Schools eye artificial turf for field

A synthetic grass surface may be in the works for the varsity football stadium at Plymouth-Canton Educational Park The school district has received permission from the state Department of Treasury to use \$1 3 million from the 1997 bond issue passed by voters to construct Plymouth High School

"Soon we will have three high school football teams, three boys varsity soccer teams, three girls varsity soccer teams and the marching band using the same field,' interim superintendent Jim Ryan said "The question is, can we handle all the games on that field the way it is? We believe an artificial surface will be a good investment for our students'

Last year, a football game had to be canceled because of an unsafe playing surface, and a marching band competition had to be moved to South Lyon as a result of a muddy field

The real problem, according to Ken Jacobs, the district's executive director of support services, is two-fold

The track has areas where it's caved it, and is unusable We just can't make any more repairs to it," said Jacobs "It's a problem with the drains Some of the drains under the football field are collapsing as it goes underneath the track in certain locations'

The field needs to be torn up to repair the drains and build a new track. The second problem is there are too many teams using the field

"It wasn't able to hold up with two schools using the field,' said Jacobs "What will happen when we add more

Teens talk about their experiences with drinking



As summer interns for the Observer Greg Migliore Katy Batdorff and Christine Broda wanted to give a voice to young adults willing to talk about their experi ences with alcohol. The young adults pro filed in the following stories live right here in our own backyard. Over the course of this two part series which appears today and Thursday take the time to get to know these young adults and to under stand what life is like in their own words

At about 11 p m on July 19, four cars rolled into the parking lot of a Sunoco gas station in Canton

This was not a typical Friday night for the dozen teenagers who piled out of the vehicles, talking on cell phones Usually by this time they would have found a place to hang out, a place where they would be free to party and drink with friends

"Everything went so wrong – it'd be off the hook at my house right now," Casper, 22, said, lamenting the evening's dire partying prospects

Casper's original plan to throw a bash at his house was foiled when his parents didn't leave town as expected

While others repeatedly dialed numbers, trying to

reach someone who might know of something going on, Drew, 17, leaned against the hood of his friend's car Although he had come all the way from his home in Port Huron to hang out with friends, he was apparently unfazed by the lack of party destination

Rather, Drew was looking forward to enjoying the fifth of E J Brandy VS O P he was about to split with his friend, Matt, 18, of Plymouth

"That's my s ," he said, explaining that E J Brandy chased with Pepsi is his favorite drink

Although he is well under the legal drinking age, Drew has developed a preference for liquor since he started drinking at age 12

Tye been hanging out with an older crowd all my life,' he said, explaining that many of his initial drinking experiences stemmed from the influence of his brother, who is three years older

"My dad knows (I drink) and my mom probably has her suspicions, but I tell her I don't like it," he said "My dad doesn t mind and my mom probably wouldn't care - shes an alcoholic

Drew dropped out of high school after 10th grade and started working 50 hours per week at a restaurant He says he plans to go back to school for his GED after he turns 18

'THE CAPTAIN MAKES IT HAPPEN'

Joe, 16, of Canton, shares Drew's taste for liquor His favorite is Captain Morgan's rum The captain makes it happen," he said

In a pinch, however, he said he will drink just about anything and usually gets alcohol from older friends

Joe dropped out of Wayne Memorial High School after the ninth grade because of 'weed and dumb stuff" and is now home-schooled He said he was athletic in middle school and played on the basketball team

Joe started drinking after getting caught with marijuana and said he would probably stop drinking for the same reason

First look Open house offers glimpse of new high school

Plymouth High School opened its doors for the first time on Tuesday to throngs of students and parents eager to see the new building they'll call home for the next four years

In an effort to make the transition to high school smooth for the first-ever Wildcat class, PHS hosted an open house for incoming freshmen and their parents to tour the new facilities as well as meet members of administration, counselors, teachers and coaches

"This is what we've been waiting for, to see the kids' faces when they see this building for the first time," said Barb Zdrodowski, secretary to PHS Principal Michael T Bee "This 15 what all the hard work has

According to Zdrodowski, all the long days and nights spent preparing for the open house and the upcoming school year paid off when she felt the energy of the crowd packed into the student union Tuesday night

We are just filling this room, it's phenomenal," Zdrodowski said, explaining that she sent out more than 460 invitations for the event "And what an incredible turnout from the staff - this is fabulous

WILDCAT SPIRIT

Bee kicked off the evening with a spirited welcome to future Wildcat students and parents After expressing his excitement about the upcoming year, the new principal introduced members of the faculty

and coaching staff, many of whom were clad in the school's colors of black and silver According to Bee, the pur-

pose of the night was two-fold 'We wanted to allow our stu-

dents and parents to see their high school building first," he said "We've worked all last year meeting with the middle schoolers and this is the next step in that relationship'

Like Zdrodowski, Bee was enthusiastic about the night as well as the students' response to the forthcoming year

'I think they've got a most marvelous place to learn,' he said "I could not have better hand-picked a group (of faculty) if I had the whole world to choose from'

Bee said the message he wanted to send to freshmen was "be involved, be involved, be involved

There's something for everyone, he said '(Students) need to take advantage of that"

English teacher Marybeth Turner agrees opportunities for students at Plymouth are exciting because everything is so new That's one reason she transferred to Plymouth after teaching at Salem for four years

"I loved Salem I was enormously happy there but it's fun to do something new," she said "The opportunity to be founding faculty in a new building is so rare I think it'll be a really fun opportunity

Turner is most excited about the energy of the new students

"Their enthusiasm is contagious," she said "We had a really great turnout tonight They were really itching to get into this building"

NEW TRADITIONS

Turner will also serve as advisor to the Plymouth Executive Council, the student government body that presides over individual class councils According to her, the group of about 20 students has already met to work on plans for homecoming

"We're starting a lot of traditions, it's really very exciting," she said "We want to try and make it different'

On the sports side of things, Athletic Director Terry Sawchuk said he was gearing up for a great first year of athletics at the new school

"The interest (in sports) has been unbelievable,' Sawchuk said "We have great numbers (of athletes) so far'

Sawchuk joined the rest of the coaching staff in recruiting middle school students for PHS athletics throughout last school year And although all Wildcat teams will field only freshmen the first year. Sawchuk said he expected Plymouth athletes to be competitive on the freshmen and junior varsity level

'The key for us is that we have high expectations for our kids, he said 'We expect them to work harder because they're behind the eight ball a little bit But we've summoned a pretty good staff (and) all the coaches are supportive of each other" Incoming freshman Sean

