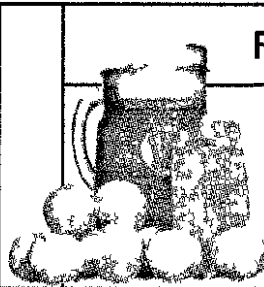

City sets raises for workers

Plymouth city commissioners voted 6-1 Monday night to give non-union city employees a 3-percent pay hike beginning July 1. The pay increases correspond with those given to members of four unions, who will receive contractual raises of between 2.3 percent. In an unusual move — in what is an election year — Commissioner Phil Pursell voted against the pay hikes, saying he wanted to hold the line on non-union pay hikes until the administration conducts a survey of city residents concerning what services they prefer to keep in the budget in tough economic times.

For the last three years I voted for pay increases," said Pursell. "This year I'm voting 'no.' I think it's time we stand pat."

"It's hard to ask somebody what services they want to do without while we're giving out raises to employees," he said. Especially with the unemployment rate in this state. It's reflected in the private sector.

Commissioner Dave Workman disagreed, noting most city employees have been doing double duty since the number of workers has dropped from an equivalent of 67 full-time employees three years ago to a total of 42 today.

"We've got to treat the people who make this city run well, because we can't cut back more and still be operating," Workman said. "I have a concern that job stability is going to cause either people to trust and stay, or to not be fully invested and looking around."

City Manager Paul Sincock said it will cost the city \$42,000 for union contract raises in fiscal 2005-06, with another \$36,000 for non-union workers.

Some of the lost jobs, according to Sincock, have been through attrition, moves to other jobs and buyouts. Last year, 10 city employees took advantage of a buyout worth \$20,000 over three years.

Rain doesn't dampen spirits as township marks start of hall build

In the early afternoon hours Tuesday, Plymouth Township Supervisor Richard Reaume and treasurer Ron Edwards were debating the weather for the scheduled girder-signing ceremony for the new township hall.

Reaume, the optimist, figured the weather would hold, Edwards said there was a 60-percent chance of rain.

Turns out Edwards was right. The clouds started gathering before the 6 p.m. ceremony, and at 6:01 Mother Nature dropped a huge rainstorm over the ceremony.

But that didn't stop township officials, and the small crowd huddled beneath a large canopy, from officially ushering in the

construction phase of the \$13.1 million project.

The crowd consisted mostly of current and former township officials and representatives of companies involved with the project, being built on 9-plus acres at Haggerty and Ann Arbor Road.

"Because it's been talked about for 10 years, it's a significant accomplishment," Reaume said.

"It's on schedule, still on budget. Because it will have a police department and a fire station right on site, it'll be a true municipal complex."

The township is building a 47,000-square-foot building that will house the township hall and the Plymouth Township Police Department. A second, 8,000-square-foot building will house Fire Station 1.

Ground-breaking actually took place in April.

The site has been cleared, underground water and sewer work is completed and the footings are in.

Reaume said the next step will be delivery of the structural steel, and residents should start seeing evidence of construction by the end of the month.

Gary Roberts, president of DeMattia, the project's construction manager, said township officials should be able to move into their new home by next spring.

It's basically a 12-month round-trip," Roberts said. "By Christmas you'll see the masonry going up and next spring we'll be moving in."

Vets' park hope close to reality

Donation puts 13-year dream in focus

The Plymouth Community Veterans Memorial Park has the lion's share of the money it needs to construct a half-million dollar memorial in downtown Plymouth that will honor those who fought and died in every major conflict in U.S. history.

After nearly 13 years of planning, groundbreaking on city-owned property in front of Central Middle School at the corner of Main and Church streets could be held as soon as September.

"We've got the money, \$450,000," said Bob Zaetta of Plymouth Township, chairman of the memorial park committee. "It's really going to happen."

We'll need about \$110,000 more, Zaetta said. But, with other funds we already have in reality we'll need about \$80,000.

Zaetta said the financial windfall will be donated by the Plymouth District Veterans Memorial Foundation in an official ceremony to be held within weeks. The proceeds are the result of the sale of the property at 173 N. Main St., home of the foundation and American Legion Post 391.

The building and land, which was dedicated in the memory of Plymouth resident Mariette Hough Nov. 9, 1947, had a letter of intent that required the property, or the proceeds, be used for veteran's groups.

Plymouth builder Dominic Maltese purchased the property for a reported \$685,000 last month. Groundbreaking for an 11,000-square-foot, two-story office building on the site — half to be occupied by Coldwell Banker Schwitzer-Bake Real Estate — was held Wednesday.

Zaetta said only \$10,000 had been raised since fund-raising began Nov. 11, 2002 — Veterans Day — from selling brick pavers with names of veterans inscribed on them for \$100 each. But, with construction set to begin, he's hopeful the rest will come from fund-raising and grants.

I never thought we'd get such a large donation as this, Zaetta said. "I thought it would come in dribbles and trickles. I think once people see it being constructed, the rest will be easy."

Karen Ensor said she's felt the effects of the lack of state funding for education, both personally and professionally.

As a media specialist at Smith Elementary in Plymouth the past dozen years, Ensor has seen how the lack of state foundation grant increases is affecting her professional life in the Plymouth-Canton school district.

"I can't buy books, I can't buy software, I can't give the staff the time and support they deserve," Ensor said. "I now have to share the media center with the before and after school programs, so that makes it off-limits to students who want to use the library as a library."

As a parent, the Plymouth mother of two has noticed a difference in the quality of education her son and daughter have received while being educated in Plymouth-Canton schools.

"There are 10 years between my children, and my son is not getting the same level of resources available to him that my daughter did when she went through," she said.

Ensor decided enough was enough and traveled Tuesday to Lansing to join more than 10,000 parents, educators and school officials in one of the largest rallies in recent memory on the lawn of the state Capitol, sponsored by the K-16 Coalition for Michigan's Future. The 400,000-member group is supporting two bills that would increase state funding for public education.

"We envision a quality education for every child in the state of Michigan, and failure is not an option," Donna Oser, director of the Michigan Parent Teacher Student Association, told the crowd. "We've had enough, and we've come here to say we won't stand for less than enough to provide a future for our children."

The K-16 Coalition is pressing the state Legislature to pass House Bill 4582 and Senate Bill 246, which call for a minimum yearly funding increase in state budgets for K-12 schools, community colleges and universities. The minimum funding increase would be based on the rate of inflation, or 5 percent, whichever is less.

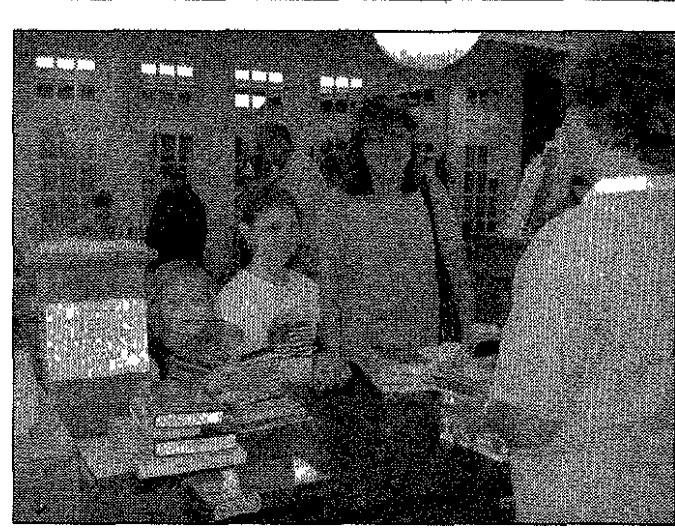

Standard real estate purchase agreements usually contain language that releases the purchaser from an agreement if they are unable to get financing within a specified period of time with a full return of their earnest money deposit. Carving a life out of wood

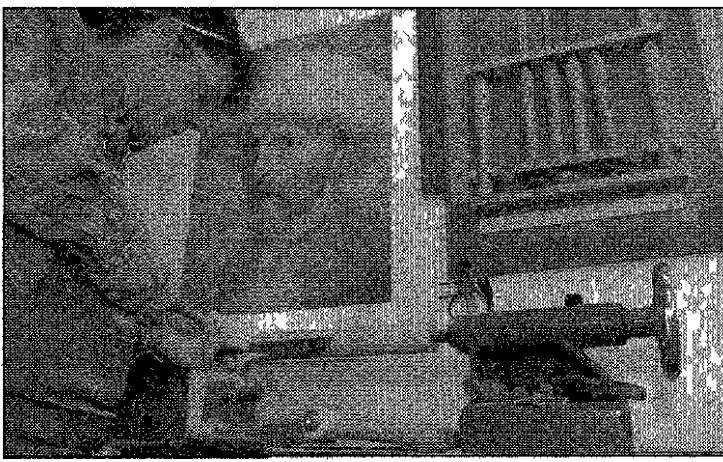
Hometown boy builds business bringing furniture back to life

When Patrick Gallagher was in school, he'd scrape the glue off of desks

He got his first saw for Christmas when he was in third grade. After high school, he became a carpenter and has spent 20 years working in wood.

Now, Gallagher celebrates 10 years in business with his furniture resurrection shop Restoration Station, located on Ann Arbor Trail in Plymouth Township. After starting out in his garage,

Gallagher couldn't be happier to be in his bigger building, into which he moved the business five years ago.

"I love this location," said Gallagher, who said he spent a year refurbishing the building before he could move into it.

"It's in a neighborhood. You get to know the kids and their dogs' names. It's more personable."

That's been the style of the people at Restoration Station from the beginning. Gallagher was born and raised in Plymouth, growing up one street over from where the store is located. After being graduated from Canton High School, Gallagher went into carpentry.

He opened his business in his own garage 10 years ago, and it has slowly grown out of its surroundings. After moving once, and continuing to grow, Gallagher found the former Tommy's Hardware building. When he found it, it wasn't quite ready for occupation.

"We owned it a year before we moved in," Gallagher said.

"We'd come in at night and work on it to get it ready. I like having a place to hang my own hat. It's like having a home away from home."

Restoration Station specializes in stripping, repairing and refinishing furniture. They work on new, old or antique — "Anything that's wood," Gallagher said — and do all the work by hand. Gallagher said he does a 'lot of veneer work,' and can also make custom parts, such as chair legs.

They've worked on projects as diverse as church doors and the Plymouth Kiwanis Club's popcorn cart. Sometimes, they get people bringing in furniture they don't realize might actually be valuable — like the time owners brought in a pair of Gustav Stickley pieces.

Once in awhile, you find a museum-quality piece and you have to be honest with them," Gallagher said.

