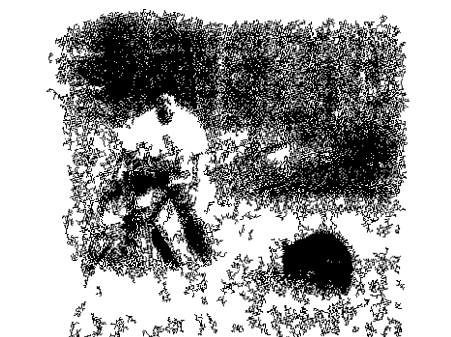

Lightning strikes wreak havoc

The thunderstorms and lightning that blew through Plymouth Tuesday afternoon resulted in house fires in Plymouth and Plymouth Township, as well as knocked out communications for Plymouth Township police and the Plymouth Community Fire Department.

The radio tower, located behind the police department at Mill and Ann Arbor Road, was struck twice by lightning within four minutes. Fire Chief Larry Groth said he was looking out a window and saw the tower get hit.

"The two bolts came down and I knew the tower was hit," said Groth. "It took my breath away."

Groth said the fire department is set up to operate communications at any of the three fire stations, and as of Wednesday afternoon was still working out of Station #3 at Beck and Territorial roads.

"We have radios, pagers and generators at the fire stations, which we use as back-up centers to keep things going," said Groth.

Meanwhile, the police department on Wednesday afternoon was still using hand-held prep radios, or walkie talkies, to communicate between the dispatch center and patrol cars.

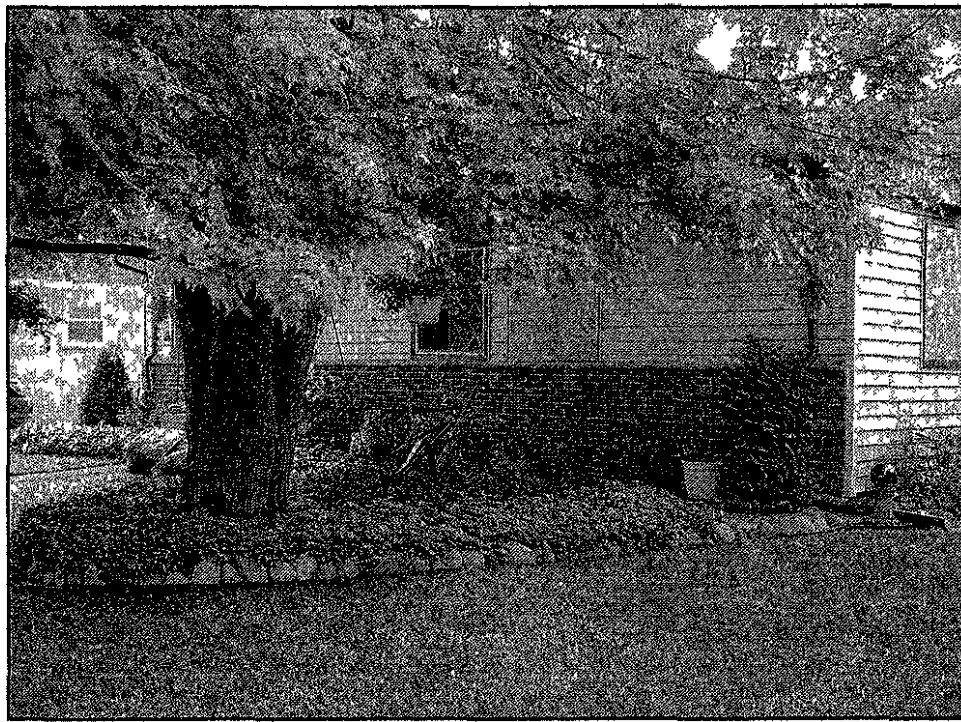
"We're up and running and able to handle any emergency situations," said Lt. Bob Smith. "We had the parts shipped overnight, but we'll just have to see how much damage was done to the radio consoles."

Smith noted the 911 system partially failed when lightning struck at 3:53 p.m., but it didn't affect the department's ability to answer emergency calls.

"We were able to receive 911 calls, but the display of caller addresses and telephone numbers wasn't working," he said. "However, that was back in service by about five o'clock."

Meanwhile, the fire department was busy responding to fire runs, including one at 665 Byron in Plymouth, where lightning resulted in \$150,000 in damages to the home owned by Richard Huebler.

"I was standing in the front door

Stewart claims attack by Patterson

State Rep. John Stewart (R-Plymouth Township) and Rep. Bruce Patterson (R-Canton Township) may represent adjoining districts but they've never claimed to be friends.

At times the two have been at odds over issues in the state legislature and have been often seen sparring verbally on the House floor.

However, the bad blood between the two allegedly boiled over into a physical confrontation after the Wayne County 13th Republican meeting last Thursday night at the Maplewood Community Center in Garden City.

According to Stewart, he was "taunted by (Patterson)" during the meeting. "He was red-faced and on the muscle," said Stewart.

Patterson did not return phone calls.

Bond a possibility as district buys Canton property

A bond issue for a new elementary school, and possibly a future middle school, may be next on the agenda after the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education approved spending \$12 million

Tuesday night for 14 acres of land in Canton's Cherry Hill Village.

The purchase of property from Biltmore Properties Corp. is for acreage on the northeast corner of Cherry Hill and Denton roads. The southwest section of Canton is considered the fastest growing area of the school district, and

there are few parcels available to purchase for future schools.

Determination on a possible bond issue to build new schools is on the to-do list for interim Superintendent Jim Ryan.

"We're looking for permission from the school board to get out in the com-

munity and discuss that," said Ryan. "Even though we've opened three schools (Discovery Middle, Dodson Elementary and Plymouth High), we're still going to be crowded at middle schools and elementaries because we're

Local Wings fan gets leg up on Cup fervor

It was a birthday present Tom Truscott wouldn't dream of taking back.

When the Detroit Red Wings won the Stanley Cup on Truscott's birthday, June 13, the Canton resident knew he had to do something to immortalize the achievement.

"It was the best birthday present I could ever have gotten," he said.

Truscott, a huge hockey and Red Wings fan virtually his entire life, quickly settled on the fashion in which he would pay homage to his favorite team: a large tattoo adorning most of his right calf.

The 38-year-old hair stylist, who works at Station 385 in Plymouth's Old Village, had the work done last week, about a week after the Wings won the Cup. He'd have done it sooner, but his tattooist couldn't work him in any quicker.

Truscott acknowledges getting a tattoo may have been a little over the top.

"That's the reaction I'm getting from everyone. 'You're nuts!' Truscott said with a laugh. "Then they say, 'now that's a dedicated fan.'"

But it's nothing new for Truscott, whose basement is filled with Red Wings memorabilia. He's been a hockey fan since before his own playing days as a teen. It hurt him to miss the celebratory parade

through downtown Detroit, but he had to work. "So I was there at work, doing my job and watching the parade on TV," Truscott said. "I just love hockey, and the Wings. It seems like they're having fun what they're doing, I think they enjoy playing hockey, it's not just a money factor for them."

Truscott's right leg is becoming more and more of a conversation starter. People in the malls see him and stop him so they can bend down to take a look. Even Truscott's own kids — 15-year-old daughter Jade and 10-year-old son Chase — are getting into the act.

"They're running around telling their friends, 'Hey, you've got to come see my dad's leg,'" he says with yet another laugh. "I didn't do it for that reason, but it really has become sort of a showpiece."

If the Red Wings win the Stanley Cup again next year, look for Truscott to dedicate more of his skin with his tribute.

"I'm thinking about adding on to it as things go on with the Wings," he said. "I'd like to start filling in the whole leg with a dedication to the Wings."

blessed this community is still growing

"The board is making a good move to secure some property for a potential site, find what the community wants to do, and then come back with a recommendation of what we're going to do," he said. "We'll find out if they want to build an elementary school in the Cherry Hill area and if we want to have a really good discussion about what would be the best use for Central Middle School."

Ryan said the ultimate decision on any new schools and bond proposals will be up to the community.

Building an elementary school is part of a potential bond issue. Discussion of Central Middle School is a part of it, too. "I'm not going to separate those two," Ryan said. "The question

is, what will the community support?"

Ryan said discussion will include the possibility of consolidating services, such as Starkweather alternative education and the school board offices, and moving them to Central.

"We want to know if Central should stay as a middle school, or can it serve this district as a focal point of educational organization," he said.

The Board of Education recalled another teacher at Tuesday's board meeting. Of the

original 18 that had to be let go by the district, 12 have been called back. Ray Bihun, executive director of human resources, said there is a chance the remaining six will be called back if other teachers take leaves of absences or retire.

Ryan was given the title of interim superintendent by the Board of Education, succeeding Superintendent Kathleen Booher, whose resignation is official as of July 12.

Ryan's salary will increase from \$110,000 to match Booher's \$133,000.

Ryan will be evaluated by trustees Dec. 3, and could have the interim removed from his title. If not, he will return to his former position as deputy superintendent and a search for a permanent superintendent will begin.

Ramp closures

The ramp from westbound Ann Arbor Road to northbound I-275 will be closed for five days starting Friday to allow reconstruction of the northbound I-275 ramp terminal and Ann Arbor Road through the ramp area.

The closure starts Friday at 9 a.m., and the ramp will be closed through 5 a.m. Wednesday, July 3. Westbound traffic will still be able to access I-275 by making a left turn and using the temporary ramp on the north side of Ann Arbor Road.

Meanwhile, the ramp from eastbound Ann Arbor Road to northbound I-275 and the right lane of northbound I-275 at Ann Arbor Road will be closed from 7 p.m. today (Thursday) until 5 a.m. Friday. The right lane of southbound I-275 at Ann Arbor Road will be closed from 7 p.m. Friday until 5 a.m. Saturday.

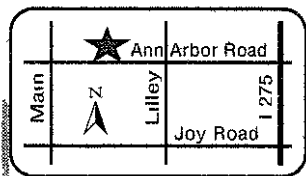

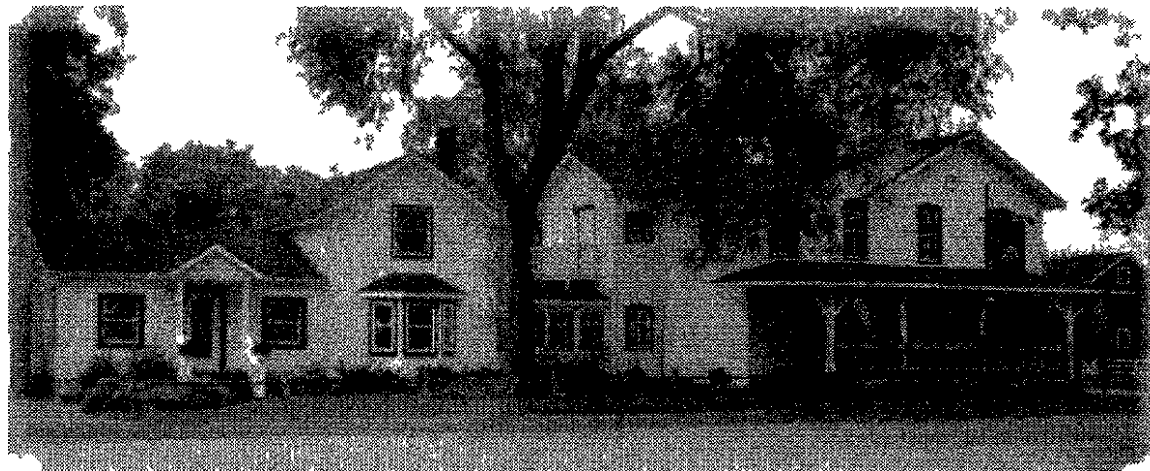

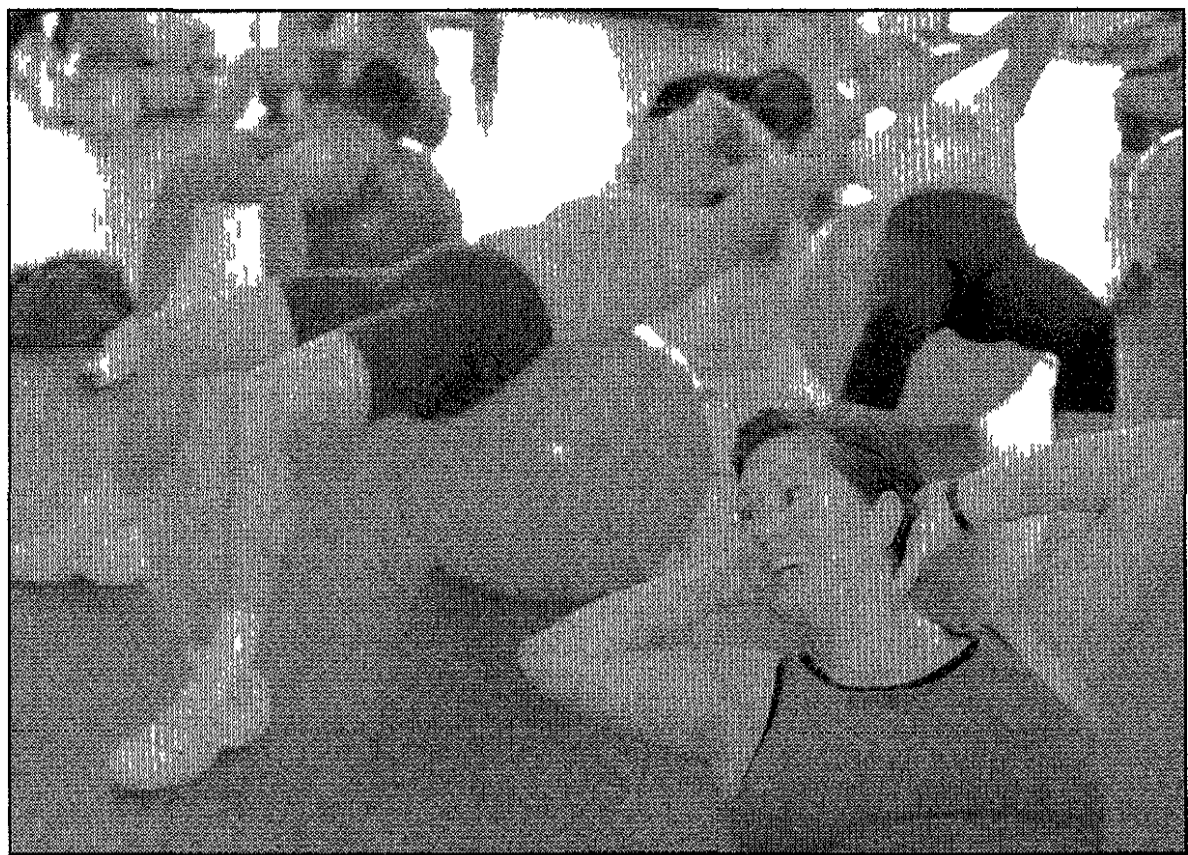

Jazzercise moving into old IGA building in the fall

After being empty the past several years, the building that for decades housed Kroger, Danny's and IGA grocery stores in downtown Plymouth will finally be re-developed.

Fran Mintz, the owner of Jazzercise in Canton, said she'll move her operation to the 16,000 square foot building — located Main Street from Charlestown Square just south of the railroad tracks — by early September and bring along several other businesses.

"We could use the space," said Mintz, who noted business has been growing steadily

the past 10 years. "We'll be able to offer more classes and different formats with the additional space."

Mintz' dance-based fitness and strength training programs will use 9,000-square-feet, which more than doubles the class space currently located in a shopping mall at Warren and Lilley roads. The remaining square footage will be sublet to at least two other related businesses.

"We're looking for businesses that blend well with the women of the community," said Mintz. "So many women come in my business and we want establishments that will cater to them and complement Jazzercise, like a nail salon or

coffee shop. We have a lot of different people interested in opening businesses in that location."

Mintz started Jazzercise a decade ago in a clubhouse in Canton's Sunflower subdivision. Since then, classes have grown to nearly 60 people, and Mintz feels it's time for her fourth move to a larger facility.

Along with moving in, Mintz and owners of the building have agreed to put on a new facade, add landscaping and repave the parking lot. Mintz declined to say how much the move will cost, except to say "a lot of money." Hopefully we'll have all our approvals from the city and be able to move in by Sept. 1.

Board holds 1st ethics meeting

The Plymouth Township Board of Trustees Tuesday night got the ball rolling in the ethics investigation of trustee Abe Munfakh by scheduling the first ethics committee meeting.

And Munfakh lived up to his word, showing he wasn't just going to sit back and take what he perceives as a political attack lying down.

The township board voted 5-2 to schedule the first meeting in what could be a protracted process for Tuesday, July 9. The board, which was already scheduled to meet in a study session that night, will now convene the ethics board at 7:30 p.m.

Immediately following the vote, Munfakh fired the newest salvo, having his lawyer, Tom Ryan of Sylvan Lake, stand up to urge the board to reconsider. "This does not rise to the level that you seem to be spending on it," Ryan told the board. "I wouldn't have taken on (Munfakh's) situation if I didn't believe in it."

