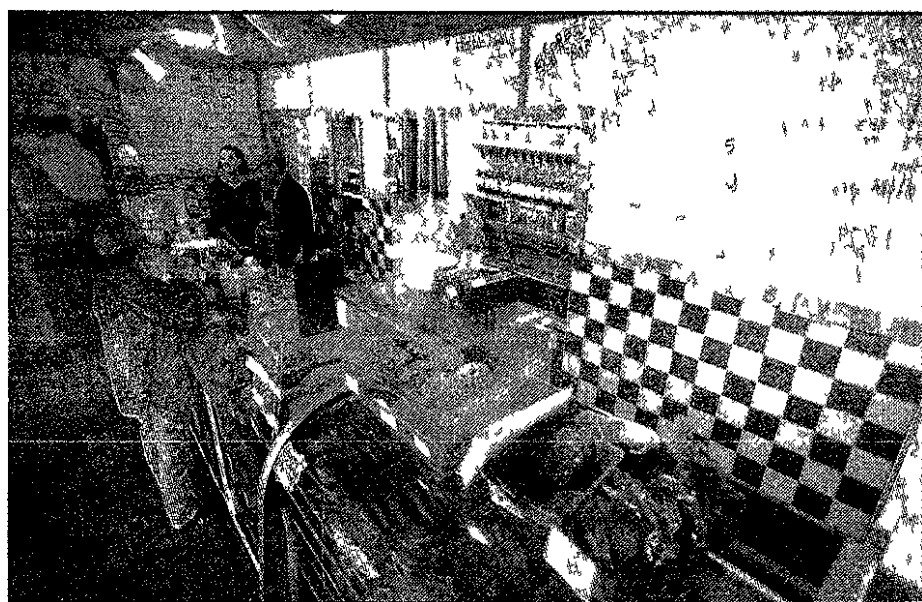
If the smaller coffee houses are fearful now that coffee giant Starbucks has opened its Plymouth doors they're hiding the fear pretty well.

## District eyes interim superintendent possibility

The search for a superintendent to run Plymouth-Canton Schools to replace Kathleen Booher may be over as quickly as it began.

Deputy Superintendent Jim Ryan is expected to be named interim superintendent after Booher officially leaves July 12, and could eventually take over the district permanently.

"I don't think we'll do a search process right away," said Elizabeth

Givens, president of the Board of Education. "I think the transition plan will have Jim Ryan stepping in."

Givens said she's discussed the idea informally with board members, who could take action at the June 25 board meeting.

"We could vote on a plan that would put Jim as the interim at that meeting," said Givens. "By July 12 we could have a contract completed and the plan in place."

"We would then evaluate the situa-

The Good Morning USA Fourth of July parade is looking for a few good men, women and children.

Meanwhile, Hill said there are plenty of new parade entries to go with some of the more popular acts returning for the sixth-annual Good Morning USA parade.

"We've got a circus wagon with a live leopard inside coming for the first time," he said. "And, we have a group called Fabulous Motown, which will be singing Temptations songs."

Some of the old standbys in this year's parade include Mark Randisi singing as Frank Sinatra, the Fifth Michigan Regiment Band, the drum line from Catholic Central, bands from Plymouth-Canton and Ypsilanti Lincoln high schools, plus Hill's own Briefcase Drill Team.

There will be approximately 90 entries in the parade. "We keep getting requests of groups wanting to be in the parade, but we don't want to

## Reception kickoff for women's museum

Wayne County Commissioner Lyn Bankes could barely contain her excitement after leaving the Small Business Association office at Schoolcraft College, because the Friday meeting brought the Phoenix Mill Museum one step closer to reality.

The SBA agreed Friday to help Bankes draw up a business plan for the museum project Bankes has been championing for years. On the heels of a successful kickoff reception Wednesday at the Plymouth Historical Museum, Phoenix Mill had a pretty good week.

"It's still a couple of years away," Bankes said of the museum. "But this is a very good start."

The museum, designed to honor Michigan working women

from 1919 through 1948, will be located on Northville Road between Five Mile and Hines Park. Right now, the Wayne County Road Commission has trucks and salt and other material stored there. Bankes said that constitutes the biggest hurdle for the Phoenix Mill Museum project.

"MDOT gave them that property for free, so we're going to have to find someone who will donate property to move them to," Bankes said. "We have to find an alternative site, and that's going to be difficult to do."

Once the road crews are moved, cleanup of the site will have to be done before the museum can move in. Bankes said she's got the commitment of the director of Wayne County roads to help do just that.

While that's the down side of the work remaining to be done, Bankes was highly encouraged

by the turnout for the reception Wednesday. More than 40 people attended, and heard speeches and presentations from various people.

Reception participants were handed some historical information, along with forms to become charter members and to make financial contributions. Though there was no overt attempt to collect money, the event raised more than \$500.

"And we didn't even ask for money," Bankes said. "That tells me people are very excited about this."

Another fund-raiser is set for October, with outgoing Wayne County Executive Ed McNamara and his wife, Lucille, chairing. Bankes hopes to get the newly elected executive, whomever it turns out to be, involved as well. "That would be a nice blend of the old and new," she said.

make it too long for the crowd," said Hill.

The Plymouth Downtown Development Authority and C D Sparling each contributed \$3,000. There are about a dozen sponsors who gave at least \$1,000 toward parade expenses.

### Merit awards

Better than 50 percent of Plymouth-Canton's 1,058 graduates earned Michigan Merit Awards, according to statistics released earlier this week.

According to the state, 273 of Salem High School's 525 graduates (52 percent) won the \$2,500 awards, given to students who either exceeded or met Michigan standards on all four sections of the MEAP test — mathematics, reading, science and writing.

Of Canton High School's 533 graduates, 284 (53.3 percent) earned the awards.

"I'm proud of the students receiving this scholarship and the teachers who have spent years preparing them for the future," said State Rep John Stewart, (R Plymouth Township), who added his congratulations earlier this week. "All

of their hard work has paid off. Having such a large number of students receive this award is a credit to our public school system that continues to provide excellent opportunities for our children."

# Auto-matic

## New Plymouth Super Center is one-stop shop for car care

When Drew Wolford was planning just what kind of business he wanted to build when he opened the Plymouth Super Center on Ann Arbor Road, he traveled all over the United States to look at similar centers.

When he opens his Plymouth store this week, Wolford will have just what he envisioned — an upscale, state-of-the-art automotive care center.

The Plymouth Super Center is set to open its doors early in the week, perhaps as early as Tuesday. Workers were feverishly putting the finishing touches on much of the colonial-style buildings over the weekend as Wolford, the vice president, and general manager Bob Turner got set to see what started in October with the ground breaking finally come to fruition.

"It's been years of planning and a lot of research," said Wolford. "We've been to facilities all over the United States to see what works and what doesn't. What we have here works."

What they have is broken up into several parts. There's your basic convenience store, which will feature the traditional convenience store fare. There's a "high-octane" counter which will feature cappuccino and coffee of various kinds and tastes. And there's a food court that will feature sandwiches, hot dogs, pizza and other items, including a nine-flavor milk shake machine, a 12-head soda pump and four flavors of frozen drinks.

There's also a bakery section that will feature donuts and the center's own cinnamon rolls, muffins, cookies, brownies and Wolford's favorite — fresh-baked bread.

"I love that smell," he admitted.

There's a packaging and shipping center, where mailers can use Federal Express, UPS or the U.S. Postal Service. There will be mail

boxes for rent and, in the future, key-making capability.

The car wash is state-of-the-art, a 180-foot tunnel that will feature high-pressure scrubbing and a half-dozen blow dryers that dry vehicles from all angles. There are 12 gas pump positions, with one diesel pump. There will be a full service unit with four pump positions.

There's also a four bay oil changing station, one of which has a 13-foot door to accommodate mobile homes and school buses, among other large vehicles. The center will service regular customers during the day, and fleet vehicles at night.

"We're going to do oil changes for fleet accounts at night, and we've already had several inquiries from

businesses," said Turner. "If we do our fleet business at night, it opens everything for our regular drive-up customers during the day."

There will also be a waiting room where customers waiting for oil changes or interior detailing are going to be treated lavishly. Workers will offer them coffee, a complimentary newspaper, and a freshly baked chocolate chip cookie.

It'll take a little longer, but Wolford believes it'll be worth the wait.

"Statistics show only 30 percent of the time you want your interior cleaned," Wolford said. "But when we do the inside, we'll do it right."

# School district pleased with MEAP results

Plymouth-Canton school officials are generally pleased with the latest MEAP scores, but admit there are some areas where more work needs to be done.

Social studies scores were up, however, students both locally and statewide continue to struggle with the test.

"Our scores are steadily increasing in social studies, and we're above the state averages," said Lon Rutkofske, director of secondary education. "However, at 32 percent, we've still got a long way to go."

For Plymouth-Canton, 32.7 percent of fifth-grade students met or exceeded state standards, as compared to 22.4 percent statewide. Last year, Plymouth-Canton was at 24 percent.

At the eighth-grade level, 49.2 percent were considered proficient, compared to 44.3 percent last year. Statewide, those who exceeded state standards in the eighth-grade was 32 percent.

"Of all the tests in the MEAP, the social studies test is the most demanding," said Rutkofske. "It's problem solving and application based, which uses high-order thinking skills."

Writing scores were down, but Rutkofske said he's "not too concerned."

Fifth-grade writing scores 71.2 percent were proficient, compared to 77.6 percent last year. This year's statewide average was 55.7 percent.

Seventh-grade writing scores were down slightly, 82.8 percent this year compared to 83.9 percent last year. The statewide level is 66.2 percent.

And, in reading, 89.6 percent of the students taking the test met or exceeded state standards, while statewide it was 80.2 percent. Last year, Plymouth-Canton fourth graders scored at 88.6.

In the seventh grade, 86.3 percent of the students met or exceeded standards on the reading test, compared to 50.9 percent statewide. Last year, 89.1 percent of Plymouth-Canton fifth-graders met or exceeded state standards.

"What we want to avoid are huge spikes in the scores," said Rutkofske. "Like the stock market, we want to slowly creep up over time."

"When scores spike, it's difficult to know why it happened," he said. "When the scores go up steadily, or even dip slightly, you know the quality of instruction is stable. No matter what group of students go through the system, you know they're getting a quality education."

Scores for the new math and science tests won't be released until August.

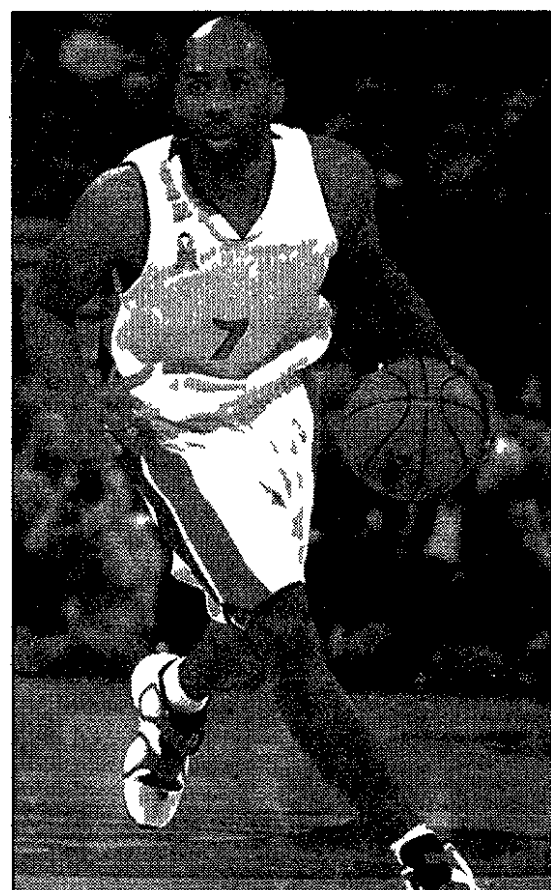

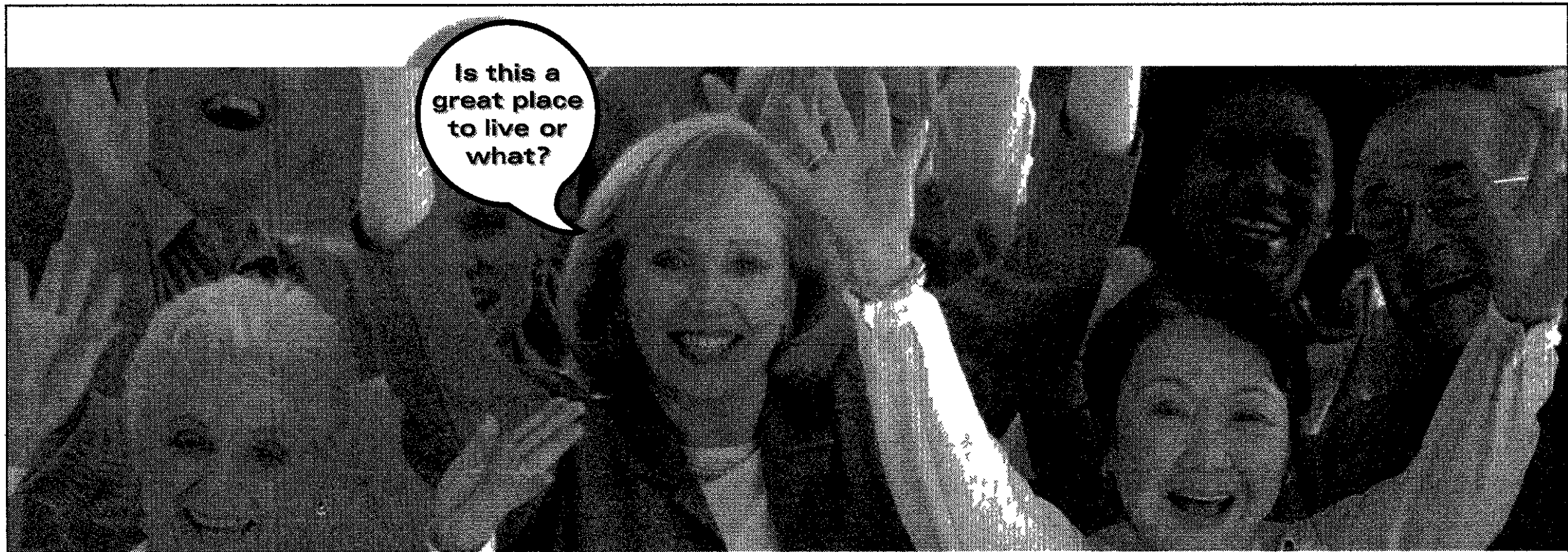

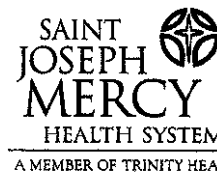

# Water company not a city service

Plymouth City Manager Paul Sincock is advising residents that a Lansing based group soliciting the sale of water treatment devices in the city is a private company and not a city service.