They wanted us to strip and sand and put a quick stain on it. 'We were like, 'No,

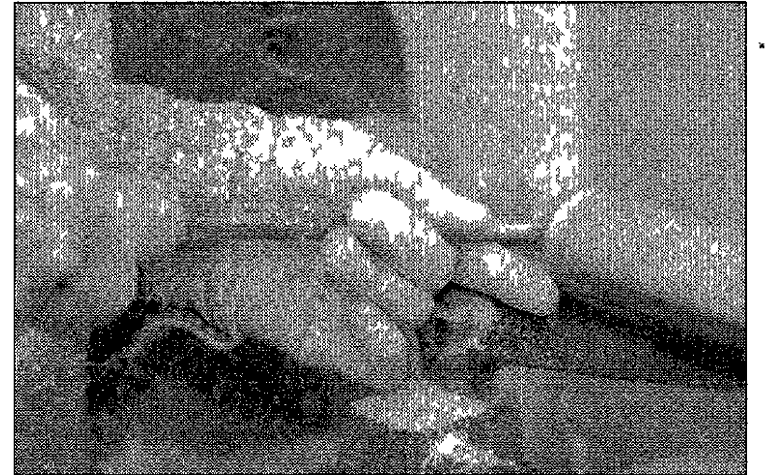
no, no!'

Any doubt about the hometown feeling at Restoration Station are put aside by the interior decor, which features a number of old signs from Plymouth businesses of the past. Those signs contribute to the small-town feel for which the store strives.

"A lot of people see the signs on the wall, and they bring back memories," said manager Darren Blair. They feel comfortable.

Comfortable enough to come in to visit, even when there's no work to be done, or to bring a tray of homemade cookies, which is one of Gallagher's favorite parts of being in a neighborhood.

"We've had people come in and cry when they see Grandma's dresser restored,"

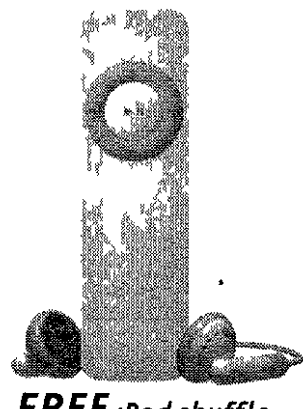

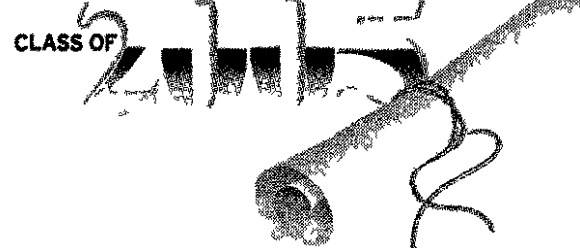

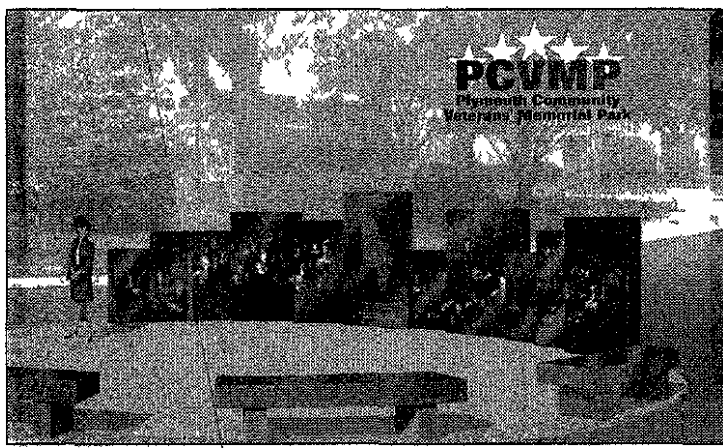

Young, 80, of Plymouth Township, said it was becoming difficult to raise money for the memorial park because of other fund-raising efforts in the community

"There's the Save the Penn campaign, and the city was selling pavers for a park, plus other efforts that were going head-to-head with us for money," said Young. "I didn't see a bright prospect on the horizon."

"I think it's going to be a showplace," he said. "It will be historical, educational and beautiful and certainly representative of every conflict from the Revolutionary War until today, with a monument representing each one of those conflicts."

The plaza will be 30 feet across and surrounded by 11 gray granite tablets, with laser-etched images of men and women who served in each of the major wars. At least 147 red, engraved pavers will be laid around the plaza, representing those who died during all the wars.

There will also be gray pavers, which can be purchased, that will have the names of veterans engraved on them and put in the plaza. Additional red pavers can be purchased, which will be engraved and be used for walkways.

There will be three flags flying - the American, the State of Michigan and the POW/MIA flags.

Currently at least five war monuments are scattered throughout the city: the Civil War monument known as The Lady is located at Riverside Cemetery, a memorial rock representing World War II veterans in front of the Wilcox House on city-owned property known as Veterans Memorial Park, a Korean/Vietnam memorial located in the same park, a monument to World War I veterans in front of

Local cops searching for possible serial robber

Canton police are looking for a serial robber and his female accomplice who may have held up as many as six businesses in Canton, Westland and Northville.

The most recent of the robberies was at a Citgo gas station at Michigan Avenue and Lotz on Saturday, June 18.

According to police, the robber came into the store at about 10:40 p.m. He's described as a white man, about 20 years old, and was wearing blue jeans, a blue T-shirt, and a ball cap.

Police said he pulled out a silver handgun and tried to

rob the business. The clerk refused to give the suspect any money and he left, taking only a magazine and a couple packs of cigarettes.

Just a few days earlier and a few miles away, a Westland store clerk reported a similar hold-up on June 13.

A man held up a Westland business at Michigan Avenue and Merriman, Westland police Lt. James Ridener said.

A man entered the store about 7:40 p.m., asked a male employee to get two Xbox games from a shelf and then revealed what was described as a nickel-plated, semiautomatic handgun, according to police reports.

"There's been a change in the transaction," the employee quoted the robber as saying.

The bandit pointed the gun at the employee, demanded money from the cash register and then fled with the money and some Xbox merchandise, police said. No shots were fired.

The worker described the gunman as a white male, about 5-foot-11, unshaven with a thin build. He wore a baggy, navy blue Polo-style shirt and a baseball cap. He also wore blue jean shorts or pants.

One witness told police she saw a man run to a vehicle parked behind the location and throw merchandise into

the trunk. A white woman was in the car, and got out to open the trunk for the robber, according to police.

She drove away, but the man left on foot. Authorities brought a police dog in from the Wayne Police Department, but the suspect couldn't be found.

Part of the unusual nature of the suspect's robberies is that the robber doesn't make off with much merchandise or cash, according to police, who believe he may have robbed two gas stations, two Radio Shack stores, and two video game stores.

Canton day care provider charged with abuse

A 43-year-old Canton woman could serve up to 15 years in jail if found guilty of sexual abuse against a 2-year-old girl who was in the woman's care.

Nancy Podorsek ran a licensed daycare facility in her home on London Court in Canton. According to the state of Michigan, her license allowed her to care for as many as six children at a time. But on May 16, 2005, the day of the alleged abuse, the toddler was the only child in her care, said Canton Police Detective Chad Baugh.

Podorsek was charged with second-degree criminal sexual conduct, a 15-year felony, and

third-degree child abuse, a two-year misdemeanor. She was arraigned June 17 and a plea of not guilty was entered on her behalf at the 35th District

Court.

According to Baugh, Podorsek had become angry with the little girl when the toddler soiled herself and needed a bath, and that's when the abuse occurred.

The girl's mother (the girl and mother do not live in Canton) discovered bruising on the girl's genitals and took her to see a doctor, who confirmed the bruising.

Podorsek admitted she may have scrubbed too hard with a towel during her bath, and has been "remorseful" about hurting her, Baugh said.

Though Podorsek has not said her actions were sexual in nature, state law as it applies to sexual abuse addresses an element of humiliation, and because the injury was in a sexual area of the girl's body, the law allows for a sexual abuse charge, Baugh said.

The parents of the other children in Podorsek's daycare were informed of the abuse, and Podorsek has voluntarily closed the day care during the investigation and upcoming legal process, Baugh said.

"There had been no prior

complaints against her and no other parent had noticed anything unusual," Baugh said. "I think this was uncharacteristic (of Podorsek), from my understanding."

Podorsek will appear in court on July 1 for a preliminary examination. She has been released on a \$5,000 personal bond.

According to state records, there are in Michigan more than 18,000 regulated child care homes and centers including 10,000 family child care homes, 3,500 group child care homes and more than 4,500 child care centers. Some Michigan 3- and 4-year-olds attend daycare.

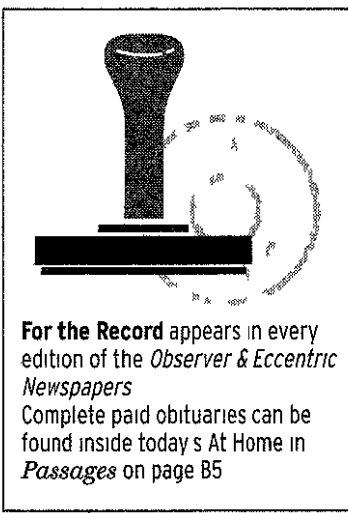

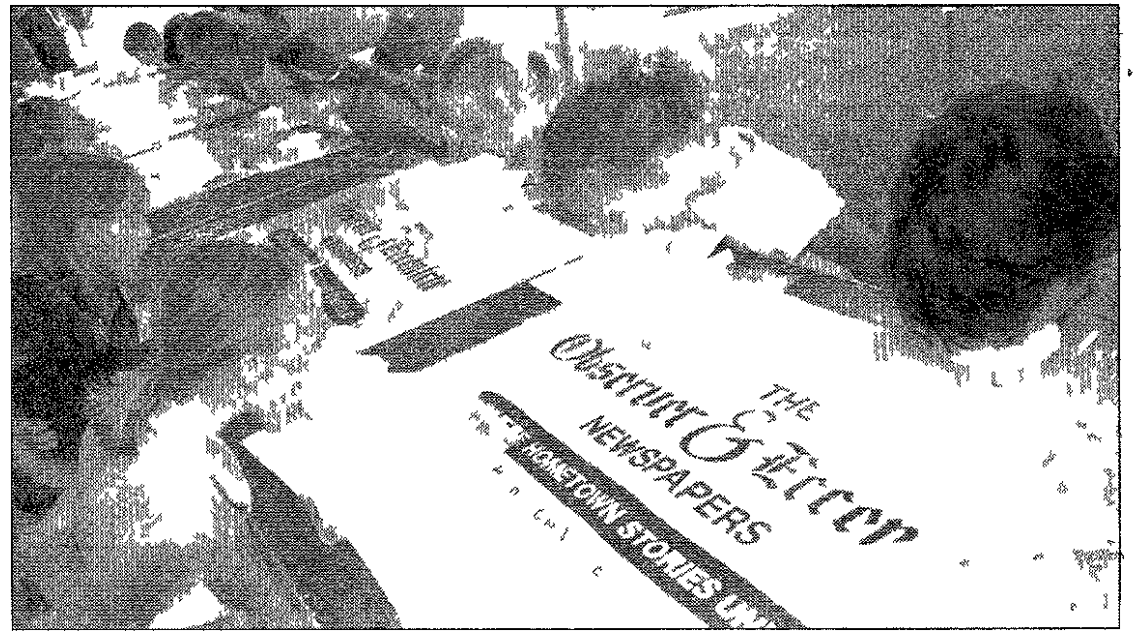
It was definitely worth it to get a booth. We sold a lot of perennial flowers," she said.