As part of the July 9 ethics meeting, the board is expected to appoint a third party, most likely an attorney, to review the conflict of interest allegations against Munfakh to determine whether violations of the township's ethics policy exist.

Several critics have accused Munfakh of the conflict because the engineering firm for which

he works, Ayres Lewis Norris & May, is a consultant to Salem Township, and recently helped broker a deal with the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department to add Salem to the city's water system.

Critics argue Munfakh has a conflict because Plymouth Township's water pressure problems are likely to be exacerbated by adding another municipality to the system. Therefore, the critics say, Munfakh's firm is engaging in activity that goes against the best interests of Plymouth Township, which Munfakh was elected to serve in 2000.

But Munfakh has said all along he never worked on the account, a position his attorney reiterated Tuesday night. Even if he had, Ryan insisted, the allegations wouldn't rise to the level of conflict of interest.

Ryan also insisted the deal between Salem and Detroit Water was going to get done, with or without Munfakh's firm.

"Honestly, with all due respect, you're a powerful board in Plymouth Township," he said. "When you get to the borders, you can't dictate policy. You don't have the responsibility or authority over what Salem Township wants to do."

Ryan urged the township board to have the allegations looked at before convening the ethics committee, but board members believe having the allegations reviewed is the purview of the ethics committee.

"That's exactly what the ethics board is for," Supervisor Steve Mann said. "To do it any other way would be sidestepping the process."

When it does convene, the ethics board will follow practices set forth in the State Administrative Procedures Act, following the recommendation by the township attorneys. At the first meeting, the board will consider appointing the third party to review the allegations and consider the timeline for subsequent meetings.

But getting the allegations framed properly is the top priority, township attorney Ronald Wittoff told the board.

"At that (July 9) meeting, appointing someone to be an advocate for the allegations would be Job One," Wittoff told the board.

Ryan politely disagreed, saying such an appointment and review of the allegations should be made prior to the decision to even convene the ethics board.

"Someone should make that determination before you drag Mr. Munfakh any further," Ryan said.

Munfakh and trustee Ron Griffith, who has decried the whole process as unnecessary from the beginning, voted against setting the meeting. Trustee Kay Arnold voted in favor of it, but "only because our attorney has told us we can't forward it to the governor's office," she told the board.

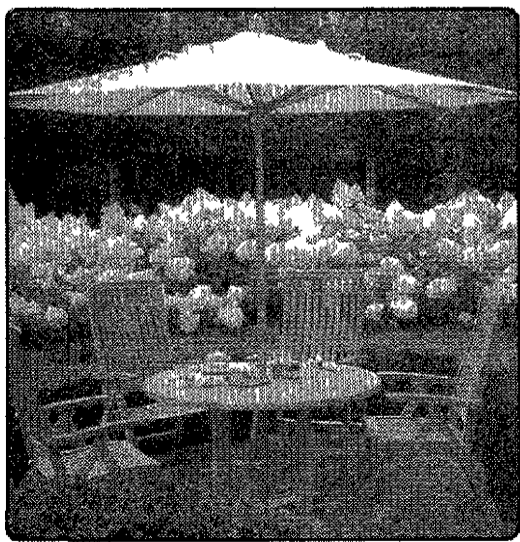
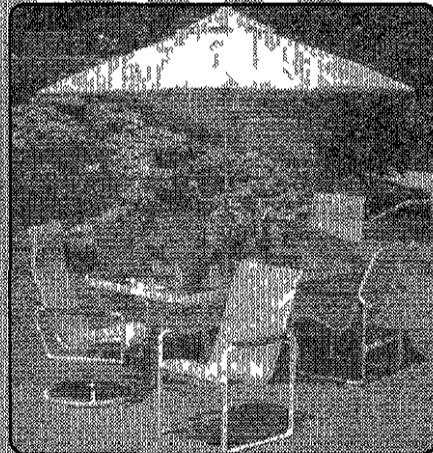

As he left the meeting, Stewart told Garden City police, he tried to avoid Patterson while on his way to his car. However, Stewart claims the Canton law-

maker followed him outside and said, "You want a piece of me?"

As he attempted to get into his car, Stewart said Patterson began pushing the car door against him.

"I was squashed between the car door and frame. It happened so fast I didn't see it coming," Stewart told the Observer. Stewart, who acknowledged there were no witnesses to the confrontation, said Garden City police took photos of his injuries, which included a quarter-inch-size bruise on his chest, and a red mark on his hand.

Garden City Police Chief David Harvey said, "We are investigating this as an assault and battery. If it has any merit, we'll submit it to the prosecutor as we normally would."

When asked if he intended to press charges against Patterson, Stewart told the Observer, "I said I would be willing to proceed. I'm begging for a polygraph. The truth will come out." Stewart said during a telephone conversation on the House floor about three weeks ago, Patterson told him "I'm going to get you."

"I didn't think anything of it at the time, so I sluffed it off," said Stewart. "I feel violated."

Paving project may face legal hurdle

The Plymouth Township Board of Trustees Tuesday took the final step in establishing a special assessment district to get roads paved in the George Robinson subdivision.

But that doesn't necessarily mean it's going to be a smooth ride.

Trustees at their June 11 meeting accepted the bid of Thompson-McCully to do the paving work, despite the fact the firm was the second-lowest bidder. Thompson's bid came in \$1,360 higher than the bid of Cadillac Asphalt.

But the township went with Thompson-McCully, citing previous positive experiences between the firm and the township.

On Tuesday, though, an attorney for Cadillac Asphalt urged the board to reconsider.

"The township has a purchasing policy that mandates awarding contracts to the lowest bidder," said Stuart Teger. "I think the township should reconsider awarding this bid to (Cadillac) for two reasons: the first is, it's the law. Even though you made the policy, you are not authorized to abandon it."

"The second reason is that other contractors will stop bidding. Why bother going to the expense of putting together a bid if it's futile, if the bid is going to go to a friend of the township?"

Supervisor Steve Mann, though, said the township was within its power to go with the second-lowest bid.

"The bid was \$1,300 lower on a \$700,000 project," Mann said. "We don't know Cadillac, but

we've had positive dealings with Thompson-McCully. We weren't willing to take a chance for that small amount of money."

The board didn't respond to Teger's request, and later in the meeting conducted a public hearing, the last step in establishing the SAD.

The \$762,400 project will cost homeowners in the SAD \$4,565.27 if they choose to pay it in one lump sum. Homeowners can also pay it over 10 years at 8 percent per year, which would cost them \$680 a year.

Trustee Abe Munfakh, the only dissenting vote, called the 8 percent interest rate "outrageous."

"You can get a bank loan much cheaper than that," Munfakh said.

But residents apparently don't want to wait any longer.

"It's a standard procedure," said resident Gordy Smith. "If you go through the township, it's 8 percent, if you get a home loan, get what you can. Let's not delay this any longer."

There's a 30-day stay following Tuesday's public hearing, to give homeowners a chance to appeal to the Michigan Tax Tribunal. The contractor expects to begin work soon after that 30-day stay, and work is expected to be completed by fall.

Billing to homeowners isn't expected until next year.

However, officials at Cadillac Asphalt, the low bidder on the project, are considering their options, including possible legal action.

"We don't know yet what we'll do next," said Teger. "Court action is a possibility, but we haven't made any decision yet."

Local reverend takes ministry on the road

The Rev. Rodney Reinhart is taking his World Sabbath of Religious Reconciliation on the road.

Reinhart, an Episcopal minister from Plymouth, will be one of the key speakers at a conference on Theology, Globalization and Peace at Oxford University's Plater College July 29.

day calling on all people of faith to stand together against the violent abuse of religion and work together for justice, tolerance and peace, the reverend said.

"We try to get people to make a commitment to speak out against violence done in the name of God," Reinhart pointed out.

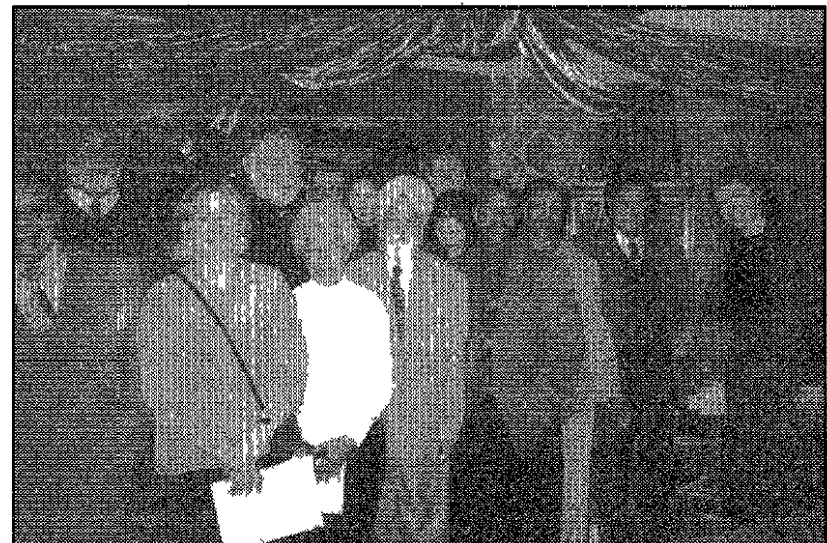
If last minute obstacles are removed, Reinhart will also take his message to Barcelona, Spain, for the International Aids Conference July 6-12. Reinhart's report has already been published in conference materials, but he said the Spanish govern-

ment wants to make sure attendees from poor countries have the wherewithal to get home because it fears a high number of people seeking economic refuge.

But at press time the conference was still on.

If things work out, I look forward to speaking at that Reinhart said.

when I heard it hit and I saw leaves fly," said Huebler, 70. "A minute later the smoke alarm went off in the hall and a whole bedroom was on fire. A big chunk of the wall blew right on out."

Huebler's stepson, Dave, 17, was in the basement working on his computer.

"I heard the thunder and lightning hit, and then all the power went out. The keyboard then flashed and I got shocked," he said.

Groth said investigators deter-

mined the lightning struck an electrical pole behind the house "and traveled from the pole to the electrical line inside the house. Six circuits were blown in the breaker box because of the jolt."

The fire was mostly confined to a bedroom and attic, according to Groth, but the entire home sustained smoke damage.

At 46701 Barrington in Plymouth Township, the homeowner came home early from work and was upstairs when lightning struck again.

"He smelled smoke after the bolt hit and went downstairs, where he found his television, VCR and cable box on fire," said Groth. "He was lucky to be home and catch it. Damage was limited to about \$7,000."

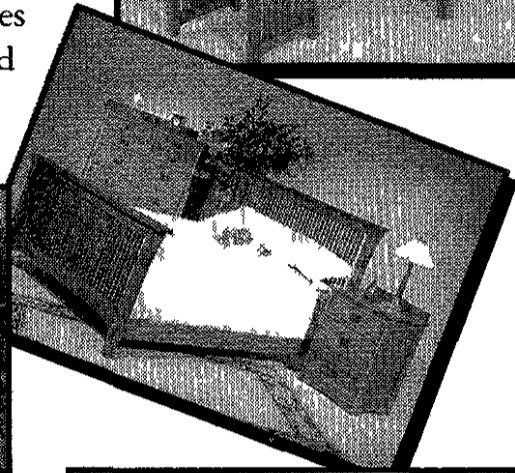
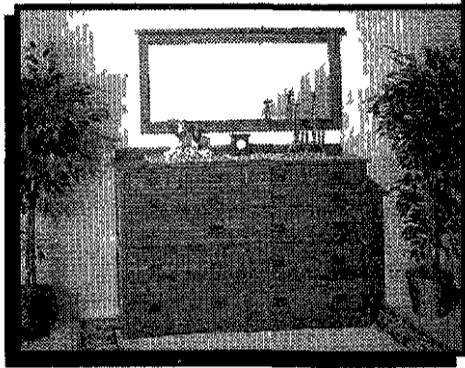
Groth said his department was overwhelmed trying to keep up with fire runs and alarms triggered by the storm.

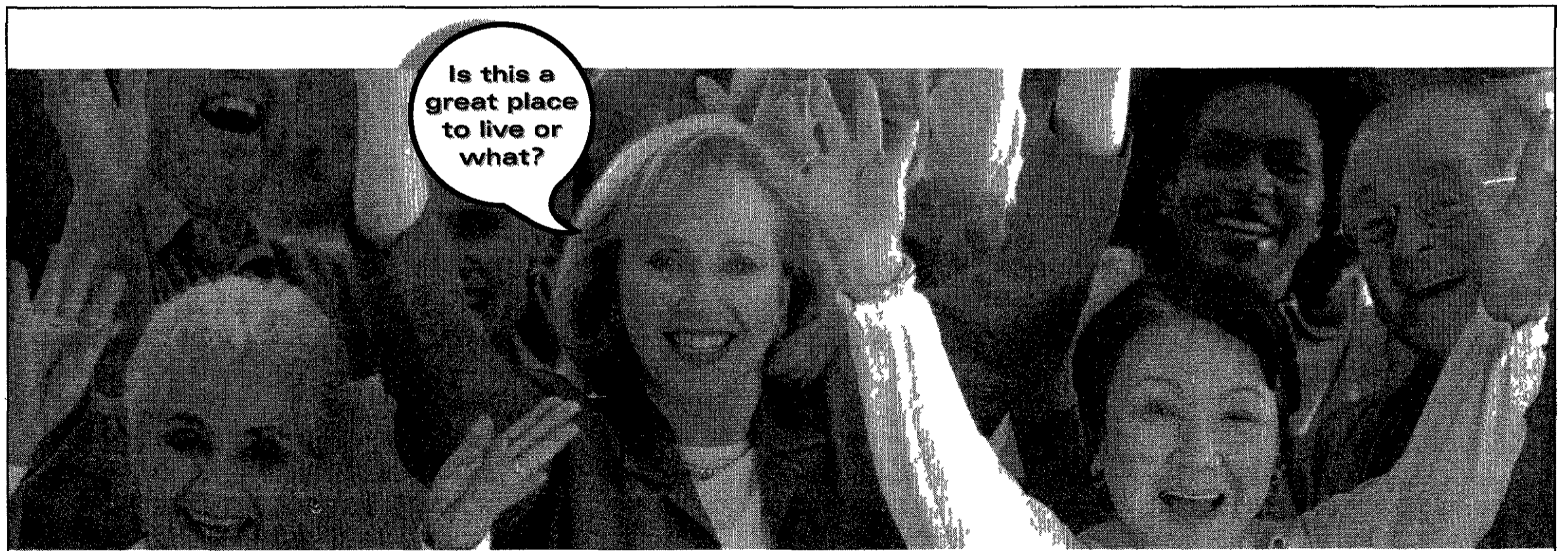

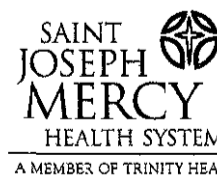

Ficano sees county helping bring high-tech future to area

(Editor's note This is the first of a series of articles on the campaign for Wayne County executive)

Robert Ficano, who has built a reputation as Wayne County's cyber sheriff, wants to use the resources of county government toward developing a high tech future

Ficano 49 who has been sheriff since 1985, says his 'track record' should convince voters that he's ready to replace Ed McNamara as county executive. He faces stiff opposition in the Aug 6 Democratic primary, which will be the decisive vote in the heavily Democratic county.

His major opponents are former Detroit Police Chief Benny Napoleon, County Commission Chair Ricardo Solomon, Register of Deeds Bernard Youngblood and state Sen Joe Young

Digital Detroit

"There's going to be a ring, they'll call it digital Detroit, a ring of high-tech companies that want to look at locating around this area, that will revolve around two or three industries," Ficano said in a meeting with Observer editors.

Ficano envisions a ring that is bounded by I-275, I 75 and I-94, with the the airport as an important linchpin.

"It will be up to us in Wayne County to see if there will be an availability of resources to lure those companies," Ficano said.

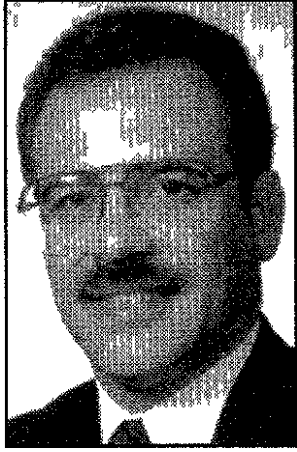
He envisions the auto industry as taking a lead in high tech innovations, including the development of the fuel cell. But he also says this area should also be a bio-tech center, pointing to the University of Michigan's multi-million research grants and also Wayne State University's biotech projects.

Once they discover some of the cures that come out of bio technology, they'll want to market it, sell it, venture capitalize. It's important to lure those companies especially along the I-94 corridor," Ficano said.

Ficano said it shouldn't be a competition between Wayne and Oakland County for business but a cooperative effort to develop the whole area.

Ficano said his work as sheriff has helped build business. The sheriff's cyber crimes unit has received most of its publicity for aggressively seeking out sexual predators.

But Ficano said a lot of the department's work is on business crimes such as identity theft and computer hacking. He said businesses want to locate in a place where they know their interests

are protected. "The county has rightly focused on the airport. A lot of its resources have been directed toward getting it completed, getting it done," Ficano said. "Now it's the next phase, working on development of the benefits from building the airport. It spreads throughout the region."