Sincock said Titan Marketing Group, LTD, is leaving empty bottles at the homes of Plymouth residents, requesting the bottles be filled with water, and then set them back out for pickup on another day. Sincock noted it's a marketing tool to sell water filters by a company that doesn't have a peddler's permit to do so in the city.

"The City of Plymouth water department does not endorse this product or the method of attempting to gain filter customers," said Sincock. "Residents should be advised their tap water is constantly tested in compliance with the State of Michigan Department of Public Health Regulations."

"Your drinking water and the city water system is safe and secure," he said. "It should be noted that the standards for tap water are higher than they are for bottled water."

A woman at Titan Marketing Group, who would only give her name as Barbara, said they will test the water for hardness and iron, and call back with the results. "If the customer wants, we will come out and do further testing. Yes, we do sell water treatment systems."

Sincock said the city annually produces a written document which provides accurate information on the chemical content of the city's drinking water.

"That report, called the Consumer Confidence Report, is scheduled to be mailed to city residents within the next few weeks," he said.

# Township eyes 2nd waste day

After watching more than 700 cars make their way through the joint township-city hazardous waste day a few weeks ago, Jim Anulewicz learned a valuable lesson.

Plymouth Township needs to sponsor more than one hazardous waste day.

With waits of more than an hour due to a lack of space to handle the workload, Anulewicz knew something was going to have to be done. The public services department on Port simply didn't allow for enough space to accommodate the unexpectedly high volume of traffic.

At a study session conducted by the township board Tuesday, Anulewicz laid out the options:

- Do nothing
- Sponsor a second day, and include city residents, as was done last month
- Sponsor a second day, but don't include city residents
- Sponsor a second day, allow city residents to participate, but find a larger facility

On the first day, 67 percent of the traffic was township residents, with 33 percent coming from the city. But city residents generally had much more to dump, since the city hadn't sponsored a day in about 10 years.

That meant that lines which lasted 10 or 15 minutes a year ago lasted as long as 70 minutes this year. "Unless you were totally environmentally committed," Anulewicz said, "when you pulled up to that line, there's no way you were going to wait."

While treasurer Ron Edwards and clerk Marilyn Massengill appeared to favor not including the city, Anulewicz said he is leaning toward scheduling a second hazardous waste day for Oct. 19, and finding a larger facility somewhere in the township at which to hold the event.

# County to help township residents with ash tree problems

Plymouth Township residents who have dying ash trees on their property are about to get some help from Wayne County — as long as the trees are located in the county right-of-way.

Wayne County officials are scheduled to conduct a tree survey in Plymouth Township this summer and mark ash trees for removal. Actual removal of the trees will come sometime this winter, according to Jim Anulewicz, director of public

services for the township. "Within the month, the county will be out in Plymouth Township," Anulewicz told township board members at a study session Tuesday. "They'll identify trees and mark them for removal."

Such removal applies only to trees the county deems are 50 percent dead and six inches or more in diameter, Anulewicz pointed out. Removal of trees under six inches in diameter, or that are not in the right-of-way, is the responsibility of the individual homeowner.

"It's been a problem we've been trying to keep on top of," supervisor Steve Mann said. "It's a significant problem throughout the township. (The trees) make a nice environment, and this has significantly impacted that."

The township had Dr. David Roberts of the Michigan State University Extension Service, come into the community to study what is becoming a statewide problem. Roberts said an "astounding number of ash trees" are currently dead or in various stages of decline around

Michigan, with a high concentration of them in the Plymouth, Canton, Livonia and Dearborn areas.

Problem is, no one can quite figure out why.

"At this time, we are uncertain of the exact cause of the ash decline," Roberts said.

One aspect with which Plymouth Township officials are now wrestling is replacement. Mann said a number of residents have asked about help with replanting. While Mann favors a 50-50 cost-share program similar to one in Canton

Township, he may have trouble getting support from his board. Trustee Chuck Curmi said he doesn't favor the township getting involved in helping residents replace trees, nor does he want the township to pay to have them removed.

"Plymouth Township isn't paying to cut any trees down," Curmi said. "Either the residents pay, or the county pays."

Mann remains undeterred. "I think we should start a 50-50 program, and hopefully I can get support for that," Mann said.

For only the second time in its history, the Plymouth-Canton Administrators union is endorsing candidates for Monday's school board elections.

Ellison Franklin, West Middle School principal and union president, said her group is endorsing Joanne Lamar and Carol Saunders, both of Plymouth Township, for the two, four-year seats that are being vacated by board members Susan Davis and Darwin Watts. The administrators are also endorsing Marcy Staley of Canton, who was appointed by the board last December and is running against Debra Madonna for the one-year seat. "We feel this is a critical time for our community

and schools," said Franklin. "With our superintendent (Kathleen Booher) leaving, it's time the district reflect on what we've done in the past, where we're at now, and where we'll be in the future. "I'm going to do the same things Jim Ryan has been doing all along, for better or for worse," he said. "And, that's what I expect to be judged on."

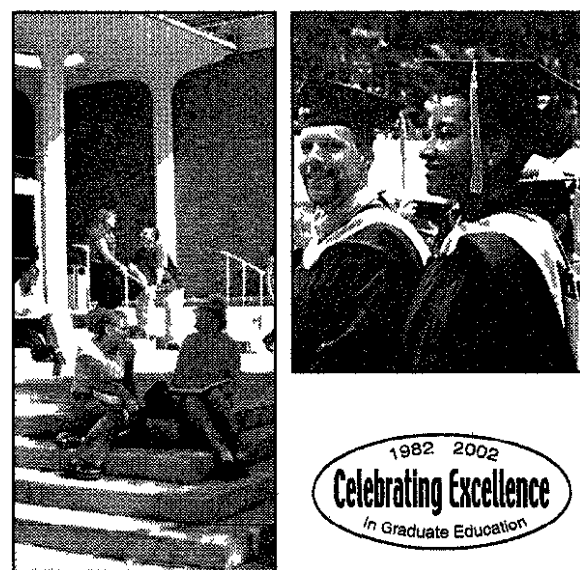
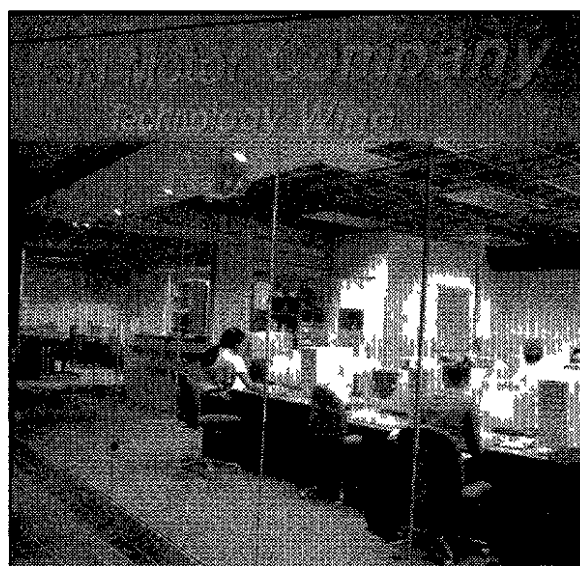

tion and decide if Jim wants the job permanently, and if we would like him to have the position permanently," said Givens

Givens said Ryan would probably be evaluated in December, at which time he could either be given the job or a formal search would begin

When Chuck Little resigned as superintendent in July 1999, the board selected an outsider, Ken Walcott, as the interim until Booher took over in February 2000

Trustee Judy Mardigian said she's enthusiastic about Ryan taking over as interim

"We're very fortunate to have such a strong person with so much experience," she said "This way we can hit the ground running"

As for giving the job to Ryan permanently, Mardigian said, "We're going to take it one step at a time, and move ahead cautiously, but with optimism"

Board member Tom Wysocki said, "I think Dr Ryan is in a good position to step in as interim superintendent He's a very positive person" As for a superintendent search, Wysocki added, "I think we have to go through a process, whether it's for one candidate, or multiple candidates"

Givens said there are a couple of reasons why Ryan may be the logical choice to take over, at least for the time being

"The administrative structure is in place, so we

can do without the search Besides, this is a bad time of year to be looking for a superintendent because they have already made their plans for the next school year," she said "And, with the possibility of three new board members, it would be tough to conduct a search"

Givens, along with fellow trustees Judy Mardigian and Mark Slavens, will be the only three board members left who were involved in the search that brought Booher to Plymouth-Canton from Berkeley

Monday's school board election will definitely produce two new board members as Susan Davis and Darwin Watts are not seeking re-election

Ryan has been an educator for 31 years, with 11 of those as superintendent in two districts From 1990-94, Ryan was superintendent in Reed City, and in Waverly from 1994-2001, before moving to Plymouth Canton to become deputy superintendent

"Jim's track record is good," said Givens "He wanted to be deputy superintendent, the head of the core team, and he has established himself The core team works well with him, and he knows how to build relationships"

Givens said if Ryan doesn't become Plymouth-Canton's next superintendent, he will continue as deputy superintendent

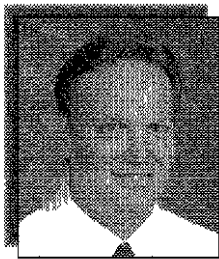

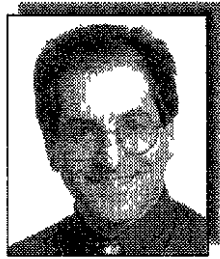

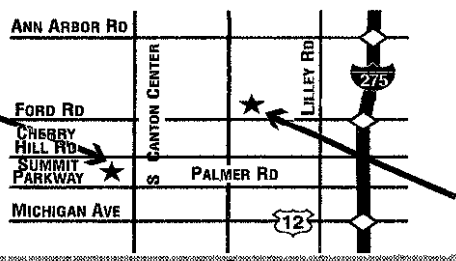

coffee house on Penniman, next to the post office. It's known as a hangout for young people. They host poetry readings there, and open microphone nights, and music. Breakfast is available Saturdays, and lunch specials are available daily.

There's the Bean Trivia question, and all kinds of newspapers and magazines to read. Sandwiches are home-made daily, and they offer fresh-squeezed juices. Their yogurt is organic and the food is healthy.

**Starbucks, the first tenant to open its doors in the new Mayflower Centre, offers much of the same things — lots of different coffees, tables up front where people can sit quietly and talk. You can even get the New York Times there.**

The Bean is smaller than Starbucks, and arguably the most popular of the coffee houses. There are several small nooks and crannies, and a back room where the poetry readings and musical engagements are held. You can play chess or other games there, or you can sit out on the front porch and just hang out, as a number of young people do nightly.

Owner/manager Justen Hemme knows none of that is going to change, and has noticed no effect on his business since Starbucks opened a week ago.

"There's been no impact that's noticeable," said Hemme. "I expect it might for a couple of months, until the novelty (of having Starbucks) wears off. But this place has been here 10 years, we've got more food and a better ambiance. All of that is a factor."

That's what Abby Case of Plymouth thinks. She admits to a certain bias because she used to work at The Coffee Bean, and knows the people who work there now. But that aside, she thinks the reasons people won't leave The Coffee Bean are simple.

"The coffee is better," said Case. "They're friendly, I like the atmosphere and the people, and the coffee is better."

Unlike the folks at The Coffee Bean, management at The Coffee Studio on Ann Arbor Trail have noticed a dramatic drop in clientele, particularly in the mornings, which attracted a lot of rushing patrons stopping for their early caffeine fix on their way to work.

In the week since Starbucks opened however, the flow of patrons has slowed to a trickle.

"Morning traffic is so slow now," said Ashley Armbruster of Canton, a barrister at the Studio. "We used to get a steady stream of morning people on their way to work, but now it's so slow. Now it's just the regulars, and there aren't as many of them."

The Studio is a clean, well organized place with a covered front porch and an upstairs that provides a place to get away and sit quietly. According to Armbruster, it was a pretty popular place for people studying for finals over the last few weeks.

There are a handful of regulars and on at least one recent morning a couple of people conducting

a business meeting over a cup of latte.

"It's quiet, more personalized," said Armbruster, who admits she hangs out at the Studio even when she isn't working. "I know pretty much everyone who comes in here. And we have better coffee. We get people who will ask, 'What do you have that tastes like Starbucks,' and I tell them, 'Nothing, because we aren't Starbucks.'"

Carol Was of Canton is the poetry editor for *The MacGuffin*, the literary journal at Schoolcraft College, and a regular at The Coffee Studio. She likes the chocolate the Studio uses to make her favorite coffee.

"I like the atmosphere, the coffee and the chocolate," at the Coffee Studio, Was said. "That and the food. They offer more food products, whereas Starbucks is limited more to pastries."

Starbucks, the first tenant to open its doors in the new Mayflower Centre, offers much of the same things — lots of different coffees, tables up front where people can sit quietly and talk. You can even get the New York Times there.

Parking is a problem, so Starbucks gets a lot of foot traffic. And, while folks at both the Bean and the Studio say business hasn't been affected all that much, there are obviously plenty of people glad the big chain is in town.

Janeen Foreman of Canton is one of them. Addicted to chai latte, a tea she says Starbucks makes to perfection. Foreman used to drive into downtown Northville in order to get a cup. When she found out Starbucks was coming to town, she couldn't have been happier.

"The other places just don't make the tea the same and I've tried them all," she said. "Before they opened, I was like a little kid at the window, yelling 'open open open.'"

