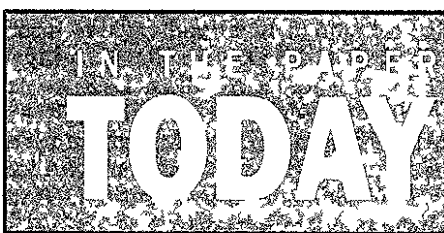

## District eyes Canton property

**Knowing that its population is growing the most in Canton, officials with the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools are working with a local developer to purchase property in southwest Canton on which they could potentially build a new elementary school.**

Plymouth-Canton Schools is working on a million-dollar deal that could net them 14 acres of land in Canton's Cherry Hill Village. The site could eventually be home to a new elementary school in the fastest growing area of the school district.

"We're in the process of negotiating a deal to sell acreage on the northeast corner of Cherry Hill and Denton roads," revealed David Stollman, vice president of Biltmore Properties Corp in Troy, which is developing the housing project in southwest Canton. "The school district is looking for a site, and sees the future growth in that part of Canton."

"We're trying to build a small village,

and schools have always played a role in that," he said. "We want to improve the quality of life for parents and kids, and a school is a great way of doing it."

Cherry Hill Village is a community with a traditional style of architecture, and Stollman said "the school will be built with a traditional look that is compatible with the rest of the village."

The footprint of the school reportedly would be the same as Tonda and Dodson elementary schools, with some modifications made to the outside to fit the aesthetics of Cherry Hill Village.

The Plymouth Canton school board has met several times in executive session concerning property. Deputy

Superintendent Jim Ryan admitted the district is looking at possibly building a new elementary school to accommodate students in the area.

"The ideal situation is to build a school where we have vision," he said. "It would probably be a pure walking school. It (Cherry Hill Village) is a high-density area, and a school could definitely be part of that."

"Even with Dodson Elementary open, we're blessed with a growing community," Ryan said. "Dodson isn't overcrowded, but we're interested in space to expand."

## Daly's comes down to pave way for Rite Aid

Plymouth is apparently about to get a new drug store.

Construction workers spent the better part of the week tearing down the old Daly's Drive-in building at the corner of Main and Ann Arbor Road, apparently paving the way for construction of a new Rite Aid store.

According to Arkan Jonna, the Bloomfield Hills-based developer hired by the drug store chain, the 11,000-square-foot store will be red brick masonry, with limestone accent and oval-top windows. There will be a red brick wall along Main Street and Ann Arbor Road, with a Welcome to Plymouth sign and a clock at the corner. The store will also have a drive-

through pharmacy.

"It will be a very pretty building," Jonna said. "The city and planning commission did a fine job in designing the building. It will bring a definite identity to that corner."

Rite Aid signed a 50-year lease for the property in November 1998 from the former owners of Daly's. At the time, the drug store chain presented designs to the planning commission for a state-of-the-art store. However, the company's economic problems forced a delay in the project.

In November 2001, Rite Aid resubmitted building plans, indicating it was ready to begin construction.

## Arts budget faces ax without state cigarette tax

As the state legislature readied to vote on a 50 cent increase in the cigarette tax Wednesday, representatives of the arts community in Plymouth were crossing their fingers hoping it would pass.

Without the additional revenue (the tax was reportedly worth upwards of \$300 million), the state was prepared to initiate painful budget reductions, including half of the \$235 million in arts grants.

For Plymouth, that would mean cuts in the budgets of the Plymouth Sym-

phony and the Plymouth Community Arts Council, resulting in possible program cuts for both those programs in 2003.

"We had anticipated before Sept. 11 that we were going to get more than the \$22,900 we got this year," said Darlene Dreyer, executive director of the Plymouth Symphony. "Now, we just don't know."

The elimination of the state grant would reduce the symphony's budget by almost 10 percent, said Dreyer.

"It seems like a small part of our budget, but if we don't get the state

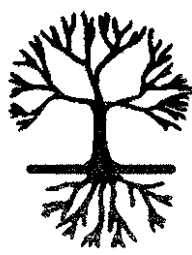

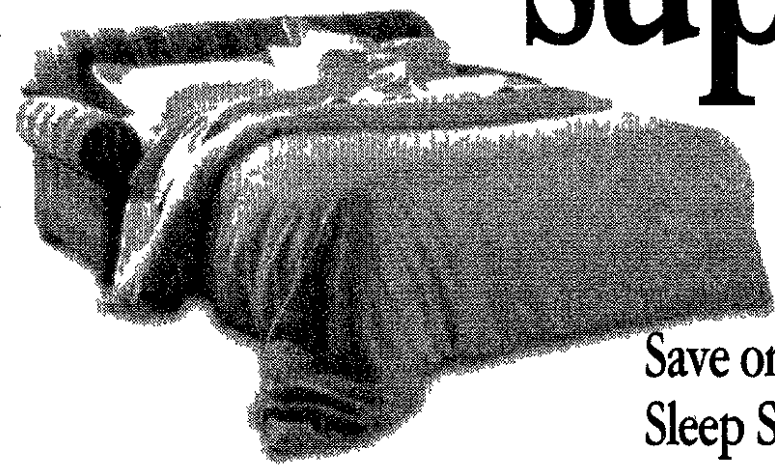

**Letter blasts township union**

The relationship between Plymouth Township negotiators and representatives of the AFSCME local trying to get a contract apparently aren't getting any better

In a scathing letter Friday, township labor attorney Eric Cholak blasted the union for talking to the media about contract negotiations, saying union president Nichole Hunt and negotiator Angela Tabor violated a "ground rule" that said the union wouldn't talk to the press without 24 hours notice to the township

Cholak and township officials were upset that union representatives talked to members of the media during an informational picket at the township's May 28 board meeting, violating the ground rule they say were set when negotiations began March 21, 2001

"The union blatantly violated this ground rule by failing to notify us before Union President Nichole Hunt spoke" with the media, Cholak wrote "What is even worse is that once the union decided to conduct negotiations in the media, it distorted the truth about issues presented at the bargaining table"

At issue is how much progress has been made According to union officials, very little

progress had been made by the time they resorted to informational pickets (they've now picketed two township meetings)

But Cholak pointed out in his letter, addressed to Angela Tabor, staff representative of Michigan AFSCME Council 25 who is handling negotiations for the union, that "potential" agreements had been reached on 18 separate items

He also pointed out a ground rule the sides had established in July 2001 concerning potential agreements According to Cholak's letter, potential agreements are reached on issues so negotiators can "reopen" discussion on them if subsequent issues require it, tentative agreement is only reached when all issues are settled

"Therefore, there is no such thing as a tentative agreement on an individual issue," Cholak wrote

Tabor could not be reached for comment

Township supervisor Steve Mann said the letter was written to show the township's disappointment that the union talked to the media

"We (township officials) discussed the actions the union is taking, and the distorted picture they're trying to paint," Mann said "We felt we couldn't let that happen, that we needed to let their members know, in fact, what's taking place There are

many things that are being done that their members aren't even aware of

"We've had very successful negotiations with all of our other groups," Mann said "This is the only group that's having any difficulties, and it's certainly not on the employers' side"

According to Tabor, though, the language in the union's initial proposal to the township is the same "boiler plate" contract that was given to employees in the City of Plymouth, who were also trying to establish a union

According to Tabor, those negotiations went very well, and the sides were getting close to an agreement before the city decided to disband its unit

Carol Stone, administrative services director for the city, wouldn't go that far, but characterized the negotiations as "friendly and cooperative"

"We hadn't really even started on economic issues," said Stone "But we had reached tentative agreement on the non-economic issues" in approximately six to eight months of bargaining

Meanwhile, the township and AFSCME returned to the bargaining table last week, and although no one was talking specifics, township human relations director Joanne Coobatis said the session went well

"We got some things accomplished," she said "So we're getting closer"

# Sculpture to honor Kellogg Park donor

In the mid 1800s the piece of property known today as Kellogg Park was used 'by people of the Village as a place to meet have picnics, and tether their cows Trees were planted in the park in 1858 Band concerts and circuses were held there according to information from the Plymouth Historical Museum

Except for the circuses and tethering of cows not much has changed in Kellogg Park It's still used to bring people together for fun and activity, thanks to John Kellogg, a settler from Westfield Mass who in 1834 moved to what is now called Plymouth

And, because of that the Kiwanis Club of Colonial Plymouth is spearheading a \$125,000 fundraising drive to construct a sculpture dedicated to Kellogg, who gave Plymouth its crown jewel

'I thought it was a shame after all these years there hadn't been anything to represent what Mr Kellogg had done and the effect it's had on our community by donating the park' said Jim Rawlinson of Plymouth a Kiwanis man who is taking charge of the project "It's such an extraordinary focal point in our community and we no longer should overlook his contribution to our city'

The sculpture will be cast bronze with the figures one and a quarter life size The tallest

part will be 5 feet 8 inches with the total length nearly 10 feet

The sculpture will represent children interacting around a drinking fountain as children might do in a park such as Kellogg Park and as Mr Kellogg might have envisioned when he donated the park to the city' said Rawlinson "It evolved from seeing families in Kellogg Park interacting and realizing how important the children and the families are'

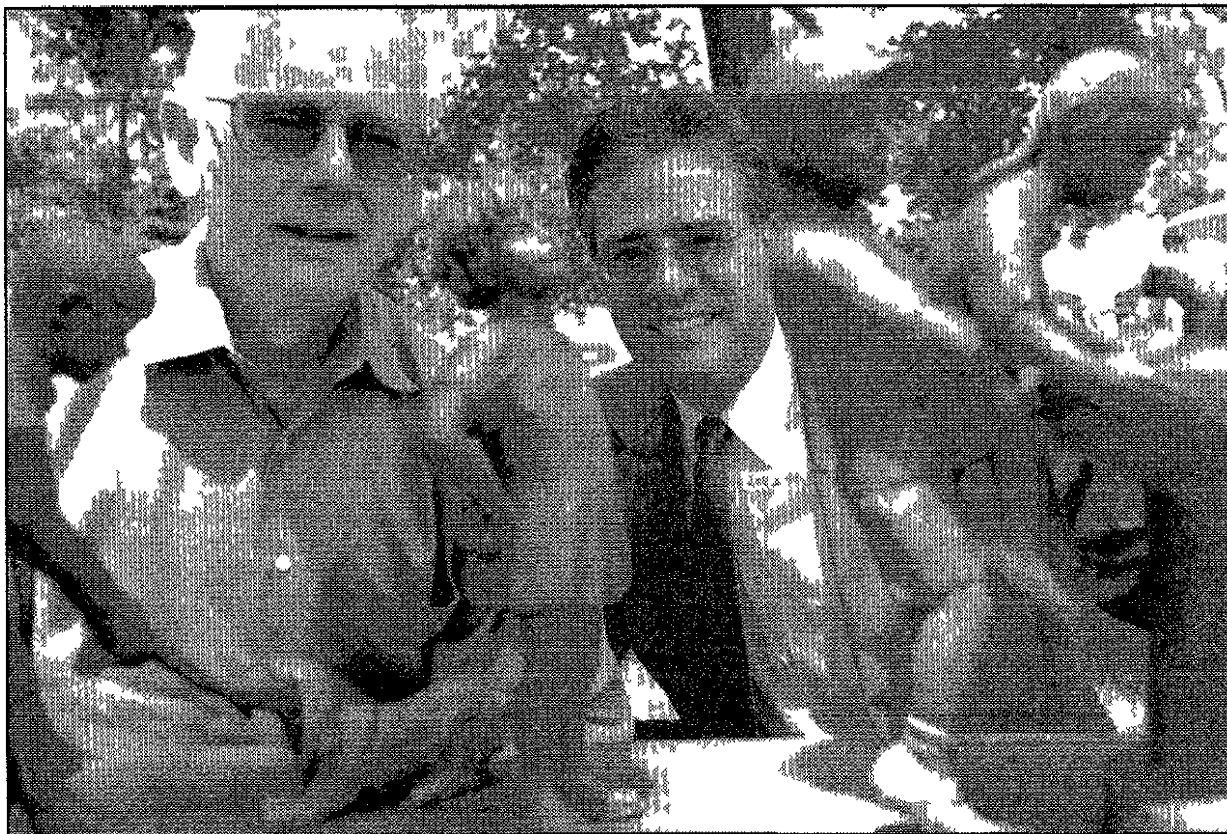
In fact it's been nearly two years in the making as Rawlinson brought sculptress Janice Trimpe of Grosse Pointe Park to Kellogg Park to get a feel for the monument which will be entitled America's Innocence'

It's a family oriented piece designed to make people smile' said Trimpe It's something that inspires people

Each of the children will be of different nationalities some thing she changed after the Sept 11 terrorist attacks 'It's all about our children and taking care of them' said Trimpe "They are the innocent people of America

Trimpe said she's done more than 200 portrait busts in her career including pieces in downtown Mt Clemens Dearborn and Roseville

Rawlinson is hoping to begin fund raising soon, after getting

permission from city commissioners

We've got some verbal commitments but I want this to become a community effort' said Rawlinson "It should be an involvement of the people in the community I'm looking for a lot of small contributions to go with some larger ones"

Rawlinson is hoping for an unveiling of the sculpture on July 4, 2003 Trimpe said with enough start up money in place, she could finish it by then if she begins the project by September

Rawlinson said he first talked over the idea with fellow Kiwanis an Jim Jabara who believes the money will be raised

The park is the centerpiece of Plymouth If it wasn't for Kellogg Park, what would we have?" said Jabara

## A piece of history

According to Sam Hudson's book *Pictures of Plymouth Past & Present*, the name of Mr Kellogg is preserved in a street and in the name of the city's principal park

"There are two versions of the circumstances under which the park became community property One is that John Kellogg donated the land to the village An opinion written by Edward Draugelis, city attorney on April 30 1962 noted that "the conclusion one draws

is that the land now known as Kellogg Park was purchased along with other acreage about

1843 by Mr Kellogg, and that some time prior to 1867, by a conveyance not of record Mr Kellogg granted the triangular piece known as Kellogg Park to the city

The other version is that Kellogg and his heirs let the settlers use the triangular plot for public gatherings over so long a period without protest that it became public property by common consent Whichever version is true there is no doubt that Plymouth owes its gratitude to Kellogg and his heirs the park has long been one of the community's most valuable assets"

Ryan said the district and Biltmore are "attempting to iron out final details. If all goes well, we'll have the agreement at the June 25 board meeting."

Neither side will publicly reveal the purchase price, however, several sources familiar with the deal indicate the piece of land will cost the district \$12 million. One scenario has the district using some of its \$6 million in Durant funds to pay for the acreage, with that money returned if and when a bond issue is passed by voters to build a new school.