Perception of unfairness

Ficano said he would not have supported an airport authority, but he said there was a "perception that there wasn't fairness going on."

He said the complaints led to frustration in the business community.

"One of the problems is that the county executive, the current one Ed McNamara, has done a yeoman's job of setting the process and having the vision to get this airport built, and it needed to be built," Ficano said. "One of the problems though is the county commission would slow up contracts. You need a mechanism that is fair, you want them done properly, but at the same time you couldn't have this long, drawn-out, exasperating process to get contracts through that were common sense most of the time."

Ficano's relations with McNamara over the years have not always been smooth. They disagreed frequently about funding for the Sheriff's Department.

He has not received McNamara's endorsement but he called McNamara a successful county executive who did what he had to do to get the airport project completed.

Ficano said he will work toward mending fences with the county commission, which is currently trying to disband the airport authority.

"I think there has to be a working relationship because the citizens want projects done, they want government to work for them, to work in their best interests," he said.

SMART

In other areas ■ Ficano supports the renewal of the SMART tax. He said companies want to be sure their employees are able to get to work.

■ He proposes having all his appointees sign a code of ethics, agree not to take a job for a year with any company with whom they've signed a county contract and agree not to lobby the agency for which they've worked for a year after leaving the county.

■ Ficano said the county needs to develop its internet capabilities and support business e-commerce efforts.

■ Ficano said that rebuilding roads needs to be approached with the "fervor" given to the airport and he supports exploring new technologies on road construction.

Ficano and his wife Rosemarie live in Livonia with their two children, Sabrina and Robert.

Solomon says his commission experience gives him an edge

Ricardo Solomon tells a story about when he was 12 years old in 1967. He was living on Hazelwood between 12th and 14th streets in Detroit, about six miles from where the Detroit riot erupted.

His father went to help neighbors drag furniture from their burning home.

"I didn't want him to go," Solomon said, "and one of the things he said to me is that what you do for others is what lasts. I began to truly appreciate and enjoy public service."

Solomon, chairman of the Wayne County Commission, would like to continue his public service as Wayne County Executive.

He faces seven other candidates in the Aug 6 Democratic primary to replace longtime County Executive Edward McNamara. Notable candidates are Sheriff Robert Ficano, former Detroit Police Chief Benny Napoleon, Register of Deeds Bernard Youngblood and state Sen Joe Young.

Solomon, 46, has been chairman of the commission for eight years, being returned by his peers five times as their leader.

The Morehouse College graduate counts as his mentors former Detroit Mayor Coleman Young and former U.S. Rep. George Crockett.

"I probably remember him (Crockett) more than any other elected official," Solomon said in an interview with Observer editors. "He said as an elected official you have to stand on your principles, even when you have to stand alone."

Though candidate polls show Solomon running behind Ficano and Napoleon, he has received notable endorsements from Detroit Mayor Kwame Kilpatrick and Wayne County Prosecutor Michael Duggan.

Airport conflict

Neither Solomon nor his opponents have received an endorsement from McNamara. The outgoing executive was expected to give his blessing to Solomon, but the chairman is taking the lead in trying to kill the new airport authority, created in a deal between McNamara and Gov. John Engler. The authority was created in the wake of investigations on airport contracts.

"I think when it comes to the airport and contracting, we all have to share in the blame and responsibility," Solomon said. "It's not a McNamara problem or a commission problem. It's a county problem. When you discover there's a problem, do you sit back and do nothing or do you do something about it? The county commission has taken proactive steps over the last four or five years to

change the way we do business in Wayne County."

Solomon said the commission acted by having voters decide on creating an independent auditor general and an independent counsel because the corporate counsel answers to the executive. He said the commission also passed an ordinance that requires commission approval for all contracts.

"The reason we oppose the authority is because the authority calls for public facilities, owned by taxpayers of Wayne County, to be placed in the hands of eight people, unpaid volunteers, four of whom will be on that board for six years, appointed by Ed McNamara," Solomon said. "While I respect Mr. McNamara a great deal, I do not believe that it is correct for any outgoing CEO to be able to appoint any individual to have oversight authority over a billion dollar facility."

Broad experience

Solomon said his experience on regional, state and local committees give him an appreciation of how government works that isn't shared by the other candidates. He also touts his performance as chairman.

"The county commission has never gone over budget," he said. "We've always had a surplus and I've managed 75 employees and five departments well."

He said he also has an advantage over other candidates in working to improve the strained relations between the executive and commission.

"There has to be a level of trust. One of the things I've learned about government is that Wayne County has a co-equal form of government," he said. "I am never going to initiate policies or programs without talking to my former colleagues."

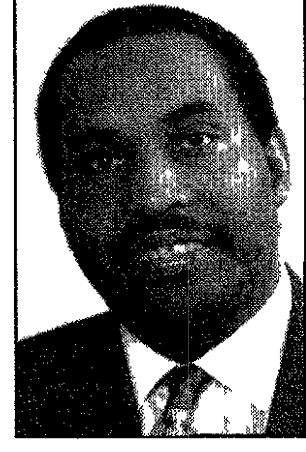
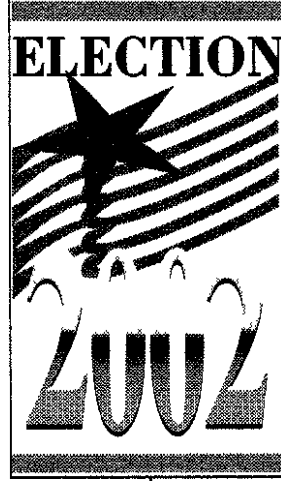
Solomon said he wants to promote small, minority and women-owned businesses. He said he wants to work with community- and faith-based organizations to work on housing programs.

He said the county is facing financial problems but that they have taken efforts to prevent a deficit.

"We're going to have to be very creative," he said. "Even though I hate taxes, as part of an infrastructure program I favor a gas tax at a minimal rate."

Solomon said he supports the regional transit proposal and the current SMART millage request.

The issue of transportation has been a divisive one and we all share in the blame because we haven't stepped up to plate," he said.

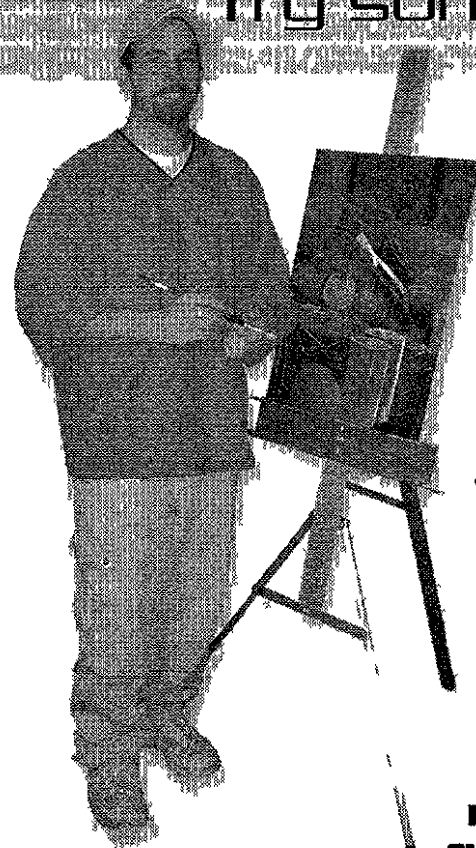

4th of July parade, picnic are tribute to volunteers

Sometimes individuals or organizations have to toot their own horns in order to get anything done, or to get recognition for the good things they've done in a community. And sometimes they can get the local hometown newspaper to do the tooting.

In the case of Plymouth's Fourth of July celebration, we'd be more than happy to do a little horn blowing.

Between them, realtor Fred Hill and Plymouth Township Treasurer Ron Edwards do as much to make the Fourth of July a great holiday as anyone could possibly ask. Hill, master of the Briefcase Drill Team and the head honcho for the Good Morning America parade through downtown, runs one of the best parades around.

He works on it constantly, particularly when the calendar turns and the date draws closer. He coordinates the entries, sees that the rules (no politicking!) are followed and leaves the town feeling a part of something amazing.

Thousands of people begin lining the street long before the parade's 7:30 a.m. start, jockeying for the prime seats. It's a great parade, featuring singing acts, musical acts, and acts of all sorts. It runs the entire downtown stretch of Main Street nearly to Ann Arbor Road, so there are plenty of chances to see it, and people frequently follow it from one end to the other.

And, since it starts so early in the morning, it lays claim to being one of the first parades in the nation to kick off the holiday, hence the name "Good Morning America" parade.

Folks who don't get enough good vibes from the parade (and those who do) get another chance at Plymouth Township Park when the township picnic kicks off. It's organized by Edwards, although he's hardly solely responsible for its success. While he does most of the grunt work getting it started, he's the first to admit it would never come off without the pre-

vious hours donated by volunteers.

There is a core group of volunteers, among them Fire Chief Larry and Sandy Groth, Lt. Bob Smith of the township police, former building official Charlie McIlarghey, police officer Denny Wilson, and a host of others.

The success of the picnic is based on volunteers, and about 60 percent of them have no idea until the Fourth of July that they're going to be volunteers. That's about how many of the volunteers who cook hot dogs, hand out chips and pop or do whatever other tasks need to be done, according to Edwards, who show up the day of the picnic and simply ask "How can I help?"

If past trends hold up, visitors to the picnic will drink about 4,800 cans of soda and another 2,400 bottles of water. They'll eat about 6,800 hot dogs along with 4,000 bags of chips and pretzels. They'll consume 130 gallons of ice cream.

And they'll do it while they're enjoying balloon rides, shooting hockey pucks with the Plymouth Whalers, decorating their bikes for the annual bike decorating contest or taking part in the yearly fishing contest.

And this year, they'll also get to help the township celebrate its 175th birthday.

Too often when asked to do things, the response is, "What's in it for me?"

In the case of the parade and picnic, the only question asked by Hill, Edwards and their crews is "What's in it for Plymouth?"

In the heightened patriotic days post-Sept. 11 people are going the extra mile to display their sense of American pride. Thanks to the parade and the picnic — and the efforts of people like Hill and Edwards and all of those volunteers — Plymouth residents get the first crack.

Thanks to these folks when the question is asked "Was a good time had by all?" the answer comes easily. "You bet."

Legislature should end bickering on budget

The discussion over whether the state should hike its 75-cents-per-pack sin tax on tobacco products, like so many other debates between partisan legislators, broke down last week into finger-pointing and subtle name-calling.

Democrats whined that Republicans who supported the tax were discriminating against middle class and poor folk, who make up a large portion of those addicted to tobacco products, and said (gasp!) the Republicans were anti-working people.

Democrats also balked at the cigarette tax because it was proposed in lieu of delaying implementation of business tax cuts that even high-profile Republicans such as GOP gubernatorial candidate Joe Schwarz have come out in favor of delaying.

GOP legislators (surprise!) branded Democrats as pro-tobacco industry. Since about 20 cents of the proposed 50-cent hike would go to schools, Republicans also accused Dems of being anti-schools.

When you boil it down, it's all election-year hype and grandstanding, and it ought to stop when discussion resumes today (Thursday) in Lansing.

According to an analysis released by the House Republican Policy Office, the bill would raise:

- About \$152.5 million for the general fund in fiscal 2003
- About \$100 million for schools
- About \$23.4 million for the Medicaid Trust Fund
- About \$5.8 million to be used in Wayne County for indigent health care.

With the state facing a budget shortfall that could approach \$350 million next year, legislators are running out of options.

Debating who pays for the shortfall is short-sighted. With that kind of deficit looming, the state has no choice but to fix it.

When there's no money, you do one of two things: cut programs or raise taxes. Either way, someone is going to pay.

Supporters of the tax say it will stave off cuts in several areas of the budget.

They point to potential reductions in education (10 percent of school readiness grants, the arts (a 50-percent slashing of arts grants), and cuts in revenue sharing, which have already hurt many of our communities.

Certainly, the sin tax won't be popular with some small business owners, say, tobacco store operators. Smokers certain-

ly won't like it much. We don't necessarily buy the theory that a higher cigarette tax may prompt attendance at smoking cessation classes.

More likely, smokers will loudly decry the tax as they stand in line waiting to buy the next pack.

The tobacco tax doesn't address broader state funding problems, and could be seen as an election-year gimmick. Delaying or reversing the unnecessary tax cuts might be a better solution.

State Rep. John Stewart (R-Plymouth Township) says the votes to pass the cigarette tax are there, with the return of State Rep. Laura Toy (R-Livonia) and Dearborn Republican Dean Woronchak, both of whom missed last week's vote.

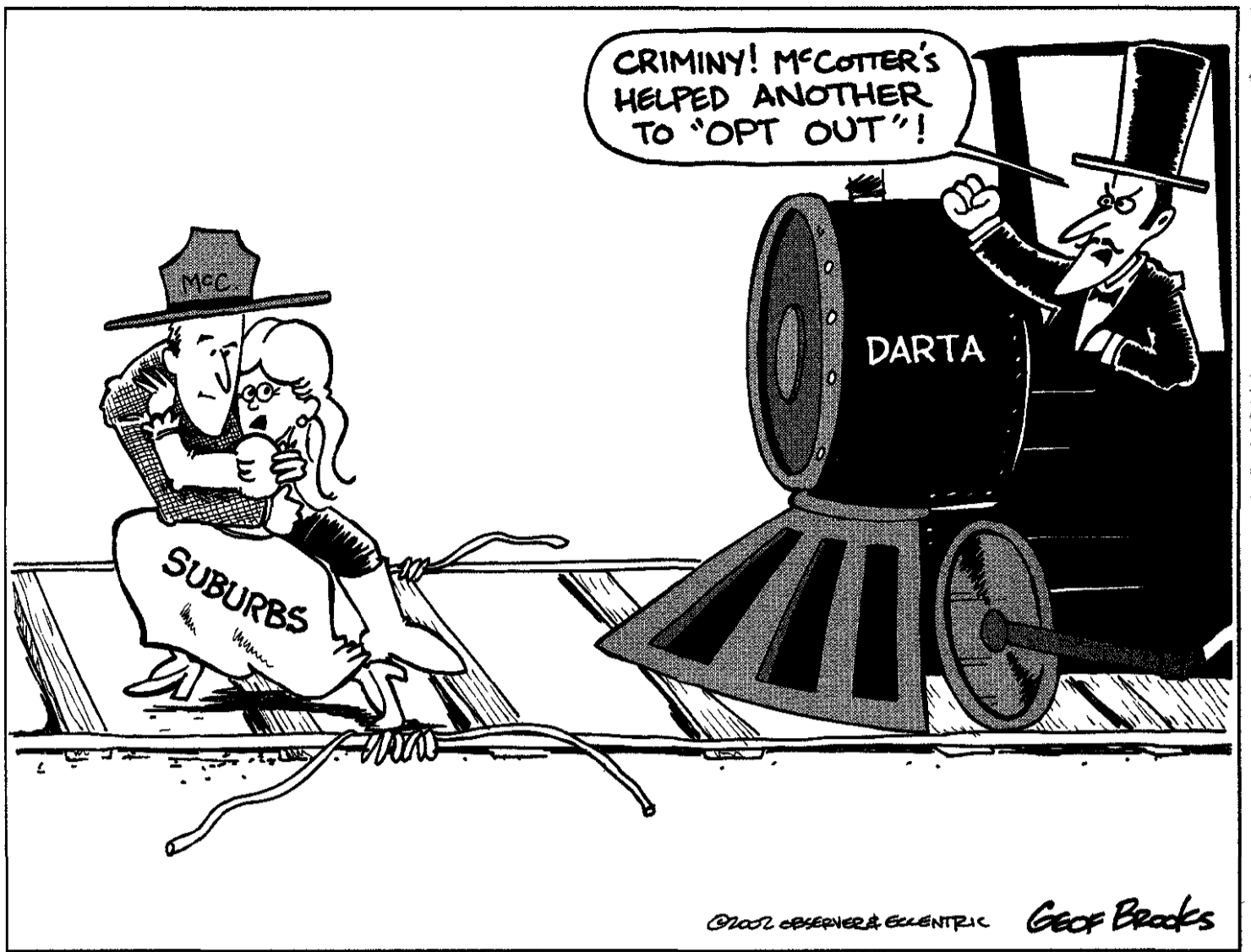
No matter who's in the room, legislators have a daunting task in front of them.

Gov. John Engler has reportedly told the legislature they can plan on staying until the deal is done on the cigarette tax.

The election-year game-playing should stop.

With a \$350 million budget deficit looming, all bets ought to be on the table. It shouldn't take a threat by the governor to get legislators to do what they were sent to Lansing to do.

■ Events are sham

In the Introduction to his book, *What Your Doctor May Not Tell You About Breast Cancer* (copyright 2002), John R. Lee, M.D. says it all: "Your risk of surviving malignant breast cancer is just about the same as it was 50 years ago — one in three. In other words, despite billions of dollars in research and hugely expensive and risky treatments, the conventional medical approach to breast cancer isn't working, and talk of prevention is virtually nonexistent."

