Locals split on Bush plan

As President George W. Bush travels the country explaining the benefits of his plan to overhaul a financially troubled Social Security system, reaction to the establishment of private accounts to build a nest egg for the future is mixed.

In his State of the Union address Monday night, Bush warned the nation the current Social Security system will begin running a deficit in 2018.

Bush's plan includes reducing the amount of benefits being paid out by allowing those under age 55 to put some of the money they currently pay into Social Security into personal retirement accounts, much like an IRA, to keep the federal retirement system from going broke.

"I like the idea of having an account that's your own and will grow in investments," said Charlene Berry, 58, who resides in Plymouth. "And, in the plan, you can leave the money to your children. It's money you worked for."

BACK'S BUSH

Berry's stance may not be too unpredictable. She recently attended the Bush's inaugural ceremonies in Washington, D.C., and was chosen as a 2004 Ronald Reagan Republican Gold Medal award winner.

"It's not a tax-and-spend policy, and President Bush is telling the Democrats we can't survive on tax and spend anymore," Berry said. "I hope people wake up."

On the other side of the coin is Jerry Vassel of Canton Township, an entrepreneur who owns Main Street Catering. Vassel, at age 59, wouldn't be affected by any change in Social Security, but he sees big problems in changing the current system.

Headband sale raises wave of tsunami relief

When Girl Scout Troop 1111 at Isbister Elementary decided to sell colorful fleece headbands to raise relief funds for tsunami victims, little did they know the kind of reaction they would get from fellow students.

The Girl Scouts received a batch of about 50 headbands from Alice Ahern of Plymouth Township, who sewed 100 to sell at her fitness center, but still had half that many leftover.

The Girl Scouts thought it would be a good community service opportunity, so they announced on a Friday they would be selling the headbands for \$6, with \$5 going to the American Red Cross

relief fund. "I thought we'd sell about 100 and make a couple of bucks," said Gusty Kummer, 11, of Plymouth Township. "But, instead, we made a lot of money. I was really surprised."

It took the Girl Scouts less than 20 minutes to sell their stock Monday. That night, Ahern sewed 60 more and the Girl Scouts didn't have to wait long to sell those on Tuesday.

Ahern made 70 more to sell Wednesday, and still every kid that wanted a headband didn't get one.

Ahern gave it one more try, this time sewing 106. Sold out.

"Everyone liked the patterns we had," said Katie Bartek, 10. "Mine was purple

with polka dots. It was cool."

In the end, Girl Scout Troop 1111 made \$1,485. And, they were able to secure matching funds, which made their effort worth double that amount.

"I really felt good helping kids around the world that were hit by the tsunami," said Sarah Dillon, 10. "I really felt bad for the kids that died and the parents who lost their children."

The lessons learned by Troop 1111 were extraordinary, too.

"I think when people see what we did, they will think 'Wow, that's cool' and they will want to help, too," said Kummer.

Board to meet on hall budget

With expenses for the new township hall significantly exceeding budget, the Plymouth Township Board of Trustees meets Wednesday night to consider options.

According to sources, the township hall project, originally pegged at around \$12 million, is already some \$2 million to \$3 million over budget. That's prompting officials to look at available avenues to cut expenses.

Among the options: Delaying or even eliminating the fire station at the site of the new hall.

Township supervisor Richard Reaume said with townships and cities fighting fiscal problems brought on at least in part by loss of state-shared revenue, options to trim expenses must be explored.

"The municipal financing model is broke," Reaume said. "Expenses are increasing exponentially, while revenues and state-shared payments are declining or being eliminated. As a fiduciary of the township, I need to evaluate all areas to either increase revenues and/or lower expenses."

Sources say the township hall project has already gone over budget due to the addition of more square footage than originally designed, as well as hikes in construction and equipment costs.

While township officials have haggled with the project's architects, A3C of Ann Arbor, over additional costs, those costs have begun to spiral, sources say.

At Wednesday's 7 p.m. meeting, board members will consider several options.

Reaume said Friday one of them would be to delay the construction of the fire station, building it in stages, rather than all at once, Reaume said. All of the underground work would be done — water, sewer, electrical, etc. — but then that portion of the

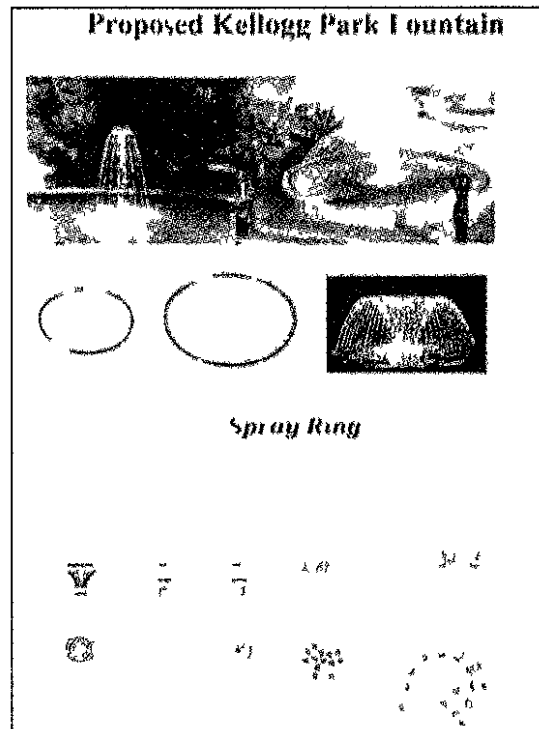

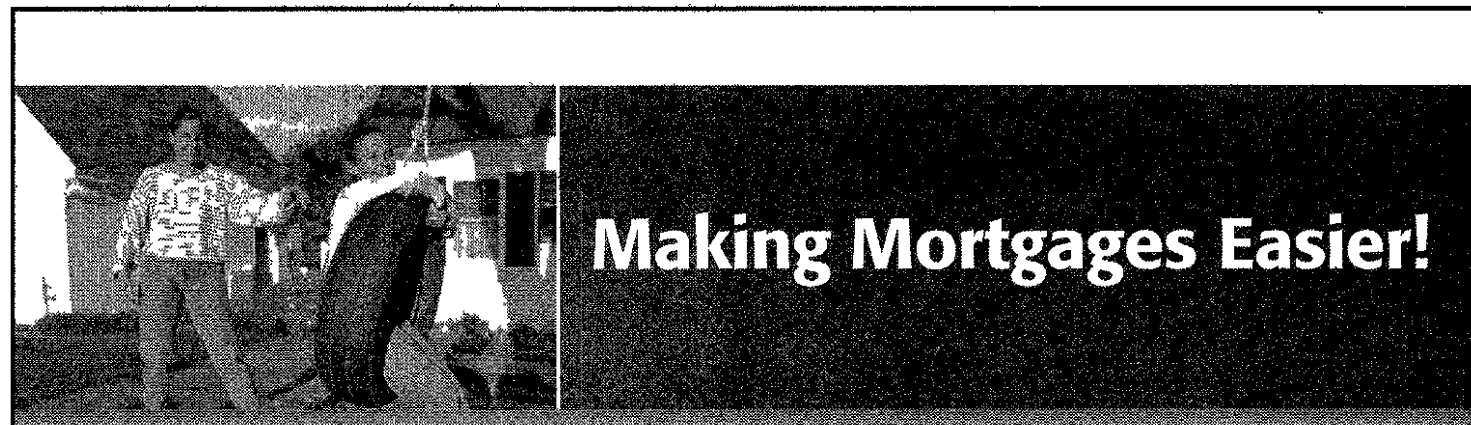

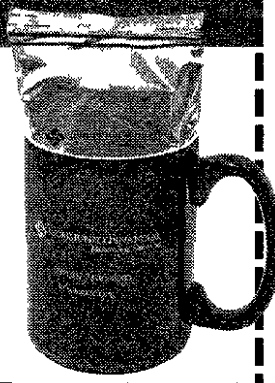

Turning the page

Store owner helps customers hit the books

When the recent snowstorm hit, some local folks were all set with their reading material. They'd visited the Old Village Bookshop on Starkweather in Plymouth.

They rushed in, got to have something good to read before the weather hits, said Lori Jouppi of Canton, an employee of the bookstore. "Here and the grocery store, I think."

The store, open 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday-Saturday, is full of new and used books, many paperbacks, sorted into such categories as mysteries and romance.

J. Karen Kelchak of Canton bought the store in January 2000. It had been at that site and on Mill in Plymouth in a different form, and Kelchak said she hopes to "have transformed it."

"I'm an avid reader," Kelchak said, pausing from sending a title to Italy. She decided in 1976 she wanted to buy an independent bookstore within driving distance of home. She'd worked previously as a paralegal.

"It was just something that really fell into place," she said of her ownership. She hasn't written the great American novel just yet, another dream, but enjoys her busy days at the book store. It's exciting and it's fun.

The front of the store has books for exchange, for \$1.75 a customer can trade in a newer paperback and walk out with one. Customers are avid readers, with some reading six-seven books a week.

Romance pays my bills, said Kelchak, agreeing that mostly women read those titles. Jouppi, who has worked at the Old Village Bookshop about a year, has found mysteries are also popular. Customers run the gamut, Jouppi said, from students to seniors, professionals to homemakers.

"It really is so varied," said Jouppi, who worked for a chain store in Livonia and found it easier to identify the typical book customer there.

The back of the building is the Internet store

with the Web site www.oldvillagebookshop.com used to list titles for customers.

"My other love was computers," said Kelchak, who also uses other sites for her business and has found customers appreciate the convenience of being able to buy books online. She started putting titles online in January 2002, has about 4,800 and said that accounts for about 25 percent of her business.

"It's evolving, it's ever-changing," she said of the store's offerings, which include some rental books. The store originally carried mostly romances and mysteries, but now offers more and caters to a changing clientele.

No bookstore would be complete without a cat, and Kelchak and her colleagues have two, Franny and Zooney named for the J.D. Salinger book.

Kelchak doesn't buy books, as she gets plenty and ends up donating the majority. There's always that gem at the bottom, she added.

The new book business is different from used books, Kelchak said, and she didn't see much change when the downtown Plymouth book store closed last year.

"I found it a shame they closed," she said.

Kelchak likes to see as many bookstores as possible, citing Liberty Street in Ann Arbor as a place where people can browse for books.

Business is very good, considering the economy, Kelchak said of her own establishment.

It's a nice little hometown bookstore, Jouppi said. She's found some customers come in on certain days, and may buy as much as \$20 worth of books. One young man buys westerns for an older relative, along with books for himself.

Roni McCrumb of Northville was browsing at the store recently. A customer for at least 12 years, she seeks romances, mysteries, intrigue and more.

They're helpful, it's economical, McCrumb said. "I just really enjoy coming here and I'm glad they have this store available to us."

Local cops ask state union to consider Stewart endorsement

Plymouth police officers want Rep. John Stewart, R-Plymouth Township, to give them a public apology for public remarks he's made they believe demigrate their department.

Stewart said he's tried to make amends, but to no avail.

The result: The department's two unions, the Plymouth Police Officers Association and the Plymouth Command Officers Association, have written the Police Officers Association of Michigan - which endorsed Stewart's re-election in November - to complain about comments Stewart made in a Nov. 11, 2004, interview with Mayor Stella Greene and the *Plymouth Observer*.

In the interview, Stewart suggested the city could trim its budget and save \$100,000 by getting rid of Lt. Ed Ochal, a member of the command officers union.

"I don't think law enforcement and the city of Plymouth would lose a whole heck of a lot if Ed Ochal retired tomorrow," Stewart said then. "I just don't think he's effective. I don't think he's a contributing member of the police department."

Sgt. Joe Kahanec, president of the command staff union, said Stewart owes Ochal and the city of Plymouth an apology.