Carol Was the poetry editor from Schoolcraft College has attended poetry nights at the Bean, is a regular at the Studio, and frequents Starbucks, as well.

"I think all three have something to offer," she said with a smile. "I suspect this town is large enough to accommodate three coffee houses."

# Over 65 group to double in metro area by 2030

By 2030, all the members of the generation that lived through the Vietnam War, ushered in the first color television and can remember exactly where they were when President Kennedy was shot will be over age 65.

These retirement-age baby boomers will account for the almost doubling of the 65 and over age-group population, according to the 2030 Regional Development Forecast recently released by the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments.

Thirty years from now, southeast Michigan will be home to nearly 562,000 more people over age 65 than there were in the 2000 Census. Wayne County alone will see a 69 percent increase in population for this age group.

As baby boomers — those who are now between the ages of 36-55 — pass beyond the childbearing phase of life and prepare to enter their senior years, the entire face of communities and institutions will change drastically, says Jim Rogers, SEMCOG Data Center Manager, who oversaw the com-

pletion of the 2030 forecast report. "As people grow older they develop a different set of needs, interests and preferences for spending money," Rogers said. "These concerns are just now coming to us and they're going to accelerate over the coming years."

Rogers said one of the most significant impacts of this population age-group shift will be on the workforce. Baby boomers who are now in their prime working years will be retiring in greater numbers over the next 30 years, taking out a large chunk of the current working population.

"This is going to put real strains on the workforce," Rogers said, noting that such labor changes will have a key impact on the economy as well as on consumption patterns.

The aging of the baby boomer generation will also shift demand and society patterns in other aspects of community life such as housing, transportation, voting and recreation.

Rogers noted that more retirement and senior-living homes are already springing up, an influx he attributes to the combined fact that people are living longer and the overall wealth of society has

increased so that people can now afford special living arrangements.

SEMCOG data indicate Wayne County — which has exhibited a relatively mature cycle of growth — will be among the Southeast Michigan counties most affected by this population age group shift because, according to Rogers, most of the communities in the county are fully developed, meaning the same people have lived and worked in them over the past few decades.

"These communities will be graying in place," Rogers said, explaining that many baby boomers will continue to reside in these same places as they grow older. "I don't think there's any area that won't experience change due to the population shifts."

# Head Start gets high marks on survey

Wayne County's Head Start program has received high marks from parents, according to a survey just conducted by the firm of Plante & Moran, the Michigan- and Ohio-based professional services firm.

The survey, issued May 3, 2002, showed 95 percent of the more than 1,200 parents responding agreeing their child has benefited from participating in the County's Head Start program.

"This is wonderful news," says Michael Johnson, Head Start executive director. "This gives us the kind of feedback we need to make the program the best it can be."

Additional survey results included:

- 95 percent agree their child has benefited from participating in the Head Start program
- 94 percent agree they would recommend Head Start to a friend or family member
- 91 percent are aware that Wayne County runs the program
- 94 percent agree that their

child is in a safe environment at Head Start.

■ 87 percent agree they are satisfied with the job Wayne County Head Start is doing.

■ 92 percent agree that Head Start staff has made every effort to meet with the family at its convenience.

■ 88 percent stated his/her child's teacher has visited to discuss the child's strengths and needs.

More than 3,700 children are currently in Wayne County's Head Start program. The County enrolls 3- and 4-year-olds from low-income families, and children with certified or suspected disabilities, in the program.

"What is remarkable is that Head Start helps both the children and their parents grow and develop," says Wayne County Executive Edward H. McNamara. "The entire family benefits from a child taking part in Head Start."

The Family Satisfaction survey was sent through the mail to fami-

lies with children enrolled at the County's Head Start locations. A total of 1,246 survey responses were returned. Respondents were asked to assess their satisfaction involving a variety of different services performed by the Head Start agencies. They were also asked questions about Wayne County running the program.

The program's Delegate Agencies include The Guidance Center, YWCA, Starfish Family Services, Westland Community School District and Wayne Metro Community Action Agency.

Head Start children engage in educational activities and receive medical, dental and nutrition services for no cost. Social events, recreational activities and volunteer opportunities are available for parents.

Head Start programs are located in several Wayne County communities, including Romulus, Dearborn Heights, Garden City, Taylor, Van Buren Township, Plymouth, Redford and Westland.

## Uncorking a wine bottle closure issue

Wine lovers have accepted the traditional cork too long! We've been frustrated with the standard natural cork closure. It has made favorite wines "corky," spoiling them with an off-odor and flavor, imparted to wine by natural corks that are contaminated with the chemical trichloroanisole (TCA). We've cringed as an inexperienced waitperson struggles to open a bottle we've ordered in a restaurant.

Corks crumble as a corkscrew is pushed through and some cork pieces float in an otherwise pristine glass of wine. Corks break as attempts are made to extract them from the neck of the bottle. At such times, a synthetic cork, screwtop or even crown cap seems preferable!

OK, crown caps are a bit radical. Yet winemakers such as David Forsyth of Hogue Cellars in Prosser, Wash., said "it's not a question of if, it's when" synthetic corks will be found in more wine bottles than natural corks.

Synthetic cork manufacturer Supreme Corq commissioned research into consumer attitudes toward synthetic corks. They learned that while consumers may be aghast at premium wine bottles with screwtops, wines that used synthetic corks garnered no negative perceptions.

### Other research findings

The Portuguese Cork Association (APCOR) cried FOUL. Why? Portugal is the world's leading manufacturer of natural corks.

APCOR commissioned an independent international research group, to survey wine drinkers in Australia, the UK and the US. This survey showed that 75 percent expressed a preference for natural cork, with just 9 percent for plastic stoppers. The preference was strongest in the US at 81 percent with 73 and 72 percent respectively for the UK and Australia.

A total of 69 percent of those polled believe that a real cork in a wine bottle is viewed as an indication of wine quality, rising as high as 83 percent in the US and 79 percent in Australia. Yet, the type of closure ranked as the fourth most important factor in wine choice, with only 26 percent claiming it was a very important factor.

Ranking at the top of wine choice factors was previous experience with the wine. That's great! Brand loyalty. If you like it, you'll buy it again. Next most important at 53 percent was wine style.

So what? Cork is natural, recyclable and biodegradable. No manmade substitute replicates these cork properties. Although recycled cork is never used again as a wine bottle closure, it has other uses, such as the manufacture of bulletin boards, placemats, coasters, floor tiles or gaskets. That's good, but a cork is small compared to our green wine bottles that are not accepted for recycling!

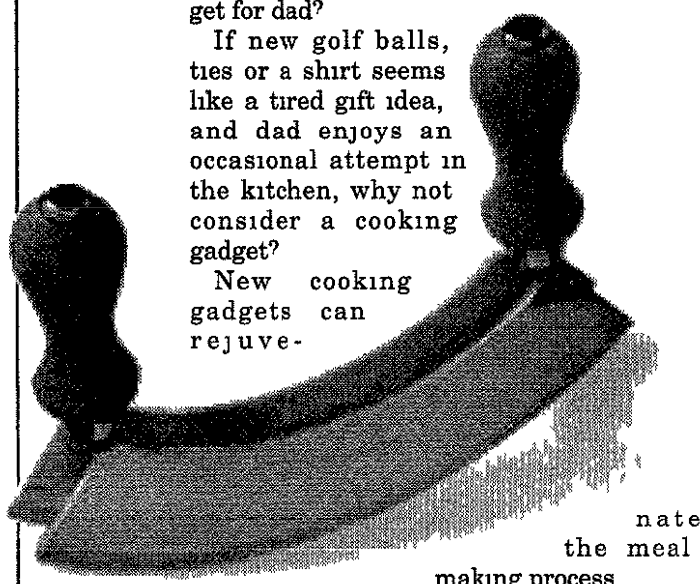
## Food experts offer gift ideas for fathers who love to cook

New cooking gadgets can rejuvenate



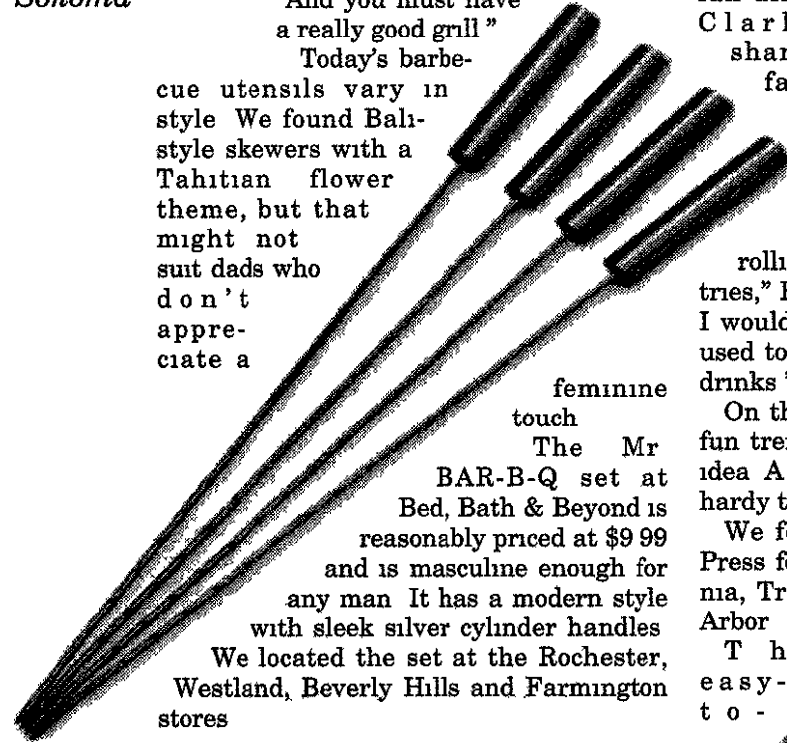

We asked local food experts for gift suggestions and exactly what kitchen items they couldn't do without. The ideas range from common to trendy.

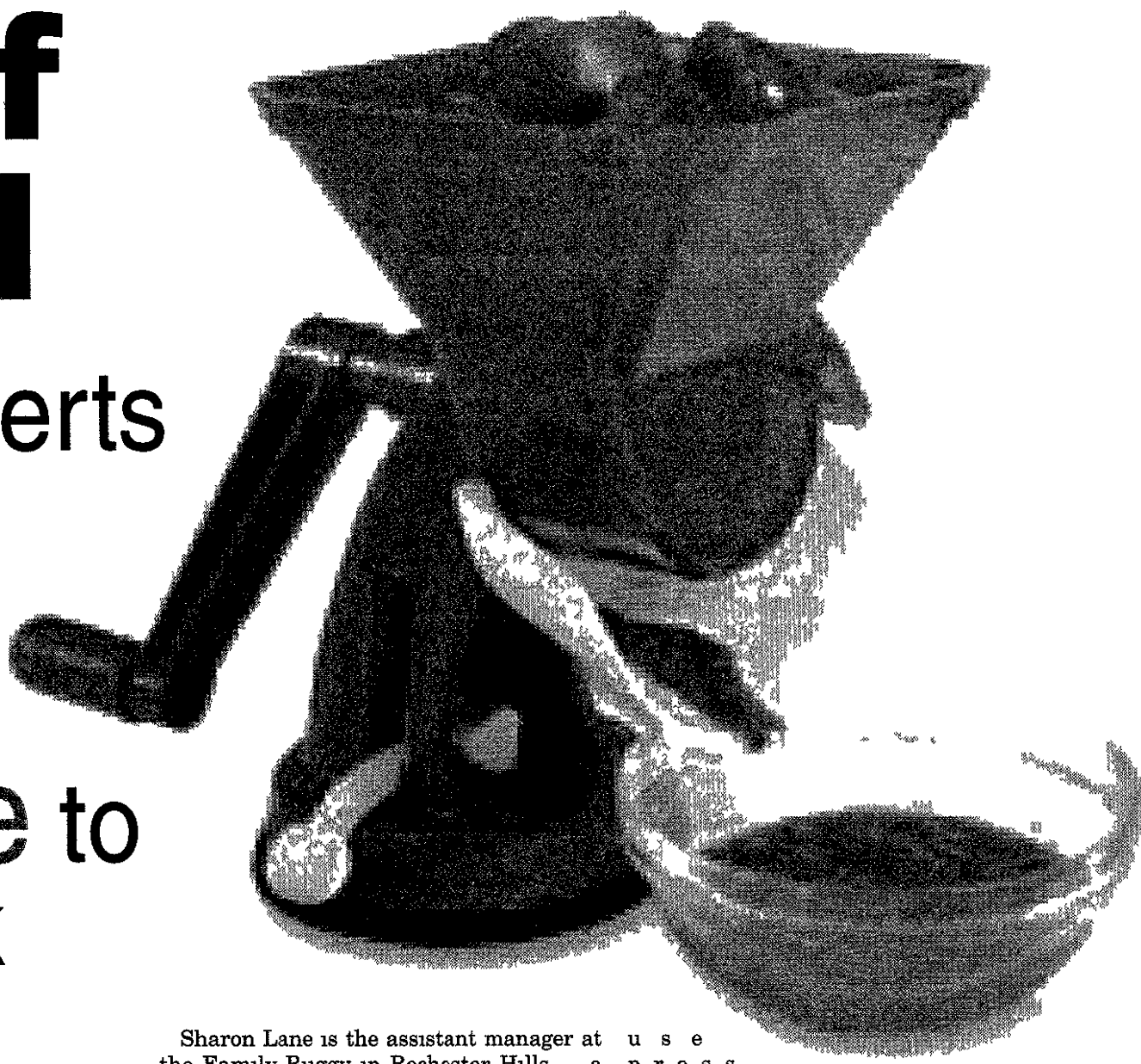
Debbie Hubbard, kitchen manager of the Victorian Rose in Rochester, has suggestions for the outdoorsy-type Dad.

"I'd suggest a really good set of barbecue utensils," Hubbard suggested for the dad who likes to grill for the family. "And you must have a really good grill."

Today's barbecue utensils vary in style. We found Bali-style skewers with a Tahitian flower theme, but that might not suit dads who don't appreciate a feminine touch.