Dillon is one student-athlete looking forward to starting high school as a Wildcat

"It's exciting to be the first to do everything," the Canton resident said, explaining that he plans to play soccer for Plymouth in the fall and has already been conditioning with the team for a few weeks

In addition to soccer, Dillon's mom, Elaine, is looking forward to all the opportunities available at the new school She's particularly excited about the library, computer labs and state-of-the-art technology

But except for less crowded halls and smaller class sizes, Elaine said she didn't expect the high school experience to be that different for freshmen like her son

"I don't think there will be a lot of change," she said "It's up to the individual and what he makes of it"



According to the Michigan Municipal League, the governors veto means the City of Plymouth would lose \$450,000, which is 42 percent of the total revenue sharing

money received from the state Plymouth Township stands to lose more than \$700,000, or 27 percent

Commissioners unanimously passed a resolution urging the state legislature to override Englers veto

"The legislature already cut over \$200,000 of our budget,

said Commissioner Ron Loiselle 'That's near 10 percent Thats a huge amount for us to cut without reducing things like fire, police, the kinds of services we want as citizens

Mayor Pro-Tem Colleen Pobur blames Engler for putting communities in the middle of a political game

Its really disappointing and disheartening that the governor would make something this important a political football, said Pobur

A lot of communities are in really, really dire shape, and the cuts in revenue sharing is a threat


'He did this to give his lieu-

tenant governor (Dick Posthumous) a leg up in the election process, and I find it vile,' added Pobur "I think there's no question in my mind the veto will be overridden ' Commissioners want a veto

Thats the same logic that led to South Lyon spending \$630,000 to install artificial turf on its football field last summer Superintendent William Pearson, who remembers the muddy field conditions when his daughter was a member of the Plymouth Canton Marching Band said the weather is just too unpredictable and the upkeep too expensive

You get a limited amount of days you can use the field in the fall and we knew we had football soccer the band and local community groups that wanted to use it said Pearson It looks gorgeous, and you don t have to spend a

lot of money on maintenance The amount of money to put it in is not insignificant, but it's well worth it "

Ryan said the board may discuss the issue at its Aug 27 meeting 'If the board decides to move forward, we need to get bids out by December, so we can install it next summer,' said Ryan "If all goes well, we ll have a new artificial surface for soccer and football, and a new track around the surface, by the fall of 2003

Part of the Plymouth High School construction included building a new football stadium complete with lights press box and concession stand However the district promised North Pointe subdi vision residents, who live next to the stadium, the facility

would be used only to play junior varsity games to cut down on noise and traffic

School board Trustee Judy Mardıgıan ısn't certain spending more than a million dollars on the artificial turf is the best use of district money

I'm not an expert on turf science, but maybe we can explore other options for the field," she said "I think the money could be better spent inside the buildings, or purchasing additional buses'

Ryan believes that with the improvements to the track and football field, as well as the newly constructed baseball fields at the high school complex, along with other amenities like restroom facili ties and ticket booths, Plymouth Canton could put itself in a position to host playoffs and league meets





At 10 55 p m on July 24 Tim stood in the bedroom of his Ann Arbor apartment clutching a beer a football tucked under the arm of his free hand

According to the soon to be 21 year old it was his second beer of the night So far his shot count was up to six

Since he started drinking shortly after 9 30 p m the University of Michigan senior had consumed a total of eight alcoholic drinks

And the night was far from over

Ten minutes after the bedroom scene Tims roommate Trevor wrestled the football away from him on the balcony of their third story apartment Tim fought hard to maintain control of the pigskin but in the end all he had to show for his efforts was a spilt beer Trevor raced back into the apartment arms raised in victory shouting Score'

Tim dutifully made his way to the kitchen while a third friend poured him in lei sho. This took a deep breath threw back his he id downed the Bacardi and chased it with a long drink of water

The events unfolding that night were not part of some bizarre hazing ritual but they were a sort of rite of passage

As is common practice for many young people on the eve of their 21st birthday Tim was preparing to celebrate his right to

Mother and son made then way to a long table in the back of the restaurant Before even taking then seats Bub flagged down a waiter and ordered her son his first legal drink a large lime margarita with salt

The first to arrive was called a Stoplight and it came in three separate shooter glasses – Southern Comfort and cranberry juice for the red light vodka and orange juice for the yellow light and comes from and that s my specialty

At 1 10 a m the waiter came by to check on the birthday boy again and told him to take it easy

Do me a favor – slow up a little he said to Tim, explaining that he could stay until last call at 2 a m if necessary ANOTHER LAST CALL

Ten minutes and two shots later, Tim announced he was ready to go After a quick bathroom break Tim and company made their way to another bar down the street

We re hittin another last call right now he said, explaining that this next bar was the fun place

I ve been here eight seven eight or nine times,' he recalled With a Bud Light in his hand at 1 40 a m Tim reflected on the events of the night

I m excited that it's my birthday, but I ve done this same exact thing before Tim said. The thing that was the coolest was that my mom came – I loved that

Tim explained that although he got fairly intoxicated, he still managed to stay in control of himself and the evening

I stood up to my filends – they were pushing me to do shots," he said At the bai I was selective with my shots I drank more than usual but I didn t max out I wanted to have fun and I did

also wanted to stay in control In less than half an hour, Tim would be reaching a significant milestone Although

ones 21st birthday is an event anx iously anticipated by many young adults Tim said he didn t really feel melon liqueur and Sprite for the green light

By 12 40 a m two more rounds of shots were lined up in fiont of Tim whose smile was becoming increasingly more broad This time the birthday boy downed a Prairie Fire (tequila and Tabasco sauce) followed by a Three Wise Men (Jack Daniels Jim Beam and Jose Cuervo) KNOWING LIMITS

When a shot called The Dragon (151 and Tabasco sauce) arrived a few minutes later Tim recognizing his limits and antic ipating his intolerance for the potent drink hid the glass behind a stack of menus

I can't do shots of anything – I gag Tim said as he sucked down water through a straw The warter had brought him the large pitcher of water and as a measure of safety told Tim to wait at least 10 minutes between shots

The waiter explained that a lot of 21 year olds come to Charlies to celebrate their birthday and the restaurant has a policy to keep the new drinkers safe and under control

We see a lot of twenty ones" the waiter said We re told to keep it responsible at all times but we want them to have fun Glancing over at Tim he added But the last thing I want is for


him to throw up at my table because I have to clean it up At the other end of the table Tim's mom who was socializing

An hour into his actual birthday on the 25th the shots appeared to be taking their toll on Tim After downing a fruity shot that consisted of peach schnapps cranberry juice and Jagermeister Tim tried to explain he liked it because it smelled good

because the sense of smell comes from oh wart I m drunk - I can t even remember what part of the brain it (sense of smell)



To avoid drinking and driving Tim and his friends walked everywhere they went even to a party after the bar closed to continue drinking

consequences

While college students may not think they're doing themselves harm by "binge" drinking, consuming too much alcohol in too little time can have serious physical consequences.

