# Pair charged with selling company secrets

Officials at Plymouth-based Metaldyne are confident trade secrets are safe despite the arrest Tuesday of two former employees charged with selling those secrets to a Chinese com-

Anne Lockwood of Rochester Hills and Fuping

Liu of Shanghai were arrested on a complaint charging them with theft of trade secrets, transmitting trade secrets to a Chinese company and conspiracy Lockwood, 52, 1s a former vice president of Metaldyne, an automotive parts supplier, who resigned in February 2004 Liu

formerly worked for Metaldyne's Shanghaı office until April 2004, when he

began working for Auburn Hills-based GKN Sinter Metals' Shanghai office

The complaint alleges Lockwood and Liu took confidential information belonging to Metaldyne and, without authorization, transmitted it to Chongqing Huafu Industry Co Ltd , a Chinese manufacturing company Liu is also charged with taking confidential

information from GKN's Auburn Hills headquarters and transmitting it to Lockwood

Metaldyne spokeswoman Myra Moreland declined to speak Wednesday about specific secrets Lockwood may have sold, for fear of compromising the FBI's case She did, however, express confidence that no serious damage was done

"We're confident that, through the judicial process, our trade secrets will be protected,' Moreland said

An affidavit in support of the complaint written by FBI Agent Jeffrey Edwards alleges Lockwood "obtained detailed information regarding Metaldyne's secret powdered metal forging process, including technical specifications and confidential cost information, and provided this information to (Huafu)'

According to the affidavit, Liu introduced Lockwood to Huafu representatives and served as a partner and gobetween in the transfer of trade secrets

### Light set for Ridge crossing

When her daughter was injured in a traffic accident at the intersection of Ann Arbor-Road and Ridge two weeks ago, Kım DelCol had had enough

After witnessing several nearmisses at what police call a danger ous intersection, and then seeing her daughter and a friend injured ın a crash, DelCol started callıng anyone she could think of -Plymouth Township police, Michigan State police, Michigan Department of Transportation to lobby for a light there

She is apparently going to get her wish. Township police said Tuesday MDOT officials have told them a blinking traffic light will be installed there this spring

"There are sight issues there, and its also heavily traveled by the expanding community," Plymouth Township Police Chief Tom Tiderington said "We've been working with the state for at least two years to get a light there

Tiderington said two years ago, his department turned over crash data to MDOT officials, who then conducted a study and determined there wasn't sufficient evidence a full traffic signal was warranted

Tiderington said he was told more than a year ago the light would be installed, but it never was He said he was told last week in an e-mail conversation with MDOT officials the light was a go


I can't really give a definitive date, but it is going in this season,' said Michael Budai, traffic and safety engineer in MDOT's Taylor office "There were some delays with responses from utility companies, but it's going forward now

Budai said that stretch of Ann Arbor Road can't get a full traffic signal in part because there's no left-center turn lane However, he said such a lane is projected to be added in 2006

"We hope at that time to upgrade the light to a full traffic signal, Budai said

That comes as good news for DelCol, whose 18-year-old daughter Tracey was the passenger in a car driven by a friend, Jessica Glidden Glidden made the left from southbound Ridge onto eastbound Ann Arbor Road, but didn't

### Contest win lets Plymouth woman turn up the heat

For four winters now, Rhonda Danis has set the thermostat in her Ann Arbor Trail home at around 58 degrees, snuggled under electric blankets given her by her father and made due

Tuesday night, she turned the heat up above 70

Danis got a new fur-nace to replace the ancient, heating-oil furnace she's been using since moving into the house four years ago Danis, a single mother out of work because of back problems, got the new furnace through a contest co-sponsored by WDIV's popular Ruth to the Rescue segment and by Lennox Industries

"I was shocked that we won," said Danis, who lives in the house with her 9-year-old son, Austin 'It's unbelievable I feel very honored and blessed, and I'm so grate-

Becky Forma has been a friend of Danis since the two met at a wedding for Danis' cousin 10 years ago It was Forma, a personal banker for Standard Federal Bank in Redford, who nominated Danis, mostly because she was tired of freezing when she went

"It's freezing in her house, I didn't like to go over because we had to

to visit

wear sweaters,' Forma said, laughing 'I was so excited for her when she won She needed it, and she deserves it'

Danis is a former shoe cobbler who was injured in a car accident and hasn't been able to work Finances forced her to stretch one barrel of oil for an entire winter, when most people fill it up monthly, she said

To make ends meet,

she kept the temperature in her house around 60 She and Austin would eat meals with her mother, who lives nearby Her father provided electric blankets after Austin told him how cold it was

That shouldn't be a problem any more As a contractor for Lennox Industries, Jack Vanderveen of Keeth Heating and Cooling in Plymouth spent the day Tuesday replacing Danis' oil heater with a new furnace Vanderveen and his staff took out the old unit and even replaced the liner in Danis' chim-

This one was in our town, so they asked us to do it, and we're happy to do it,' said Vanderveen, who even got Plymouth Township to waive some

### **District** may close Miller for one year 2

Repairs force School officials to eye options

Groundbreaking for the new eleentary school being constructed in Canton Township's Cherry Hill Village needs to happen soon to guarantee opening in time for the 2006-2007 school year

School district officials also say opening of the school in August 2006 is paramount to plans affecting more than 600 students at Miller Elementary in Canton which houses the Talented and Gifted program with students from Plymouth and Canton - who are expected to be displaced for an entire school year when Miller is closed to complete \$3 5 million in renovations

Both projects are part of the \$109 million bond issue passed by Plymouth-Canton school district voters in September Ken Jacobs, assistant superintendent for administrative services, said surveys and soil borings are being conducted at the 20-acre site on the northwest corner of Cherry Hill and Denton

Design work for the building must be approved and fit in with the Cherry Hill Village architecture, and is expected to be sent to the Canton Township planning commission in time for its March 7 meeting

However, Jacobs admits the time frame to build and open the school is a bit shorter than what is generally considered acceptable for a school project

"Its shorter than what we would feel extremely comfortable with But, if everything goes right, we should be OK," Jacobs said "We can't afford any trip-ups along the way, because there is no room for maneuvering"





### Kiwanis Club taking a bite out of hunger Locals wonder if underpass will come

Group seeks volunteers to help feed children around the world

After eating a nutritious meal of a fortified rice soy mix ture with added dehydrated vegetables, chicken and 21 essential vitamins and minerals, members of the Kıwanıs Club of Colonial Plymouth received some stunning infor mation at its weekly Thursday noon-time meeting


We lose about 40,000 chil dren who starve to death every 24 hours, said Don Burwell, president of Feeding Children International of Michigan, a non-profit organization "Its a staggering number of children we lose every year Plus, we have hungry kids in our own country'

The Kiwanians found out first-hand what some children consider a gourmet meal, con sidering many get very little else to eat

'Today you got a chance to sample the product that is sent around the world to starving kids, and hungry kids in the United States, said Kiwanian Lee Harrison, who is taking charge of the club's drive to help feed starving children 'If we were in a third world coun try and hadn't eaten in a couple of weeks, that rice dish would have been very spectac-

The Kiwanians are doing their part in helping to feed seven million children throughout the world, participating with Minneapolis based Feeding Children International and its Kids Against Hunger program Its part of the Kiwanis International Young Children Priority One project

"It's the major project we've taken on this year,' said Harrison, who last year spent several hours at a church in Oak Park packaging thousands of meals for needy children, along with nearly 20 Plymouth Kıwanıans, for Burwell's group We became aware that getting people to come from all over the tri county area to Oak Park to package meals would



Members of the Kiwanis Club and the Key Club (Kiwanis Club of the high schools) are helping in the fight against childhood hunger Amono them are Kiwanis Club members Jim Walker, Don Burwell, Jim Walk, Jim Jabara, Lee Harrison, Mark Riegal Rob Noel Chris Lynn Mike Merlo and Krista Noel