"Mr. Stewart had no problem in stating he could save the city

\$100,000 by firing Lt. Ochal and eliminating a position within the police department," said Kahanec. "I wonder if Mr. Stewart ever considers what the true facts are before speaking, or is he only concerned with how his words will play to his special interest groups?"

Officer Jennifer Dergis, president of the Plymouth Police Officers Association, said she was disturbed after reading Stewart's remarks, considering the police department is already short two police officers because of budget cuts.

He came right out and said cut more, cut more, cut more. But, he has no clue as to what was cut, already, said Dergis. "We are at bare minimum (staffing) right now. If we cut any further, services are going to be deeply affected. We're doing everything we can to maintain a high level of service with less and less people every year."

Kahanec and Dergis want Stewart to acknowledge, publicly, he spoke out of turn before agreeing to meet with him. Stewart said he's tried contacting Dergis several times, and has contacted the Police Officers Association of Michigan.

I have said I apologize, that I wasn't aware of the facts, and I would like to move forward, said Stewart. "I would be happy to put that in writing and give it to them."

I don't care about Ed Ochal, added Stewart. "As long as he

does meticulous and careful work, let him go for it. This is excessive politics."

In the interview, Stewart admitted legislators don't always know what cuts their district's communities make, relying mostly on what is printed by local newspapers.

"I don't know the depths (of the cuts), but I know that Plymouth cries the most, Plymouth complains the most," said Stewart. "It's obvious they've cut down to the bone. I still think they can cut a little something."

Ochal, who said he had a confrontation with Stewart in 35th District Court several years ago when Stewart practiced law, said he believes the lawmaker is angry over his \$100 contribution to Jonathan Grant's campaign against Stewart in 2002.

Kahanec and Dergis want the POAM to consider Stewart's actions in future endorsements. POAM President Jerry Radovic said Stewart admitted he was wrong, but the 20th House Representative is term-limited and can't be re-elected to his position.

But, if he were to run for the Senate, they would look at his record.

He has problems with Plymouth, and we understand that. And, what Plymouth has to say is important to us," said Radovic. "If there is an opportunity to consider an endorsement, we will look at his record."

Scholarship recognizes students facing adversity

The Plymouth A M Rotary is looking for two types of students to receive scholarships - those who have overcome diversity amid special physical or emotional challenges, and those with an artistic flair

The first is the \$500 Sandra Sagar-Rotary Scholarship, so named for a 1969 Plymouth High School (when it was housed at the current Central Middle School) graduate Sagar, who died in 1992, overcame the physical barriers of polio and had a successful career working in computers

One of the biggest challenges Sagar overcame while attending Plymouth-Canton schools was using stairs, because no elevators were available

Debra Madonna, Plymouth A M Rotary scholarship com-

mittee co-chair, said Sagar's leg braces made stairwells a challenge especially since dress codes required girls to wear skirts Sagar sometimes sat down and scooted herself up and down stairs

I think (the Sandra Sagar Scholarship) acknowledges kids who really kind of have to invent how they get through school, Madonna said

Scholarship committee co-chair Jerry Trumpka, like Sagar, grew up with polio

He stressed that the Sagar scholarship is not limited to students who overcome physical barriers Emotional barriers that students must overcome with courage, such as personal tragedy, are important, too

We don't limit it to one or two things, Trumpka said "We want to give the scholarship to kids that certainly face challenges and deserve some recog-

niton The 2004 recipients were Brock Knowlton, Matt Tibaldi and Joseph Urban, all of Canton High School

The scholarship's application deadline is April 8 Requirements include

■ Fill out scholarship form (students should contact the counseling office)

■ Meet one of the following criteria Be a graduating senior, have a 2.5 or better grade point average, be a resident of the Plymouth-Canton school district, participate in school activities, perform community service, provide proof of acceptance to college and supply a recent photograph

Applicants must also complete an essay of 250 words or less The essay must include college plans and a description of future goals

should be mailed to Debra Madonna, Rotary Club of Plymouth A M, P.O. Box 5384, Plymouth, MI, 48170

Lastly, Sagar scholarship candidates must include two letters of recommendation from a teacher, counselor or employer

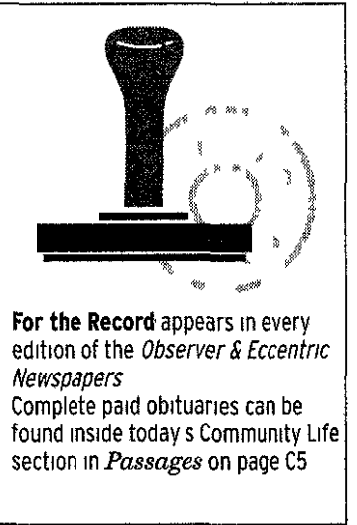

"I know that Plymouth is an older community, so I didn't want something too modern," she said. "I pretty much made up an old-fashioned design. Plymouth is a really cool community, and I knew it would be something that will be there for a while."

Zabowski received \$50 in Plymouth Chamber of Commerce gift certificates for her winning entry.

Zabowski's design is similar to the fountain that was donated to the city by Calvin and Charlotte Perry and dedicated in May 1998. Her idea is being combined with an entry that was taken off the Internet and sent anonymously to

the PCYC.

"We want to have something that's affordable and easy to maintain," said Garland. "The more elaborate it is, the harder it will be to keep it in good condition."

"We tried to come up with something that was simple, but elegant enough to take pictures in front of," she said. "Something that would match with Plymouth. A more modern design wouldn't have been appropriate."

Garland said the design the youth commission envisions will have only one bowl, with water that shoots inward, with possibly a mosaic tile design or the City of Homes emblem.

"We were also thinking about a design that would prevent kids from getting into the fountain," added Garland.

Plymouth city commissioner Michele Potter mentors the youth commission, and said the younger commissioners have stepped up to the challenge of replacing a city landmark.

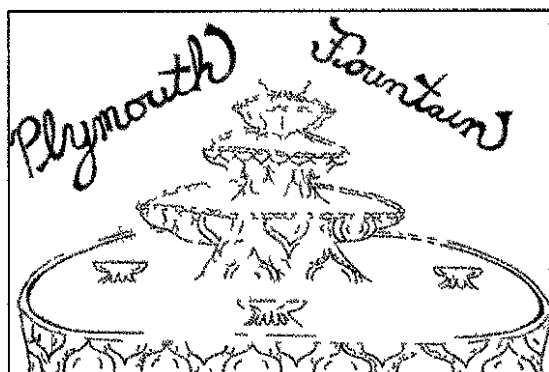
"It's exciting to watch," said Potter. "They're very enthusiastic, and have some creative thoughts and ideas. They feed off one another with their creativity."

Garland said the next step will be to determine if their idea can be constructed, and then move ahead to fund raising.

"We're taking the two designs to a company that makes fountains to see if it's possible to do," Garland said. "Then we'll have to look at costs."

"We have some places that want to donate money, and we'll be looking at school organizations and councils to help with fund raising," she said. "Our goal is to do it mostly with efforts from kids."

"Knowing people in general — Aany more than we did when we were younger — they won't put money away and we'll have a whole class of people that will be on the short side of retirement income," said Vassel. "Are young people going to put money away instead of going out this weekend?"

In part, Vassel blames the federal government for putting the Social Security system in jeopardy by borrowing from the fund to pay other federal bills.

The Social Security system was never meant to be

touched, he said. If they had left it alone it wouldn't be going broke.

Ben Pohl, 17, of Canton Township doesn't believe Social Security will be there for his future, so he's not afraid of the proposed change by Bush.

"I'm going to end up with no Social Security and the adults have to realize that," said Pohl. "I'm not afraid of putting my money in the market."

ONGOING DEBATE

From his Plymouth office, CPA Fred Grant said the argument to change Social Security has been ongoing since the John F. Kennedy administration.

"The real problem is that President Bush wants the private accounts to be run by the federal government," said Grant.

From an accounting standpoint, that makes me nervous. The government has proven it can't effectively run Social Security."

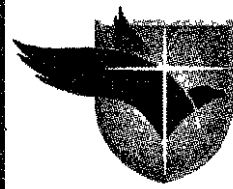
Grant said the current system of a guaranteed income might not be a bad idea, especially if you live long.

The real risk is if you live a long time, he said. "If you were to die at 68, there's no risk. But, if you live to be 100, there is no guaranteed income."

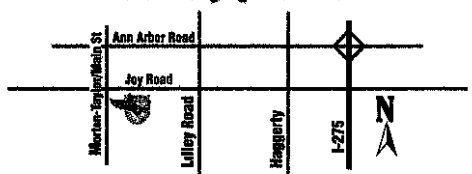

Long-forgotten autobiography reveals two amazing stories

This is the story of one of black history's amazing unknown pioneers, a slave boy who, against all odds, rose to become the foremost black classical scholar, a major voice in the debate over the future of black America and, finally, president of Wilberforce University.

And it is the story of a young white woman, born long after he died, who found his fascinating autobiography tucked away and forgotten, and who has just given William Sanders Scarborough's incredible life back to the nation after it was somehow tragically lost for decades. "He was an American hero of the mind," Michele Valerie Ronnick said. "His story remains living proof that if you work hard, aim high and dream big dreams, you can overcome tremendous obstacles."

Thanks to her own hard work, Wayne State University Press has just published his book *The Autobiography of William Sanders Scarborough: An American Journey From Slavery to Scholarship* (425 pages, \$29.95). Her achievement, like that of her subject, has been hailed as nothing short of brilliant by Henry Louis Gates, the famous scholar and critic.

Though they are separated by race, gender and more than a century, the black pioneer and the young scholar have something in common. No one would have expected either to become experts in ancient tongues.

Growing up in Florida in the 1970s, Michele Ronnick took Latin as a senior in high school mainly because her brother liked the teacher. It started her on a lifelong passion for the classics.

Nobody would ever have expected Scarborough to become a scholar - let alone a leading expert on Greek and Latin.

When he was growing up, it was illegal to teach blacks to read or write. U.S. Sen. John C. Calhoun, the famous fire-eating defender of slavery, once said that if he could find a Negro who knew the Greek syntax, he would then believe the Negro was a human being. Scarborough, who surreptitiously was taught to read, ended up not just knowing that ancient language fluently - he became the author of a Greek college textbook widely used in the late 19th century.

He rose to become an amazing example who fought hardship all his life, never took no for an answer and who wasn't content to be a trailblazer in merely academic circles.

He dabbled in Ohio politics and fought Booker T. Washington's idea that African Americans should be content to learn industrial arts and not worry about cultivating the life of the mind.

And William Scarborough was witness to some of the greatest moments of his time. He was a 12-year-old boy in Atlanta when the city was sacked by William Tecumseh Sherman (when blacks were allowed to do some looting, he tellingly went after, he says, 'pencils,

envelopes and paper.)

He saw Jefferson Davis dragged away as a prisoner of war, met Richard Wright and Frederick Douglass, knew Warren G. Harding, and attended Booker T. Washington's funeral. He fell in love with a white divorcee when that was social suicide, they married in 1881 and lived happily ever after for 45 years.

Then, in the fall of 1926, he died, after struggling into his library for one last look at his beloved books. Shortly before he had finished writing an autobiography to which his heartbroken wife added a few pages. But it was never published, and it and he were finally forgotten.

Meanwhile, Michele Ronnick had gone on to become an expert on Roman literature and ended up as part of the tiny classics department at Wayne State University. Eight years ago, doing research, she came across a reference to one William Scarborough. It said he was African-American, a former slave and was the author of a textbook of ancient Greek.

What amazed her was that she had never heard of him. Her interest was piqued.

Then, after a lot of digging, she discovered a treasure trove. A copy of his autobiography forgotten, in the Ohio Historical Society archives. For some reason, it had never been published.

As she began to read, she was hooked.