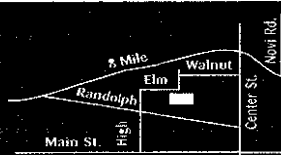

"We're willing to sacrifice everything and anything to make sure that message is heard," said Terrance McClain, a member of the Wayne-Westland Board of Education. McClain said the \$175 increase in the per-pupil foundation grant allowance proposed by legislators is a sleight-of-hand.

"They're taking it from other areas in order to bring it back to the foundation allowance," McClain said. "But they're cutting back some of the grants for reading recovery and other categorical. It looks to the public like they're in favor of public education, when they are really moving money from one place to the other."

Judy Morante, retired for two years after a 34-year teaching career at Thurston High School in the South Redford district, made the trek to lend her support.

"My whole career I saw funding problems," Morante said. "When I taught, the district was able to provide field trips and could use school buses. Now students have to pay to go on field trips, and materials have been cut dramatically."

Gov. Jennifer Granholm, whose long-term goal is to increase the number of college graduates in the state, received a rousing welcome, especially when the Democratic governor criticized Republican lawmakers.

"We have to make the Republican-controlled Legislature do the right thing for children," Granholm said. "We have to ask them to choose between investing in our kids, and pouring money into tax giveaways for special interests." Carolyn Norris-Deyell, presi-

dent of the 1,200-member Livonia teachers union, said Proposal A is failing school districts.

"It's based on an economy that's booming, and our economy in Michigan isn't booming," Norris-Deyell said. "The priority has to be to turn this state around, and change it from an industrial into a technology base. And the best way to do that is to educate our children. That's where the priority has to be."

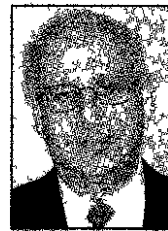
In 1997, Mark Slavens of Canton Township started the Michigan Citizens for Fairness in Public School Funding. After three major summits which attracted school districts and legislators from across the state, the funding issue appeared to be dormant, until Tuesday's rally.

"Education funding is getting worse and worse, and my prediction is coming true: the state Legislature and the governor were not adequately funding schools," Slavens — now president of the Plymouth-Canton Schools Board of Education — said before the rally. "I think they (legislators) will listen, but whether they have the courage to stand up and do something for children, I'm not so sure."

Retiring Schoolcraft VP Tomey has seen college grow, change

Life for a Schoolcraft College student has changed quite a bit during the 31-year tenure of John Tomey, who is retiring as executive vice president on June 30.

For starters, Schoolcraft students see a greater number of other students milling around the campus than they did in the past. When Tomey joined Schoolcraft in 1974, enrollment hovered around 10,000. Today, enrollment is about 30,000.

Another big change is that the big lines students traditionally waited in to enroll for classes and buy books can be circumvented via the Internet. Now, students may register for classes on-line, as well as purchase books and perform a number of other functions, including checking grades and applying for financial aid, electronically.

"We try to make things convenient while trying to maintain a personal touch," Tomey said. "We have found that students need to connect with

people on campus."

At the heart of all this is customer service. And in this case, the "customer" is the Schoolcraft student.

"We really do believe in customer service and delivering customer service in everything we do."

Tomey, 64, lives in Novi with his wife, Carolyn. He has two sons, Phillip, who lives in Seattle, and Michael, who lives in Milford.

One of Schoolcraft's changes may happen after Tomey's retirement. That is to allow for students to get baccalaureate (four-year) degrees. Only two-year degrees are offered at Schoolcraft under its current structure.

"I think that's something a lot of community colleges need to look at," Tomey said of offering four-year programs. "We'd still be a community college, but we would still be allowed to offer certain baccalaureate programs

It's an exciting possibility."

Offering nursing as a four-year program is just one option Schoolcraft would have, if the state legislature approved the change.

"There is a drastic nursing shortage," Tomey said. When he first arrived at Schoolcraft, Tomey's job was director of financial aid. In 1974, an estimated \$500,000 was distributed to students through financial aid.

"This year, we'll probably exceed \$10 million," he said. Financial aid remains an essential lifeline for students.

"Without those funds, there probably be a lot of student who couldn't afford to go to college. The need for financial aid has increased substantially over the years."

Tomey's second job at Schoolcraft began in 1980, when he became director of admissions in addition to financial aid. In 1995, he became dean of student services, became vice president for enrollment services in 2000 and executive vice president in 2004.

Community very family friendly

When Guy Louis and Chataqua Express hit the stage Wednesday for the first in the "Music in the Park" concert series, it marked what some might consider the unofficial start of summer in downtown Plymouth.

The series, hosted by the Plymouth Community Arts Council and sponsored by Community Financial, is arguably the community's most popular event. It draws hundreds of people every Wednesday afternoon, allowing them to spread out their blankets, plunk down a picnic basket and simply enjoy themselves.

For more than 20 years, the series has helped give downtown Plymouth its sense of "hometown," its identity as a family friendly place, and has contributed mightily to an atmosphere that truly makes Plymouth a destination community.

Of course, that concert series isn't solely responsible for the burgeoning reputation. There is much to make the community, particularly the downtown area, an attractive place to be. The Downtown Development Authority sponsors the other concert series, "Music in the Air," at 7 p.m. Fridays, and those concerts — aimed primarily at adults — are nearly as popular as the Wednesday "kiddie" concerts.

One of the community's prized jewels, the Plymouth Community Band, plays at 8 p.m. Thursdays. Restaurants dot the landscape, many of them with outdoor seating that contributes to the ambience. The local coffee shops — the Coffee Bean on Penniman and Ginger's Coffee Connection on Arbor Trail — offer events from literary readings to psychic performances.

Of course, family friendly programming isn't limited to downtown Plymouth. Plymouth Township boasts a playscape and a sprayscape at Plymouth Township Park. Officials recently marked the 10th anniversary of the playscape construction and the sprayscape, the addition of which sparked much controversy, has been a popular attraction since it opened.

The city is generally recognized as having an older population, while the township tends to be seen as a place for younger generations. None of that matters, though, because the Plymouth community as a whole has become a bastion for families of all ages.

Let schools decide their election dates

What the public schools do not need from Lansing now is any more meddling in their affairs.

It's bad enough the state Legislature treats funding as a fiscal yo-yo, stringing the districts along with their per pupil allotments. Now the Legislature wants all the school districts to hold their annual elections in November.

Sounds reasonable, but it isn't that simple even though it would bring everyone onto one unified date, which would result in a savings by combining the school elections with general elections.

Last year the Legislature gave the state the option of holding their elections on one of four dates throughout the year. Most districts, including 27 of 28 in Oakland County, opted for a date in May. That was closest to the traditional June election date.

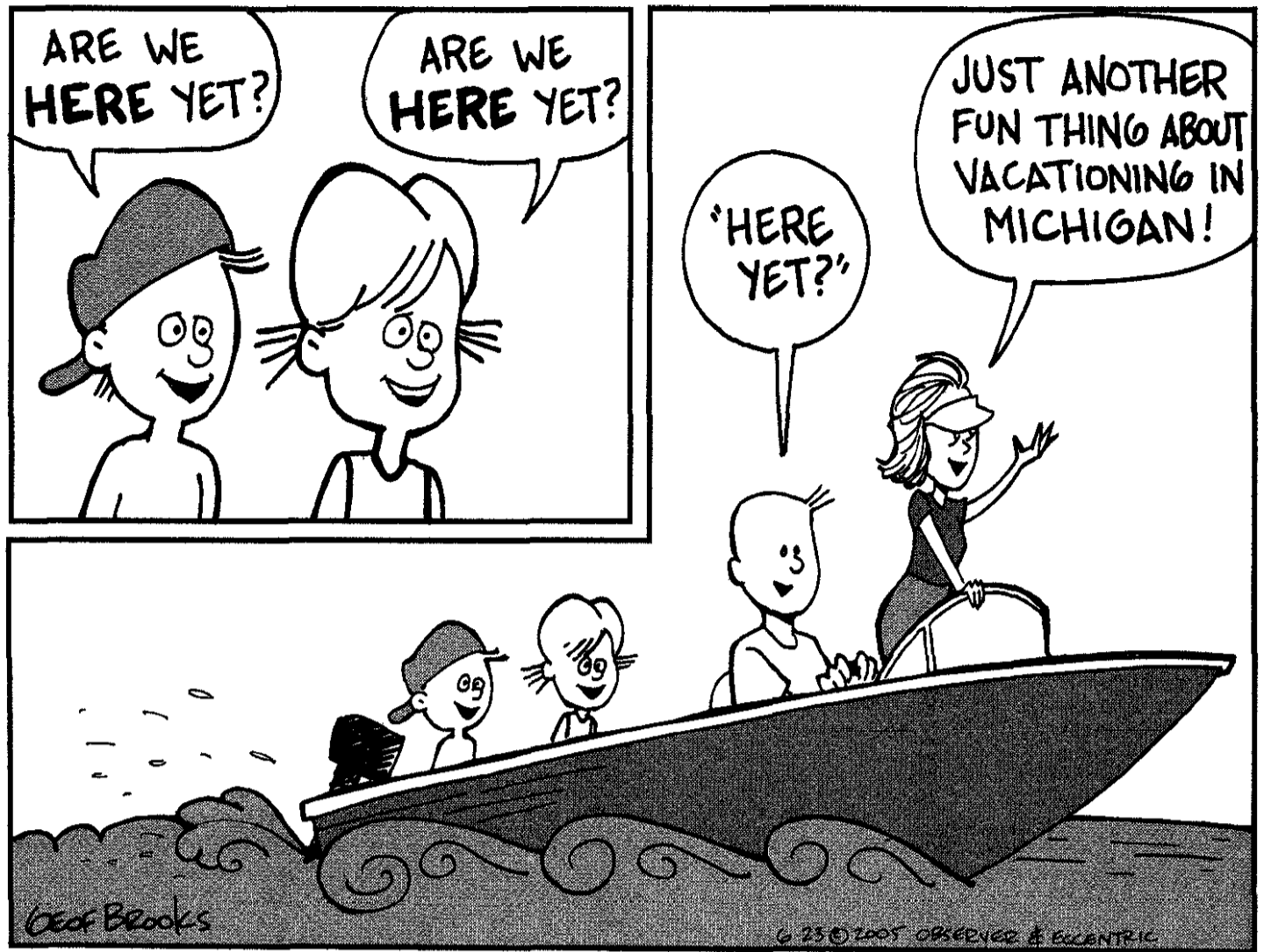
For the most part, the schools chose not to go with the November election date because they want their issues to stand alone and not get buried in potentially massive ballots littered with local, state and national issues and candidates.