Colonial Plymouth donated a van and trailer (nearly \$25,000) so Burwell could take the Kids Against Hunger program on the road, making it easier for groups to participate in raising money to buy food and then supply volunteers to package the rice meals that will be sent abroad

Now, the Kiwanians are hoping to broaden their scope by finding groups who have money to buy food and help package it, or by pairing those with money with groups that can supply volunteers

What we'd like to do now is get more groups to take on a day, raise money and provide volunteers to have this mobile operation come to their church, school or civil group and package meals," Harrison said "There may be people who out there who want to give big donations and we have plenty of groups with kids who want to participate, but can t raise that kind of money

Burwell said it costs \$1,600 for a group to spend between 2 3 hours of time packaging 7,000 meals Harrison said the Plymouth Kiwanians are contributing another \$8 000 in

Kıwanıan Mark Rıegal helped prepare the surprise meal his club ate at its weekly meeting

We secretly put a few things in there to spice it up a little bit, but we wanted to stay close to what the children get,' said Riegal 'You can't stop but to think about them when eating that meal and be happy our kids don't have to eat like that Losing 40,000 children a day to starvation is just unbeliev-

Richard Proudfit, founder of Mınnesota based Feeding Children International, told Kiwanians he took on the worldwide project after visiting Honduras some 20 years ago

'They (children) were literally dying around me and it broke my heart said Proudfit "God broke me to my I had to do something

Currently, the packages of food - which contain six servings and are prepared in less than 20 minutes by adding to boiling water — are feeding seven million children in 32 countries Proudfit said his goal is to feed 20 million starving children within a couple of

trailer donated by the Kiwanis Club of Colonial Plymouth will begin making the rounds in metro Detroit March 1, with its first stop at Plymouth-Canton Educational Park where high school students will package

'Kiwanis is on the cutting edge of what is about to take place in Michigan," said Burwell, whose plans include opening more packaging centers throughout the state "In the meantime, transporting to the high schools will ignite something throughout the state of Michigan and the country"

Kıwanıan Jım Jabara was among those who spent several hours packaging meals at the Oak Park center last

"It makes you feel good because you're doing something big for very little effort, and giving something back," Jabara said "We're all very lucky here"

fied "The lawyers are still bouncing the intergovernmental agreement around," Plymouth City Manager Paul Sincock said "According to the county, CSX still hasn't signed onto the project"

At issue in terms of the agreement is locking in the amounts of money the township and city are going to have to pay Several years ago, the township board agreed to pay just over \$1 million, the city agreed to some \$500,000 and the county was going to pay for the bulk of the project out of federal money earmarked specifically for that project If the project doesn't get done, the county loses that money

There have been several roadblocks County officials had trouble acquiring all of the rights-of-way they needed along Sheldon, but they have now done so One of the major issues right now is water to the area There's a water main that will need to be moved in order to maintain water service, but the sides are disputing responsibility for such a move

County officials couldn't be reached for comment According to Sincock, county

officials have told the Detroit Water and Sewerage

Department since the equipment belongs to them, they have to move it Detroit water officials have refused, and now the county is considering

"So the county is thinking about starting this major project by suing one of its primary

participants, said Sincock, who said commissioners would discuss the issue at Monday's commission meetıng

At a project meeting two weeks ago to discuss utilities, city and township officials arrived to find representatives from Detroit Water,

Consumers Energy and even the county's own engineering people didn't attend

"It costs us money every time we do these meetings, because we have people there plus we're paying our engineers to be there, as is the township," Sincock said


The project is scheduled to close Sheldon south of the underpass, with traffic north of it detoured to 5 Mile for some 23 months More than 20,000 drivers use Sheldon daily

Local officials, tiring of waiting for the county to get started, are looking at other things on which to spend the money, particularly if the price is going

We back any improvements in the Plymouth Township community," township supervisor Richard Reaume said "We originally put it in the budget at \$1 026 million, and if we have to pay an increase, that's a budget-blower

"We might be able to find the funds, although it would be hard for us because we have other projects planned," Reaume added "We'd have to be robbing from those to pay any increase in the underpass"





Jacobs said problems with the site, labor problems or material shortages would put the scheduled opening of the school in jeopardy

"Do we feel confident? Absolutely," Jacobs said "Are we on schedule now? Yes"

As blueprints for constructing the new school move forward, Jacobs and his staff are also planning more than \$90 million in repairs and renovations at all the district's buildings constructed before 2000

That includes Miller, where the outlay of \$3 5 million will most likely mean closing the building for an entire school year to add walls to classrooms which currently have dividers, replace doors, install new flooring and windows, replace boilers and lighting, and repave the driveway, parking lot and bus loop

### Views split on increasing minimum wage

BY PAUL R PACE STAFF WRITER

Democrats in the House and Senate are proposing to raise Michigan's minimum wage by \$2 to \$7 15 per hour in an effort they called long overdue for working families

"We can't keep waiting for Washington to act - we need to stand up for Michigan's working families right now," said Rep Aldo Vagnozzi, D-Farmington/Farmington Hills

"Not only will it offer fair compensation for hard work, but it ll provide a shot in the arm to our local economy Its sensible public policy"

Some local business owners aren't so sure its a good idea, however

Jerry Burger, owner of Dagwood's Deli in downtown Farmington, said he's against

'I'm a firm believer in letting the market dictate wages," he

If the minimum wage is raised, Burger said, 'I would have to raise prices

The sandwich shop owner said it is usually high schoolage workers who settle for minimum wage pay of \$5 15 an hour

"We're training them for future jobs,' he said "There's a burden on us to be patient with them We're imparting experience on them'

He said once a worker gains experience, he or she usually can demand \$8 or \$9 an hour without a problem

According to Democrats, raising the minimum wage by \$2 per hour would directly benefit at least 464,000 Michigan workers — or nearly one in six hourly workers statewide

Vagnozzi said even though the state is facing hundreds of millions of dollars in budget cuts and it is tied with Alaska for having the worst unemployment rate in the nation. the bills aren't anti-business

"There is never a good or bad time to introduce something like this," he said "It would, to a large extent, stimulate the economy"

In November, 70 percent of Florida voters agreed to increase the state's minimum

wage to \$7 an hour, he added Should Michigan follow the

trend? Maureen Cowley of Cowley's Pub and Restaurant in downtown Farmington said she's not sure if the measure would help husinesses

'Any time it affects the bottom line, it will cost more," she

Cowley said she can understand the proposals would help people making low wages

"It's a difficult topic to approach," she said They're trying to pay their bills It's got to be a balance between the business and the wage earner"

The proposed bills being touted by Democrats in Lansing suggest raising the mınımum wage ın Mıchıgan ın three increments from July to Jan 1, 2007 A second bill would raise the minimum wage for waitstaff and other service employees from \$2 65 to \$4 60 per hour in the same increments



### Center Stage is facing wrecking ball

The Police, Rodney Dangerfield, The Allman **Brothers Band and Grand** Funk Raılroad all played Center Stage in its late 70s early 80s heyday

Now, plans call for demolishing the club on Ford Road east of I-275, and building a 11 500 square-foot strip mall and a 14,000 square foot Gordons Food Service market

The strip mall developer is negotiating with Starbucks Noodles and Company restau rant, and others to occupy sites

'They would like to go as soon as possible," said project engineer Bob Rowe adding the project must win approval from township planners Developer Bill Banıckı said

he expects to buy the property by mid-February, from the family of long time owner John Sassak, who died in 2003

Rowe said 'it's real prema ture' to say when the strip mall and market would open, adding construction would likely begin by fall

Planning requirements for that stretch of Ford Road include brick building facades garden walls and landscape provisions in keeping with the upscale village look township planners have established for the flourishing business dis-

### LIFE AND DEATH OF DREAM

There wasn t a bad seat in the house recalled former Center Stage manager John Goci, who currently owns the US 12 club in Wayne

in the mid-70s, the original

owners had a deal with the top local booking agency of the time, Brass Ring Productions They brought in top acts including Ricky Nelson War, and Brooks and Dunn