We desperately need to focus on learning more about the causes of cancer. Ionizing radiation is the only proven cause of breast cancer. Exposure to low levels of radiation can build up in the body and do harm. Women need to be mindful of their exposure to radiation, especially in the form of mammograms, which are so vehemently pushed on us in this society.

And what about chemicals in our environment, such as pesticides and herbicides? An estimated 75,000 chemicals are in commercial use today, two-thirds of which have never been tested for carcinogenicity. Meanwhile, production of these chemicals continues to rise at a rate of 3.3 percent per year. Approximately 11,000 different organochlorine compounds have been released into our environment in the form of insecticides, solvents, plastics, dioxin, and other substances. Organochlorines have frequently been associated with cancer. These chemicals tend to linger in the environment and accumulate in our bodies. A life-long exposure to small amounts of carcinogens adds up, and we're just now beginning to realize the toxic impact of these exposures.

Before you support a fund-raising event, ask where the money is going. This means not only how much of the money is going to the cause, but also what programs are being supported. Don't let corporations and wealthy charities exploit your concerns and build massive public relations campaigns while you and your loved ones foot the bill. Until these events begin focusing on education and prevention, rather than a "cure," I will continue to refuse to support them. My hope is that we can begin to work together to support only causes that will benefit us, and not the sponsoring corporations. I also encourage Canton officials to do their research and reconsider supporting such events in the future.

Forget charter schools facts when ideology is involved

A lot of important things are getting lost in all the legislative arm waving and finger-pointing now going on over the state's budget crisis. Among them are common sense, a sense of common purpose and reliance on facts (rather than ideology) as guides to sound public policy.

Also getting swamped are actual matters of substance including important issues having to do with charter schools (also called "public school academies") in Michigan. Both touted (by those who believe they represent a non governmental competitive spur to the public K-12 system) and reviled (by those who believe they represent a systematic assault on public education), charter schools have been around for eight years. Presently capped by the legislature at 189 institutions, charter schools now enroll nearly 60,000 students.

Last year, the legislature established a commission "to conduct a complete and objective review of all aspects of public school academies in Michigan." Chaired by MSU President Peter McPherson, the eight-member commission issued its report in May. Essentially, it called for creating 250 new schools by 2017, together with improvements in oversight and accountability for charter school operators.

The commission's report made small headlines before being overtaken by more sensational news. Word from Lansing is that the legislature, if it ever gets around to thinking about things other than budget deficits, is likely to follow along and lift the cap.

Earlier this month, Gary Miron and Christopher Nelson, researchers at Western Michigan University's Evaluation Center, published in the Detroit Free Press their own findings based on four years of research into charter schools in Michigan, Pennsylvania, Illinois and Connecticut. They concluded charter schools have a mixed record in reaching their objectives of increasing student achievement, leveraging improvement in public schools and satisfying customers (i.e. parents).

Charter school students, parents and teachers are generally satisfied with their school's curriculum and instruction.

Many charter schools are provoking improvements in public schools as they compete for student enrollments.

Michigan charter schools, however, have shown smaller gains and larger losses in student achievement than public schools.

Although many charter schools in Michigan are located in poor urban areas, they tend to enroll lower concentrations of at risk students than neighboring public schools.

Charter schools are supposed to deliver good education at lower cost than public schools, but they tend to receive and spend more than comparable public schools. "Over time, the proportion of spending on instruction in charter schools has drifted downward relative to spending on administration."

Overall, Miron and Nelson concluded that Michigan charter schools "often produce weaker outcomes at greater cost than non charter schools."

I talked about this with Tom Watkins, the State Superintendent of Education, about all this last weekend. Watkins served on the McPherson Commission but did not concur with its findings, especially on increasing the cap on charter schools to 250 by 2017 and doing another study about outcomes.

"This puts the cart before the horse," says Watkins. "It makes no sense to start a whole lot of new charter schools and then do a study to figure out whether they work the way they're supposed to. Acting now would let a term-limited governor and legislature lock in public policy on charter schools for the next 15 years. That's a bad way to do things."

In this, as in many other things subject to flows of cash from the government, it's instructive to follow the money trail. In the case of charter schools, the universities that authorize charters and oversee performance (mainly Central Michigan and Grand Valley State Universities) get 3 percent of the \$8,700 the state pays per enrolled student, which comes to a tidy \$12 million. With this money, the universities employ around 100 staffers to oversee educational performance of the 60,000 odd charter school students, while the state Department of Education employs some 300 people to do the same job for 1.7 million public school students.

Forget the facts. With Gov. Engler and the Republican majority in both houses of the legislature ideologically committed to charter schools, you can confidently expect a lot more of them over the coming years.

Network program set to highlight accomplishments of Plymouth's Russell Kirk

By the time he died at age 75 he had traveled the world over, written over 30 books (including the internationally acclaimed study *The Conservative Mind*), served as an unofficial advisor to Presidents Nixon and Reagan and met many major figures within the world of journalism, literature and politics.

Kirk played a major role in establishing conservatism as a respectable cultural mindset in post World War II America, and numbered science fiction writer Ray Bradbury and poet T.S. Eliot among his many admirers. He was a nationally known columnist on literature and world affairs, a social critic, lecturer, short story writer, historian, expert on American education, Christian apologist and one of the founding contributors to the conservative magazine *National Review*.

In recognition of his accomplishments, CSPAN will devote the June 30 installment of its ongoing "American Writers" series to profile Kirk, as well as his longtime friend and comrade-in-arms within the conservative movement, William F. Buckley Jr. The month-end program will broadcast live from Kirk's longtime home in Mecosta, Michigan from 3-5 p.m. Commentary upon the distinguished Plymouthite's accomplishment will be provided by his son Wilfred McClay and Kirk's widow, Annette. The program will be rebroadcast on July 5 at 8 p.m.

Kirk's legacy is being further honored by a new exhibit being mounted at the Plymouth Historical Museum, featuring various books, diplomas and other artifacts lent to the museum by Annette Kirk — including a framed facsimile of the Presidential Citizen's Medal awarded to Kirk by Ronald Reagan in 1989. The Plymouth District Library has also erected an attractive display featuring Kirk's many books and newspaper articles related to his accomplishment, in recognition of the CSPAN program.

Born and raised in Plymouth's Old Village, Kirk was shy and bookish as a boy, given to long walks and talks with his grandfather, Frank Pierce, a community leader in the city's North End. Kirk's family lived in a millhouse overlooking Wilcox Lake, and Russell attended Starkweather School where he performed well academically.

He went on to attend Plymouth High School where at age 17 he entered and won a national essay writing contest sponsored by *Scholastic Magazine*. This essay, "Mementos" was written under the guidance of one of his favorite teachers, Edna Allen, and became Kirk's first piece of published writing.

In high school he also captained the debate team, which scored numerous wins throughout the state thanks in large part to his leadership and strong skills as a well-prepared debater. Kirk graduated with Plymouth High School's Class of 1936.

Kirk left Plymouth in 1942, after entering the service during World War II. In time he became the only American to earn the degree of Doctor of Letters from St. Andrews University in Scotland. Kirk never forgot his Plymouth roots, though, returning periodically to visit friends. He attended his high school's 50th class reunion in 1986, and two years later delivered a message titled, "The Christian Imagination of T.S. Eliot" at the First United Methodist Church of Plymouth.

Upon his death, he was eulogized at memorial services at St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York and the National Cathedral in Washington, D.C. The full story of Kirk's life is recounted in his lively memoir, *The Sword of Imagination*, recently reissued in a paperback edition by Eerdmans Publishing Co.

Kirk's best-known work, *The Conservative Mind*, a history of ideas originally published in 1953, will be the focus of the CSPAN broadcast. The essence of this work is captured in words that appear near its conclusion: "The twentieth-century conservative is concerned, first of all, for the regeneration of spirit and character with the perennial problem of the inner order of the soul, the restoration of the ethical understanding and the religious sanction upon which any life worth living is founded." This, Kirk wrote, is conservatism at its highest: not an ethic of getting and spending or the elevation of any ideology as a cure-all for all the ills to which human flesh is heir.

The Russell Kirk Center in Mecosta carries on Kirk's work, providing the facilities for graduate students on fellowships to study and write their theses in the unhurried quiet of Kirk's extensive private library. Activities at the Kirk Center are overseen by Annette Kirk. (A champion of excellence in education in her own right, she was recently appointed to the Laura Bush Foundation for America's Libraries.)

Annette's accomplishments were a source of great pride to her husband, and Plymouth has reason to be proud of Russell Kirk, who came a long way from the largely vanished small town world of that humble bungalow beside the railroad tracks.

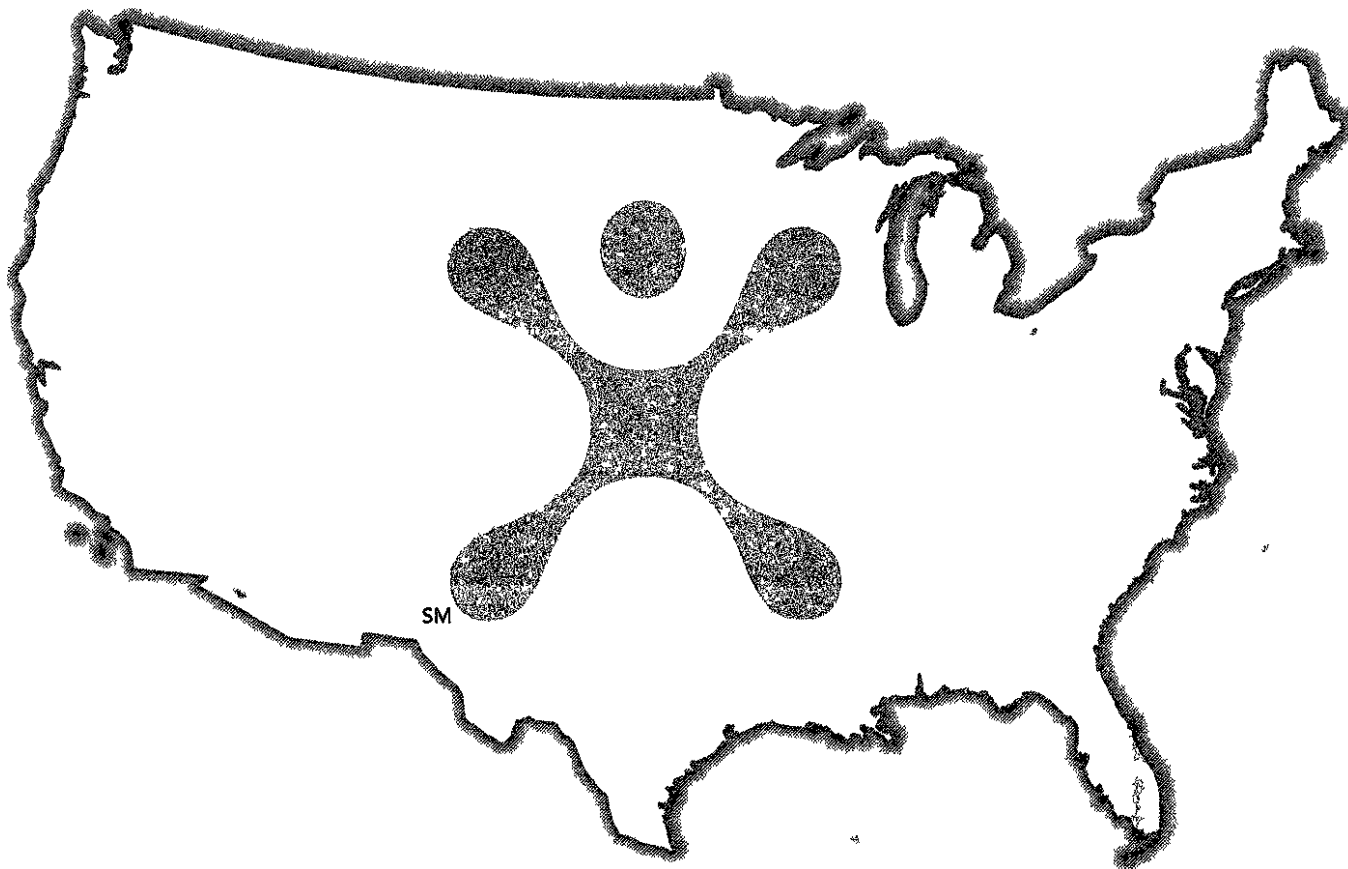

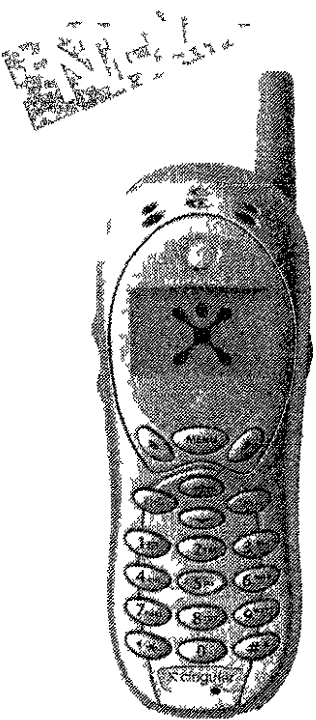

Violinist is happy about playing with DSO

It's been quite a whirlwind for Elayna Duitman since returning to America from Holland in August. After playing with the Phoenix Symphony Orchestra for just six months, she secured a chair in the second violin section of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra.

At age 26, the Canton musician already has earned a degree at the New England Conservatory of Music in Boston, lived and studied abroad — and is now performing under the direction of Neeme Jarvi.

"May 6 was our last concert with Jarvi," said Duitman. "He's a fabulous conductor. We did Beethoven's *Missa Solemnis* and he was so clear."

Landing the position wasn't as easy as playing with the internationally-known conductor. After reading an ad in the International Musician in January, Duitman spent the next few weeks preparing for the DSO audition. More than six weeks after performing her first concert with the DSO, Duitman still finds it incredible that she was chosen over nearly 100 applicants.

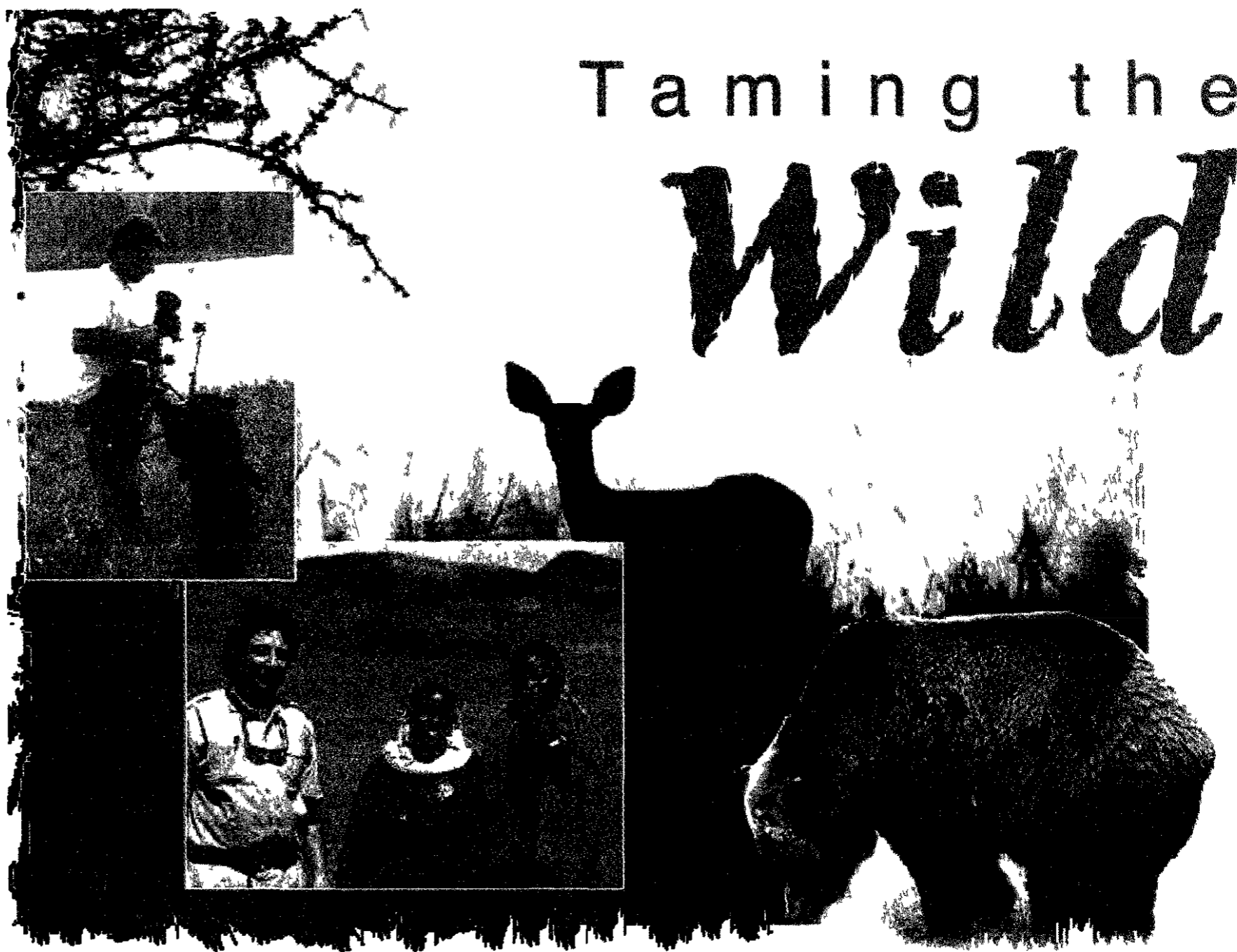
On board: Elayna Duitman is the newest member of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra.