According to the National Institute on Alcohol and Alcoholism the US government's recommended "safe" levels for alcohol consumption are one drink per day for women and two drinks per day for men One bottle of beer, one 5 ounce glass of wine or 1 5 ounces of 80-proof liquor all meet the definition of a 'standard drink."

Binge drinking is defined by researchers as five or more drinks in a row for men and four or more for women. A 180pound man's blood alcohol level will be approximately .04 after two drinks and will rise to 11, well over the legal limit, after five

For women, the effects of alcohol can be impairing after just two drinks A 140-pound woman, for instance, would have a blood alcohol level of 09 after only three drinks.

The Web site www collegedrinkingnews.net relates results of a Harvard School of Public Health College Alcohol Study, which showed two out of five students on college campuses binge drink

Alcohol is involved in two-thirds of college student suicides and 95 percent of violent crime on campus. Alcohol is involved in 90 percent of campus rapes, according to Columbia University's National Center on Addiction and Substance Abuse A study on campus rape published in the Journal of American College Health found 73 percent of the assailants and 55 percent of rape victums used alcohol or other drugs prior to the assault

Three out of four non-binge drinkers and abstainers who hved in dormitories or fraternities and sororities reported experiencing at least one second-hand effect from binge drinking The 1999 Harvard survey found that 36 percent had been insulted or humiliated and 71 percent had sleep or study interrupted A smaller share of students had experienced an unwanted sexual advance (23 percent), been assaulted (11 percent) or had property damaged (16 percent)

Each year, college students spend about \$5.5 billion on alcohol, mostly beer The annual overall costs of alcohol use by those under 21 is estimated at more than \$55 billion dollars, according to the US Department of Justice, Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention. This estimate, based on current health and criminal justice data, assigns costs associated with violent crime, traffic crashes, treatment, and alcohol poisonings, among other variables.



Jail millage renewal approved

Wayne County residents Tuesday approved the renewal of the jail millage, Proposal J

With 94 4 percent of precincts reporting Wednesday afternoon, it passed with 54 6 percent (161,684-134,641)

In the suburbs, the proposal got through by more than 10,000 votes

It passed in Detroit by more than 15,000 The proposal renews the 0 9432 millage for 10 years It will cover jail construction and operation, penalty options such as work release, as well as the county's juvenile detention facility

The 10 years will maintain programs and retire debts

"It's extremely important, said Jeriel Heard, assistant county executive and director of community justice "I'm just glad the county doesn t have to consider shutting down 800 plus (jail) beds"

Garden City Police Chief David Harvey said he thinks the millage is double dipping

"My problem with the jail millage is I didn t think it was supposed to be a recurring expense to the taxpayers," he said

Harvey also said without the millage, his daily expenses would increase, but he would rather decide what services he wants than be told by the county what he needs

"It's a dilemma," he said "If we lose the millage, my day-to-day expenses would go up

'I think what's more needed is a re-examination of county services

The original millage was passed in 1988 and then renewed in 1998 for four years Since it was passed, the county has added 1,070 beds to the jail system, and built a new juvenile facility, which opened in 1999 and added 188 beds

We have to fund the jails to make sure we have someplace to keep the prisoners incarcerated, said Anthony Klukowski, who voted for the proposal I don't want them on the street"

One tenth of the millage goes to the juvenile facility and local programs

The renewal of the millage is critical for the operation of the jail and our new juvenile facility, Heard said

The owner of a \$100,000 house will pay about \$49 a year The renewal is expected to raise more than 37 million in property tax revenue in 2002

The original millage was passed to help ease the county's lack of jail space, which was leading to the release of more than 3,000 people per year

Crime has dropped 28 percent through out the county from 1991-2000

"How we treat criminal activity in our society is tremendously important to my own well-being and the well-being of the people who are not in jail, said Sharon Helzer of Livonia

nly last year, Dan Goldfield, one half of the partnership that makes up Dutton-Goldfield Winery, said, "In a period of only 10 years, a small contingent of growers and winemakers has made Sonoma Coast pinot noir the rival of any wine made anywhere The exciting thing is we haven't come close to making our best wine"

OK, modesty will get you everywhere The truth is that Dutton-Goldfield wines have caught the attention of pinot noir and chardonnay lovers in the know We've been hot on these wines since we tasted the first releases in summer 2000 No sense telling our Observer-Eccentric readers about them because that would only have been dangling carrots - until now The wines are here and this is the scoop



COLD-CLIMATE GRAPEGROWING

Winemaker Dan Goldfield and his grapegrower partner Steve Dutton have promoted vineyards in California s coldest regions since the early 1990s They cut their teeth on the coldest areas of the Russian River Valley appellation and make dynamite chardonnay and pinot noir from there

They ve pushed the envelope by developing vineyards in areas of

western Sonoma County, such as Sonoma Coast, considered cattle grazing land only a few years ago Even Marin County to the south, near the Point Reyes Peninsula, has vineyards that Dutton-Goldfield considers premium

"In the Sonoma Coast appellation and other cold-coast regions of California,' Dutton said, "site selection is crucial The cold winds and heavy fogs are unforgiving There, if your vineyard isn't just the right combination of elevation, exposure, variety and clone, you can easily end up with unripe grapes on your hands in late October This isn't the kind of problem most California grapegrowers are used to facing But when it all comes together, you've got grapes





Roast the corn and put the butter away

It's peak corn season right now, and time for simple ways to enjoy the natural sweetness of fresh corn-on-the-cob

Most folks equate corn-onthe-cob with plenty of melted butter But you will be pleasantly astonished to discover, like the AICR staff who tastetested this version, how wonderful corn can taste without butter Really No butter Just plenty of juicy flavor

As soon as corn is picked, its natural sugar begins to convert to starch - making the corn taste less sweet So ideally, buy corn as soon after it's picked as you can, and cook it as quickly as possible But even corn that has been trucked in or refrigerated is delicious grilled or roasted, which heightens the sweetness and adds a nice smoky taste