Part of the district's concern in purchasing the property, according to the sources, is making certain it can be sold at a future date, without restrictions, if a school isn't constructed. School officials have been given assurances there are no restrictions, and the property should increase in value in the future, giving them flexibility.

Canton Township Supervisor Tom Yack said the district and Biltmore have been in discussions on the site for over a year.

"Until they actually ink an agreement, who knows if it will happen," said Yack. "I'm more confident today than I was two months ago."

Yack said the purchase is more complicated than most land deals "because Cherry Hill Village has an historic district which has architectural controls that would apply in some form."

In reality, Plymouth Canton Schools may need the property to accommodate the growing population in Canton.

"If they don't get the Cherry Hill Village site, I don't know where they're going to build an elementary school," said Yack. "There aren't a lot of alternatives left for property in that portion of the township."

funding that could mean slimming down our programs in the schools, or cut programs altogether," said Dreyer. "Grant funding allows us to continue providing educational services to supplement programs in the schools."

Dreyer said if her group doesn't make up the difference in investment income, grants or business giving, they'd have to raise ticket prices to concerts. The symphony has already seen a decline in corporate giving over the past three years from \$35,000 to only \$19,000. Fortunately, the symphony is making that up in ticket sales revenue,

which is up with the help of increased attendance and ticket prices.

"We're a draw for people to move to Plymouth, and for people to operate a business in Plymouth," said Dreyer.

At the Plymouth Community Arts Council, development direc-

tor Stella Greene is afraid of what will happen if her group's \$20,000 from the state is eliminated.

"It's a devastating blow. Those kinds of cuts are a death knell for local arts programs," said Greene. "It's really crucial that the state find a better, more creative, means of dealing with budget deficits than cutting quality of life. And, that's what the arts are."

Greene points to studies that show participation in the arts means lower juvenile delinquency rates, and helps meet the psychological and emotional needs of young people. Like Dreyer,

Greene said budget cuts could mean a reduction in programs.

"Those dollars go towards programs that are education related, and with where our school district is at financially, we're making up that deficit the school district is unable to provide for arts programming," said Greene.

The Plymouth Historical Museum doesn't get direct state funding, but does partner with the other two organizations for its Passport to the Arts program, designed to get children interested in attending activities of all three groups, which did involve state money.

"The lack of state funding

could mean we would do less collaboration in the future," said Beth Stewart, museum director. "So far, we've managed to do most of our own projects ourselves. That way, we won't have to close our doors for lack of funding."

Stewart's husband, Rep. John Stewart (R-Plymouth Township), said he's in favor of increasing taxes on cigarettes to save the arts.

"The arts are the fabric of this community," said Stewart. "The orchestra and the Plymouth Community Arts Council are the cornerstones of the cultural life of Plymouth."

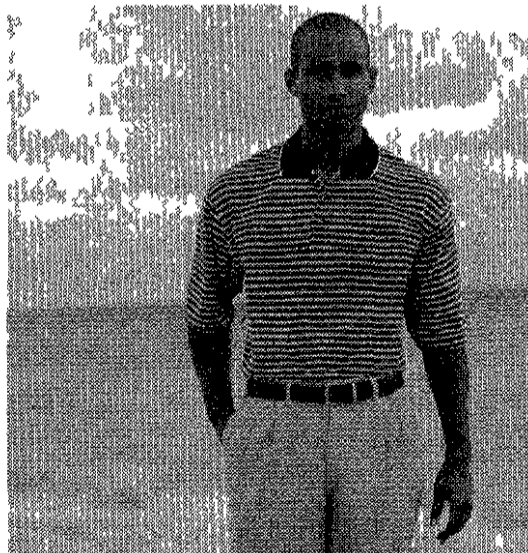

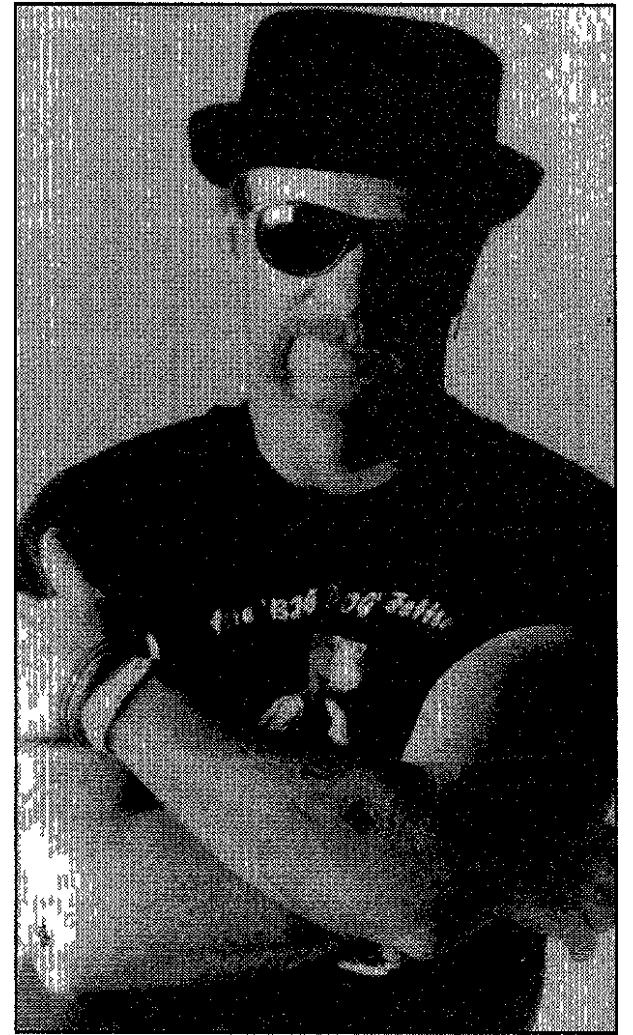

# Caring for kids

## Officer to be part of schools' 'TEAM'

Students at Smith Elementary, as well as those at Central and East middle schools, will get to know Plymouth police officer Jennifer Dergis on more familiar terms beginning next school year.

Dergis, a six-year member of the department, will be spending all her duty time talking to kids about topics such as gun safety, bike safety, drugs, alcohol and criminal sexual misconduct. It's all part of the TEAM program,

which stands for Teaching, Educating and Mentoring.

"It's more flexible than the DARE program because it just doesn't focus on drugs and alcohol," said Dergis.

While the DARE program focused mainly on fifth graders, Dergis said the TEAM program is designed to teach students from kindergarten through high school on topics of which kids, in today's society, need to be aware.

"It doesn't focus on certain age groups," said Dergis. "I'll teach them stranger awareness and information about access to the Internet. You have to be careful about what you give out on the Internet. It's amazing how easily people can find you."

Det. Al Cox is the department's former DARE officer. He believes the new TEAM concept will be much better for students because of its wide range of topics and grade levels.

"It's better because it won't just focus on drugs and alcohol," he said. "Personally, I don't think DARE really works, and a lot of studies show that. The kids like having a police officer as a friend, but one hour a week for 17 weeks isn't going to do it."

"A lot of parents relied on DARE so they wouldn't have to talk to their kids about not using drugs," added Cox.

"DARE won't work unless the parents enforce it at home."

Dergis said she'll spend a lot of time educating students and building trust.

"A lot of times, these days, kids don't trust police officers," she said. "I want them to know they can trust us."

"Sometimes when we do see kids it's at their home for a reason, maybe a domestic dispute, and that can have a negative effect," said Dergis. "They may think that if the police have to come to my house and take one of my family members away, maybe they'll take me away."

"We want to make sure they have a positive look at the police department, and that they can call if they need help."

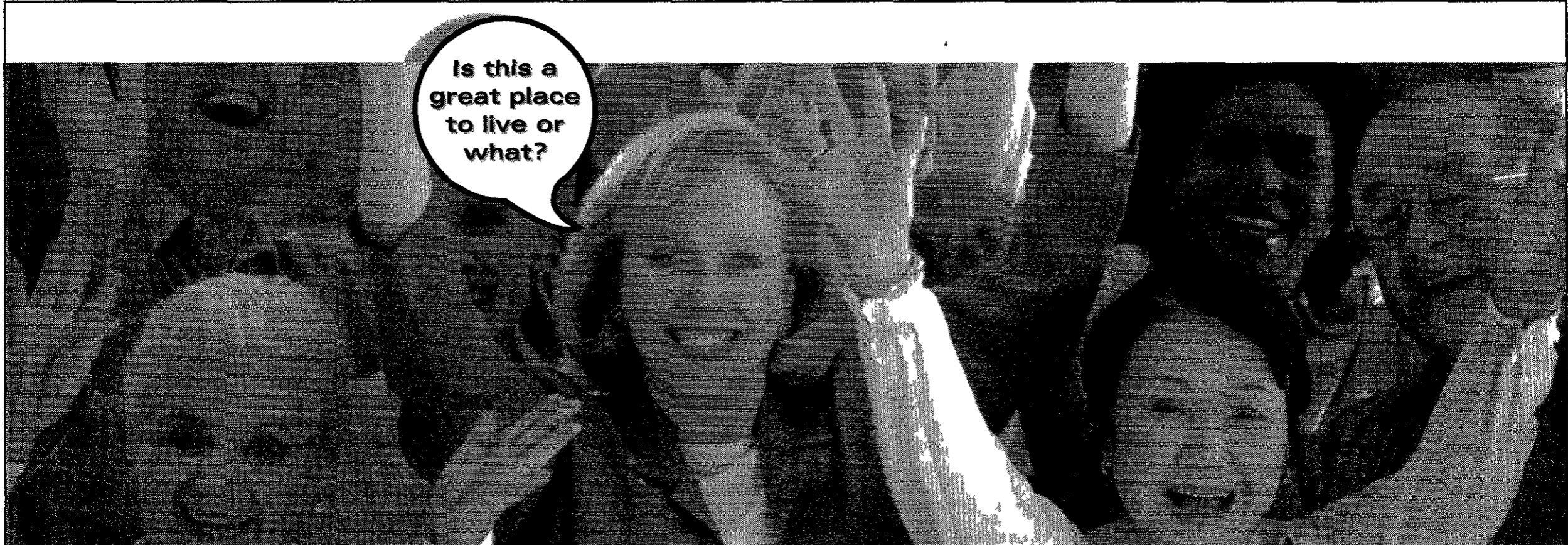

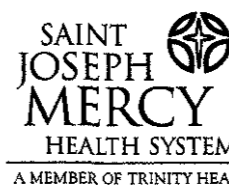

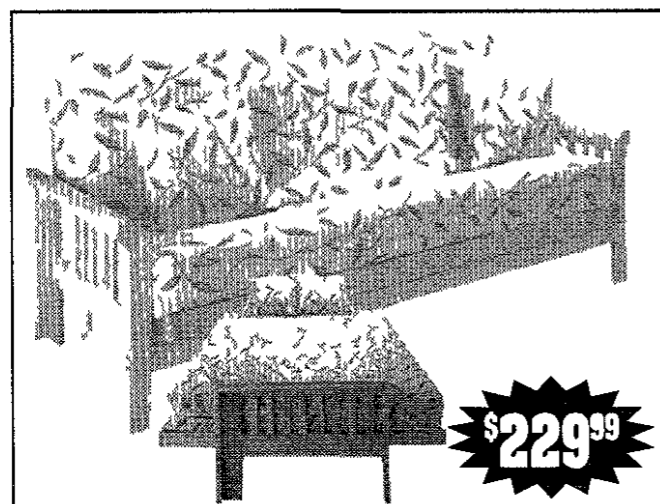

### Split board likely result of toothless ethics inquiry

The Plymouth Township Board and trustee Abe Munfakh have fashioned themselves something of a sticky wicket.

A divided township board voted 4-3 last week to convene an ethics inquiry into the practices of Munfakh, a high-ranking member (how high ranking is a current matter of debate) of the engineering firm of Ayres Lewis Norris & May.

Seems Munfakh's firm has been doing some consulting work for Salem Township in an effort to get that municipality added to the Detroit water system. Unfortunately for Munfakh, his critics think adding yet another customer to Detroit's system will leave an already-struggling Plymouth Township with even less water pressure than it has now.

There is some question about how much Munfakh has been involved in any of the negotiations. A sign-in sheet from a February meeting featuring Salem Township officials and folks from the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department has Munfakh's name near the top. Munfakh denies doing anything more than making introductions at that meeting, several people have said he had a much bigger involvement.

The central question for Munfakh's critics is how can he, as a Plymouth Township trustee, help Salem Township get on a system that's already struggling to meet demands of its current customers. Isn't that a blatant conflict of interest?

Sure it is, if Munfakh is actively involved in the negotiations. But he has publicly denied that, while acknowledging that his firm is working with Salem. If Munfakh's telling the truth, the conflict is much less obvious but, we think still there.

There are other issues. For instance critics are pointing to Munfakh's position as chairman of the board at ALNM, Munfakh denies being the chairman, although his firm's Web site identified him as such as recently as March.

His position with the firm is less important than his responsibility to Plymouth Township. He knows the township suffers from occasional water pressure problems, and has been involved in discussions and spending as the board tries to remedy the situation.

The board has already spent thousands of dollars on design and engineering work for a proposed second water tower, and it will almost certainly build the tower in the near future, whether Salem is added to the Detroit system or not. That will solve the township's water problems, according to Supervisor Steve Mann.

Why, then, are we haggling over Mun-

fakh's involvement? Because it raises questions about where his interests lie. We suspect if he hadn't lost an election 10 years ago over questions about his involvement in the letting of contracts as the Western Township Utilities Authority was set up, this might be blowing over.

But his critics are making much of the "same ol' Abe" line. That's unfair, except when you realize everything's fair in love, war and politics. And make no mistake about it: no matter what his critics say, this is a political issue. And it's not going away anytime soon.

The township's decision to convene an ethics inquiry means that, since according to ordinance the township board also sits as the ethics board (minus Munfakh, of course), trustees will be investigating one of their own. It's bound to fracture a board that, despite the political bent of its individual members, has been able to get quite a bit accomplished.

And in the end it will be to no avail. The township board will not be able to remove Munfakh, even if it can prove he violated the township's ethics policy, only a recall election can do that. This inquiry (or inquisition, if you're Munfakh) is only going to accomplish two things: 1) get information out there that Munfakh's critics will label "truth" and Munfakh himself will continue to deny, 2) divide the board perhaps permanently.

Mann says he wants to get this investigation underway in the next couple of weeks and hopes to conclude it in a timely fashion. We doubt there's any way to do that. The board will have to talk to a lot of people, have several meetings and consult frequently with an attorney.

