along. I was so bad, and I really had no vision. She helped me discover a skill I never knew I had.'"

It's been a real process of discovery. I'm still not that good, but she continues to encourage me and help me find a way to express myself."

Fleetham, who said he can sing along now with almost every tune and "sound OK," recently bought a karaoke machine for his family.

#### New skill

"For me the biggest benefit has been the ability to do this with my kids," he said. "We sing songs together and it's a blast. I never would have known how to approach it." He credits Atwood with giving him this new skill.

At the airport recently Atwood said three people came up to her and referred to her as "Miss Norma." With her CD and *Shower Singing in Public* classes, Atwood hopes to continue an evolution back to just "Norma."

"It's a way for me to find myself again," said the grandmother of three.

"My whole interest in music is that I want people to feel the passion," said Atwood, who graduated from Northeastern University in Boston with a bachelor of arts degree in theater arts and minors in music and biology.

Her theater work includes performing with June Lockhart in *No Sex Please I'm British* in a dinner theater production in Ohio. She is also the director, founder and performer in *Variations I & II*, a woman's vocal performing group in Ohio and Michigan.

Atwood went on to receive a post-baccalaureate in music education from Akron University and took graduate voice studies at the University of Alabama.

As a young college student, Atwood thought she would become a doctor. It turned out that all the biology and other "ology" classes, as she refers to them, helps her to better understand the body and how it works to create music. She has spent most of her life sharing that knowledge.

"Everyone who comes here (to Village Music), we consider family."

## Livonia singer pens lyrics for 'Somewhere in Time'

In the 22 years since it was first released, *Somewhere in Time* has gained somewhat of a cult film status among hopeful romantics.

The story, which was filmed on Mackinac Island, allows a character played by Christopher Reeves to travel backward in time to find his true love.

Over the years, multiple Web sites devoted to the film have sprung up and some devotees even make pilgrimages to the northern Michigan island where they reenact the script.

*Somewhere in Time* also caught the fancy of Livonia resident Tom Morgan. Inspired by a muse named Anne Grobosky, Morgan put lyrics to the movie's theme music.

Jordan, who now runs an accounting firm in Ann Arbor, has assisted Morgan with the business side of the compact disc release. He said *Somewhere in Time* is just beginning to make some money for its designated charities.

"It's been very modest," Jordan said. "We're not talking tons of money, but it displays the talents of the Ford chorus and gives us a forum to work in."

In the past seven years, the chorus has embarked on three tours of Europe as well as tours of Michigan and the eastern United States.

The European trips have included visits to Germany, France and Italy, where the group sang for the pope.

One of the group's current major undertakings is the recording of a full-length compact disc called *Liberty*, which contains patriotic songs and is in the process of being recorded in a Houghton Lake church.

"The whole chorus is really excited about it," Morgan said. "It's a very spiritually uplifting CD and when people listen to it they're going to be very proud they're Americans. It instills a feeling in you that's kind of hard to describe."

Morgan said he first became interested in singing in public in 1975 when friends urged him to go onstage at a local bar to sing a rendition of the Everly Brothers' *Cathy's Clown*. Morgan went over big and was asked back again.

Discouraged from singing in bars by his former wife, Morgan joined a church choir. Not long

after that, a friend at Ford encouraged him to join the company's chorus.

Even though he no longer works at Ford and runs his own heating and cooling business, Morgan has stayed with the chorus. It's something he wouldn't readily give up, he said.

"I love to sing in the chorus," Morgan said. "It's like a big family. Everybody kind of looks out for each other and it's real nice."

And the chorus is also about helping others, which is something Morgan expects to do with the proceeds of *Somewhere in Time*.

"I play Santa Claus and I go to those hospitals and I see those children," Morgan said. "I wanted to do something for the children."

According to Morgan, the Ford Motor Company Chorus is looking ahead to a busy spring and summer that will include local shows as well as a tour of northern Michigan and the east coast to promote *Liberty*.

Morgan said the east coast tour will include stops at West Point and Annapolis.

He's also working on getting the chorus to Ireland for a concert in St. Patrick's Cathedral at Trinity College in Dublin.

"Right now I think it's time to realize how lucky we are to live in this country," Morgan said. "Even though a lot of bad things happen, it's still a nicer place to live than just about any other place in the world."

I felt a strong sense of belonging, generations of Kaleskis grew up in that village and still live there today. I used to think there was something odd about my family because everyone, even my dad's siblings, and my little brother, got divorced. Mom's an only child. Now I know better. I spent my first New Year's Day alone with my little brother and his second wife. He made meatloaf for dinner and we watched a really dumb movie with his step children. It was one of the nicest New Year's Days I can remember. On

the way home I said, "thank-you God for giving me my family back."

I love my in-laws, but as I began reconnecting with my family, and "Keely," I felt less of an affiliation to the Wygonik family. I wanted to be a Kaleski again, part of the clan.

Change is part of life, you can't stop it any more than you can stop seasons from changing. But you should never change yourself to make someone else happy. It was an important lesson to learn.

I've embraced change, and am open to new experiences. On June 26 I'll be on my bicycle with 700 people somewhere between Stevensville and Luna Pier. It's the first

vacation I've ever taken alone. I don't know anyone who's going on this trip, but am sure I'll have lots of new friends when the bus drops us off in Ann Arbor on June 29.

David's gone, but not forgotten, he'll always be a part of me. Sometimes I feel his presence, and it's always peaceful and loving. I'm not afraid of death or life anymore. I held David when he died, and know that death is cold and still. Life is warm and full of possibilities, something to enjoy and cherish.

