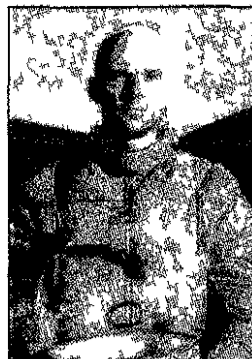

And that's what's happening as six new businesses come to town, one relocates its store front, and another is leaving town.

JCI seeks rezoning in Salem

Despite hours of discussion about the possible rezoning of hundreds of acres of Salem Township land for a research and development complex, no decision has been made concerning Johnson Controls Inc. planned move from Plymouth Township.

Another meeting to discuss and possibly decide on the JCI proposal will be scheduled for later this month.

About 60 residents packed Salem Township Hall Tuesday night for the presentation by the company concerning the rezoning of 367 acres in the area of Napier and Joy roads.

Dean Boik of JCI promised a lot of jobs at the proposed facility, adding that there would be no manufacturing at the site.

It could be as high as 5,000, at the beginning it will be about 1,700," he said. They would be executive, technical and engineering jobs.

Despite a threatening sky that occasionally opened up, crowds of shoppers took to the streets last weekend to sample local wares during the annual Plymouth Sidewalk Sale.

Plymouth Community Chamber of Commerce Executive Director Fran Toney said the turnout was better than in recent years. "We had good crowds, better than last year," she said. "I think it went very well."

She said there was good participation from local merchants as well. A lot of businesses that didn't necessarily put up displays on the streets still opened their doors wide to invite shoppers in.

Almost all of the businesses participated," Toney said.

Kal Jabara, owner of Wild Wings Gallery, rolled out the collapsible tables again to take part in the annual promotion.

A participant in every sidewalk sale to date, he said the quirky weather didn't keep the crowds down.

Classic cars in Old Village could be habit

While organizers didn't get as big of a response as they had hoped for, a charity classic car show in Old Village drew enough of a crowd to warrant positive feelings about a bigger turnout next year.

Home-building outreach program Habitat for Humanity and 20 classic car enthusiasts gathered on Starkweather between Liberty and Spring to appreciate Detroit steel and donate money for the construction of new homes around the

county last Saturday.

Habitat for Humanity Development Director Heather Abreu said they pulled in about \$600 from the car show.

"It was pretty good for a first-year effort," she said. "We hope to have some growth for next year."

The money will be put to work immediately several different home-building projects in Wayne County. Currently, Habitat is finishing a house in Romulus and is getting ready to build another in Inkster. The organization hopes to purchase land for another 10 homes in the

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Prop. 2 designed to increase park funds and grants

Michigan voters may decide the fate of the state's most popular environmental program with their vote on Proposal 2 on the Aug. 6 primary ballot.

If Proposal 2 fails, supporters say local governments could face an estimated loss of \$15 million in grant funding annually from the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund. If Proposal 2 passes, the fund could gain more than \$500 million over the next 20 years with no tax increase.

In Wayne County, places like the Canton Recreational Center, Southgate Nature Center and the State Fairgrounds were funded by the trust fund. Local units of government can apply for a three-to-one match in funding from the trust fund for acquiring or improving local parks, trails, nature preserves or other recreational areas. Since 1978, Wayne County has received more than \$32.4 million from the trust fund.

The trust fund has touched literally every county in the state of Michigan over the past 25 years, said Garret Johnson, director of government relations for the Michigan Chapter of The Nature Conservancy. "The success or failure of Proposal 2 will greatly affect the ability of local communi-

ties to provide these recreational opportunities for its residents.

If it passes on Aug. 6, Proposal 2 would:

- Allow certain permanent and endowment funds operated by the state, such as the Natural Resources Trust Fund, State Park Endowment Fund and the Veterans Trust Fund, to be invested as provided by law.
- Increase the cap on the Natural Resources Trust Fund from \$400 million to \$500 million, and allow the continued annual expenditure of up to 33 1/3 percent of mineral royalties received by the Natural Resources Trust Fund on state and local outdoor recreation grants.
- Allow interest and earnings, and not more than 50 percent of the money received by the State Park Endowment Fund to be annually spent for state park improvements.
- Proposal 2 was placed on the Aug. 6 primary ballot by an overwhelming, bipartisan vote by the Michigan Legislature earlier this year.

"We hope voters will remember that a yes vote on Proposal 2 is a vote for Michigan's parks, lakes and wildlife," Johnson said.

Plymouth company and Chrysler exploring joint venture for forge plant

Metaldyne Corporation of Plymouth and DaimlerChrysler Corporation have signed a letter of intent to explore entering into a joint venture to operate the DaimlerChrysler New Castle Machining and Forge Plant in New Castle, Indiana.

The DaimlerChrysler New Castle Machining and Forge operation manufactures suspension components as well as engine and transmission components for Chrysler Jeep and Dodge vehicles and employs

approximately 1,350 salaried and hourly workers.

Metaldyne is focused on full service integrated supply opportunities in the engine, driveline and chassis portion of the automotive industry, said Timothy Leuhette, Metaldyne's Chairman and President. "This potential joint venture positions us to play a role as a systems and module consolidator in keeping with our established company vision."

There is a solid business case

behind this letter of intent, said Tom LaSorda, Executive Vice President, Manufacturing, DaimlerChrysler Corporation. "This potential transaction would allow us to explore ways to provide New Castle Machining and Forge with new product and market opportunities. Metaldyne and DaimlerChrysler will work with the International and Local union leadership in connection

with this potential transaction. Employees at the facility are represented by the United Auto Workers Local 371, the International Association of Machinists Lodge D S 120 and the Security Police Fire Professionals of America Local 13.

The joint venture would include the construction of a definitive agreement

QUESTION 1:
Please outline your background and how it qualifies you to serve on the bench.

10 years experience as a municipal judge for Grosse Pointe Woods, Grosse Pointe Shores, and as a visiting judge in many surrounding district courts. Licensed to practice law since 1979. QUESTION 2:
What do you think is the role of the circuit court, and how should it work with other courts?

Circuit court is the primary trial court. As a practical matter, most citizens will have their civil dispute, criminal matter, or divorce finalized in the circuit court. Most cases are not appealed. It is important that every citizen receive a fair trial at the trial court level since most can't afford to appeal. A judge must be fair, honest, and knowledgeable. A proper record must be kept to allow the appeals courts to thoroughly review the judge's decision. Well-reasoned opinions are important for this reason. The trial court judge must clearly set out the law and how it applies to the case at hand.

QUESTION 3:
What are the major issues facing the court, and the judiciary in general?

All trial courts are facing problems with budgets, workload, and courtroom security. In the face of personnel cutbacks, the workload continues to increase. The public deserves hard-working judges willing and able to handle the workload. Circuit court is nowhere to get one's feet wet. Experience counts! The judiciary is struggling with the ever-increasing politicization of the office. Term-limited career politicians are looking at the job as an extension of their political career. Candidates must find ways to finance expensive campaigns by giving the public the impression they can be influenced by monetary contributions.

High personal and professional standards are expected of judges. The same ones I have lived up to as a state senator for 15 years. I have been a litigator, lawmaker, problem solver, and daily for 15 years. I have had to make decisions on important matters of law and fact as a senator. Fundamental changes in the way criminals are sentenced and paroled, civil disputes resolved, and justice administered resulted from a series of commissions that I helped set up and served on. I conducted myself in such a fashion that various factions constantly warring in Lansing are willing to support or endorse my candidacy.

The role of any court is to resolve cases within its jurisdiction in as speedy and efficient a manner as possible, consistent with justice. I would like to see jurisdictional flexibility exercised. I believe that circuit and other courts should be encouraged to borrow jurisdiction more freely from other courts, not just as a pilot program, but on a one-time only basis also. As examples, I would like to see district courts able to take on early felony guilty pleas and handle juvenile criminal matters, and circuit courts be encouraged to take complicated civil suits that do not satisfy jurisdictional requirements.

The public in general, and the press in particular, has doubts that the bench or bar live up to the standards required by the trust placed in them. Judges and candidates for judge need to understand that every aspect of their public and private lives must be above reproach. Judges need more internal scrutiny of their work habits, seem to need non-disciplinary coaching when things don't go well, but need the flexibility to do it their own best way. Judges need some sort of non-disciplinary referral service to improve the skills of attorneys, not quite making the grade.

Respect is also an issue. Respect is essential in the courtroom if litigants appearing before the court are to believe that the court has treated them fairly and impartially. Respect comes in the form of the judge being prepared, on time, and maintaining decorum in the courtroom.



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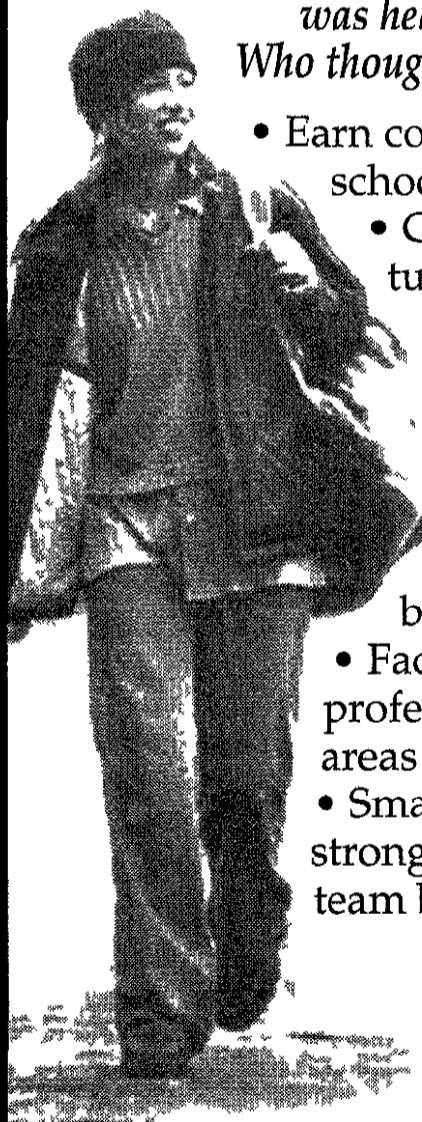

Fall Fest vote reasoning is poor

In nine out of 10 cases, Plymouth city commissioners make decisions that are in the best interests of the city. In our opinion, the commission's decision not to extend the hours for Fall Festival is the 10th.