When selecting corn, pick ears with bright green, tight-fitting husks and golden brown sılk The kernels should be milky, plump and in tightlyspaced rows that reach all the way to the tip of the ear

Čorn is believed to contain cancer-fighting properties Recent studies suggest that

that includes beta-carotene) helps fight cancer One study reported that women with the highest blood levels of lutein faced about half the incidence of breast cancer as those with the lowest Other research shows that people with the highest dietary intake of lutein had a substantially lower incidence of colon cancer than those with the lowest intake

Although yellow corn contains less lutein than dark green, leafy vegetables, it s still an excellent source of this cancer-protective phytochemical Lutein may also reduce the risk of heart attack and stroke

Corn roasted in the following way is so good you may want to roast a few extra ears and cut the kernels off the cob for salads, salsas, or soups

ROASTED CORN WITH CUMIN

AND LIME 1 Tbsp_fresh lime juice 1 tsp_ground cumin 1/2 tsp salt 1/4 tsp_freshly ground black pep per 2 tsp extra virgin olive oil 6 ears fresh corn in the husk 2 limes cut lengthwise into

Heat the grill or preheat the oven to 500 degrees

In a small bowl whisk together lime juice, cumin, salt, pepper and oil Prepare corn one ear at a time Pull off and discard the 2 or 3 tough outer leaves Carefully pull back remaining leaves, one at a time, exposing as much of the ear as possible (It is better to uncover only half the ear than to tear the husks) Pull off all the sılk

Brush kernels with oil mixture, using just enough to coat corn lightly Smooth folded leaves back into place, one by one, until ear 1s completely covered

Arrange corn on the grill or place in oven Roast 15 minutes Îf using a grill, turn ears 2 or 3 times (This is not necessary if oven-roasting) Serve corn immediately, accompanied by additional salt, if desired, and lime wedges, which are squeezed over the corn as it is eaten



Have fun experimenting with tofu

Bad tofu recipes abound Frankly, I blame it on the fact that soy is good for you Seems the health benefits have persuaded everyone, and not just vegetarians anymore, to put tofu in everything from chocolate-chip cookies to ravioli

Some ideas work There are some exceptional sov-filled ravioli on the market Many do not Hunks of tofu may look like white chocolate chips, but taste tells a different story

Frustrated to find one cookbook after another claiming to be the complete encyclopedia of how to turn tofu into anything from salad dressing to spare tires, I decided to cast a wide net over the tofu world and see what it caught

The plan was simple Call tofu manufacturers around the country and ask them for surprising, exciting, even unusual and, most important, tasty recipes that use tofu From them I d choose the most appealing Not as easy a task as it seemed For many tofu makers, English isn t a first (or second or third) language

Also, tofu-making machinery apparently tends to be big and loud, because at some companies it was impossible





to scream above the churning noises

At those with whom communication was possible, some were bemused, others offended Those recipes are proprietary,' one tofu-marketing woman told me

Most were more giving Soon my mailbox overflowed with nifty, if not always tasty, ideas for using bean curd

Some, including creamy peanut-butter pie, sounded decadent Others were outright disgusting, among them Russian noodle pudding - not even the cat would touch it

In the end, three merited passing on

Start with spicy Mumbai potatoes, an Indian take on the twice-baked favorite This recipe, offered by Morinaga Nutritional Foods, maker of the very versatile Mori-Nu sılken tofu line, puts tofu in its place the background It adds body to the dish, but doesn t detract from the flavors

Then move on to Eden Foods vegetable saute The plain name disguises creative ingredients including dried lotus root and dried tofu, which is dense and chewy, with a taste and texture remarkably different from regular tofu

Finish your tofu experiments with the deviled tofu recipe offered by Small Planet Tofu

This dish is easy to whip up, but packs plenty of flavor Use it as a sandwich filling, or pate for crackers and vegetable sticks

SPICY MUMBAI POTATOES

(Preparation 1 hour 15 minutes) 4 large Idaho or russet potatoes 2 teaspoons canola or olive oil 1 cup finely minced leeks 1 tablespoon finely grated ginger 1 clove garlic minced 1/2 teaspoon salt 1/8 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper 1 teaspoon ground coriander 1/8 teaspoon turmeric

1/2 teaspoon ground cumin 1 cup fresh or frozen peas 3/4 cup firm silken tofu pureed 2 tablespoons chopped fresh cilantro

Canola oil cooking spray

Preheat oven to 425° F Wash and scrub each potato well Dry and prick each with a fork a few times Bake until tender, about 40 to 60 minutes depending on size of potato

While potatoes bake, combine oil, leeks, ginger, garlic and salt in a large skillet and saute over a medium-high flame for 6 to 8 minutes, or until leeks are soft

Add pepper, coriander, turmeric and cumin, and cook another 2 minutes Add peas and cook until tender, about 5 minutes

When the potatoes are done, remove from oven and allow to cool Reduce oven to 350° F

Cut the potatoes in half lengthwise and scoop out the innards, leaving the skins intact with about 1/4 inch of potato Set the skins aside

Transfer the scooped potato to a large bowl Use a potato masher to combine the potatoes and tofu puree, then stir the leek mixture into the potatoes

CHOCOLATE MILK SHAKE THE EASY WAY

Put three tablespoons chocolate sauce in tall glass Fill glass with cold milk or soymilk Shake thoroughly and top with frozen whipped cream if desired

COCOA MILK SHAKE

3 tablespoons cocoa 1/2 teaspoon sugar 1 pinch salt 1/4 teaspoon vanilla 1 cup milk 3 scoops vanilla ice cream

Mix cocoa and sugar with a little milk Add remaining ingredients Beat well Add ice cream

REAL ROOT BEER

7 cups distilled or purified water 11/2 cups white Sugar 1/4 teaspoon of active dry yeast 1 teaspoon of root beer concen trate

(Look for the concentrate in the spice and extract section of your grocery store)

Measure the water into a glass bowl and heat it in a microwave on the high setting for three minutes You can also heat the water in a non-aluminum pan on a stove burner until the water is lukewarm Do not overheat it though, or you will deactivate the yeast Add the sugar, dry yeast, and root beer concentrate to the water and stir slowly until the sugar and yeast dissolve

Bottling Your Soda

Set a small plastic funnel into the mouth of a 2-liter plastic bottle Use a small cup or ladle to pour the soda mixture through the funnel Fill the bottle, leaving about 2-3 inches of air at the top Remove the funnel and screw the bottle cap tightly (If air leaks out, the root beer will not carbonate properly)