# Look past husband for cause of insomnia

**Q: My husband and I have been married for 11 years and have a fairly good relationship. Our problem is our sleeping patterns. My husband is self-employed and nocturnal. He schedules his business appointments in the afternoon, and then works on his computer until the wee hours of the morning. I have a high-pressure day job, where I am required to be at work early to attend meetings with clients. I can't fall asleep until my husband is in bed, and the house is quiet. When I've spoken to him about my concerns, he says "it's your problem." How can I get my husband to respect my needs and come to bed at a decent hour?**

■ Try going to bed at approximately the same time every night, avoiding naps during the day, eating late meals or watching TV late into the night. The key to natural sleep is in patterns. Try keeping track of your sleep-wake patterns for the next week, working to regulate your times of rest.

■ Stress is a common thief of sleep. Assess the areas in your life where stress is present but likely to pass (work stress, death in the family, a move to a new home). Compare those to long-term difficulties that will require some type of change on your part. Insomnia is your brain's way of trying to resolve your problems even when you're lying down! A therapist can help you assess your stress level, help you develop adequate coping skills, and steer you toward resolution.

You wanted to know how to get your husband to respect your sleep needs. You could try separate bedrooms, but finding the solution for your insomnia would be a better solution for you both.

A. It sounds like you're experiencing a classic case of disturbed sleep, better known as insomnia. Insomnia can have many causes and sorting out the reason you can't sleep can be tough. Here are a few places to start:

■ Depression is an overlooked cause of insomnia. Are you experiencing additional symptoms of low self-esteem, weight gain or loss, flat feelings, or loss of interest in things you used to enjoy? If so, undiagnosed depression could be your culprit.

A therapist who specializes in mental health issues can determine if you are clinically depressed. They may suggest an antidepressant medication, in addition to therapy, to facilitate sleep and treat depressive symptoms.

■ Stimulants and depressants in our every day diet can disturb our sleep-wake cycle. Caffeine in coffee, colas, and chocolate give us energy and pep us up.

Being keyed up in the evening we look for a way to relax. Alcohol is often a choice because it can bring on unconsciousness but the sleep is not rejuvenating and we wake up feeling tired. Try eliminating caffeine from your diet as well as alcohol to allow your normal sleep-wake cycle to kick in.

■ Many people think they are too tired to exercise, but moderate exercise has been shown to increase restful sleep.

Often our brains feel worn out because our jobs are mentally taxing, but our bodies are not physically tired.

Start a regular routine of moderate exercise three times a week, alternating between aerobic activity and muscle building exercises such as weight training. Your brain and body will

Chrissy O'Malley of Birmingham has done her share of cardiovascular training.

Today, she takes three classes in Pilates, a fitness method gaining in popularity, every week, and enjoys working out more than ever.

And the results, well, simply astonish her.

"I can't believe the amount of strength I have," said the 31-year-old O'Malley, who began Pilates classes in November when The Pilates Institute of Birmingham opened. "This works out my entire body."

The appeal of Pilates lies with the fitness method's philosophy. Development of core body strength, particularly in the abdominal region, through slow, controlled movements. But along with strength, is improved balance and a long, lean, dancer's physique.

The fitness method was created in the 1920s by Joseph H. Pilates. Widely used by dancers since the 1940s, it struck mainstream fitness circles about a decade ago, making its way from California and New York to the Midwest.

**More than results**

**Method without madness**

*Pilates gains favor with among fitness buffs*

"Pilates is a good overall workout, and you don't leave hurting," says Tracy Tripp, 35, of Bloomfield Hills. A former personal trainer, Tripp also takes classes at the Pilates Institute of Birmingham.

Oakland County now hosts a handful of Pilates studios where students can enroll in classes using specialized equipment.

The Reformer, a bench with straps and a sliding mechanism, is the most commonly used Pilates machine and looks similar to equipment used in physical rehabilitation centers.

One studio, Equilibrium Mind Body Fitness in Bloomfield Hills, offers certification to aspiring Pilates instructors.

Even mainstream gyms are getting in on the Pilates trend.

American Fitness in Waterford started offering Pilates mat classes about a year ago. Enrollment in the class, which is available both through the gym and Waterford Community Education, has steadily risen, said the gym's co-owner Pat H. Heath. "It kind of started out slow because it's so new for people," said Heath. "But the word is starting to get out and Pilates is getting more popular mostly because it's a mind/body workout," she said. "It really is the new thing."

Pilates is well-suited to an older gym user who can't take high-impact aerobics classes or run on a treadmill, said Sue

Reid, group exercise supervisor for Bally Total Fitness in the Detroit area. "The growth curve in fitness is now older," said Reid. "Besides, fitness is not grinding it out on the treadmill. It's about using mind and body together to create an overall fitness experience."

**Body and mind**

Like yoga, Pilates tends to calm the mind and lift spirits - another characteristic that appeals to today's exercisers. "Pilates epitomizes the holistic approach," said Wendy Johnson, owner of The Health of It, a Pilates studio in Beverly Hills.