The commission July 15 denied a request by the Fall Festival to add one hour Friday, Sept. 7, and another hour Saturday, Sept. 8, to the festival, allowing festival rides and booths to stay open until 11 p.m.

Fall Festival president Mark Baldwin made what we considered a pretty convincing argument that the additional hour each night would help the festival make more money, thus allowing the festival to become entirely self-sufficient.

He correctly points out that both Salem and Canton high schools have home games that weekend, extending the hours would allow players and fans of the local football teams to cheer on their gridiron heroes and still have time to enjoy one of the area's best festivals.

But his best reason for staying an extra 60 ticks of the clock each day is this: It would allow area civic groups that currently contribute a \$25 application fee, \$150 per booth space and 25 percent of their profits, to keep more of their money, thus keeping even more of the money in the local community.

"One of my goals is to make the festival as self-supportive as possible without taking profits from the civic groups," Baldwin told the commission. Then, they could put more of their money back into the community.

And a noble goal it is.

City commissioners seemed to agree it was a great goal, but only two of them thought it was good enough to make an exception to the city's ordinance, which calls for the closing of Kellogg Park at 10 p.m. Mayor Bill Graham and commissioner Stella Greene thought trying the extended hours on a one-year pilot basis was a good idea, particularly if the festival was willing to give up the controversial beer tent it's had the last two years.

But Mayor Pro-Tem Colleen Pobur and commissioners Michele Potter, Dan Dwyer and Phil Pursell voted against the idea. (Commissioner Ron Loiselle wasn't at the meeting.)

Potter said to extend the hours — and the noise that invariably accompanies the festival — would be unfair to residents, who "could potentially be bothered by the noise going on an hour later." She also worried granting such absolutism to the Fall Festival would open a door she'd rather leave closed.

"If we allow one event to do this on a trial basis, we're going to have every other event coming to us saying we want a trial period as well," Potter said.

We disagree. Think of the other festivals that take place in Plymouth annually. Think anyone's going to ask to hang around Kellogg Park until 11 o'clock at night in the dead of January for the ice festival? Are the people milling about during Art in the Park going to want to hang out until 11 p.m. to buy a weather vane? Will chili still be cooking at 11 p.m. during the annual Chili Festival?

The answer to those questions, of course, is in all likelihood "No." But even if those groups DO ask to stay later, there's no reason the commission can't turn them down. They make decisions like that all the time, in zoning disputes and other similar situations.

The Fall Festival makes a pretty persuasive argument that one extra hour one time a year, while perhaps inconveniencing residents, can do a lot of good for the community.

With deference to residents whose lives might be impacted, we hope the city commission changes its mind. As Mr. Spock pointed out to Captain Kirk in Star Trek II: "the needs of the many outweigh the needs of the few."

Engler's veto not needed

We just don't know where to start with this one. Gov. John Engler's veto Thursday of nearly \$1 billion in discretionary state revenue sharing funds is horrifyingly wrong on so many levels it leaves us with writer's block.

■ It cuts millions of dollars from city, township and county budgets at the drop of a hat — and makes fundamental changes in the way municipalities have paid for local programs for decades.

■ It hijacks the November election, at least the portion of the ballot that will likely contain two proposals re-allocating state money for specific purposes and one that would allow binding arbitration for state employees. The reallocation measures — whether you support them or not — made the ballot in legal and customary fashion. So too will the proposal affecting state employees if enough valid petition signatures are submitted.

■ It bypasses an out-of-session state legislature, which has angered some members of the governor's own party enough to spur talk of an override, which would be a rarity in the Republican-dominated Engler era. They are particularly upset because the veto undoes the July budget deal reached with heavy input from Engler and, presumably, his imprimatur.

Engler has said he will rescind the veto, provided people vote the "right" way and reject the ballot proposals.

Canton would lose \$4 million if the veto stands up. Residents should join local leaders in calling on their elected representatives in Lansing to undo the damage Engler has wrought.

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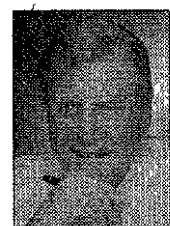

Expect airwaves to be filled with nasty ads in final days

Election day is next Tuesday in what has turned out to be one of the most hotly contested gubernatorial primaries in recent Michigan history.

So I called my old friend, Craig Ruff, head of Public Sector Consultants and a seasoned observer of things political to talk about what readers might be looking for as the races for both the Republican and Democratic nominations come down to the wire. Here's my report: Schwarz vs Posthumus, State Senator John

(Joe) Schwarz is the poster child for moderate Republicans (an oxymoron in recent years) and the overwhelming favorite of editorial writers and miscellaneous political insiders. He's smart, knowledgeable, candid, experienced, articulate. His message — that the right-wing moral absolutists now in control are taking the GOP into the abyss of defeat in November — is almost certainly right on.

But, barring an almost unimaginable turn of events, Joe's very likely to lose next Tuesday. He doesn't have much money to spend on TV ads and the entire Republican apparatus is lined up in lockstep to support Lt. Gov. Dick Posthumus, who keeps insisting there's nothing wrong with Michigan's desperate budget situation that a tax cut won't cure. It's too bad for Schwarz that the Democratic primary race is so close and is attracting so much public interest, otherwise, he'd have a shot at attracting independents and moderate Democrats who regard Posthumus as nothing more than Engler lite.

With Dan Pero, an able guy who used to flack for Gov. John Engler, now managing the Posthumus campaign, expect the Lt. Gov. to go on the offensive during August. He'll have lots of money left over and he'll want to spend a lot of it dominating the news while his Democratic opponent is trying to catch his/her breath and bind up the wounds inflicted in the primary.

Blanchard vs Bonior vs Granholm. This race is turning out to be a whole lot closer than most people figured.

Attorney Gen. Jennifer Granholm is bright, charismatic, beautiful — a fresh face in politics if you ever saw one. She has raised a ton of money — more than \$4 million — and most insiders figured she'd be far in the lead by now, if only because she had the financial muscle to out-spend her male opponents on TV.

But it hasn't turned out quite like that. Former governor Jim Blanchard has mounted a very energetic and effective campaign, so much so that some are wondering how come he didn't

do it back in 1990 when he was upset by Engler. U.S. Rep. David Bonior was originally written off by the pundits who figured he'd never break out of his Macomb County base. But Bonior is a

smart, tough, high-energy campaigner, and he's got big time backing from his chums in the UAW. Both Blanchard and Bonior have put together so-called "independent" committees to raise money that has gone into attack ads against Granholm. Blanchard's is managed by his old sidekick, Larry Owen, while a lot of money from organized labor has gone into the St. Clair County Democratic Party, which is going after Granholm on TV. Blanchard and Bonior, both ostensibly in favor of political reform, have a lot of explaining to do about these committees that clearly violate the intent if not the letter of campaign finance law.

And because the race is so close, you can expect the airwaves will be filled between now and Aug. 6 with very nasty attack ads on all sides. Blanchard and Bonior are going after Granholm for having supported, in her job as Attorney General, Gov. Engler, the Democrats' favorite hate object. Both of them know perfectly well that Granholm has been simply performing her statutory function as AG and that the charges are phony. But that won't prevent them from cutting the ads.

If the race turns out to be close going into the weekend, look for Bonior to gain a real advantage when it comes to getting out the vote. Organized labor really learned how to get the troops out for Al Gore two years ago, and no one figures they've forgotten how to do it this time around. I'd guess neither Blanchard nor Granholm have much of a field organization.

The General Election. Posthumus is supposed to be toast against Granholm and in trouble against both Blanchard and Bonior. But both Craig and I think that after Posthumus gets through dominating the headlines in August, he'll go into Labor Day weekend only 10-15 percent down. Given how volatile the times are, that's not insurmountable. Stay tuned!

Personal attacks muddy honest political debate

endorse Candidate B? Is your ouija board broke?

Some people think the editor makes all the decisions, but that's not necessarily the case. While the editor has a significant amount of input, the endorsements are generally discussed among a panel of writers, editors and management types who decide which candidates we feel best serve their constituents' needs, give good district service and aren't beholden to special interests.

Take the case of the 20th House District seat, currently held by state Rep. John Stewart, R-Plymouth Township. He's being challenged by political newcomer Jonathon Grant, a dot-com entrepreneur with little experience, except for a term on the Downtown Development Authority board.

John Stewart, although claiming to be mostly Right to Life, favors a woman's right to choose under certain circumstances. Jonathon Grant is strictly Right to Life.

John Stewart is in favor of tweaking Proposal A, the school funding law, to enable local school districts to enhance their financial standing. Jonathon Grant wouldn't touch Proposal A with a 10-foot pole, because he thinks it's a property tax hike. This newspaper has editorialized in favor of tweaking the law. Who gets the endorsement?

John Stewart has lived and worked in the community a long time, is a former township board member and votes in every election. Jonathon Grant hasn't lived in town as long, has never served on any boards except the DDA and the only school election in which he voted was the one right after he filed to run for office. From the newspaper's point of view, who gets the endorsement?

The election will likely be made close by the fact that Grant, a conservative Republican being advised by former Plymouth Township Police Chief Carl Berry, is working his tail off to get his name and face before voters prior to Tuesday's primary. In the view from this space, Stewart probably pulls out a narrow win.

The looming election prompted one of my bosses to ask me last week, "Can Jonathon Grant do the job?"

I considered the question, then said, "Absolutely."

Grant probably could be a good state representative, if he stays true to his word and doesn't fall prey to special interests. He's bright, intelligent, appears to love his state. He's a former military man. He has definite views on the

issues, and articulates them well.

It'll be interesting to see how a few things play out. There is one view that, in the primary, many moderate Republicans (upon whom Stewart counts) will desert the party in favor of influencing the race for governor. If that happens, Grant could have an edge.