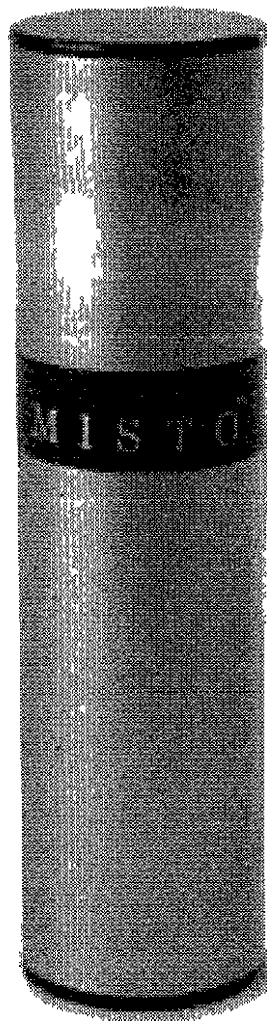
"An electric skillet," Lane said. "I use mine everyday to make casseroles, smothered chicken, and meat and potato dishes."

Lane's husband isn't a fan of cooking, but if he did cook it would probably be a meat dish.

"A good knife is necessary," she said.

### Stepping up in style

Stereotypical families that include meals made solely by Mom are fading of course. Not all dads play golf and cook hamburgers. Some dads actually enjoy time in the kitchen to make upscale food. For the father who has fun creating sophisticated meals, Chef Josef Foreman of the newly opened Giacomo's Fine Italian dining in Clarkston shared his favorite cooking tools.



"For me, I can't do without a rolling pin because I make a lot of pastries," Foreman said. "But for a gift for dad I would suggest a hand blender. It can be used to puree for soups and sauces and drinks."

On the same lines is the tomato press, a fun trendy gadget, that comes from an old idea. A tomato press is a fresh way to make hardy tomato-based soups and sauces.

We found a bright red Italian Tomato Press for \$25 at Williams Sonoma in Livonia, Troy and Ann Arbor.

The easy-to-

use press strains the skins and is a modern version of the old wooden tomato crushers that originated in Sicily. Foreman also said he enjoys receiving new aprons chosen by his family. He uses them while grilling outside and in the cooking classes he teaches.

"A decent apron is fun because there's so many different styles out there," Foreman said.

"A nice set of German steel knives is a great gift. And the olive oil misters are good too."

Olive Oil sprayers are a new trend for grilling.

Rather than use brushes which can be messy, the sprayers distribute oil evenly without any mess.

We found the Olive Oil Misto for \$9.99 at Bed, Bath & Beyond. Perfect for vegetables and fish.

At the Loon River Cafe in Sterling Heights, Chef Ray Hollingsworth stuck with items that can be used for his breakfast ideas.

He specializes in wild meats like elk, pheasants and rabbits.

His number one suggestion is a cast iron skillet that can be used at campfires or in the home.

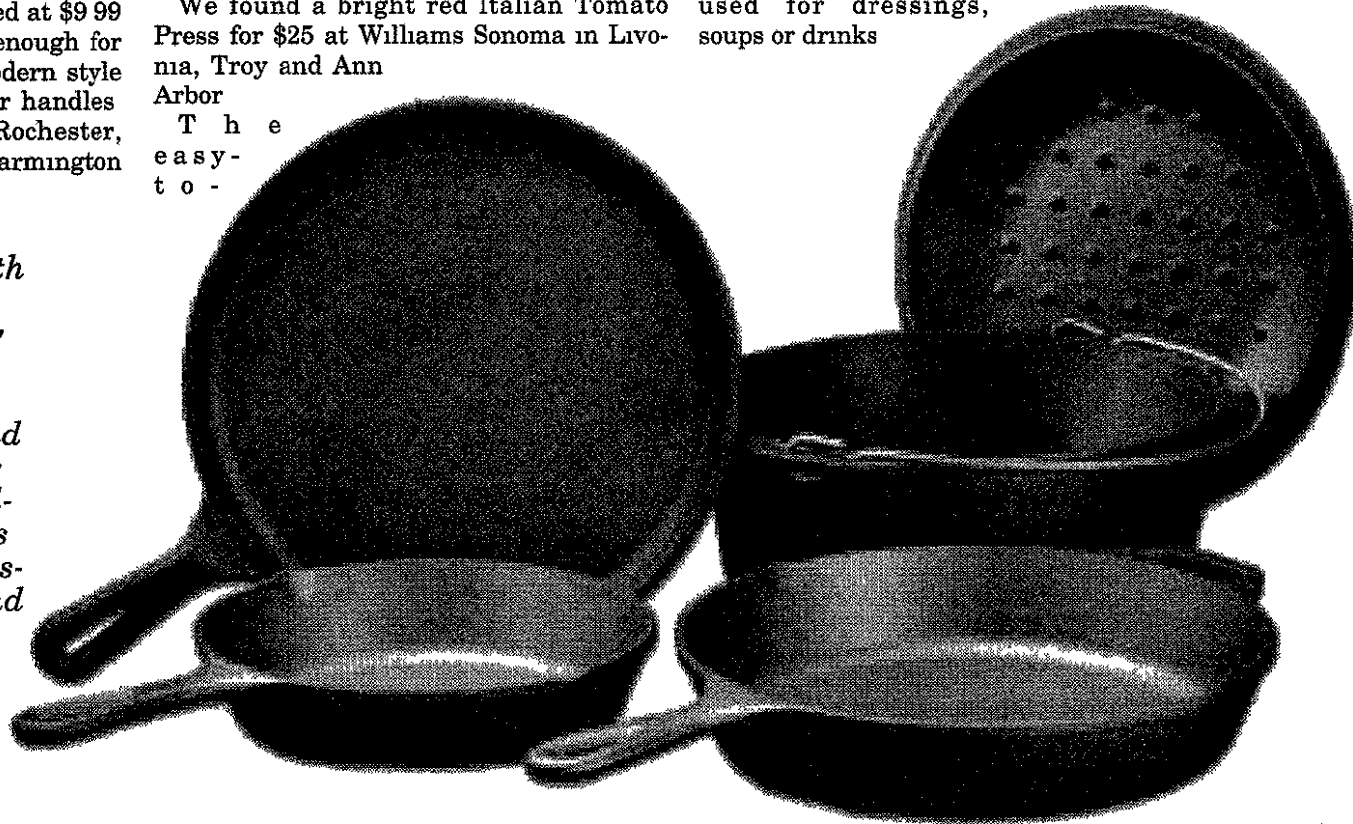
"I use it for my meal called Hunters' Breakfast," Hollingsworth said. "Bacon, potatoes, peppers and topped with eggs. I use it when I'm fishing."

We found a five-piece cast iron skillet set with a Dutch oven for \$50 at Cabelas stores.

Hollingsworth said he likes solid basics rather than huge equipment.

What is a trendy idea that he enjoys is a gas-powered blender that he said can be used while spending time in nature.

The blender has a motor similar to a weed whacker that can be used for dressings, soups or drinks.



# Grilling is year-round for this family

If Memorial Day just past was the start of barbecuing season across America, it was merely another in the endless series of strolls to the grill for the Thomas family of Beverly Hills

"We cook out three or four nights a week," said Susie Thomas, 36, a pre-K schoolteacher. "Everything tastes better. The meat is juicier. A steak in the oven is dried out. I've got to have it done on a grill."

But it isn't just the taste of the food that drives the Thomas family out of the house for more than half of their daily dinners. Susie and her husband, Dr. Mark, 34, a pediatrician, like the reduced clean-up.

"No pans," said Mark. "No big mess in the kitchen. And, we like being outdoors."

Susie and Mark use a propane grill, but they don't have big issues about the taste of propane cooking versus charcoal cooking.

"We use a charcoal grill when we go camping and it tastes a little different, but the propane is ready faster."

Anyway, they have wood-chip holders made for propane grills, which give them charcoal-grill benefits of mesquite and hickory smoking.

For Connor, 8, and Kelsey, 7, it doesn't matter what kind of fuel you use to cook their hot dogs as long as you don't burn them.

Mark likes to grill salmon filets, strip steaks, marinated shrimp, and chicken. For Susie, the greatest thrill of the grill is not animal but vegetable.

"When I was growing up," she said, "Everyone grilled hamburgers and hot-dogs and then when I was older someone made vegetables on the grill and that was wonderful. Smoky grilled vegetables. In a specially made grill wok. Wonderful."

Perhaps not traditional, she said, but wonderful.

## Try grilling veggies too

### SUSIE'S GRILLED VEGGIES

#### For the vegetables

- 3 zucchini
  - 3 yellow squash (the size of zucchini)
  - 3/4 cup cut up Shiitake mushrooms
  - 3/4 cup cut up Portabella mushrooms
  - 1 Vidalia onion
- (The selection of vegetables can vary as long as the uncooked firmness of the vegetables is the same so that cooking time will be equal)

#### For the marinade

- 1 cup (or more) Balsamic vinaigrette ready made or your own
- 2 garlic cloves
- dash of lemon juice
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese

#### Utensils

- A cook-out wok is recommended
- The pan is perforated all

around to let smoke reach the vegetables while containing them. Usually available at home and hardware stores.

Slice 1/4-1/2-inch rounds of the zucchini, squash and onion. Cut the mushrooms bite-size. Put all into a deep glass mixing bowl. In a measuring cup, stir the grated cheese into the vinaigrette, add the lemon juice and garlic. Pour mixture over the vegetables, adding vinaigrette as necessary to cover completely. Cover bowl with plastic wrap and refrigerate. Overnight marinating is recommended.

After marinating, bring the vegetables to near room temperature. Warm the grill wok. With a slotted spoon, lift the vegetables out of the marinade and put into the wok.

Cooking times will vary depending on the temperature of the grill and preference for al dente or soft vegetables. Possibly 10-20 minutes, with continual stirring to cook evenly.

Remove wok from grill with hot-pads or oven mitts.

# Give grilled turkey a try

BY THE ASSOCIATED PRESS

Try turkey on the grill. Here's a summary of steps for grilling whole turkey.

**1 Preparation:** Unwrap thawed turkey, remove giblets, pat dry. Prepare your grill for indirect heat method. Make sure heat source (coals or gas burner) is not directly under turkey.

**2 Grill:** Follow charcoal and gas grill directions (directions follow).

**3 Check:** Use a meat thermometer to check for doneness.

**4 Carve:** Let turkey rest for 15 minutes, then carve and enjoy it.

Cook turkey to an internal high temperature of 180 F, and breast temperature to 170 F.

Remove turkey from grill and let stand 15 minutes before carving.

Refer to your grill owner's guide for more information on the indirect heat method.

### Handling and grilling safety guidelines:

- Keep fresh turkey in refrigerator and grill as soon as possible, no later than "use by" date.

- Prevent uncooked juices from dripping onto other foods in refrigerator by placing turkey on a tray.

- Do not stuff turkey.
- Wash hands with hot soapy water after handling raw turkey.

- Spray unheated cook grate with cooking spray to reduce sticking.

- Do not use packaged-turkey lifter when grilling turkey. Use thick, washable oven mitts to lift cooked turkey from grill to platter.

- Never pierce turkey with a fork while grilling or juices will escape.

- Grill faster-cooking turkey products like burgers over direct heat.

### Grill tips:

**Convenience:** Put bastes and sauces in squeeze bottles to make applying them easier - no messy brushes to clean.

**Flavor:** Turn your charcoal grill into a smoker. After the coals are heated, simply add 1/2 cup drained wood chips - apple, cherry or hickory - on each mound of charcoal for a rich flavor.

**Variety:** Experiment with new recipes and different cuts.

# The well-dressed salad sports less fat

Salad is often the first thing people think of when they're trying to cut down on calories and eat healthy.

It's a good instinct — salads made with leafy greens and other veggies are packed with important nutrients and health protection. The problem is when those salads get dressed. To put it bluntly — they get fat.

There are plenty of ways to get lots of flavor in a dressing without a lot of fat. Olive oil is fine for a base when used in moderate amounts. Other bases, though, like a fruit or vegetable juice, can replace the oil in many vinaigrette recipes. Even creamy dressings don't have to be heavy and fat-laden. They can be lightened up with non- or low-fat buttermilk, yogurt, or sour cream.

Here's a trio of healthful dressings that are simply made and simply delicious.

## CREAMY BASIL DRESSING

- 1/2 cup low fat plain yogurt
- 3 tablespoons low fat cottage cheese
- 2 tablespoons finely minced fresh basil
- 1 teaspoon granulated sugar or to taste
- 1 tablespoon freshly squeezed lemon juice
- salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste

## Try Asian-style noodles and slaw

Asian noodles can be an interesting starting point for a creative cook to produce something rather special — in next to no time.

This recipe for chicken with Japanese noodles is a suggestion from *Cooking Light* magazine's May issue and calls for a total cooking time of about 30 minutes.

You can find the noodles and Asian condiments in many supermarkets' special sections as well as in Asian grocery stores.

Note that the chicken breast tenders called for are ideal for hectic schedules. They don't need to be cut or trimmed, and the smaller pieces cook more quickly than chicken breast.

The peanut sauce gives the dish a rich and satisfying taste, although a serving has only a little more than 10 grams of fat.

The dish tastes good served at room temperature, too, or cold. Add a touch of warm water to loosen the noodles if you serve it cold.

Broccoli would be a suitable accompaniment, with Asian slaw as a pleasant side dish (recipe follows).

### CHICKEN AND NOODLES WITH PEANUT SAUCE

- (Total preparation and cooking time 30 minutes)
- 5 ounces uncooked Japanese curly noodles (chucka soba)
- 1/2 cup fat free less sodium chicken broth
- 1/3 cup hoisin sauce
- 1/4 cup creamy peanut butter
- 2 tablespoons rice vinegar
- 2 tablespoons ketchup
- 1/4 teaspoon crushed red pepper
- 2 teaspoons dark sesame oil
- 1 pound chicken breast tenders

- 1 1/2 cups red bell pepper strips
- 1 tablespoon bottled ground fresh ginger
- 1 teaspoon bottled minced garlic
- 1/2 cup chopped green onions

Cook noodles according to package directions. Drain.