True, this amounted to some additional costs for the districts and complicated the election procedure because the jurisdiction was switched to local election clerks, usually in multiple municipalities.

But some things are worth the costs. The schools should have the right to choose the election date that best suits their interests, which translates into doing what is best for the community.

If the state Legislature wants a single election date, it should have proposed that to begin with. To come back after the fact with still another change only demonstrates the legislators' inability to think issues through before enacting legislation.

There's no excuse for that. And if the state really wants to help the schools, the legislators should come up with a consistent, realistic funding system that will stop the bleeding wound opened by Proposal A.

May 5 might be symbolic start of crisis, but certainly not end

Historians take note May 5, 2005, is going to turn out to have been a red-letter date in Michigan's history

And I'm not thinking about Cinco de Mayo, the Mexican national holiday which commemorates the Mexican army's stunning defeat of the imperialist forces of France and the Austrian Emperor Maximilian at Puebla in 1862, a major milestone on the way to Mexican independence

No, ours is a much more gloomy May 5 We are talking about the date when Standard & Poor's downgraded the bond ratings of both General Motors and Ford Motor Co to what the headlines call "junk" Put in the fancy language the bond rating agencies use, that means "investors should not invest in bonds of either of these companies for the long term"

When historians look back on our times, I suspect they'll seize on May 5 as the symbolic date at which it became painfully clear to all that Michigan was in a major economic crisis of a new kind

The symptoms have been clear for years Manufacturing employment, the traditional core of our economy, is hemorrhaging Our largest employers — GM, Ford, Chrysler and much of the automotive supply chain — are losing market share and their investment grade credit rating

Soon, some may be facing bankruptcy We're tops in the nation for unemployment — and dead last when it comes to forming new companies

The state budget is structured to produce a chronic billion-dollar plus deficit every year, while the political system seems paralyzed and the politicians unable to do anything about it

We're in serious trouble We've had tough times in the past, yes But today's crisis is quite unlike what we've faced before It is the result of complex and widespread changes in the worldwide economy — think of outsourcing and offshoring jobs to China and India as just the start

The causes are far deeper than the usual cyclical changes in the economy, as a result, this crisis will not be resolved merely by an upturn in the domestic business cycle and a few more domestic auto sales someday

These facts are finally beginning to penetrate even the thick walls of denial put up by Lansing's political class Take Gov Jennifer Granholm, without a doubt the most gifted political communicator Michigan has seen in many years

My sense is that her re-election strategy (she's up next year) has been to run as Ms Congeniality This means she intended to try to slide through the recurrent budget problems, cut deals with the GOP-controlled Legislature where possible and generally argue that while things may be tough

just now, she's doing the best she can

But the crisis has caught up with her careful, cautious planning As anybody who heard the governor's speech at the Mackinac Island policy gathering (I wasn't there, but I read the text and have talked to plenty of people who were in the room), she didn't fudge this time around

The governor made it clear that the biggest issue in Michigan is responding to the crisis, right now, and she talked about how vital it was to invest in Michigan's economic future via the \$2 billion bond proposal she wants to put on a statewide ballot later this year

So what are the Republicans in the Legislature doing? Slow walking, that's what, doing just barely enough to avoid being labeled as obstructionists, but making sure nothing significant gets done before 2006

That's to set up Richard De Vos, Amway heir and near-certain Republican nominee for governor, to proclaim that Granholm has done nothing to resolve Michigan's economic crisis, that he's an experienced businessman, that he has a plan you get the picture

Even if that were true, Michigan can't wait Personally, I think the governor should be telling the Republicans to follow, lead or get the hell out of the way I think she should be talking about \$5 billion for her bond program, not a measly \$2 billion

And I think she needs to be much, much more hard-edged, bold and comprehensive in proposing a strategy to tackle Michigan's crisis than she has been We're in major trouble, and we can't afford to fool around

Incidentally, I think that positioning a "bond" as the remedy for our crisis is making a basic linguistic mistake Nobody associates the word "bond" with "crisis" The solution to this crisis is a serious restructuring plan, and the word emergency probably needs to be used Often

Mark my words From now until the next statewide election in November 2006, Michigan politics and policy are bound to center around our present economic crisis Like it or not, both parties will be obliged to address it — and they better do so realistically

My friend, Mark Murray, now president of Grand Valley State University, offers another interesting historic parallel He notes that May 5, 1959, was the date when Michigan suffered another symbolic financial and political crisis payless paydays for state government employees, thanks to another financial crisis during which the politicians couldn't agree

History always repeats itself, but seldom quite as neatly as this

Painful as it may be, experts say not to interfere with nature's course

The circle of life is painful to watch A couple of weeks ago, I buried six wild bunnies in my back yard I don't ever want to do that again It was a thrill to watch them wriggle out of the nest in search of milk from their mother, but that joy quickly turned to sadness when my sister and I discovered them huddled together and lifeless

We aren't sure if the mother was run over by a car — or if she was feeding them and they drowned during a downpour in the middle of the night Either way, the experts say not to interfere with nature I didn't That's what makes it so painful I can't help but feel that maybe if I had taken them into the

house and fed them with an eye dropper, they might have survived

"We get calls in spring and fall about people finding babies," said Tim Patino, a Plymouth resident who serves on the board of the Great Lakes Rabbit Sanctuary in Whittaker "A man recently called about two bunnies that had fallen through a grate over a window well I told him to pull them out of there and

release them in the morning or night, not during the day when they could be attacked

Patino would never bring them into the home he shares with two domestic rabbits adopted through the Rabbit Sanctuary Although the nonprofit doesn't take in wild rabbits, it is available to answer questions at (734) 461-1726

"I'd contact the wildlife rehabilitators," Patino said "Bringing them in is not a good option because wild animals carry disease If any animal is hurt, contact a veterinarian A lot of them will take care of them, but then you have to get them back into the wild

Amita McCrane suggests waiting to see if the mother returns One of the pieces of advice she gives when answering the Friends of Wildlife helpline for cottontail rabbits is to place twigs on a nest in a tic tac toe pattern to see if it's disturbed For more information, call

(734) 670-1407 For squirrels, possums, raccoons, woodchuck, deer, fox, turtles and snakes, call (734) 913-9843 The help lines receive about 500 phone calls a year The rabbit birthing season runs from April 1 until October Friends of Wildlife is licensed through the Department of Natural Resources to rehabilitate and release animals into the wild whenever possible Even with the training volunteers receive every spring only 10 percent of orphaned baby bunnies survive

"A mother rabbit does not stay with her nest and visits twice a day to feed If you find a baby and it can hop, it does not need rehabbing," McCrane said "Only if we really think that mom has been killed do we recommend rehabilitation Almost every cat caught rabbit will die That's why they have five litters a year Life expectancy is only about one year in the wild They're a prey animal"

If you do find baby bunnies in your back yard, as I did McCrane's advice is to tie up your dog My Irish wolfhound, Shamrock, never realized the bunnies were there even though he's a sight hound Squirrels frequently run right by him without a worry "Lots of times a mother will have a nest in the middle of a yard, where it's safer Lots choose yards with dogs to keep prey away," McCrane said

Walk outdoors these days and you'll think you're indoors, especially if you're stepping onto a patio that has been decked out in the latest furniture fashions.

The patio isn't the only outdoor space that has a new look and feel. Decks and porches are also becoming areas where you can entertain, relax and enjoy, according to Jerry Wilkinson, manager of Jimmies Rustics in Birmingham.

SO MUCH LIKE INDOORS

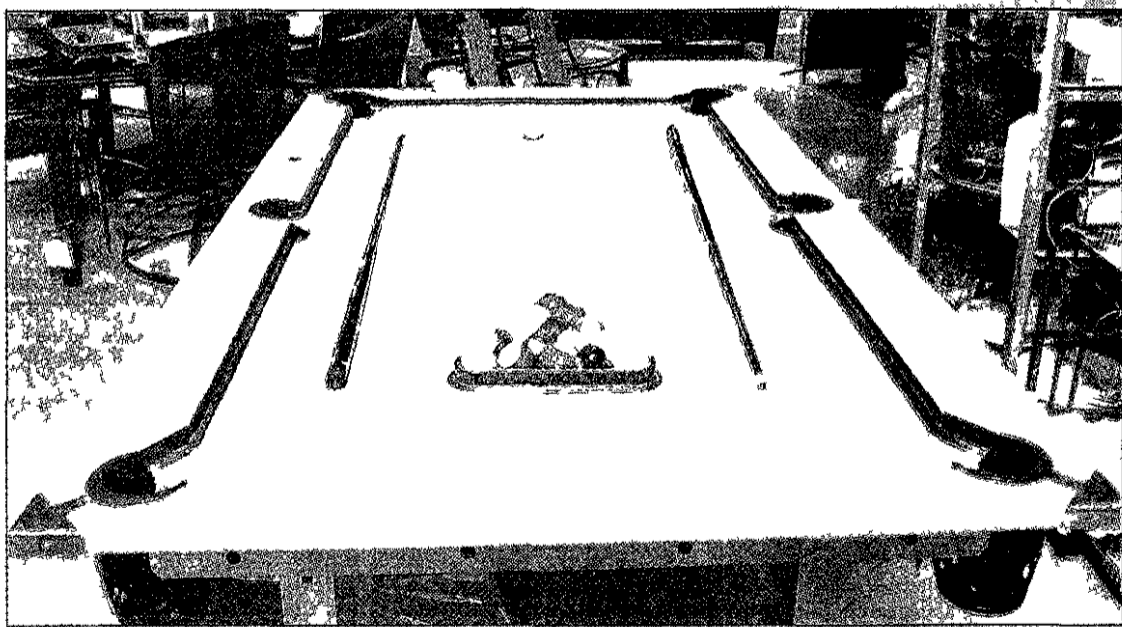

Organizing a garden walk isn't always as easy as you might think.

It seems like every year it gets more difficult for many of the local clubs to find new homes and gardeners who are willing to clean up their yards in a hurry and fill them with colorful perennials.

"A lot of people have lawns and foundation plants, but they don't have the gardens," said Georgia Randinitis, president of the Trailwood Garden Club in Plymouth. "Others may not want people walking through their yards."

But the club always manages to get beautiful yards for the walk.

their yard, many have perennials that were given to them by family members or friends, or some have ponds," Randinitis said.

One of the gardeners has more than 100 hostas in his yard. Two of the gardeners belong to the garden club,

another was on last year's walk.

Randinitis drove down Harvey one day, looking for gardens for the walk. "They always have really nice yards on Harvey," she

said. She left two notes for homeowners, and one of those homeowners responded and wanted to be on the walk.