The other thing at play, at least locally, is the kind of campaign some Stewart supporters have been waging. Published stories have criticized Grant for taking money from the Betsy DeVos-run Great Lakes Education Project, which advocates school vouchers, no change to proposal A and lifting the cap on charter schools. The same stories failed to point out Stewart has taken money from Blue Cross/Blue Shield, the Michigan Trial Lawyers and the political action committee for the state's realtors.

Grant's name has also been run through the north end mud because of material published on his Web site, allplymouth.com. He's been portrayed as a purveyor of smut and a pornographer, neither of which is true. Though there's no indication Stewart is behind this, it is being done in his name by his supporters.

Grant's wife's name and character have even been insulted. There's no excuse for that, and it could be a disaster. It's worth noting that former state Rep. Gerald Law dragged Ron Edwards' family into the campaign for township treasurer two years ago, and the move backfired when Edwards beat Law by more than 2-to-1.

Opponents of former city commissioner Dave Byers were targeted by equally unfavorable tactics in the last city commission race. Is Byers, who had the distinct advantage of running from the commission dais, still sitting up there? Nope.

Could Grant do the job he's trying to pluck away from Stewart? Absolutely. Is he going to get the chance? Probably not. Are voters going to decide on the issues rather than some weak attempt to sully one candidate or another? We hope so.

NEW YORK (AP) — Disney has taken the most corn-pone of all theater clichés — “We gotta put on a show!” — and turned it into a foot-stomping, crowd-pleasing, heartwarming romp with the animals in *The Country Bears*.

More than 75 million people have seen *The Country Bears Jamboree*, one of the most popular attractions for decades at Disney parks. Disney has now expanded the old franchise by creating a film that parents can take their littlest ones to and not fight off seat-rot or mind-numbing boredom.

Three aspects of *The Country Bears* make the movie. A catchy soundtrack with at least three show-stopping musical routines, a scattering of comic touches aimed straight at parents, and goofy, slapstick humor that appeals to audiences age 2 and up.

Christopher Walken is screamingly arch as the villainous banker who wants to tear down Country Bear Hall — no one else can overact with such panache.

Daryl “Chill” Mitchell and Dierich Bader are two modern-day Keystone Cops, guaranteed never to get their man, even if he is an 11-year-old boy bear. Their car-wash chase scene rates with the classics of comedy, so simple and yet so stupid. You don't really want to laugh, but you must.

Haley Joel Osment is sufficiently earnest as Beary, the

young bear who realizes he must leave his human family to reunite *The Country Bears* rock group and save the hall they made so famous. So much for the plot.

Jennifer S. Paige, as a winsome waitress, and singers Krystal Marie Harris and Brian Setzer engagingly belt out the big songs, seven of them written by John Hiatt, that keep everyone awake in a dark theater.

Older kids (we are talking 7- to 8-year-olds) can identify with Beary's human brother Dex (Eli Marienthal), who is amazed that his parents will not just admit that his younger brother is a bear.

While the bears specialize in slow-motion, pun-filled humor, screenwriter Mark Perez did not forget the adults who drove his audience to the movie.

“They are great. They were always great!” Bonnie Raitt says to Hiatt, as they sit at a bar admiring the bears who are singing with their voices. “Better than the Eagles,” Hiatt adds.

The bus sign reads “Hiber Nation Tour,” a dissolute rocker bear has a “sticky honey” problem, a former lover “took off with a panda” and Beary innocently asks his human parents “Am I adopted?”

Public TV won't rule out HIV-positive Muppet for American Sesame Street

PASADENA, California (AP) — A public television executive said he won't rule out the appearance of an HIV-positive Muppet on *Sesame Street*, saying the show's approach will reflect the virus impact on U.S. children.

An HIV-positive character will join South Africa's version of the show in September, and some federal American lawmakers had grown alarmed by the possibility of such a character joining the U.S. show, questioning whether it was age appropriate.

PBS President Pat Mitchell told the Television Critics Association on Friday that the South African character grew

from the needs of that country, where millions of children are affected by AIDS.

If the virus became a more serious problem for U.S. children, *Sesame Street* would be as responsive as it has been to other topics, Mitchell said.

The public television show aimed at preschoolers has dealt with the issue of death before, Mitchell noted.

She and the show's producers had previously said no HIV-positive character was planned in the U.S. version. South Africa's *Takalani Sesame* is one of several locally produced versions of the children's program which premiered in the United States in 1969.

Its new HIV-positive Muppet character was created at the urging of the South African government to educate children about AIDS.

Some 4.7 million South Africans — one in nine — are HIV positive, more people than in any other country.

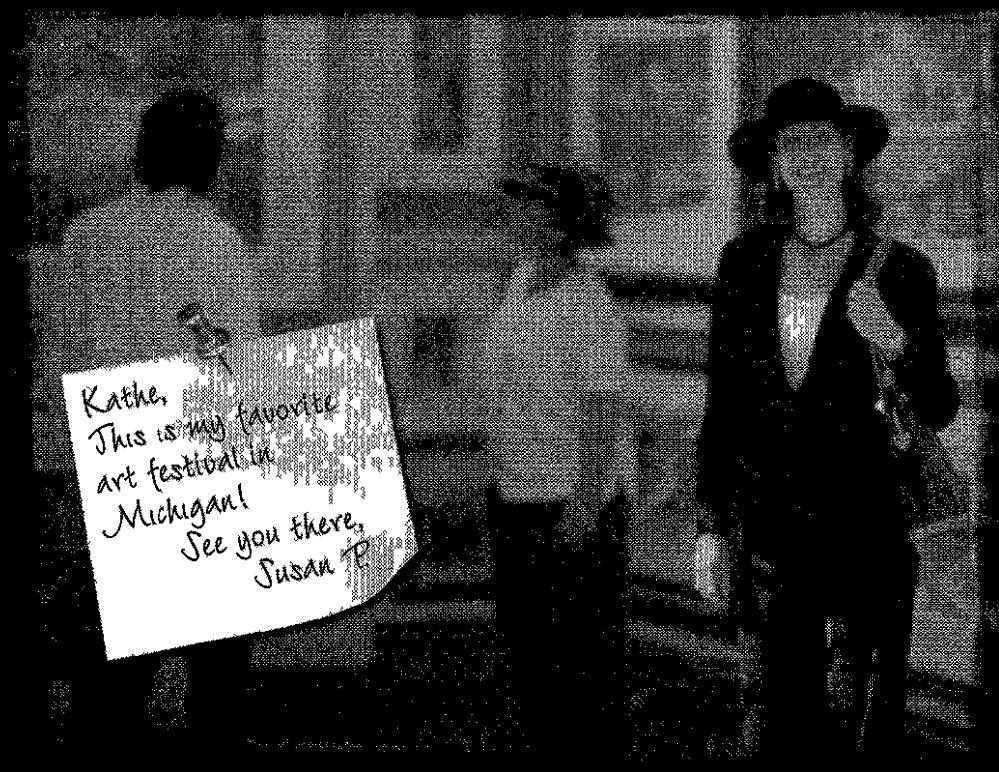

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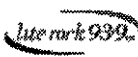

Springsteen's latest album responds to Sept. 11

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Bruce Springsteen did some reporting for his new album *The Rising*, the first major work of music to respond to the events of Sept 11.

Two widows told Time magazine that Springsteen, 52, called them after the terrorist attacks to learn more about their husbands and their loss.

Springsteen also addressed charges that the album might be exploiting the tragedy.

"When you're putting yourself into shoes you haven't worn, you have to be very just very thoughtful, is the way that

I'd put it. Just thoughtful," Springsteen told the magazine.

"You call on your craft, and you go searching for it, and hopefully what makes people listen is that over the years you've been serious and honest," he said.

The *Rising* goes on sale Tuesday and is Springsteen's first work of new material in seven years. His 46-city tour with the E Street Band starts Saturday, Aug 7.

Springsteen's home county,

Monmouth, lost 158 people in the World Trade Center bombing, more than any other in New Jersey. He noticed from reading The New York Times obituaries how often his songs, from *Thunder Road* to *Born in the U.S.A.*, were played at memorial services.

"This was one of those moments when the years that

I've put in and the relationships that I've developed and nurtured with my audience — this was one of those times when people want to see you," he said.

Dine in elegant surroundings at auto baron mansions

Order up a little luxury with lunch today. Skip the fast food or brown bag sandwich and head for a former auto baron's home. Dine with good crystal and china, amid sumptuous gardens and historic furnishings in a mansion.

"We've had a summer dining program for at least 20 years. What we did this year was revamp it a bit. We changed the menu. We offer lighter fare as well as full lunches," said Sally Victor, external relations director for Meadow Brook Hall, the former home of Oakland University founder Matilda Dodge Wilson and auto pioneer, John Dodge.

"We added the ability to have a glass of champagne or wine if you'd like. And what we started doing is on nice days, putting tables outside."

The dining crews look to the skies each morning and decides if it should set tables outdoors or in the Christopher Wren dining room, the Dodge's former family dining room which seats 94 people.

"We have been surprised this year by the diversity of the groups (at lunch)," Victor said. "We get groups of people celebrating birthdays, people coming from a company saying, 'let's have lunch there today, and a lot of people who take the tour'."

Summer Tours (Memorial Day to Labor Day), run every half hour from 10:30 a.m. - 3:30 p.m. Monday-Saturday and 11:30 a.m., 12:30 p.m., 1:30 p.m., 2:30 p.m. and 3:30 p.m. on Sunday. The tour costs \$8 for adults, \$6 for senior citizens and \$4 for children, age 4-12.

But patrons can eat lunch without taking the tour.

"We might do a lobster bisque or gazpacho. We make sure there's a salad entree," said Victor, describing the menu. "We have five (entree) choices every day and two desserts."

Prices range from \$10-15 for an entree salad and \$10-\$18 for a full lunch (soup, hot entrée, dessert). Tea, average \$4 for dessert and \$3 for a cup

of soup. Visitors seeking lighter fare can buy a wrap sandwich or iced coffee drink from the cafe in Meadow Brook Hall's lobby. Victor said the new cafe extends the museum experience and offers visitors an opportunity to snack while waiting for their tour to start.

Meadow Brook Hall has halted lunch service until after Concours d'Elegance, the vintage auto show that will fill the mansion grounds this weekend. It will resume lunch next week.