"I was really happy when they told me I got the position," said Duitman. "There were three rounds during the four days of auditions. I was the only finalist left but that didn't mean I got the job. Music director Neeme Jarvi still had to hear me. He can say this isn't up to my standards."

But Duitman was and she partly credits her early training for the success. "At age four my parents found a good violin teacher so they decided it would be violin," said Duitman who was born in Florida and moved to Iowa at age 9. "My three-year-old sister and I began Suzuki. It's a great method because it teaches kids to use their ears and to learn everything by heart. I didn't learn to read music until about 7. You do it in a group and it's more fun and there are games. To start really young is a bonus. The earlier you start the better because it's harder to catch up."

By high school, Duitman was "pretty serious" about music, forgoing any of her thoughts about becoming an astronaut, doctor or ballerina. In her senior year at the New England Conservatory of Music, life would take a turn though. It was then she met husband-to-be, Zergen Vehage, while per-

Filmmaker leaves documentaries for movie made in Michigan

Jim Jabara doesn't seem to mind leaving behind the elephants in Sri Lanka and panthers in Tanzania for the chance to bring a heart-warming story with a message to the screen. The filmmaker traveled all over the world making documentaries for National Geographic, PBS and the Animal Planet. Now he's back home in Michigan to begin shooting a film about a little boy with cerebral palsy.

Jabara's already put in plenty of leg work scouting locations in Plymouth, Brighton and surrounding areas in order to make the movie tentatively titled *Discovery on Blackbird Island* after a book by Johnnie Tutel. Securing rights to the story, writing a script and finding investors are just a few of the tasks needed to lay the groundwork before filming begins in mid-July.

"I think you can make a good film anywhere but it's hard in Michigan to pitch people," said Jabara.

whose public service announcement for Michigan's loon license plate can be seen locally. Banks don't have good feelings about movies. It's a foreign subject to them."

But Jabara isn't about to give up on the project featuring a heroic type character confined to a wheelchair. Jabara and wife Josephine believe in the film. Since founding Our Small Planet Films and Multimedia in 1991, they've produced award-winning movies around the world. It's time to tell a story with role models who set a good example for children. Jamie, the youngest of their three children, has cerebral palsy and is a hero to them.

Film plot

It's about these kids discovering cats and dogs who were put there by a person working with an organization involved with stealing animals to sell them to laboratories, said Jabara. Through a series of clues they crack a pet theft ring. It's all about animal welfare and what Johnnie can't do but can do. There's not too many films where a kid with a disability can be a hero.

There are really two reasons for making it, added Josephine, vice president of United Cerebral Palsy Michigan. "There's a lack of movies that don't contain foul language and bad role models. I'm active in schools and the parents complain about it all the

time, and second, that you're a kid whether you have a disability or not."

"There are 500,000 people with cerebral palsy in the U.S. right now. We wanted to make a family feature film but it's been difficult to find someone with a disability, ages 11 to 14, with acting experience."

They're still looking for a child to fill the role regardless of acting credentials. Age is critical, the younger the better, because

Jabara would eventually like to turn all four of Tutel's books into films.

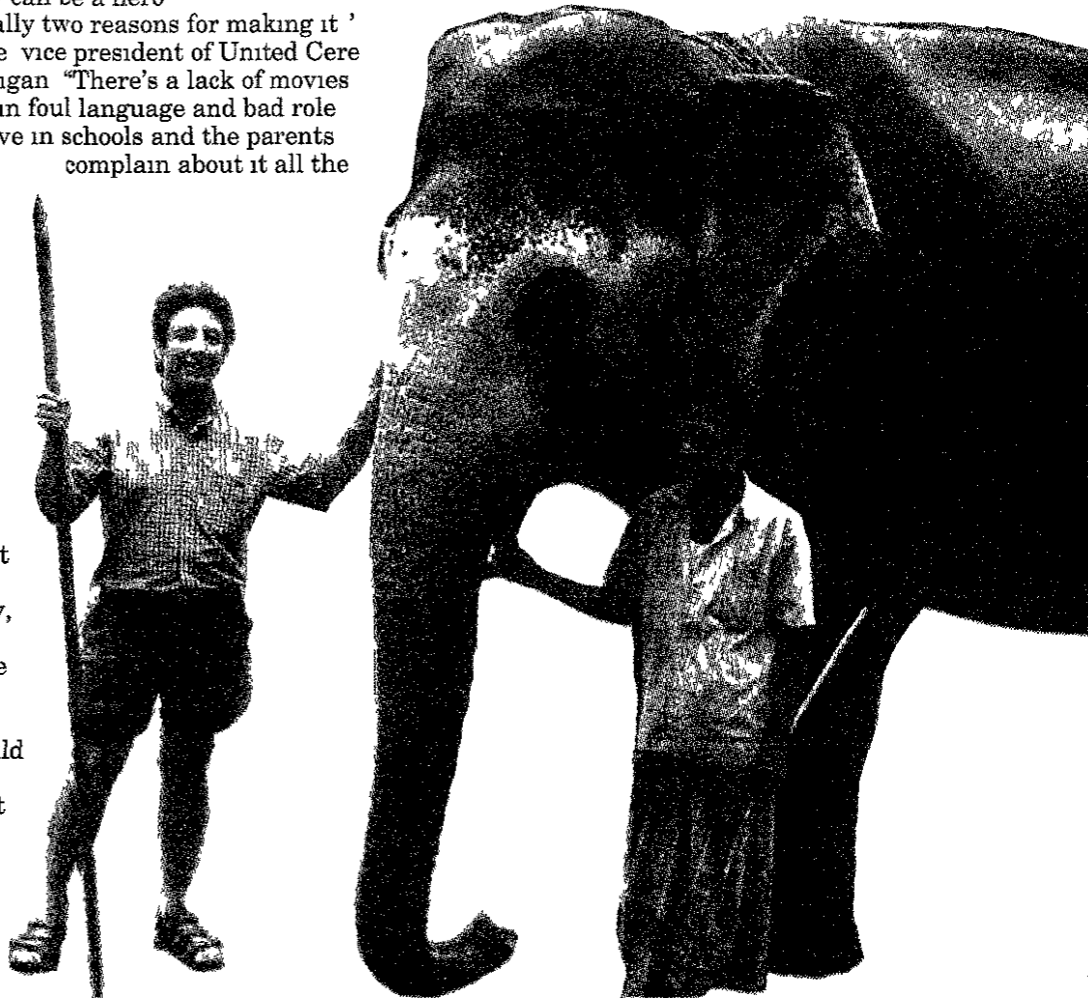
"We have someone in mind but we'd still like to find out if there's anyone with a disability with acting experience or a hidden talent to send in an audition tape," said Jabara.

Previous projects

Making this film may be the biggest challenge in Jabara's career so far, one he never envisioned while making videos of his band while a student at the old Plymouth High School on Main Street. In fact, it wasn't until after receiving a degree in environmental education 25 years ago that Jabara decided to go into television production.

From there it was on to filming *The Sloth Bear* for international distribution in the series *Wild Horizons*, *Asian Elephants Wanted Alive* and *Florida Panther* co-produced with Living Planet, for the Endangered series. Along the way he met Josephine at a television conference in Washing-

The notes for the Stratford production of Shakespeare's *All's Well That Ends Well* call the comedy one of the Bard's "problem plays."

The problem is that it's hard for playgoers, especially modern playgoers, to accept the play's basic premise. The play has at its center a strong female lead who makes decisions that seem a bit incomprehensible.

The pleasures in this Stratford production are in the small gestures and rich use of language as performed by a fine cast of Shakespearean actors.

Helena is the orphan daughter of a physician. She has come under the patronage of a widowed countess whose husband was treated by the physician.

Helena falls in love with the countess' handsome but arrogant and snobbish son.

When she cures an ailing king, she asks the king to force the young man to marry her. Instead the young count runs off to war and she sets out to trick him into marriage.

Ignore the plot and concentrate on the acting.

The great William Hutt plays the ailing king. Hutt has the

remarkable facility for speaking Shakespeare's language as if it were his normal speech. He also has a wonderful sense of timing and gesture. He finds the humor where others would miss it.

Domini Blythe is also at home with Shakespeare's language. Her countess is warm and sympathetic. Even the most difficult passages become comprehensible.

Lucy Peacock is also at ease with Shakespearean language though she seems to play the central role of Helena a bit too stiffly. Her many long speeches get us no closer to understanding why Helena stalks after an impudent boy.

Benedict Campbell handles the low humor of the jester Lavatch skillfully, though some of the word play has lost its sting. Tim MacDonald has fun as the bragging and posturing Parolles, who is finally revealed as a coward. Sara Topham is

attractive and blithe as the young maid seduced by the cadish count.

Richard Monette's direction is deft and capable. The comic encounter to unmask Parolles is especially well done.

Whatever Shakespeare might have been saying about class differences becomes muddled in the plot.

All's Well runs through Aug. 31 at the Festival Theatre.

The Scarlet Pimpernel

Class differences are at the heart of Beverley Cross' stage version of Baroness Orczy's popular melodrama *The Scarlet Pimpernel*.

This production is part comedy, part swashbuckler.

Sir Percy Blakeney, the foppish lover of drink, games and theater, is secretly the dashing Scarlet Pimpernel, who leads a merry band of Englishmen dedicated to saving the necks of French aristocrats from the guillotine of the French Revolution. His name is taken from the small red flower he wears as his calling card.

Sir Percy has recently married a French actress, Marguerite, who has Republican sympathies and may or may not be in league with the revolutionaries.

Director Dennis Garnhum keeps the action moving smoothly back and forth from France to England. The clever mechanics of the set are a show in themselves on the Avon stage. The frame for the guillotine becomes a rocking ship, a grubby tavern and a count's ballroom.

Peter Donaldson and real-life wife Sheila McCarthy play the Blakeney and his spouse. They also play the despicable Peachums in *Three Penny Opera*. They have a lot of fun with the roles, especially Donaldson who gets to dress up in a variety of disguises. He does not, however, fit the usual image of a dashing hero.

Peter Hutt is the villain, Chauven, special agent to Robespierre. He wears black and looks a lot like Richard Nixon with a five o'clock shadow. His performance is uneven and a bit confusing. Perhaps a little more "Smelly Whiplash" would carry the idea more effectively. Though the audience did hiss him.

The production has its moments but never rises to true heart-stopping melodrama.

The Scarlet Pimpernel continues at the Avon through Nov. 2. (For a look at the *Shaw Festival* see Sunday's paper.)

forming with an international youth symphony at a music festival in Germany. She ended up studying for two years in The Netherlands at the Koninklijk Conservatorium on a Netherlands American Foundation Fellowship, and worked one year with the Nederlands Filharmonisch Orkest because of the clarinetist from Holland. Married two years ago, they moved to Arizona in September so Duitman could take the position with the Phoenix Symphony Orchestra. If she'd stay there she wouldn't be playing through the summer and Duitman wanted to go on to bigger and better things.

From July 3 to 6 she'll be joining the DSO for its 10th anniversary *Salute to America* at Henry

Ford Museum & Greenfield Village in Dearborn then it's on to open the Meadow Brook Music Festival, the summer home of the orchestra, July 12 to Aug. 11, for three separate series: Family Fun Fridays focus on light classical music with fireworks finale. Sensational Saturday Classics feature guest artists performing traditional masterworks, and Sunday Summer Pops the music of Broadway and Hollywood.

She doesn't mind the intense rehearsal schedule necessary to carry off the four week season.

"It's really hard financially

working only nine months," said Duitman. The DSO is so incredibly good. They can pretty much pull anything together in a short time. I like Meadow Brook and it's classical. Most summer programs there is lots of pops.

But the highlight of Duitman's summer is sure to be returning to Interlochen Arts Camp for the DSO's residency. It was there in 1991-92 that she played under the direction of Jarvi in a side by side concert with members of the DSO. Now she'll be one of the professional musicians.

"That was fantastic. There

were around 3,000 students not all into music but all in the arts. I made a lot of friends.

"I'm looking forward to going back to Interlochen this time as a member of the DSO. There was a residency I remember. For students that was the highlight, the DSO coming for sectionals, coaching, and side by side concerts."

ton D.C. Jabara continued producing documentaries including *The Golden Jackal* for National Geographic, and various footage for television stations in Italy, Germany, The Netherlands, France, and Australia. Their second son, Jordan, was born in Africa while filming Kratts Creatures for PBS and TV Ontario. Their film about a Nepali village and its tigers is still on view at The Smithsonian Institute.

"Basically we're filmmakers finding a good idea and taking it to production," said Jabara, who this fall will teach film at Michigan State University where he lectures regularly. "We're looking for interested parties to help in all ways including

investors for our modest budget and creative marketing plan. In addition to looking for distributors we're planning to offer it as a fundraiser for non-profits.

"Making a feature film requires so many details. At the end of the day it's we're storytellers who hope to make a difference in the quality of life."

Rooted in soul

Local jazz singer influenced by her deep Motown roots

Kathy Kosins' still talks about meeting singer Jackie Wilson at 10 years old. It's one of the experiences she believes led to her choosing a career in music early on.

Kosins lived until age eight in Detroit where her father owned a clothing store. Harry Kosins dressed all of the Motown stars, first at his downtown location and

later in Southfield where Kathy spent her teen years. By the time she graduated from Southfield High School, Kosins was determined to sing her way to the top even though she'd only had two lessons in her life.

That was 28 years ago and even though she's not a household name, local audiences recognize the sound of Kosins' sultry voice from her two CDs. Kosins will perform selections from the latest

release, *Mood Swings*, Saturday, July 6, at the Comerica Tastefest in downtown Detroit, and July 12-13, at the Bird of Paradise in Ann Arbor.

"I can't say when I started singing," said Kosins, a Birmingham resident who didn't start out as a jazz singer. "It felt very natural to sing. I grew up with Motown and Isaac Hayes. I loved soul music before soul music was R & B."

"I think there's definitely a transition in the jazz scene today to think outside the box. People from my generation want to hear things familiar to them, not Gershwin from the 20s and 30s. They want to hear Janis Joplin, Pink Floyd, Jimi Hendrix."

Hendrix's *Foxy Lady* is one of the cuts Kosins gives her take on. Released in February after it was recorded in Ann Arbor and Chicago, *Mood Swings* features nearly all originals by Kosins plus the Hendrix tune.

"I started auditioning in my early 20s for top 40 bands, playing six nights a week with bar bands," said Kosins. "I always wanted to do songs like the record. I was the rebel who would always get fired. I was always interested in taking it in a new artistic direction."

Kosins eventually did move in a new direction. In the mid 1980s she began writing commercials for Cadillac and Ford and doing weekend band work until heading out to Los Angeles where she kept an apartment. It was destroyed in the 1994 earthquake and she returned to Birmingham where she's lived since the early 1970s.

Kosins had gotten of taste of writing — and performing soon took a back burner. She released her first CD *All in a Dream's Work*, in 1995 on Schoolkids. Recorded in New York, the album set the tone

for *Mood Swings* on Chiaroscuro. "I really enjoyed song writing and connected with a woman April Lang, who I met in New York. April had a deep love for jazz. We ended up writing nine originals together and then I did a demo on my own so I could pitch the songs."

Kosins opens a drawer filled with tapes she's cut of her original songs. It's obvious she's a prolific composer as well as an artist upon looking at the paintings covering the walls of her home. As with her singing, she's self-taught, the acrylic abstracts created during painting sessions with an independent group at the Birmingham Bloomfield Art Center.

The question is where does she find the time. Kosins spends six-eight hours a day calling universities and colleges all over the country trying to line up work. Next year's academic tour includes giving seminars and performing in jazz festivals in Indiana, Kentucky, Arkansas, West Virginia, Washington and Mississippi. She's passing on what she knows about "Hustling the Gig" and per-

forming. "I work hard," said Kosins. "This is a business. I tell them I'm in sales. I'm a one woman army for getting gigs for myself."

And she's "not content to be locally known." While she enjoyed singing at the Ford Detroit International Jazz Festival and The Community House Jazzfest in Birmingham last year and Clarkston Cafe last week, Kosins' enthusiasm for the business is most evident when talking about playing the Blue Note in New York and Jazz Bakery in Los Angeles. She now is in the midst of

booking a European tour for next summer.

"After 28 years in the business I feel like it's starting to snowball," said Kosins. "I have ideas for the next two completely different albums. I have a lot of natural soul in my voice. I'm just going to continue doing what I'm doing. Being in the business doesn't come without frustration and rejection but the rewards are very satisfying."