When the original owners ran into money problems Sassak - a tool and die business owner who also ran the Urban Cowboy club in Westland complete with mechanical bull - took over

Goci recalled the 20 000 square foot clubs acoustics as superior Center Stage was the largest such club on the west side, holding 1 500 on two levels Even more impressive were two skyboxes available for rentals, before the notion of suites became common

A former World War II bomber pilot, Sassak also showed major boxing matches on closed circuit TV at Center Stage Goci said the legendary Thomas Hearns vs Sugar Ray Leonard bout in 1989 was memorable The club was packed Hearns knocked Leonard down twice, but Leonard was named the win ner Everybody was totally distraught the Hit Man lost Goci recalled Everybody thought he won and were quite upset

Around this time, the club was also becoming known for other fights involving groups of teens as Center Stage was also serving as a teen club

The Canton police used to set up vans in the parking lot recalled Township Supervisor Tom Yack Sometimes teenagers get

out of hand, Goci said I don t recall anybody being seriously injured I got a lot of When Center Stage was built for this business at Center

Sassaks son, Mark, said his father 'loved the night club business John Sassak later tried to recast the Center Stage as a dinner club but closed it in 2001 after he was injured in a car accident He died at age 83 in May 2003

#### **MOVING ON**

Banicki said he does not have a name for the property, to be developed by his company Model Properties, which is headquartered in Flushing near Flint Hes so positive about the prospects for success that the land sale is going through immediately, and is not being tied to approval of the development by the town ship government

It's certainly near I-275 You ve got a huge anchor next door that draws a lot of traffic Wal-Mart and Sam's Club are very powerful and Ford Road is an absolutely great site for a small strip mall," Banicki said , We don't anticipate any big problems

Other strip malls developed by Banicki include the 32 000 square-foot Riverview Plaza at Fort and Pennsylvania roads 1 Riverview and another at Ford Road and Middlebelt in Garden City which includes a Rite Aid



### **Underpass** needs critical re-think

Five years is long enough

That's how long the plan to build an underpass at the CSX railroad crossing on Sheldon Road has been kicked around by Wayne County, Plymouth and Plymouth Township officials The project was to be paid for largely using federal money funneled through Wayne County, with both the city (\$500,000) and township (\$12 million) kicking in

It was a project designed, after some short-term pain, to fix the traffic problems created by trains halting commuters in both directions on Sheldon, which is heavily traveled at drive time. At the time, there were a few kinks to work out, including the acquisition of rights-of-way and moving the water system that feeds the area

Those were supposed to be worked out in short order, and the project was originally to have been completed in two years For the longest time, CSX officials dragged their feet Then moving the water main became a problem Now the sides are wrangling over language in the intergovernmental agreement that would cap monetary commitments from the city and township at their original levels

So it's five years later, nothing has been done on the project, and it's time for both Plymouth and Plymouth Township to re-evaluate their support

The city is particularly vulnerable to this project, because it can't really afford the half-million dollars it's going to take The underpass isn't even in the city, and commissioners there must decide whether there are other priorities

Plymouth Township officials are building a new township hall, they have recreational improvements they'd like to make and a sidewalk plan they'd like to see through

Local businesses along that corridor are also likely to be seriously affected, what with a projected two-year closure of Sheldon at the underpass

And that's if it really is only two years. The county has had trouble even getting started on this project, there's absolutely no indication it will go smoothly if it ever does get started

There's a hint the county might be looking for the Plymouths to take on a larger share of the financial burden If that's the case, the city commission and the township board need to take a serious look at the cost-benefit ratio

Five years later, it's probably not getting any better

There's a big difference between passing laws that sound like good ideas and actually making good laws. The devil, as they say, is in the details, and municipal clerks and school officials see plenty of flaws in the election consolidation law that took effect last month

This law was pushed as a way to improve voter turnout and, in turn, help eliminate stealth elections, those odd-time elections set up by school districts to ensure that only the diehard "yes" voters go to the polls It sets four specific dates a year for all elections — eliminating the June school board votes — and specifies all elections are run under state law

Local clerks, generally, see nothing wrong with limiting the number of elections and making sure voters in city, township or school elections go to the same polling site for each election And improving voter turnout is a great goal

The problem, though, has come in administration of the law In a time of dwindling budgets, the law also looks to be raising the cost of elections School districts that used to run their own elections — many with paper ballots and using their own rules about numbers of election inspectors - can expect to see their costs multiply as clerks following state law require more election workers and the use of voting machines Using machines for, sometimes, several hundred or a thousand voters in a small district school election leaves officials understandably angry with the potential new costs of this new law

School districts are also faced with issues over how clerks' offices will be billing them, and for what hours The law requires schools to reumburse for costs beyond regular staff during business hours, but at least one municipal clerk — Canton's Terry Bennett — is using the change to seek payment for expenses even beyond what the law requires Facing that situation, Plymouth-Canton Schools Supt. Jim Ryan is among those who say it's a "bad law" and he notes "I feel like we're losing the positive relationship we have with our local municipalities

Officials agree This law has gaps and lawmakers will need to make plenty of revisions once we get past this first year of elections And we can only hope the lessons learned won't end up costing taxpayers even more money Lawmakers could have avoided some of those issues, it seems, by phasing such a law in over a longer period of time

### Granholm typically cautious in revamping of tax system

erhaps the very hardest thing for anyone holding public office is deciding whether and when - to be bold or to be cautious

An example Faced with a then-unprecedented budget crisis in 1983, newly elected Gov James Blanchard chose to fight to temporarily hike the state income tax to cover the deficit Net result? Economically, the measure worked, and within a couple of years the tax increase expired and the state had returned to prosperity

Yet politically, there was a big downside for the Democrats Two of their state senators who voted for the measure were recalled, and the

> Republicans took control and have dominated the Senate ever

Personally, I thought Blanchard did the responsible and right thing And maybe the crushing reality of the situation left him with no real choice But the conventional political wisdom flowing from the event is that being bold - when it comes to raising taxes - is always a mistake

Now, we are facing a new and timely test of this proposition,

in the form of the revisions to the Single Business Tax proposed last week by State Treasurer Jay Rising and Gov Jennifer

Certainly, something has had to be done about the antiquated 40-year-old SBT At heart, it's a tax on payroll, for a state leading the nation in job loss, this seems a perverse way to structure our main business tax In national surveys comparing state tax climates, Michigan has always stood out like a sore thumb because of the onerous way the SBT operates Moreover, administering and computing the tax is a royal pain, some businesses spend more in figuring out how much tax they owe than the actual tax they pay

The proposed changes get a lot of things right ■ The rate drops from 19 percent to 12 percent, a reduction of more than one-third

■ The tax base reduces the use of payroll as a factor, which also penalizes firms less for hiring

■ A credit for research and development expenses should help high-tech companies

■ Manufacturers using lots of expensive equipment get a credit for personal property

All told, according to Rising, some 72,000 state businesses (including many small firms, which tend to be the main source of job growth) will see a tax reduction Another 67,000 businesses will see no tax change, and 22,000 (including, notably, insurance companies) will

get higher tax bills Overall, the changes in the SBT are supposed to be "revenue neutral," which means they are designed to not affect the total amount of money coming to the state

But the obvious question now is whether the changes being proposed are far reaching ("bold") enough to really make a substantial difference to our economy Some business types have proposed doing away with the SBT altogether and replacing it with a tax on business profit

Personally, I have argued for eliminating the SBT and replacing it by broadening the sales tax to include services, but at a reduced rate On the other hand, the SBT represents a big component of state revenue (now around \$2 2 billion annually), and it is a relatively stable tax in a state with a very volatile economy

The Granholm administration has typically followed the path of moderate caution as it has made its choices along the bold-cautious continuum So the recent SBT proposals are consistent with its overall philosophy And from this perspective, they certainly represent a good first

In such matters, however, it's useful to consider what the economists call the "opportunity cost" The opportunity cost of choosing to buy fixed-interest bonds, for example, is that while such a choice may limit the likelihood of major loss, it also forgoes the possibility of big gains that could come if the money were invested in the stock market