The mansion is located on the grounds of Oakland University, at Adams and Walton in Rochester Hills.

"The first question people ask is 'Where is the swimming pool?' You can't believe the phone calls we get - 'My daughter is going to lunch at the pool restaurant. Can I include a swimsuit?' When they opened the restaurant they filled in the pool," said Gail Raby, food service manager. "Oh gosh, it's been longer than 20 years."

The 87-acre estate grounds, planted with tulips and daffodils in the spring and "cutting" flowers, including roses in the summer, hugs the shoreline of Lake St. Clair.

During the fall, extensive wooded areas become a blaze of golds, reds and yellows. Visitors can buy a \$3 pass to walk the grounds - an audio tape tour rents for \$2 - or eat lunch and walk for free.

was used as the Edsel Ford family residence from 1929-1976, start every half hour, beginning at 10 a.m., with the last tour starting at 4 p.m., Tuesday through Sunday. The mansion was opened to the public in 1978. Tours are \$6 for adults, \$5 for seniors and \$3 for children, age 6-12.

"You don't see the main house from the tea room. You take a shuttle to the house because it's a quarter mile away," Fitzpatrick noted.

The tea room is a misnomer. The estate serves more substantial fare than scones and finger sandwiches.

The menu specials change daily. Typical items include soup, sandwiches, salads and wraps, lemonade, iced tea, soda pop and coffee. Prices average \$6 for a sandwich and \$6.95 for salads with meat.

"We also have hot daily specials. Our most popular salad is the new garden salad, with chicken, pine nuts and dried cranberries."

The tea room is located in the 12-year-old activities building.

"There are parts of the original structure. This is the site where the gardening sheds and utility sheds were," Fitzpatrick noted. "The design looks like a greenhouse."

She called the setting "casual but nice." Visitors can eat inside the tea room or outdoors. The Edsel Ford estate is located on Jefferson south of Nine Mile in Grosse Pointe Shores (313) 884-4222. Or visit www.fordhouse.org on the Internet.

Study group delves into history, uses and joys

The term "study group" evokes images of academia and panic-ridden graduate students cramming for exams.

But the Evening Herb Study Group of Matthaei Botanical Gardens, though committed to a learned approach to the history and uses of herbs, gathers as much for amusement as education.

Consider the club's upcoming potluck dinner. On the menu: Creative culinary courses involving around homegrown herbs. The setting: Late evening beside a garden of herbs.

Set for 7:30 p.m. Monday Aug. 5 in the Plymouth home garden of Heidi Leland, study group executive director, the dinner is open to non-members, too.

"It's prime growing season," Leland says, and then ticks off an imaginary menu to whet any appetite: lemon thyme chicken, pork wrapped in mint leaves and lavender iced tea.

There are only so many months that you can do this type of event. More often, we're in a classroom and not outdoors observing nature.

That's not to say the group's more scholarly get-togethers fall short of play. Remember, members are herb crazy. "We love herbs," says Noreen Miller, a master gardener who lives in Plymouth.

What, you ask, is there to love about herbs?

For one thing, they're potently fragrant. Most have strong eye-appeal.

Then, there's the plethora of ways—medicinal, therapeutic, decorative and culinary—for using herbs at home.

Miller, for instance, uses stevia, a natural sweetener, in place of sugar in iced tea and as a healthy snack alternative to satisfy her 5- and 8-year-old children's sweet tooth.

"They like it," Miller says, describing stevia as sweeter than raw sugar.

Herbs from Aumta Erskine's approximately 10 by 20-foot herb garden not only inspire culinary endeavors but also dry flower a range-neuts and potpourri.

The harvest not only improves the garden but your table," says Erskine, a docent at Matthaei Botanical Gardens who lives in Ann Arbor.

But it's the history of herbs as touchstones for human culture and mythology that most intrigues Erskine.

"I'm kind of interested in ethnobotany, the study of the way that people use plants and the relationship between them," says Erskine.

In the Middle Ages, for instance, it was believed an herb's appearance hinted at the injury or illness it could cure. The idea was called the Doctrine of Signatures.

Boneset, which happens to be native to the United States, has a big stem that pierces its own leaves, causing the belief it cured broken bones.

Boneset does, in fact, reduce fevers. And in colonial times it was ingested to fight a fever characterized by severe bone pain called break-bone fever.

So see, there are two different stories about one herb, says Erskine. "The history and stories give plants and herbs another dimension, a human dimension. That's why I like herbs."

More likely to marvel at an early 20th-century Tiffany lamp than a V-8 engine made in 1908?

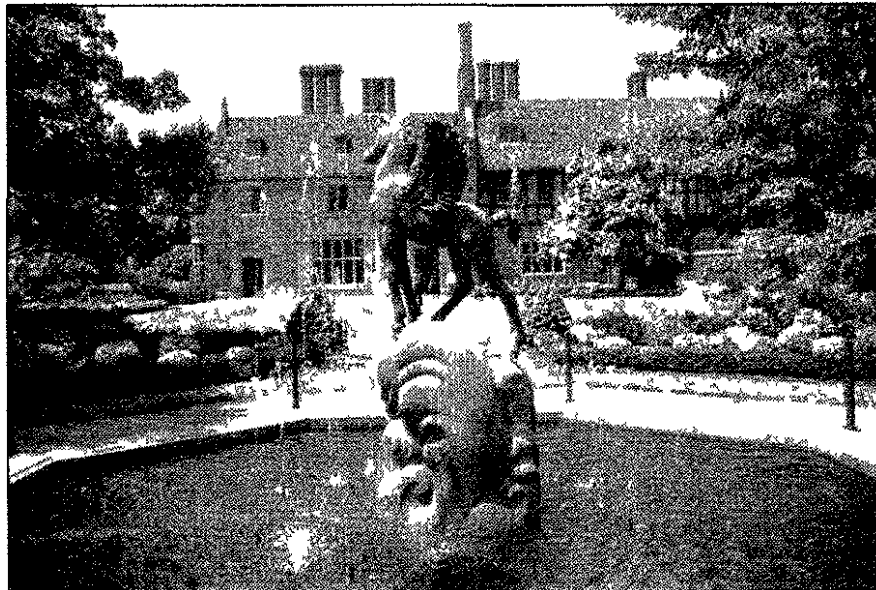
Then you still have good reason to attend the 24th Annual Concours d'Elegance auto show, scheduled Sunday, Aug. 4, on the grounds of Meadow Brook Hall in Rochester Hills.

The internationally renowned auto show features some of the world's finest collector cars, but it has more to offer than rare roadsters and classic Cadillacs.

Meadow Brook Hall, the 110-room mansion lovingly built by Matilda Dodge Wilson as a tribute to her late husband, automobile pioneer John Dodge, will be open for public tours all day.

In more ways than one, tours allow attendees with a limited interest in cars to stay in keeping with the spirit of Concours d'Elegance.

For instance, Pegasus, a bronze sculp-

And, the grandness of the house, built in the 1920s, alone speaks to the great beginnings of automotive history.

"It's just this perfect statement of time and place, of the so-called 'Gatsby period' and of the life of the automobile barons," said Lisa Baylis Ashby, Meadow Brook Hall chief curator and executive director.

First impressions of Meadow Brook Hall revolve around the house's cost—nearly \$4 million—and size—80,000 square feet with 39 brick chimneys serving 26 fireplaces.

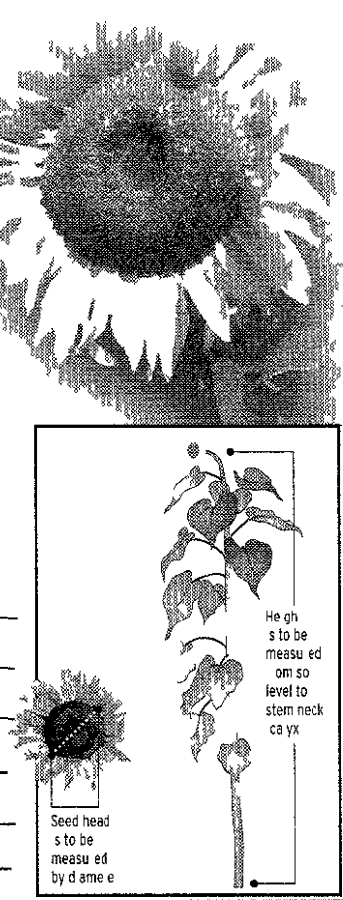

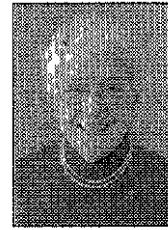

Small backyard garden is big on beauty, harmony

It's a labor of love, Pat Nickol of Birmingham says about her small backyard garden.

It may be small in size (90 feet by 20 feet), but that hasn't hindered Pat. She has used every available space to bring beauty and harmony to this bright setting.

Growing in this beautiful garden are many, many plants, including hostas, rhododendrons, Lady's mantle, Bells of Ireland (with chartreuse foliage and bloom), hibiscus and iris. A plant Pat calls hogwort has long, thin, green foliage and blue flowers.

At one end of the garden tall blue delphinium are striking with evergreens and small foliage plants forming the background. Nearby is a low, flower-shaped basin for the birds. A lovely little boy statue sits under a large tree and serves as a focal point. An adjacent area is filled with hydrangeas 'Nikko Blue,' peonies in pinks and whites and monkshood with blue flowers, and many roses.

A flagstone walk leads to the garden where several pots of plants grow profusely.

"I wanted bright yellow to reflect the sun and lots of color, so I used yellow daisy-like flowers in the top of a strawberry jar," Pat said.

Planted along with the yellow are deep blue ageratum, hot pink, purple and white petunias, aqua that has bluish purple foliage, white bacopa snowflake, white daisy-like argyranthemum, blue verbena and others. Some of the plants trail over the sides of the jar.

Pat didn't stop with one container. There are several that are beautifully planted and repeat the colors of the others.

At the entrance to the garden two tall brick columns hold planters, while two more sit at the base of the columns. They are filled with sherbet-type colors and echo the colors in the other pots. They bloom in lavender, white and pink as well as the sunny yellow.