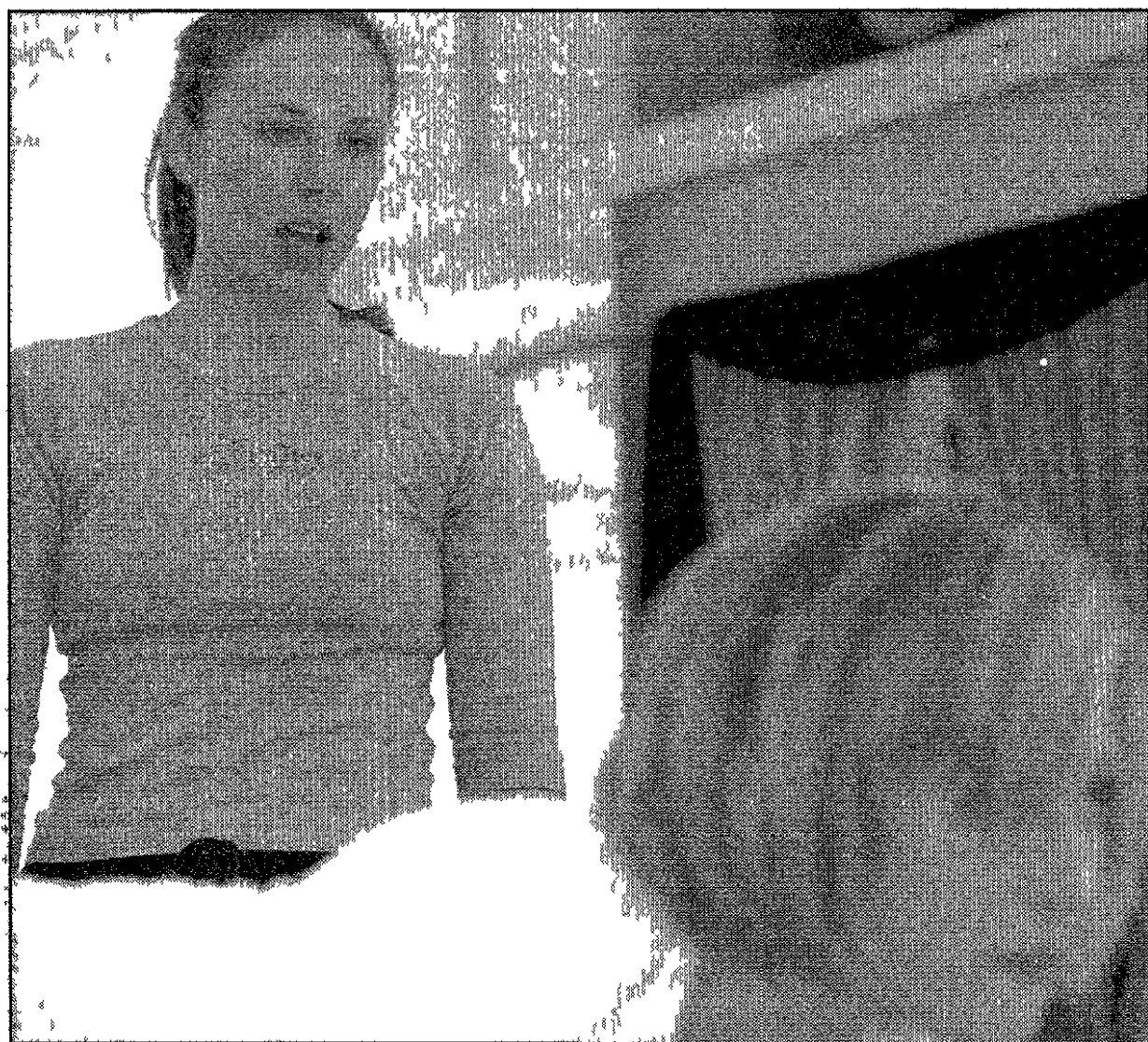

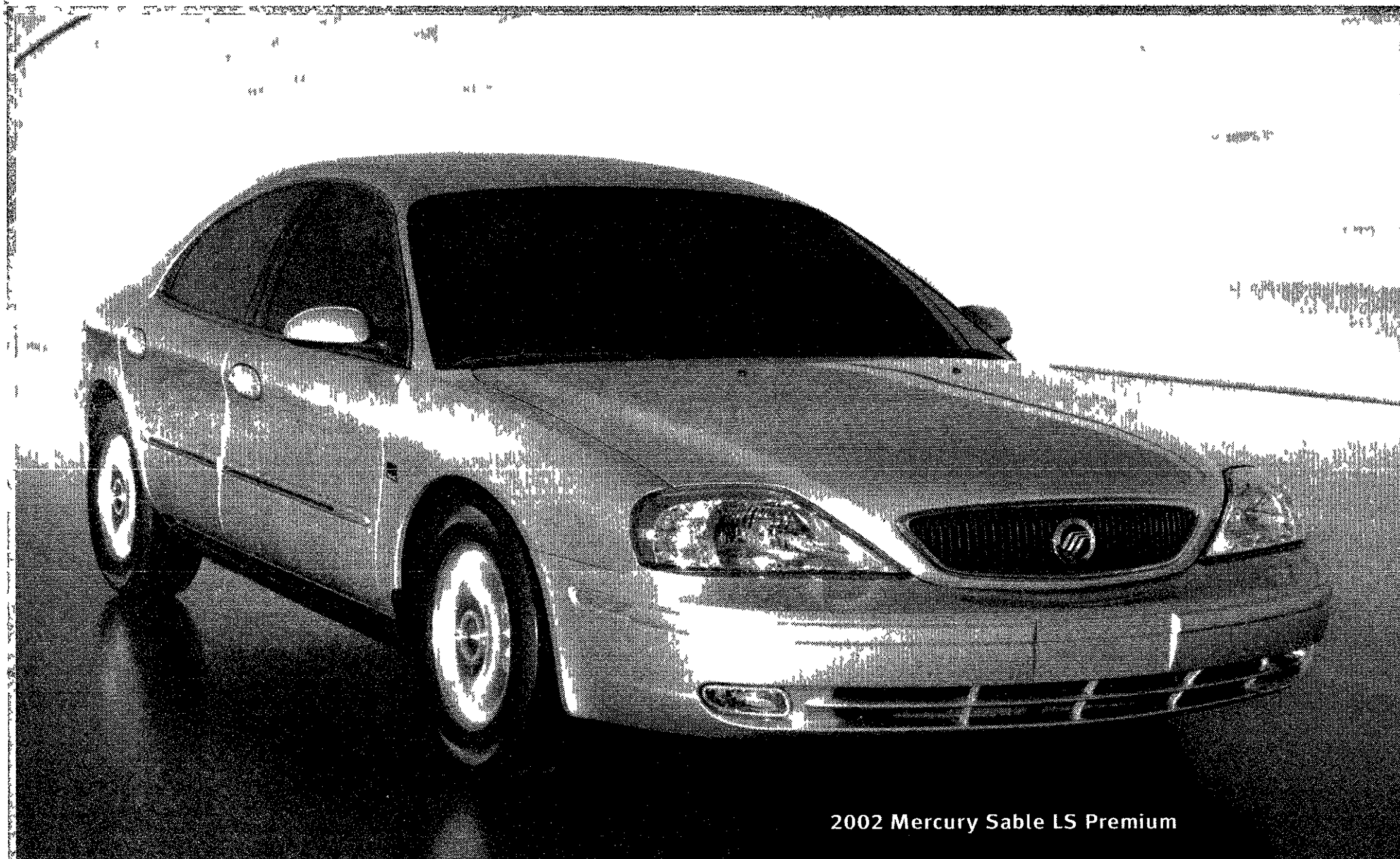
Concentration is required to isolate muscle groups and regulate breathing during movements.