"These are not estate gardens," Randinitis said of this year's gardens. "These are very doable gardens where people can get an idea." Today these yards are all shade. Everybody once had a sun garden, but now the trees have grown and now everybody has an older garden," Randinitis said. "It's a progression of your yard."

The walk is the only fund-raiser for the Trailwood club. The club features speakers at its monthly meetings and volunteers plant flowers in the Old Village and downtown Plymouth. The club participates in the Festival of Trees. Trailwood donated trees for schools and \$2,000 to Plymouth Township.

Here are some of the gardens:

Eugene and Justina McNamara on Spicer Drive. Last year all the garden beds were combined and redesigned to relocate plants that had outgrown their site. Beds include herbs, irises, peonies, ferns, daisies and other flowers.

All plants have been collected from family members and friends. Old birdhouses add a nice attraction to the garden, and provide a haven to sparrows and hummingbirds.

Evelyn and John Olszewski of Hillside Drive. After the couple moved to the home in December 1982, iris (Evelyn's favorite flower) was the first plant put in the following spring. Since that time the garden has been a work in progress with most of the changes taking place in the last five years. John has developed a love for growing orchids. The couple's goal is to have color for spring, summer and fall.

Karen Hyland on South Harvey. Hyland took what she calls her gardening "addiction" a step further when she became an advanced master gardener and started gardening professionally.

Hyland's gardens are described as an eclectic mix of specimen trees, unique collection of perennials and discarded plant material. Stroll

waterproof, meaning you can not only take it to the pool, you

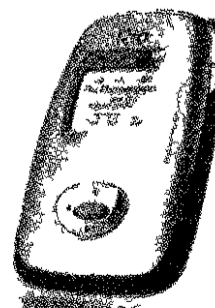
Unfortunately, the included earbuds sound pretty crummy, especially when you move

What's more, you can schedule these recordings to occur automatically, much the same way you program a VCR. Just make sure you leave the Radio YourWay LX in a spot where reception is good, otherwise you may end up with nothing but static.

"And there are hundreds of fabric colors and prints from which to choose for furniture coverings, cushions and pillows. There are so many options that we can accommodate just about anybody's personal taste."

Once all-weather materials became available, designers were able to create pieces similar in style to those found in the home, Wilkinson said. As an example, synthetic wicker furniture that looks just like the real stuff is now available for outdoor use.

FURNITURE DRIES QUICKLY

One producer, Lloyd/Flanders in Menominee, Mich., makes "wicker" on a loom with a material made of paper and wood that covers ultra-thin stainless steel rods. The sheets of wicker-like fabric, which is available in a variety of colors, are then fashioned over aluminum frames for couches, chairs, ottomans, rockers, tables and other pieces. Fabric cushions and pillows cover the furniture.

Acrylic fabrics that don't hold water are now available. They also resist fading by the sun and stains," said Wilkinson.

Wilkinson said that pillows and cushions are stuffed by acrylic fibers that dry quickly. "The new fabrics available are unlike other materials that soak up water like a sponge," Wilkinson said.

According to Viseel, the new deep-seating collections replace sling chairs - fabric material attached to the chair's sides or front and back. "For the last 10 to 15 years, sling seating was popular because it was comfortable and the fabric dried quickly," Viseel said. "Furniture choices now available for the outdoors allow people to be as comfortable as they are when they sit on the couches and chairs in their home."

In addition to synthetic wicker pieces, treated natural woods, such as teak and cherry, offered in a variety of stains, are also making their way into the furniture selections available for the outdoors. These wood pieces are available with carved legs and ornate trims for more traditional styles, as well as straight lines for a con-

temporary look.

Viseel said that in addition to the switch to "real" furniture for the outdoors, customers are discarding glass-topped tables for the new marble and faux stone varieties now on the market. "Prior to three years ago, glass-topped tables accounted for 80 to 90 percent of the market. Now the demand for these tables is less than 50 percent," he said.

Marble, faux marble, cultured slate (synthetic slate-like material) and synthetic stone, in a multitude of color choices, are now popular. These attractive table tops are more durable and require less upkeep.

In addition to the beauty and comfort of today's fine furniture for the outdoors, sitting around on the patio or deck can be even more appealing with the multitude of accessories available. Fireplaces and pits have become a "must" for the well-dressed outdoor space.

And they don't have to be small in size. Jimmies Rustics sells an 8- by 5-1/2- by 4-foot "traditional" fireplace with a hearth that burns wood or natural gas. Stainless steel cover-

ings over the chimney prevent water from entering the fireplace.

Another important accessory is the table or floor lamp. "These have water repelling shades, covers over the light bulbs and outdoor electric cords making them a safe addition to outdoor groupings," Wilkinson said.

Defining outdoor seating areas are screened-in gazebos and expansive cantilever umbrellas. This type of umbrella, which expands to almost 12-feet in diameter, is hung from a stand and can be tilted to any angle. The stand is filled with 500 pounds of pea gravel, which stabilizes it and makes it sturdy enough to withstand strong winds.

Outdoor living spaces will soon take on the look of home even more with the addition of a pool table. The table is made of aluminum with resin bumpers and a treated acrylic bed.

Other outdoors accessories on the horizon are televisions and other electronics, as well as rugs that "drain" (and not hold) water. "Current floor coverings do not have this capability," Wilkinson said.

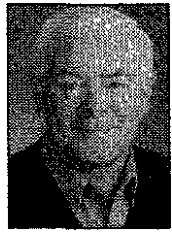

What is the repair company's responsibility?

I received an e-mail from Louis who asked me a great question. He writes "Maybe you can give me an idea of a repairman's responsibility. I had an Asko dishwasher which was purchased in 1991. The lower seal on the door was leaking, so I called what I thought was a reputable appliance repair service. I paid for a gasket up front because they had to order it. They sent out a repairman who took about two hours to replace the gasket. He did not disconnect the power. He checked to see if it was functioning and all was well, but upon reassembling, he did something to cause the breaker to flip. I reset the breaker, but he could no longer make the dishwasher work, even though it had power

"I was asked to pay the \$79 service call, which I told him I would pay when the repair company got it running again. The following day a different repairman checked the unit and I was informed that it needed a \$250 circuit board. I said I would speak to their supervisor. At this point I could see no point in paying the \$79 service charge plus three hours of labor plus a \$250 circuit board for a 14-year-old dishwasher. Presently I have paid them nothing but the \$19 and change for the gasket. "Since that time I have purchased a new Asko dishwasher. I had a working quality dishwasher with matching wood front panel, albeit leaking. I considered it worth fixing with a \$20 gasket. "Am I being unreasonable in thinking that they owe me more than just walking away from an unfortunate situation?"

Dear Louis, Let me start with the last sentence of your e-mail. I do not believe that the repair company owes you anything. I realize that you ended up buying a new dishwasher because of this service call, but I also

must consider that the circuit board may have gone bad or failed, having reached its life expectancy, at that very moment.

I know that you called them to repair a leaking door - which means it was leaking for some time.

Water leaks splashing or spraying onto electrical wires can also damage a circuit board. I cannot criticize the repair service man because a part became defective while he was holding it in his hand.

This sort of thing happens when you're in the service business.

Even with the good knowledgeable service person, it happens, but only infrequently and unfortunately, it is a part of doing business.

The company you called on is now out the dollars they would have received from you for repairs. They certainly didn't make any money off you and they lost a few dollars in wages, but they also understand that being in business is not always taking, but that sometimes you have to give a little.

From your explanation of the visit by the first service technician, it appears he may have been inexperienced working on Asko dishwashers.

As you know Asko is a special brand of appliances and one which can present problems to the untrained technician.

It is important when calling for service to ask if that company is trained by the factory on repairs of the product you own. You now have the same brand product you just removed from the house, so I trust you felt it gave you good service for the past 14 years.

I'll bet you also know who to call for factory service should you require it now.

Alas, you'll pay a big premium for the player's unique radio-recording capabilities. The 256MB and 512MB models sell for \$200 and \$250, respectively. I should note that neither the MP120 nor the Radio YourWay support copyright-protected digital music purchased from online services like Musicmatch, Napster and Wal-Mart. If you want that capability (or just a lot more storage space), consider a play-

er with a built-in hard drive. One of my new favorites is the Rio Carbon (www.noaudio.com), which gives the beloved Apple iPod Mini a run for the money in the sex-appeal department.

The gorgeous little player runs for 20 hours on a battery charge and comes with a voice recorder. The 5GB model sells for \$200, but there's a \$20 mail-in rebate available through July 31.

Admittedly, the Carbon's interface isn't quite as slick as the iPod's, but it's very easy to learn and navigate - an important consideration when you're

dealing with gigabytes' worth of music. What's more, the Carbon can play music purchased from a variety of online stores. And an upcoming software update will enable it to work with subscription-download services like Napster To Go and Yahoo! Unlimited.

These way-cool services let you fill your MP3 to the brim

for a small monthly fee. I'll cover them in greater detail in a future column.

During his daily walks across St. Peter's Square to Pope John Paul's chambers, he shook hands with the pilgrims who traveled from all over the world to see the Vatican. He even took pictures of them, if requested. "He has a warmth," said McClory.

McClory speaks from personal experience, as he was a student in Rome for five years. There, he got to know both the cardinal and Pope John Paul.

He knew that the cardinal loved to relax at the end of a busy day by playing Mozart on his classical piano. Ratzinger looked forward to returning to Bavaria to live with his 81-year-old brother to build on his collection of writings while immersing himself in the music he loves, he said. But, this was not to be.

Instead Ratzinger was assigned to coordinate the details of Pope John Paul's funeral in April, speak at the funeral Mass, and direct the conclave of cardinals that quickly elected him as pope.

As he saw the votes going in his favor, he told the cardinal beside him that his head was under the guillotine. The cardinal replied that Christ's message is always very clear. "Follow me." And so he accepted his new office as pope of the Roman Catholic world.

A TRANSITIONARY PERIOD

McClory spoke from his office on the seventh floor of the Chancery building. The building stands in the heart of Detroit on Washington Boulevard, which in its heyday looked like a boulevard in Paris. Inside, it still displays the opulence of the Detroit neighborhood's past glory with its expansive, elegantly furnished lounge and exquisite conference room.

The young, vibrant president of the archdiocese is a Royal Oak native and former member of the Shrine of the Little Flower parish in Royal Oak. He practiced civil law before abandoning his career to become a priest and then quickly rising in church ranks. Along with his duties as chancellor, McClory teaches canon law at Sacred Heart Seminary in Detroit.

McClory refers to Pope Benedict XVI as "the humble genius - a still, small voice in a very noisy world." He says the new pope is one of the most brilliant scholars in the Church. "He analyzes situations quickly and sees all the implications. He is a shining theological star."

Because of these qualities, and the fact that he was Pope John Paul's longtime immediate adviser, McClory maintains that the cardinals of the conclave quickly recognized him as the right man to head the Roman Catholic Church.