And we mustn't forget the large strawberry jar filled with herbs such as parsley, thyme, basil, dill, cilantro and more. It sits on a step right outside a door.

"I have had the best luck this year with containers using potted soil that contains pellets to hold moisture and I fertilize every two weeks," Pat said. As I said, it's a labor of love. I spend about an hour and a half each day removing spent blooms so the beauty will continue for a long time.

There are many tricks that can be used when gardening in a small space to give the illusion of a large garden. Color, form and texture of plants all play an important role. As do the hardscapes, paths, decks, buildings, fences and borrowed backgrounds that blend in with the garden.

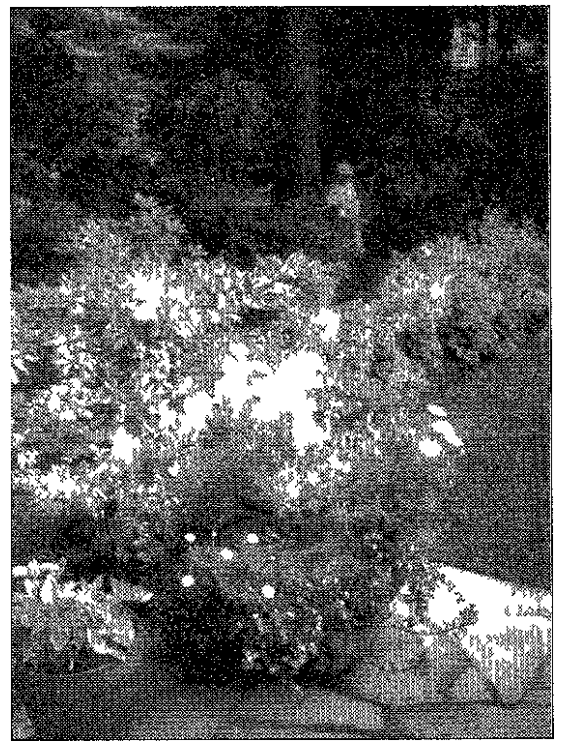

Shapes and textures add interest and need to be used in harmony. Tall plants will provide necessary contrast. Lacy foliage adds a light note, large leaves give stability, mounding shapes gently soften, and vertical or cone shapes make a statement rather like an exclamation point.

You can create a spectacular and satisfying garden that, although it hasn't actually grown in size, will look that way.

One special thing to remember when you plant a garden: Plant only those things that are pleasing to you, don't waste space on plants you don't like. Use accessories that are meaningful to you and your family.

GOODGARDEN TIP

Garden clubs as well as individuals will enjoy seeing how many plants perform at the All America Display Gardens across the country.

Exotic pest threat to ash tree identified locally

An exotic pest may be the culprit behind a rash of local ash tree deaths.

Federal and local officials say they have identified infestation by the Emerald Ash Borer, a beetle from Asia, in five south east Michigan counties, including Oakland and Wayne.

In recent years, there has been a significant loss of ash trees in southeast Michigan. Initially the deaths were attributed to a combination of disease, drought and soil conditions.

Though those factors may be in play, infestation by the Emerald Ash Borer is a likely additional reason.

To prevent the spread of the invasive species the Michigan Department of Agriculture has quarantined ash trees and their timber products, whether infested or not, to affected regions.

"The reason is you may not be able to tell whether it is infested," said Tim Flint, deputy director of the Pesticide and Plant Pest Management Division of the Michigan Department of Agriculture. Macomb, Livingston and

Washtenaw counties join Oakland and Wayne in the list of affected regions.

Under the quarantine, ash trees and their branches as well as ash logs and firewood, cannot be moved from an affected area without certification by the Michigan Department of Agriculture.

Violation of the quarantine is a misdemeanor, said Flint. And since it's difficult to identify the tree type when looking at firewood, residents of affected counties are advised to discontinue transporting all logs and timber.

Get your firewood locally. Flint advised local campers planning future trips.

Likewise, landscapers and commercial suppliers will be unable to transport ash trees from affected to unaffected regions.

Emerald Ash Borer adults are dark metallic green and about a half-inch in length and 1/16-inch in width. Their larvae are creamy white and found under tree bark.

Typically, the beetles go undetected until an affected tree shows symptoms of infestation.

In terms of what homeowners can do with infested ash

trees, there are not a lot of options, said Flint.

Most require the services of a commercial pest control company. However, no treatment has been proven effective thus far, he said.

While officials need to gather additional information about the pest, they believe it presents no danger to human beings.

The only known hazards are to the trees. And because we're familiar with related species we don't expect additional problems, Flint said. It's early on in the process and officials expect to know more and learn more.

Scraping by on a southern journey

We have traveled a lot for our children's chosen sports and when the kids were younger, we would make yearly pilgrimages to visit South Carolina Grandma. Weekends in the fall winter and spring now find us piling mom, dad, three kids and sometimes Michigan Grandma into the minivan to attend various gymnastics meets. We haul through Michigan, down the bumpy roads we call our own, as they lead us to meets in Michigan and other states. We struggle through all types of weather, we've been lost more than once but somehow we always seem to find our destination.

We are seasoned travelers. We think we know every trick.

We know to travel with an airsick bag, a first aid kit, a map published more recently than 1956, a bag of snacks and a cooler of soda pop and juices. But most of all, we know to bring a newspaper. Even in the heat of August. We're from Michigan. You never know when a blizzard is going to hit.

The weather was beautiful that April as we headed out of our Michigan home, my husband and I had no fears for our travels through the Smoky Mountains in the spring.

We never traveled light. We had every baby contraption we owned crammed into the trunk of our sedan and our son loved his blankets, several of them, so they were strewn across the back seat next to his car seat.

The trip was going nicely, the baby was happy as we made frequent play stops at fast food restaurants and rest areas. We weren't very concerned even when outside of Knoxville, Tenn., the snow started. As we drove further into the squall, we chatted about getting off, but felt confident to keep going. After all, we were from Michigan. Besides, we really wanted to make Asheville, N.C., for our overnight stop.

Swords, cannons and...choreography

Many highland dances though graceful and stylish actually have their origins in Scottish battle. Here are some stories about how highland dances started.

HIGHLAND FLING

This dance originated as a wild dance of triumph following a battle victory. It is said to be inspired by the capers of the stag, with the dancers upraised arms representing animal antlers. The highly stylized dance calls for technical skill and exact timing and because it was originally performed atop a clansmen's shield, it should be performed in the same position on the board. It has become the classic solo dance at modern competitive dance events and is often used to select the best dancer of the day.

SWORD DANCE

Also called the "Ghillie Chalum," this dance, like the Highland Fling, also is inspired by war. One legend tells of Malcolm Canmore, after having defeated one of the MacBeth chiefs at the battle of Dunsinane in 1054, seized his opponent's sword, placed it over his own and formed a cross over which he danced triumphantly to pipe music.

SEANN TRIUBHAS

Pronounced Shawn Fluews and defined as "no trousers," this dance is associated with the period of 1746 to 1782. Following the rebellion of 1745, Scots were forbidden to wear ancient highland dress and instead had to wear trousers. The first part of the dance is supposed to mock the restrictions imposed by trousers, while the second part exhibits the freedom of movement allowed by a kilt.

HIGHLAND REEL

This group dance has many variations and originated for recreational, rather than military purposes. Legend has it that the reel originated outside a locked church, and was performed by chilly parishioners as a method of keeping warm while waiting for a tardy clergyman.

REEL OF TULLOCH, STRATHSPEY

These unique, colorful dances were committed to memory and handed down by word of mouth. Dancers of all ages and earn prizes in day-long competition beginning at 9 a.m.

Deadly issue

Family, Plymouth group push for label law on food allergens

In all respects, Jacob McGladdery looks and acts like a perfectly healthy child.

But the 10-year-old lives with something that affects all aspects of his life, from what he eats to where he can sit during lunch time at school. He's allergic to all tree nuts, mangoes, wintergreen and peanuts, an allergy so severe that even trace amounts cause grave illness.

It's called anaphylaxis, a word that literally means "without protection," explains registered nurse Anne Russell, who is executive director of Food Anaphylaxis Education in Plymouth.

It is a potentially life-threatening reaction," she said. "People have died from it."

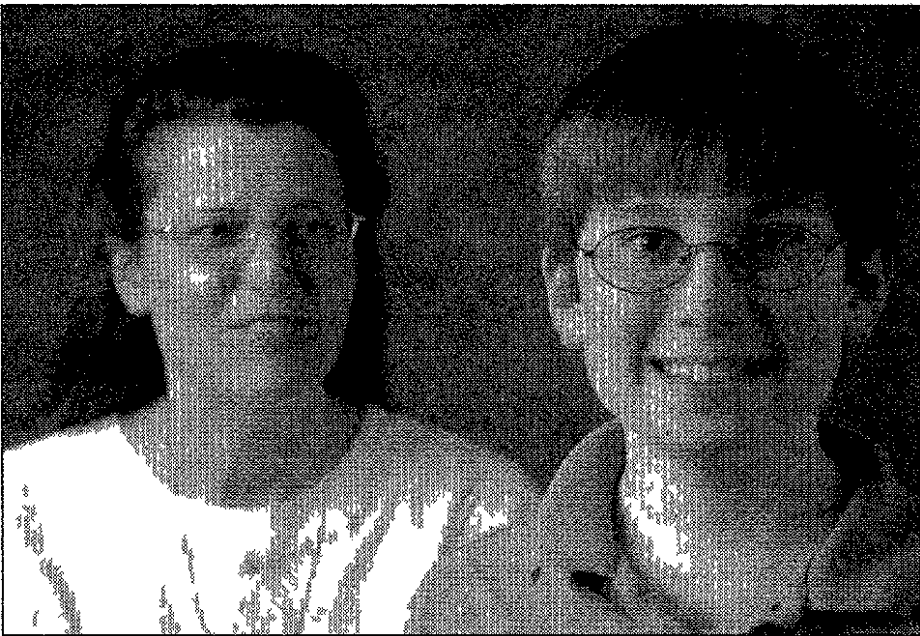
Russell has a son with food-induced anaphylaxis, so she knows what parents Sharon and Marty McGladdery go through every day.