In choosing to make cautious changes in the SBT, the Granholm administration has forgone an opportunity to address the basic problem in Michigan's financial picture - the chronic structural deficit in the state budget Deciding to junk the SBT and spread the sales tax to services is probably the easiest way to eliminate repetitive \$1 billion holes in the budget, but it's a risky move A revenue-neutral tweak at the tax will likely, over time, result in some employment gains, but it almost certainly will not result in any fundamental improvement in the state's financial situation

Choosing one route over another is all a matter of basic instinct between risk and reward, between boldness and caution As the old saying goes, "you pays your money and you takes your

But I still remember that when incoming Gov John Engler was maugurated, former Gov George Romney leaned over and gave him only two words of advice "Be bold!" That was advice he took, and whatever your politics, no man can say that John Engler didn't make a difference

### Death shouldn't have to be the catalyst for making things right ...

🌋 y kıd brother's dad dıed Sunday after-

That's a pretty blunt way to put it, but that's how death really is One second you're alive, the next you're not Sounds like the beginnings of a "downer" column, but maybe it doesn't have to be

My kid brother's dad died Sunday afternoon, and maybe there are lessons in his death - for all of us

He was my dad, too, but for fewer of my growing-up years He married my mother Marth 1, 1973, when I was 14 My older brother was 16 and my sister was just about

> 12, but my little brother was only 10 He was in our lives for several years before that

> He owned a bar with his mother on Detroit's east side, and one of the two jobs my mother worked was tending bar there It was a little neighborhood bar called Henry's, at Seven Mile and Gratiot, back when that area thrived more than it does today There was a Montgomery Ward across the street, a

Fretter's appliance store on the corner and a

Kadrich

Woolworth's down the block My mother found love in that bar and, for a long time, we found happiness, or at least our version of it When I was a teenager, it was the coolest place in the world to be, much like the fictional Cheers would be years later on televi-

The "regulars" were all young, vibrant people There were pool and foosball tables in the back, there were three pinball machines up front Guys named Dale and Tommy and Gary taught me how to push the pinball machines to get the right bounces

They weren't skills I'd need later in life, but at the time there wasn't anyplace on Earth I'd rather have been Those guys were heroes to

I remember how happy my mom was the Christmas Eve she got her engagement ring She'd moved us out of riot-torn Detroit to south Warren in 1967, and had struggled to put food on the table and clothes on our backs My grandmother lived with us to take care of us while Mom worked two jobs

The night she got engaged, she was running all over our small house, the one she'd bought with her own money and on her own terms, screaming, "See my ring! See my ring!" It was the happiest I'd ever seen her, or ever would, looking back on it now

Christmas Eves we'd have the regulars over for drinks and fun, we'd play touch football in

But as the years wore on, the regulars grew older, got married, had children and moved on. So did we, my brothers and sister and I.

the street, snowy or not We'd have annual picnics with softball games and other activities We had jackets made, proudly proclaiming we were from Henry's

When I was in the Air Force, I'd come home to visit, and we'd pick up a bag full of White Castle hamburgers and watch football before I had to go back to the base It's actually one of my favorite memories

But as the years wore on, the regulars grew older, got married, had children and moved on So did we, my brothers and sister and I Mom and Dad didn't and, as the area worsened and the business deteriorated, so did their relationship, and ours Mom died in 1986, just weeks after the birth of her first grandson

Dad swore at the time he'd be part of our lives, and he tried — for a while He showed ~ up for family parties, remembered birthdays, though not for all the kids. He attended the christening for my son, Robert, who was named partially after him I called him when Andrew was born 18 months later, but the call wasn't returned, and I hadn't really spoken to him since That was more than six years ago

That wasn't true of my kid brother, who grew up with Dad as more of a father figure than we did He made the effort, made the trek frequently from his Oxford home to Dad's <sup>‡1</sup> St Clair Shores condo with his wife and two daughters He called Dad and his new wife on "9 birthdays and anniversaries and holidays

They had much more of a father-son relationship, and that's actually a good thing He doesn't have the same issues his two older brothers had when Dad died My older brother and I rushed to the hospital to make things right, as estranged family members often must do For my kid brother, it was already right

In retrospect, in light of death, I wish it was right for me, too My dad died Sunday, too Not my father, but my dad And in his death is a lesson for everyone

Make things right while you still have the chance







ust a few days before, many metro Detroit communities received more than 10 inches of snow

But about 60 city and township officials, garden volunteers, landscapers and homeowners met Wednesday at a meeting of the Southeast Oakland County Water Authority in Bloomfield Township to discuss, of all things, lawn care, landscaping, tree planting and

So why discuss these topics when there's still show on the ground? Well, lawn care compames start distributing information to residents and homeowners about lawn care at this time of year, said Lillian Dean, coordinator of the Healthy Lawns & Gardens for the Southeastern Oakland County Water Authority

And obviously nobody is too busy working outside to inform themselves on proper yard care And it's not too early to start thinking about spring

"People are indoors and municipalities really have a role to play in educating their constituents,' Dean said

### Diversify trees when selecting ash replacements

Bert Cregg, assistant professor and extension specialist in the department of horticulture and forestry at Michigan State University, believes tree selections by communities and homeowners for plantings should be diversified

Just as the elm tree was savaged by Dutch elm disease, the emerald ash borer wreaked havoc on ash trees in Michigan over the past three years

Cregg estimates that 8 million trees have been affected by the emerald ash borer Much of southeastern Lower Peninsula is under the emerald ash borer quarantine Once the ash borer is discovered and the tree treated, that treatment will continue "in perpetuity," Cregg said

One survey found that nearly 25 percent of a typical community's trees are ash, because they were easy to grow, tough trees, ornamental and had few pest problems

Cregg recommends that communities should look at tree species and make sure they do not

have more than 10 percent of one species in their communities "There's also the 'look around' rule," Cregg said 'If you see the same (species)

tree nearby, plant something else' When planting trees, look at adaptability (sun/shade, available space), design intent, originality and diversity Cregg said there is no alternate to ash that meets all of that tree's characteristics "You have to ask yourself what traits of the ash that you liked about ash," he said

Trident maple, hedge maple, state street maple, red maple, American hornbeam, hackberry, American yellowwood, hardy rubber tree, ginkgo and Kentucky coffeetree are all ones that can be planted The red maple is a Michigan native, hornbeams can be seen along the Red Cedar River on the MSU campus, while hackberrys can be used in tight spots, Cregg said "Kentucky coffeetrees can be messy with seed pods," he said

Others are sweetgum, hophornbeam, plane tree, swamp white oak, scarlet oak and shingle oak. Tree diseases and pests tend to make trees turn a full circle Ash trees were planted by many homeowners to trees lost to Dutch elm, and ironically, elms will soon be available to replace the ash trees, Cregg said Hybridizing the elms in recent years have made them resistant to the

Dutch elm "Elms are somewhat ugly ducklings, and it will take time for the cultivars to work their way through the inventory pipelines of nurseries," he said Nurseries nurture the cultivars (grafted trees) for eight-10 years before selling them to the public Cregg suggests homeowners check the Web site www hrt msu edu for tree ideas and information "The biggest problem is planting too deep," Cregg said Ropes around the trunk and root ball and wire baskets on the root ball set the tree up for girdling and can kill the tree

### Personal video players not quite ready for prime time

Personal video players, or PVPs, made a big splash at this year's Consumer Electronics Show

And why not? Countless devices already let you listen to music on the go, so it's only logical to add video to the mix

After all, who wants to be stuck with some watered-down in-flight movie when you could be watching episodes of Curb Your Enthusiasm on your own private player?