Ratzinger has also written 20 books and headed up a radio show to discuss Catholic policy.

According to McClory, however, we will see little change in church policy during his papacy. Priests will still be men. Women will have only secondary roles in the church. And birth control will still be by the "natural method" or abstinence. He cited as reasons that Ratzinger, 78, is a "transitional pope," and was the policy maker and enforcer of Pope John Paul.

MUSICAL FAMILY

McClory said that the young Ratzinger grew up in a musical family in Bavaria, a very Catholic area of Germany. When World War II broke out in Germany, his family was on the run.

Eventually the Nazis caught up with the Ratzingers and forced young Joseph to join the Hitler Youth. When an officer asked the Hitler Youth boys what their greatest dream was, many replied "fighting for the Fuhrer." Joseph, on the other hand, replied, "I would like to be a Roman Catholic priest," a statement that could have gotten him killed. He was later conscripted into the German army. At the first opportunity he defected. He was captured and freed by the Allies.

The new pope accepted his mission with the simple words, "I am a humble worker in the Lord's vineyard."

Now, time will tell what his legacy will be, said McClory.

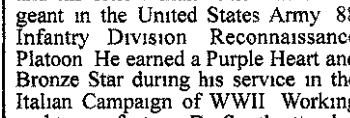

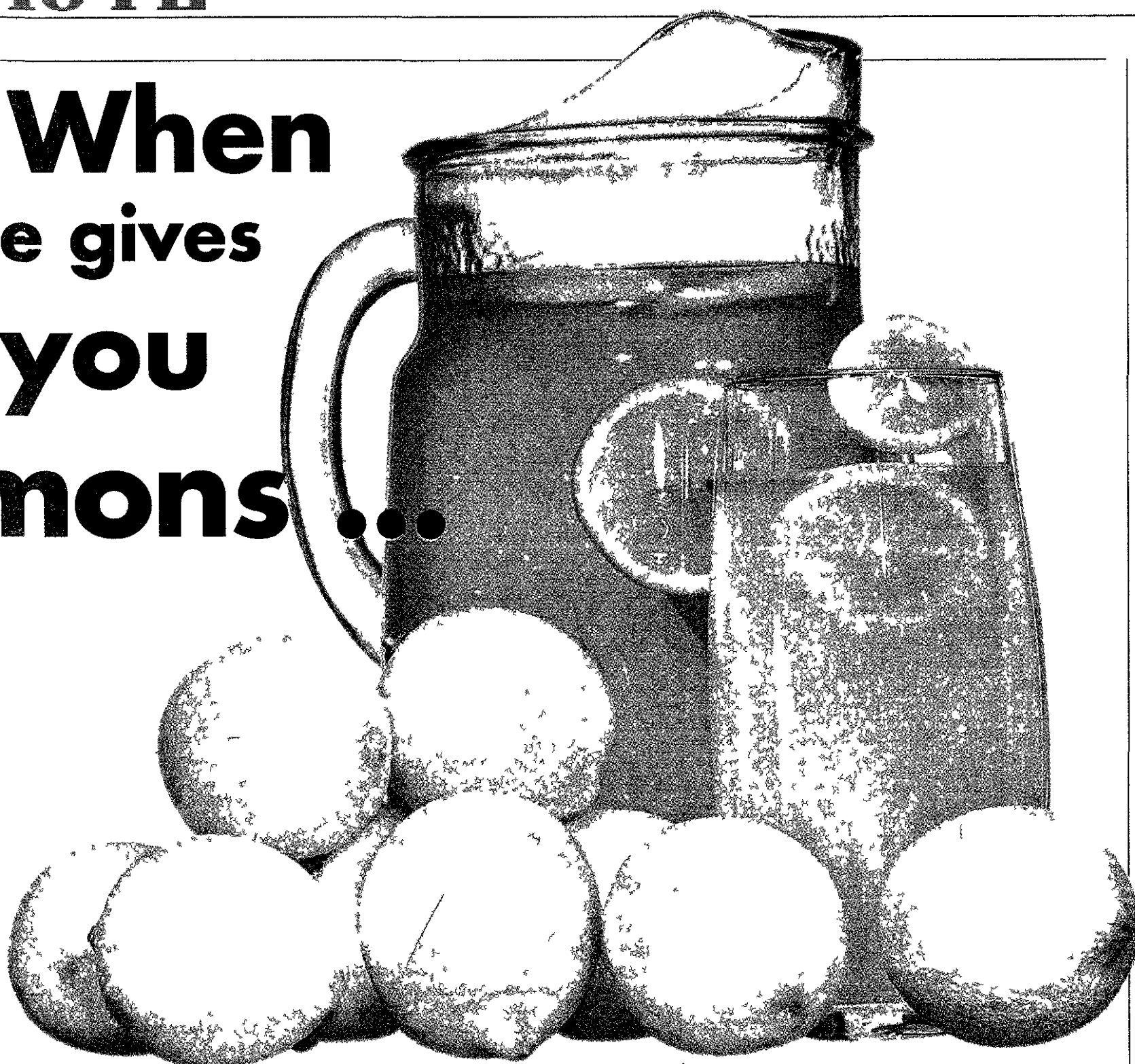

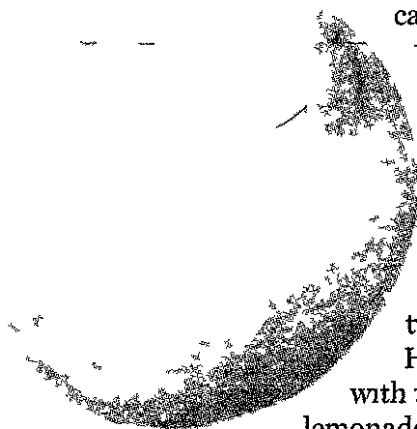
Fruit syrups blend summer flavors

A simple variation on a classic theme can be a welcome refresher on a hot, thirsty day. Lemonade and other fruit flavors mix and match pleasantly.

Trying out different combinations can be as easy as filling a glass or pitcher with your basic cool drinks and adding a splash or two of fruit syrup. Don't forget to add a berry or two, or mint leaves, for garnish.

Here are some suggestions, starting with the most simple, classic homemade lemonade (which you can also vary by adjusting ingredients to taste).



RASPBERRY LEMONADE	BASIC LEMONADE
2 tablespoons raspberry syrup	6 lemons
1 cup lemonade	6 cups cold water
Ice	1 cup sugar
Optional: 3 or 4 fresh or frozen raspberries	Juice the lemons, creating about 1 cup of juice. In a large pitcher, mix juice, water and sugar. Stir lemonade well to thoroughly dissolve sugar, and serve over ice.
Fill a tall glass with ice. Add lemonade and syrup, and stir. Garnish, if desired, with floating raspberries. Makes 1 serving.	Makes 7 to 8 cups.

Spanish wines are a stampede of great value

Spanish wines continue to be among the best values in European wines. If you're bored with chardonnay and cabernet, seek out some wines from Spain.

RIOJA

The Rioja area gets its name from the Rio (River) Oja, a tributary of the Ebro River, flowing through the center of the region. Diversity of soil types and climate create three grape-growing sub-zones: Rioja Alta with an Atlantic climate, Rioja Baja with Mediterranean-Continental climate and a mixture of Atlantic and Mediterranean influences in the Rioja Alavesa.

Tempranillo, a red grape, makes up 61 percent of the vineyards and is regarded as the authentic variety of Rioja. Other varieties of prominence include garnacha (grenache), graciano, mazuelo and the white grape viura.

Although wine has been made in the Rioja for thousands of years, in 1780 the practice of aging wine in barrels began and propelled Rioja to the forefront. Over the modern era of winemaking, Rioja embraced new techniques to create brighter, more fruit-forward styles especially pleasing to the modern palate.

CAMPO VIEJO

Overseeing 1,000 acres of vines in the heart of the Rioja Alta region, Campo Viejo is a regional leader. At the highest point of the estate, on a hill overlooking the Ebro Valley lies the underground cellar of Campo Viejo's new bodega (winery).

At 23 feet underground, 70,000 oak barrels and 6 million bottles rest free from air currents or temperature changes.

Talk about energy efficient! Subterranean and covered by vegetation, the bodega enjoys the advantages of traditional wine cellars including stable temperature, humidity and steady ventilation - all occurring naturally.

WHAT TO BUY

■ 2001 Campo Viejo Crianza (\$10) was aged 12 months in a combination of American and French oak. Deeply colored and smooth with dark berry flavors, it's a good accompaniment to a tapa of olives stuffed with cheese, readily available in cans in markets such as Trader Joe's.

■ 1999 Campo Viejo Reserva (\$13) aged two years in oak before being bottled. Berries and vanilla dominate the aromas and flavors in a wine that harmonizes with grilled or barbecued meats.

Throw a fish on the grill

Just remember grilling does not have to mean meat. Substitute fish and some colorful vegetables, and you'll never miss the meat. Some experts advise people with heart disease, or at high risk for this condition, to eat two servings a week of fish highest in omega-3 fats, like salmon, herring, rainbow trout, sardines, albacore tuna and mackerel.

Marinate chunks of tuna in lime juice, soy sauce, garlic, basil and a few red pepper flakes. The marinade will keep the fish moist as it cooks. Only 15 minutes of marinating is necessary. After marinating, thread the tuna on skewers for grilling. In addition to the tuna, add big cherry tomatoes, onion wedges and cucumber. Cucumbers are usually eaten raw, but cooking them can bring out their often-overlooked citrus flavor. To further keep the lean tuna moist while grilling, cut the cucumber into crescents and nestle the fish between a cucumber crescent and a wedge of onion - a position that helps protect the tuna from excess heat.

Use tomatoes and cucumbers that are firm, with smooth, brightly-colored skin. Avoid those that have soft spots or are shriveled. Store tomatoes at room temperature. Whole cucumbers may be stored in the refrigerator, washed and in a plastic bag, up to 10 days. Wash them thoroughly just before using.

Since these kebabs only get better when their flavors meld overnight, they can even be made ahead. They are good at room temperature. If you have leftovers, take the tuna off the skewers and

serve it on a bed of chopped romaine lettuce for a chunky, grilled tuna salad.

TUNA KEBABS

- 1/4 cup fresh lime juice (about 2 limes)
- 1 tablespoon reduced sodium soy sauce
- 1 garlic clove minced
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh basil leaves
- 1/2 teaspoon red pepper flakes
- 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground pepper
- 1/4 cup extra virgin olive oil
- 1 pound fresh tuna, cut in 12 chunks
- 1 large cucumber, peeled, seeded and sliced
- 8 large cherry tomatoes
- 1 medium red onion, halved vertically and cut into crescents

Preheat grill or broiler.

In a glass or other non-reactive bowl, combine the lime juice, soy sauce, garlic, basil, pepper flakes, pepper and oil. Add the tuna to the marinade, turning to coat. Cover and marinate up to 1 hour, turning tuna chunks occasionally.