Sharon carries a pack around her waist that contains Jacob's health information and medication that could relieve the symptoms of a reaction and allow precious minutes to get him to a hospital.

But that's just the tip of the iceberg. Jacob's condition affects virtually every aspect of the family's life.

"The way we buy food is I pick a product, I call them up, look at the website or mail them and ask what is their allergen policy," Sharon said.

She asks questions like whether the company lists trace ingredients on their labels. Canned tuna, for instance, contains casein, which is derived from milk and can cause a reaction.

Traces of allergens can also show up when companies manufacture different types of foods, food labels and company-provided information may not provide warnings about the possibility of cross-contamination.

"We only buy from companies that list traces and allergens," Sharon said. "The companies that give me a quick

response (when she contacts them about their allergen policies) that's what I buy from."

That can make life difficult for a kid bombarded with images of tasty treats every day. Jacob has adapted, however.

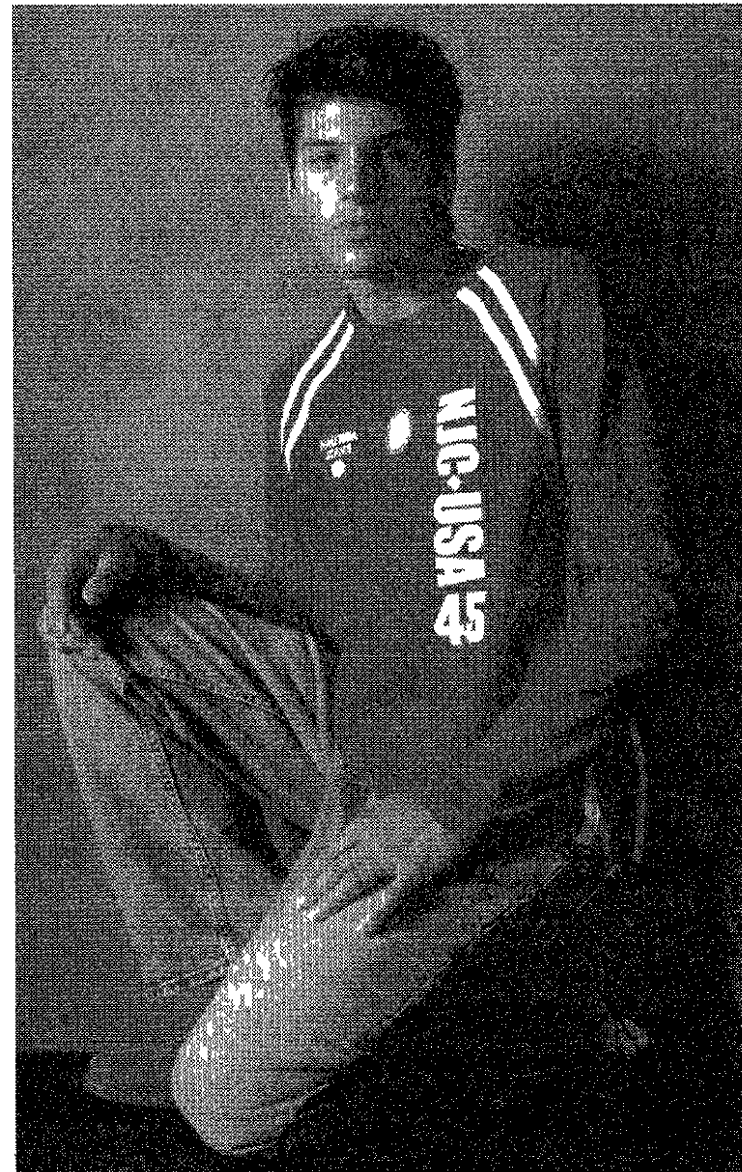
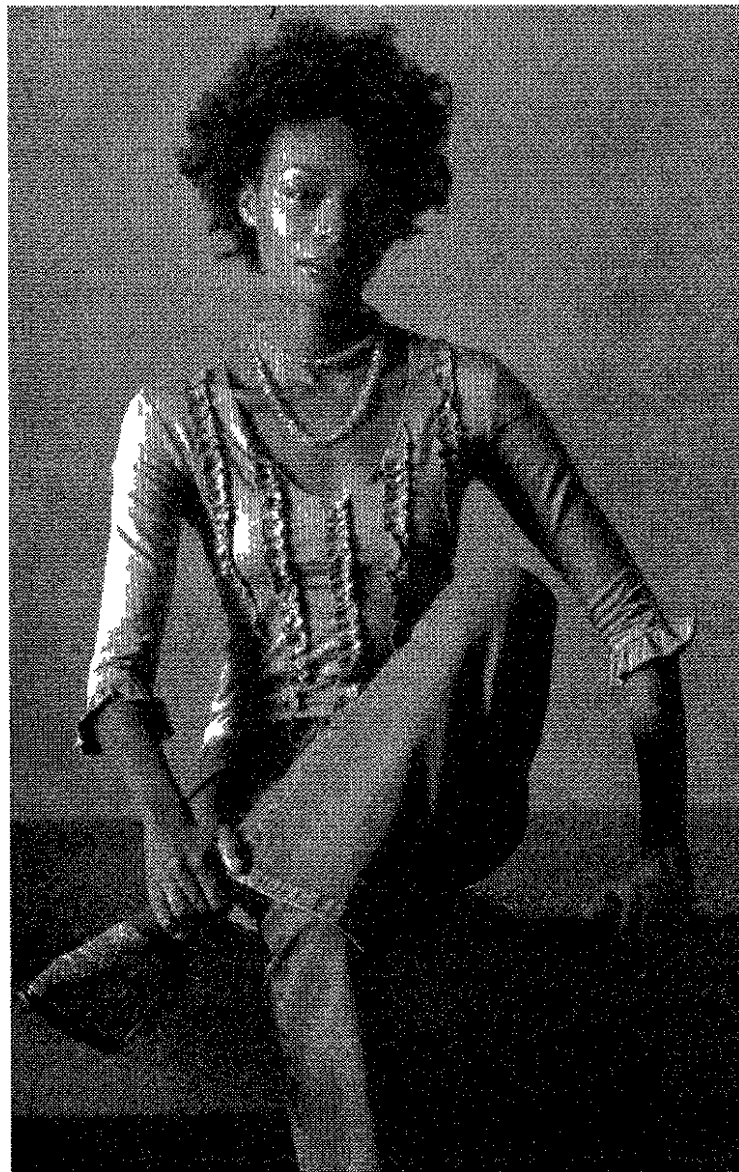

He makes his own peanut butter cups, using soy butter.

The McGladders' journey began on Aug 15, 1998. Six-and-a-half-year-old Jacob had just a taste of a mixed nut cookie and knew something was very wrong.

"Immediately his mouth was stinging," Sharon said. "He rinsed his mouth out. He didn't swallow any of it, but he still

threw up and congested and coughed. He felt terrible. That's another sign of anaphylaxis, a feeling of impending doom."

Three hours later, Jacob was covered in hives, everywhere except below his elbows and knees. He got medical care before the end stage - when the victim's blood pressure drops to zero and breathing stops when the bronchial tubes close up.

Because anaphylaxis is unpredictable, Sharon urges anyone who has had even a

mild reaction to a food to consult a good allergist and get tested. She's heard stories about people who died because they failed to get help for an anaphylactic reaction.

Sharon preaches the gospel of prevention as well, educating other parents and students, who may wonder why Jacob can't even sit near a child who's having peanut butter for lunch. Sensitivity to a food can be so great that even touching trace amounts can cause a reaction.

She's also lobbying for the Food Allergen Consumer Protection Act (HR 4704 and S 2499), a federal bill that would improve food labeling through mandatory regulation, as opposed to the voluntary compliance that now exists. wheat, soy, peanuts and other nuts. She waited until her son was 4 years old before introducing him to peanut butter, because she knew he was allergic prone.

"At 4, he had his first lick of peanut butter, and within 11 minutes, he was in the emergency room," she recalled. In the last two years, FAE has become a lifeline for about 200 families who've had similar experiences. Though primarily in southeast Michigan, Russell says the local group is growing. The primary national organization was formed only 10 years ago.

"Not every state has an organization like this," she said.

A registered 501(c)3 nonprofit, FAE advocates for food labeling reform and early diagnosis of food allergies.

"The way we'd like to see it happen is the kids are identi-

fied early on as allergy-prone, and hopefully they visit an allergist and get testing," Russell said.

Education outreach includes a website (www.faem1.org) and newsletters during the school year, which include a section to which members can contribute their stories. "Listening to the children" gives kids an opportunity to share their thoughts about the issue. Plymouth-Canton school nurse Mary Huber, RN, also writes a column that deals with the school experience for kids with anaphylaxis.

"We try to have representatives from a multi-disciplinary approach," Russell said. "We're very much involved in getting into the Michigan Association of School Nurses conference. The whole idea is to get the facts out so that when families go to their schools, there isn't that look of disbelief."

"On the outside, the kids almost all look perfectly fine. There's an air of unreality, and to a certain extent, I can understand this. What's hard on the families is, it's one thing to be ignorant. It's another to ridicule. A lot of snap judgments are made. People don't always take the time to think it through."

At six the next morning, the traffic began to creep ahead. We eventually made it into Asheville, where a Holiday Inn provided heat, light, a bathroom less than 50 yards away, and a Holdome for the tiny little one-year-old who was rested and ready to go.

After we arrived, my husband grabbed the trusty snow scraper and instantly became the most popular guy around. Travelers from north and south, east and west envied the tool my husband held. 