It will be expensive, time consuming and, ultimately, toothless without the power to remove Munfakh. Calling for Munfakh's resignation is fruitless because a) he's not going to do it and b) there's not enough evidence to suggest he should resign.

Resident Carol Levitte, an attorney, says sections of the state constitution provide for the governor to conduct the investigation and remove Munfakh, if grounds exist.

We don't know if it's possible, and we doubt the governor would remove him under these circumstances, but we agree with Levitte in one aspect. If there is any way to let an outside agency undertake this investigation, the township should find it.

We agree there's enough to warrant a peek. We just think it's going to be ugly if the township board itself does the looking

### Consider method, cost of merging elections

Election reform legislation now before the state Legislature could hit close to home — and the pocket — for area residents.

The legislation, if approved, would consolidate elections, although the method and degree are under debate.

What is clear is that the time and number of elections at which voters cast ballots could drastically change. Those changes would have an impact on local municipal clerks' offices and the flexibility of the school districts in holding elections.

While the concept of limiting elections is, on its face, worth merit, the practicality of the matter leaves substantial concern over how and whether it should be pursued.

Voters owe it to themselves to study the proposals, since local control over the timing of school elections would be lost.

Now before the state House are two bills by State Rep. John Pappageorge (R-Troy), which are a substitute for bills passed by the State Senate. Pappageorge's bills are now before the elections committee, and he admits it's unlikely they will be reported out of committee during this legislative session.

While the Senate's proposal would allow only four elections yearly, Pappageorge's plan would provide for six elections over two years. Included would be an "election day" in June, the only one allowed each year for school office holders. However, millage and bond proposals could be voted on at any of the three elections held each year under his plan.

Other elections would be held in alternate years — a primary and general election for all local offices one year, and a pri-

mary election for state offices the next.

But some school officials argued that education issues would get lost in national and state elections.

Certainly, this area has an abysmal record of turnout for all elections, school elections among them. For instance, just over 4,100 voters turned out for the Plymouth-Canton election June 10. That 6-percent turnout was the highest in several years here.

School districts have long been accused of holding special elections for a millage or bond at times when voters aren't expecting them. It is a Pandora's box, and not every one is in agreement as to what should be done, if anything.

#### School elections

Consider the opinion of Livonia City Clerk Joan McCotter, an avowed fan of consolidating elections. The Senate plan would limit the number of elections to four a year, and that might be something she'd approve of.

Officials need to "stop these little special elections they try to sneak in," she said.

School districts have long been accused of holding special elections for a millage or bond at times when voters aren't expecting them.

So with no action expected this legislative year, the debate will continue. Also unsettled is whether our representatives in Lansing should go forward with the idea. But there is reason enough for the concern that is prompting this legislation.

To resolve the issue, we encourage our legislators to go forward with a careful study of this good but very complicated concept.

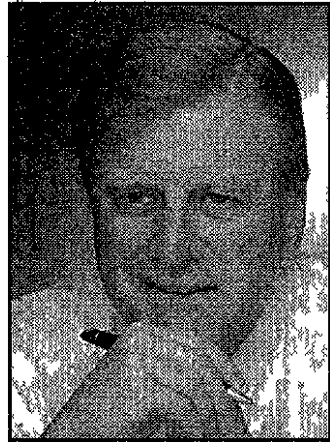

# 'Chronic wasting disease' poses threat to deer herd

It hasn't been in the headlines much so far, but I'd guess it will be in the near future

It's called "chronic wasting disease," a fatal ailment that affects deer and elk. First identified in Colorado in the late 1960s, it cropped up recently in whitetail deer near Madison, Wis. The DNR there is so concerned it plans to eradicate the disease by shooting every deer in the 287-square-mile infected area.

— a neurological, progressive ailment hard to diagnose at the outset and always fatal to infected animals — gets into the Michigan deer herd, "the consequences could be horrible." So far as the scientists know, the disease only affects so-called cervids, i.e. whitetail deer, mule deer and elk.

At a meeting earlier this month, the Michigan Natural Resources Commission banned supplemental feeding of deer in the four Upper Peninsula counties bordering Wisconsin. The NRC will likely ban deer feeding in the entire UP next year, while the Michigan Department of Agriculture has temporarily halted all imports of captive deer and elk. Scientists think the disease is transmitted when deer come into close contact with each other, either as they gather at feeding or baiting sites or in densely populated private hunting preserves.

The disease is caused by a mutation in something called a prion, a very primitive form of virus, that also caused the "mad cow disease" that terrorized England and Europe a couple of years ago. In England, mad cow disease jumped the species barrier from cattle to humans, causing fatal brain lesions in around 100 people. Mad cow disease has not appeared in the U.S.

According to DNR scientists there is no current evidence that chronic wasting disease can infect humans or for that matter cattle or other non-cervid species. But so little is known about the disease its spread and its consequences that

Michigan authorities are dead right to move promptly and firmly.

It's important not to sensationalize all this. Thinking in terms of a gradient from good to bad might help.

The best outcome would be that the deer herd, already at historic highs sufficient to turn deer into nuisances in some areas, will be somewhat reduced if the disease spreads to Michigan. In that case, the authorities will probably try to cull infected animals, almost surely ban deer feeding and baiting and place restrictions on game preserves where the risk of infection is especially high. Deer hunting, especially in infected areas, will deteriorate.

A bad outcome would be that chronic wasting disease gets into the deer herd and lots of people quit hunting and eating deer because they're scared of getting infected. This is non-trivial, given the importance the deer hunting industry has in the Michigan economy. According to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife 2002 survey, just about to be published, something like 90 percent of all hunting licenses issued in Michigan are for deer and the deer hunt generates more than \$1 billion annually in our economy.

The worst case would be for that the disease to cross the species barrier from deer to cattle and gets into the food chain, infecting humans and causing mad cow-like panic among ordinary folks. I repeat: So far there is no evidence that this can happen, but the possibility cannot be ruled out arbitrarily.

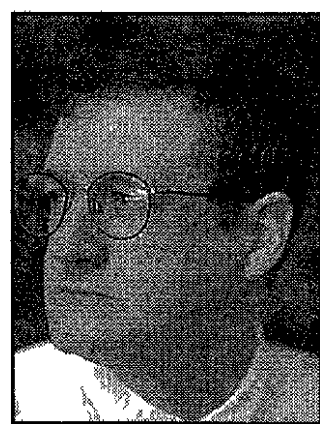
And a lot of people are very concerned. The board of the Michigan United Conservation Clubs, representing nearly 100,000 members, in April unanimously passed a resolution aimed at preventing chronic wasting disease from reaching the state's whitetail deer herd.

MUCC called on the DNR to ban importing all deer, elk and exotic game species into the state, halt permits for all new private cervid game farms and require existing big game facilities to put up double fences to separate captive and wild animals.

Michigan is better off in facing this problem than other states. State government already has a disease-fighting plan in place as a result of trying to eradicate bovine tuberculosis, which broke out among the northeast Lower Peninsula deer herd in the mid 1990s and has been largely confined to that region ever since.

But folks like the DNR and MUCC, already engaged in figuring out how to deal with this unexpected threat, need the support of a well-informed public that is neither panicky nor blasé.

# Security program helps businesses deal with terrorism

Business owners skittish and unsure about how to make plans and move ahead in a terrorism-tinged world can attend a presentation Friday and load up on current information from people working directly on the problem.

The Environmental Management Association will host "Homeland Security and Anti Terrorism: The Cost of Doing Business," a day-long examination of the post 9/11 world June 21 at the Eagle Crest Conference Center in Ypsilanti.

The conference will start with an overview of homeland security at the federal level by Mark Davidson of the FBI. Later, there will be a panel discussion including perspectives from the Michigan State Police, Metro Airport security, the Integrated border Enforcement Team and

the U.S. Attorney's office. The day will end with a presentation on dual-use commodity (commercial products with possible military applications) concerns by a

representative of the U.S. Department of Commerce.

Nestled between the officials and policy wonks will be a person who will frame the discussion about terrorism with a personal perspective: Minnesota resident Jackie Pflug was the victim of a terrorist hijacking in 1985, an experience she almost didn't survive.

Pflug was living in Egypt working as a teacher at the American School when she took a vacation trip to Greece. Her flight was 15 minutes into the air on the return trip when it was hijacked by terrorists and diverted to Malta.

Officials in Malta demanded that the hijackers give up and release the hostages. The terrorists demanded that the plane be refueled or they would start killing hostages. Their demands were not met, they started shooting hostages.

Pflug was shot in the head and thrown onto the tarmac. The bullet tore away the right side of her skull.

"I was sent to the morgue with the other victims until a worker there noticed that I was alive," she said. "They took me to the hospital and took the bullet and bone fragments out of my brain."

After being cared for in Malta, she was moved back to the states where rebuilding continued. She had lost parts of her sight and her short term memory was unreliable. The doctors told her she would never work again, never drive again, she would suffer seizures for the rest of her

life and not be able to read any higher than the third grade level ever again.

It was a dark period for her. "I hit a level of depression where I didn't care about living," Pflug said. "I didn't want to do anything, I just wanted to stay in my jammies in bed."

She didn't want to leave the bed, or brush her teeth, but she did anyway. She said she understood that if she didn't get out of bed, she never would.

After two years she could drive, in four she had started work as a motivational speaker. Just 10 years after she was shot, she reads at a 12th grade level.

She shares the story all over the country now.

"It's a story about healing and coming back, about surviving and never giving up," Pflug said.

She's been telling it for some time now. Since everything in the country changed on Sept. 11, people think her story has changed as well. It hasn't.

"The story hasn't really changed, I think people look at it differently," she said. "Terrorism used to happen to other people in faraway lands, now it's here. Before people got the story, now they relate to it."

## Bill would ban 'Segway' scooters from trailways

The hiking boots win. A grassroots effort to prohibit Segway Human Transporters from trailways proved successful. The two-wheeled electric scooters, balanced by a gyroscope to provide easy mobility, will be restricted to public roadways under a bill pending before the state House this week.

Senate Bill 1016 allows "the use of the electric personal mobility devices on sidewalks, crosswalks, and roads with speed limits under 25 mph."

The bill, which passed in the Senate by 21-15 vote, was amended in the House transportation committee to include language that will allow local governments the authority to prohibit the electric scooters from trailways.

"I'm just grateful that people took the time to write letters and send e-mail," Rochester Hills City Councilwoman Lois Golden said Monday. "It's nice to be a part of the success once in a while."

Concerns about how the Segway bill might impact both the

Paint Creek Trail and Clinton River Trail prompted Golden and other area officials to start a letter-writing campaign for the amendment.

State Sen. Bill Bullard Jr. (R-Highland), who sponsored the bill, also supported the amendment. His legislative aide, Audrey Robinson, said the bill was never meant to include trailways.

"It was never our intent to allow them on trailways," she said. "Including this amendment should allow local governments more flexibility in determining that."

Robinson added that a separate bill will be drafted which amends the Michigan Trailways Act and allows local governments and trail commissions to regulate or prohibit the Segway devices if necessary.

The amended version of the bill is expected to go before the House floor for a vote sometime this week.

"A load of thanks goes out to the many trail advocates who put their voices into action," said Nancy Krupiarz, State Director of the Rails to Trails Conservancy.

## Choosing a dance teacher

As Artistic Director of a professional dance company, Eisenhower Dance Ensemble, and Professor of Dance at Oakland University, I am often asked for advice regarding dance training.

How do I pick a dance school? How do I know I'm receiving good training? How do I differentiate a good dance teacher from a bad one?

Anyone, with minimal or no training, can put a sign up, open a dance studio and start registering students. And sadly, many do. So, asking questions and investigating is important. The following are standards that I recommend.

**Does the teacher have a college degree in dance?**

Most college programs require knowledge of numerous styles of dance, choreography, pedagogy, dance history, current issues and trends in dance, dance philosophy, and most importantly, anatomy and kinesiology. Historically, dance has been passed down from one teacher to another, but science now offers new, positive advances in dance training and teaching methods. Instructors without this knowledge will rely on traditional rather than contemporary information.

Anatomy training is especially critical because, if a dancer trains with a misalignment, it can cause irreparable damage to his/her body.

**Is the teacher a good dancer?**

Teaching and performing are two distinct talents. With that said, it is important that teachers be skilled and proficient dancers or if they accomplished at some point in their career. Teachers need to have applied tuning to their own bodies in order to relate that experience to others.

**Who's teaching the class?**

Often, the director of a school has great credentials but has advanced students teaching many of the lower level classes. Beginning level classes require experienced teachers as much, if not more, than the advanced levels. Make sure you ask the qualifications of the person who will be teaching your class.

**Has the teacher performed?**

Performing experience is definitely a plus. For those students considering a dance career, retired or current performers are more able to prepare students for auditions and often have more professional contacts.

**Does the school offer competitions?**

This is a debated issue among dance professionals. I have to admit I'm saddened by a practice that pits one school against another. Dance should be about creativity and expression, and the joy of sharing with others in class, rehearsal and, ultimately, on the stage.

Competition often rewards dancers for tricks rather than performance nuance (think of the value of the quad jump over an expressive performance in figure skating and you know what I mean). At Oakland University where I am Dance Program Coordinator, some freshman students have resumes that list trophies from various competitions. Often they can do terrific pirouettes and leaps but have serious alignment problems and can't walk across the floor gracefully. Because they have been rewarded for accomplishing these "tricks" of dance, they have a skewed

## Orchestra musicians share the music

Dr. Joseph Lewis looks as at home on the podium as he does the operating room. But before long his turn at conducting the Redford Civic Symphony rehearsal is over and Robert Zimmerman takes the baton.

It's classical camaraderie at its finest. No egos here. Everyone gets along with everyone. It's conducting by committee. Well sort of. Lewis a West Bloomfield thoracic surgeon is the primary conductor but Zimmerman, John Gajec and Benny Moon frequently step up to lead a selection or two.

All will be on hand when the orchestra kicks off a summer series of concerts Tuesday, June 25, in Capitol Park in Redford.

"It will be a fast paced concert of semi-classic, overtures, patriotic music marches and show tunes," said Lewis who's been playing violin since his college days. In addition to the Redford Civic Symphony, Lewis performs with the Franklin Village Band so he knows music.

"It's a great symphony with potential to develop and progress. One of our goals is to present free concerts to Redford and surrounding communities. We're always interested in new members, strings especially."

Mutual admiration between musicians is key to the success of this orchestra along with the desire to serve the community. Lewis has only been with the Redford Civic Symphony 18 years compared to founder John Gajec's 46, but he's as devoted.