Using four 10-inch metal or (well-soaked) bamboo skewers, assemble the kebabs, alternating the fish with pieces of cucumber, onion and tomato.

Broil the kebabs 5 minutes. Turn and cook until the fish is firm to the touch and the vegetables browned, about 5 minutes more. Do not overcook or the tuna will be dry. Serve either hot or at room temperature with hot steamed rice.

Serve sesame-chili chicken with watermelon salsa

The gingered watermelon salsa served with this spicy chicken dish is a creative way to conjure up a fresh taste of summer that will satisfy the palate and do no damage to the waistline.

The low-fat recipe is from the Summer Cookbook selection in the June issue of *Cooking Light* magazine. If the cook sensibly prefers to shorten time spent in the kitchen, an editor's note points out that, for ease of preparation, you could buy a container of cut-up watermelon from the produce section of your supermarket, then all you have to do is cut the chunks into small pieces. Note: While the liquid from the salsa is tasty, you might want to use a slotted spoon when you serve the salsa.

Serve the chicken over a bed of jasmine or basmati rice.

SESAME-CHILI CHICKEN WITH GINGERED WATERMELON SALSA

For the chicken:

- 2 tablespoons low sodium soy sauce
- 1 to 2 tablespoons chili sauce with garlic
- 1 tablespoon dark sesame oil
- four 6 ounce skinless boneless chicken breast halves

For the salsa:

- 2 cups diced seeded watermelon
- 1/4 cup diced yellow bell pepper
- 2 tablespoons thinly sliced green onions

- 1 tablespoon chopped fresh cilantro
- 1 teaspoon grated peeled fresh ginger
- 2 teaspoons mirin (sweet rice wine)
- 1 teaspoon fresh lime juice
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 1 jalapeno pepper seeded and minced

Remaining ingredients:

- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- Cooking spray
- Cilantro sprigs optional
- Lime wedges optional

To prepare chicken: Combine soy sauce, chili sauce and sesame oil in a large zip-top plastic bag. Add chicken to bag, seal and marinate in refrigerator for one hour, turning bag occasionally.

Prepare grill

To prepare salsa: Combine watermelon, bell pepper, onions, cilantro, ginger, mirin, lime juice, salt and jalapeno, cover and chill until ready to serve.

Remove chicken from marinade, discard marinade. Sprinkle chicken evenly with 1/4 teaspoon salt. Place chicken on a grill rack coated with cooking spray. Grill 6 minutes on each side or until done. Remove chicken from grill, let stand 5 minutes. Cut chicken diagonally across grain into thin slices, serve with salsa. Garnish with cilantro sprigs and lime wedges, if desired.

Oregano can add flavor to many foods, including pasta

It's the year of oregano cooking

Many people think of pizza when they think of oregano, for a good reason. Oregano has a strong natural affinity for tomatoes. And it is an indispensable element of Italian cooking.

The International Herb Association has chosen oregano as the herb of the year. Oregano was almost unknown in the United States before soldiers returned from fighting in Italy during World War II, bringing with them a taste for pizza. And it wouldn't be pizza without oregano.

Sometimes called wild marjoram, both oregano and marjoram are members of the mint family. Oregano, Greek for "joy of the mountain," is not as sweet as marjoram. It has a stronger, more pungent flavor and smell. Oregano not only smells good and tastes good, it has properties that protect our health, too.

Every herb and spice is distinctive in the particular phytochemicals it contains. Natural plant substances, called phytochemicals, have been shown to have cancer-fighting properties. Hundreds of phytochemicals have been identified, each highly specialized in the way it can protect health.

A recent U.S. Department of Agriculture study shows that oregano offers the most antioxidant activity of all herbs examined. 42 times more antioxidant activity than

apples, 30 times more than potatoes and 12 times more than oranges. Oregano contains quercetin, which has strong antioxidant properties and may be especially protective against breast, ovarian and endometrial cancers.

When choosing oregano, look for bright-green, fresh-looking bunches with no sign of wilting or yellowing. Refrigerate for up to three days, ideally in a container with a small amount of water and covered loosely in a plastic bag.

Dried Mediterranean oregano is available both crumbled and powdered at most supermarkets. As with all dried herbs, oregano should be stored in a cool, dark place for no more than six months.

PASTA WITH FRESH TOMATOES AND HERBS

3 medium fresh tomatoes

- chopped
- 4 ounces feta cheese crumbled
- 1/2 cup kalamata olives chopped
- 1/4 cup red onion finely chopped
- 1/4 cup fresh basil chopped
- 2 tablespoons fresh oregano chopped
- 2 large garlic cloves minced
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 12 ounces whole wheat penne freshly cooked
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste
- Grated Parmesan cheese to taste

In a bowl large enough to hold the pasta, combine first eight ingredients. Add freshly cooked pasta and toss well. Season with pepper to taste. Top with Parmesan cheese. Serve immediately.

Try it with char-grilled rib-eye steaks or serve it with a plate of aged cheeses and crusty bread.

WINECAM CREATED

A group of concerned wine consumers across Michigan has banded together to form WineCAM (Wine Consumers Across Michigan) for the purpose of reminding Michigan's government and wine industry that they need to serve the interests of the state's wine consumers - not the other way around.

Since the U.S. Supreme Court

declared Michigan and New York's wine laws banning direct-to-consumer wine shipping unconstitutional last month, WineCAM organizers learned that Gov. George Pataki proposed a bill to allow direct shipment of wine into and out of the state, meaning New Yorkers could see lower prices for California wines and state vintners could see higher profits.

WineCAM organizers wonder why Michigan's Gov. Jennifer Granholm has not acted similarly in their interest and that of the state's wine industry. If you have similar concerns, check out WineCAM's Web site www.winecam.org and join the group.

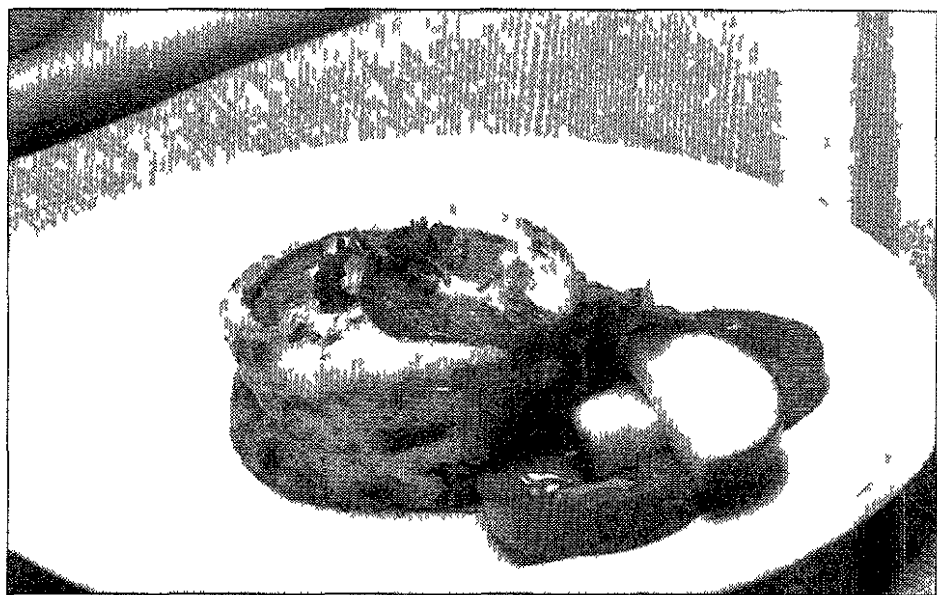

Flip a frittata with leek and zucchini

For warm weather entertaining, I like colorful dishes that can be made ahead.

I favor those flexible enough to accommodate spur-of-the-moment gatherings and variations based on what looks good at the market or happens to be on hand. Such dishes are easily stretched by adding more of something or by doubling the recipe, and can be served lukewarm or at room temperature.

Frittatas are my favorite choice, easily fitting all these requirements. They can also be served as a one-dish meal, encompassing generous servings of vegetables, cheese and even grains, like rice or pasta, or become part of a larger spread of dishes, from salads to grilled fish and kebabs. And a frittata can be easily packed and transported, to take to a potluck or picnic.

A good frittata uses a lavish amount of sauteed or roasted vegetables and just enough egg, or a combination of whole eggs and whites, to bind them together in a firm but moist cake. Herbs, fresh or dried, beautifully complement that mixture. Unless a family member or guest is lactose-intolerant, or avoids saturated fats or animal products, you can include grated Parmesan pecorino, or goat cheese whichever cheese best complements other ingredients.

If flipping a frittata intimidates you, use a skillet that can go into the oven or under the broiler to set the top and cook the frittata all the way through. Or, place a flat plate somewhat larger than the skillet upside down over the frittata and, firmly holding the skillet handle in one hand and firmly pressing the plate against the skillet, flip and slide the frittata onto the plate. Then slide it, browned side up, back into the skillet to lightly brown the other side. You can also try this recipe for individual frittatas baked in heatproof ramekins or custard cups.

ZUCCHINI AND LEEK FRITTATA

- Canola cooking spray
- 2 teaspoons extra virgin olive oil
- 1 medium red onion finely chopped
- 1 small leek thinly sliced
- 2 small zucchini (6 inches) thinly sliced
- 2 teaspoons dried oregano
- 3 large eggs
- 6 large egg whites or 1/4 cup liquid egg whites
- 2 tablespoons reduced fat (2 percent) milk
- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 1/4 cup chopped fresh basil
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- Pinch cayenne pepper
- 2 large plum tomatoes thinly sliced crosswise
- Minced flat leaf parsley for garnish (optional)

Place a rack in the center of the oven. Preheat the oven to 375° F. Coat 6 6-ounce heatproof

ramekins or custard cups generously with cooking oil spray and set aside. (For dishes holding more or less volume, count on enough to hold a total of 4/3 cups of egg mixture.)

Heat the oil in a medium non-stick skillet over medium-high heat. Sauté the onion until soft, 4 to 5 minutes. Mix in the leek, zucchini and oregano. Cook until the zucchini is just soft, about 4 minutes, stirring occasionally. Set the vegetables aside to cool.

In a large mixing bowl whisk the eggs, whites and milk to combine them. Mix in the vegetables, cheese, basil, salt and cayenne. Spoon the mixture into the prepared dishes, dividing it evenly. Arrange 2 tomato slices on the top of each frittata.

Set a baking sheet on the oven rack. Place the ramekins on the baking sheet. Bake 25 minutes or until the frittatas are puffed, browned and a knife inserted into the center comes out clean. Remove from the oven and let them sit 5 minutes. Unmold the frittatas and serve hot or let stand up to 2 hours to serve at room temperature. Garnish with parsley just before serving.

Makes 6 6-ounce ramekins or custard cups.