Wayne State University Press has just published the manuscript. It reveals a black man who was a straight-laced Victorian, who was always proper, but whose remarkable life puts most of us to shame. "I have never been ashamed of my birth conditions," he says succinctly. "I have left that to the slaveholders."

Shortly before he died nearly a century ago Professor William Sanders Scarborough finished his memoir, writing "I look ahead into years to come, when the melting pot America - will have melted away racial lines, hates and prejudices - a thing this country owes to its honor."

We can only guess what he would have thought today. But I think it might be something like what I heard a minister say once during a service in the African Methodist Episcopal Church to which the old professor belonged.

Watkins loses political battle, but he raised honest concerns

Tom Watkins was always quick to return phone calls and he always gave good quotes.

Newspaper reporters appreciate those qualities in a public official.

Watkins is also passionate about public education. That was a good trait to have for the state's superintendent of public instruction. Despite an A- vote of approval by the State Board of Education last fall, Gov. Jennifer Granholm had been pushing for his removal for a long time.

Yes, yes, yes, he's a good talker, very passionate but, the governor says, an ineffective leader. He talks a good game but wasn't getting the job done. Sort of like the governor, herself, in dealing with the state's tortuous economic problems. But, that's another story.

Anyway, she had a deal. He promised in May he would leave at the end of the year and reneged on the promise. You don't mess with a governor, no matter how good your report card and stay politically alive.

Last weekend's push came to shove, and Watkins was no match for a governor and board members from the other party who have never been his fans. So it's off to Wayne State University for Watkins. Jeremy Hughes, the state's chief academic officer, will keep the seat warm until a replacement is chosen.

Though the board decides on the state superintendent and a Democratic board brought Watkins in when John Engler was governor, the power still rests with Granholm.

Though Watkins was obviously in Granholm's crosshairs for a long time, he didn't help his cause with a report he was asked to prepare in December by state board President Kathleen Straus. Asking her superintendent for honest feedback was like setting up a bear trap and waiting for him to stick his foot in.

Watkins upset several constituencies at once. He worried about school costs and especially the high cost of labor, pension and health care. He didn't win friends in the Michigan Education Association by writing succinctly these obligations are competing with the ability to invest in tools such as professional development, technology, lowering class size, quality of pre-school programs, reading programs, dropout prevention pro-

grams, and para-professionals among many other tools that help teachers teach and children learn."

Whew! He also had the temerity to broach the issue of whether Michigan might have too many school districts and might need to think about combinations or cooperation or even elimination of some districts. Districts like Clarenceville, South Redford and Redford Union beg to differ. A recent suggestion along the same lines by the *Observer & Eccentric's* chairman Phil Power drew a barrage of letters from Clarenceville administrators, teachers and parents.

Obviously, in politics or business, when a boss asks someone to think outside the box, they don't really expect them to do more than pop out like a jack-in-the-box and then pop back in. They never really want anybody too far outside that box.

As a seasoned political figure, Watkins should have known that.

As Watkins notes, the report is his thinking, his concerns, his evaluation. The real business of getting things done remains with the governor and legislature. They're the ones who must make the bold decisions, or not.

These are confusing times for our school districts and Watkins and the state board haven't done a good job of explaining No Child Left Behind and getting schools behind the state's Education Yes! program. School districts regard the report card system as a black eye on their districts, rather than as a help in evaluating problems within the system. It's become, as it always does, political. And maybe Watkins' lack of enthusiasm for NCLB was another reason he was vulnerable.

According to news reports, Granholm's spokeswoman Liz Boyd said the governor is looking for someone who has served as a school superintendent, is dedicated to early childhood education and understands the problems faced by school districts with declining enrollment (read that: Detroit). The board will choose, but it's obvious that Granholm has a silent veto power.

Metro moving ahead on new terminal

This summer Metro Airport's Davey Terminal will be demolished and work will begin on a new \$418 million North Terminal, the first major capital improvement since management of Wayne County's Metro and Willow Run Airports was moved to an independent authority from the county commission.

The Davey Terminal has been unused since the airport's hub airline Northwest moved to the \$1.2 billion, 97-gate McNamara Terminal in 2002.

The new North Terminal scheduled to open in 2008 will accommodate airlines not in alliance with Northwest. The terminal will be paid for with money borrowed against the \$4.50 (per) ticket fee, which generates between \$40 million and \$50 million a year at Metro.

The Smith and Berry terminals will be demolished when the new terminal opens. Smith is currently used by Air Canada, American, American West, Delta, Independence Air, Southwest, Spirit, United and US Air and several commuter airlines. Charter airlines fly out of Berry.

The 27-gate terminal is being

built at a time when many major airlines are facing financial losses but air travel is approaching an all-time high.

"Even though airlines are having financial troubles, we serve two masters, we serve the flying public and second we make the airlines as comfortable as possible," said Lester Robinson, CEO of the Airport Authority.

"We see the two as not always being the same. You can argue that quality airlines are doing poorly at a time in which we're about to break records in person travel. We're about back to our pre-2001 levels in terms of passenger activity. If you're operating at those levels and the airlines can't make money there's something wrong."

Robinson said labor costs, pensions, increased competition and fuel prices have all contributed to the airlines' problems. He said he is sympathetic to the airlines.

"At the same time, we realize we have more passengers coming to our terminals than ever before. We're going through a change and that change might mean that some of our carriers are going away," he said.

But Robinson said he is confident that Northwest will survive the current shakeout, but even if they don't the airport

will continue to operate successfully.

"Even if they go bankrupt, our market won't go bankrupt," he said.

Vernice Anthony, chair of the Airport Authority and president and CEO of the Greater Detroit Area Health Council, is also optimistic about the airport.

"We are joined at the hip by Northwest Airlines as our major partner," she said. "We feel strongly about having a strong, positive relationship. On the other hand we are building the North Terminal, creating more space for other airlines in terms of competition. Northwest is a hub that brings global travel and people passing through from all parts of the world."

Robinson said having Northwest as a hub airline provides Detroit travelers with more options than at other air-

ports that don't have a hub.

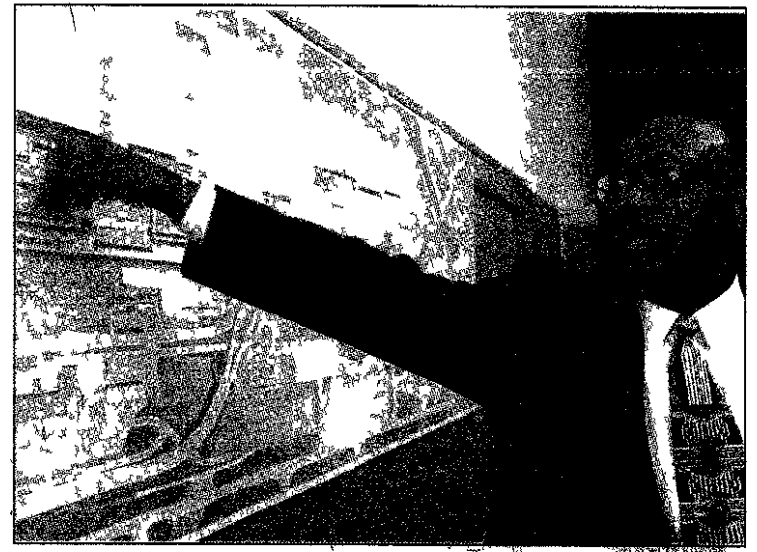
Still the airport is projecting a decline in landing fees of nearly \$7 million for the 2005 fiscal year and pursuing other sources of revenue.

"I think airports are collectively trying to find ways to operate more efficiently, to find ways to generate revenue outside of those charges it makes to the airlines to help pay for its costs," Robinson said.

Robinson said plans for the new terminal date back to 2001 and were delayed by the fall out from the terrorists attacks of Sept. 11, 2001.

"Those passengers who are not choosing to fly Northwest deserve a better facility," he said.

"Quite frankly the facility we have today is an old 1950s-60s vintage facility and not the kind of service you want to represent this community in 2005."

Apron construction is scheduled for later this year with construction of the terminal to

Authority brought 'credibility'

The Wayne County Airport Authority was established by the state legislature in 2002 following an agreement between then Gov. John Engler and then Wayne County Executive Edward McNamara.

The legislation shifted management of Detroit Metropolitan Airport and Willow Run Airport from the Wayne County Commission to an independent seven-member board with three appointees of the governor, three by the county executive and one by county commission.

The authority was created after questions were raised about airport management and contracting procedures.

Vernice Anthony, current chair of the authority and president and CEO of the Greater Detroit Area Health Council, said there were problems under the old management structure.

"There were serious credibility problems, which was one reason why the authority was created in the first place, and there were also efficiency issues with county government," Anthony said. "How could we do this in a way that maintains public authority but adds timeliness and provides more of an open book about airport issues. That

has worked well the last four years."

Airport Authority CEO Lester Robinson, who was director of the airport when the management change was made, said some of the complaints about contracts were more perception than reality but that the authority has been an improvement.

"I am a firm believer that the authority has improved not only our image but our practices, and I believe one of the things that's very evident to me is the opening of our solicitation methods and not being a protectionist kind of purchaser has improved our efficiency by lowering our costs in a number of ways," Robinson said.

Robinson said the authority has allowed the airport to attract a wider range of vendors and contractors.

"I will tell you I've talked to professionals who've told me they would not have bid on our work if we were still part of the political process we used to be part of," he said.

He said the authority members are all "business people" who understand "the value of money and time."

"They challenge us to look for the best possible deal for the goods and services we need, they understand a little better that the political organization we used to be a part of," he said.