"John is so talented he can switch instru-

ments," said Lewis. "He's playing oboe now and before then cello. He plays whatever instrument depending on what we need."

Gajec is just as proud of Lewis who used to take a violin break from studies in medical school as a way to refresh himself.

Dr. Lewis works well with the orchestra members said the 84 year old Gajec. He's one of six doctors in the orchestra. They just enjoy it. It's a relaxation a relief from the technology they're around all day long.

Music's ability to relieve stress definitely is a plus for orchestra members but so is humor. Zimmerman joined one year after the orchestra was founded so he's allowed to take liberties. Like the Redford flutist, many of the musicians have been with the Redford Civic Symphony for decades.

"To get out of this outfit you have to die," quips Zimmerman. "And to get in the audition is — can you find the place?"

On a more serious note, Gajec jokes the orchestra operates on a "frayed shoe string budget." Although more than half of the 50 orchestra members are volunteers, 22 are union members who have to be paid for their services. Contributions from the audience, memberships in the Redford Township Music Society, and money from the Music Performance Trust Fund help keep the Redford Civic Symphony afloat, and the concerts free.

"Our supporters have kept the orchestra going even though financially we had hard times," said Gajec, a music teacher in Redford Union Schools for many years before retiring in the early 1970s.

"We don't claim to be perfect. We're not the Detroit Symphony but we try to emulate them."

## Where to find classical music this summer

He's just kidding about his vocal abilities. Although he hasn't sung in years, Francisco thinks with a little practice he and the rest of the chorale members will

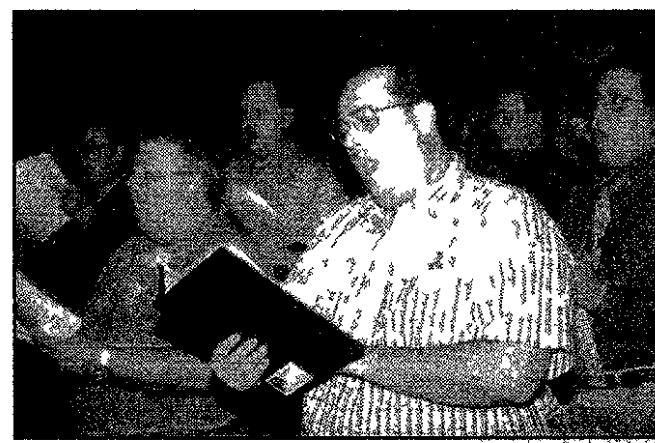
put on a concert definitely worth hearing Sunday, June 23, in Pease Auditorium in Ypsilanti.

vision of their abilities  
**What performance opportunities does the school offer?**

Since dance is a performing art, performance is clearly important. Most schools offer something, including recitals at the end of the year, participation in festivals or competitions. School's like our EDE Center for Dance in Rochester Hills can offer professional-level performing opportunities for the students.

The professional EDE dancers serve as instructors, and our students participate in numerous EDE productions, including the company's Motown in Motion production at the Macomb Center for the Performing Arts, EDE's annual holiday production, and other appearances around the State.

**What is the class environment?**

Finally, ask questions about or

take a tour of the dance studio. The floors should be sprung to avoid impact injuries. Larger rooms will allow more freedom of movement and longer phrases of choreography. Find out how many students will be in your class - you will receive more individual feedback in a small class. Today, dance studios are thriving across the country. More and more people are currently studying dance. Yet, most students select schools according to location rather than quality. Ask lots of questions and you will be able to make an informed choice.



Mary Wagner Bozell's memories of Chile are as fond as Francisco's even if a little frightening. Now a Plymouth resident, Bozell was then a student at Pioneer High School in Ann Arbor. She sang under the direction of Bob Pratt who returns to the podium for the June 23 concert.

"It was an unbelievable music experience," said Bozell. "But in Chile demonstrators were throwing pamphlets at us from the balcony. It was a little scary. Then in Argentina they made us land and disembark and searched through all of our luggage. You had to be careful what you wore. The girls always had to wear skirts and there were no bikinis permitted."

Nonetheless, Dr. Ralph Bozell wouldn't have missed the experience for anything. Bozell met Mary, whom he'd later marry, on his final tour. Bozell sang in the 1965-66 chorales as a Bloomfield Andover High School student. He's now a Canton dentist.

"We met when both of us were

assigned to the same family on the South American tour," said Bozell. "The experience gave me a terrific appreciation for languages and learning about their culture. At that age you're so impressionable and we were one of the few high school choirs performing. It's always a joy to go back and sing with our friends."

For Eric May the opportunity to sing with people he hasn't seen in years brings mixed emotions. It was 1959 when the West Bloomfield resident joined the chorale on tour. Back then he went to Royal Oak Dondero High School where he sang in the a capella choir.

"It's been a long time," said May. "There's three of us from the original 100 performing in the concert. It's a really strange feeling to see people you haven't seen in 43 years. The singing seems to be coming back fairly easy and with practice it should be quite fun and quite good to hear."

### Finding former members

While vocal skills return with practice, it's not so easy tracking down former members and assembling them after all this time. Bob Trumble's spent untold hours contacting students who sang in the chorales from

1958 to 1973 when it was disbanded. So far, he's reached a former member from as far away as The Netherlands to Don Pratt, an Ann Arbor High School math teacher living in Canton.

Trumble isn't sure if there will be another reunion concert so he's currently putting together two CDs of the chorales' spiritual and folk music as a fundraiser to cover the costs of renting the auditorium and piano.

"We lost track of people," said Trumble who organized the first reunion in April 2001. Trumble sang with the 1969-70 chorales while a student at Edsel Ford High School in Dearborn. He now teaches English as a second language at McDonald Elementary in Dearborn. "I found 400 and 125 sang in a mini-concert at the Michigan League Ballroom but there are probably

about 1,100 out there. Youth for Understanding was centered in Ann Arbor and later moved to Washington D.C. The touring of chorales started in Germany so people would get an idea to get an exchange student for a year."

David Graves was one of the students in the first chorale that toured Germany in 1958. At the time he was a student at the old Plymouth High School on Main Street. Today the Troy resident is executive director of an agency specializing in corporate travel.

"It was not a usual experience to go off to Europe. It was a major turning point in my life," said Graves. "It was not that far from the second World War. We still saw a lot of destruction. As a 16-year old second World War had no impression with me. The tour made it a personal experi-

ence seeing people in wheelchairs and others without arms and legs. Even though Germany was the antagonist, the idea was to build good relationships with the people of Germany. I personally feel Youth for Understanding did 200 percent of what it set out to accomplish. They exhibited excellent musicianship and they were all ambassadors who created good will."

"I can't tell you how much I'm looking forward to the concert. It's so exciting bringing back a portion of our lives and youth that was thrown in back of the mind. It will be a magnificent concert because of the enthusiasm and the talent. There were chorale members who went on to sing with the New York City Opera and The Producers on Broadway."

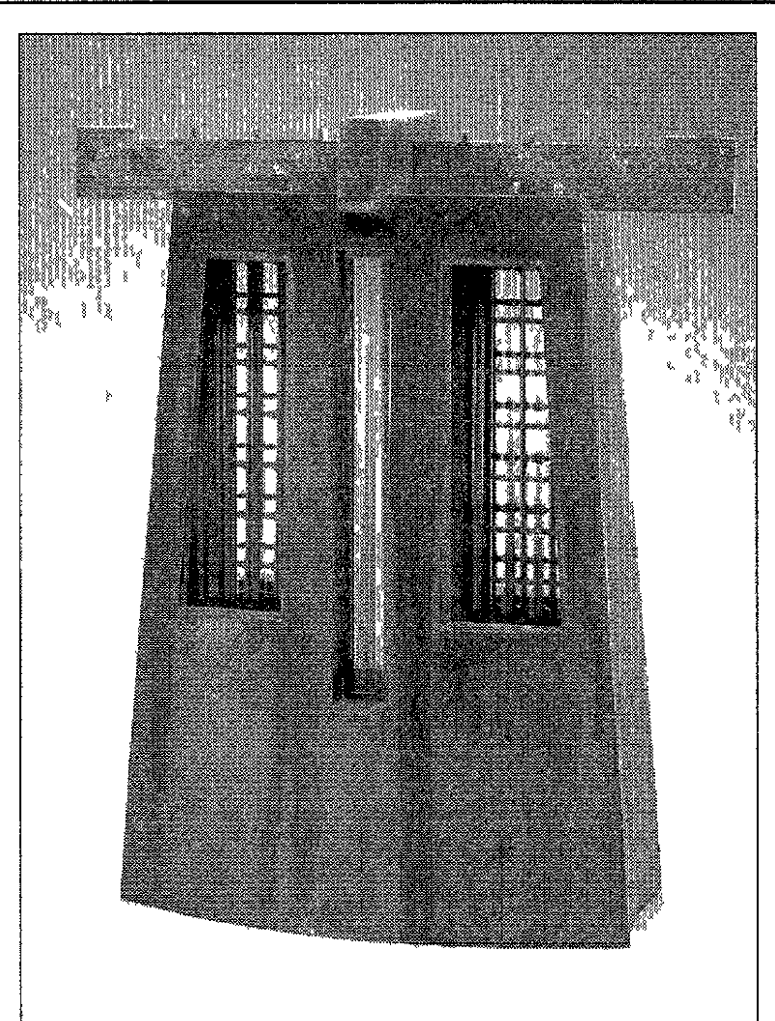

# Fine art at Meadow Brook

## Grounds a beautiful setting for variety of media

Donna Beaubien thinks she knows what it takes to produce an arts festival. The Troy artist has exhibited abstracts created from handmade paper at over a hundred shows since taking a class at Paint Creek Center for the Arts in Rochester in the late 1980s. So when the Creative Arts Council and Palace Sports & Entertainment teamed up to present a new festival at Meadow Brook last summer, Beaubien wanted to be part of drawing thousands of art lovers not only the first time but for years to come.

Beaubien's been successful at

this sort of thing before. For 17 years she served as artist coordinator for the Birmingham Arts Festival held by the Birmingham Bloomfield Art Center every spring. This summer's outdoor art fair season is especially busy for

Beaubien, who sold her first framed works in Greentown in May, but she's made time to head up the second annual Fine Art at Meadow Brook Music Festival Saturday-Sunday, June 22-23 in Rochester. As coordinator of the

event she's been running around town wrapping up last minute details. Bringing in 136 artists requires organization. Decisions have to be made on where to place all of the painters, sculptors, ceramists, jewelers, glass blowers, and photographers selected for the juried art fair.

Beaubien's built other attractions into the art festival as well. Two weeks ago she dropped off 1,000 postcards at the Detroit Institute of Arts which will have a booth there. During the fair new members receive a 20 percent discount plus two tickets to upcoming special exhibitions including *Degas and the Dance* Oct. 20 to Jan. 12.

"Meadow Brook is a beautiful location. The artists' booths wind in and out of the garden and the hills add to the ambiance," said Beaubien, who exhibits in St. Clair and Ann Arbor before concluding the year indoors at the Holiday Art Fair at Oakland Community College in Farmington Hills Nov. 2-3.

"The DIA will have a booth to recruit membership. We'll have a student booth featuring metal smithing and wood furniture from College for Creative Studies to help young people get started."

"I'm excited about many of the artists. I'm excited about a new category and new artist Donovan Reeve of Ypsilanti who does digital prints. Photographer Jan Kaulhus gears his work to the area he's showing in and will have images that relate to Detroit including the Red Wings. Last year his aerial views of the last game at Tiger Stadium and the first at Comerica Park were popular with men."

"But it's an international show with one painter from South Africa and three Canadians."

### Documenting

Clifford Charles brings his oil paintings on canvas and paper all the way from Johannesburg. Charles came to Rochester a couple

of weeks ago to visit his sister and decided to try his hand at exhibiting in art fairs. He's been painting professionally and displaying work at galleries and cultural centers since graduating with a bachelor of fine arts degree

from the University of Witwatersrand in 1987.

"I'm inspired by life in South Africa, how people heal themselves and the difficult journey we make through life. It's a struggle not just political but to make meaning in life," said Charles. "My paintings are a contemplative place embracing beauty and anxiety of life."

"I'm documenting life there to start encouraging people that art does have a role to play in society. To feed the soul we need other forms of nourishment."

Charles finds satisfaction in working through the arts with disadvantaged communities, mental health challenged children, women's groups, and trade unions.

"Child abuse is a big problem. We use the arts to open up topics of expression," said Charles. "Johannesburg is like any big major city now. We have casinos and large buildings and it's fast paced."

*Talking to Myself* deals with the idea of dualism and the overthrow of apartheid, something that did not happen overnight in South Africa.

"It's people's desire to separate themselves from themselves," said Charles. "It is drawing on the uncomfortable notion that we need to be connected to ourselves and the world around us. It was inspired by living in constant struggle mode in South Africa, creating separation and division and the reality of a new South Africa - that we only have one country and we are as much a part of the other person as they are part of us."

"I'm excited about the chance to meet and talk with people (at the art fair). It's an eagerness, but I'm cautious about how they'll accept my work."

Dorothy Jett-Carter expects visitors to find her capes, throws, ethnically-inspired jewelry, and beaded bags as fashionable as they did at last year's festival. ArtsLeague of Michigan appreciates the African flair. They selected her Fulani Rudraksha Seed necklace to tour with *People, Plants and Cultures II*.

Jett-Carter began designing clothing with African textiles during her student days at Cass Technical High School. But the Oak Park resident isn't the only one in the family with talent. Her husband Rod Carter will show fine art photography. One of his images, *My Land*, which shows a woman working in the field, is also included in the ArtsLeague of Michigan's touring exhibition.

"The capes and throws are made from contemporary fabrics from Senegal," said Jett-Carter. "I layer fabrics on the edges then pull the threads and add beading. The small hand made bags are from mud cloth with traditional hand painted patterns depending on tribe. For the jewelry I learned beading from women in the Wolof tribe in Senegal."