These last two wins came with engines designed by Ilmor Engineering Inc., which is located in Plymouth. Penske owns 25 percent of Ilmor.

Castroneves' win last year took the

world by surprise. This year's win was surrounded by controversy.

Castroneves won on Sunday under a caution after Paul Tracy's attempt to pass him was ruled to have occurred after the caution had been issued.

Tracy and his Team Green protested the ruling both after the race and again on Monday, but to no avail.

Although the end result was pleasing to both Penske Racing Team president Tim Cindric and those at Ilmor, it wasn't the power of the engine that proved

decisive. Indeed, Castroneves was only 13th in qualifying.

"We had six cars there," said Ilmor representative Ian Hawkins, "but the cold weather affected them during qualifying."

What the Penske team, with its Ilmor engine, did better than its competitors was gauge its fuel. Cindric opted not to refuel after lap 158, gambling there would be another caution in that time.

Joyce Rose got open on the left side and lifted a pass into the middle, but the ball rolled out of bounds on the far side of the net before Erica Rose could get to it.

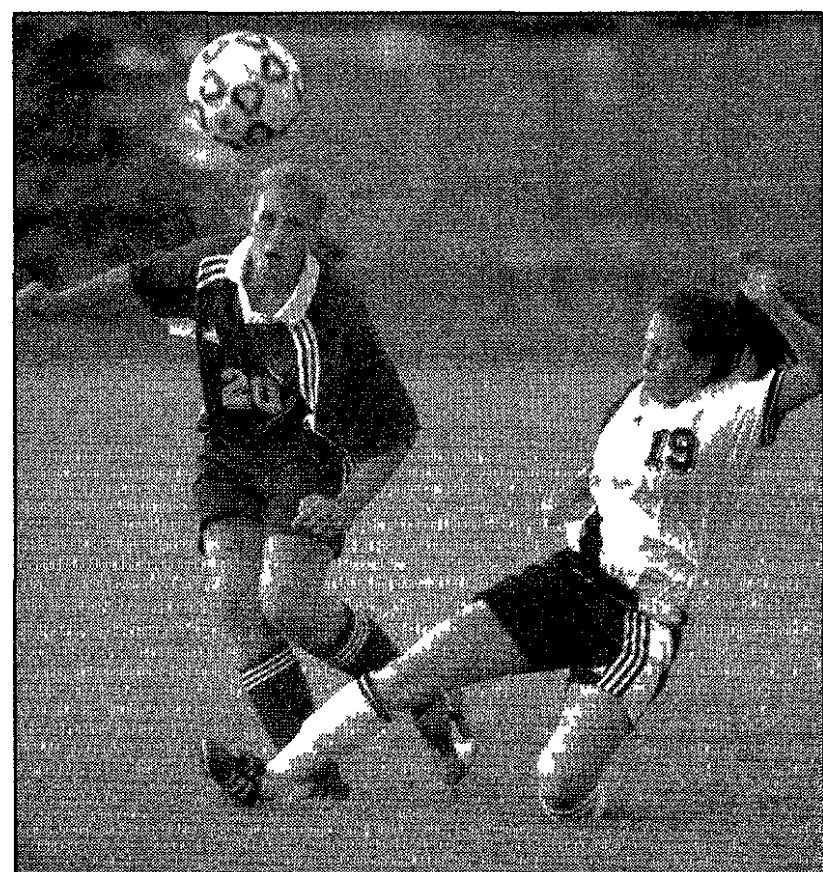
That resulted in a Farmington corner kick, but the Ladywood defense cleared the ball without a shot being taken.

# MHSAA submits new sports season-changing plan

Stating its belief that more students are helped and fewer are hurt by adding new tournaments than by switching existing seasons, the Michigan High School Athletic Association submitted to a Federal District Court a plan that would change the scheduling of its tournaments in three sports and add four new tournaments for girls.

## PREP SPORTS

The MHSAA has two weeks to reply. The U.S. District Court in Kalamazoo will conduct a hearing regarding the Plan on July 18.

Schools and their students wanted no change, said MHSAA Executive Director John E. "Jack" Roberts, "but no change is not an option for the court ordered plan. We had to comply with the Court's Order to place an equal number of tournaments in what the Court ruled are disadvantageous seasons and still respect the overwhelming sentiments of our membership to maximize participation by scheduling boys and girls in different seasons in basketball, Lower Peninsula golf, soccer, Lower Peninsula swimming & diving and tennis.