Unfortunately, the appeal of the PVP has been mitigated by overpriced, overcomplicated first-generation products

For instance, one of the best PVPs I've seen thus far is the Archos AV420 Equipped with a



Broida

20GB hard drive and 3 5-inch color screen, it not only plays music and videos, but records them as well You can actually connect the AV420 to a VCR or DVD player to record TV shows and copy movies

However, these can be awkward, time-consuming processes In an ideal world, you'd plug the device

into your TiVo and transfer your recorded shows in a matter of minutes (Don't think this won't happen — we're just not there yet )

Actually, this kind of simplicity can be found in a PVP like the Creative Zen Portable Media Center, which links seamlessly with Windows Media Player 10 for downloading content stored on


Great, but where does the content come from? You need a TV tuner card if you want to record shows to your PC, and even then you have to deal with potentially incompatible video formats, lengthy file conversions and other

As for DVDs, you have to jump through hoops with legally iffy ripping software just to get the movies off the discs and onto your hard drive Even then, there's no guarantee the movie files will play properly on the PVP (see "incompatible video formats," above)

In short, PVPs require a lot of time, patience and knowledge — to say nothing of cash The AV420 costs a whopping \$550, the Zen, \$500

For that kind of money, you could buy a top-end portable DVD





around the trees, you start to get erosion," Lazzell said "But when you put the trees together, you take out grass, put down mulch and you get away from these mulch volcanoes" That grouping creates a larger area to help filter water runoff and lessens the need for fertilizer

Planting slower growing plants means less maintenance There are 10 to 15 varieties of

ewes that don't get higher than three to four feet, so they don't need pruning," Lazzell said "Look at it before you buy it"

Stormwater runoff — probably the biggest problem facing communities in the Rouge River watershed - can be filtered, while erosion can be slowed by landscaping with mulch and garden beds, Lazzell

"The velocity of water 1s what causes runoff," Lazzell said "Landscaping slows down water and slows erosion

To build a healthy soil, you need to add nutrients, especially if the yard is located at a new home and has been stripped of its soil "Organisms make the soil healthy," Lazzell said Lazzell recommends testing the pH level in the soil at least once every three years

Garden beds should have compost and mulch, he said "Don't put harsh chemicals in your beds'

Compost also releases water and nutrients as the plants need them, so that helps conserve water Lazzell said the cost of water increased 4 4 percent nationally "Watering is becoming more and more expensive," Lazzell saıd

Carol Alexander of Bloomfield Township, who volunteers for SOCWA, said these same principles discussed at the meeting should be used by homeowners when assessing their lawn and yard needs for the upcoming growing season

Vincent shares some tips To get flavor in the liquid soak (infuse) the fruit as indicated in the recipe, macerate it (age for the specific time), or percolate by pouring boiling water over it You need to capture the flavor, rack to separate the clear liquid from the sediment, and carefully bottle it To strain, use a paper towel (support it with a strainer), but do not use a coffee filter Age at least a month - or longer - for best flavor

Here's a recipe for spiced rum you can make for your Valentine, if you start right away (you still have 11 days!) cup sugar, 1 cup water, 21/2 cups (good) dark rum, 4 teaspoons pure vanilla extract, 12 whole allspice (crushed), 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves (or whole cloves crushed), 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg and 2 cınnamon sticks

Bring sugar and water to boil over medium heat, stirring constantly to prevent scorching When clear, remove from heat and cool to just warm Combine this syrup, with remaining ingredients in a clean one-quart jar with a screw on-lid (Mason jar) Cover and let stand in a cool dark place for three to four weeks Use a fine-mesh strainer to strain out solids Discard





Franklın's worst-to-first comeback didn't come as a surprise to coach Dave Chiola, who has witnessed his current


group of wrestlers potential steadily develop into positive results since they competed for him in the seventh and eighth grades


John Maurer couldn t skate before he could run — but it was close

### Ford Field to be site of MHSAA football finals

The Michigan High School Athletic Association has entered into a multi-year agreement with Ford Field to host its Football Finals beginning with the 2005 playoffs

The announcement was made Thursday in a press conference at the state-of-the-art facility in downtown Detroit involving personnel from the City of Detroit, Ford Field and the Detroit Lions

The move to the 65,000-seat facility is only third in the 30year history of the tournament In the tournaments first year -1975 - the Finals were split, with two classes of competition takıng place at Waldo Stadium ın Kalamazoo, and two at Perry Shorts Stadium in Mt Pleasant

The event moved indoors in 1976 to the Pontiac Silverdome, the second year that facility was in business, which has hosted over 1 75 million fans for 176 title games in the last 29 years

"With the future of the Pontiac Silverdome in doubt, this is a necessary move for high school football in our state, and it will be great to have our premier games played in one of the premier facilities in the country," said Jack Roberts, executive director of the MHSAA "Ford Field has much to offer our game's participants and spectators They will enjoy the opportunity to begin playing the Finals at Ford Field this November, just two months before the venue will host the 2006 Super Bowl'

With the move to Ford Field will come other changes in the event, the most notable of which will be a single \$9 admission to watch four title games ın a sıngle dav "We always felt, our \$9 ticket

for two games, which previously included on-site parking at the Finals, was a great bargain,' Roberts said "That same ticket will now allow a fan to watch all four games on a single day, and we feel that Ford Field has worked hard to provide parking that is in close proximity to the facility at a reasonable price'

Parking, at lots operated by Olympia Entertainment, will provide approximately 2,700 spaces adjacent to Ford Field or Comerica Park at a cost of \$6 00 for passenger cars "We want our fans to drive to the Olympia parking lots, which will offer an outstanding value and which are some of the closest, if not the closest, lots to Ford Field '

In addition, there are private lots just south of Ford Field

with an additional 700 spaces available Roberts added that private lots generally follow the lead of the Olympia lots in terms of pricing

"As the games approach, we will encourage fans to visit the MHSAA Web site often to become familiar with the parking areas around Ford Field and to learn about the facilities many amenities," he said "For those fans planning to watch multiple games, the stadium has a variety of in-house dining options available, making an all-day stay attractive"

Because of Ford Field's location, accessible by freeway from all directions, housing options will be available downtown and on the perimeter of the city, all within a 30-minute drive

"Visitors to this event will be able to find the kind of lodging they want," Roberts said "With the amenities they want, at competitive prices, all within a reasonable distance, regardless of the direction they will coming from"

The MHSAA will also engage in promotional efforts for the event and seek corporate support for it with the assistance of the Ford Field/Detroit Lions marketing staff

"High school sports by their nature must keep a low commercial profile, but it has become necessary to engage the support of corporate partners to help underwrite the costs of these events," Roberts said

"We plan to work closely with the marketing staff at Ford Field to attract such support, including a major sponsor This kind of effort will keep our expenses low and assist us in conducting programming in all sports

Roberts also complimented the Pontiac Silverdome for its many years of service

"Our run of 29 consecutive years at the Pontiac Silverdome was the second longest at any site ever for an MHSAA Final event, and we are appreciative of how well the building and its staff served our schools and their fans," Roberts said "We leave the Silverdome with some great memories of great games, and salute the people behind the scenes there and the City of Pontiac for being an excellent host to the event'

The only facility to continuously host an MHSAA Final event longer than the Silverdome is Stowe Stadium in Kalamazoo, with 58 years of service as a Boys Tennis Finals venue beginning in 1947

The fee will principally be used by the township to provide street sweeping once a week for thirty (30) weeks of the year and maintenance of the siltation fabric on the catch basins The fee may also be used but is not required to be used to offset the expense incurred by the township for minor grading seeding cleanouts of catch basins and the stormwater system or activity reasonably related to flood prevention and stormwater runoff pollution prevention such activity by the township not affecting the applicants obligations under Section 106 33 above. **COOKING WITH ROSES RECIPES** 

### RUBY ROSE SYRUP

Rose syrup keeps well in bot tles for months without refrig-

It can be added to canned frozen or fresh fruit such as pears, figs, apricots, strawberries, bananas, oranges or cranberries

Make a fluffy hard sauce or whipped cream flavored with rose syrup to use on steamed puddings, gelatin desserts, applesauce cake or gingerbread

ments for thousands of years, and Napoleon's army treated lead poisoning from bullet wounds by using rose petals boiled in white wine, according to www foodreference com

On a more appetizing note, scented roses were used to make a jelly in the 19th centu-

ry, the Web site said According to the American Rose Society (which features recipes for cooking with roses at its Web site, www.ars.org), rose water has been used in the East for centuries - for flavor and nutrition.