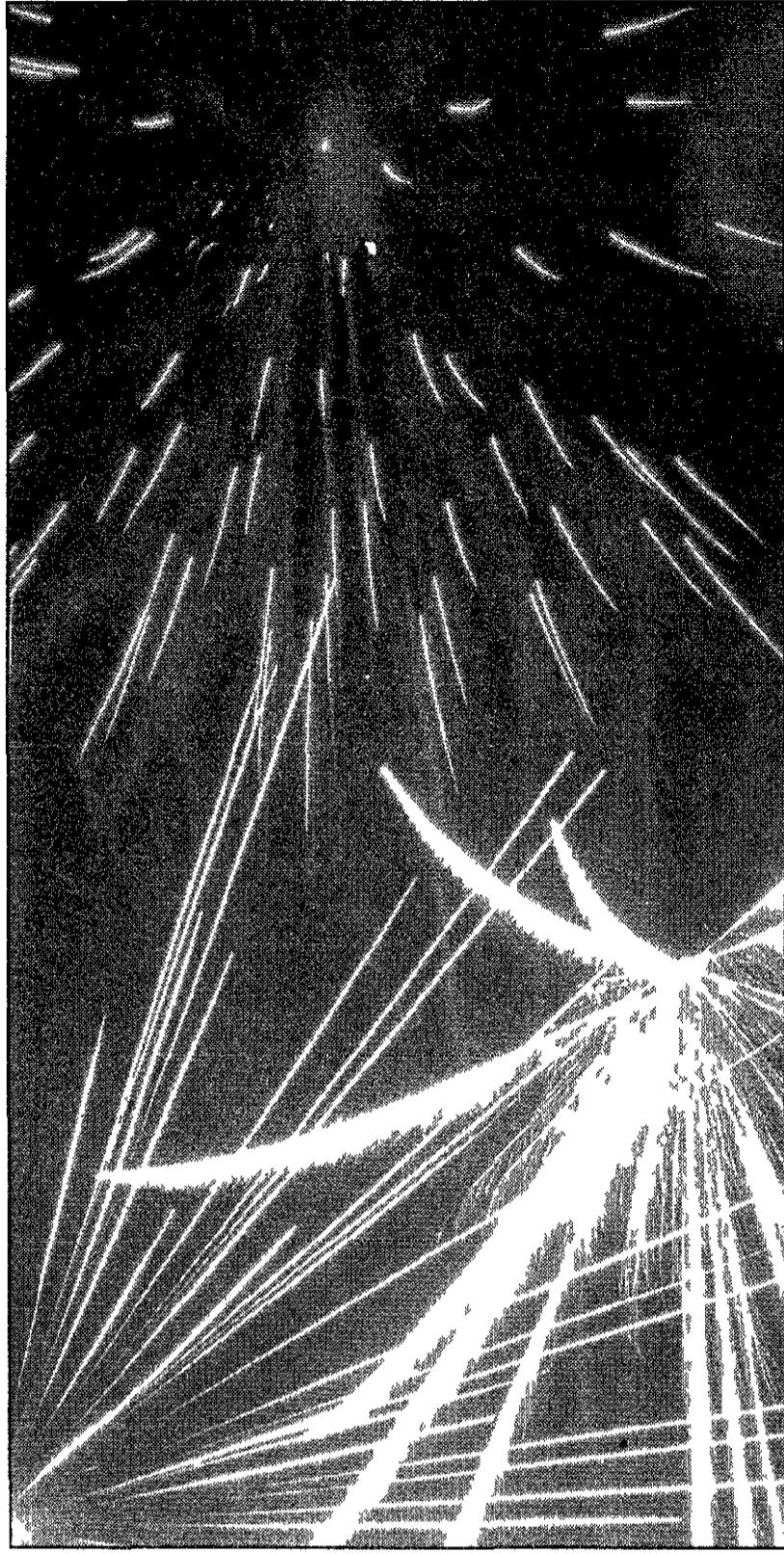

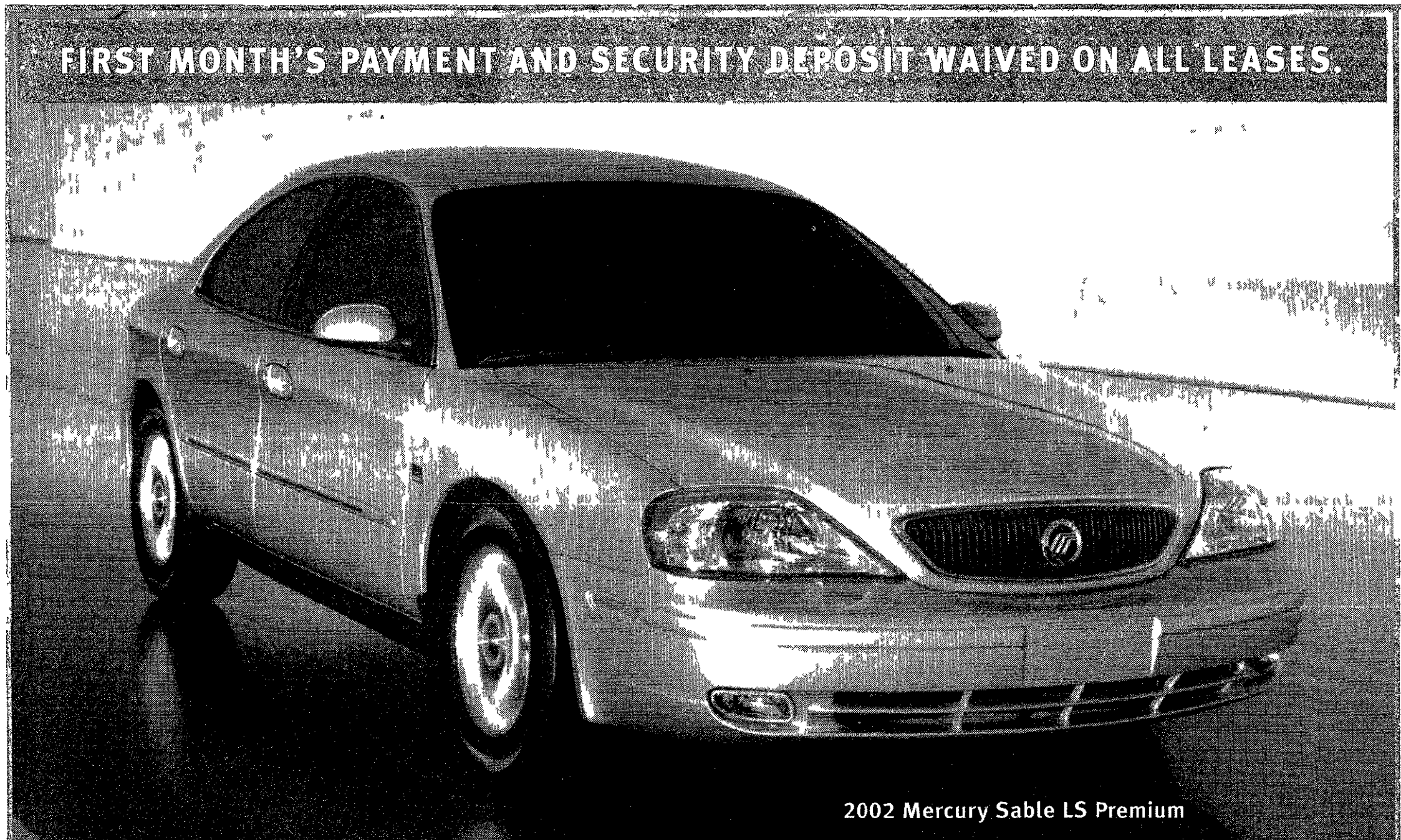

## Help restore native plants in area

The Michigan Chapter of The Nature Conservancy has set out guidelines to prevent the introduction or spread of invasive alien plants (those not native to the area) into our natural areas, and to help

restore our native flora and fauna

■ Avoid disturbance to natural areas, including clearing of native vegetation, planting of non-native plants and dumping of yard wastes

■ Don't buy or use invasive exotic species in your landscaping or for land restoration or erosion control projects

■ For landscaping, use plants that are native to your local region as much as possible or those that aren't known to be invasive

■ Know your plants If you are unsure of the identification of a plant, take a sample to a university, arboretum, department of agriculture office, local nature center, or native plant society for assistance

Find out if it is known or thought to have invasive tendencies. If the exotic plant is closely related to an invasive species, it is likely to have similar tendencies

To be on the safe side, if you don't know it, don't grow it

■ Control exotic invasive plants in your landscape either by removing them entirely or by managing them to prevent their spread outside your property

This may include pruning to prevent flowering and seed dispersal or cutting, mowing or herbicide uses to prevent vegetative spread

■ Discuss your concerns about invasive exotic plants with nurseries and garden shops and ask them not to sell these species. Provide them with printed material (such as this) explaining the problem to read later. Ask for non-invasive alternatives instead

■ Notify land managers of invasive exotic plant occurrences

■ Offer to assist in exotic plant removal projects

Work with your local government to encourage the use of native plants in urban and suburban landscapes. Provide lists of attractive, non-invasive, locally native alternatives that are naturally more hardy and pest-resistant and provide more nutritious food for wildlife than cultivated plants

Here are some culprits

■ Perennials

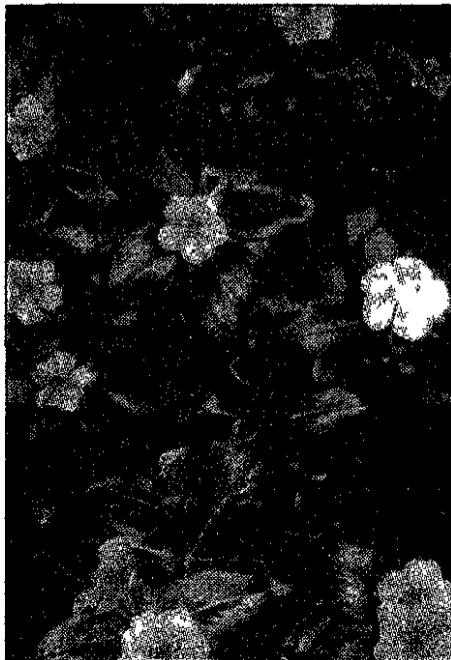
**Sulfur Cinquefoil**, *Potentilla recta*, looks like a hairy marijuana plant before flowering. Leaves have toothed edges, pale-yellow flowers at top of stalks, very competitive in native grasslands. Light encourages growth

**Baby's-Breath**, *Gypsophila paniculata*, tiny white flowers in the summer, delicate-looking small, gray-green leaves. Is invading the habitat of dune thistle, *Cirsium pitcheri*

**Vinca**, *Periwinkle*, *Myrtle*, *Vinca minor*, *V. major*, trailing groundcovers, evergreen leaves, small, blue flowers often summer and fall. Various cultivars have a wide range of colors and leaf variegation

*V. major* has larger blooms and leaves with rounded bases and tapered tips. Can persist in original sites for decades, crowding out all native herbaceous vegetation

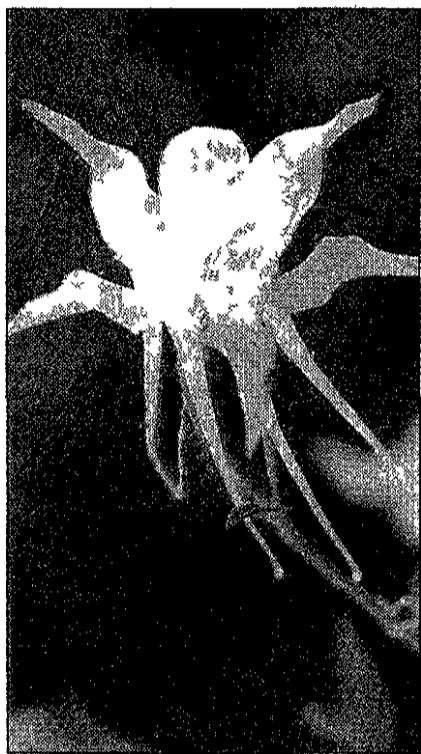

## Canton gardener works on nature's terms

If a plant dies, he said, that's part of the overall expectation.

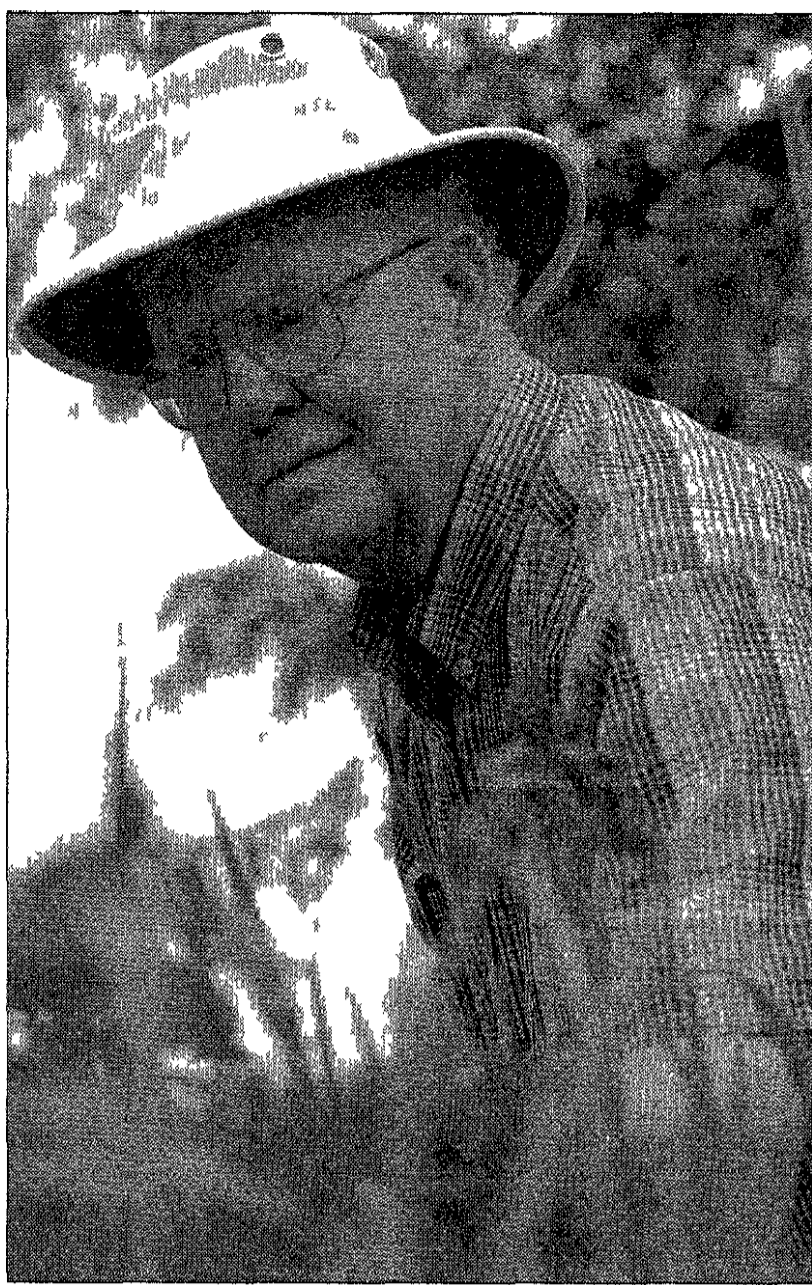
## Garden club

"Growing flowers is wonderful," Kluz said. "It's a tremendous amount of work and it really soothes the soul."