The Plan leaves three girls' sports and places three boys' sports in the District Court designated disadvantageous season. It puts three girls' sports and leaves only two boys' sports in the District Court designated advantageous seasons.

"We have gone beyond the Court's order to demonstrate further the intent of this organization and its member schools to promote opportunities for girls in athletics," said Roberts. "Decades ago schools scheduled sports seasons for girls in order to facilitate the fastest growth possible in girls' athletic opportunities and their efforts have proven successful in every one of the sports at issue in this case, Michigan's girls' high school sports participation rates are better than its eighth rank nationally in population for high school age girls."

The MHSAA also released the results of a survey of its membership conducted in late April regarding sports seasons. "The response was phenomenal," said Roberts. "In two weeks' time, more than 86 percent of our member schools responded with properly signed survey responses. This attests to their great interest in the issue and their concerns for the outcome."

Basketball is the sport that schools least want moved for either gender. Basketball is also

the sport that schools least want combined in the same season for boys and girls. No plan for season changes received majority support, but the option selected by the Council addressing golf, swimming & diving and tennis -

received the best response. "The Council listened to schools as well as it could," said Roberts. "Schools and their students really wanted no change, and there wasn't enthusiasm for any particular option. But the

Representative Council always takes its direction from the membership, and the membership has spoken.

"The part of this Plan that excites us is the part that does not disrupt schools, coaches and

student-athletes, but challenges the MHSAA office to come up with the resources to provide high quality tournaments for girls in four additional sports over two years."

The MHSAA's tournaments for golf, swimming & diving and tennis would be affected. The MHSAA's Lower Peninsula tournament in boys' golf would move to the spring, girls' golf to the fall, girls' swimming & diving would move to the winter, boys to the fall, and boys' tennis would move to the fall and girls to the spring. In the Upper Peninsula, the MHSAA's championship for girls' golf would move to the fall while boys' golf would remain in the spring, boys' swimming & diving would move to the fall, while girls' swimming & diving would remain in the winter, and the MHSAA's U.P. championships in boys and girls' tennis would reverse seasons as in the Lower Peninsula.

These changes are dependent upon the approval of the U.S. District Court in Kalamazoo later this summer, and none of the changes will occur if the MHSAA's appeal of the District Court's decision to the U.S. Court of Appeals is successful. On May 9, the Sixth Circuit of the U.S. Court of Appeals delayed until at least 2004-05 the District Court's ruling that seasons be realigned in 2003-04.

The MHSAA's plan also commits the association to starting four new post-season tournaments for girls before adding any new tournaments for boys. Two new tournaments would be initiated each year for two years, with the association choosing the four sports that serve its membership best from the following list of 12 sports: bowling, crew, equestrian, field hockey, figure skating, ice hockey, indoor track & field, lacrosse, powerlifting, synchronized swimming, water polo, and wrestling.

The Compliance Plan was approved by the MHSAA Representative Council during a recent meeting this morning and filed with the Federal Court. Plaintiffs have two weeks to respond to the Plan after which

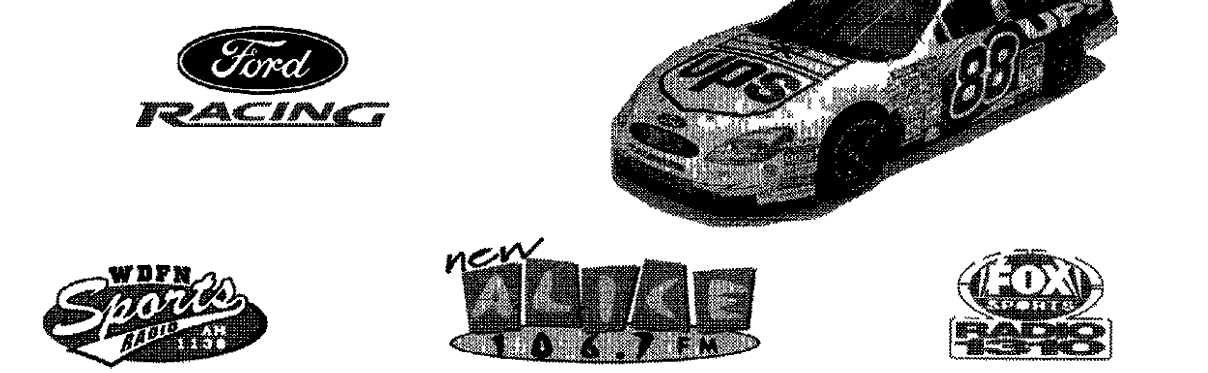

"The last two games have been a significant improvement in our team playing as a team," said Duggan. "The organization through the central midfield has been much better. They mark up quickly and there's great improvement in not giving the ball away."

That wasn't the case in a 2-1 overtime loss to the Chicago Fire Reserves in a match played 12 days ago. "Horrendous," was Duggan's description of his team's play in the midfield against the Fire. "And on both of their goals, our defenders left their marks."

Both the players and the coach — who, due in great part to NCAA regulations that forbid college players (who make up most of the Bucks' roster) from joining PDL teams before May 1, had just one week of practice together before the season-opener — are now becoming familiar with each other.

The Bucks took the lead for good five minutes into the second half when Shawn Lee, a defender from Trinidad and Tobago making his debut with the Bucks, pushed forward and scored. Unassisted. Nine minutes later Noonan scored again, this time with an assist from Justin Detter.

The Bucks' final goal came from John Swann, 17 minutes into the second half. Ryan Mack (from Birmingham Seaholm) assisted. Eric Pogue (Troy Athens) was in goal for the Bucks, he had five saves.