Combine broth, hoisin sauce, peanut butter, rice vinegar, ketchup and red pepper in a bowl. Stir well with a whisk.

Heat 1 teaspoon oil in a large nonstick skillet over medium high heat. Add the chicken, saute 4 minutes.

Add bell pepper, saute 3 minutes. Remove from heat. Combine chicken mixture and noodles in a large bowl.

Heat 1 teaspoon oil in pan over medium heat. Add ginger and garlic. Cook 15 seconds. Stir in broth mixture, cook 30 seconds, stirring constantly. Add the broth mixture and 1/4 cup green onions to noodle mixture, toss well. Sprinkle with 1/4 cup green onions.

## Lighting reflects tonal contrast

### FOCUS ON PHOTOGRAPHY

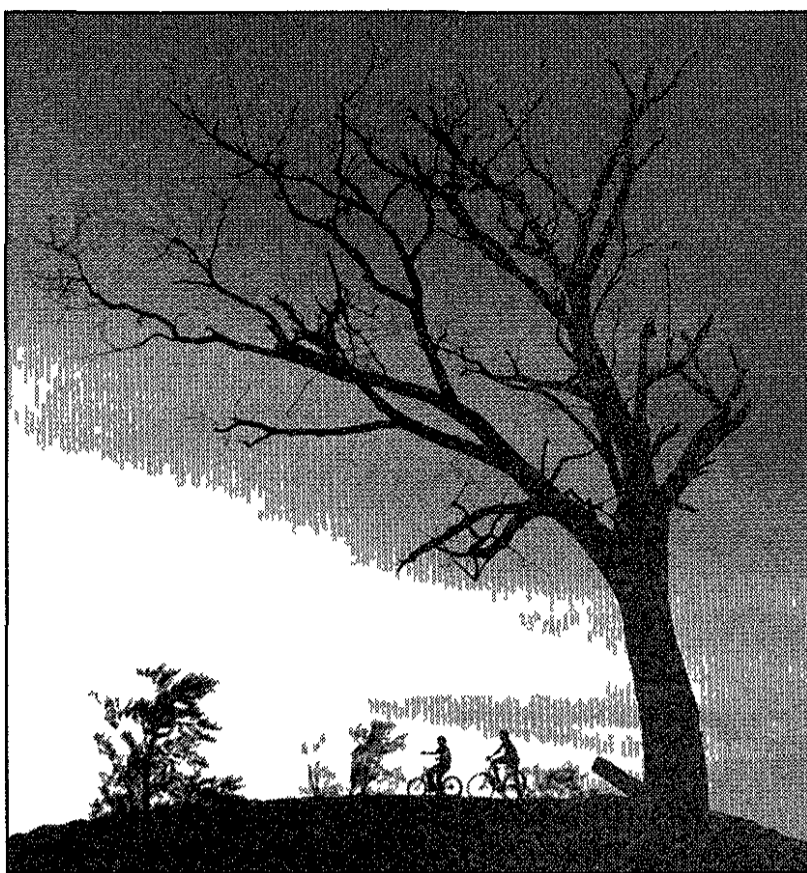
The tones in most photographs range from white to black with a variety of tones in between. It is the relationship of these tones that give three-dimensional form and depth to a picture. And the tonal contrast of an image is usu-

ally affected by how a subject is lit.

With color, the same principal applies, but adjacent areas may also be differentiated by color rather than brightness.

A photographer's skill lies in making a two-dimensional photograph appear with a third dimension. A full tonal range will make this possible.

For instance, a solid white ball lit directly from the front will have no shadows or highlights. It will appear as a solid circle of white in a photograph. But move the light to the side in order to create shadows and the difference will become immediately obvious. The ball will develop a complete range of tones from white on the lit side, gradually darkening grays in the center, to

black in the deepest shadow. The ball will now appear three-dimensional.

Thinking of the ball as an example, become aware of tone in everyday life. Take a friend outdoors and notice how a hard source of light such as direct sun creates solid tones on the face with clearly defined steps. The soft light on an overcast day produces mildly changing tones on the face with barely noticeable edges.

There is a strong connection between the tones in a photograph and mood it conveys. A picture with mostly light tones is called "high-key" and has a deli-

cate, often romantic quality. Photos with dark tones "low key," create a somber, serious, often moody feel.

Photographs with a full tonal range, bright highlights and crisp shadows, create normal, easily accepted images.

Contrast is the relationship between the lightest and darkest tones. A picture that is dominated by extremely light and dark tones is described as high contrast. Where there's only a small difference between the brightest and darkest tones, you have a low contrast image. A photograph with full range of lights and darks is considered to be normal contrast.

Contrast is primarily controlled by lighting. Bright sun light will create high contrast subjects while soft lighting an overcast day creates a softer contrast image.

## Scripts light imagination

No costumes, fancy lighting, music or elaborate props, just the words and the imagination will take center stage as local playwrights present their works in raw form at Playscape, a festival celebrating original full-length plays.

Presented by Heartland Theatre Company and Oakland University, the three-day event will feature staged readings of scripts written by local talent and a "Imagery in Playwriting" workshop conducted by Stephen Svoboda, an assistant professor at the University of Miami.

The festival, to be held at Oakland University's Lab Theatre in Varner Hall Friday, Sunday, June 14-16, will offer an educational forum for local playwrights and audience members who will be invited to offer feedback following each reading.

"The Big One," written by Beverly Hills playwright Kim Carney and directed by Mary Locker, is among the theatrical works to be presented at the festival. The two-character romantic comedy is set in a Beverly Hills, Calif. mansion, where an attractive real estate agent accompanies a handsome prospective buyer. The two are trapped in the wine cellar following an earthquake and embark on personal journeys and resurrection.

Carney, whose 13th play will be produced late summer in New Jersey, said the staged reading will be nothing more than two people on a stage with two chairs.

"It's bare bones, that's for sure," Carney said. "It's about the script."

It will be the first time the script is read for a general audience. The staged reading is an integral part of the creative process, said Carney. Each of her produced theatrical works stemmed from such readings. She sits in the audience and

gazes body language, emotions and reactions. The audience feedback session is also vital, she noted.

### Educational

"It's educational, especially for the playwright," she said. "Sometimes you lose your perspective on the script, so it's nice to hear it again through somebody who has never heard it before. A lot of that is real helpful. It's just really invaluable."

Other works presented at Playscape include, "Freeman's Grounding," a play set in 1795 that explores the meaning of freedom, written by M.V. Patton, of Ferndale and directed by Stephanie L. Nichols.

"Innocence, Peppermint," a story of a couple's feud over "protecting" their daughter, written by Steve Daut, of Chelsea and directed by T. Andrew Aston, will also be presented for the first time to a general audience.

Svoboda will present his current work "Reconstructing Mama" in a staged reading. An

accomplished playwright, Svoboda earned national acclaim for his work, "Thin Blue Curtains," as one of the best plays dealing with the AIDS issue since "Angels in America."

Staged readings are educational and entertaining for the audience as well, said Jan Radcliff, a founding member of Heartland Theatre Company, which is dedicated to supporting local playwrights. Because there are no props, music or choreography, the raw scripts leave much to the imagination of the viewer.

"We're trying to reach an audience who is interested in seeing it all come together," Radcliff said. "The audience gets a better understanding of how difficult it is to do and how complex a particular art form can be. The more sophisticated an audience becomes, the higher the appreciation of what it takes to create a play."

Established 10 years ago by a group of local actors, Heartland Theatre Company promotes, supports and offers resources to local playwrights. Educational workshops, staged readings and the New Plays Initiative program perpetuate local theater.

"If we nurture (local playwrights), they will feed into dif-

# Land O' Goshen

Get away for a relaxing weekend in Indiana's Amish country

"Our guests would like to try some garden tea," our gracious hostess said to her daughter "Bring in some peppermint and spearmint."

Without a word the young girl found some scissors and headed out the front door. Minutes later the ThreeOlBags sat down to a wonderful cup of freshly brewed "garden tea." Our chance to visit the tidy home of this hospitable Amish family was the highlight of our two day trip to Amish country in northern Indiana.

Our adventure began on Friday morning when we drove the short four hours from Detroit and arrived at Market Street Guest House in Nappanee, Ind. It's a beautiful historic home on the main street in town. We found our accommodations online, and were very happy with our choice, and our charming innkeeper, Sharon Bontrager. She made us feel instantly welcome, and gave us plenty of information about the Amish.

Much to our surprise, the horse-and-buggy Amish are only part of the story in northern Indiana. We learned there are actually three different sects represented in "Amish" country. There are Mennonites, Hutterites, and of course, Amish. In addition, within each sect there are differences in beliefs which create a wide variety of liv-

ing standards within the community.

At Bontrager's suggestion, we took the Heritage Trail Driving Tour while listening to a CD she loaned us. The CD explained the history of the area, and interesting spots as we drove through Elkhart, Middlebury, Shipshewana, Goshen and Nappanee. It takes about three hours, if you don't stop anywhere along the way. Of course, that was not part of our plan.

## First stop

We found all roads lead to Goshen, the center of Amish country. Our first stop was the Old Bag Factory. With a name like that, how could ThreeOlBags resist? Formerly a paper bag factory, the building has been transformed into a specialty mall with 19 shops and a cafe.

Potter Dick Lehman showed us how he made his wares on an old pottery wheel. He deftly sculpted wet clay while we chatted and soon produced an original stoneware bowl. Although most of his wheel-thrown stoneware and porcelain is sold locally, he accepts orders from out-of-towners. Lehman also pointed us toward other interesting activities in the area and shared his knowledge of Amish culture. One important etiquette tip we learned is to ask permission before taking pictures of the Amish.

Just across the trolley tracks from The Old Bag Factory is a restored 1837 log cabin perched on a hill. This is the home of Quilt Designs, owned and operated by Dave and Shirley A. Shenk. Shirley designs one-of-a-kind quilts, and then hires local Amish and Mennonite women to do the hand quilting. Shenk is one of the top five quilt designers in the country. It's definitely worth a stop to view her exquisite form of fabric art.

Our first stop on Saturday was Borkholder Dutch Village in Nappanee. It claims to be the "nation's largest antiques, collectibles and crafts mall." Each booth contains hand-crafted items made by area residents. We spoke with one woman from Hazel Park, Mich. who said, "I come here about every two years. There are things here you cannot find anywhere else. It's the best craft mall I have ever seen."

## Museum

We drove on to Shipshewana and found the Mennohof, a Mennonite Amish Visitors Center. Whether you are a history buff or just curious about learning the

beginnings of the Mennonite and Amish people, this is the place to start. The tastefully done museum traces their church history back to the Reformation.

"Follow the trail of a people searching for peace" is the theme of their multi-image presentation. Here you will find answers to questions like: Why do the Amish drive horse and buggies instead of cars? What caused the Amish to break away from the Mennonites in 1693? The tour takes a little over an hour to complete, and is well worth the \$5 donation.

We highly recommend the Blue Gate Restaurant in Shipshewana for the best Amish cuisine at a reasonable price. At only \$12.95 per person we found it to be a bargain. The family-style dinner concludes with a hearty portion of fresh-baked fruit pie.

Our two-hour visit with in the home of an Amish family gave us a chance to learn that our cultures are more alike than different

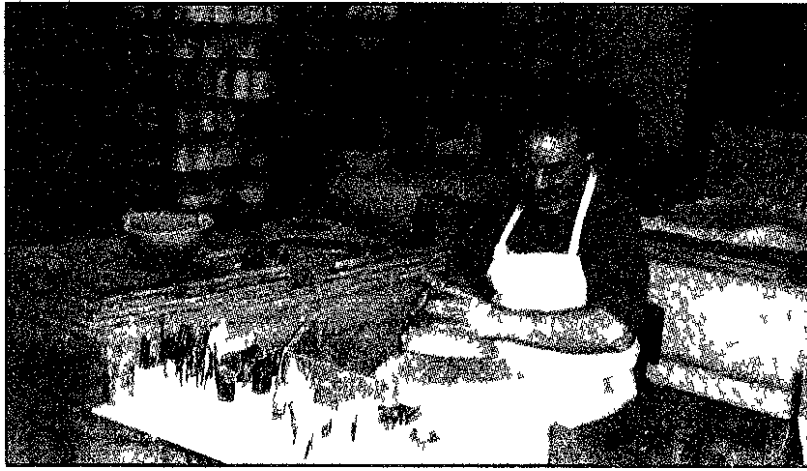
Even though their choice of transportation and dress may seem foreign to us, the Amish hold dear the same family values cherished by most Americans.