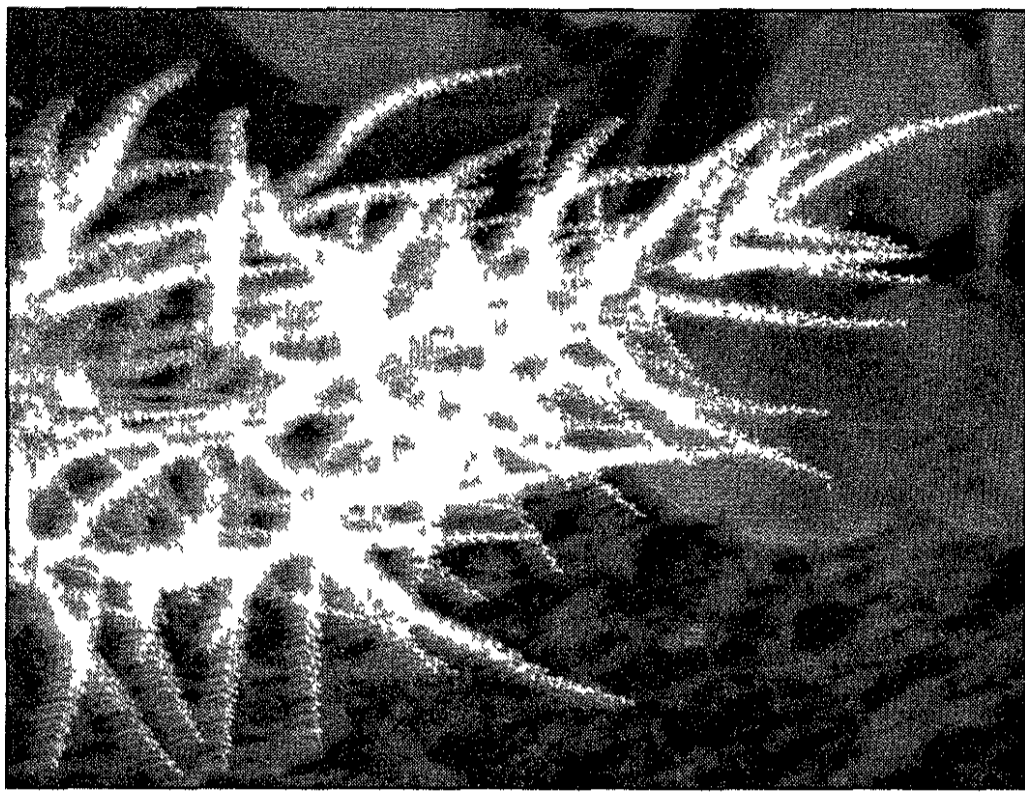

**Purple Loosestrife, *Lythrum salicaria*,** long, showy spikes of purple flowers in wetlands between June and September. Replaces native vegetation, threatens endangered plant species and reduces the availability of food and shelter for wildlife. Quite a problem in this state.

■ **Vines**  
**Japanese Honeysuckle, *Lonicera japonica*,** a woody plant, fragrant white tubular flowers in pairs, turn yellow as

they age. Semi-evergreen. Easily distinguished from native honeysuckle vines by its upper leaves that are distinctly separate, berries are black to purple. Leaves of the native vine are joined together around the stem, berries are red to orange. Spreads rapidly, smothering surrounding small trees and shrubs. May form a ground layer on shady floor of forests, will grow quickly if area gets more light.

■ **Shrubs**  
**Multiflora Rose *Rosa multiflora*** large vigorous shrub to 10 feet tall arching stems. White flower clusters in June, red hips in August. Often forms dense thickets damaging pasture lands overtaking them. Has

replaced vast areas of native plant habitat.

■ **Wintercreeper, *Euonymus fortunei*** evergreen shrub with leathery opposite leaves. Spreads to form dense groundcover that seldom flowers or fruits, climbing stems flower in June followed by smooth capsules, split in the fall to reveal scarlet berries. Smothers and kills wildflowers as well as small trees.

# Gardening is family tradition

Gardening is a family tradition at the home of Farmington Hills resident Kitty Gitulli, who says she derives much of the inspiration for her sprawling country gardens and elaborate Koi filled pond from her German mother and 94-year-old Polish aunt.

Gitulli, who has been gardening for 30 years, continues to make her inherited passion for the outdoors a family affair.

She now employs the help of her husband Paul and 16 year old son Dante to help maintain the lush landscape that is one of six garden sites to be featured in the Farmington Garden Walk on Saturday, June 22.

"I couldn't do this without my family," said Gitulli, gesturing to the colorful flower beds, unusual hanging plants and finely trimmed shrubs that accent the

front of her home "That's why I don't work - this house is a job"

The Gitulli gardens feature a variety of flowering delights, from large purple rhododendrons and robust hostas to elegant Boston ferns and sweet-smelling mountain laurel.

Many of the plants and flowers have special meaning to Gitulli because they have either been given to her by friends and family or she has raised them herself from seeds.

Gitulli said that the dramatic peonies blossoming by the front porch "mean a lot to me" because they are from the original slip her aunt gave her many years ago.

## Water wonderland

The focal point of Gitulli's garden paradise, and one of the reasons it was chosen for the garden walk, is the multi-tiered, Koi-filled pond that stretches across her front lawn.

An array of ornamental pond grass circles the top pond while mixed zinnia and primrose adorn the lower level. Whimsical garden ornaments such as a brass dragonfly and small stone garden gnomes add a personal flair while large boulders - hand-picked by Gitulli's husband - set off the area from the rest of the yard.

Water from the pond flows over jagged stones and around an angel statue, emptying into a larger pond full of 9-foot-long Koi fish.

Dispersed throughout the water is an arrangement of iris and lotus plants, intermingled with small groupings of lily pads that sprinkle the pond surface. The flower beds around the ponds create the illusion of a sunset, featuring the deep purple of iris, the shocking orange of tiger lily and the soft yellow of sedum.

One of Gitulli's favorite plants in this area is the ornamental kale cabbage that rims the front of the pond.

"These plants hang onto life even after everything's gone," Gitulli said.

In between the kale Gitulli planted geraniums to keep the rabbits out, a trick she learned from her aunt.

Pink and lavender wave petunias another of Gitulli's favorites, spill over the sloping garden beds and mix with multi-colored ball florist aster and a variety of perennials.

On warm summer nights Git

ulli lays aside her watering can and spade to enjoy the natural retreat she and her family have created. The garden has become a wildlife sanctuary says Gitulli making reference to the many frogs, bugs and birds that have made the pond and surrounding flower beds their home.

"There's a bench out there and in the evening I sit there and have a glass of wine or a cup of tea and watch the fish and the frogs" she said. "The music of nature is what I like - the echoes at night are so pretty."

Gitulli has worked for 12 years to establish the kind of wildlife haven her family and neighbors now enjoy every spring and summer.

"But I didn't start off like this" said Gitulli, explaining that gardening for her has been a process of experimentation.

"Each year I add something new and try to change the color scheme. Sometimes I buy a flower because of color - sometimes it'll do well or sometimes it'll invade the whole area. It's trial and error."

Gitulli's advice for other gardeners is to start small and try new things.

"My theory is to take a little section of your yard cut it out and start a garden. Don't start off too big - you plant something and you learn from it."

## About the walk

The Farmington Garden Walk is presented by the Farmington Garden Club. It has taken place for more than 30 years.

Hours are 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. rain or shine. Tickets are \$7 and can be bought at Steinkopf Nursery, 20815 Farmington Road. Saturday tickets will be sold at the Heritage Park Visitors Center on Farmington Road between 10 and 11 Mile.

Refreshments will be served at Heritage midway through the walk and a limited number of dragonfly garden ornaments handcrafted by members of the Garden Club will be offered for sale.

A new twist this year will be a special sale of the types of plants and flowers found at the different sites along the walk.

# 'Flower city' home to wide population of plants

Gloria Hughes pours herself into her gardens, logging more than 80 hours weekly caring for perennials, planting 50 flats of annual blooms and nurturing her passion for flowers.

Her mother taught her to love plants at a tender age, but Hughes never worried herself with studying books to learn the names of the flowers.

She'd rather design landscapes or be elbow-deep in dirt taking care of the ones she has already planted in her 90-by-165-foot yard.

"This is flower city," Hughes said, referring to her yard.

Her garden will be one of seven on Livonia's 13th Annual Garden Walk, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday, June 29.

Tickets are \$9 in advance and \$10 the day of the event, which is sponsored by the Friends for the Development of Greenmead. Tickets are available at Greenmead (Eight Mile and Newburgh), Livonia City Hall (Five Mile and Farmington Road) and all Livonia libraries. The day of the walk, tickets will be available at Greenmead and Civic Center Library.

"This is appreciated by a lot of people in the community and a lot of people like to get ideas for their own yards," said Rosemary

Farabaugh, garden walk chairperson.

"It covers all areas of the city, so they aren't all in one spot and they're all maintained by the homeowners."

## Many levels

Hughes has been adding to her garden beds for the 30 years she has lived in the home she and her husband, Michael, had built. "We put everything in, including the grass," Hughes said.

The bulk of her labor is in spring, preparing the gardens and planting annuals. Weeding is limited by ground cover and sprinklers take care of the watering during the summer

months. Going by the home, you have to notice the diamond-shaped, raised bed lined with boulders in the front yard.

The back yard has a deck that gradually reaches to 5 feet tall to give friends and family an elevated view of the mounds of blooms in various shades of pinks, purples and blues. More than 20 hanging baskets fill in gaps from ground level to a bird's eye view.

Paver brick adorns the front porch and continues in a winding path down the front walk, wrapping around the side to the back of the house leading to the deck.

Most of the beds around the entire perimeter of the lot are raised up with rocks. Hughes estimates that she spends well over \$1,000 annually on her flowers and small fish-filled pond.

Michael, a science teacher at Churchill High School, takes the fish to school every year sometime in November. The students enjoy them for the school year and Gloria takes them back for her pond over the summer.

"Last year we had a calamity," Hughes said. "The day before I was going to take them to his school, the fish were gone."

Whatever got to the 10 large fish didn't even leave carcasses.

Replacing the fish will be another expense this year. Hughes helps cut down on gardening expenses for friends by giving them pieces of her perennials.

For Mother's Day, Michael knows he'll definitely make a hit with a load of dirt or boulders for her flower beds. When her three children were young, Hughes paid 10 cents for every wag

onload of stones they collected from a field across the street.

Gardeners learn not expect fish or plants to last forever — not even the perennials that usually fade with time, Hughes said. She learned the adage from her mom, she said.

While begonias and impatiens are always on Hughes' shopping list, geraniums are her favorite annual flower.

"Whatever looks good is what I use, but it has to be in the right colors," she said. "I'm fussy about my colors and I like the real different things — not the run of the mill."

Hughes mentioned more than a dozen area nurseries and large home improvement stores where she looks for plants every year.

"My husband enjoys them as much as I do," she said. "He's off in the summer and we call it our little park."

## Special features

Like Hughes' house, each of the homes on the garden walk has something special to offer — one leads down to a ravine and another has a water garden, Farabaugh said.

"We attract visitors from all over," she said. She said that well

over 500 people visit Livonia's Garden Walk each year.

The flower pots that will be sold during the walk were donated by Steinkopf Gardening Center and Landscaping in Farmington Hills. Proceeds will go to the preservation projects at Greenmead.

Currently, Friends for the Development of Greenmead are in the midst of a project to preserve and restore the Alexander Blue House, which will be used as a center for weddings and other activities.