Gas mileage for these cars doubles when running under a caution.

Cundric's decision paid off, Castroneves finished the race with less than a gallon left in his tank.

Castroneves' ability to conserve fuel and the engine itself were also factors in the outcome. "It really came down to fuel economy," said Hawkins.

Castroneves averaged 166.5799 mph. His victory gave him the overall lead in the IRL driver's standings, Penske teammates Gil de Ferran and Felipe Giaffone are second and fourth, respectively.

Last year, Castroneves drove an Ilmor-designed Oldsmobile engine. Hawkins called this year's engine, a Chevrolet, "basically the same power plant." Both are loosely-based on the Aurora V8.

"We've been working on this for the last year," said Hawkins. "It's been under constant development, for both mileage and power."

Penske's, and Ilmor's, racing interests go well beyond the IRL. They also sponsor the Mercedes/McLaren team in Formula One, which finished first at the Monaco Grand Prix Sunday.

"It was quite a weekend," Hawkins said, laughing. "We're still high on Indy. We've got a lot of races left, but you've got to celebrate (the wins) when you get them, because you don't know when your next one will come."

Until last year, it wasn't certain if a Penske team would get another win at Indy, simply because it wasn't racing there. The Penske Racing Team was part of the CART (Championship Auto Racing Teams) circuit, from 1996 through 2000, it did not race at

Indy Penske, and Ilmor — which relocated to Plymouth from offices at Detroit Diesel in Redford in 1998 — returned to Indy last year, still racing for CART.

Because of a court ruling that limits the advertising of tobacco companies in sports, Marlboro, Penske's top sponsor, could not have its name on his car at last year's Indy 500 because it was an IRL (Indy Racing League) race and Penske was associated with CART (tobacco companies can advertise/sponsor in one circuit or the other, but not both).

The Penske Racing Team circumvented that by leaving CART and joining the IRL this year.

The move looks like a winner, for all those involved with Penske and Ilmor.

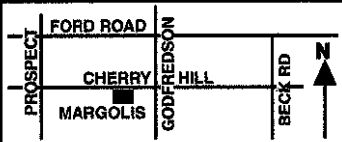

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Planning Commission of Plymouth Charter Township proposes on its own motion to amend Article XIX PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT OPTION as follows:

**ARTICLE XIX PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT OPTION**

**A. The PURPOSE** section is hereby proposed to be amended to add the ARC and OS ARC Districts to read as follows:

**PURPOSE:** It is intended by the Community that uses of high intensity shall be located in areas which will not adversely impact the orderly development of existing or future residential areas. Commercial office research testing and residential uses in structures beyond two (2) and two and one half (2½) stories in height are more than urban in nature and therefore could be in conflict with a specific development area and the general character of the Township of Plymouth if not properly regulated in regard to location relationship to adjacent land uses and development requirements. The Community has provided a MR Mid Rise District to provide for locations for these higher intensity uses separately or in combination in areas which will not impact the existing or future land uses of adjacent properties and the Community as a whole. The Community, however, recognizes that within the C 2 District, IND Industrial District, OS, Office Service District, OR, Office Research District and TAR Technology and Research Districts there may be sites which because of certain existing and specific factors, could be developed as a Planned Unit Development (PUD) beyond the 2 to 2½ stories without negatively impacting adjacent properties and the community as a whole.

It is understood that said developments may be consistent with the planning goals of the community only in specific locations under specific conditions, related to height bulk and location of buildings in accordance with sound planning and site plan principles. It is further the intent that any uses permitted by this option be compatible and consistent with the availability of utilities both existing and planned for the area in which the PUD is proposed. It is therefore intended that the PUD option permit flexibility in the regulation of land development encourage innovation in land use and variety in design, layout and type of structures constructed, achieve economy and efficiency in the use of land, natural resources energy and the provisions of public services and utilities, encourage useful open space, and provide better housing employment and shopping opportunities particularly suited to the needs of the residents of the Township of Plymouth in the C 2 Commercial District IND Industrial District, OS, Office Service District, OR, Office Research District and TAR Technology and Research Districts on parcels of five (5) acres or greater where the basic principles set forth in this article are met.

Further the PUD option shall also be available in the ARC Ann Arbor Road Corridor District and OS ARC Office Service Ann Arbor Road Corridor District subject to certain conditions applicable only to properties located within those districts. The purpose of allowing this flexibility within the Ann Arbor Road Corridor is to:

- A. Achieve a higher quality of development than would otherwise be achieved
- B. Encourage assembly of lots and redevelopment of outdated commercial properties
- C. Encourage in fill developments on sites that would be difficult to develop according to conventional standards because of lot shape or size, abutting development accessibility or other site features
- D. Ensure compatibility of design and function between neighboring properties
- E. Encourage developments in the ARC and OS ARC Districts on parcels of one (1) acre or greater that are consistent with the Township's Master Plan, the Ann Arbor Road Corridor Plan, the basic principles set forth in this Article and the conditions of Section 19 12B General Conditions for Sites in the ARC and OS ARC Districts

However it is not intended that the use of the PUD option in the ARC and OS ARC Districts should detract from the primary function and use of the Ann Arbor Road Corridor as a commercial area, but rather it is intended only to provide some flexibility for limited uses within the Corridor.

**B. SECTION 19.1, STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES** is hereby proposed to be amended to add the TAR, ARC and OS ARC Districts.