Adding the Fizz

Lav the filled bottle on its side in a warm place and leave it undisturbed for four days During this time the root beer will carbonate-the sugar and the yeast react to form tiny carbon dioxide bubbles that give the soda its fizz On the fifth day, put the root beer in the refrigerator to chill It will be ready to drink the following day

Taste Testing

The best way to serve your homemade root beer is in a frosted glass mug As you unscrew the bottle cap, listen for the soft woosh sound as the pressurized air at the top of thee bottle escapes When you pour the root beer, you should see bubbles on the sides of the glass and foam forming at the top You'll notice a slight yeasty flavor to your homemade brew, as well as a hint of anise and wintergreen If the flavor 1s too strong, just add a small amount of cold water

Or make a root beer float by putting one scoop of vanilla ice cream or sorbet in a tall frosted glass Pour in enough root beer to cover Top with a second scoop of ice cream, whipped cream, and a cherry, and serve with a spoon and straw





Tom Teeters didn't mince words His Lady Ocelots have to do a better job at the net







So what if they don t hit it as far as Tiger Woods? So what if they don't have the

So what?

Bob Ackerman, Tom Gillis, Kevin Muir and Jeff Roth all can match the love and passion, drive and determination on the golf course as that of the great one himself

The Eccentric-area foursome found themselves in the midst of the Tiger-mania that highlighted a week-long of excitement at the 2002 Buick Open held at Warwick Hills Golf & Country Club in Grand Blanc

Though not as successful as Woods on the leaderboard, Ackerman, Gillis, Muir and Roth each hope the recent experience serves as a springboard for their future dreams

TOM GILLIS

The return to friendly turf may be just the remedy Tom Gillis is looking for

The Lake Orion native made what he called a "real risky decision" recently when he elected to forego a sense of security playing on the European Tour and opt for the trials and tribulations of competing on the PGA Tour

"It was a big decision," informed Gillis, who appeared comfortable over the first two days on the 7,127-yard, par-72 track at Warwick Hills by shooting rounds of 71 and 69 "I made a really risky decision by leaving Europe because I had status over there

"It made me a lot better player, but I wasn't totally happy," continued Gillis, who began his European play in 1997 and estimated that he had teed up the little white dimpled golf ball in some 25 countries each year 'I had been teetering a couple years because it's been a tough place to play The travel and not having any real interaction with family and friends were tough I just finally woke up one day

and said 'I'm not having any fun and I'm not enjoying this" Gillis' return has already pro-

duced some shining moments as solid play in the first two rounds of June's US Open Golf Championships on the treacherous Black Course at Bethpage State Park allowed the 33-yearold to make the cut

"I made the cut at Bethpage, played all four days, and got some demons off my back knowing I'd done it," Gillis said "It was a good experience Id love to play in another '

At the Buick, steady play from tee to green on Thursday led to a 1-under 71 and more of the same Friday resulted in a 69 and two-day total of 140 In two previous appearances ('93, '95) in the Buick, Gillis missed the cut each time

'The game is pretty good right now," said Gillis, who was looking forward to weekend play 'I'm trying to get my health back (Gillis said hes still recovering from a bout with mononucleosis) and a good solid week here will do great things for my confidence'

JEFF ROTH

Jeff Roth planned on a long golfing weekend It didn't happen

The Knollwood Country Club head professional teed off in his seventh Buick Open golf tournament Thursday afternoon After missing the cut his first three times out, hes managed to stick around for two more rounds in each of his next three appearances

This year was a different story

Roth, 44, finished with a 1over total 145 (72-73) on the par 72, 1,127-yard Warwick Hills Golf & Country Club course Unfortunately for Roth, only scores in the red (2-under, 140) made the final cut That left Roth a rather disappointed golfer, according to his pretournament goals

"I expect to play well I ve kind of gotten past that point of just being happy to be here said Roth two hours before his 1 30 pm tee off time on Thursday

"Realistically, I would expect to make the cut,' he said 'I think a good tournament for me would be a top-25 and an awesome tournament would be a top-10'

Roth tied for 56th place in 1998 with a 285 to win \$3,960 In 1999 and 2000, he finished with identical scores of 280 and placed 33rd each time to earn a combined total of \$25,267

Roth knew he'd have to finish with low numbers to make any type of impact this year

To get to that top 10 you'd have to shoot maybe 15 or 16 under par, and that's a pretty good number" said Roth, a 1979 University of Arizona graduate

"The key for me to have any kind of success is to drive the ball in the fairway and have a good week putting," he said "If you drive the ball in the fairway you're going to have a lot of birdie opportunities If you don't drive the ball well, you're going to be looking for the birdies and the pars

Roth, a former pro at the Birmingham Country Club and for 12 years at nearby Flint Country Club, qualified for the Buick Open by winning the Michigan PGA last year at Shanty Creek It's a championship he eagerly anticipates

'You always enjoy playing against the best players in the world," he said 'For one week anyways, I can play with anybody There's too much talent out here to think that week-in and week-out I could beat these guys If I was playing fulltime my game would elevate itself"

BOB ACKERMAN

For a man doing a lot of teaching, Bob Ackerman was busy doing a lot of learning the first two days of the Buick Open

Learning to cope with the many distractions associated with the PGA TOUR.

'Coming into this tournament, its a different environment than what I m used to and I was aware of that said the West Bloomfield resident, who earned a berth in the 156player field by carding a spectacular 66 at The Fortress in Frankenmuth during a Michigan PGA Section Qualifier 'You just have to adjust

'You have to try and get in a concentrated frame of mind and pay attention to just playing golf instead of getting caught up in the thrill and excitement of being around all these great players and nice people that bend over backwards to make it good for you '

Ackerman's adjustment, unfortunately, didn t include the scores he was looking for as too many bogeys and not enough birdies resulted in an opening-round 76 on Thursday That was followed up by a 78 on Friday

Despite the disappointment in not qualifying for weekend play, Ackerman was still thrilled to being playing "with the best players in the world

'It's seeing if you can get your game in shape to compete with them," he said 'I enjoy the challenge to see if I can get ready for that'

Ackerman involves quite a bit of preparation in his day-to-day activities as he spends the better part of each one instructing students on how to improve their games

Ackerman pulls double duty by teaching in an indoor facility in Commerce Township and also outdoors at the Links at Pinewood