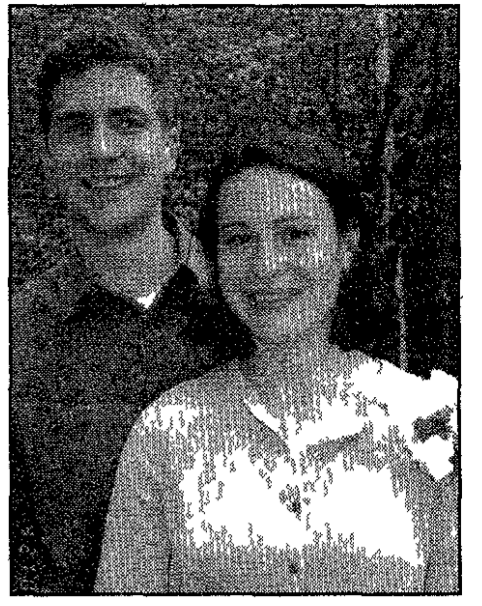

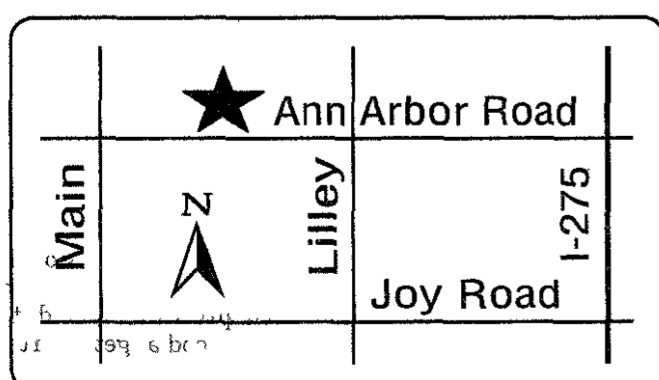

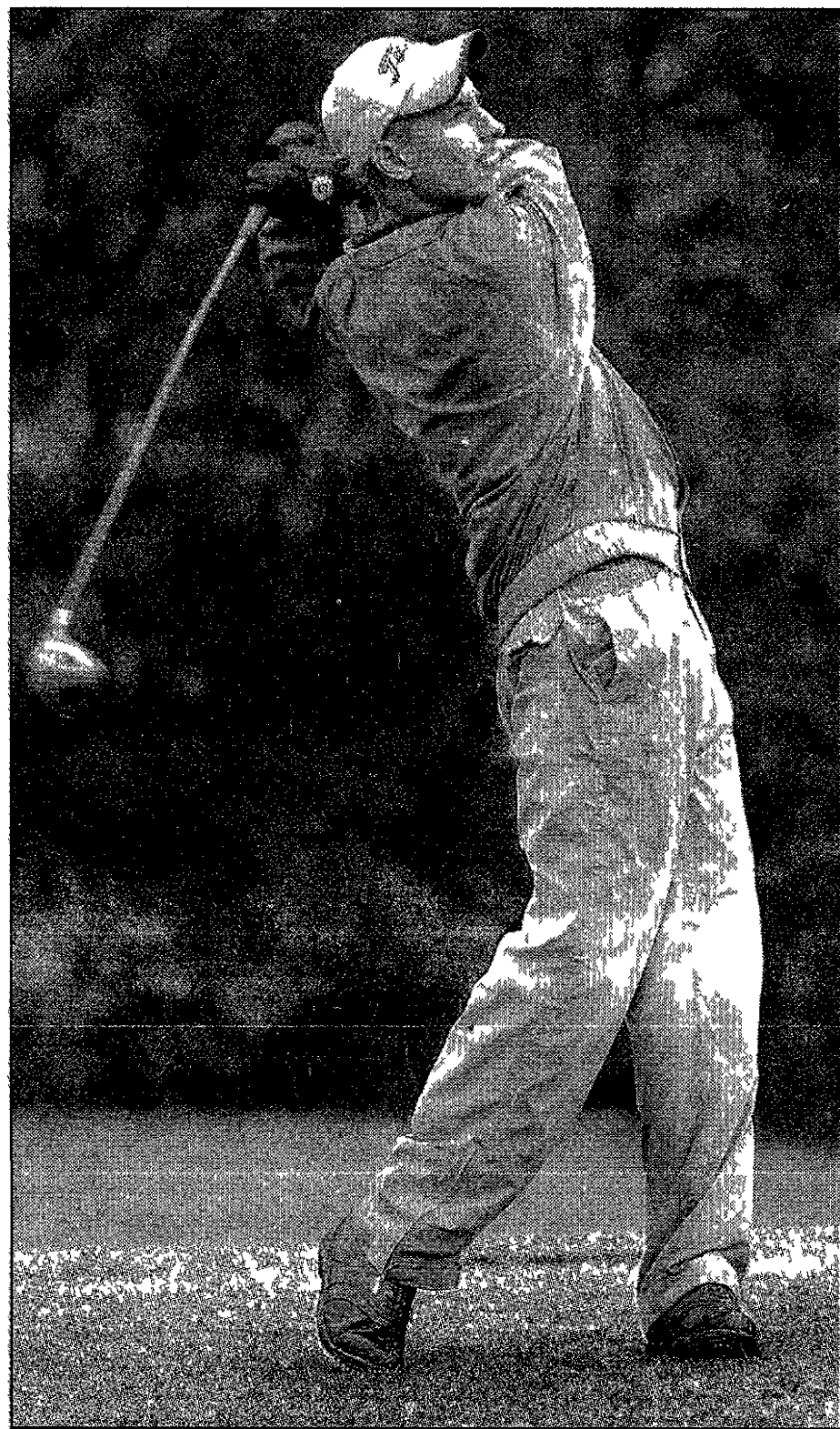
"You need a lot of bodies when you play back-to-back games like that," said Duggan. "He figured he might have to

# Schoolcraft College cage team taking shape

A month ago it looked like the Schoolcraft College men's basketball team would have an entirely new look and a new direction.

But coach Carlos Briggs, who has guided the Ocelots to two straight trips to the NJCAA Division I tournament, decided to stay after a tempting offer to become an assistant coach at Western Michigan University.

"The administration has done a good job of taking care of me and our school president Dr. (Conway) Jeffress has convinced me this can be a home for me," Briggs said. "Right now saving lives means more to me than money or a step up in the coaching ranks."

Briggs is more proud of his accomplishment of moving players on to four-year schools more than his 141-24 record in five seasons.

"The reason why I turned it down because I've built a home here at Schoolcraft and it's rewarding to see kids from different backgrounds and social environments come together as a team," Briggs said. "To see kids go on to

four-year schools means a lot to me. Right now I feel I can do more here."

Briggs' top assistant Steve Norgrove recently accepted the varsity boys basketball position at Farmington High. Second assistant John Sharpe will not return, leaving two spots vacant.

Five of Briggs' players, who led Schoolcraft to a No. 1 ranking, a 35-1 overall record and a third place finish in the NJCAA Tournament in Hutchinson, Kan., have signed with Division I schools.

The only two players returning are back-up point-guard Gary Johnson (Wayne Memorial) and reserved forward Ronald Dorsey (Detroit Pershing).

But next year's squad is beginning to take shape and the Ocelots are definitely rebuilding, yet also reloading.

Briggs has put together another strong recruiting class led by 6-foot-3 guard Marcus Bennett, a mid-semester transfer from the University of Michigan who practiced two months with Schoolcraft.

"This team on paper is as good as my second-year team," said Briggs, referring to the squad that produced Rob Brown (University of Buffalo), Lamar

Bigby (UNLV), Quentin Mitchell (Western Illinois), Reggie Kirkland (Wayne State) and Brian Williams (Western Illinois). "This team is both athletic and deep, but they lack the experience and the basketball knowledge of the last two teams."

Briggs hopes to bring in three more players before the fall term starts.

"We're looking for two big guys and a wing player," he said.

In addition to Bennett, the former Detroit Renaissance standout, two more Division I transfers will suit up next season for the Ocelots including 6-4 guard Dion Sherrell (Wichita State) and 6-6 forward Torvoris Baker (Eastern Michigan).

Sherrell, Detroit Henry Ford graduate, appeared in 20 games in limited action for the Shockers, averaging three points and one rebound per game.

"He may be one of the better players we've brought in," Briggs said of Sherrell. "They (Wichita State) didn't play his style of basketball, so he decided to

come home. He's a tough kid with good size. He can really score any way with the ball."

Baker, who prepped at Detroit Cooley red-shirted last year as a Prop 48 academic situation at EMU.

"He's very athletic," Briggs said of Baker. "He's inside player who can also can step out and shoot it. He's a tough kid who plays hard and is very coachable."

Briggs also nabbed his second recruit from Redford Bishop Borgess in three years, 6-7, 250-pound first-team All-Observer center Darien Bynum. (The other Borgess standout to sign with Schoolcraft was 2000-02 All-America Sam Hoskin, now at DePaul.)

Bynum averaged 22 points and 12 rebounds this season for the Spartans under coach Lloyd Praedel.

"Darien is a big body who can score on the low block," Briggs said. "He needs to get in shape, but he's a tough kid who will compete."

Two other signees include 6-7 forward Marcus Johnson of Dearborn Heights Robichaud and 6-2 shooting guard James Holmes of Belleville.

The pair were considered two of the

best in western Wayne County. Holmes, Belleville's leading scorer at nearly 17 points per game, led the Tigers to the state Class A semifinals. He is an All-Mega Red Division selection and first-team Detroit Free Press All-West who also averaged 5.8 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 2.7 steals per game.

Johnson also averaged double figures in both points and rebounds for the Bulldogs. He also played football and baseball.

"Marcus is athletic, he runs well and is very coachable, he needs to improve his strength," Briggs said. "James is a good shooter, well coached in high school. He understands the game."

Also in the fold is 5-10 point guard Aaron Squirewell, a transfer from Saginaw Valley State who prepped at Detroit St. Martin DePorres.

"Aaron is quick, he's a good point-guard, a tough kid who can run the team," said Briggs, who has already begun summer workouts and has entered his team in the formidable St. Cecilia Summer Basketball League.

# SC's Medunjanin going Division I

It's been quite an odyssey for Schoolcraft College basketball player Emir Medunjanin, who left war-torn Bosnia six years ago to come to the U.S.

Last Wednesday (June 12), the 6-foot-6 swingman realized a personal dream when he signed a Division I scholarship to play at Sacramento State (Calif.), which is coming off a 9-19 season and a 3-11 record in the Big Sky Conference.

Medunjanin, who turned down several offers from Division II schools, has two years of eligibility left. He made an official visit

to the California school on Wednesday and immediately signed a National Letter of Intent.

"The reason why I signed with Schoolcraft was to go to a Division I school," said Medunjanin, who averaged nearly nine points and five rebounds for the 35-1 Ocelots. "There are only eight teams in the conference (Big Sky) and there's a good chance to make the (NCAA) tournament."

"I fell in love with it, the campus, the weather, the people. It's clean, it's a beautiful area."

Medunjanin shot 54 percent from the field, including 49 percent from three-point range as

Schoolcraft finished third in the NJCAA Division I tournament last March in Hutchinson, Kan.

He averaged over 10 points per game in four games in the nationals, including a team high 19 points in a quarterfinal victory over Itawamba (Miss.). He also improved defensively, normally guarding the opposing team's top scorer.

As a freshman, Medunjanin was a backup forward for the 32-4 Ocelots, who made their first appearance in school history in the NJCAA Tournament.

He came to Schoolcraft after making first-team All-Observer at North Farmington where he played the center position for coach Tom Negoshian.

"It took me two years to adjust to the perimeter game because I played the five position (center) in high school," Medunjanin said. "Coach (Briggs) gave me the biggest boost of my basketball career. I learned a lot from that man and I thank him a lot along with coach (Steve) Norgrove who worked me hard in practice every day."

Medunjanin plans to study German at Sacramento State.

Ironically, he spent four months in Germany with an uncle after leaving Bosnia with his parents, his brother and aunt.

Medunjanin first began to learn the game at age 14 when he played at a German sports club.

"My mother played and my brother also played some basketball in Germany," said Medunjanin, who eventually wound up with relatives in Michigan.

Medunjanin is the fifth Ocelot player to sign with a Division I program this year. He is joined by Mike Williams (Western Michigan), Rulon Harris (Detroit Mercy), Delvar Barrett (Ohio University) and Westland John Glenn's Yaku Moton-Spruill (Cansius).

Sacramento State, coached by Jerome Jenkins, has now four recruits in the fold for the 2002-03 season including 6-10 junior college player Djibril Diop, 6-4 guard Jameel Pugh, a transfer from Massachusetts, and DeShawn Freeman, a guard from Sacramento.

## On building moratoriums, plat dedication

We have a condo in northern Michigan and have been subjected to a moratorium for building on our lot. I understand there is a case before the U.S. Supreme Court which may affect our rights versus the government.

There is a case before the Supreme Court where the court has agreed to hear a landowner's claim that even a "temporary moratorium" is a taking under the Fifth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution entitling them to compensation.

If the landowners prevail, the impact could be significant, given that development halts are common and a temporary delay in issuing building permits is routine.

In addition, a natural disaster such as a flood or hurricane often leads to a development moratorium in some locations.

But public agencies don't agree that such a halt should result in a right to a landowner's ability to receive compensation. We will monitor this case.

I'm a real estate lawyer and want to make sure my dedication of a part of a plat which I'm utilizing goes to the public for public use. How do I ensure that happens?

First, a recorded plat designating the areas for public use evidencing a clear intent by the plat proprietor to dedicate those areas to public use and, secondly, acceptance by the proper public authority.

Make sure the public authority clearly provides evidence of such acceptance, presumably in recordable form.

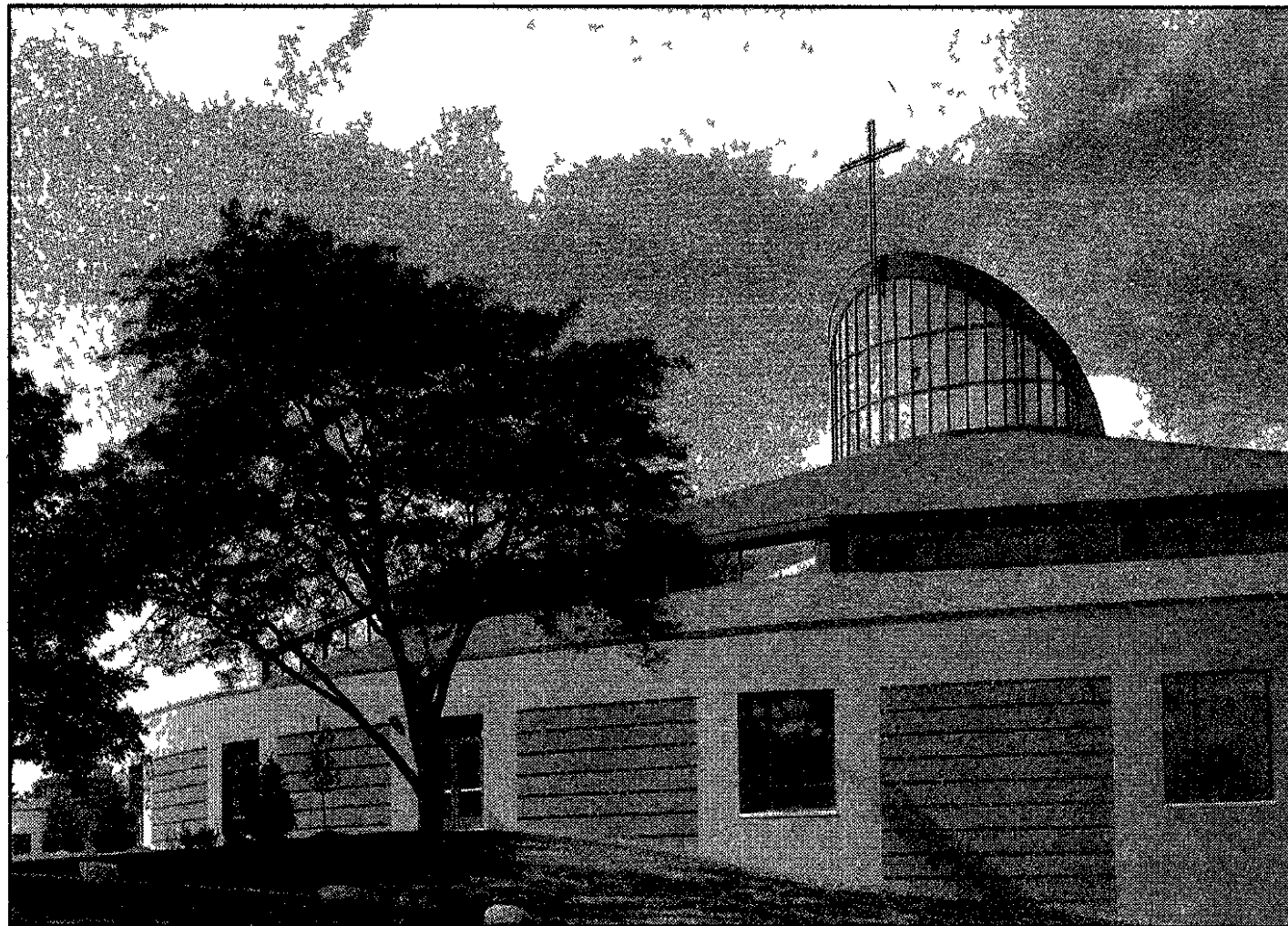

## Construction, design projects wow judges in annual ESD competition

Real estate has commercial as well as residential uses.