**C. SECTION 19 12, GENERAL CONDITIONS** is hereby proposed to be amended to incorporate the existing language of this section under a new sub section A entitled SITES IN THE C 2 IND, OS, OR and TAR ZONING DISTRICTS and amend Section 19 12 A 1 b 4 to add:

- 4) Facilities such as a licensed restaurant or bar may be permitted in an IND, C 2, OR, TAR and OS District when said facilities are attached to or occupy an integral part of a main structure within the Planned Unit Development. In reviewing this aspect the Commission and the Board shall find that the proposed restaurant or bar is consistent with the Purpose and Statement of Principles Sections of this Article.
  - (a) Research, testing and training uses including industrial or scientific research development and testing laboratories and offices
  - (b) Residential uses

**D. SECTION 19.12, GENERAL CONDITIONS** is hereby proposed to be amended to add a new sub section B entitled SITES IN THE ARC AND OS ARC DISTRICTS and provide subsections B 1 B 15 as follows:

- B SITES IN THE ARC AND OS ARC ZONING DISTRICTS**
  - 1 Permitted Uses for Sites in the ARC District
  - 2 Permitted Uses for Sites in the OS ARC District
  - 3 Site Area and Density Standards
  - 4 Maximum Building Height
  - 5 Building Setbacks
  - 6 Perimeter Yard Setbacks
  - 7 Open Space and Green Area
  - 8 Circulation Parking Loading and Access Management
  - 9 Utilities
  - 10 Landscaping
  - 11 Signs
  - 12 Streetscape Improvements
  - 13 Outdoor Lighting
  - 14 Sidewalks
  - 15 Elevators

**E SECTION 19 14, CONFLICTING ORDINANCES, and SECTION 19 15, VALIDITY** are hereby proposed to be deleted in their entirety.

**F SECTION 19 14, CONDOMINIUM PROJECTS** is hereby proposed to be added as a new section as follows:

**SEC. 19 14 CONDOMINIUM PROJECTS**

For any condominium proposed as a PUD the applicant shall provide a copy of the Master Deed and Condominium Association Bylaws for approval by the Township Board of Trustees. The condominium documents shall provide limits on use of common areas or open space for accessory structures such as swimming pools decks playground equipment and buildings. A plan shall be provided indicating the limits of such accessory structures within a defined envelope.

Prior to approval of the Final Development Plan the applicant shall submit the necessary documents to the Township Attorney for review and approval by the Board of Trustees. The Association documentation shall include provisions for the following at a minimum:

- 1 The conditions upon which the approval is based with reference to the approved Final Development Plan.
- 2 When open space or common areas are indicated in the development plan for use by the residents the open space or common areas shall be conveyed in fee or otherwise committed by dedication to an association of the residents and the use shall be irrevocably dedicated for the useful life of the residences and retained as open space for park recreation or other common uses.
- 3 A program and financing for maintaining common areas and features, such as walkways, signs lighting and landscaping.
- 4 Assure that trees waterways and woodlands will be preserved as shown on the Final Development Plan.
- 5 Assure the construction and maintenance of all streets and necessary utilities (including public water wastewater collection and treatment) through bonds or other satisfactory means, for any and all phases of the PUD. In the case of a phased PUD, this requirement shall be reviewed at the time of any final development plan approval.
- 6 Address any other concerns of the Township regarding construction and maintenance.

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Planning Commission of Plymouth Charter Township proposes on its own motion to amend Article XXXII, DEFINITIONS by adding definitions for "Apartment, Accessory," "Dwellings, Stacked Flats," as follows:

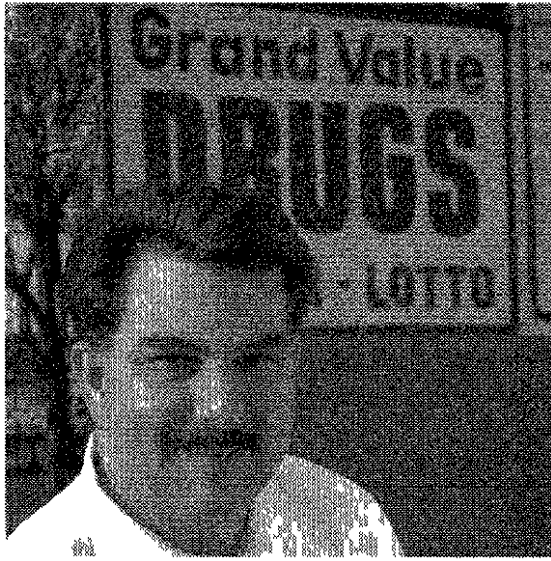

## On specifying lender source; 'flipping' on sale of house

I'm interested in buying a condominium unit, but the developer is pushing hard to get us to use a lender which the developer, I understand, controls.

Do I have any latitude in that regard as I am particularly interested in that unit?

Under Section 113 of the Condominium Act, as amended in 2001, a developer, builder and sales agent cannot require a purchaser to obtain financing exclusively from a specific lender

I have just been ripped off by a seller who sold me a house for a price which far exceeds its real value. I'm buying on a land contract and didn't get an appraisal. Is there anything I can do?

You may be the victim of a shady seller, who's referred to in some states as a "flipper," that is one who buys a house cheaply and then sells it to an unsuspecting home buyer for a price well in excess of real value

There have been cases in other states where a purchaser has been able to obtain damages for what is tantamount to fraud and which would appear to be a violation of the Consumer Protection Act

Consult with an attorney familiar with this new area of the law You may also wish to write to the attorney general to see if the consumer affairs department can offer you relief

## Oh, no!

# Your house is for sale and the adjacent property is a big mess

You've done everything you possibly could to get your home ready for sale

You've spruced up the yard, polished the windows, replaced the crumbling concrete porch steps, painted inside and out The place looks terrific and it's priced right, but there's no action

The reason is simple The house next door or the one behind the back fence or the one across the street out front is a mess

The grass is overgrown, full of weeds and dandelions Or clunker cars parked around the property give the impression of a repair shop or sales lot