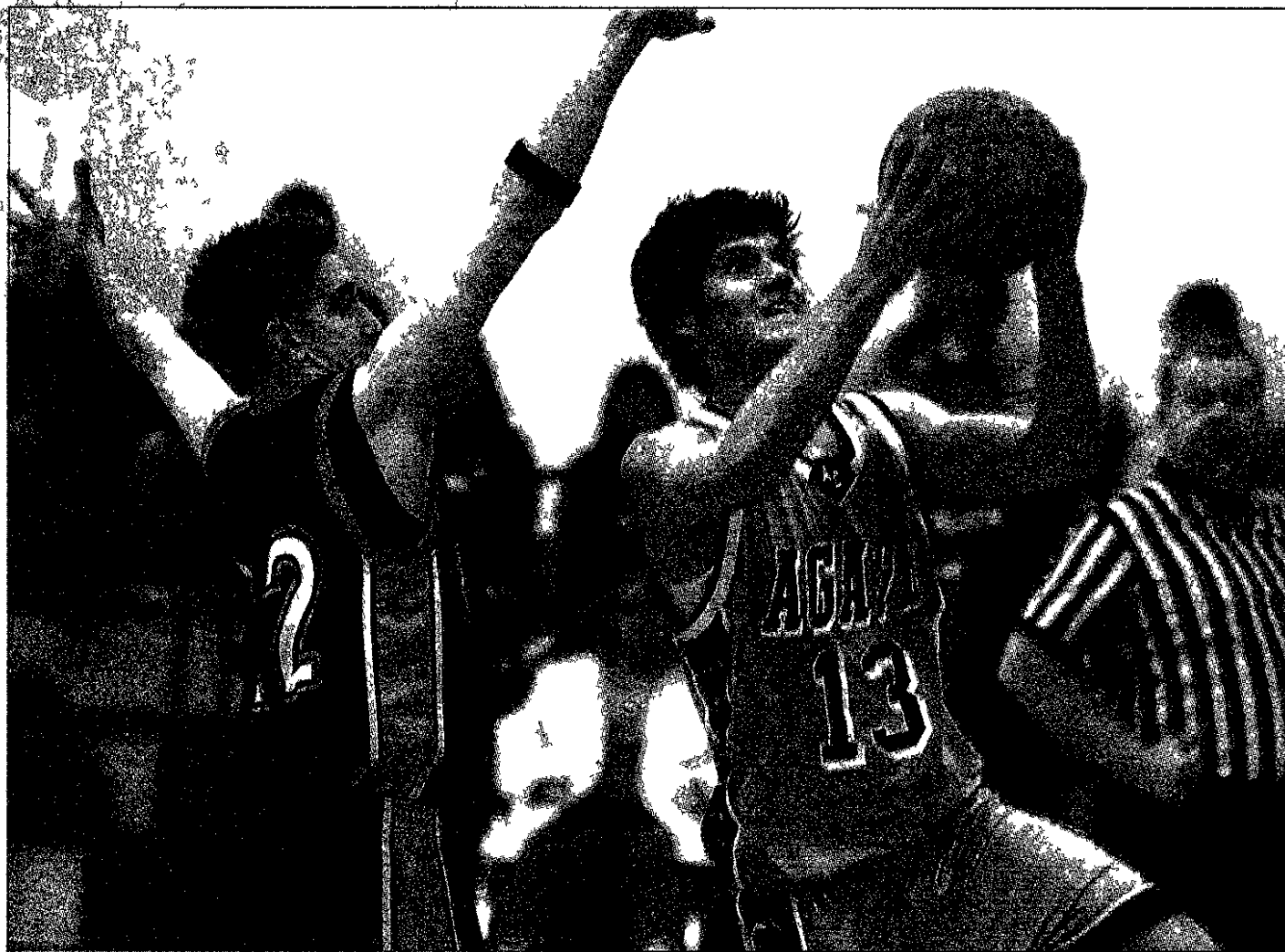

Canton's Powers headed to Ivy League

Jake Powers wasn't fazed when a blizzard forced him to spend an extra day at Brown University last month during his official weekend football visit to the prestigious Ivy League college.

It turns out the storm gave the Canton gridiron standout an extra day to become accustomed to his future collegiate surroundings.

Powers, who was a powerful two-way performer for the Chiefs' successful football program the past three seasons, verbally committed to Brown on Jan. 26. The Division I-AA school located in Providence, R.I., won out over the

University of Pennsylvania, Michigan Tech and Ferris State University, who were also on Powers' short list of schools.

"I liked everything about the school," said Powers. "The campus is great and they have outstanding facilities for athletics. They don't give out athletic scholarships, but I can apply for academic scholarships."

Powers, who has compiled a stellar 3.7 grade-point average at Canton, said Brown's strong academic reputation had a lot to do with his decision to head east.

"I worked hard to get good grades in high school, so I definitely wanted to attend a college where I could put that to good use," he said.

Another appealing aspect of the

school's academic approach is that students are not required to take any general studies courses like at many universities, Powers said.

"Without any required classes, it's easier to double-major," explained Powers, who said he is leaning toward earning his bachelor's degree in business.

Ivy League athletes are not allowed to wear red-shirts, so Powers could see playing time this coming season.

Brown head coach Phil Estes told the 6-2, 230-pound Powers that he would start out on the offensive side of the ball, but that a future switch to defense wasn't out of the question.

"They told me I will start out playing H-back, which is a combination fullback and tight end," said Powers, who dou-

bled as a tight end and linebacker for the Chiefs. "On most plays, the H-back lines up in front of the tailback, but then he goes in motion and either blocks or runs a pass pattern. It will give me a chance to catch some passes and the H-back usually runs the ball a couple of times every game."

"They said I could get moved over to defense in the future, depending on what the team's needs are."

Powers said he is unsure of whether he will pursue a collegiate baseball career at Brown.

"You're allowed to play two sports, so we'll have to wait and see what happens," he said.

New challenges

Former Salem basketball star turns passion for game into career

The basketball rolled off the shooter's fingertips, rainbowed through the air and into the net more than 19 feet away with stunning regularity at a recent Central Connecticut State women's basketball team practice.

The shooter was helping the Blue Devils' coaching staff simulate a sharp-shooting opponent that was next on the team's schedule.

When the brief defensive drill was over, the shooter had drained at least 10 of the long-range shots, drawing awe-struck praise from the over-matched CCSU players who were trying to defend her.

"Coach D can shoot!" one of the players said to CCSU head coach Yvette Harris, referring to the person who had just put on a world-class

shooting exhibition. The shooter — who was also the top assistant coach on Harris' staff — was Dena Head, arguably the best female basketball player to ever wear a Plymouth Salem uniform.

Head, who led the Rocks to two Class A state semi-final appearances in 1986 and 1987 and was voted Michigan's "Miss Basketball" her senior season, is currently in the middle of her fourth year as the primary assistant coach at CCSU, a 13,000-student Division I college located in New Britain, Conn. She not only assists Harris with coaching responsibilities during practices and games, but she is also the program's recruiting coordinator, a role that has helped her accumulate more frequent-flyer miles than most commercial airline pilots.

DRIVEN TO SUCCEED

According to Harris, Head tackles all of these tasks with the same passion that made her an All-State player at Salem, an All-American at the University of Tennessee and a highly respected nine-year professional in the Women's National Basketball Association and in leagues overseas.

"Dena is probably one of the most intense people I know when she steps on the basketball court," said Harris, who took over the reins at CCSU three years ago. "She is ready to go every single day. The players in our program have a lot of respect for her because they know what she has accomplished. Dena is very humble, though. She doesn't go around saying, 'Do it this way so you can catch up to me'."

She helps them get better by being honest with them and showing them how to play the game the right way."

Ironically, Harris recruited Head in the late-80s when she was an assistant coach at Western Michigan University and Head was a high school senior who could have played for just about any college she chose.

Dena was very kind to me when I recruited her," Harris recalled with a laugh. "She basically said, 'Thanks, but no thanks. I'm going to Tennessee. I'm fortunate now that I get another opportunity to work with her.'"

SALEM DAYS

Head's game blossomed at Salem under the tutelage of longtime coach Fred Thomann, who doesn't hesitate when he calls Head, "The

best I've ever coached."

At 5-foot-11, Head started as a post player for Salem as a freshman. She eventually moved to guard to take advantage of her ball-handling skills, and to prepare her for the college game she was about to take by storm.

"Dena was such a powerful player," Thomann remembered. "And she was a great leader, too. She didn't say a lot, but she didn't have to. When she played, the other players on the team just got on board."

Thomann said he wasn't surprised the gifted Head pursued a coaching career following her successful stint in the pros.

"I always tell my players that they need to give back to the game, whether that means coaching seventh- and eighth-graders in a summer camp,

working in the community, or helping coach a middle-school team," Thomann said. "Dena has not only given something back, she's taken it to the next level. When you have accomplished what Dena has — leading Tennessee to two national championships and playing several years in the pros — you have a lot to give back to the game."

Head returned the compliments to Thomann, calling him the initial driving force behind her early success.

"Fred Thomann took the time to teach me how to play the game when I was younger," Head said. "After my freshman year, he sat me down and had a long talk with me. He told me that if I wanted to reach my dreams and aspirations, I needed to become a better ball-handler and a better shooter. He stayed after practice and worked with me, and he pointed me in the right direction. I owe Fred a lot

Head retired from professional basketball at the relatively young age of 31 because of the pounding her body sustained during her long and successful career.

For nine straight years, I was basically playing basketball year-round, she said. "My body needed a break and my mind needed a break. I had always said I wasn't going to coach, but I wanted to stay connected to the game. When this opportunity came along to coach at Central Connecticut, I jumped at it. People would ask me, 'You played at Tennessee and in the pros — Why would you want to coach at a mid-major like Central Connecticut?' Well, there aren't many people who get a chance to be a No. 1 assistant at a Division I school with no previous coaching experience. I love everything about this job."

With one exception:

"I have a hard time when we lose, especially against teams that we should beat," Head said. "During my first year of coaching, I'd get so frustrated after some of the losses that I'd say to myself, 'I can't take this. I'm going to play again. But then I learned to calm down and handle it better.'"

Head said her competitive fires burn as brightly today as they ever have.

"I expect to win every game I'm involved in," Head said, emphatically. "If I go to the park tomorrow and play pickup ball with five people I don't even know, I want to win every game. It's mind over matter. That's what I'm trying to teach to my players."

Harris said it won't be long before the well-qualified Head becomes a head coach herself.

"With Dena's passion for the game and knowledge of the game," Harris said, "it will be sooner rather than later."

There were total of 859 (300 games), 309 (299 games), 137 (298 games) and 222 (800 series)

This is down approximately 10 percent from a year ago

These honor scores were from among 1,264 Greater Detroit Bowling Association leagues with 48,069 registered members

Awards are also given out to lower average bowlers who roll a game or series, which is a milestone (Example A 140-or-under bowler roll their first 200 game of the season, or when a 160-and-under bowler hits his first 600 series of the season)

Bowlers have discovered a new way to break the bank Some of the local bowling centers are offering a game of

chance and skill combined to win a few extra dollars

It's a frame game, in which the bowler can select from a variety of prize options

Called "Kegler's Cash," several houses making it available

To win, the entrant must strike (or spare where indicated on the chart) in certain frames during league games

Averages of below 140 can win with only three spares, 141-160 average bowlers only have to strike twice to win, 161-180 must have a mark in the first frame and strike in the third, sixth and ninth frames

Meanwhile, averages of 181-200 must strike in 3-6-9 and first ball in 10th frame, 201-220 must strike in 1-3-6-9 and first ball in 10th frame, and 221-235 must strike in 1-3-4-6-7-9 and first ball in 10th

Cost to enter can be anywhere from 25 cents per game to a maximum of \$5 per game.

Every time you get the correct strikes or mark, you win 10 times the amount you played for up to \$150 per night

You must sign up for any or all games before you bowl the first ball in the third frame of the first game and you can enter any or all of the three games

Open for winter hours

Is there a name for Michiganders who like the change of seasons, but don't embrace January?

There's great news for the hearty souls who don't migrate south for the winter, but need a break from February. The sign on the door of Gray's Greenhouse says, "Yes, We're Open - Winter Hours." Less than a block away, Sparr's Flower and Greenhouse neon sign greets visitors, "Open."

Gray's and Sparr's are family-owned businesses. Sylvia Gray's father, Alexander, emigrated from Poland when he was 14. The greenhouses, built in 1928, stand where he started a truck-farming business.

Sylvia, born in 1915, has worked in the greenhouses all her life and is now joined by daughter, Alice Humphrey, son-in-law and retired science teacher, Richard, son, Joe, and daughter-in-law, Connie. Daughter Mary Ann Vittore, from Dundee, helps out when she's in town. Sylvia says, "I have good children."

Sparr's Flowers is a newer business, established by Louis Sparr in 1950. Son, Dennis and wife, Sally, operate the business. Another son, Jared, is at Sparr's in Northville. Colleen Bielat, the floral designer and Diane Hickey, cashier manager, will be joined by another 25 employees in the spring.

Sylvia "Working in a greenhouse keeps you busy." Alice "Winter is a good time to work in the greenhouse. We have time to clean up." Dennis "Loyal customers are the best. See what's new."

"In February, gardeners start to come around," Alice said. "They just want to plant or weed something." Customer Mary Abeck plants fairy gardens, using miniature plants. A lifesaver plant was inherited from another customer. Some customers, who are therapists, recommend a trip to the greenhouse to some of their clients. Sylvia agrees. "The greenhouse is a healthy building. The plants give off energy."

One visit isn't enough to see everything. Sparr's is ready for Valentine's Day, St. Patrick's Day and Easter. Tulips, shamrocks, azaleas, mums, roses, snaps, lilies, irises, hydrangeas, large decorative geraniums, and shrubs are grown in every nook and cranny of the greenhouses. Hanging baskets are suspended from the rafters.