We began our visit a bit nervous that we might say or do something offensive to these people. We thought they lived within strange and restrictive boundaries. But, we left laughing at ourselves for being so presumptuous and deeply touched to have had the opportunity to share a little time with new

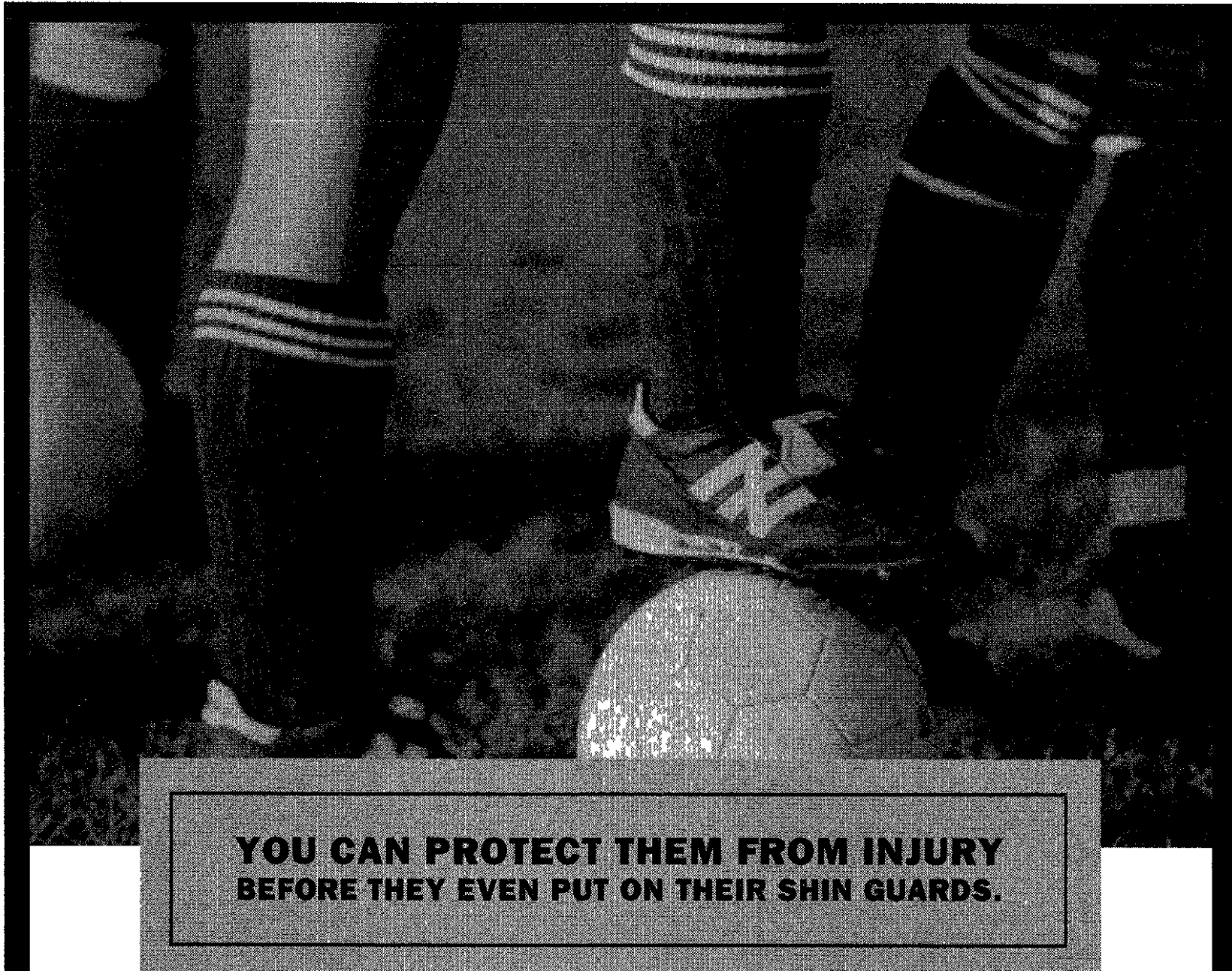
friends.

We asked our hosts if it was polite to wave at the buggies that pass by. They looked at each other knowingly, and then the husband replied, "Smiles are universally understood."

"Great players come up no matter who they're defended by," said Pinta, who adjusted his defense to try contain Pioneer

With eight minutes left, the Spartans nearly increased their lead when Bethany Dobbyn got a shot behind Goethel, but was kicked away by a Pioneer defender

Goethel also stopped Melissa Dobbyn point blank in the second minute of the period

"That was unbelievable," Pinta said. "It was just unfortunate she didn't put a little more on it."

Goethel made four saves, while Katherine Koch made three for the Spartans

Sophomore Melissa Dobbyn gave Stevenson a 1-0 lead at 36:03 of the first when she scored off a header. Senior Danielle Lewis assisted

"We came out, we were nervous," Morgan said

Pinta said he was worried about a letdown following Wednesday's victory over Western Lakes Activities Association rival and No. 2-ranked Northville

"This game, I had some concern, but they responded," said the first-year coach

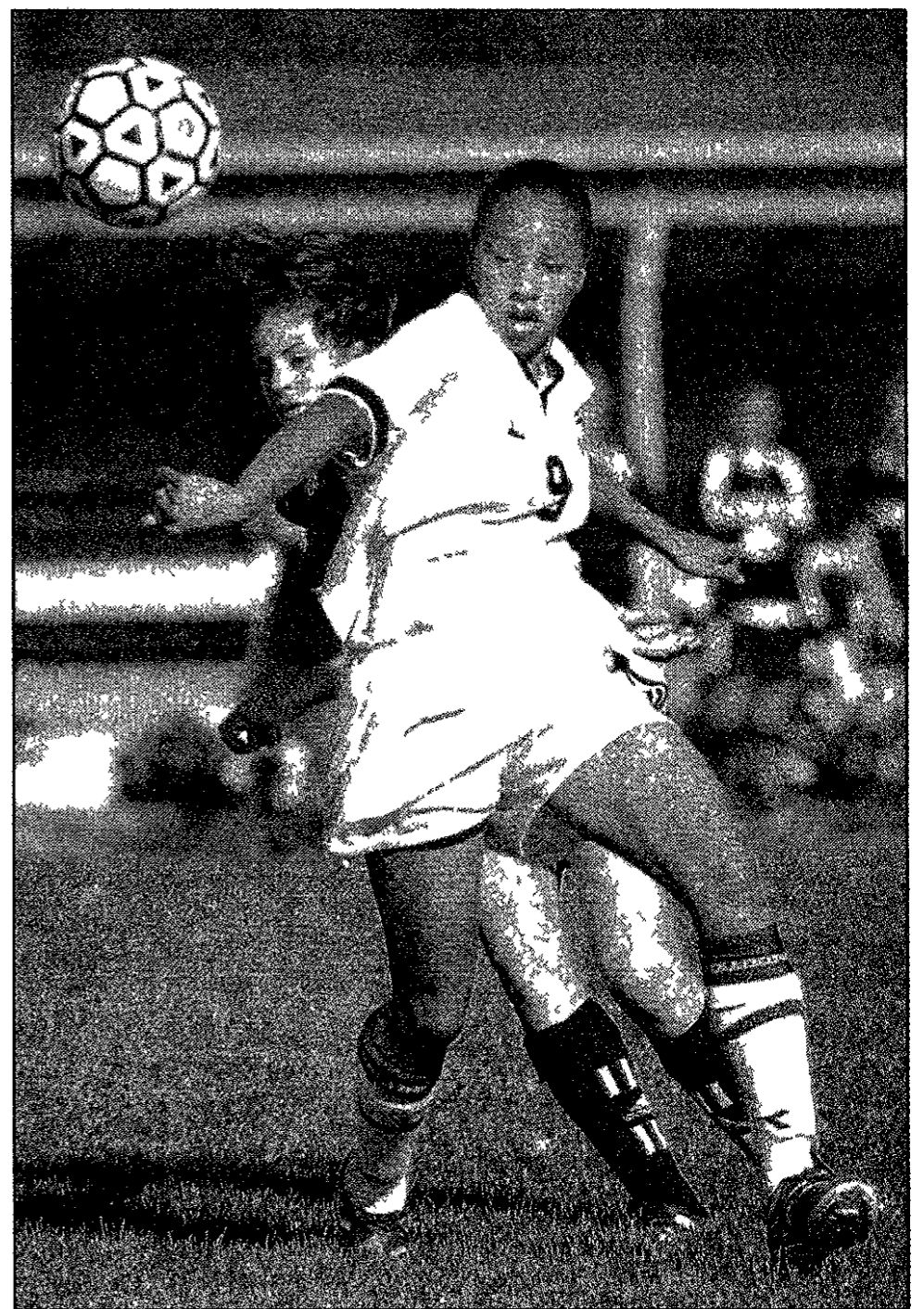
Morgan said his team switched its alignment for a 3-5-2 to a 3-4-3 with about 20 minutes left to try to generate offense

This should have been a story that, in reality, was just a couple of paragraphs. After all, Madonna University's men's soccer program isn't blessed with an abundance of athletic scholarship funds, and what coach Pete Alexander had was already tied up in the players he has returning

Which is everyone. "Recruiting without scholarship money," Alexander said, "well, I am very happy with what we ended up with"

Make that overjoyed Alexander — whose Crusader team battled through an injury-plagued campaign to post a 12-9-1 record, winning the Wolverine-Hoosier Athletic Conference Tournament and coming within one win of the NAIA Tournament — has commitments from nine players, three of whom could crack the starting lineup

The Madonna coach didn't have to travel far to pick up two of his top recruits. T.J. "He can play anywhere," said Alexander. "I talked to

coaches that played against his (Hamtramck) team and they said he was the only guy that kept them in the game. He's a very well-rounded player, and one of our most exciting recruits"

Then there's Shane Smith, a forward from Plymouth Salem who Alexander called "a workhorse. He's got a lot of speed, good size and he's very quick. I like what Shane gives us"

"T.J., Shane and Bernie are potential starters," said Alexander. "Maybe they won't get it right away, but they'll learn. I'm very position-specific. I call it functional training, making sure they know what they're going to do"

Others Alexander figures will make an impact on his team are midfielder Evan Baker, from Plymouth Canton, midfielder Joe Boumaroun, from Redford Catholic Central, Jeff Luttrell, a Canton resident, Brandon Sullivan, from Dearborn Heights Crestwood, and Garrett Dykes, from Woodhaven

Indeed, both the number and quality of his recruits even surprised Alexander. "This is one of our best recruiting classes ever," he insisted. "Not just in adding depth, but starters, too"

"We didn't need much. With these guys, we're looking great"

Certainly some are more advanced than others and will contribute earlier, like Djokic, Miller, Smith and Mesic. But Alexander has high hopes for the others as well

Like Baker. "He's a very, very fast kid," the Madonna coach said. "He doesn't have a lot of skill right now, but he's very fast"

He could say much the same about Sullivan. "He could be great," Alexander noted. "He's got a lot of athletic ability and he's very quick"

And then there's Dykes. "He works his butt off," said Alexander. "He'll be in the midfield somewhere"

But the quality of this recruiting class will be determined by those four guys at the top of Alexander's list. "T.J.'s a unique player," he said. "Some say he's got an attitude, but I love what he brings. He's going to be a standout in this league. He should start in the midfield"

"Miller's a lot like Shane. Both could start at forward for us"

And then there's Mesic. "Bernie will start for us somewhere," Alexander declared

It all adds up to something very positive, the Madonna coach felt. "I'm excited about this year," he said. "He should be, especially if Sam Pirame — a two-time All-American who missed most of last season with an injury — and Dan Kurtinaitis, who broke his leg in the next-to-last game, return healthy"

"If we can stay healthy, and you add these recruits to what we have coming back, we could have a phenomenal team," he said. "This could be our best season"

Hamilton reportedly discovered Lee University while surfing the internet, searching for a Christian college that had a solid volleyball program. After looking at several other schools, including Hillsdale, she settled on Lee

# MHSAA submits sports plan that is more like comedy show

Backed into a corner by a U.S. District Court judge in Kalamazoo, the Michigan High School Athletic Association recently submitted a plan that would change the scheduling to its tournaments in three sports.

The MHSAA also has submitted a plan to start four new post-season girls tournaments before adding any more for boys.

Gender equity and the alignment of current sports seasons — namely girls volleyball and basketball — have put the MHSAA in a pickle.

But it just doesn't boil down to switching seasons for girls and boys golf, tennis and swimming. It comes down to the old cigarette commercial "Wouldn't you rather fight than switch?"

The MHSAA's plan to add four more post-season tournaments for girls is curious, even laughable.

Somebody up in MHSAA office in Lansing must have been in a back room gagging with laughter when they came up with this plan to appease the K'zoo judge.

Of course, the MHSAA is banking on a favorable decision

down the road by the Sixth Circuit of the U.S. Court of Appeals, which delayed the District Court's ruling that seasons be realigned in 2003-04.

If the MHSAA wins this case, it's business as usual.

Or is it? Two new tournaments would be initiated each year for two years with the MHSAA choosing the four sports that best serves its membership from the following list of 12 sports: bowling, crew, equestrian, field hockey, figure skating, ice hockey, indoor track and field, lacrosse, power lifting, synchronized swimming, water polo and wrestling.

Which sports have the best chance of advancing in the field of 12?

I thought I'd give Jack Roberts and his staff some odds.

It's time to handicap their chances.

**Bowling (2-to-1):** Despite beer advertisements and cigarette smoke, most schools could come up with a squad and gain access to plenty of lanes, especially during the day.

**Ice hockey (5-to-2):** Most suburban school districts could put a unified squad on the ice. The sport is growing in popularity among girls following the last two Olympic Games. Doesn't Title IX stipulate if they allow

checking for boys, shouldn't they do the same for girls?

**Field hockey (8-to-1):** Popular among private and prep schools. It's been a traditional sport for women. The big question: Do you play it in the fall or the spring?

**Equestrian (40-to-1):** Not exactly a cheap sport, unlike bowling. What about liability? Who grooms the horses? What does the coach do?

**Powerlifting (50-to-1):** All we need are more Ken Caminiti and Jose Canseco female-types.

**Indoor track and field (60-to-1):** Don't tear Cobo Hall down just yet!

**Synchronized swimming (80-to-1):** Sure we have the pools, but do we have enough

noseplugs and swim caps? Who selects the music?

**Figure skating (100-to-1):** Crooked French judges, Tonya Harding vs. Nancy Kerrigan. It's almost as frightening as competitive cheer. What about competitive pom-pom?

## Shaw's season ends

One of the great athletic careers in Observerland history came to an abrupt end in the Division III track regional May 18 in Almont when Livonia Clarenceville's Tim Shaw pulled out of the 100-meter dash preliminaries with a pulled hamstring.

The 6-foot-2, 221-pound Shaw, the state's all-time leader in career rushing yards and touchdowns, had qualified for the state meet in the long jump, but did not make the trip Saturday to Comstock Park.

"The risk of further injury before going to Penn State (for football) just wasn't worth it,"

said first-year coach Clarenceville coach Dean Bergeron. "He's been doing better. He's jogging a little bit and he's getting physical therapy."

Shaw was the defending Division III state champion in the 100 and was runner-up in the 200.

He had lost a hotly contested 100-meter race to Division IV state champion Darryl Anglin of Redford Bishop Borgess in the Observerland Relays on May 4 at Livonia Churchill.

Shaw never made it either to the Metro Conference meet May 14 at Lutheran Westland.

It's no wonder Shaw or any track athlete, for that matter at Clarenceville, didn't come up with a pulled hamstring with the unseasonably cold spring and overloaded schedule.

Curiously, Clarenceville competed in some ill-advised back-to-back Monday-Tuesday dual meets for three consecutive weeks from April 22 through May 7.