KEVIN MUIR

The birdies were flying at Warwick Hills Golf & Country Club in the first two rounds of the Buick Open in Grand Blanc Unfortunately for Kevin Muir, he found more bogeys than birdies

The Director of Golf at The Wyndgate in Rochester Hills had a rough two rounds Thursday and Friday Muir finished with a 9-over par 153 (76-77) and missed the cut of 142 His two-day total included four birdies, nine bogeys and two double bogeys

It was a score that would never hold up in a tournament where the winner is normally somewhere around 15 under





An 8-year-old boy from Pune India, who was scheduled to have a foot partially amputated, is now running, jumping and enjoying a normal life back in his native country thanks to the efforts of several local physicians Area doctors recently donated their time and medical services to help this young boy suffering from a serious bone infection

Dr Mohammed Arsıwala, of Michigan Urgent & Primary Care Physicians in Livonia, learned about the case of Huzefa Kapuswala during a visit back nome to India. The boy has spina bifida, a congenital defect in which the spinal cord is not fully closed Children with spina bifida often develop clubfeet, as was the case with Huzefa The boy had surgery within his first day or two of life to close the hole in his spinal cord, but his clubfeet were not corrected His case became complicated when he developed a severe bone infection in one of his feet After meeting and examining Huzefa ın India ın August 2001, Arsıwala learned the following December that doctors in India were prepared to perform a partial amputation of Huzefa's foot to prevent the spread of infection Arsiwala then contacted Dr Jeffrey Szczepanski, a doctor of podiatric medicine who works two floors above him

Dr Jeffrey Szczepanski, above, a Livonia doctor of podiatric medicine, assures Huzefa Kapuswala that all went well during surgery to correct his foot Huzefa, who was born with clubfeet, traveled with his mother from India so Szczepanski could save his foot from possible amputation Left, Huzefa's foot following surgery







I was reluctant and had the same degree of enthusiasm as a Viking would have taking a ballet class,' he said "But my wife encouraged me, so I agreed to attend one class

That one class led to another, and what was once reluctance has become a lifestyle



Viagra helps men with heart failure

Men with congestive heart failure and erectile dysfunction safely used sildenafil (Viagra) to improve sexual function in a study reported in the Circulation Journal of the American Heart Association

The popular medication may even make patients more likely to take their heart failure drugs, says author Dr Edimar Alcides Bocchi, associate professor and chief of the heart failure chinics at the Sao Paulo University Medical School in Brazil

"Heart failure patients may become noncompliant with their congestive heart failure treatment if they feel it causes or aggravates their ED," Bocchi said "However, our study suggests that treating the ED may make patients more motivated to take their medicines

Sıldenafil caused no harmful effects and improved exercise performance during treadmill exercise tests in 23 men with congestive heart failure (average age 50) and a history of ED, says Bocchi

Sildenafil blocks the activity of enzyme phosphodiesterase type 5, which is active in multiple tissues and cells

The effects of PFE5 inhibition include increased production of nitric oxide, which is associated with improved function of the heart and blood vessels

The cardiovascular effects of sildenafil have created some concern that the drug might be harmful in men with congestive heart failure

But there's not enough data on the safety or potential harm of sildenafil in those patients

Most of the men had moderate or severe heart failure and each had been referred for treatment of ED

On separate days, the men underwent two exercise treadmill tests, which consisted of six-minute walk and a maximum exercise test

About an hour before the first test the men received

either 50 milligrams of sildenafil of a placebo On the sec ond day, the men received the opposite treatments before the exercise

Those treated with the sildenafil had significantly lower blood pressure and heart rate and improvement in measures of oxygen consumption and carbon dioxide production compared with those on placebo

Total exercise time also increased A separate evaluation showed that treatment with sildenafil was associated with higher scores on questionnaire related to erectile disfunction

Frequently, CHF patients and especially their wives are afraid their spouses will have heart failure symptoms or even death during sexual activity, says Bocchi

"Our study shows that the benefits may outweigh harmful effects of treatment with sildenafil

The successful treatment of ED in CHF could not only improve sexual relationships but overall quality and success of CHF treatment

New procedure may end chronic sinus troubles

Doctors at St Joseph Mercy Hospital-Ann Arbor are using a new technology to treat patients with chronic sinus problems, a condition which has become the number one chronic illness for all age groups in the United States, according to the National Center for Disease Statistics, affecting 35 million Americans each year The LandmarX ENT Image Guidance System provides a three-

dimensional view of the sinus area This enhanced view increases procedure efficiency and safety and elimi nates cumbersome setups for the patient

Currently doctors can perform sinus procedures with the use of an endoscope – or tiny camera – which provides them with a two-dimensional view of the path of their instruments

This can be risky in patients who have had previous sinus surgery or have congenital abnormalities because the endoscope does not provide us with a three-dimensional picture of the affected area Image guided surgery provides the sinus surgeon an additional tool allowing him or her to operate with confidence," said Dr Paul T Hoff, otolaryngologist (head and neck surgeon) at St Joseph

Hospital

With the new technology, patients report to the hospital's radiology department for a CT scan The image is then downloaded onto a disc, which is inserted into the LandmarX System The system displays three views of the patient's head on a screen while also providing a view from the tip of the surgical instrument that is also attached to the LandmarX

System As the surgeon navigates the instruments through the sinus cavity, the system shows the surgeon the exact location of the instrument in relation to the surrounding tissues in three dimensions

As a result, procedures take less time to complete and safety is improved because the surgeon can see what to remove and what to leave alone

15 and began the long process of healing Huzefas infection before Szczepanski could perform the surgery During Huzefas medical care in the United States, his father and 3year-old sister stayed in India

Husefas medical treatment was a long process 'First we had to identify the

type of bacteria that was caus-

ing the bone infection Then Huzefa was on IV antibiotics for six weeks to clear up the infection before we could perform the surgery

If not, the infection would have continued to spread and we would have had to perform an amputation anyway The problem he was having in India was that doctors could not get his foot to heal," said Szczepanski

After surgery at Providence Hospital in Southfield on May 10 Huzefa and his mother returned to India on June 28 The five hour operation was videotaped so that Indian doctors could perform the surgery on his other foot in a year or so He may however, return to the United States to let Szczepanski and Mozen do the surgery

RECOVERING WELL

Hakim talks to her nephew about once a week since he

returned to India

"He's doing good and continuing his physical therapy back home He does all the normal activities like walking, running, biking and swimming," Hakim said