"It gives me hope," Alice said. "It's never boring; there's always a surprise - the way a plant opens, dew on the leaves, a new, fluffier primrose. The Goldfish plant actually looks like a goldfish. The Rootbeer plant looks like it has a life-saver in the center of the bloom and a licorice scent. The Vicks plant's leaves cascade like the scale of a fish and smells like mentholatum."

A hothouse is a great place to visit in January and February. Warm, fresh air. Poinsettias are still red. Blooming shapes of oranges, yellows, blues, purples and greens are an elixir for what ails you. Avid gardener Mary Novrocki suggests reading gardening catalogs and a visit to Gray's Greenhouse as an antidote to mid-winter blues. Said Novrocki, "It works every time."

On a mission

Canton woman puts faith in God, finds a new path

If you believe things happen for a reason, you'll understand why Canton resident Jill Berry founded the Children's Christian Alliance. Four years ago, she was working in sales for a trucking company when she got laid off from her job.

"My oldest daughter has cystic fibrosis. She had just been hospitalized when I learned I was losing my job. It was a very stressful time for me, so I went into prayer to ask God what he wanted me to do with my life. I needed some direction, remembered Berry, a single mother with three daughters ages 16, 13 and 6.

What she was called upon to do surprised her.

"He showed me I was going to get my hands dirty and start to serve people for a while," said Berry, who now works for the *Observer* Newspapers in Livonia as a sales representative.

After a conversation with an acquaintance, she learned there was a need for help at an 858-unit public housing development on Middlebelt Road south of Michigan Avenue. And so began her mission at Lemoyne Gardens in Inkster.

"I basically drove there one day and just offered myself to help in anyway I could," Berry said.

ON A MISSION

Since then, Berry has become a familiar, but not always welcomed, face at the Inkster public housing facility.

"It's been a struggle and I've had some challenges. Many people have questioned my motives and slammed doors in my face," Berry said. "I have pure motives. God called me to do this work and I'm being faithful to it because it's what he wants me to do."

One of Berry's biggest allies has

been the Rev. Walter G. Bradley Jr., an associate elder at Christ Temple Apostolic Church in Westland.

A friend of Berry's from Starfish Family Services encouraged her to reach out and meet the Westland church leader.

"The first time I met Jill she told me the Lord had sent her to meet me," Bradley said. "I think she is a blessing, a true blessing. She doesn't

like to take 'no' for an answer and she shouldn't because she's doing God's work."

The elder divides his time between the church and managing one of the buildings at the Inkster housing development. The pair wasted no time putting their energy, faith and persuasive personalities together to

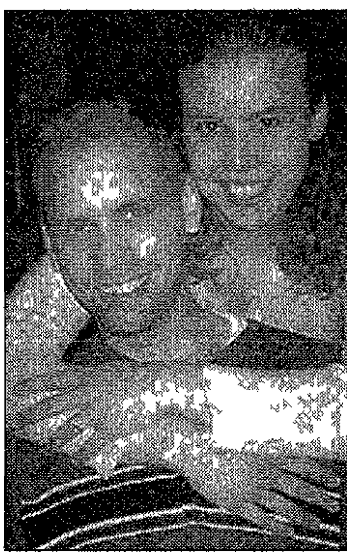

Concert will raise funds for musician

Over the years Nozero has performed, toured and recorded with legends such as Ella Fitzgerald, Dizzie Gillespie, Stan Kenton, and Sarah Vaughan.

"We've become known as a two-man horn section, but Larry did a lot on his own at Baker's Keyboard, Bird of Paradise and The Firefly in Ann Arbor," said Swindell, a Farmington Hills flugelhorn and trumpet player. "He's a first call studio musician. He's on one of the Kid Rock cuts. He played at Motown. He's the piccolo player on Stay on the Right Track to 9 Mile and Mack with the Gaylords. He's a very serious musician. His one CD, Warm, features some arrangements for strings with the Birmingham Bloomfield Symphony Orchestra. Larry has a singular voice. He plays in a way that touches people's emotions."

On Monday, Feb. 7, Swindell and the rest of Nozero's Jobim Project will carry on without him, performing at The Village in Canton. The show was scheduled before Nozero knew he was ill. The good news is the 61-year-old musician's brain tumors have shrunk.

"We're keeping the band warm for when he comes back and he will be back," said Swindell. "It's not the same without him. There's a voice that's not there."

"He's one of the true stars out of Detroit that stayed in

Detroit. He's like a brother to me."

Swindell, drummer Jim Ryan, Terry Lower on piano, and Ray Tim, bass, became family over the years they've played concerts and recorded with Nozero as his band. Ryan, like many musicians, met Nozero through Johnny Trudell, who hires first call musicians for his big band. Together they played DePalma's for almost five years, La Bistecca for two and then Mitch Housey's for three.

"I'm looking forward to playing a couple of songs, not necessarily theme songs but an arrangement by Terry Lower of Harlem Nocturne," said Jim Ryan, who grew up in Livonia and now lives in Plymouth.

"I really enjoy all of the music we've done together. We did a variety of styles not just swing, jazz, anything to Latin to beautiful ballads, funk jazz. You don't get bored or stagnant."

Brothers Ray and Dennis Tim, and Nozero learned a lot from each other while playing together as kids. Dennis, co-founder of the Wayne State University jazz studies program and a Farmington Hills resident, went on to form his own group.

Ray and Nozero teamed up 20 years ago when Tim left the road after playing with Paul Anka for 20 years. Today he plays five to six nights a week with Johnny Trudell.

"We always played together

since our teens," said Ray Tim of Livonia. "Our fathers were brother-in-laws that played music together before we did. We sort of carried it on. When Larry gets back to playing we'll be playing together again."

Johnny Trudell's been hospitalized before and knows how fast medical bills mount. That's why he and Ellis decided to put on the concert.

"Musicians kind of band together when things happen," said Trudell. "These are all people who play in the Michigan Jazz Festival (in July at Schoolcraft College). We're giving a lot of musicians a chance to play - Bess Bonnier and a trio, some musicians from Toledo. They'll play 15-minute per group. We want to keep it short. It gives people a chance to speak a little bit about Larry if they want."

Trudell's memories of Nozero go back to the 1960s when Larry was in his band and they played steady gigs at the Hyatt Regency and clubs around town.

The Larry Nozero jazz tribute is 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, Feb. 22, at Clarenceville High School, 20155 Middlebelt, between Seven and Eight Mile. 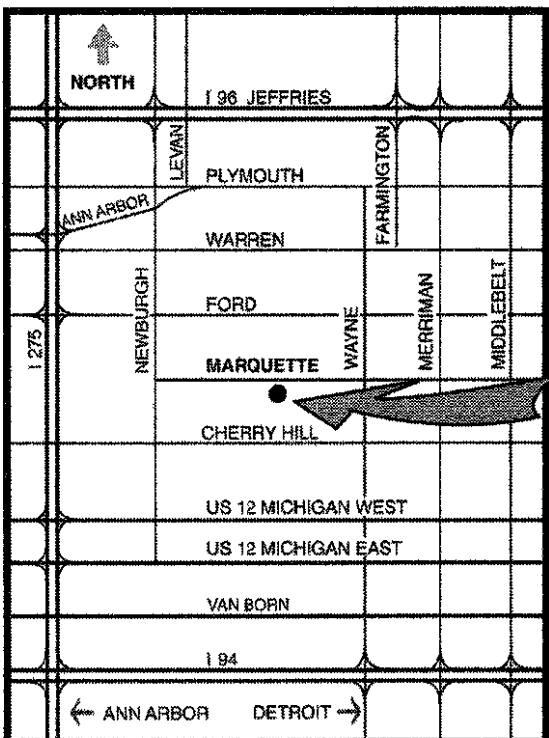

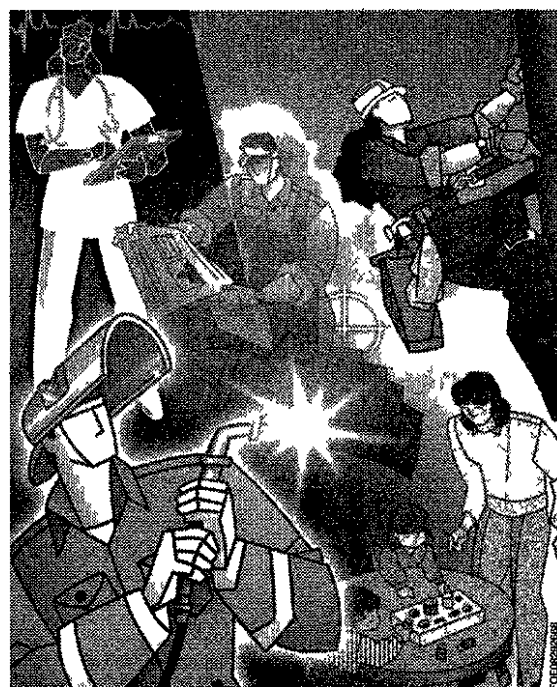

Bullies beware

'It doesn't need to be a rite of passage'

At Buchanan Elementary School in Livonia, students who call someone a name must write a brief paper explaining who they hurt, why it was wrong and what they will do to prevent this from happening again.

School administrators and child psychologists around the country are trying to change the way that students, parents and school staff think about these types of incidents, sometimes referred to as bullying.

"It doesn't need to be a rite of passage," says Dr. Marcia McEvoy, a psychologist who said bullying is no longer limited to physical intimidation. Some behaviors school administrators now take seriously include rumor spreading, taunting and ridiculing.

"Every time I conduct seminars for parents, someone will always say, 'If we get involved in every incident in our kids' lives, we're going to raise a generation of wimps.' I respond by asking, 'If you had to go to work every day and listen to people put you down and push you around, would you put up with it?' The answer is always no."

At Buchanan, a statement is posted in each classroom that violence is any action, word or gesture that hurts a person's body, feelings, friendships, reputation or property,

regardless of the intent. The punishments escalate for each violation of this definition. Principal Marjorie Moore, like other school administrators around the country, thinks she has good reason to try to halt these types of behaviors.

"What we have found through research is that the severe bullying - bringing guns to school and such - is done by kids who were either bullied or who were bullies," Moore said.

A number of Livonia schools are looking at the program Buchanan has adopted, as well as a similar one at Emerson Middle School.

In the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools, West Middle School has declared itself a no-bully zone, said Principal Ellison Franklin. Like Buchanan and Emerson, West has a list of escalating consequences for each offense. Other schools in the Plymouth-Canton district may adopt programs similar to West.

McEvoy said research has shown that 75 percent of children who commit school shootings were the targets of bullying. One of the most notable examples was the 1999 massacre at Columbine High School in Littleton, Colo.

They snap. If they don't become homicidal, they often become suicidal, McEvoy said.

Kids who go to those extremes have usually been bullied for years. But there are other serious effects of

bullying, both for the target and for the bully.

Short-term effects for the target include increased absenteeism from school, difficulty learning or concentrating, falling grades and sleep disturbances. If the bullying continues, they may suffer from low self-esteem, depression and difficulty in long-term relationships as adults, McEvoy said.

Boys consistently identified as bullies are more likely to have substance abuse problems or drop out of school. In adulthood, they are more likely to have criminal convictions, lose jobs frequently or become spouse or child abusers. Not much research has been done on girls who bullied in school, McEvoy said.

In Livonia, all the district's social workers have attended McEvoy's training seminars. She developed them because many districts were asking for help in dealing with bullying problems.

While schools have always had bullies, the problem has intensified over

the past 20 years because, McEvoy believes, society is less civil.

Kids witness people such as sports figures behaving badly, for lack of a better term, and they think it's OK, she said.

At Buchanan, the teachers do a lot of role playing in the classroom to help children know how to respond to bullying and to help bystanders know what to say or do to help a target.