And what better way to enhance the value of office buildings, churches, hospitals, schools, technical centers, monuments, infrastructure and tourist attractions than well-thought designs and quality construction?

Ten projects were selected this year as Engineering Society Detroit Construction & Design Award winners.

Judges looked at overall design, teamwork involving the owner, architect and construction partners innovative construction techniques and how the projects impacted the environment.

Judges also reviewed materials used, energy considerations and economic/social impacts.

Here's a brief summary of the winners:

■ Barton Malow Corporate Headquarters, Southfield

Owner, designer and constructor Barton Malow, Southfield.

Right at the get go the firm admitted it had a difficult client to please in itself.

The four-story, 110,000 square-foot building, years in the planning stages and 14 months under construction, established an inviting environment where job function rather than rank determined space allocation.

Rainwater that hits the building's roof is carried via a drainage system to a wetlands. Water from the parking lot empties to a different system.

■ Department of Veteran Affairs Medical Center, Ann Arbor

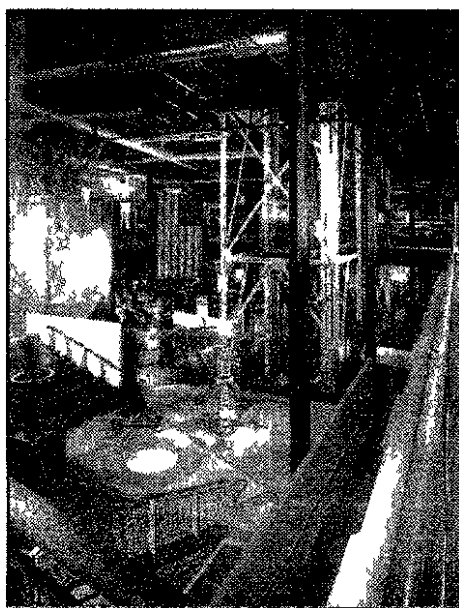
Owner: Department of Veteran Affairs, Designer: HarleyEllis, Southfield, Constructor: P J Dick, Pittsburgh, Pa.

A 340,000-square-foot clinic addition provides a variety of inpatient and outpatient services. The design allows for future modifications while minimizing patient impact.

The topography of the site was changed substantially after much research to accommodate the project.

■ Down River Tunnel System, Wyandotte

Owner: Wayne County Division of Public Works, Designer: Wade-Trim, Taylor, and NTH Consultants, Farm-

ington Hills, Constructors: Dan's Excavating, Jay Dee Contractors, Mancini Construction, Ric-Man Construction, and Shaw Electric.

Teaming and underground construction were the central themes of the wastewater relief system designed in phases since 1995 involving 13 communities.

■ Driveability Test Facility, Allen Park

Owner, designer and constructor Jacobs Sverdrup, Southfield.

This 225,000-square-foot building contains some of the most advanced aerodynamic, climactic, powertrain, altitude and acoustic testing labs in the automotive industry.

■ Michigan Vietnam Monument, Lansing

Owner: Veteran Monument Commission of Michigan, Designer: A L Gordon Architect, NY, NY, Contractor: The Christman Co., Lansing.

More than \$100,000 in cash and in-kind donations were procured to preserve design integrity within limited construction budget.

The monument, itself, consists of a series of timeline panels constructed of steel, brick, concrete and lights in a 2.5-acre park.

■ Montcalm Community College Beatrice E. Doser Building, (vocational technical facility), northeast of

Grand Rapids

Owner: Montcalm Community College, Designer: J Stuart Pettitt, AIA, Clawson, Constructor: The Christman Co.

The 38,000-square-foot building contains a divisible meeting room, teleconferencing rooms, general class rooms, a computer lab and faculty offices.

It's positioned to take advantage of a view of woods without disturbing sensitive natural wetlands.

■ The New Detroit Science Center, Detroit

Owner: The New Detroit Science Center, Designer: Neumann/Smith Associates, Southfield, Constructor: Walbridge Aldinger, Detroit.

Bold geometry vibrant colors and nearly 50,000 square feet of hands-on exhibit space mesh with a planetarium and IMAX theater.

■ Our Lady of Good Counsel Catholic Church, Plymouth

## Integrity saves deals

As cadets at the Air Force Academy, my peers and I swore to uphold strict standards of conduct that established the groundwork for our work as military officers. This Cadet Honor Code said that we will not lie, cheat or steal, nor tolerate those who did.

During our ethics training, we learned that failing to disclose information was as much a lie as verbalizing untruths. A lie is an act or an omission that deceives combined with an intention to deceive.

So why do I bring up ethics and honor in a mortgage column? Because very often when buyers get burned in real estate transactions it is because they did not fully disclose their situation.

In the mortgage world, you should begin by completing your loan application fully and truthfully. Virtually everything you write on your application will be verified in some manner or another. Years ago, I had an FHA borrower who did not disclose a 15-year old unpaid student loan that did not appear on her credit report. A federal computer system flagged her as ineligible when we submitted her social security number to get her an FHA case number.

During the mortgage approval process, you should tell your loan officer about any changes in your situation that might impact your loan. Some young clients of mine once bought several large appliances and signed a new vehicle lease mere days after submitting their mortgage application to me.

The added debt burden (which they attempted to conceal) almost squelched their deal. Because of their new lease, they barely qualified even after returning their appliances. Lesson: It is easier and cheaper to dial a phone, than to move a refrigerator.

With hundreds of niche loan products on the market and dozens of lenders willing to waive certain restrictions, you can live risk-free and peacefully by understanding that your loan officer is your advocate, not your adversary. If you have an issue gnawing at you, let your loan officer decide whether or not it will affect your mortgage approval.

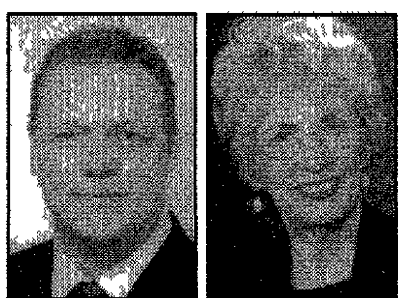

# Aging homeowners stay put, look at remodeling

(AP) - Alan and Julie Stewart converted their kitchen cabinets into drawers to hold pots and pans. They widened the doorways and eliminated all stairs in the house.

They age-proofed it, not for their grandchildren, but for themselves. The two are in their 80s and getting around has become more difficult.

"It's fixed up for older, disabled people," Alan Stewart said. "It's a lot safer. It's a lot less tense for us not having to watch for steps."

This type of home modification is referred to as remodeling for "aging-in-place," something building industry representatives say is growing as baby boomers mature and seniors look for a more active lifestyle than what is provided in retirement homes.

"People want to maintain that independence," said Louis Tenenbaum, an independent living strategist. "They don't want to move into a home where someone else decides when they will have lunch."

Tenenbaum has advocated aging-in-place at national conferences, including one held recently in Denver that was organized by the National Council on the Aging and the American Society on Aging.

Tenenbaum supports increased government funding, from sources like Medicare

and Social Security, to help pay for the remodeling.

"The age wave is coming and people are starting to find ways to deal with it," he said.

In addition to staying in their homes, aging baby boomers are searching for active adult communities with spas and Internet access. The fastest-growing segment of the retirement market wants to stay close to home, builders say.

To accommodate the need, home-builders and remodelers are becoming more creative by designing homes and retrofits that are useful and aesthetic, architect Doug Walter said.

"There's no excuse for clunky looking or institutional looking bathrooms," he said.

In the Stewarts' home, the shower grab bars match the towel holders and the wider doorways are enclosed with double doors.

They could have moved to a new home with built-in amenities, but they preferred to remain at home. "We just couldn't bear moving," Alan said.

The Stewarts have lived in their home more than 40 years and will celebrate their 60th anniversary there later this month with 200 friends.

Walter predicts the remodeling market will surge as baby boomers age.

"The baby boom generation is doing OK in their 50s, but give us another 10 years and a lot more of these accessibility issues will be in the forefront," Walter said.

The National Home Builders Association has launched an aging-in-place certificate to train professionals of the skills needed to make home modifications that accommodate seniors.

The association estimates residential remodeling to be a \$180 billion industry.

In its latest survey of the remodeling industry, Harvard's Joint Center for Housing Studies projected that baby boomers will account for the creation of 12 million new households as a result of empty nests and new single-person households.

# Build tree house with safety features in mind

What is it about a tree house that can put a smile on a child's face?

Perhaps it's that such a perch allows them to be high off the ground and see things that can't be seen with little feet planted firmly on the ground. Maybe it has something to do with being enveloped by nature - wind, branches, leaves, birds and squirrels.

Or it might be the independence that comes from having one's own secret hiding place - a place from which to spy down upon others.

Whatever the reasons, building a tree house can be an exciting parent child experience, one that will be remembered long after the tree house is gone.

A tree house is essentially a platform upon which there could be a roofed shelter and an open area, fenced around. There must be a small space for access by a ladder, but it should be otherwise enclosed to prevent falls.

Unlike plans for a playhouse, those for a tree house aren't feasible because no two trees are alike. Building a tree house is one of those design-and-build-as-you-go projects.

There are basic design criteria that

will ensure a safe and lasting tree house without jeopardizing the life of the tree.

The process involves notching and cutting branches and nailing into the tree. Consult an arborist or tree surgeon for advice so as not to harm the tree.

The biggest challenge to building a tree house is finding a tree that will serve as a foundation. The tree must have a rigid trunk and strong branches that will allow a suitable size at a convenient height. This can be asking a lot of one tree.

Sometimes a tree house can be supported by two or more trees. For example, a tree house can be nestled into a grove of redwood trees. In contrast to the traditional single-tree, branch-supported tree house, the trunks support the floor system with this method.

Since trees are alive and grow, the tree house must be designed to accommodate their changes. Connections to the tree should be made using nails or construction screws. Lag screws can be used for added stability and a more durable structure.

Avoid lashing the connections with rope, cable or wire, as each can strangle the tree or limb as it grows.

The first step is to locate a horizontal

plane in the tree where a level floor or platform can be built.

The size and shape of the platform will depend on the available space. However, a square or rectangular frame can maximize space and make construction easier.

Begin the platform frame by fastening two reasonably parallel 2 by 4 beams to the tree branches. Next, install two parallel beams perpendicular to the first two beams.

The trunk or sloping branches might need to be slightly notched to accommodate the platform frame. Notches also will offer added support for downward loads and will prevent slipping.

Complete the platform framing by installing joist spaced at 16 inch to 24 inch centers. The joist can be hung from the frame using joist hangers or end-nailed using nails or construction screws.

If the shape of the frame for the platform doesn't look anything like a square or rectangle, consider installing the floor joist on top of the frame. This will allow greater design flexibility by permitting one or more tree branches to pass through the floor.

Once the floor frame is complete, the floor material can be installed. Fence boards are

a good choice. They are rustic looking, easy to install and, when properly spaced, will allow drainage that will prevent rot.

Fasten the floorboards to the floor framing with nails or construction screws.

If your tree house will have a roof or partial cover, uprights consisting of 4-by-4 posts should be installed before the floorboards are.

Posts will also be needed as support for a rail that will surround the entire perimeter of the tree house. This is a safety requirement. All posts should be attached to the floor frame using nuts, bolts and washers. Use two bolts at each connection.

The roof, which should have a slight pitch for watershed, can be supported in much the same fashion as the floor - rail frame and joist fill.

Painted plywood makes for a good, watertight roof. Use brown or green acrylic latex paint that will blend in with the tree.

While a roof can keep little ones dry, it's the rail that will keep them safe from a nasty fall. The rail consists of support posts, a bottom rail fastened to the floorboards, a top-cap rail fastened to the inside face of the support posts

and the pickets.

The rail can be solid or made of pickets from fence boards spaced no more than four inches apart. In either case, the material should be fastened from the interior so outward-thrusting movement cannot weaken the rail.

The same holds true for siding at walls. Fasten plywood or fence boards from the interior to maintain strength and prevent falls. If you fasten from the outside, only the fastener takes the load, and it could be pushed out.

Once the tree house is completed, you will need a means of getting in and out of it. One often-used means is boards nailed to the trunk. This method involves excessive nailing that can injure the tree. It also isn't very safe.

Safer alternatives are a wood frame ladder made of 2-by-4 rails and 1-by-4 rungs. Another more kid-popular option is a rope ladder, because it can be drawn up to prevent unwanted intruders.

A rope ladder can be assembled using wooden closet pole dowels and half-inch rope. Cut the rungs to about 18 inches, and drill two parallel 5/8-inch holes, one inch in from each end. Thread the rope through holes, and place a knot every 16 inches.

## English government to erect pre-fab homes

(AP) - The government in England is to build thousands of cheap, prefabricated homes for teachers, nurses and police officers to stop them being priced out of the booming housing market there, a newspaper has reported.

Housing minister Lord Falconer told The Daily Telegraph that thousands of homes, which are constructed in factories and then erected on site, would be built on public land for key workers to buy or rent.

"School teachers or health workers now cannot afford to live near where they work and therefore don't work there," the newspaper quoted Falconer as saying.

"It's comfortable, beautiful housing. I would like to see thousands built a year," he said.

The booming housing market, especially in London and south east England, has shown no sign of collapsing.

According to the nationwide building society, annual house price inflation now stands at 16.5 percent. The average house now costs \$143,676 US, the major mortgage lender said.

Local Government Secretary Stephen Byers has, in the past, also talked of government plans to build affordable housing for public sector workers. The government has set aside \$357.5 million US to subsidize starter homes for public sector staff.

## Interior bedroom window wows kids

## Glue then trim when installing carpeting

When installing indoor-outdoor carpet, glue first then trim. Be sure that the concrete slab is clean and dry. Check for moisture problems by securely taping a 12-inch-square piece of plastic sheeting to the slab, using duct tape.

If moisture appears between the plastic and the slab, it should be sealed with a high-quality concrete sealer.

Use a stair tool, a large chisel-like tool, to seat and create the edge of the carpet into the joint between the floor and the wall. Finish the job by trimming the carpet with a utility knife.

Now, on to magnetic coatings

Wonder what effect those coatings painted on interior walls have on computers, pagers, cell phones, etc? Even with four coats, does it cause problems with a computer in the same room?