Arabians glaze a roasting chicken with rose water, honey and butter, in Greece, rose water flavors candies and rich pastries, in Turkey, a rose water sprinkler is on the dinner table, according to the ARS

When Britain's citrus supply was cut off during World War II, the British got their vitamin C from rose hips, said Nancy Lindley, who with her husband, Roger, owns Great Lakes Roses, south of Belleville

"The hips are very high in vitamin C No other fruit is as high in vitamin C, ounce per ounce, as rose hips," she said

The roses in Lindley's cooking come from Great Lakes Roses, as chemical pesticides and fungicides aren't used at the nursery

'Don't use any rose products from roses that have been treated with pesticides or fungicides in the past year," she said If you re just buying a rose bush from a nursery, wait a year (before cooking with the roses) so you know its history" Lindley, author of Roses From Michigan, describes the taste of

Roses and apples are related," she said "Like apples, roses taste sweeter after a frost" Rose hips are cooked the same

roses as "very like an apple"

way as cranberries boiled in a mixture of equal parts sugar and water until they pucker, Lindley said The skin is then strained Two parts of the rose are used

in cooking the blooms (petals) and hips (seed pods), Lindley said The sepals (protective leaves) and stems are removed

Cooking with rose hips is more of a northern European tradition, Lindley said Rose hips in Rugosa roses are

about the size of marbles They are smaller in multiflora roses 'The hips can be dried The

petals need to be used fresh," Lindley said Dark-colored rose petals have a more metallic taste, while the taste of light-colored

rose petals is very mild, Lindley said "Most of what you're experiencing (with lighter roses) is

the fragrance," she said Lindley said she will include a section on cooking with roses ın her next book.

#### **CHAMPAGNE AND ROSES**

Recipes from the American Rose Society include coating petals with the white of one egg beaten to foam and sprinkling sugar on both sides After they have dried in the refrigerator, the petals can be used to garnish cakes or served as candy

Another ARS recipe is Rose Frost Twist the rims of beverage glasses in a mixture of egg white and a little rose water whipped to froth Sprinkle with granulated sugar, and dry on waxed paper

For her Champagne and Roses jam (see recipe), Chapman picks handfuls of petals off rose bushes from the garden of her daughter-in-law, who doesn't spray the roses with chemicals

"You don't want to use petals that have been sprayed," Chapman said "I prefer using roses that have a nice fragrance I think it makes the

jam taste a little better" She selects petals in reds and deep pinks for the recipe

"It makes a nice, pretty rose blush The rose petals dissolve and disappear," she said Chapman minces the petals on a cutting board the same

### It's harder to sell a house in the winter

You're house-hunting in the winter Your agent has parked in front of what might be your dream house But it's one of those gray Michigan days It's freezing cold It's windy It's snowing You think you have the flu You're about to get out of the car and you're wondering if you've lost your mind

Well, before you rush off to have yourself committed for house-hunting in the winter, do what the home inspectors do when they arrive at a house in a wintry setting. What they do is look at the roof

A snow-covered roof, the inspectors can tell you, is an excellent way to check on attic insulation If the snow lies in an even blanket all across the roof, the inspectors will say, you can be confident about the ınsulatıon

But if you see patches of bare roof where the snow has melted away, you should suspect improper insulation and heatloss in those spots

And that just might be all the good news there is about how a blızzard can help you choose a house to buy Actually, it might even be harder to sell houses during winter

"The weather definitely slows us down," said Joan Downing, sales agent with RE/MAX in the Hills, Bloomfield Hills

"I just can't show as many homes when the streets are impassable or have ruts in them," she said "It can take us forever to get from house to house'

It also can seem like forever, she said, to get house-hunters up and down snow-covered or icy front walks and steps "You have to go out a second

time to show the same amount of houses we'd show in good weather - say, just three houses in two hours, instead of six" If bad weather hits while sellers are out of town,

Downing said, "we might have to make arrangements to have their sidewalks and steps made 'Or those of us who are more

### Power up for snow removal with blower

(MS) - Who can say they didn't make (or at least consider) a solemn promise last winter No more shoveling! Wise decision, and not just for your aching muscles, but your heart According to a recent study, snow shoveling requires as much energy as playing tennis or downhill skiing Cold temperatures can camouflage the symptoms of overexertion, so it's no surprise that heart attacks often result from snow

shoveling Now that you have even more of a reason to trade in your shovel for a snowthrower, here are some basic guidelines will help determine which model is right for you

Walk-behind snowthrowers generally fit into one of three categories - single-stage, twostage and electric

Single-stage units are light and easy to maneuver They gather snow with a high-speed rotor and throw it out of the machine in a single action Two-stage units are more powerful and first break up the snow with a slow-turning auger, then pass it to a highspeed impeller that blows it out through a chute

As a general rule of thumb, electric snowthrowers are not built to be as powerful as larger gas-powered models Yet for those with smaller areas to clear, an electric snowthrower might be ideal It can clear snow up to 6 inches deep, throwing snow as far as 20 feet away, and is perfect for cleaning sidewalks, decks and steps

For heavy-duty snow

removal, gas-powered equipment is the answer Light, fluffy snow can be handled with a single-stage machine Single-stage snowthrowers move snow in one motion and require less power than twostage units For snow depths of more than 6 inches, or heavy, wet or 1cy snow, a two-stage snowthrower is your best bet Two-stage machines aggressively move piles of snow, like those left by the snow plow Areas with heavy, drifting snowfalls, like lake-effect snows, generally opt for twostage models Two-stage models are also the only option for unpaved surfaces, because they have "skid shoes" that allow them to ride above the ground

Pay close attention to the snow - throwing design

Models may look alike, but those with easy-to-use drive and chute control mechanisms promote ease of maneuverability and snow placement Look for a better model that can start easily Many gas-powered models have electric start options, which are highly recommended on larger two-stage

units Look for manufacturers

who offer engines with starting

guarantees

Since problems can arise, read the warranty before purchasing The best warranties cover all material and workmanship defects for two years or more It is also a good idea to make sure there's a service center in your area that can handle the type of snowthrower you buy For information. visit www toro com



Learn about the different types of foreclosure properties, and the foreclosure process

There are three basic types of foreclosure properties, representing different stages in the foreclosure process noticeof-default (NOD) and notice of trustee sale (NTS), which are both pre-foreclosure properties, and real-estate-owned (REO), a foreclosure property which has been re-purchased by the bank For most consumers, buying

a pre-foreclosure property from a private homeowner is the best option It's important that both the buyer and the seller see the situation as a win-win situation, in order to ensure a smooth process In this case, the seller is able to get out from under a mortgage without destroying their credit rating, the lender is saved the time and expense of foreclosing on the property, and the

buyer gets a below-market price on a home

Foreclosure auction sales are typically the domain of the professional investor These properties are formally in default, and sold to the highest bidder at an auction Buyers are required to be physically present at the auction, and must pay 100 percent of the sale price in cash, on the spot Though foreclosure auctions can offer significant savings, they are not for the feint of heart or the uninformed Unless the buyer is already familiar with a particular property, there is usually little time to examine it And the buyer will be competing against professional investors - and sometimes even the lender - at the auction

Once the lender officially reclaims a home, it becomes a real-estate-owned property (d) While REO properties typically offer more time for evaluation and a more standard bank-managed transaction, their prices are usually very close to full retail market