At West Middle School, the staff has worked to teach kids that it's OK to tell an adult if someone's getting hurt.

"We've created a school where that's a positive, not a negative," the principal, Franklin, said. "And we do have kids who come to us and say, 'Something's going on that I don't think is right.'"

Experts say that creating an environment where kids feel they can tell is important because most bullying occurs out of the earshot of adults. Principals say that it takes time to investigate allegations, but it's worth

the time invested if the bullying can be curtailed.

The Buchanan staff always stresses to kids who've committed offenses that what they're doing is hurtful. For every offense, the child must reread the school's definition of violence.

For each violation, the school staff writes an incident report. The last week in October, when the policy was new, the school recorded 34 incidents. Within a month, the number of incidents was cut to five.

"I hope we're raising awareness. I hope it's not just fear of consequences," Moore said.

If state Rep. John Stewart (R-Plymouth) has his way, all school districts will need to have a written policy prohibiting bullying, harassment or intimidation. Under legislation he plans to reintroduce, the district's policy would need to define bullying, state the consequences for offenses and outline a procedure by which students could report incidents and school staff would investigate.

Expert discusses the 'gift' of attention deficit

He bounced to the front of the gym, acknowledged his host (Eaton Academy in Birmingham), said kind words about others who were writing about Attention Deficit Disorder (ADD) and gave the audience of 300 a taste of the contents of his new book *Delivered from Distraction* (Ballantine Books, 2005, \$25.95).

Dr. Edward Hallowell (Ned) is probably one person who has thought more deeply about ADD than others because he has lived with the disorder since childhood and has three children with ADD. He has written and spoken about the subject for many years.

As an aside, I was so impressed with Hallowell's earlier book *The Childhood Roots of Adult Happiness* (Ballantine, 2002) that I asked him to write an article for our *Healthy Beginnings* newsletter. You will find that posted on our web site at www.bridgecomm.com.

During his presentation, Hallowell explained that ADD (ADD is the old term most often used, ADHD includes hyperactivity or impulsivity in the disorder) is a gift. The difficulty comes from the 'wrapping' on the ADD and 'unwrapping the disorder'.

In the 'unwrapping' process, Hallowell discussed how important it is to find talent in every child or adolescent and set that person on the path to mastery. "Instead of another chance to fail," he says that unwrapping ADD takes creativity and patience and maintaining a positive goal, while changing the negative. "It takes a while," he says, "for talent to emerge."

"Children with ADD need strong mentors so they don't get crushed along the way," he explains. "So many times," he continued, "when a pathological approach is used, real damage can occur to the child's self-esteem."

He says, "The mind cares. It cares how we speak and act toward the child with ADD. We must build on the child's strengths, not dwell on his or her deficiencies."

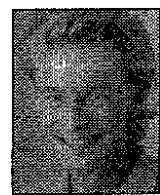
Dr. Hallowell urges those with an ADD child to truly connect with that child. This can be done through totally irrelevant ways such as talking about hobbies and sports or hiking in the woods. He says that in the context of connectivity, any type of play that involves imagination (a daughter with her doll house) is helpful. Playing involves the brain, and provides an opportunity to discover talent. With practice (sports, theater involvement, etc.) mastery occurs and esteem grows.

Hallowell is enthused about physical activity as exercise for the brain. Denying access to promote more 'seat' learning is fool-hearty, he says. The brain must have exercise to stimulate the cerebellum (the cerebellum coordinates our voluntary movements and balance). Hallowell says, "Recent brain science is showing how much more involved in global brain function the cerebellum is than we used to believe. Brain-scan studies have shown connections between parts of the cerebellum to the pre-frontal lobes and other areas of the brain that govern what goes awry in ADD and dyslexia."

Hallowell's *Delivered from Distraction* is indeed a gem. His warm, giving personality stands out in this book, written in first person.

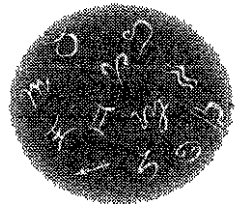
His new book and his brilliant thinking will make a difference in your life and the life of a child, an adolescent, or adult with ADD.

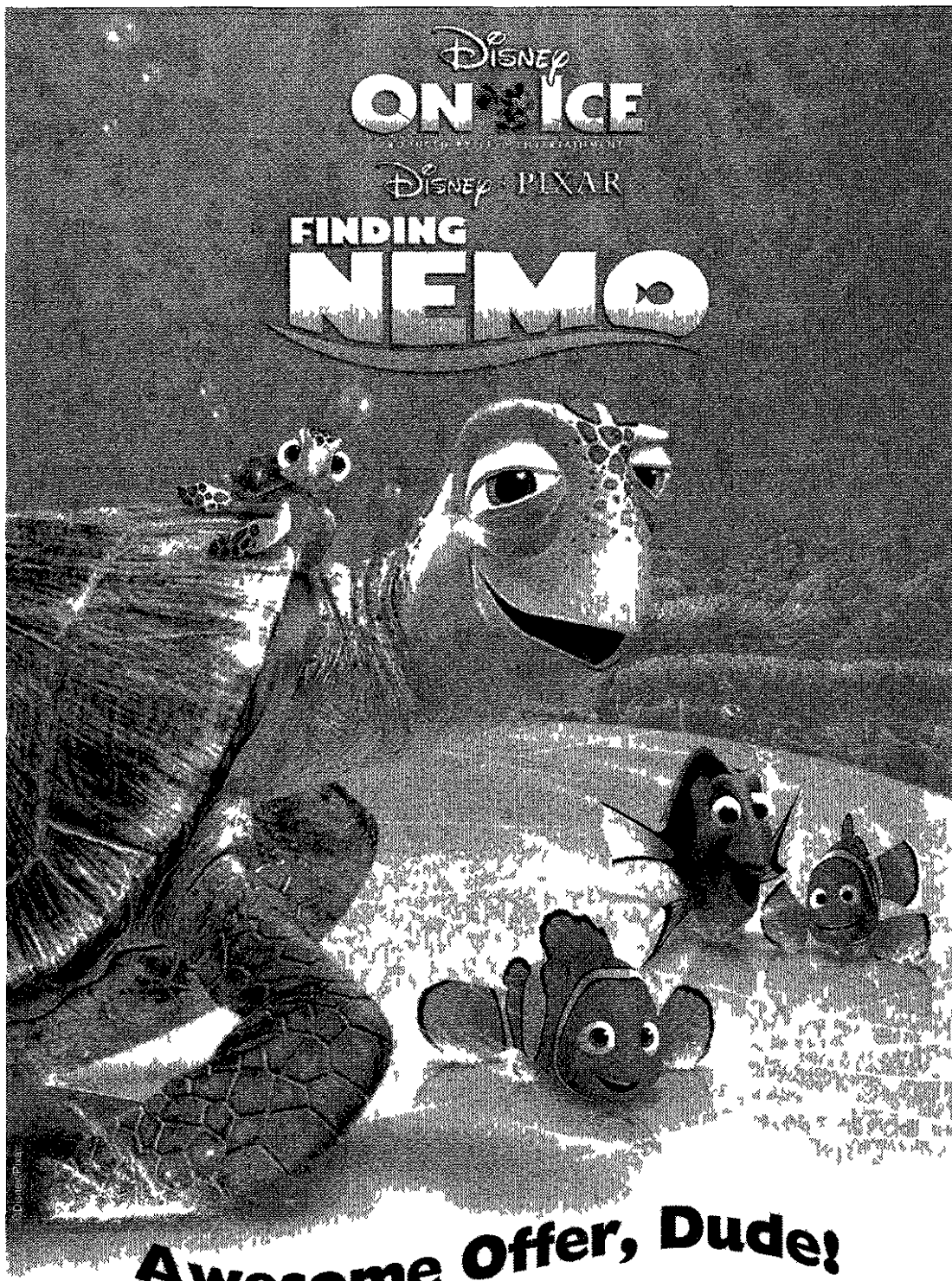

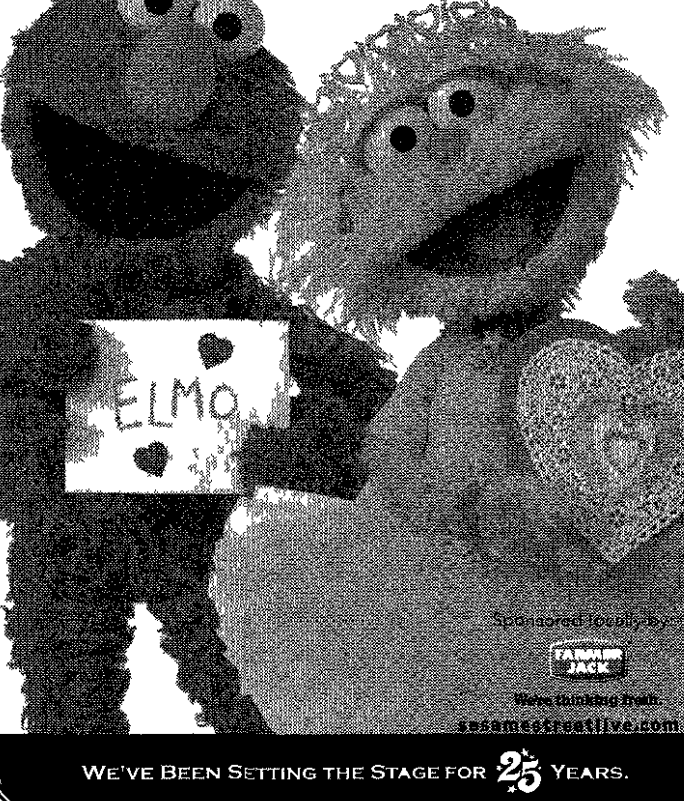

start helping the children and families who call Lemoyne Gardens home. With that in mind, Berry founded the Children's Christian Alliance, a grassroots endeavor whose mission is to "touch the lives of children by showing the love of Jesus." The CCA supports educational programs (spiritual/academic), worship services, concerts, scholarships, funding for programs and also day-to-day living necessities.

What they have done together and with the help of their families, friends, colleagues and strangers is provide many of the basics most people take for granted including clothing, bedding, food, furniture, toothbrushes and – most importantly to Berry and Bradley – prayer.

And where there's prayer, they believe there is hope. Basically I do a lot of exchanging, Berry said. "When God blesses me with things I know Rev. Bradley knows someone whose in need and we make the connection."

Berry's goodwill, coupled with her networking skills, has led to many positive changes. Some of them include buying school uni-

forms, getting a homeless parent back on track, hospital visits to the sick and most importantly promoting positive changes in a neighborhood that has a higher incidence of child and drug abuse, violence and poverty.

Throughout the years, she's also been able to host holiday parties and provide free Thanksgiving dinners and gifts at Christmas. In 2001, she and Bradley partnered with Starfish Family Services and the Teamsters to donate more than 600 coats to needy children.

I'd really like to do that again, said Berry. Lisa Walker-Kadrach, a fellow sales representative at the *Observer Newspapers* in Livonia, has witnessed and supported her colleagues' charity.

The soup kitchen downtown closed where I used to donate things so I started giving them to Jill. It's wonderful what she's doing for the kids,' said Walker-Kadrach, who recently donated cakes for one of the Lemoyne Gardens parties. "No one else is doing what she is there and I think it's great."

The littlest residents of the Inkster housing development think so, too. Bradley said countless children there have come to love Jill and look forward to her parties, visits and

special gifts. "Like I said, it's our good fortune she's there to help," added Bradley.

This past December, Berry's employer, the OGE, donated Golden Books for her to distribute at the Lemoyne Gardens annual Christmas party.

I really appreciated the donation and so did the kids," Berry said. It really hit home to see children pass up toys for a blanket and a book.