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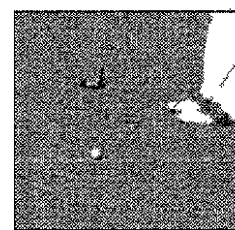

Bucks tumble to Boulder in OT penalty kicks

The scenario could not have been more perfect for the Mid-Michigan Bucks. A strong ending to their regular season swept them into the Premier Development League soccer playoffs, although their first match was against the No. 1-ranked team in the PDL, the Des Moines Menace, and in Des Moines Iowa, no less. But the Bucks rose to the challenge, utilizing a defense that had been missing all season to shut down the

Menace, 3-1 last Friday. That put the Bucks into the Western Conference final against the Boulder (Colo.) Rapid Reserve, who upset the best defensive team in the PDL, the Chicago Fire Reserve, 2-1 in Friday's other conference semifinal in Des Moines. Which meant for the Bucks to reach the PDL's national semifinals, they had to beat a team that, like themselves, finished

second in their division. And there was more good news after that — not a single top seed survived the conference playoffs.

A PDL national championship was beckoning the Bucks, who had previously lost in the PDL finals once and in the semifinals twice.

But it was not to be. For the first time this season, the Bucks shut out their opponent, only to see the Rapid Reserve do the same to them. Ninety minutes of regulation and 30 minutes of sudden-death overtime resolved nothing, indeed,

it took nine penalty kicks before a winner emerged, and it was the Rapid Reserve by a 7-6 margin.

The Bucks finish their season at 12-6-2, reaching the PDL's Final Eight for the fifth time in their seven-year history.

It's the ultimate irony, said Bucks co-owner/general manager Jim Duggan: "We went 19 games without a shutout, probably our worst streak ever, and we finally get one and we lose."

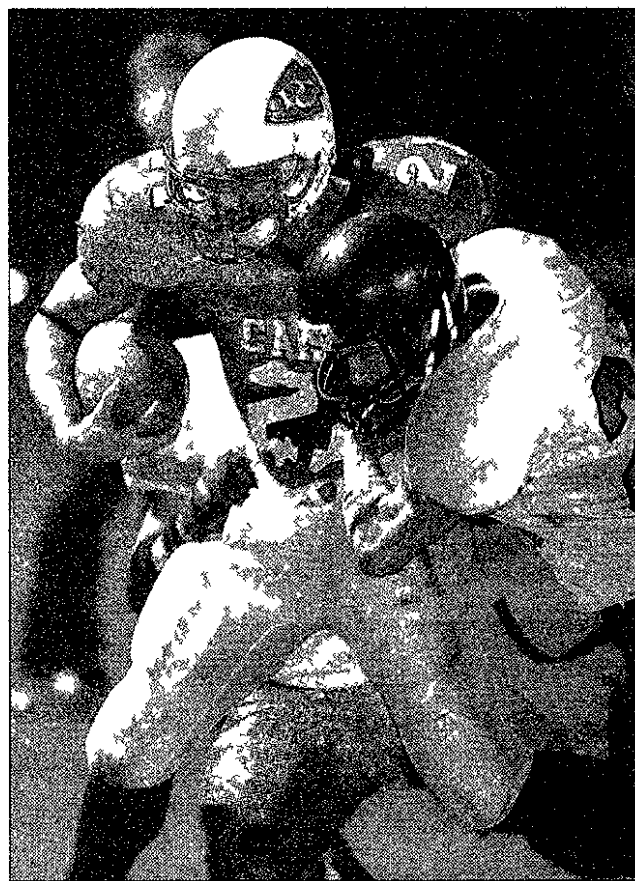
When the East team is on offense, there's a good chance someone from the Observer area will be handling the ball. All five players from Observerland are backfield players: quarterback

If only I was a good enough bowler I would run, not walk, down to Vision Lanes on Ford Road in Westland and sign up for the new scratch league being formed, with the added prize

League. As of now, twelve teams are signed up and they are looking for four more. Miller Brewing is adding \$5,000 to the prize fund, evenly distributed to all members. Silver Streak: Great Lakes anglers lose a great innovator

Chuck Cartwright will be remembered by anglers across the Great Lakes as an innovator, a sportsman and an accomplished fisherman.

Cartwright, of Orchard Lake, founded Wolverine Tackle Company and invented the Silver Streak trolling spoon - one of the most popular trolling

spoons on the Great Lakes today. Sadly, Chuck lost his battle with cancer earlier this month.

I met the man known to many as 'Mr. Silver Streak' many years ago at a local fishing show and interviewed him a few years back for an article about his tackle business.

He was always upbeat, cordial and accommodating, and always had time to chat about the sport of fishing or the fishing industry.

Chuck ran a charter boat - Tuna Boat Charters - on Lake Michigan in the early 1980s and enjoyed great success as the Great Lakes trout and salmon fisheries flourished. He witnessed firsthand the suc-

cessful innovation and fool-hearted failure of others who were trying to make a living in the Great Lakes fishing industry. While running his charter business, Chuck also worked as a field tester for Lure Jensen and other top fishing tackle manufacturers. One day some 20 years ago he grew tired of giving other people his ideas and opted to take matters into his own

hands. He decided to 'build a better mouse trap.'

Chuck retreated to his home on Cass Lake and eventually emerged with the concept of the Silver Streak spoons.

Over the years Chuck watched his business grow. His spoons have garnered international attention from lure distributors from as far away as Finland, Norway and Australia. He also distributes them to the west coast, Alaska and throughout the Great Lakes region.

Chuck's first batch of Silver Streak spoons was made from 50 pounds of brass, which resulted in approximately 1,200 spoons. Today, his company produces over 250,000 Silver Streak spoons annually.

Chuck's entire family, including his wife Arleen, daughter Kim and sons Chip and Chris, helped with the family business, which employs between 10-20 people, depending on the season.

Chuck left behind a loving family and an army of friends and acquaintances.

He will be remembered and missed, and his legacy will live on forever in the waters and the fishing boats of the Great Lakes.

DEER HARVEST NUMBERS

Lack of snow and unseasonably warm weather throughout most of last year's deer seasons resulted in a 14 percent decline in the state's overall harvest compared to 2000, according to the DNR.

Citing the 2001 Michigan Deer Harvest Survey - sent out randomly to some 50,000 licensed deer hunters - as well as field reports, traffic survey results, and numbers from highway check stations and field offices, the DNR says hunters killed 463,706 white-tails during the combined seasons of 2002.

But there could be a silver lining here. Since last year's harvest was down, and since we had very little seasonal die-offs from last year's relatively mild winter - even in the Upper Peninsula - the outlook for the upcoming fall deer season should be outstanding with the herd holding between 1.7 and 1.9 million animals.

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

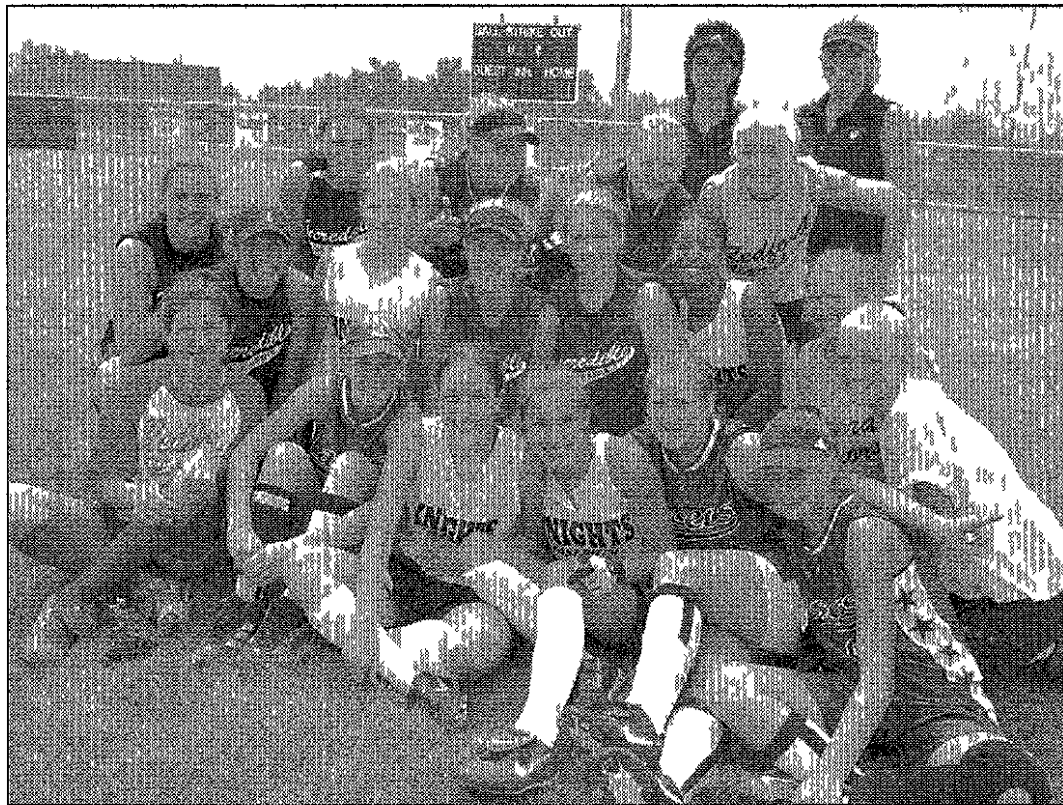

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING MINORS FROM BEING TRUANT FROM SCHOOL IN PUBLIC PLACES PROVIDING FOR AN ENFORCEMENT PROCEDURE AND FOR PARENTAL OBLIGATIONS PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES REPEAL SEVERABILITY PUBLICATION AND EFFECTIVE DATE.

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF CANTON ORDAINS

SECTION 1 TRUANCY

This section declares the need for truancy enforcement.

SECTION 2 TRUANCY IN A PUBLIC PLACE, MINOR, EXCEPTIONS

- A This section prohibits truancy by any student under seventeen (17) years of age.
- B This section defines truancy as being in a public place during school hours.
- C This section exempts students who live with a parent or has any other legal custody.

SECTION 3 ENFORCEMENT PROCEDURE PARENTAL OBLIGATIONS

- A This section provides for a court hearing with a parent guardian or legal custodian.
- B This section requires the parent guardian or legal custodian's attendance at the hearing.
- C This section requires parent guardian or legal custodians to monitor school attendance of the minor.

SECTION 4 VIOLATION AND PENALTY

This section provides that any person or entity that violates any provision of this Ordinance may, upon conviction be fined not more than Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars or imprisoned not more than Ninety (90) days or both in the discretion of the court.