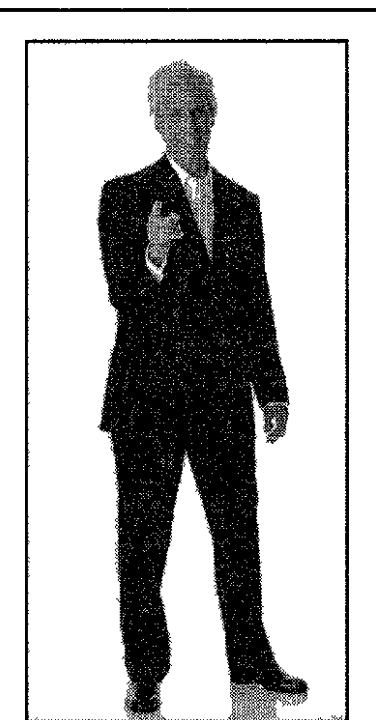

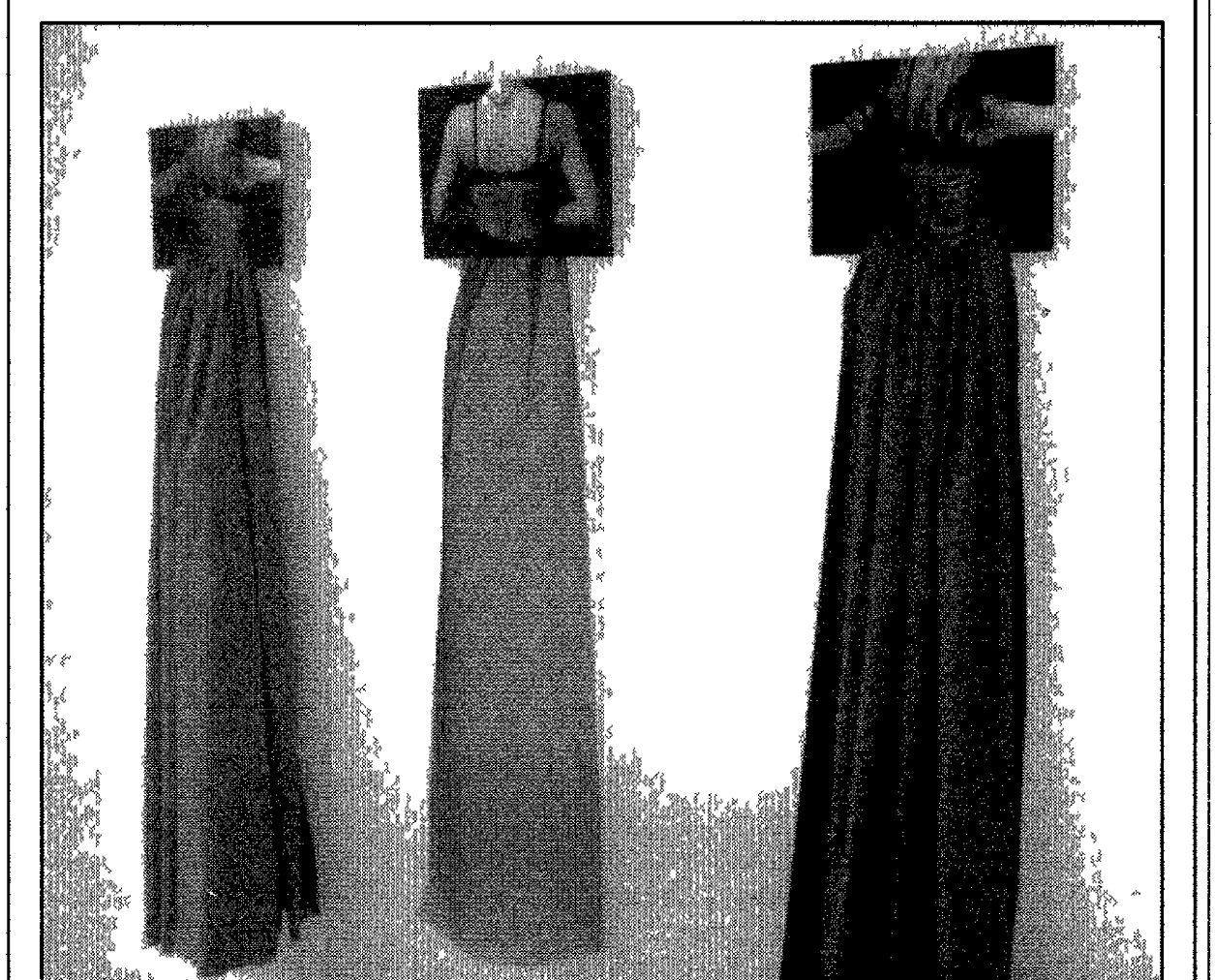

Heaven by David Bowie
Throughout his 35-year recording career, David Bowie has never stagnated, consistently absorbing new ideas. He continues that tradition with *Heaven*, his latest release.

On *Sunday*, the opening song on the disc, the 55-year old's theatrical baritone is as powerful as ever. Subtle electronics and strange almost mournful chords slowly build to a dramatic drum beat in the final minute of the song. It's exhilarating but very serious sounding as are most of the songs on *Heaven*.

Bowie creates wonderful and sophisticated sound textures with his string arrangements, which are dark and beautiful.

The songwriting is profoundly modern on the sublime elegant love song *I Would Be Your Slave*, reminding listeners that Bowie is a poet. The lyrics are simple, yet, evocative.

Bowie remains a master at this combination hipness and artistic sensibility.

The Osbourne Family Album by Various Artists

Fans of the MTV reality series *The Osbournes*—who just can't seem to get enough of heavy metal madman Ozzy Osbourne and his dysfunctional family—will love *The Osbourne Family Album*. This eclectic collection features Ozzy covers and favorite songs by other artists, picked by America's new favorite family.

The disc opens with a Las Vegas-style cover of Ozzy's anthem *Crazy Train* by Pat Boone, the family's former next-door neighbor. But the strangest offering is daughter Kelly's met-

aled-up cover of Madonna's *Papa Don't Preach*, which surely exists because daddy is rich and powerful enough to insist that it be so. *System of a Down* offers a nice hyperspeed cover of Black Sabbath's *Snowblind*, and Ozzy's wife, Sharon, picked Eric Clapton's *Wonderful Tonight* because it reminded her of the couple's days when they were dating.

Weaving all this together are snippets of the kind of virtually incoherent, incomprehensible babble the Osbournes spewed each week on their show including the Godfather of Heavy Metal urging kids not to drink or do drugs.

While entertaining at times, the disc wanders aimlessly and lacks focus. An Internet chat room would be a better forum for members of the Osbourne clan to list their favorite songs and why they like them.

Bramble Rose by Tift Merritt

Expectations were high for Tift Merritt's debut album, mostly based on some mesmerizing live performances in front of a whole bunch of music business types. So, let's crawl out on a limb here. There isn't going to be a better debut album this year. Not just in the rather undefinable Americana alt country, whatever you wanna call it genre—but in any genre. *Bramble Rose* is an assured release by a star in the making, recorded the old-fashioned way—live in the studio.

The single, *Virginia, No One Can Warn You*, is an irresistibly catchy confection that would be playing on all car radios this summer in a more perfect world. Merritt's phrasing at times sounds a little like Lucinda Williams, her breathy ache,

especially on *Are You Still in Love With Me?* recalls Emmylou Harris, but mostly she sounds just like Tift Merritt, which is a mighty darn good thing.

Instant Vintage by Raphael Saadiq

Although Raphael Saadiq is making his album debut with *Instant Vintage*, he's hardly a novice. The former lead singer of the '80s R&B group Tony! Toni! Tone! was more recently a member of the short-lived trio Lucy Pearl, and is also a popular producer.

Saadiq borrows from all those experiences to create *Instant Vintage*, a fabulous 19-track album of gospel, blues and funk.

During his days with Tony! Toni! Tone!, violins, organic guitars, heavy drums and a deep bass were at the center of the group's musical arrangements. He continues that tradition on tunes such as *Doing What I Can*, a hip-hop-flavored cut, and *Body Parts*—very Curtis Mayfield orchestra soul. The experimental funk he dabbled in with Lucy Pearl is evident on the tracks *You're the One I Like*, featuring prickly, rockabilly guitars, and *Faithful*, a funky dance gem dedicated to two friends who inspired Saadiq to be more faithful to his mate. He also showcases blues and gospel on *Charlie Ray* and *Tick Tock*.

For the past 20 years, guitarist Bill Frisell has seamlessly woven various American musical traditions into a unified and unique voice.

His new CD, *The Willies*, is a delightful meditation on bluegrass and country music themes. Frisell's musical palette is colorful and rich, yet serenely simple. Tape loops and other electronics subtly augment his superb technique.

The Willies opens with the traditional *Sittin' on Top of the World*. For those familiar with the tune, it will be hard not to fill in the lyrics. But Frisell's playing is narrative in itself, captivating and utterly entertaining.

He is joined on the disc by guitarist-banjo player Danny Barnes and bassist Keith Lowe. Together they create an ethereal soundscape that sparkles.

Directions in Music Live at Massey Hall by Herbie Hancock, Michael Brecker, Roy Hargrove

Pianist Herbie Hancock, tenor saxophonist Michael Brecker and trumpeter Roy Hargrove honored two of their jazz ancestors, Miles Davis and John Coltrane, in an October 2001 concert in Toronto.

The concert has now been released as *Directions in Music Live at Massey Hall*, a remark-

able new disc. Their intention in performing this celebratory concert was not to merely mimic the work of Davis and Coltrane but as Hancock put it, "take the very pieces they were associated with and put our own spin on it."

Directions in Music incorporates Davis and Coltrane compositions with original works by Hancock, Brecker and Hargrove. The new compositions are written and performed with an eye toward the styles of the two masters. Brecker's *D Trane* captures the aggressive attack and unusual choral ideas characteristic of Coltrane's later period. But it's the group's interpretation of the classic Coltrane ballad *Naima*, featuring a blistering solo by Brecker, that is the highlight of the disc.

Jazz singer Nneena Freelon

pays tribute to Stevie Wonder, one of her greatest influences, on the new CD *Tales of Wonder*. Freelon gives 12 of Wonder's songs a fresh approach, while retaining their integrity.

Her success lies in the arrangements, where she plays the song in a different key or uses a different jazz style. Add to that her creamy, full-bodied vocals, and the songs sound like you're hearing them for the first time.

Freelon makes this vocal tribute a Wonderful experience. She gives his contemporary standard *Lately* a bossa nova arrangement with a midtempo pace. She also uses that arrangement for *Send One Your Love*, though the pace is much slower with harmonica accents, just like Wonder did originally. And his classic love ballad *My Cherie Amour* has a smooth jazz buffering, with bass and piano driving the melody.

Pizza, with style

California Pizza Kitchen serves up gourmet fare in new Livonia location

What happens when two defense lawyers, who are also pals, decide to get out of the courtroom and into the kitchen?

In the case of Larry Flax and Rick Rosenfield the verdict was a happy one. In 1985 the pair founded a chain of eateries called California Pizza Kitchen.

Two months ago, they opened a restaurant at Laurel Park Place in Livonia, their 132nd location.

'Our restaurants are great for families, said Flax, co-owner of California Pizza Kitchen, who described the atmosphere as casual with an emphasis on a more upscale setting. CPK was the first major restaurant chain to initiate a smoke-free policy.

The eatery appeals to a broad range of people. It is not unusual to see three and four generations of families dining together.

So, yes — bring the kids. 'They (kids) are just as important to us as customers as the parents,' Flax said. The restaurant has a food bar where youngsters love to sit and watch the

food preparation. The menu features a variety of appetizers, soups, salads, more than two dozen pizzas, pastas and sandwiches.

Sesame Ginger Chicken Dumplings, Tuscan Hummus, a Spinach Artichoke Dip and three varieties of Tortilla Spring Rolls highlight the appetizer choices.

'The first barbecued chicken pizza was created in our restaurant,' said Flax.

It's listed as The Original BBQ Chicken on the menu, and ranks as the chain's most popular pizza. Ingredients include barbecue sauce, smoked Gouda and

Mozzarella cheeses, barbecued chicken, sliced red onions and cilantro.

Other pizza possibilities run the gamut from the Traditional Cheese to a Vegetarian with Japanese Eggplant, Philly Cheesesteak, Hawaiian, Mushroom Pepperoni Sausage and the Grilled Garlic Shrimp.

The Tandoori Chicken pizza, topped with pieces of chicken marinated in Indian spices and decorated with splashes of zucchini, yellow squash and a spicy tomato-yogurt curry, is served with a side of mango chutney. Flax confesses that he is par-

tial to the BLT pizza.

However, he said, the Jamaican Jerk Chicken is "running a close second." This pizza, topped with spiced chicken breast, a spicy sweet Caribbean sauce, Mozzarella Cheese, smoked bacon, onions, roasted red and yellow peppers, and scallions is one of the newest items on the menu.

Customers who prefer an Italian-style, thin crisp pizza have three options. Upon request, pizzas can be prepared with honey-wheat dough.

When patrons can't decide whether to try the Potato Leek, Sedona White Corn Tortilla or the Dakota Smashed Pea & Barley soup, a great alternative is to order the Two in a Bowl.

A combination of any two soups is served side by side in the same bowl.

Pasta lover selections include at least a dozen choices.

Fettuccine with Garlic Cream Sauce, Broccoli/Sun-dried Tomato Fusilli and Bolognese Penne are just a few.

Recently, Cherie Lyon and her friend, Amy Childs met for dinner at California Pizza Kitchen.

'Everything was delicious,' said Lyon of Westland, who sampled several menu items.

One of her favorites was The Original BBQ Chicken pizza.

She also tried the Oriental Chicken salad.

It's mixed with shredded lettuce and crispy angel hair, tossed with a spicy sweet-and-sour sesame dressing, julienne carrots, scallions and basil, and then topped with strips of grilled chicken.

Most of the salads are available as a half order.

Lyon said that she usually doesn't care for spicy foods. However she liked the Tai Chicken pizza that is prepared with spicy peanut-ginger and sesame sauce.

'California Pizza Kitchen will be one of my favorite take out restaurants,' said Lyon, who works just minutes away at Valassis in Livonia.

Amy Childs of Westland, who is a teacher for the Wayne/Westland schools, also enjoyed "the great flavor of the combination of the chicken and the barbecue" on The Original pizza.

Both women described the Key Lime Pie as 'incredible.' Apple

Crisp, Caramel Fudge Pecan Cheesecake and Tiramisu also are featured as desserts.

Childs was impressed with the service. The wait staff, she said, seemed to be well informed about the menu choices.

'Training is everything,' said Flax, referring to his staff.

Prospective CPK employees are required to participate in classroom sessions.

The wait staff takes five written tests plus a final exam with 200 questions.

Cooks also require extensive testing.

A segment of their training includes preparation of eight pizzas (excluding bake time) within seven minutes.

'We don't rush. We really take our time before opening a restaurant,' said Flax.

Key elements to the success of the business, he said, are quality, value, service and cleanliness.

Be sure to use good paint on clean surface

Questions about exterior painting, in particular painting aluminum siding are frequent this time of year

My pat answer to just about any painting questions is 'Write a check.' Dad doesn't really like to paint but the savings are usually worth the bother

The coating on aluminum and some vinyl siding is in fact paint. The key to successful repainting is using good quality latex paint on an impeccably cleaned surface

A TSP (trisodium phosphate) solution and a power washer is best for cleaning siding. TSP chemically attacks the dirt and slightly etches the surface helping paint adhesion

Use extreme caution with the TSP, as it can be corrosive to the skin and eyes. Power wash after the TSP has a chance to work on the surface (about 15 minutes unless it begins to dry)

TSP promotes algae growth in lakes and streams. Dilute the rinse water as much as possible and try to avoid letting this get into storm drains

The siding should dry for at least a day before applying quality paint

There are many paints on the market. Be certain to stay with a good quality brand name product. Prime any spots where the aluminum shows with a primer recommended by the paint manufacturer for the paint you are using. Not all primers are con-

ductive to all paints

Start painting early before the heat of the day and when possible paint on the shady side of the building

Renting an airless spray gun might be tempting. Often, however, the preparation and cleanup involved with this tool offsets the benefits

When choosing your paint, keep in mind that generally lighter colors and shinier finishes will last longer

From a reader

In my recent column about finding a contractor I said "You have the right to get out of a contract within three business days, but money paid up front could be difficult to recover"

Mark R. Almas, a Livonia attorney and instructor of business law at Madonna University e-mailed me with the following:

"It is a common misconception that a person signing a contract has 'three days or five days' to cancel the contract. There is no automatic right of rescission of contract unless it comes under one of the narrow statutes that apply to the situation"

Such as the Home Solicitation Act, where contracts signed in the home under certain circumstances can be canceled if done so in writing and within three days of signing. This law was generally enacted to protect the elderly and unsuspecting of door-to-door salesmen that use high pressure sales tactics

Another rescission right is under federal mortgage laws that allow consumers to cancel mortgage documents usually associated with refinancing issues

"The practical aspect of all this is that your advice is wise before you give someone your money. Make sure it is what you want and the contract is understood by all parties"

Heart of the home

Kid-friendly kitchens make sense

Kids don't simply come home. They bring all their kid's stuff with them: backpacks, permission slips, class projects. Splat! They go on the tops of kitchen tables, chairs and counters, cluttering the inherent chaos of the room where we cook, eat

and gather

And, for younger children, well, the kitchen can be source of danger and trouble

Should we ban children from the heart of the home?