Berry admits there have been times when she wanted to quit, but it was her own daughters who encouraged her to keep going. She's not sure what the future holds for her or the Children's Christian Alliance, but she'll keep praying for guidance.

"My ultimate dream is to use one of the vacant Lemoyne Gardens buildings and offer regular programs and activities for the kids there," Berry said.

"What I've learned from all this is that I can do so much with so little. There was a time when I'd spend \$300 on a suit and not think twice. I have drastically changed my rationale. Now I think of how many people I could feed with \$300."

Emergency angioplasty team races to save lives

Michael VanTiem knew something was wrong when he began having chest pains in the early evening of Jan 19. With encouragement from wife Gail, he went without delay to St Mary Mercy Hospital, a mile from his Livonia home.

If VanTiem had walked into the emergency room with chest pains three days earlier, the heart attack might have caused permanent damage, but Jan 17 the community hospital became one of the first to begin offering emergency angioplasty without on-site open heart surgery backup. Twenty minutes away in Bloomfield Hills, Dr Chamon Sohal was leaving his Bloomfield Hills home for the cardiac catheterization lab at St Mary Mercy Hospital.

"Within the hour they were all there," said VanTiem, 56. "They took me in for angioplasty and put in a stent. I felt good immediately. The pain immediately subsided because the blockage is gone."

Within one week, VanTiem was back to his old routine, except now he

walks every day as a form of exercise. "It's important they have the service there," VanTiem said. "The care and immediate response from everyone at St Mary was incredible. They saved me from having any damage."

Timing is everything, according to Sohal, a cardiologist and director of the catheterization lab at St Mary Mercy. Until recent studies proved the safety of performing the procedure without open heart surgery on-site, emergency angioplasty was unavailable at community hospitals. Precious time was lost as patients were transported.

Michigan granted non-open heart surgery facilities the ability to perform emergency angioplasty in 2003. Hospitals applying for approval from the Michigan Department of Community Health must meet standards recommended by the American College of Cardiology, including following a protocol to alert an open heart surgery team at a nearby facility.

Emergency angioplasty has become the preferred treatment for heart attacks because it increases the survival rate and reduces damage. According to research reported at the American Heart Association's Scientific Sessions in 2002, "survival rates following emergency angioplasty for heart attack are the same regardless of the availability of on-site cardiac surgery." In case of complications, a St Mary Mercy patient will be transferred to St Joseph Mercy Hospital in Ann Arbor within 60 minutes.

"The American College of Cardiologists gives a 90 to 120-minute leeway," said Sohal, one of three doctors performing emergency angioplasty at St Mary Mercy. "We're racing against time. The earlier (the intervention), the better. We want to interrupt the heart attack. Where the clot has formed, we need to restore the blood flow."

"This is a great service for the community. They can go next door."

So far, patients from Livonia, Plymouth and Northville have undergone successful emergency angioplasty at St Mary Mercy.

Edward Motley is part of the team that has been training for the procedure over the last couple of months. He previously assisted Sohal in treating patients at Oakwood Hospital,

Restore your weight loss resolution

What was your New Year's resolution for 2005? For most, it was to lose those few extra pounds by going on a diet.

The Atkins diet, which embeds itself in the philosophy that excessive carbohydrate intake leads to obesity and other health problems, has received massive media attention within the last few years. This diet, which promotes the avoidance of such foods as bread, pasta, alcohol, and fruit, claims to work effectively because as carbohydrate intake decreases, the body's ability to burn fat increases. Mary Heiser, a registered dietitian at Garden City Hospital, says that because of the high levels of fats, specifically saturated fats that are consumed as a result of the Atkins diet's philosophy, followers have an increased likelihood of developing high cholesterol levels and also more strain is placed on the kidneys and their functions.

Another popular diet circulating today is "The Zone." Unlike Atkins, The Zone places its emphasis on how the consumption of combinations of foods in exact proportions have the ability to decrease hunger and increase weight loss and energy through changes in metabolic states.

Unlike Atkins though, this diet is not low in carbohydrates, but low in added sugar.

The Zone Diet is rigid in proportions. It sticks to the idea that through strict adherence to the daily proportions of 30 percent fat, 30 percent protein, and 40 percent carbohydrates, that weight will be lost," said Heiser.

So why is the diet failing you? The effectiveness of a weight loss treatment ultimately rests on the individual," said Heiser. "We as dietitians are only the facilitators of change. A person must want to lose weight and must have the discipline and self-control to follow their chosen diet. Because many fad diets are very restrictive on foods allowed or is difficult to follow, often people fail to stay with them. Therefore long term studies on these diet's effects are unavailable."

Garden City Hospital's medical nutrition therapy program for children and adults provides private sessions with a registered dietitian who is able to provide individualized diet plans for persons with diabetes, hypoglycemia, allergies, or weight loss concerns. where Motley was a registered cardiac intervention specialist. At St. Mary Mercy, Motley supervises the catheterization lab, which primarily performs diagnostics and pacemaker implants.

"If you're having an ongoing heart attack, the best thing is to open the artery rather than transfer a patient and let the muscle die," said Motley, who traveled 30 minutes from Lathrup Village to assist Sohal with an emergency angioplasty at 2 a.m. last Sunday morning. "On Sunday morning, it took 85 minutes from the time the patient arrived in ER and blood was restored to the heart."

The average time for emergency angioplasty treatment at Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit in December was 88 minutes, according to Dr. Aaron Kugelmass, director of the cardiac catheterization lab. The

Henry Ford cardiologist arrived at the hospital from his home in Franklin at 3 a.m. Tuesday to perform emergency angioplasty on a patient transferred from Bi-County Hospital in Warren.

Henry Ford cardiologists have performed the procedure for years because they have open heart backup on-site.

"We have a specialized center for this process," Kugelmass said. "We set up against pathways so patients can be brought here in an expedited fashion from all over the area — from Henry Ford Bi-County, Henry Ford Wyandotte, West Bloomfield, Fairlane and Sterling Heights. It's been in existence over a year and a half."

"From the time the patient walks in the door to the time artery is opened the median is less than two hours. The sooner you can restore blood flow, the better for patients."

Q I was told the cut of a diamond is the most important, is this true?

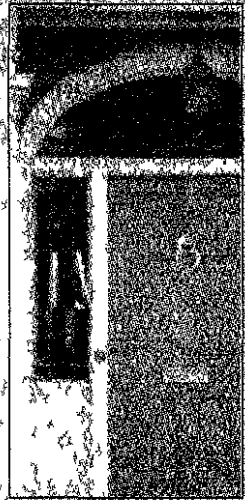
A The four C's of diamond quality are clarity, color, carat weight and cut. The unlimited combination of these details will be used to determine price and also influence beauty. When it comes to cut the most common misconception is that cut refers to shape (round, pear, marquise etc.) when in fact cut refers more to how the stone is proportioned and finished. The facets on a diamond are like small mirrors whose job is to reflect light. If the facets are not positioned correctly the light will not be reflected or it will be reflected in a disorganized fashion. This reduced reflection will result in a less brilliant stone. 10 ways to conquer and prevent mold in home

(MS) - Mold can ruin the appearance of a home's interior and exterior, and certain types may even cause health-related problems if left unchecked. But, conquering and preventing mold is quite simple, according to Ed Keith, senior engineer with APA - The Engineered Wood Association.

"It's all about venting and sealing," Keith says. "Get rid of the moisture and you've banished your mold problem."

Industry research points to poorly sealed windows and doors as major culprits for mold growth. But don't forget about proper venting. "We've seen folks seal their homes up tight and forget about the importance of venting moisture," says Keith. He says that people shouldn't let moisture collect from steamy showers, dishwashers and washing machines. Using a properly vented exhaust fan, for example, regularly keeps indoor spaces dry.

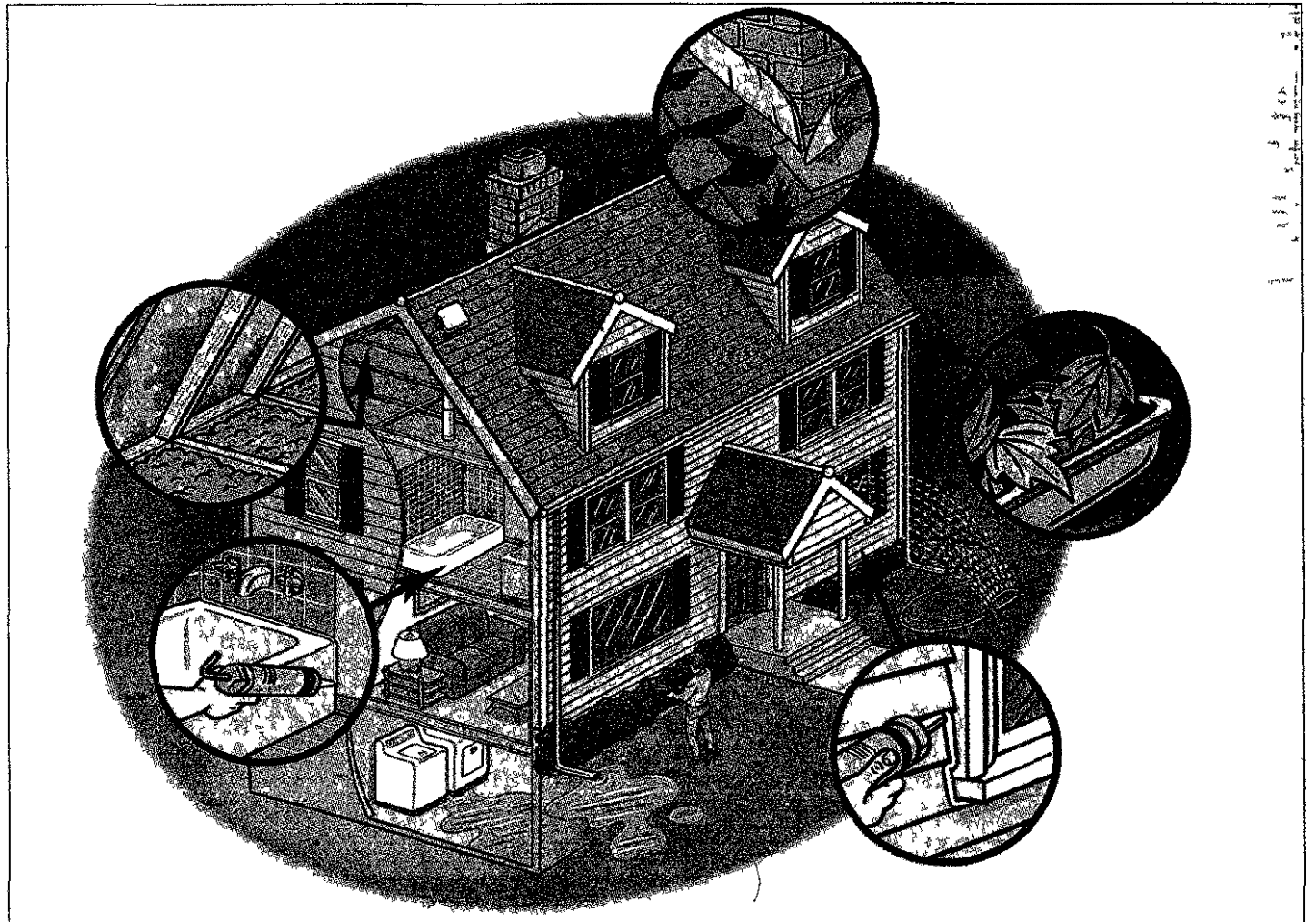
APA says that if homeowners are armed with a common-sense plan, they can overcome mold and protect their most valuable asset - their home. APA has launched a new initiative and Web site, FreeFromMold.org, which provides recommendations and suggestions for addressing common causes of mold. Following is the their "Ten-Point Protection Plan." If homeowners follow the plan's routine maintenance suggestions, they can help keep minor mold problems from becoming major headaches.