■ Secure financing early It s important for a buyer to be pre-qualified before engaging in discussions with a seller This ensures that the buyer is in a financial position to purchase the property, and is in the strongest possible position to negotiate It's best to work with a lender who understands the foreclosure process, and can guide the buyer through certain steps, such as ensuring that a property is FHA-compliant Another reason to consider pre-qualification is that not

all lenders finance foreclosure properties Having approved financing in-hand makes negotiations with both the seller and the lender easier, and may even make it possible for the buyer to simply cure the default and take over the existing loan to reduce loan processing fees

Engage a real estate agent as a "buyer's representative" Most people hire a real estate agent to sell their home These 'seller's representatives' are charged with making the sale and negotiating the best deal for their clients "Buyer's representatives" have the home buyer's interests at heart, and are charged with finding the right property and negotiating the best price for their clients Picking the right real estate agent will make a buyer's life much easier There are agents who specialize in the foreclosure market, with specific experience in REO properties Look for an agent with foreclosure transaction experience, as well as knowledge of local, regional and state laws But it's also important to consider the agent's knowledge of the area, their ability to close a deal, and their access to other professionals (attorneys, lenders, mortgage and title professionals) to ensure that the buyer is

ın good hands Do your homework Stocks offer higher potential returns for investors than traditional savings programs, but are also riskier Similarly, purchasing foreclosure properties is somewhat more risky than buying traditional real estate properties, but offers much

higher potential savings With the right examination and due diligence, buyers can significantly reduce the risks It makes sense to give any property under consideration a thorough examination Here are eight steps for doing a professional-level exam

■ Make a realistic offer Despite what you may see on late-night cable TV, investing in foreclosure properties isn't a sure fire "get rich quick" formula Lenders aren't likely to give properties away, particularly in a real estate market where prices continue to rise And homeowners in financial distress may be difficult to deal with, particularly early in the foreclosure process The keys to a successful foreclosure property purchase are diligence and patience

As a rule of thumb, the best savings can be made at the pre-foreclosure stage, where home owners can avoid a foreclosure and lenders can save the time and cost involved in going through the process. 

### **EXAMINATION PROCESS STEPS**

■ Identify desirable neighborhoods - Identify specific neighborhoods where you'd like to live or own a home This will limit your search to a manageable size for you and your real estate agent, and give you a sense of relative property values

Cast a wide net - There are a number of Webbased services that can put hundreds of thousands of foreclosure properties at your fingertips. Since the best savings are often found in pre-foreclosure properties it's important to check the percentage of pre-foreclosure (vs REO) properties in any database before subscribing

■ Determine the property value - Look at the original purchase price, and recent comparable property sales to determine the current value of the proper-

Find out the amount in default and the remaining loan balance -- In order to determine a reasonable offer price, you'll need to know - at a minimum how much money it will take just to satisfy the debt

Run a legal investing report - Before purchasing any foreclosure property, make sure it is free and clear of any bankruptcies, tax liens or other financial liabilities

Assess the condition of the property - If at all

possible, visit the property, ask your Realtor's opinion and review pest and structural reports to make sure that the property is in acceptable condition, or to determine how much of a rehab budget you'll need to build in to your deal

■ Build a positive relationship with the seller -Before purchasing the property try to make sure \* that you're entering into a win-win situation with the seller, so that they'll do what they can to make the process easier and leave the property in good condition

Leverage your timing - Knowing when a property is going to be auctioned gives you an extra bargaining chip when negotiating with the seller or the

### Rates on 30-year mortgages fall for a fourth straight week

Rates on 30-year mortgages fell for a fourth straight week as investors waited to see what the Federal Reserve will do with interest rates

Freddie Macs weekly survey of mortgage rates released Jan 27 showed that rates on 30-year, fixed rate mortgages averaged 5 66 percent, down from 5 67 percent

Low mortgage rates have pow ered sales of both new and existing homes to record highs The National Association of Realtors reported Tuesday that existing

home sales climbed to an all time high of 6 68 million units last year, the fourth straight year of record sales

Analysts are forecasting housing will enjoy another good year in 2005 as long as mortgage rates do not rise too sharply under the impact of the Federal Reserve's credit-tightening campaign to make sure inflation stays well con tained

'Until the market gets a better read of how the economy per formed at the end of last year and how the Fed interprets that information, interest rates will likely remain calm, said Frank Nothaft, Freddie Mac's chief economist

Rates on 15-year, fixed-rate mortgages, a popular option for refinancing, dipped to 5 14 percent, down from 5 15 percent Rates on one-year adjustablerate mortgages were 4 18 percent, up slightly from 4 11 per-

Five-year hybrid adjustable rate mortgages averaged 5 02 percent, down from 5 05 percent These hybrid mortgages have a fixed rate for five years and then they adjust each year after that

The nationwide averages for mortgage rates do not include addon fees known as points The 30year, 15-year and five-year mortgages each carried a 0 6 point fee



When Honda and Toyota came up with their versions of light sport-utility vehicles several years ago, with the CR-V and the RAV4 respectively, the two Japanese automakers not unexpectedly hit the nail on the head Now that the entries in the category have proliferated recently, Honda is still doing things right with its CR-V In fact, you could argue that CR-V is doing more things right than anyone else in the segment

The 2005 Honda CR-V is roomy, fun and easy to drive, reliable in bad weather, and well designed on the outside and the inside It sports relatively good gas mileage and a modest price tag to boot Honda keeps improving the CR-V - including some new wrinkles for this year's model - but it remains difficult for the company to improve significantly on its original concept of a car-based SUV that would serve the demands that most American consumers are ready to make on these vehicles

For the most part, we want our SUVs to act like SUVs That means we want to have upright seating and a feel of command from the driver's position We want surefootedness We want enough power to feel confident and perform well in all routine driving situations And we want enough passenger and cargo room for the vehicle to deserve the appellation "utility" CR-V comes through admirably on all those fronts

Some of us also want a lot of power under the hood for climbing the Rocky Mountains, CR-V doesn't offer that The vehicle doesn't even come in a six-cylinder configuration. Others, of course, buy SUVs to take them off-road, but the relatively slight CR-V isn't recommended for that either

As with nearly every Honda, CR-V presents a spare, if pleasing, external design The front grille and bumper have been redesigned for 2005 to improve aerodynamics, complemented by cylindrical headlights that also are new A shorter,

more blunt front end gives CR-V a more rugged look than earlier versions of the vehicle, but you'll never mistake this SUV for a Hummer In any event, the high-mount tail lights on either side of the rear window remain from the original CR-V design, a truly worthy trademark touch

Unusually among SUVs, CR-V's tailgate glass opens separately from the door, which is fine except that the lower part of the gate is sidehinged and opens to the right - an accommodation of right-hand-drive models in Japan, but inconvenient for American curbs where opening to the left would be much more convenient

As with Honda now and from the beginning, the greatest thing about its vehicles is their driveability, and CR-V is no exception Almost in defiance of its competitors, CR-V doesn't even offer an option for a six-cylinder engine But Honda's engineers, naturally, have managed to coax the utmost performance out of the vehicle's 2 4-lite, inline four-cylinder engine 160 horsepower and 162 pound-feet of torque

And while that can't equal the outright oomph of some of CR-V's competitors, Honda makes up for that lack of raw power with fine gearing and optimum tuning of the engine to typical driving

needs, lending a performance that underscores CR-V's original relationship to the Civic platform on which it is based CR-V, unlike some competitors, allows you to forget that you're driving an SUV, and for the most part that's a good thing

Of course, the four-cylinder configuration also pays off in fuel economy CR-V delivers an EPArated 27 miles a gallon on the highway and a fine; 22 mpg in the city

This isn't to suggest that CR-V is a small or frail thing, however Its performance out in snow and ice in this challenging Michigan winter was highly dependable Once inside the vehicle, you'll also find that CR-V offers a generous allotment of room both for passengers and cargo, featuring among other things extraordinary flexibility for the back seat in its range of front-to-back motion and degree of recline

Clever interior-design twists include a foldaway middle console, so that you can either use it to stash stuff or get rid of it in case you need the room on the floor There are plenty of other cubbyholes and compartments, some that it's even fun and a bit of a challenge to find And the climate controls in CR-V are mercifully simple - no small thing in January in metro Detroit

### 'Aliens of the Deep' dazzling beauty underwater

James Cameron goes down with the ship, again, in *Aliens of* the Deep, his latest 3-D IMAX extravaganza now playing at the Henry Ford in Dearborn

The *Trtanic* director, who previously married his loves of filmmaking and underwater exploration in the 2003 documentary *Ghosts of the Abyss*, takes his high-tech toys and a team of scientists and dives deep one more time

The results are frequently dazzling and sometimes even amusing, especially when creatures jump out at you from the screen Chunks of coral jut toward your face, and a jagged monstrosity that one researcher describes as 'the ughest fish in the world' seems to swim right into your lap And it has feet!