Szczepanski confirms that Huzefa's recovery is going well "She's e-mailed me every week and given me updates on his progress," said

Szczepanski 'I would recommend several months to a year before the other foot is operated on

Szczepanski is glad that he was able to help this young Indian boy who had to travel such a long distance for medical care

"I have four kids of my own who are 5, 3, 2 and 10 months My heart just sinks when I think about one of them having to have a foot partially amputated When you know that you can help somebody and make a big impact on their life, it's very rewarding, he

said

Szczepanski added that Huzefa's family is most grateful for the care provided by local physicians

"His mother has been so appreciative, he said "She has thanked us a thousand times"

It's also touching that after his experiences with local physicians that Huzefa now wants to be a doctor so that he, too, can help children with problems like his

The terms osteoporosis and osteoarthritis are confusing Both words contain the same beginning letters osteo That phrase stands for bone bevond that the words have far different meanings

Osteoporosis means that the bone being described is porous and is weak bone. Technically he term describes bone that has insufficient calcium lining the network of protein that is th scaffolding for bone. A related term is osteopenia, which means bone that has less then the bes amount calcium in it At times your doctor can make a guess if your bones are osteopenic or osteoporotic by looking at an x ray that includes bone such as in the leg arm or back. These interpretations are often faulty because of the x ray voltage used or the angle of the x ray beam The best way to determ ne if your bones are lacking calcium is by a measure of bone density This test is designed to concentrate only on the bone itself and compare the findings with standards agreed upon by the medical community

Ostecarthritis refers to changes in a joint such as the wrist shoulder knee and ankle When your doctor uses this term he is taiking about a jont that is wearing out as a result of loss of cartiage The change is comparable to a tire losing tread. Ostecarthirtis is most simply diagnosed by x ray. For the knee and ankle weight bearing films are excellent ways of bringing out the presence of osteoarthritis

Osteoarthritic joints can also be esteopenic or osteoporotic a combination that is common for the high Therefore you need to listen carefully when your doctor discusses your arthritic joint



o wrap or not to wrap, that is the question

There's been a meeting of the minds, so to speak - a summit of a grand scale - to settle the issue of

housewrap Now, the housewrap dilemma

ısn't a problem of monumental

scale, granted It may not even be on the radar screen for most people

But for years, we at Detroit Edison recommended against using housewrap, or the insulating material installed under the vinyl or aluminum siding of your home


There was a simple reason for our disdain For housewrap to be effective, it has to be installed properly and we found that it wasn't in 95 percent of the jobs

The main culprits were improper taping and the nails used to affix the siding to the house The nails penetrated the housewrap, which made it ineffective as an air barrier But it is an effective water barrier to keep a

house's frame from rotting Of course, while we recommended against it, others said it was a must for energy-efficient home construction

There was only one way to settle the matter - to bring the different points of view together and discuss it

And after just two hours, Detroit Edison, Dow Chemical, Hansen Marketing Services, Michigan Energy Services and Home Building Workshop, reached a conclusion





Families still love safe feeling living on cul-de-sacs

(AP) - Jenny and Rick White neighborhoods in the early enjoy living on their cozy culde-sac, where traffic is light and neighbors are friendly

"There are a lot of advantages," she said "It's safer for kids because people don't drive as fast and we know everyone who lives on this street"

People cherish the privacy and peace of mind they get from living on the dead-end streets

Children can play basketball and ride their bicycles without the threat of heavy traffic Generally, anyone who drives by belongs there, and neighbors often meet for block parties or barbecues

Because so few vehicles use the streets, residents say they are free from noise and air pollution

But the suburban oasis of the cul-de-sac can create traffic gridlock elsewhere, transportation experts say

That is one of the reasons urban planners are starting to return to more traditional developments reminiscent of

1900s - straight streets laid out in a grid pattern, smaller lots and sidewalks

Steven Bodzin, a spokesman for the San Francisco-based Congress for the New Urbanism, said there are about 250 grid-pattern developments around the country, with hundreds more in planning

"We see a higher level of devotion to the towns and a better sense of community," he said of the grid developments "I think people are missing that in conventional suburbia

Planners say the dead-end streets, which usually don t have sidewalks, also can discourage social interaction, isolating residents

"Virtually every trip involves getting in the car, even to get a gallon of milk or a loaf of bread," said Greg Dale, a Cincinnati-based urban planning consultant who has worked with communities across the country

"People used to be able to

walk to the corner store Too many cul-de-sacs can create isolation between neighborhoods There's a sense of community that's lost, he said

Ninety-five percent of the 120 subdivisions being built in southwest Ohio's Warren County, where the Whites live, include cul-de-sacs

Roger Young settled on one of the dead-end streets two years, with his wife and three daughters Safety was a major reason

"There's a lot of trust between neighbors, a real neighborhood feeling, he said "We have Fourth of July parties and block parties in the summer If you're teaching your kids to ride their bikes or sending them out to play, you don't worry at all "

However, county Engineer Neil Tunison said the few main streets serving such subdivisions often become clogged with traffic

"We're seeing a lot of back-ups, delays and congestion," he said 'We ve got large subdivisions that have only one access

road That becomes a choke point if you need to evacuate people It makes it difficult for fire departments to respond to calls"

Bodzin said cul-de-sac neighborhoods discourage racial and economic diversity

"In these developments, you usually have one culture, people of the same economic class," he said "Studies have shown they have less interest in their community and belong to fewer social clubs Everyone tends to do their own thing instead

French for "bottom of a sack, the cul-de-sac has been around for hundreds of years However, it didn't become popular in the United States until the mid-1950s

Radburn, NJ, was one of the first cities to use no-outlet streets, said Jeff Spech, an urban planner and co-author of the book Suburban Nation

"The idea was to separate cars from pedestrians," he said "Developers saw that people liked them, so they started

building whole developments of them

The greatest concentration now is in the Sun Belt, especially near Las Vegas and Scottsdale, Arız

The aging of baby boomers has contributed to the popularity of grid layouts, Bodzin said With their children grown, people are looking for alternatives to large lots and single-family homes and want to be close to stores

The grid developments include mixed zoning, so corner groceries and other small businesses can co-exist with housıng

Bodzin said the new movement started gaining momentum with Seaside, a 1981 development near Panama City, Fla Seaside has a town green and retail shops within walking distance of homes

Developers around the country, including some in

Maryland, Tennessee, Texas, Arizona and Colorado, have followed suit The change has been slower in the Midwest,

where there are fewer new developments, Bodzin said But other developers say

families still find cul-de-sacs the most desirable Jim Obert, planning director

for Great Traditions Land & Development Co in Cincinnati, said developers can get higher prices for homes and lots on a dead-end street