1 **Roof** - Remove moss and lichen growth anywhere on the roof using a broom or garden hose with a spray nozzle. Direct water down the roof, never up under the shingles. Remove debris build-up in valleys and at wall-to-roof intersections.

2 **Gutters/Downspouts** - Clean gutters with a blower, hose or small broom. (A hose will help pinpoint leaks and other trouble spots.) Use gutter cement on cracks or replace gutter sections according to manufacturer's instructions. Make sure that downspouts drain away from the house.

3 **Windows/Doors/Siding** - Inspect and recaulk siding, windows, utility penetrations and doors. Check that weather-stripping around doors and windows seals tightly to prevent moisture from entering.

4 **Drainage** - Make sure that perimeter ground slopes away from the



foundation. If downspouts dead-end near the foundation, add splash blocks to redirect water away from the foundation.

5 **Sprinklers** - Water your plants, not your house. Redirect lawn sprinklers so they do not wet the siding, windows or foundation walls.

6 **Landscaping** - Trim plants away from the siding. Large shrubs or vegetation may need to be moved if foliage persistently contacts siding, windows or utility penetrations like dryer vents.

7 **Attic** - Look for water stains on the underside of the roof, rusted nails and discolored moldy sections on any surface. If you find any of these moisture warning signs, look for the source of the moisture, such as a vent that isn't directing air to the outside. Also check that there is room for air to flow from the eaves (soffit vents) into the attic space and out the upper roof vents.

8 **Ventilation** - Install timers on bathroom and laundry fans, and run fans for 20 minutes after showers. Your bath, kitchen and laundry fan ducts should vent outside and never terminate in the attic or another area of the house.

9 **Kitchen/Bath** - Inspect plumbing fixtures, paying particular attention to areas under sinks and toilets and around showers and tubs. Look for stains, cracks and mold on caulk, and repair as necessary.

10 **Basement** - Check your basement and crawlspace for moisture problems such as standing water, mold on floor joists or rust on metal fasteners. Replace loose or missing batt insulation. If crawlspace is not insulated, install a 6-mil polyethylene vapor barrier over exposed ground. If you find serious moisture damage or standing water in the crawlspace or basement, call a contractor to repair and correct the source of the problem.

Relocating Companies Hedge Bets On Employee Contentment

Moving a business to a new area often benefits a company, but employees have to be happy with the change, as well

The risks of relocating can be minimized for companies and their employees, according to Bob Potter, economic development recruiter at Inland Northwest Regional Economic Development Alliance in Coeur d'Alene. He mentions that relocating to northern Idaho or eastern Washington isn't just about saving money. It involves competition offshore and in China, and high workmen's compensation rates in California (approximately \$10 per \$100 of payroll, he reports). That amount drops approximately 35 percent in his region.

Business relocation is also about people. Small manufacturers (25 to 30 employees) seek to reduce operating costs, but if a key employee refuses to leave with the company, everyone may well have to remain in place. To make certain a deal gets, Potter visits a company five to seven times and spends approximately three years bringing the agreement to fruition. The fact that his region puts home ownership in reach for most employees is appealing to such businesses.

But what about the culture? "We have a reputation for being rednecks," Potter

acknowledges. The truth is, we're not Coeur d'Alene has probably one of the most active Human Rights organizations in the world. We won the Raoul Wallenberg Civic Award (honoring the Swedish diplomat who protected Jews from the Nazis) in 1987. We've been very successful in eliminating the source of the (unfavorable) human rights activity."

PEOPLE FACTOR

Penn Siegel, chairman and CEO of the \$1.4 billion Potlatch Corp., a forest products and paper company headquartered in Spokane, has 4,000 employees, considered "small to mid-sized in an industry with low turnover, where people who leave either retire or die," he says. The firm, founded in 1903, left San Francisco for Spokane in 1997. Its operations span Idaho, Arkansas and Minnesota.

"Almost all of our employees live in small towns," he explains. "For six or seven years, we'd been unable to promote (and relocate) anyone to headquarters in the Bay Area, because we couldn't offer enough money to maintain their living standard. Inability to promote really was a management development issue."

The fact that the CEO was a native of northern Idaho spurred the company to seek an objective opinion on relocating. "We gave the search firm weightings of 50 percent to the cost of doing business, 25 percent to the cost of travel and 25 percent to employee costs as they looked at our potential cost of locating in a different area," Siegel states. The firm recommended Boise, Spokane and

Salt Lake

An unexpectedly large group of employees - 85 percent -- agreed to go with him, more than four times anticipated by experts. "We'd been worried," Siegel notes, "because the 45 employees who came had been hired in the Bay Area. Most of them had no clue about Spokane and were amazed at how easy it is to live here and how close people are to outdoor activities."

Five of the seven who didn't move retired. "We really lost only two. I'm sure some feared job hunting, because they'd been out of the job market for 10 or 15 years."

The sun was shining on the long weekend each family took to the area. "We did not do it in February," Siegel deadpans. He also points out that an extremely important factor affected employee decisions to take the risk: They liked working there.

Senior service technician Tim Inez is one of 15 employees at Data Acquisition Labs, a privately-held computer networks company and refurbishing center for Xerox in Hayden, Idaho. He spent six years with the company before it relocated to northern Idaho. His job has expanded from repairing circuitboards to include servicing computers and peripherals. He has much more responsibility, traveling off-site to repair printers for the county,

Sheriff, City of Coeur d'Alene and companies that have relocated to the area.

"I feel a lot more freedom and independence," he states, "I manage myself and my time so much more and have a better quality of life." His son attends a better public school than he would have in California. Personal savings are up because of decreased living costs. Inez is also president of his nearby golf club.

"I wouldn't change my life if I had to do it all over again," he adds. In other words, companies can hedge their bets on successful relocation by remaining profitable, continuing to be good place to work and increasing employee satisfaction on the job and off.

The 2005 Pontiac G6 does not look -- or act -- like a four door sedan

It rivals the integrity, sportiness, prowess and interior refinements of a fine luxury sports coupe

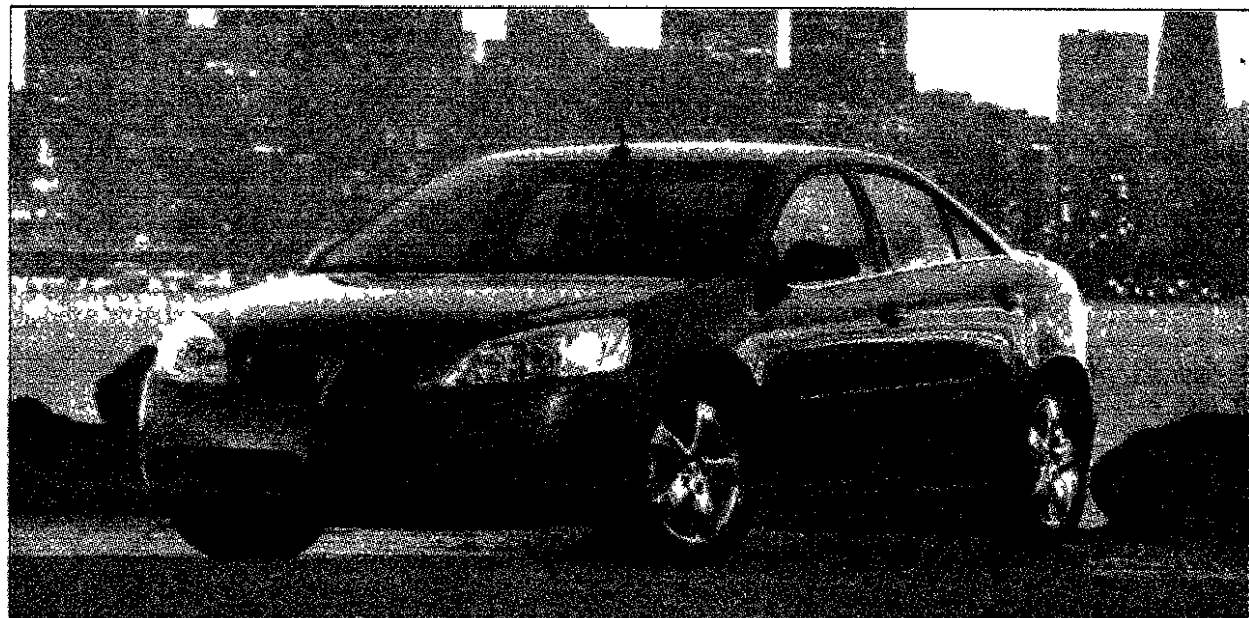
Powered by a 3.5-liter V6 engine, 200 horses are under the hood working hard to make your driving experience a dream come true. Some of the cool and up-and-coming technology is evident in the G6. For example, there's variable-effort power steering, four-wheel disc brakes, telescopic steering, power windows and programmable door lock that includes lockout protection and delayed locking and driver information center. And that's all on the standard equipment list.

The price is nice, too \$21,300. Open the door and slip inside behind the wheel and you'll find instrumentation that rivals the most sports cars, including speedometer, temperature, fuel, tachometer and trip odometer all closely packaged very neatly and easy to understand.

The center console flows continuously from the back of the front seats to the center instrumentation stack. The floor shifter, armrest, lighted shift indicator, parking brake and storage compartments fit snugly and are easy to maneuver around. There are enough map pockets and storage areas to put everything you need in a secure place.

Beneath the driver's front instrumentation you'll find gas and brake pedals that are power adjustable. Interior lighting includes illuminated entry and theater dimming. Air conditioning is also standard, along with the great PASSlock theft-deterrent alarm system.

The front bucket seats recline, while the rear seats are 60/40 split-folding. Also available is a 4-

way or 6-way power seat with power height adjustment and ratcheting lumbar support. You can also opt for leather seating surfaces that include driver and front passenger heated seats on the seat cushion and back. With this option you'll also get a leather-wrapped steering wheel, steering wheel mounted radio controls, leather-wrapped shift knob and parking brake handle.

There are two types of sunroof options to choose from, including a power, tilt-sliding sunroof with sunshade, or a panoramic power room with four panel glass and a multi-position electric sunshade.

On the visors are driver and passenger vanity mirrors - illuminated one on the GT model. Power windows are also on the standard list and includes both driver and passenger express-down.

Head, shoulder, hip and leg room is more than adequate for most people. Seating is comfortable. Other things you'll find that you won't in most vehicles' standard equipment are stainless steel exhaust outlet, front projector-beam integrum fog lamps, solar-ray tinted glass, halogen composite headlamps with automatic exterior lamp control and 20-second delay off feature, license plate frame, power outside mirrors, rear spoiler and intermittent wipers.

The suspension on the G6 is finely tuned so no matter how long your in the car, even with unev-

en roads and snow-covered messes, you'll feel comfortable and in control. Ride and handling is superb. I drove it in that 12-inch snowstorm we had recently and it drove like a charm, which you wouldn't expect in a vehicle of this size.

And here's an option you don't see often -- an engine block heater.

Any safety issues you would have in a small car like this are taken care of. Three-point safety belts in all positions, dual-stage air bags, child safety seats and remote vehicle starter system (What a blessing when it's sooooo cold out there -- or even sooo hot).

Available to you are anti lock brakes, full function traction control, enhanced traction system, side roof rail side impact air bags and the coveted OnStar system.

OnStar includes automatic notification of air bag deployment, emergency services, roadside assistance, stolen vehicle tracking, accident assist, remote door unlock and remote diagnostics. You can add hands-free calling and get location-based traffic and weather reports for a nominal fee.

The Pontiac G6 is a breath of fresh air in the small sedan marketplace, teaching you that power, performance and an exciting drive experience can be had in a small package.