Certainly not, particularly because there are numerous ways to make the kitchen not only safe, but also friendly to younger generations

Kid-friendly kitchens — it's a wonderful idea. Kim Swan Fugaban, kitchen designer at KSI Kitchen and Bath Showrooms in Livonia

The key principles to consider are safety and access, she said

Lower height counters, for instance, allow children to comfortably reach over or sit at a counter. Lowered counters in a multi-level counter system prevent youngsters from coming into contact with a cooktop burner

Kid-friendly features foster children's interest in cooking and helping, too, said Linda Welch, a certified kitchen designer at NA Mans Kitchen & Bath Design Center in Canton

A low sink where children can wash hands or get a glass of water without assistance, for example, encourages independence and involvement in kitchen activities

It's like teaching them to read a book, teaching them to use the basic tools inside the kitchen," said Welch

Another easy and safe way to nurture self-sufficiency — a time saver for busy parents — is dedicated storage space for snacks that children are allowed to serve themselves

Although low-level deep drawers do serve the purpose, Welch recommends a cabinet with roll-out trays, one containing snacks and the other stocked with paper plates, napkins and other utensils

A lot of people will put a microwave under the counter for children to use, but you really have to look at the age of the child. A child needs to be old enough to use the appliance," said Welch. She said age 7 is typically appropriate for microwave use

"You have to really look at the child's maturity and it's always good to be there supervising them"

Another reason for the kid-friendly trend hinges on the concept of the kitchen as a natural gathering place, said Welch

"Our society is so busy and we're always doing something. But that doesn't mean we can't be with our kids while we're doing it"

With dedicated counter island seating for smaller, younger occupants, Mom can cook, surf the Internet or pay bills while her child does homework or draws a picture

But what about the not-so-pint-sized messes so frequently left by youngsters in the kitchen?

If you have three children, you give them three drawers," said Dawn Bluga, certified kitchen designer at Kitchen Master in downtown Farmington

That way, children have a destination for backpacks, art work and personal items, she said

"It's whether you have the space to give up for those items," said Bluga. It's a trade-off

But it's usually a fair trade-off for today's busy families, she said

We go to people's houses and see stacks and stacks of papers, and we ask what are you trying to accomplish, and they say 'Get rid of all this paper and get things organized'."

If you are a fan of heirloom plants, *Heirloom Flower Gardens Rediscovering and Designing with Classic Ornamentals* (Chelsea Green, \$24.95 soft) is another hit by author Jo Ann Gardner.

She explains that as new plants are developed (not always better) old varieties are tossed aside so over the years many of the old plants are removed from the market.

Now with this book, you can find all the information you'll need to grow them in your own garden. Gardner tells how to grow the plants, save seeds, propagate as well as design a garden for a specific theme (i.e., butterflies). Her "integrated landscape approach" assures that all elements of the garden work together.

She shares much historical information when describing the hundreds of plants, including 25 never before profiled. Sidebars feature crafts and recipes.

Look no further to find sources for plants, gardens to visit and plant societies and preservation organizations. Wow!

If you believe fragrance is an important part of gardening, *A Garden of Fragrance: Creating Gloriously Scented Gardens*, Suzy Bales (Regan Books, an imprint of HarperCollins, \$17.95 soft), is for you.

I love the chapter headings - the Come Closer Moonlighters Shaggy Dogs, Rogues, etc. They are so descriptive of what each section is about.

Take time to read and study this book and

If you believe fragrance is an important part of gardening, "A Garden of Fragrance: Creating Gloriously Scented Gardens," Suzy Bales (Regan Books, an imprint of HarperCollins, \$17.95, soft), is for you.

learn about Bales' personal garden, her thoughts and information about scent and the specific plants that grow well together with their particular fragrances. Lots to learn here and a pure delight.

Roses Nancy J. Ondra (A Taylor's Guide, Houghton Mifflin, \$23), explains how to select and grow roses, including hardy and everblooming plants.

Color photographs show many of the roses, followed by the encyclopedic section, which contains 380 of these beauties. Along with the descriptions we learn ideas of how to use each one in the landscape. Another excellent feature is the chart about common rose pests and disease, and how to control them. This is a completely revised and updated edition.

Former fashion designer Carolynne Roehm, who spoke at Goldner-Walsh this spring, is the author of several books. *At Home with Carolynne Roehm* (Broadway Books, \$60) follows the seasons as she shares her entertaining style.

The gorgeous photos only whet the appetite to learn more, try the recipes she shares, the flower arrangements and table settings.

For instance, for a floating picnic, a small dinner for two or a Thanksgiving feast, she

often goes to the garden for inspiration and ideas, mixing colors and styles with abandon. *A Passion for Flowers* (HarperCollins, \$60) also follows the seasons.

"Nothing lights up a room like flowers. I have always had a passion for them," Roehm says.

From tones of apricot roses and ranunculus arranged in a bowl to plants growing in clay pots for a meal in the garden, the arrangements seem "right."

On the way Roehm shares many tips such as buying pansy plants and cutting them herself. Many recipes for the arrangements are included, as are tips for conditioning the flowers and keeping them fresh.

Also from HarperCollins, Roehm's *Seasonal Notebooks* (\$25 each) focus on each season: *Spring, Summer, Fall* and *Winter*. All are spiral bound and are meant to be used for your personal observations and comments. Pockets in the front allow space for your own "keepers."

You'll find her thoughts on flowers and foods, gardening, and entertaining ideas. Sometimes one flower such as the hellebore is featured, another time a recipe is given. The innovative ideas this author shares will inspire us all.

I have written several columns pointing directly at the few unethical businesses that exist in the appliance repair industry. I know that these articles have helped consumers

that you live in is an appliance repair company that you can stop in for a learning visit. You can talk to someone in person, explain what's happening with the washer and get instructions on a few common things that go wrong and you can check out yourself.

For instance, if you complain that the agitator doesn't move back and forth but everything else works OK, then maybe the spline in the top of the agitator is stripped.

The technician will show you how to remove the agitator, hold it up to a light bulb and look inside to find the plastic teeth are stripped or worn out. You can go home, pull the agitator, check it out and buy a new or used one and fix it yourself.

What's wrong with saving \$100 on a service call and labor? Think of the self-satisfaction you get from doing such a simple thing.

Don't tell me you don't have the confidence to attempt these things, because I've spent a lifetime helping first-time do-it-yourselfers. There are many hundreds of fixes on appliances that you can do on your own, and most of these shops like to meet new customers like you.

Think of the customer who spends \$75 to fix the door on the clothes dryer. All he or she had to do was go visit a shop, buy a little door closure kit for \$5, pop it into the door and bingo! It's fixed.

Let's say the light bulb stays on in the refrigerator after you close the door. It doesn't take an engineer to figure out how to pop out the old switch and replace it. All you need is a little instruction and gumption and you've saved a lot of money.

If tools laugh at you when you pick them up, stay tuned.

You must know someone who can fix things and that is whom you should call. Ask what he or she would do in your position and whom they know.

I'm telling you that there is a neighbor, relative or friend who can direct you to someone who will help you with an appliance question.

At one time in this country there were several manufacturers who had toll free numbers that you could call and get technical help. Today in this profit-oriented world many of these same numbers end up charging a fee to your credit card for talking with a service technician. In the very neighborhood

Learn about reptiles before getting one as pet

ABOUT ANIMALS
A few years ago a teacher invited me to speak to her class of third graders about being a veterinarian. I consider it an absolutely priceless experience, watching the kids listen intently and then hearing their questions. Of course, they were far more interested in the jar with the heart full of heart worm than they were in me, but you take whatever attention you can get. Anyway, a few days later I received a lovely gift. Each child had written a report about my visit, and the teacher bound them up as a book for me, with art work by the students on the front and back covers. This remains one of my prized possessions.

The reports struck me because of the different styles, and the different facts. The number of dogs I own ranged from one to five. The time I went to school ranged from three to 12 years. And the spellings of my name showed me these youngsters would someday be Scrabble champions. One of my quotes, however, appeared absolutely perfectly exact in every report: "Snakes give me the willies!" I mean, honestly, how can they not? Forget any biblical or cultural bias, they ain't got no arms!!! Their tongues zip out of their mouths, and they crawl on their bellies in silence! Plus, just when you think they can't get creepier, they rub against a rock and shed their skin! (Uh oh - I'm getting the willies!)

Snakes as pets
Some people don't agree with my (and every other sane person's) assessment of snakes. They don't find them creepy

They think having a pet that doesn't blink makes everything good. One of these people is Mark Honas, reptile expert and radio host. Mark has had hundreds of these critters living in his house (yes, he has a house, ruining the image that every snake owner lives in his parents' basement), and finds them to be the best pets you can own. He believes they're so cool it rubs off on their owner (the same thing every Miata dealer tries to convince every middle-aged man entering his showroom). "An interest in exotic animals like reptiles (and snakes) usually leads to books and a great deal of reading about these critters, which leads to an interest in science," Honas said. "These kids will grow up to be scientists and cure cancer! See, snakes will cure cancer!" Creepy scientists, that is. Mostly I'm teasing snake owners. I don't personally like snakes, but they can be great

pets, especially if you do things right and know all that owning a critter like this involves. This knowledge gained ahead of time helps keep children aware of what they need to do, and keeps parents from freaking out. "If you want to own a reptile get a good book on the care and be sure you know what you're buying," Honas said. "An 18-inch baby albino Burmese python is cute now (yeah, right!) but in three years it will be over 15 feet long and close to 200 pounds. Learn before you buy." "Go to the local reptile shop and ask a million questions. The more you know the better. Plus, most pet shop owners will love to pass on their experience. A good Web site for reptile information is www.kingsnake.com. They have everything reptile." Herpers, people inclined toward reptilian pets, don't all agree on what pets to own. Some own the "hot," or venomous snakes. Most feel that owning a pet that could kill you might be a

mistake. Honas has three choices for starter snakes: a California King Snake, a corn snake, or a ball python, and recommends the purchase of captive bred snakes, as they will be the healthiest and the easiest to maintain. All three of these snakes can be expected to end up between 2 and 4 feet long. Remember, you will need to figure in the costs of keeping the snake, as well as just buying it. Those with weak stomachs may not want a freezer full of dead mice to be used as snake chow. Still, more and more people get into these pets all the time. "The reptile segment of the pet industry is one the fastest growing," Honas said. "There are currently over 28 million reptile pets. So be warned there may be a herper in your neighborhood!" So it's probable that of those kids I spoke to, a few of them have become herpers, keeping snakes or other reptilian creatures.

Oh well - can't save them all!

Take Home Message: Snakes may not be everybody's cup of tea, but anyone with an interest in them needs to do careful research before getting into the hobby. I mean, what if you get the whole setup, and then you find out they give you the willies?

Don't overdo when watering and feeding plants

Nana Rose loved her carnations. She saw great beauty in all growing things, and kept an enormous garden filled with stunning shrubs and flowers. But her carnations were her pride and joy - those and her roses. We brothers often would sit with her out in the back yard on a big steel swing with massively fluffy seat cushions and she would show us how to use just the right amount of water - not too much, not too little - to keep her flowers lovely. Our mom would break out in a rash when she stayed in the sun too long. So she became the houseplant person. When it came to the plants outside we learned from Nana Rose. With the house plants Mom was the expert.

Watch watering
Did you know that more plants - indoors or out - die from over-watering and over-fertilization than from any other cause? Roots left to soak in a pot of muddy water eventually will rot and cause your plant to suffocate. What we learned from mom was simple. Don't water a plant every day. The best way to find out if a plant needs water is to use your personal moisture meter - your finger. Stick your finger into the soil near the base of the plant. If the soil is moist about an inch beneath the surface, it doesn't need water. Here's another good tip: Never use fresh tap water to give your plants a drink. Fill your watering can and let it sit for a few days before you use it to water plants. Letting the tap water sit

allows it to warm to room temperature and gives chlorine time to dissipate. Cold water can send some plants into hibernation and others into shock. It is also important to water your plants thoroughly. Remember, the root ball of your plant will grow toward the water. If you water only the top of your pot, the roots will remain near the top and the root ball won't become large and strong. If you get the soil wet all the way to the bottom of the pot, that's where the plant's roots eventually will go. It is really important to pot indoor plants in containers that have a hole at the bottom. Drainage is essential to a plant's health.

Feeding
As do humans, plants need food as well as water. Once you have your watering routine down

pat, you will need to be sure that your plants are properly fed. Keep in mind that you should never fertilize a plant that is dry. Always water first, then fertilize. Chemical fertilizers can burn, so be careful about how much you use. Fish emulsion is the best. It stinks, but it is very hard to overdo it. Miracle-Gro is another safe fertilizing product when used according to instructions. It is really important to not fertilize during the winter or when a plant is dormant. Fertilizer can build up in the soil and become quite toxic. When you first bring home a plant from the nursery, be careful not to fertilize it right away. Most companies use slow release

fertilizer that will last for quite a while.

Beneficial
Plants - indoors or out - are attractive, but are beneficial in another important way. They give off oxygen and absorb carbon dioxide. We humans do just the opposite. We breathe in oxygen and expel carbon dioxide. Plants provide a fresh supply of air and absorb the dangerous gasses that we expel. How much more compatible could any two elements of nature be? Be careful. Many houseplants come from tropical climates where many poisonous plants grow. The houseplant is a good air purifier, but it could be quite poisonous. So it is wise to treat

houseplants as potentially harmful when it comes to children. Here's one that Mom taught us: When the leaf is brown the plant needs water. When the leaf is yellow it needs food. Display shows lifelong love of gardening

When she was a child, Gail Dudzinski loved to help her father in the garden. She walked among plants that seemed gigantic to her, and she raised around 60 African violets.

Now Dudzinski has a family and a garden of her own, and her joy of gardening is even stronger. The joy shows in the spectacular scene she has raised, and is conveyed to the viewer.

"I couldn't begin to tell you how many plants I have," said Dudzinski, a master gardener who teaches at the Michigan School of Gardening. "Well over 100."

The garden is one of five on the 28th annual Troy Garden Walk, taking place Wednesday, July 10, presented by the Troy Garden Club. Items from a featured raffle will be displayed here.

The Dudzinski garden was on the walk 10 years ago. Since then, a sunroom and a garden pond have been added for extra enjoyment and enrichment of the beautiful site.

Dudzinski has her own garden maintenance business. She experiments with different plants in her garden to evaluate them, the better to advise her clients. Many of the other flowers came from her aunt's garden, such as the shimmering peonies.

The peonies are part of the parade of perennials in the back yard, their petals like banners. Dudzinski plants only perennials here. She plans the garden so it has continuous color through the seasons, and also looks for leaf and texture variety.

The back yard garden includes purple, yellow, blue, white and variegated irises, yellow buttercup, campanula, and oriental poppies in a raspberry hue.

"At this time of year I love my poppies," Dudzinski said.

Euphorbia grows in a container so it doesn't spread. Moonflowers were placed by windows because of their fragrance.

The tranquil pond features water lilies and is home to toads and frogs. Ducks arrive in the spring. Kinglets, cardinals and finches are some of the birds that visit feeders in the yard.

A shade garden is on one side of the house. It includes hostas, ferns, bleeding heart, astilbes, pulmonaria and Jack-in-the-pulpit.

In the summer, Gooseneck loosestrife, black-eyed Susans, coneflower and Coronation Gold yarrow can be seen on the property.

Joe Pye weed, plumbago, mums and caryopteris are on view in the fall. Grasses, sedum Autumn Joy and globe thistle offer winter interest.

Dudzinski deposits mulch for compost in woods behind the back yard.

"I don't use pesticides. I don't do much fertilization," she said.

"I do like a real natural garden." Being outside is what she likes most about gardening, Dudzinski said.

"I used to have a job in an office and I couldn't do that," she said. "I just love to be outside."

Dudzinski advises would-be gardeners to start out with a small garden so it isn't overwhelming.

"Don't make it too big. You can always expand it," she said.

A teenage son has inherited Dudzinski's love of gardening. He designed the stone paver steps in the back yard, and tends a strawberry patch (where his childhood sandbox used to be) and a vegetable garden along sides of the house.

His vegetable garden gets larger every year — potatoes, corn, cabbage, tomatoes, beans and pumpkins are among the selections.

"I don't have the patience to do vegetables," Dudzinski said.

A mosaic top or iron cafe table adorned with patterned wrought-iron chairs offers a striking centerpiece. Surround with an eclectic assortment of containers brimming with colorful annuals for a vibrant outdoor setting. Or frame a patio door with wrought-iron trellises to create a striking perpendicular element.

■ Since balconies tend to have limited space it's critical to make use of the ceiling, floor and wall area.

Condo owners can dress up a cement balcony by painting the floor with a diamond pattern or floral design or incorporating an outdoor rug to mark the space. Hanging plants in cocomoss planters or wall-mounted hangars create added dimension.

■ Create one visually cohesive theme or design since multiple elements tend to get lost in small spaces, Vartrav says.