(To make the three-dimensional effect work, you have to

wear enormous plastic glasses that will make you and everyone else in the theater look like former Paramount Pictures chief Robert Evans, but it's worth the embarrassment)

Other life forms are far more beautiful, both for their mystery and for the astonishingly sharp way in which they re shot A translucent jellyfish-looking thing - even the scientists admit they have no idea what it is bobs and weaves in a way that recalls the dancing plastic bag from American Beauty A pastel pink creature (which might be an octopus - who knows?) floats like a delicate ballerina through the deep ocean, and scads of shrimp swarm around chimneys that spew ultrahot water

It's all fascinating, and it makes you wish the film lasted longer than 47 minutes

Cameron intended the film to be visually arresting, but he also compiled his crew of marine biologists and astrobiologists to prove that underwater expeditions are crucial for preparing to study the solar system. Life forms exist in unknown, underwater places on Earth where no sunlight has ever shone, and yet they thrive Couldn't this be true on other planets, as well?

That s an excellent point, but one that he and his researchers reiterate a few times too many Yes, the work they re doing is mind-boggling and important, but sometimes the images alone are more than capable of speaking for themselves

At the same time, it would have been helpful to know a little more about some of the creatures they encounter 3,000 feet (900 meters) under the sea, and to know where in the world they are

And we could have done with less Cameron on camera, rallying his troops and navigating unknown oceans worlds from the cockpit of his glassed-in bubble

### 'Hide and Seek' better lost than found

What is Robert De Niro thinking?
The question is being posed not with condescension or derision – though that s probably how it sounds – but with curiosity and concern

When he makes a movie like Hide and Seek – essentially a B-horror flick with the benefit of a high-quality cast – is he doing it for a change of pace? He s turned to comedy in recent years from the films (Taxi Driver, Raging Bull) that defined his esteemed career early on Maybe he felt the need to mix things up again after playing the pent-up gangster shtick of the Analyze This movies and the pent-up retired CIA agent shtick of the Meet the Parents movies

He made a similar choice with last spring s sci-fi bomb *Godsend*, in which he played a doctor who helped a couple clone their child Maybe he sees something in these projects that the rest of us don t

Certainly the first two thirds of this generically titled thriller are engrossing enough, chock full of good, old-fashioned scary movie images and ideas Director John Polson, who also directed the high-school stalker movie *Swimfan*, concocts a sort of horror flick greatest hits in working with Ari Schlossberg's script

De Niro plays New York City psychologist

David Callaway, who takes his daughter, Emily (Dakota Fanning), to a dinky town upstate after the suicide of his wife (Amy Irving) David and Emily move into a rambling Victorian home with creaky doors and hardwood floors, surrounded by dark woods and blanketed in perpetual cloud cover Creepy neighbors stop by with homemade preserves or to drop off extra keys in the middle of the night, and the sheriff (Dylan Baker) personally patrols every home and but still finds time to write parking tickets

Hoping to start over, David becomes friendly with cute divorcee Elizabeth (Elisabeth Shue) and hopes that Emily will come out of her frequently stoic state to make new friends, too

What he doesn't realize is that Emily does have a buddy. His name is Charlie Charlie is fun like mommy. Charlie does not want daddy to be happy. David assumes this is an imaginary pal, the manifestation of her grief. His protege, Katherine (Famke Janssen), who s. Emily s psychologist back in the city, agrees. Then the bodies start piling up. Emily, in her small, eerie voice, blames them on Charlie. De Niro is forced to say and do things that an actor of his stature should not have to say and do

### 'Flesh for the Beast' is mildly tasty

espite the abundance of gore that is reflected routinely in this column, I do try to keep a sense of decorum That's why you will never read a review of, say Jodorowsky's *The Beast*, on these pages

That is what makes it rather difficult to approach Flesh for the Beast — no relation to The Beast — which I found while lurking the shelves of Thomas Video in Clawson

Flesh for the Beast is a tale of a haunted house of ill repute, to put it genteelly A group of dumb but well-meaning psychic researchers comes at the invitation of the owner to the Fisher

mansion (no, not the one in Detroit) to uncover its secrets Owner John Stoker is insistent they seek out the demons haunting his house and doubles the salary of the psychic team when the researchers have some second thoughts about roaming its decrepit halls

So off they go into the dark-

ness Well, what's the first thing you do as a group when you enter a haunted house? Why, you split up and go your separate ways That way there will be no chance of anyone being able to aid anyone else when they come up against the evil spirits

It doesn't make much sense but it does help the story along For just as quick as you can say "my goodness," the young researchers start bumping into unusual people all over the place As first, they think these are vagrants who occasionally have taken refuge in the sprawling old house Sure, vagrants in skimpy nightgowns who could have

served as George's inspiration in the classic *Seinfeld* episode

But these idiot ghost hunters are taken in by the slinky spirits, with dire results. Tearing out and puking up guts seems to be a recurring theme throughout this film.

One spirit has a treasured toy collection, and when one of the researchers accidentally crushes a prized possession she returns the favor by crushing him to the point that he upchucks his lungs and beating heart

There are a few plot twists as we learn that Mr Stoker knows all about the ghosts and really is using the ghostbusters to help him find a magic medallion, which will allow him to control them, or some such nonsense I'm not exactly sure why that is important

And this is a cheap excuse to justify the sex and violence, as if it needed justification

Flesh for the Beast is hardly a great film or even a good film, but if you're in the right frame of mind to waste 90 minutes or so you could do worse Meet the Fockers, for example



The singers are very diverse



The Chinese believe the animal ruling the year in which a person is born has a sig inficant influence on personality. This year its the rooster and such people are said to be very observant accurate and make pre




c so observations. However, a rooster likes to be noticed and flattered. With this in mind a rooster person may dress slightly flashy yet is conservative at heart.

### Let Paul Anka stir it up for Valentine's Day

If you're hoping to stir up some downright shameless puppy love for Valentine's Day, pop icon and singer-songwriter Paul Anka ought to work

Anka, whose love song *Put Your Head On My Shoulder* became a starry-eyed
1950s hit, performs Friday, Feb 11, at
Music Hall Center for the Performing
Arts in downtown Detroit

The show, which features a 14-piece orchestra, is Music Hall's fifth annual Valentines Day concert

What we're doing is a kind of potpourri of songs,' Anka said "Some old, some new"

Of course "old and new" doesn't narrow down the play list much for Anka In his 45 years in the music business, he's written more than 900 songs with LP and single sales collectively numbering more than 60 million

Along the way, he composed My Way for Frank Sınatra, She's a Lady for Tom Jones and It Doesn't Matter Anymore for Buddy Holly His songs have been performed by a diverse selection of heavy-hitting performers, from Elvis Presley to Barbra Streisand to the Sex Pistols



I m inspired by the style of the singer and the singer them selves, Anka said of composing songs for other performers, adding that working with Sinatra was one of his most thrilling collaborations

Another notable project — The Tonight Show theme song that Anka created for Johnny

Carson in 1962 — had the icon making a number of unplanned special performances last week following news the legendary talk show host had passed away

"It feels like they threw away the mold," Anka said of Carson's death 'We go way back"

Thousands of people are expected to attend the event


The crowd will be both mainstream professionals, gothic and punk, gay and straight, singles and couples