Or peeling paint, well-worn shingles, clogged gutters and dilapidated windows bring to mind the children's book, *The House That Had Enough*

Rose Butkovich, a Realtor with GMAC Quality in Livonia, remembers taking a prospective buyer to a home where the next door neighbor, who had been at odds with the seller, "basically let everything go to hell"

"They didn't want anything to do with it," Butkovich said of her clients "They went into the house that was listed, and it was beautiful, but then again, the house next door was an eyesore"

Talk to any Realtor and you probably will get a similar story

"The first impression a buyer actually gets of a home sometimes includes the neighbor's yard," said Mary Savoie, an associate broker with Snyder Kinney Bennett & Keating in Birmingham

"We both know how important first impressions are A lot of times, sales mentally are made or broken right there," Savoie said

"I've had situations of junk cars or debris in the (adjoining) yard," said Marilyn Moir, associate broker with RE/MAX Village Professionals in Clarkston

"What it really means, like any other condition you face, is value is affected," Moir added "If you don't adjust for value, it will sit on the market longer It's an unfortunate situation"

"I think communication is the key... Depending on the relationship between the potential seller and annoying neighbor, you may be able to approach them... get some kind of understanding and they may... cooperate."

So now what?

"I think communication is the key," Moir said "Depending on the relationship between the potential seller and annoying neighbor, you may be able to approach them get some kind of understanding and they may be able to cooperate"

Offer to help, or better yet, promote a blitz of all homes and common areas on the block, Moir suggested Make it a social as well as a working event

"Organize a block party and organize a cleanup involving the whole neighborhood, so it's not personal," she said

Style counts big-time if you decide to approach a neighbor for that talk "Be gentle," Butkovich advised "Make subtle, careful suggestions Don't come up and say, 'Your place looks like crap' Keep them abreast about what's going on Don't let them find out (about the move) when they see the for-sale sign in your yard"

A beverage or some cookies to share while talking could set a good tone Savoie, who's been in the business nearly 30 years, has found that confronting the offending neighbor won't do much good

"I think it's mostly people who don't care about the aesthetics of their own surroundings," she said of scofflaws "Talking to them probably will offend them and make it more difficult I don't see that as a means of getting them to clean up"

Her solution - go to the code enforcement department in the municipality where you live Most cities and townships have laws about storing vehicles, running a business out of a garage and keeping grass and weeds under control

Also, many newer developments

have deed restrictions - rules and regulations - enforceable by a homeowner's association

Savoie recalled a problem in Birmingham with improvements that seemed to stall at a house behind a listing she had

"I started putting pressure on the city," she said "When I called, then they called the (offending) owner Finally, they threatened to ticket It was fixed I don't know whether you could do that in every community, but I bet you could"

Here are couple of other strategies

■ Elderly folks or persons with health problems may have difficulty maintaining their property They also may be more receptive to some friendly persuasion

Offer to make some inexpensive cosmetic repairs, trim the bushes and regularly mow their lawn and police their yard for debris between listing your house for sale and closing. In winter, offer to shovel snow off their sidewalks and porch

It could be time and money well spent

■ Consider erecting a high-quality privacy fence Again, a high-quality privacy fence

But first check with your local building department and homeowner's association to make sure you can do it and learn about any restrictions on height, materials and other construction standards

■ Send your Realtor over to talk to a recalcitrant neighbor A third party may be able to better reason and convince the neighbor that everyone will be better off with cooperation and a quicker move

Mr and Mrs Borrower were burned out on the renting scene They happened upon a beautiful doll house in the neighborhood of their dreams Excellent! The price was exactly in their target price range and they were ready to place an offer

Mr Seller, savvy on today's real estate trends, insisted that he would only entertain offers from borrowers who had been properly qualified by a

professional lending institution Anxious to lock up this gem, the Borrowers rushed off to get pre-qualified for a mortgage

To their dismay, they found that their credit report was blemished by unpaid medical collections placed shortly after their child's birth Further, Mr Borrower was infuriated by credit carnage from his previous marriage that should have been resolved per his divorce judgment years ago

Unfortunately, correcting credit reporting errors, and removing inaccurate information, can often take months Had they known earlier, they could have repaired their credit with the three major credit repositories - Experian, TransUnion, and Equifax

Alternatively, they could have turned to non-profit organizations, local or national credit repair companies, or their attorney for assistance Their costs and headaches would have varied greatly depending on the choice Sadly, all of these methods required time - a commodity which was no longer theirs

Their mortgage broker, a full-time loan officer, told them about some fascinating credit repair tools offered by the credit bureaus with whom he contracted Such programs, often called "Quick Fixes" or "Rapid Re-Scores," allowed him make fast, permanent credit repairs in a matter of only a few business days

To benefit from such tools, borrowers must be able to provide written documentation showing that the credit report information was wrongfully reported, and will usually pay about \$20 per repository for each item

A recent client of mine, a single mother, invested \$220 in credit repairs which allowed her to purchase a home for which she would not have otherwise qualified The Borrower family did the same thing

Cooperation keys smooth disposition of estate

(AP) — A parent's death can be devastating, taking a heavy emotional toll even on adult children

Then, to add to the grief, there's the difficult task of disposing of the estate — not just houses, securities and bank accounts, but a lifetime of possessions

In some ways, it's impossible to prepare for the process Just as it is difficult to predict what emotions will surface, there is no way to know in advance all of the family, practical or logistical problems that will arise as children sort through assets and belongings

Financial planners say disposing of an estate can be made much easier if parents have done some careful planning, not just leaving a will, but letting children know where bank and brokerage accounts and any real property are located

It can also be helpful if parents write what are known as testamentary letters, expressing their wishes about who gets the good china or the clock that's been in the family for generations