For example, an oriental theme might include planters with fescue grass, a bamboo fountain or tabletop bonsai waterfall and simple sling chairs. Add candles on a tray covered with stones, a bamboo area rug, wind chimes and an exotic flower to complete the look.

■ Top floor balconies without

ceilings and rooftop spaces provide special urban oasis options. With their added sunlight, these spaces can be used to train climbing roses on a trellis, create a vegetable and fruit garden in whisky barrels or attract fine-feathered friends with a bird-house collection.

■ Window boxes create a picturesque boundary for high-level apartments that don't look out to trees or other natural greenery.

"If you've got a rooftop deck, the possibilities are endless," Thompson said. "You can use peastone and pavers to transform unattractive rooftop decking into an adult playground with benches and dining areas."

It's important to select cast aluminum or other heavy furniture pieces for high balconies since the wind tends to be stronger, she said.

Canton camp gives challenged kids a chance to hone interpersonal skills

Twelve-year-old T.J. Johnson is pretty sure of her opinions.

She doesn't care much for Scooby Doo. She likes the Power Puff girls. And she loves Camp Able, the six-week summer day camp for children with mental and physical disabilities run by Canton Township's Leisure Services Department. With its daily activities and thrice weekly field trips, Camp Able is among Lauren's favorite things.

"I love it!" she exclaimed Tuesday during a break from making flower planters. I love getting ice cream, and I love going on the day trips.

The 20-year-old Camp Able program is designed to provide recreational and leisure activities for kids with mild to moderate physical and/or mental impairments. The goal is to provide an educational experience while enhancing self-esteem, independence and creativity.

The camp draws most of its participants from Canton and Livonia, while some campers also come from communities as diverse as Livonia, Plymouth and Westland. Campers are between the ages of 8 and 16, and the camp is staffed at a camper to counselor ratio of 3 to 1.

Campers are at Bentley Elementary School two days a week from 8:30 a.m. to around 3 p.m. Activities include things like arts and crafts, cooking and games. The other three days are generally spent on outings to places such as

the local park, the library, the museum, and the zoo.

By honing these interpersonal skills, Camp Able helps campers become more confident and outgoing. Most kids with disabilities have trouble with social skills, so it's important to go on the outings.

Camp Able participants suffer from a variety of conditions, among them autism, epilepsy, cerebral palsy, attention deficit disorder, and Down Syndrome.

Students apply to the camp, and camp staffers make a determination as to whether the individual will fit in with the others in the camp.

As one of the only such camps in Wayne County, Camp Able takes its mission seriously.

I think these camps are very important, Perry said. It allows (campers) to meet other children who have the same disabilities. It boosts their self-esteem.

But maybe most importantly, it builds relationships. The kids can't wait to see the kids from last year, and they wonder where the kids are who don't come back.

Campers do lots of activities that help hone fine motor skills, with every activity having a specific goal in mind. It's a great environment not only for the campers, but for the counselors as well.

"I love working with such a variety of kids," said Kristen Kearney of Novi, who is studying special education at Grand Valley State University. You get exposed to many disabilities, and a diverse group of kids. I'm going into

special education, so this is a great experience for me.

According to Perry, there are only a couple of other camps of this nature

that operate in the county, and none as established as Camp Able.

We might just be the best kept secret in the county," she said.

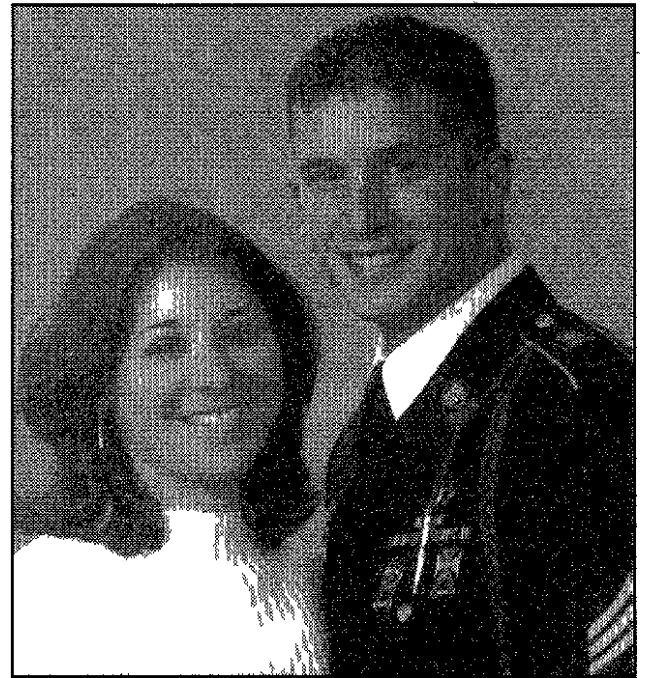

It was hard to find respect because I wasn't a college grad Wittrock says now I missed Michigan and I missed my family and my church So I came home

She looked for the right place to finish her education and after applying (and being accepted) at various campuses and doing a lot of praying she settled on Madonna And never regretted it

I was blessed with teachers who loved the Lord and who really helped me Wittrock said I really enjoyed Madonna

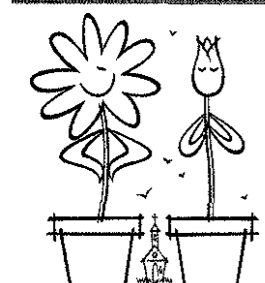

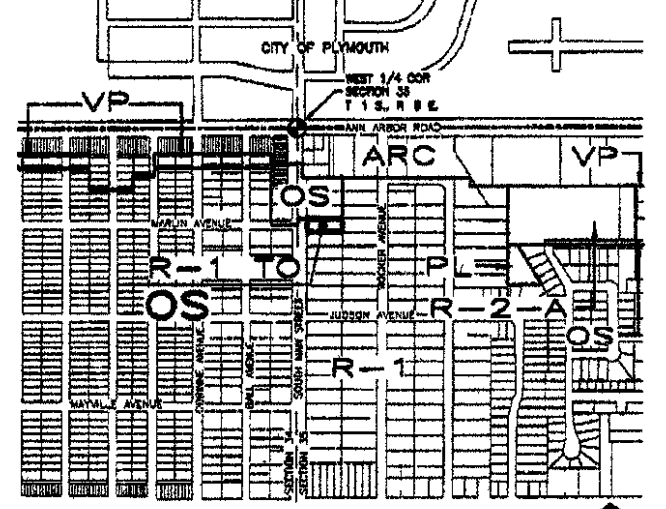

Madonna A.D. Summers resigns

Sources have told the Observer that athletic director Ray Summers, who launched Madonna University into competitive collegiate athletics in the late 1980s, has stepped down to pursue other career opportunities.

Neither Summers or Sister Nancy Jamroz, Dean of Students and Vice President of Student Services, could be reached for comment late Tuesday night.

Bryan Rizzo, assistant A.D. and sports information director, will return Monday after a month-long vacation and is expected to be named acting A.D.

Summers arrived at MU in 1981 as men's basketball coach for the club team. In 1982 he became athletic director and has been in control of the ever-

expanding department.

Under Summers' direction, Madonna joined the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics in 1987 with women's volleyball as its only sport.

"It's quite a shock to me," said women's volleyball coach Jerry Abraham, the school's winningest coach. "Ray built the program from scratch, he originated all the programs. The growth was all his doing, along with the help of the administration, of course."

"Ray is a Madonna person all the way, very dedicated, a hard worker. Madonna will miss him dearly. I have nothing but great things to say about him."

Since 1987, MU has added six more sports including men's and women's soccer, basketball, baseball and softball.

In 1997, MU achieved another mile-

stone when Summers helped the University gain entrance into the Wolverine-Hoosier Athletic Conference, which now consists of eight schools including Concordia, Cornerstone, Siena Heights, Spring Arbor, Aquinas, Tri State (Ind.) and Indiana Tech.

During his tenure, Summers directed a program that started from scratch and eventually evolved into a recognized force in the NAIA as seven different Crusader teams have made National Championship appearances.

Abraham, who just completed his 15th season, called Summers "a good person to work for."

"He was a good boss because he allows you to coach," Abraham said. "He gives you the flexibility and he follows the rules. He always does things professionally."

Mike George, who served 10 years as MU's baseball coach, called Summers

"a guy who was always in your corner."

"Not once did he ever meddle," said George, who also coached high school baseball at Redford Bishop Borgess. "He didn't tell you how to coach or how to recruit. He was never on a power trip with us."

"He was a stand-up guy. I thank him because he gave me an opportunity to coach college baseball. And it was the best 10 years of my life. He was all for making the program better and helping the kids."

A native of Detroit, Summers earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Psychology from Eastern Michigan University in 1976 as well as a Master's in Psychology in 1980, also from EMU.

Summers, his wife Marilee (Hoag), a former MU women's basketball coach, reside in Highland along with their two sons, Jason and Joey.

The Whalers had two other players selected in the draft. Left wing Gregory Campbell was taken in the third round by the Florida Panthers, and Jonas Fiedler was picked 86th overall by the San Jose Sharks.

Although Wisniewski hoped to be drafted higher, he said Tuesday he was very pleased to be picked by a team with a rich history like the Blackhawks, and looks forward to bouncing back from his injury.

"It's just a great experience to be drafted by a team like Chicago with all the history they have," he said. "I had a feeling that might be the team to pick me. I had an interview with them in Toronto a few weeks

ago and it went pretty well."

Wisniewski, known for his offensive skills from the blue line, had 11 goals and 25 assists in helping to lead the Whalers to the best regular season record in the OHL in 2001-02.

Coach Mike Vellucci said he feels the best is yet to come from Wisniewski, who he said felt the pressure of being a potential draft pick last season.

"I think he put a little too much pressure on himself playing in his draft year," Vellucci said. "But that happens to the best of them. He's a great player and will now be able to concentrate on just playing hockey."

Wisniewski admits he felt pressure to perform last season, but now that he has an idea of what his future could hold, he is focused and ready for the new season.

"Before, I was worrying about what 30 teams thought of me," he said. "Now I know who my team is and I can just play. It's certainly a huge relief."

Wisniewski said he should resume skating by August and hopes to be at 100 percent entering Plymouth's training camp in September.

Campbell had a solid offensive season for the Whalers, scoring 17 goals with 36 assists in 65 games and was a plus-31 for the season. Vellucci said the Panthers will offer Campbell chance to grow as a player and an opportunity to play in the NHL down the road.

"Greg was rated as a second round pick and ended up going in the third, but that's the way the draft works sometimes," Vellucci said. "He had a big jump in his numbers this year and he'll have a chance to make an even bigger jump next year."

Vellucci said Fiedler going to the Sharks was a pleasant surprise.

"He's a big kid who improved a lot this year," Vellucci said. "He has a nice scoring touch but didn't get a whole lot of ice time this year, so you can see the Sharks probably drafted him on potential. But for him to get drafted, it will be a great experience for him."

Fiedler had eight goals and 12 assists for the Whalers last season.

Freeway to popularize Mexican resorts

However, there is a new high rise condominium going up on the beach which is twice as large as the existing condominiums, which sell from \$200,000-\$400,000 US.

The new condominiums, which are in the pre-construction phase, will sell for as much as \$800,000, but the market isn't quite as brisk since 9/11.

The local real estate people indicate that with the completion of a new expressway - which will allow other Mexicans from coastal regions to reach Ixtapa in three hours as opposed to nine - more interest will be displayed in the residential real estate market in Ixtapa.

After we find a new address, sell our house or condo and sign all the papers, we still have to pack up and go.

Some companies, especially with a job transfer, will pay to relocate to new home from old. Also, some national real estate firms will provide personal coordinators and trucks at no charge.

But many folks are on their own. That's where the real adventure may begin. "They're usually overwhelmed," said Nancy Austin, a Realtor with Coldwell Banker Preferred in Plymouth.

"They say that three stressful times in a person's life are death, divorce and moving - at least that's what I've heard," said Dan Jamieson, general manager of Ryder truck rental in Farmington.

Veteran movers and first-timers can expedite the process by planning their work, then working their plan, the experts say.

"It starts from the day of listing," said Linda K. Rea, a sales associate with Real Estate One in Troy. "Dishes in the cupboard haven't been used in years and clothes in closets make the home look smaller."

So get rid of clutter by giving things to family, friends or charity, Rea advised, or have a garage sale and make a few dollars before even showing the house. What's not there doesn't have to be moved.

From her 35 years of experience, procrastination is the biggest stumbling block, Rea said. "They wait too long to make proper decisions."

Don't wait for an exact closing date to book a mover, said Joann White, general manager of Two Men and a Truck moving company in Oak Park.

Lock in a tentative date as soon as you can, especially for weekends during the prime moving months May through September.

"Two weeks is cutting it close," White said. "Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays, there's a little more leeway."

Her firm will move you for \$75 per hour for labor, billable in 15 minute increments, plus a flat daily fee of \$75 for the truck.

"Make sure you don't overpack," White advised. "A general rule of thumb is the heavier the item the smaller the box. You don't want to overload and break the box."

She offered other tips:
■ Legal documents, valuables (jewelry), medical records should be transported by you.

■ "Label boxes no matter who may help you. You will be more organized and put the right things in the right rooms."
■ "Don't mix items from different rooms in the same box. It causes panic."

■ "It's always good to pack an essentials box with soap, toilet paper, paper towels, tooth paste, tooth brushes. Things you're going to need right away."

Let children pack their own toys so they feel more comfortable with the move, White added.

"When you call to book a move, don't underestimate what you have," she said. "When movers get there you will want them to move everything. Tell us everything. We can usually give you a pretty good estimate."

Rick Pochowicz, general manager of Midwest Moving & Storage in Canton, charges \$115 per hour for a four-man crew Monday through Friday, \$20 more per hour for weekend work.

Midwest is affiliated nationally with Bekins.

"Probably the biggest mistake is people think they can get packing done in a day by themselves," Pochowicz said. "Movers show up and they're still packing. We recommend they pack a few boxes each day about a month in advance."

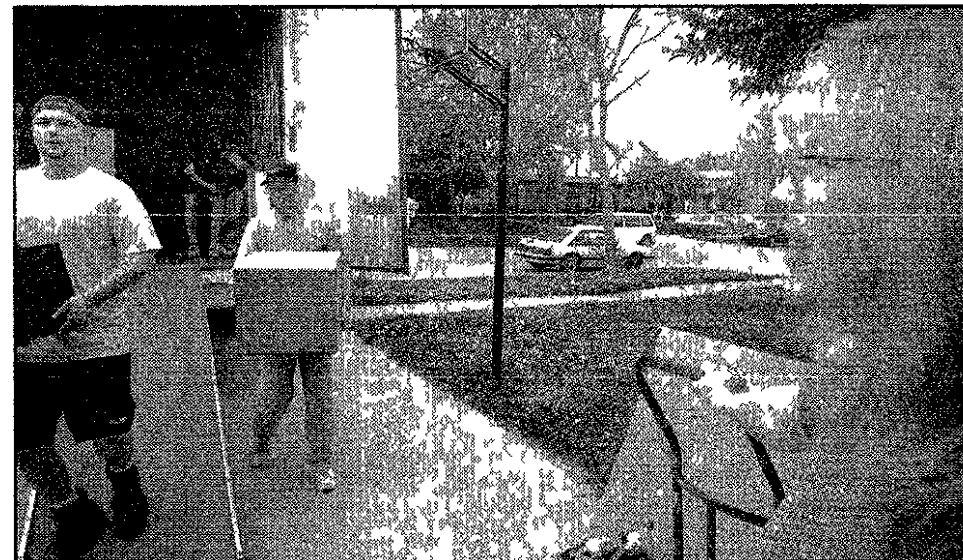
Other advice from Pochowicz:
■ "On moving day, just let it be moving day. Don't have the cable guy show up, or this guy show up or that guy."

■ "Have a neighbor or cousin watch pets for the day. Same with kids."
■ "Definitely have an in-house estimate

done so you don't run into horror stories. You can see special needs of a move then that really gets the ball moving."

Lack of organization and unrealistic expectations often go hand-in-hand, Jamieson said.

"They try packing the same day they're moving and that turns one day of moving into three days," he said. "They always underestimate what size vehicle they need. That turns one trip into two trips or three trips."

"They don't realize the longer you live in a house, the more you accumulate," he said.

Jamieson recommends a 24-foot truck for a house with three bedrooms, a basement and a garage.

He charges do-it-yourselfers \$99.95 per day plus 55 cents a mile Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays the first and last weekends of the month, \$79.95 plus 55 cents per mile the middle weekends of the month.

The cost is \$49.95 daily plus 55 cents a mile weekdays.

Moving pads are \$10 per dozen, a dolly \$10 per day.

"A lot of people don't know how to pack a truck properly," Jamieson said. "Movers can use every inch."

His advice - boxes in first, then mattresses, then appliances and furniture.

The big thing is getting rid of things before packing and moving, Austin said.

"Things they haven't used the last two years or more including clothing, including knickknacks, something stored in the basement. Crummy furniture I'd put at the curb."

"How many of us, I included, have stuff from grown kids in the basement?" Austin added. "When you move, call them to get it or it's going to the curb."

Her last word - "whittle down, then whittle down some more."