There was simply no time for recovery and Shaw unfortunately paid the price.

# Turnquist out, Harrison to get new varsity basketball coach

After coaching boys basketball at Harrison High School for 13

years, Dave Turnquist won't be back on the bench directing the Hawks next season.

He resigned as boys varsity head coach recently, according to

Turnquist, under pressure from the school administration.

Turnquist, who replaced long time coach Mike Teachman on the eve of the 1999-00 season on

an interim basis, was later given the permanent job and had a 26-37 record in three years.

He had been the school's JV coach for the previous 10 years, compiling an overall record of 131-69 at that level.

At the end of the last season, Turnquist said he met with Assistant Principal Dennis Noe and requested a meeting with Principal Rande Horn when it became apparent he wasn't going to be retained. The meeting with Horn confirmed that, he said.

When asked for his comment Horn said he had a letter of resignation from Turnquist and referred the matter to Brian Swinehart, the athletic director for Farmington Public Schools.

Horn said there was an amicable break between various people and he thinks a lot of Turnquist.

"It became very apparent I was longer wanted as basketball coach," Turnquist said, "so I offered my resignation along with some very constructive issues with regard to sports in general at Harrison."

Harrison has already hired a replacement for Turnquist, however, Horn declined to say who the new coach will be, also referring that issue to Swinehart, who was not available Friday afternoon. The new coach apparently will be on the teaching staff at Harrison and will have a presence in the building.

Turnquist was a non-staff employee who works as a financial analyst for The Budd Company, an automotive supplier. He is a Harrison alum living in Farmington Hills and has been a longtime Harrison booster.

I've always said that if the

school could hire an experienced, qualified coach who is in the building every day, that's what they should do," Turnquist said. "The daily interactions between a coach and his players and their teachers is critical to the overall success of any program."

"I am disappointed in the way it was handled in the end. The communication between myself and the principal was never what it should have been, and for that I'll take some of the responsibility."

"(Horn) and I have had only two serious conversations about basketball over the past eight years. The first was two years ago when he said, 'Good luck, I hope you're here a long time.' The second was two months ago when he said, 'You're fired' — and even with that one, he had his assistant tell me that news."

There are many Sunday morning bowling leagues in the area in spite of the fact that some people like to just sleep in on that day. The guys all asked Harry what happened to him, and he replied "I got blessed by a priest." The next two games he bowled 116 and 131. The following week as he saw the Priest, he thanked him and said, "I would appreciate it if your blessing was good for all three games instead of just one." A couple of weeks ago, our story was about bowler Terry

Haines of Westland. He rolled 35 of a possible 36 strikes in his three-game series for a Detroit area record tying total of 879, setting a new all-time high series mark in the Western Wayne Metro Bowling Association. Now, Terry has made the most of his talent by turning it into some good hard cash in the Mid-States Masters 215 division competition. ### Kidney cars

### Row your boat, junior!

A new survey, commissioned by the National Marine Manufacturers Association and conducted by the Impulse Research Corporation, found that kids who boat are healthier physically and psychologically than their non-boating counterparts. The online survey was conducted with a random sample of 1,004 parents, half of whom have children who boat regularly, and have who do not.

Families who boat reported their children to be healthier than those who don't (71 percent of boaters said their children's health was excellent, as opposed to 61 percent of non-boaters). While it might seem obvious that boating can promote physical fitness, boating can also help children psychologically.

Children who boat learn to be more outgoing and less shy or introverted. They are better team players (63 percent compared to 53 percent) and tend to be more optimistic (52 percent to 43 percent) and self-confident. Boaters' children (75 percent to 65 percent) tended to be the leader more often than their peers are.

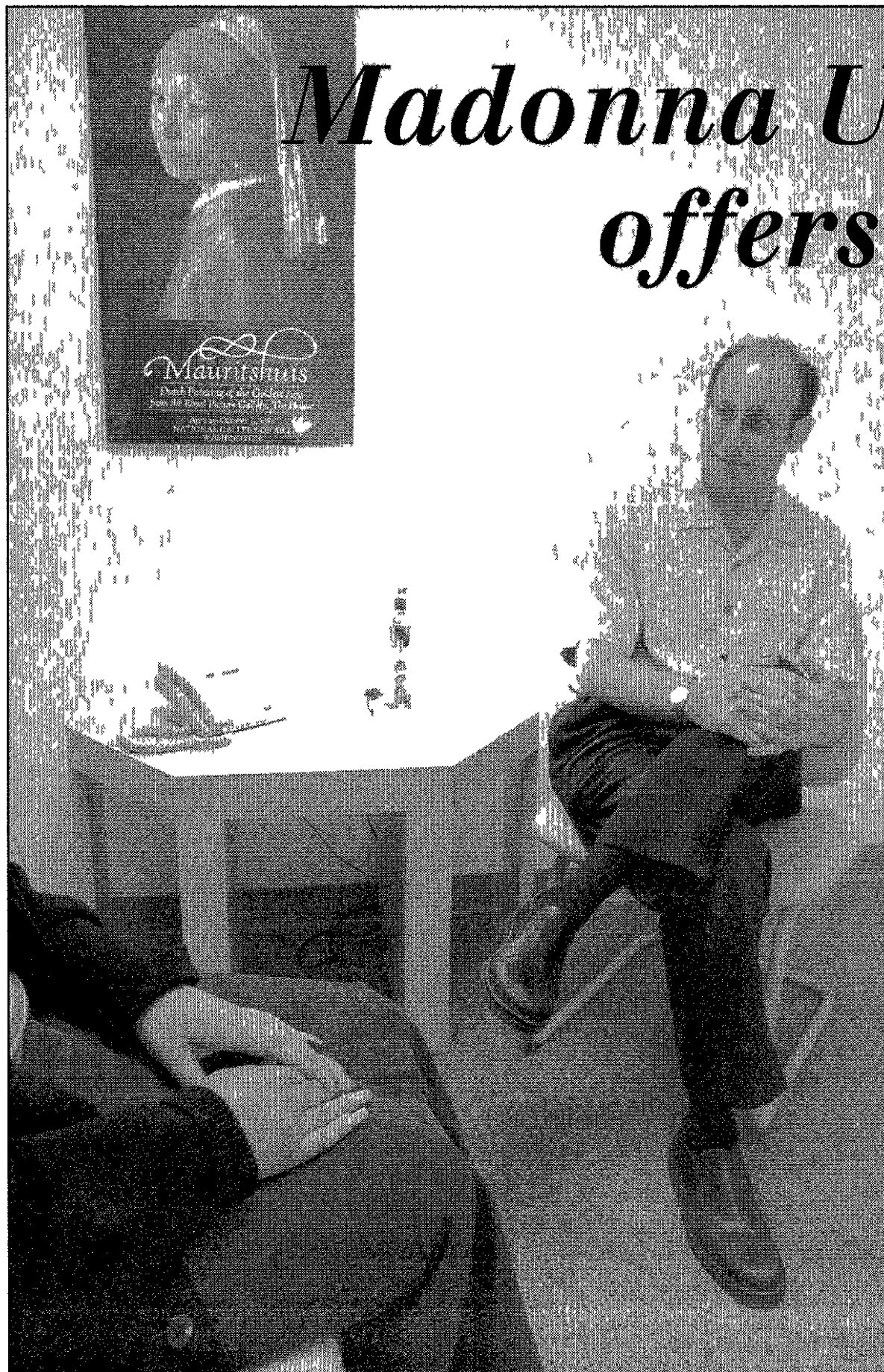

## Madonna University offers low-cost mental health care

A potential solution to the high cost and inaccessibility of quality mental health care is available and open to the public at Livonia's Madonna University. Opened in early May, the new Psychological Services Clinic offers reduced-fee psychological assessment, treatment and testing to the general public, as well as to the university's students, staff and faculty.

"We wanted to create a place where people could come and receive affordable, high-quality mental health care without the limits often imposed by other facilities," said Robert Cohen, Ph.D., director of both the Psychological Services Clinic and the Master's of Science in Clinical Psychology program at Madonna.

"Often, insurance companies and community organizations place restrictions on the number of sessions a person can attend, or limits to what kinds of problems a person can be treated for. There are no such limits here," he continued.

In an effort to promote awareness and education, the clinical staff is embarking on a campus-wide campaign to dispel the negative connotations associated with mental health care.

There are a lot of myths about mental health care, but things like depression and anxiety can lead to the deterioration of relationships and prevent a person from doing well in school or at work, said Cohen. "Years of research show that therapy helps, and helps more than medication alone."

Although it is staffed mainly by graduate students working under the supervision of doctoral-level psychologists, the clinic also provides some services from faculty members who are licensed, experienced professionals. Cohen is one of several staff members who, in addition to his work at the university, also has an established private practice.

### Services

Treatment is available at the clinic for a wide range of difficulties, including depression.

## Alcohol before bed: No Rx for insomnia

ANN ARBOR, Mich. - Many people think of alcohol as a substance that can help them relax after a long day at the office or even act as a sleeping aid after a stressful or active day.

But a drink before bed can have a serious effect on sleep, often aggravating insomnia rather than eliminating it. And for those people at risk for alcohol dependence, drinking regularly before bed, over time, could lead to dependency.

In fact, ongoing research at the Addiction Research Center at the University of Michigan Health System shows a strong relationship between alcohol dependence and insomnia, defined as trouble falling asleep, staying asleep or feeling dissatisfied with sleep. The study revealed that up to 75 percent of people surveyed who were alcohol dependent had difficulty with insomnia. However, alcohol's effect on sleep is not limited to those who are alcohol dependent.

"Alcohol disrupts sleep," says Dr. Kirk Brower, a U-M addiction psychiatrist who leads the research. "It may help people initially fall asleep, but as it wears off when blood alcohol levels drop during sleep, it will cause a person to wake up or have restless sleep."

Alcohol dependence, also affects other areas of a person's life. When a person is alcohol dependent, he or she may drink more than intended, even though there may be a desire to stop or cut down. Due to an impaired control over alcohol, that will continue to drink despite adverse consequences. Alcoholism often refers to a severe, chronic and progressive form of alcohol dependence, which wors-

ens over time without treatment.

A vicious cycle can develop when people become dependent on alcohol to help them sleep. The alcohol may work initially, but over time, it can disrupt sleep, causing a person to feel the need to drink even more before bed to fall asleep. Ultimately, Brower says, this cycle leads to an increased use of alcohol.

"There's really a spectrum of drinking before bed," says Brower. "Some people have one drink, the so-called 'nightcap,' while others may drink more heavily, causing an even greater disruption to sleep. But sleep laboratory tests have also shown that even one drink before bed can be disruptive to sleep."

Taking an even closer look at the effect of alcohol on sleep, Brower and his colleagues at U-M have studied the sleeping patterns of people who had been diagnosed as alcohol dependent. The study was based on the patients' self-

### Facts on alcohol and sleep

■ For one in ten Americans who are alcohol dependent, a drink before bed can have a serious effect on their sleep, in most cases creating insomnia rather than eliminating it.

■ A recent study conducted by the Addiction Research Center at the U-M Health System showed that up to 75 percent of people who are alcohol dependent experience insomnia.

■ Drinking before bed can develop into a vicious cycle. When one drink isn't enough to avoid sleeplessness or restless sleep, most often alcohol consumption is increased before bed to aid with sleep.

■ About two-thirds of people who undergo treatment for alcohol dependency either significantly reduce their drinking or are able to abstain from its use. Often it's necessary to correct other problems, such as sleep disorders, that may result in alcohol use to treat the dependence successfully.

and anxiety, relationship concerns, work and academic inhibitions, children's issues and family problems. Full psychological testing related to learning problems and personality issues is also available.

Because of a young family's overwhelming financial responsibilities, children are much more likely to go without testing than adults, said Jane Alexandra Kessler, administrative director of the Psychological Services

Clinic and co-director of the Clinical Psychology graduate program.

"But if a child is struggling with behavior issues or learning problems, testing can be crucial to really understanding the problem."

Kessler, also in private practice, says staff members work hard to make sure clients understand what the test results actually mean.

As a result of testing, we are

usually able to give parents a down-to-earth understanding of what that child is struggling with, said Kessler. "And it's important they receive concrete recommendations about the things we found and the services we feel can make a real difference for the child."

Psychological testing, a process that takes 4-6 hours over several sessions, is available for both children and adults at the clinic.

The fee for this service is approximately \$150.

"Typically, a person receiving these tests at a private facility can expect to pay around \$1,200," said Kessler, noting that insurance benefits do not usually cover psychological testing.

Fees for therapy are based on a sliding scale reflective of the client's income. Sessions range from \$10-\$60 each.

The sliding scale will allow those people who may need more intensive treatment to come in more often, said Lorne Chopra, one of eight graduate students who work in the clinic. "There aren't a lot of people out there who can afford to pay \$100-\$150 per session if they need to come in three times a week. Here, they could pay as little as \$10 per visit."

### Good education

Chopra believes the high quality of education she received,

along with the dedication, expertise and experience of faculty members, will enable the clinic's team to reach out to help a great many people.

Our educators bring a very real aspect to the instruction we receive, said Chopra. "They're out working in the real world, so they have current knowledge of different organizations and all the latest research findings. They bring all those pieces back together in the clinic here at Madonna. It's a benefit to everyone involved."

Chopra is no stranger to the real world, either. The Master's of Clinical Psychology will be her second graduate degree. She earned a Master's of Science in Hospice from Madonna several years ago.

Currently, she provides grief support to bereaved children and their families through employment in the Sand Castles program at Hospice of Henry Ford, division of the Henry Ford

Health System.

An element common to all those involved in the new clinic is a hope that it will help create a greater sense of well-being in the institution and the community at large.

It's exciting to see this beginning venture that has such potential to serve the needs of our students, and the needs of our community as well, said Sister Nancy Marie Jamroz, Madonna's vice president of student services.

reporting of their sleep patterns and overnight stays at a U-M sleep laboratory.

The study followed the patients for about five months after they began treatment for alcohol dependence. The researchers found that those people who complained the most about sleep, experienced the most insomnia, and had the most disruptive sleep while at the sleep laboratory were more likely to relapse to alcohol use and dependence than those who did not complain of insomnia.