'That s absolutely a selling point," he said "It's perceived to be safe for kids, and that's what most people look for We respond to demand "

The Whites, who have a son 👒 in high school and daughter in middle school, lived on another cul-de-sac before moving to Mason But they acknowledge the drawbacks

Her cul-de-sac is so narrow that its difficult to back out of their driveway if cars are parked along the street, Jenny White said

"In the winter, we're about the last street to get the snow cleared," she said "They re not as worried about us as with the . main streets

Wood is natural building choice, wood promoters say

(NAPS) - Green building is a hot topic today for some builders and home purchasers

While new buyers are increasingly sensitive to green building, a new survev reveals there are wide gaps in knowledge of which building materials actually are best for the environment

According to the National Green Building Gauge, a survey of 1,000 prospective home buyers to measure their understanding on a range of green building decisions, nearly four out of five believe that minimizing environmental impact is an important factor in selecting home construction materials

But when it comes to rating common building materials, only 50 percent of buyers believe that North America's most enduring building materials, wood, is a good environmental choice

Perhaps the biggest gap in knowledge revealed in the survey surrounds the state of forests

While more than 60 percent of prospective buyers believe that wood is an excellent renewable and recycla ble resource, less than a third believe that forests in North America are

abundant, even though the best available data proves otherwise

Two successive State of the Worlds *Forests* reports, released by the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization, show that North America's forests have increased in size and are about 20 percent larger than they were in 1970

"Steady regeneration efforts have helped to sustain the growth of our forests while ensuring that millions of environmentally and structurally sound homes are built - and will continue to be built for generations to come," said Kelly McCloskey, president of the Wood Promotion Network

"Not only are our forests abundant, but wood is the only major building material to embark on environmental certification programs

"Today, North America has the largest area of independently certified forests in the world - well over 200 million acres," McCloskey said

"Despite this progress and solid body of evidence behind it, many people still don't know that North American forests are increasing and continue to produce a continuous sustainable supply of wood McCloskey said

The survey also reveals that many prospective homeowners are unaware of the environmental impacts of building material choices they face

Nearly 40 percent believe the manufacturing of concrete and steel is less intrusive on the environment than the harvesting of trees for wood

'In our culture's constant search for new and better things, it's counterintuitive that the material we've relied on for years is still the best, especially for the environment,' McCloskey said

"All human activity has an impact on the environment, but when making material choices, science shows us the

way "Wood 1s the natural choice For more than 200 years, North America has used wood to build the vast majority of its homes and today, a growing body of research proves that building with wood is something we can feel good about," McCloskey said

That research includes some of today's most advanced technology, like satellite mapping to track North America's growing forests

It also includes a software modeling system that lets builders, architects and engineers measure the environmental impacts of the building materials they consider for each project

Developed by the ATHENA Sustainable Materials Institute in 1977, a non-profit organization supported by all the major building material manufacturers, nearly every application of the ATHENA model run since it's inception can be distilled into one simple rule

That is, where practical, the more wood used in a home, the better the home is for the environment

one of the strongest offerings in this segment I ve recommended the Outback to several colleagues and friends and family and at least eight people who took the plunge and bought one still thank me today

One particular friend who was T boned on the drivers side about six months ago in her 2 year old Outback actually walked away from the accident without a scratch or being sore. She was impressed the side doors held so well in an impact like that

The Outback I drove this week was assembled in Indiana and loaded to the max It had everything but the kitchen sink and stove in it The price reflected it at nearly \$30 000 But there are quite a few models to choose from including the Outback Wagon Outback Limited Wagon Outback Limited Sedan, Outback H6 3 L L Bean edition and the Outback H6 3 0 VDV Wagon and the sedan edition I drove

Lots of choices to choose from all with different levels of equipment and bottom line prices

New equipment this year includes an air filtration system dual illuminated visor vanity mirrors, ignition switch illumina tion ring (really great in the pitch dark) off delay dome light internal child safety trunk release with self illuminating handle variable intermittent windshield wipers and woodgrain pat terned interior door switch trim that's actually elegant looking rather than tacky

This year, Subaru has introduced yet another 6 cylinder engine A new 212 horsepower box six powers the sedan I drove and shares its all wheel drive and stability technology with the wagon model There's an off switch for the Vehicle Dynamics Control system which turns it off when trying to remove the car from deep snow or mud

Standard power available on three H4 models is a 25 liter horizontally opposed single overhead cam 4-cylinder engine that promises 165 horsepower It's been a long time since I've driven the 4-cylinder Subaru technology, but I can tell you that the 6 cylinder engine is certainly a head turner As in your head turn ing and you thinking "Wow did I go past that faster than I thought it could!

The power is absolutely a blessing when merging on freeways and when passing a slow vehicle in traffic And the cool thing about the new H6 engine is that it doesn't take up any more under the hood space than the H4 engine, Remarkable

Some of the stuff you d expect to see on true luxury models but you'll find on the Outback offerings include full time all wheel independent suspension 4 wheel disc brake anti lock brakes air conditioning 12 volt cargo area power outlet 60/40 split rear


Finally the mileage on the Outback models are much better than I expected, frankly The 5 speed manuals produce the best mileage numbers understandably Try 21 mpg in the city and 27 on the highway

But surprise, surprise With the automatic transmission, you enjoy 20 mpg in the city and 26 on the highway It's negligible Chose the automatic if you wish Chose the 5 speed for optimum control The mileage is the same, in my eyes One mile doesn't make for a decision, here, does it?

I always ask my back seat passengers (my kids) for a quick opinion on some of the vehicles I drive Sometimes even my hus band but he doesn't know as much as they do My daughters were highly irritated by one minor (at least I consider it minor) quirk in the Outback Their opinion is that the trunk should have a handle release on the exterior You need a key to open it or you have to release it from the inside The key fob doesn't offer a button to open the trunk either

Picking your kids up at the ice rink after a coaching session is a bit annoying when you have to open the trunk for them or open the driver's door to release the hatch, because they're so used to opening it themselves Oh well My attitude about the value and comfort of the Outback hasn't changed at all this year from the previous year I recommend it It's a strong offering and worth a serious look from anyone looking for a safe sedan for their family to an all around safe vehicle that's really strong in the snow Go drive one and see if you ll agree E mail me with your thoughts I welcome them