SECTION 5 REPEAL

This section provides that all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

SECTION 6 SEVERABILITY

This Section provides that any unenforceable section can be severed from the rest of the Ordinance.

SECTION 7 SAVINGS CLAUSE

This Section provides that adoption of this Ordinance does not affect proceedings prosecutions for violation of law penalties and matured rights and duties in effect before the effective date of this Ordinance.

SECTION 8 PUBLICATION

This section provides that the Clerk for the Charter Township of Canton shall cause this Ordinance to be published in the manner required by law.

SECTION 9 EFFECTIVE DATE

This section provides that this Ordinance as amended, shall take full force and effect upon publication as required by law.

A PROPOSAL TO AMEND THE PROVISION OF THE STATE CONSTITUTION GOVERNING THE OPERATION OF THE STATE OFFICERS' COMPENSATION COMMISSION (SOCC)

The proposed constitutional amendment would:

- Add Attorney General and Secretary of State to list of state officials whose salaries and expense allowances are determined by the SOCC. The list currently includes the State Legislature, Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and Supreme Court Justices.
- Require the legislature to approve by majority vote any salary and expense allowance determinations proposed by the SOCC before determinations go into effect. Currently the SOCC's determinations go into effect unless rejected by 2/3 vote of legislature.
- Allow legislature to reduce compensation increases proposed by the SOCC.
- Provide that the SOCC's salary and expense determinations would take effect after the next general election.

PROPOSAL 02-2

A PROPOSAL TO ALLOW CERTAIN PERMANENT AND ENDOWMENT FUNDS TO BE INVESTED AS PROVIDED BY LAW AND INCREASE ALLOWED SPENDING FOR STATE PARKS, LOCAL PARKS AND OUTDOOR RECREATION

The proposed constitutional amendment would:

- Allow certain permanent and endowment funds including Natural Resources Trust Fund, State Parks Endowment Fund and Veterans Trust Fund to be invested as provided by law eliminating prior restrictions on investing in stocks.
- Increase Natural Resources Trust Fund cap on assets from \$400 million to \$500 million.
- Allow the Natural Resources Trust Fund to continue to annually expend up to 33 1/3% of Fund royalties or other revenues up to a new asset cap of \$500 million.
- Increase allowed State Parks endowment Fund spending to include interest and earnings and up to 50% of funds received from Natural Resources Trust Fund.

JAIL MILLAGE RENEWAL

To renew the millage authorized in 1998 shall Wayne County be authorized to continue to levy this millage at the 2002 rollback rate of 9432 mills (about 94 cents per thousand dollars of taxable valuation) for ten more years (2002 through 2011) for any of the following previously authorized uses:

To acquire, construct and/or operate jail, misdemeanor or juvenile incarceration or detention facilities and for adult penalty options such as work release, home detention and community restitution with at least one tenth of the millage used to acquire, build and operate a juvenile offender work/training institution? WAYNE COUNTY RESA PROPOSAL K SPECIAL EDUCATION MILLAGE PROPOSAL

The following proposal asks voters to consider an additional 1.5 mills for mandated special education programs beginning in 2002. The current authorization of 2.00 mills which the voters approved a 1.00 mill in 1974 with an additional mill in 1988 has been rolled back to 1.872 mills through application of the Headlee Amendment to the Michigan Constitution. The funds would be restricted to supporting these mandated programs in Wayne County School Districts and reduce the reliance on the districts' general funds for this purpose.

Shall the limitation on the annual property tax rate previously approved by the electors of Wayne County Regional Educational Service Agency Michigan for the education of persons with disabilities be increased by 1.50 mills (\$1.50 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation)? The estimate of the revenue the intermediate school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in calendar year 2002 is approximately \$59,360,000.

Yes, fair housing laws apply

I'm wondering whether any segment of the Fair Housing Laws apply to condominium associations since we are private enterprises and it doesn't seem like the government has a right to legislate our behavior.

Fair Housing Laws apply to all community associations, condominiums, cooperatives and homeowners associations. The law prohibits discrimination based on disability or familial status in the sale, rental or provision of service in connection with the dwelling. Accordingly, community associations, including a common or association property, is subject to the law. The penalties for violating the law could be very severe - \$10,000 for the first offense, \$25,000 for a second and \$50,000 afterward. This is in addition to any damages or attorney fees which the person discriminated against could be awarded. We will talk about specifics in a subsequent column.

Home sales prices continued to hold their value in many northern and western suburbs through the first half of this year.

Mid-year sales prices stable

Residential sales prices here through the first half of this year compared to last remained fairly stable.

Realtors have reported greater lag time between listing and sales in recent months. But median (half above, half below) prices moved up or down within a 1-2 percent range or remained unchanged in many O&E communities at the mid-year measuring point.

Those municipalities included Farmington/Farmington Hills, Lake Orion/Orion Township, Southfield, Troy, Canton, Livonia and Westland. A couple of communities, Clarkston/Independence Township, Oakland Township and Garden City increased upwards of 8 percent.

Much residential construction is ongoing in the former two areas. New generally is pricier than existing, pushing median figures up. Garden City is considered a more affordable starter home community where demand drives price.

Prices were down 15 percent in Rochester, but up 7 percent in neighboring Rochester Hills, the latter also a high new home construction community.

Prices were up 21 percent in Bloomfield Hills, 6 percent in Birmingham and down 8 percent in Bloomfield Township.

Median figures in Bloomfield Township and West Bloomfield are averages of three submarkets, which can cloud statistical interpretation.

Also, some prices in Bloomfield Hills and Birmingham are grossly understated to maintain privacy, so sales medians can be misleading.

Here's a breakdown by community with the number of sales through the first half of this year in parenthesis, followed by median mid-year sales prices for 2002, 2001, 2000, 1999, 1998 and 1997, in that order.

The figures include new construction and existing homes, condominiums and houses. They don't include refinancings.

The numbers were provided by Realcomp II, a company that provides multi-listing services to the Western

Wayne/Oakland County, Metropolitan Consolidated, North Oakland Dearborn, Detroit and Livingston County realty boards.

Sales price of an individual home across municipal boundaries and within a community depends on type, age and condition, city/township services, public schools, general reputation, and supply and demand.

Sandy Norman, associate broker with Century 21 Town & Country in Birmingham, said the current market continues to reflect a leveling or equilibrium from tremendous appreciation between 1991 and 2001.

"I see the market as still very strong for \$300,000 and under, he said. "I don't think we're in a down market unless it's over \$1 million."

Uncertainty about employment prospects is the main reason for problems at the upper end, Norman said. Deterioration in the value of stock portfolios also has played a role, he added.

"What I see is not so much prices going down but just leveling off," concurred Joan Dawkins, associate broker with RE/MAX on the Trail in Plymouth.

"Nice homes - those updated, clean, well cared for, work put in - are still selling for asking price if they're reasonably priced," she said. "Those that aren't selling at all or taking big hits."

Job uncertainties, bonus cutbacks and losses in the stock market have made all buyers more cautious and choosier, Dawkins said.

Appraisers also are tougher "not expecting skyrocketing appreciation," she added. dfunke@oe.homecomm.net | (734) 953 2137

Timely actions save day

The familiar term "behind the power curve" has its roots in the aviation world, and refers to a hazardous situation in which pilots may rapidly approach a stall. Once in this situation, the doomed airplane continues to slow down even after adding full power.

To preclude disaster, a skilled pilot recognizes the situation before it becomes dangerous and avoids it. Unwary pilots who find themselves in this flight domain have no choice but to descend to save themselves. With luck, they have altitude to do so.

I love analogies, and this one is very relevant to this current refinance market. With interest rates near their 40-year lows, everybody with a mortgage seems to be on the phone researching their mortgage options - a truly excellent idea.

Borrowers today are naturally looking to better their mortgage interest, but a very large number are also looking to restructure debt, or to pay off high-interest debts with a lower-interest, tax-deductible mortgage.

Of late, I have unfortunately heard from a number of borrowers who haven't acted on their rapidly rising debts in a timely manner. They wisely chose to restructure their debt load, but they took action way too late to land the best possible interest rates and terms.

In other words, they let their debts get out of control before they acted. They got behind the power curve.

Fair Isaac & Company's credit scoring modules are the machines that generate "fico" scores. Fair Isaac uses mathematical algorithms that evaluate different borrower risk factors.

Borrowers running very high credit card balances should expect to see their credit scores drop. The more credit cards they max out, the more their scores can drop.

Beware. Closing credit cards accounts that are paid off can often make scores drop, too. Closing these accounts increases the ratio of used credit to available credit the same as if these borrowers were actually running up their balances.

Lake flying, try to stay ahead of the power curve by restructuring your debts before they get out of control, and before your credit scores drop. Waiting too long could really place you in jeopardy.

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Fences may come with restrictions

(AP) - The poet Robert Frost wrote, "Good fences make for good neighbors." Good fences also provide a margin of safety and security.

While keeping your children and pets on your property - or a specified area - a good fence also provides reverse safety by preventing other kids and pets from wandering into your yard where unsupervised activity could lead to injury and liability.

A fence also provides a good first line of security defense by discouraging would-be intruders, visually by shielding valuables from sight and physically as a barrier against all but the most determined individuals.

Once you have decided to build a fence, it's imperative you first do some checking

on local building codes, zoning laws and deed restrictions to determine what exactly is allowed.

Also, inquire as to any specific local rulings and/or requirements for choice of materials, post-hole footings, picket spacing and setback distances from the street, curbs or property lines.

Besides the above, zoning laws in many municipalities dictate the maximum acceptable height for fences.

Often, for example, a front-yard fence cannot exceed 42 inches. There might also be regional requirements you need to know about, such as the minimum and maximum depth of footings - based on the frost line in your region or to meet earthquake standards - and

safety issues for special hazards.

Fencing for special hazards includes cordoning off swimming pools, spas and wells to name but a few areas that require extra precaution.

Homeowners insurance coverage often dictates that certain fence requirements be met to keep your policy in full force. So, be sure to check with your insurance agent before getting underway.

Your new fence should be attractive on both sides. Choose its design with care and be aware that some codes even specify that the finished side must face your neighbor's property.