Following the study, Brower says he and his colleagues decided to explore ways to help alcohol dependent people with their sleep problems to prevent them from using an alcoholic "nightcap" as a solution.

Alcohol dependence is often a matter of life and death, says Brower. In many cases, it can lead to automobile accidents, liver and brain disease and some forms of cancer. It can also impair relationships and job performance, taking a toll on a person's entire life.

"We are always looking for ways to help people with sleep and other problems without resorting to sleeping pills that have some abuse potential because they are habit forming," says Brower. "There are a variety of other medications out on the market that are not necessarily designed for sleep, but are used to treat other disorders such as

depression or epilepsy. We've found that some of those medications work quite well in people with alcohol dependence."

### Recognition

Sometimes, however, the first and most difficult step for a person facing alcohol dependence is to admit they have a problem. Often, Brower says, it is the people surrounding that person that initially recognize there is a problem.

For people who don't think they have a problem, we may ask them to demonstrate that by abstaining completely from alcohol for several weeks or longer. People who can abstain readily at all are unlikely to have alcohol dependence. People who cannot are candidates for treatment.

But there is treatment for alcohol dependence such as various forms of counseling and medications like disulfiram and naltrexone. Brower is the executive director of Chelsea Arbor Treatment Center, which provides these treatments.

"Treatment works," Brower says. "Studies have shown that about two-thirds of people who undergo treatment for the condition either significantly reduce their drinking or are able to abstain from alcohol completely."

# Katie Couric wakes up America on colonoscopy screening

ANN ARBOR, MI - She's known as the perky co-host of NBC's "Today Show," and millions of Americans wake up to her every morning. And each morning, Katie Couric's faithful viewers depend on her to not only deliver the news but also to keep them informed on the latest in home life, fashion sense, and health care. So it's no surprise when Katie does something, much of America does too.

Evidence of this was obvious in March of 2000, when Couric underwent a live, on-air colonoscopy on the "Today Show," two years after the tragic death of her husband, Jay Monahan, from colon cancer at

age 42. This was the cornerstone of a week-long series the show ran promoting colon cancer awareness and endorsing colorectal cancer screening.

In the months following the broadcast, interest in colon cancer prevention increased dramatically, but the actual effect on colon cancer screening was not quantified. Researchers from the University of Michigan Health System at the Society of General Internal Medicine meeting in Atlanta recently reported that Couric's campaign did have a substantial effect on the number of cancer screening tests. They call this finding the "Couric Effect."

"Our study found Ms. Couric's

campaign resulted in a substantial increase in colonoscopies performed across the country," says Dr. Mark Fendrick, senior author on the paper and co-director of the Consortium for Health Outcomes, Innovation, Cost Effectiveness Studies or CHOICES at UMHS. "Not only did Ms. Couric's television campaign have an immediate impact, but the significant increase in screening rates remained long after the broadcast."

Using a population-based observational study, the U-M researchers examined colonoscopy rates drawn from a database of 400 endoscopists nationwide, as well as rates

from a Midwestern managed care organization from July 1998 (89 weeks before Ms. Couric's procedure) through December 2000 (40 weeks after). Peter Cram, M.D., lead author on the study and an internal medicine lecturer at UMHS, says the results were striking.

"Our study shows the number of colonoscopies increased by 19 percent, and was sustained for 40 weeks," says Cram. "Colorectal cancer is the second leading cause of cancer death among Americans. It is important to point out that a majority of these deaths can be prevented if people underwent the recommended screening. So the fact

that Ms. Couric's campaign demonstrated nearly a 20 percent increase in the number of screenings is an exciting finding."

The study also revealed that significantly more women and younger individuals underwent colonoscopy following Ms. Couric's campaign than before, a finding consistent with the demographics of the "Today Show" viewers, who are 60 percent female with a median age of 47.5.

Fendrick says this study suggests a celebrity spokesperson - even one who doesn't suffer from the disease they are promoting - can have a dramatic impact on public behavior relat-

ed to that disease. Although Fendrick views Couric's campaign as a tremendous success, he says there are many more people at risk for colon cancer that still should undergo colon cancer screening.

"There's no question Ms. Couric had a direct impact on the increase in colonoscopy screenings across the country," Fendrick says. "Despite the overwhelming evidence that colon cancer screening saves lives, half of Americans who could benefit from screening are not getting it. We need more celebrity spokespeople like Katie Couric to help get the word out."

# Key to security: Don't overlook insurance policies

Many small business owners may feel particularly vulnerable to risk because much of their businesses success depends on one person or a few key employees. Because no business can insulate itself completely from very risk, getting protection and planning ahead is vital to being prepared for the worst-case scenario.

As part of this planning, small business owners should consider key employee life and/or disability insurance. Key employee life insurance is insurance written on the life of an organization's officer or other key employee, the loss of whom would cause the organization financial hardship. In general, a key employee can be anyone who is responsible for management decisions, as highly paid, has a significant effect on sales or has a special

rapport with customers and creditors.

If a key employee dies, a business typically suffers in four ways:

- Loss of management skill and experience
- Disruption in sales or business production
- Credit difficulties
- New expenses as a result of hiring and training a replacement for the key employee

Key employee life insurance works like individual life insurance, when the insured dies, the policy pays out a benefit. However, instead of an individual insuring him or herself or a family member, the business owns the policy and pays the premium. If the insured dies, the business is the beneficiary and will receive the policy payout.

Structurally, many key employee life insurance policies are set up as permanent policies that build cash value over time. However, a smaller business can choose a term life policy instead, if cash flow is an issue. The term

policy may be able to be connected to a permanent policy at a later date.

In this case, premiums are paid until the employee retires or leaves the company. The cash value can then be used to informally fund a deferred compensation pay out if the key employee remains with the company for a certain length of time.

How much coverage is necessary? The amount can range from the equivalent of the key employee's base salary to as high as 10 or 15 times his or her salary. Most small business do

best with a payout of two to three times the key employee's salary. Key employee life insurance policies are not only affordable, but investors and lenders often will insist you purchase a policy to protect their investment.

Typical benefits of key employee life insurance include:

- Corporate redemption of stock owned by the key employee
- Indemnification of lost corporate profits
- Payment of outstanding obligations

Increased working capital. When the right type and amount of insurance are used, key

employee life insurance can also include informal funding of a key employee's death, disability or retirement benefits. Premiums are not included in a key employee's income and are not deductible. The proceeds of a key employee life insurance policy paid to the business are exempt from income tax.

When considering key employee life insurance, it is also a good idea to put together a business continuation plan, including details of how your business will function without key employees. Not only is this helpful, but it is also often required by insurance companies.

Because the chance of being disabled is greater than the chance of death before the age of 65, key employee disability insurance may be more important than life insurance in protecting your company. Although disability can be a great econom-

ic loss to a business, small business owners are often unsure about using this insurance.

One reason business owners may be deterred from disability insurance is the potential cost. Expect to pay \$3,500 to \$4,000 a year to cover a nonsmoking 40-year-old male for a benefit of \$15,000 a month for two years (after a 90-day waiting period). Disability insurance is also hard to find because the number of providers is diminishing. Premiums may be deductible, but if they are not, the benefits are tax-free.

As with most safety nets, key employee insurance may seem expensive and can be tough to think about. When planning for the unknown, however, there is one thing you can surely count on: The price of key employee insurance and the time associated with planning for it will seem like a bargain if you ever need to use it.

**IN CASE OF TIE, YOU WIN**

Physicians often turn to blood studies, x-rays, CT scans and MRIs to help in the diagnosis of arthritic conditions. These studies can be as deceptive as they are useful. A blood study could show you have a high titer of rheumatoid factor or reveal a positive ANA, a finding associated with lupus arthritis. However, the doctor examining you may find no evidence that you have either rheumatoid or lupus arthritis.


In such cases, and they happen often, you win. If the laboratory tests indicate one condition, but the experience of your illness and the examination indicate something else, then the laboratory results are set aside. Contact with your doctor over the results of test tubes and imaging whether by x-rays or digital chips. Even with the technology now available, nothing surpasses telling you, story to the doctor, and having him follow with an examination.

I do not mean to downgrade the use of screening tests. The medical community has sufficient experience to know that certain tests such as a blood sugar, cholesterol level, post-menopausal bone density test, pap smear and mammogram are useful. The time to obtain them is when you do not show the effects of diabetes, atherosclerosis, osteoporosis or cancer.

Screening for arthritis does not work that way. In arthritis, you are as good as you feel. However, if you don't feel right, you need further evaluation even if the test results conclude nothing is wrong. The rule is to care for the patients, not the paper trail that follows them.

"This car is really cool," said Francesca, who's 10.

"Yeah, you know what I like? How big the back seat is and there's a lot of room back here," said her sister, Rebecca, 8.

"You know what's really cool that we haven't seen in any cars? These foot rests in the back for us to put our feet on," said Francesca "It's even cool-looking on the outside"

Even my kids are, becoming critics Or should I say future auto reviewers

Everyone's got an opinion on a car, but now I have to put up with it from the back seat as well? Great But what's really great is that this Rendezvous is a comfort to drive on long journeys gets you great gas mileage, has looks that can kill and is a blast to drive

You want a fun commute—you want a Rendezvous Let's start with it's powerful 3.4 liter V6 engine that's rated at 185 horsepower Mated to a 4-speed automatic with overdrive and torque converter clutch and you've got power at your toes with a quick flex of your ankle

Never did I have a problem merging on the freeway, passing a slower vehicle or shooting around town Its quick response and nimble handling—usually reserved for a sports car—makes it a pleasure to drive

The Rendezvous is available in two trim levels CX and CXL, with the CXL level giving you a bit more luxury and options The Rendezvous is what's now known as a crossover vehicle

Crossovers are creating a benchmark in the automotive industry They cannot be classified into any existing automotive category, which was defined before Buick combined the comforts of a passenger car and sport sedan, the people hauling features of a minivan and the versatility of an SUV, all rolled into a neat package What it gives you is the flexibility to configure your Rendezvous to whatever suits your lifestyle Looks like an SUV, has all points luxury on the inside and the bonus option of carrying lots of people or lots of cargo

You can actually get about 109 cubic feet of cargo area by moving around the seats Pop the available third row seat out of the floor and you can seat up to seven passengers Parents of quintuplets? No problem

There's an option of adding GM's own VersaTrak all wheel-drive system and you can equip it to tow up to 3,500 pounds Opt for it if you live where snow is a four letter word (Don't get me wrong, I love snow—just not in the city)

On the inside, Rendezvous is comfortable Standard are cloth seats but you can opt for the leather-with-cloth-inserts or fully leather seating surfaces I like the leather More luxurious and easy to clean

There's a large center console that allows you to pass between the rows Interior surfaces are downright pretty with accenting in all the right places Instrumentation is easy to read and simple to operate

Safety features do not take a back seat on the Rendezvous The list, it goes on and on Front and side air bags, four-wheel, anti lock braking system, safety-cage construction and OnStar In the rear cargo area, you'll notice a pressure outlet that can be utilized to blow up an inner tube, floating toys for the kids, sports equipment or even a low tire

Relatively new in concept—although a couple of automakers have had this equipment in their vehicles—is the Rear Parking Assist Through the

use of four strategically placed sensors in the rear bumper the system can detect objects in the rear of the vehicle that you can't see It gives the driver a warning chime and flashes warning lights to alert you to the danger that can be anything from a bike to a child

The standard equipment list is long, so I'll just give you the highlights Remote keyless entry, power programmable door locks Cruise control, power windows, leather wrapped steering wheel, aluminum wheels, deep tint glass, floor mats, remote liftgate release and cargo security cover and net

The Rendezvous we tested was the CXL trim level and added more than \$6,000 in available options, including six-way power seats up front with memory, overhead console, leather heated seats, theft deterrent system, universal garage door opener, rear seat audio controls, head-up display, a premium sound package and trailer-tow package, among others

Gotta tell you, the Buick Rendezvous is an incredible car-truck It can handle just about any situation you can throw at it The power, the comfort, the fuel economy are all on the mark I'd recommend you take yourself down to your nearest Buick dealer and take your own test drive Then you'll see what I mean

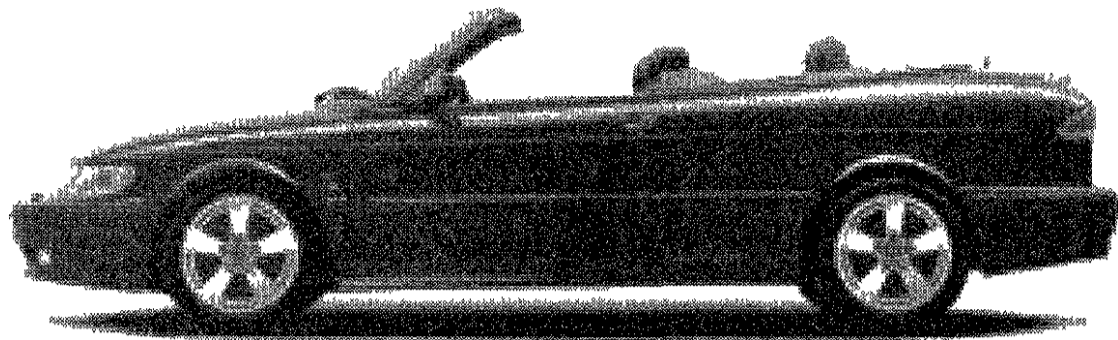

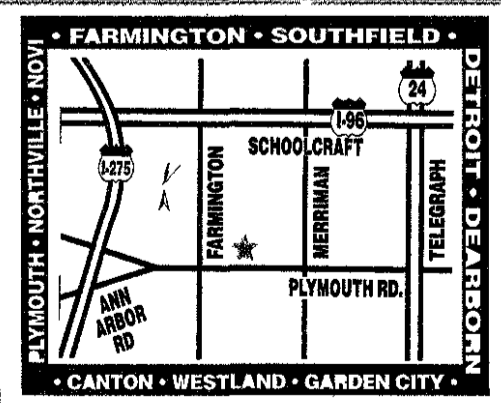