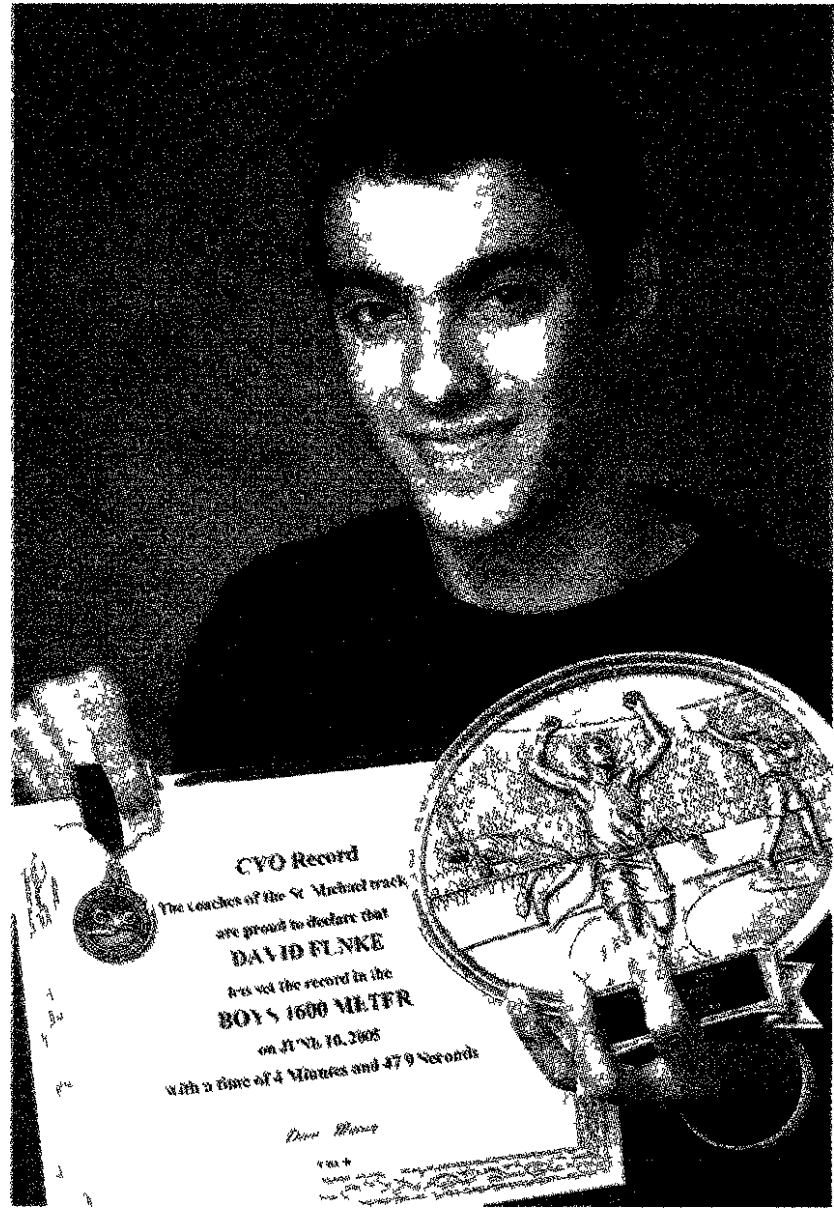

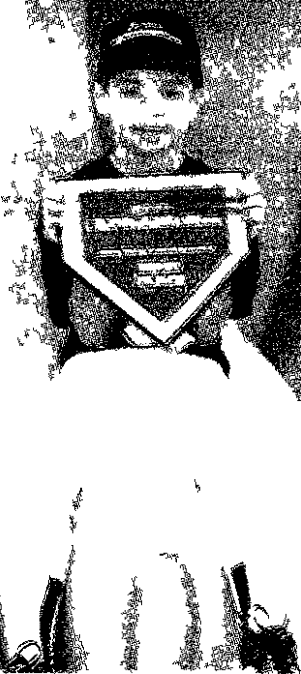

From McClumpha Park to Comerica Park — with a lot of practice in between.

That sums up the past month's baseball journey for 7-year-old Canton resident Dante Toppi, who was crowned the state champion in his age group in the Pitch, Hit & Run competition, a national skills contest that is sponsored by Major League Baseball.

To win the competition, Dante, who will be a third grader at Plymouth's All Saints Catholic School in the fall, out-hit, out-pitched and out-ran hundreds of 7- and 8-year-old players from throughout Michigan. The state finals were held Saturday at Comerica Park several hours before the Detroit Tigers' game against the San Francisco Giants. While the big stage may have been

intimidating to many elementary school-aged kids, it didn't faze Dante, who posted his best point totals in the three events in the shadow of the Tigers' huge scoreboard.

Being down on the field at Comerica Park was very inspirational for Dante, said Sally Toppi, Dante's mom. "He was probably the youngest kid out there, but he didn't seem nervous. He was very focused."

"Dante practiced every night — hitting baseballs and pitching — in our yard and at the park to get ready for this. He loves sports, but especially baseball."

As one of 30 national winners (there will be one for each of the 30 Major League teams), Dante may be eligible to compete for the national PH&R title, which will be held at Comerica Park the week of the All-Star game.

The top four kids in each age group get to compete during the week of the

All-Star game, Sally Toppi said. "All of the teams haven't finished their state competitions, so we don't know yet if Dante is one of the final four."

Dante's path to Comerica started at the Canton Sports Center, where he finished first in the local portion of the event. He then won the sectional event held in Dearborn Heights, which earned him a berth in the state finals.

Participants earned points by hitting a strike zone-sized target while pitching from 45 feet away, getting timed while running from second base to home plate, and hitting a ball off a tee (both distance and accuracy were measured).

"Dante is extremely fast, so he always did well in the running," his mom said. "But he won first place at Comerica Park because he hit the target with three of his six pitches. Most of the kids — even the older ones — had a hard time hitting the target with two pitches."

26th Father's Day Run draws 1,400

Since its inception in 1980, the Plymouth YMCA Father's Day Run has evolved from a small, family-oriented event to a "can't-miss" happening for avid runners in the metro Detroit area and beyond.

Greg Thomas, a resident of Cho, won the men's 2005 triple with a combined time of 58:53. The female triple champion is Rebekah Smeltzer, who resides in Monroe. Morency said the Father's Day Run would not have reached the heights it has without the assistance of many behind-the-scenes helpers. "We had over 100 volunteers and 30 local businesses pitch in to help us this year," said Morency. "One of our contributors, Dr. Tom Morris, has been sponsoring the triple for 11 years now."

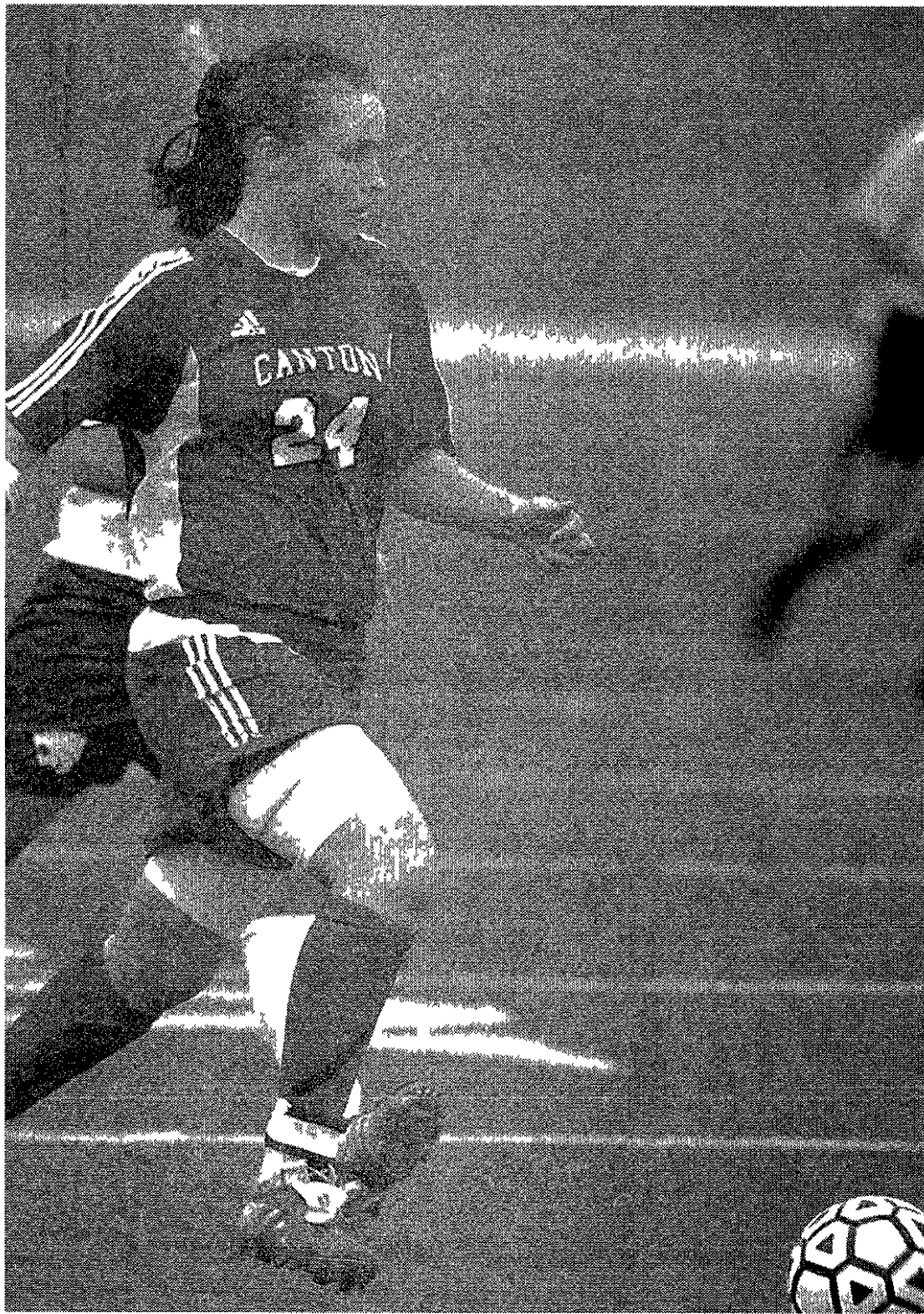
"And even though she only scored one goal, she helped us offensively quite a bit."

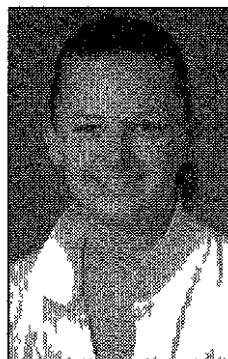

Fisher earned All-Conference honors and was named the team's co-MVP for the second consecutive year, as a freshman, she registered 30 goals.

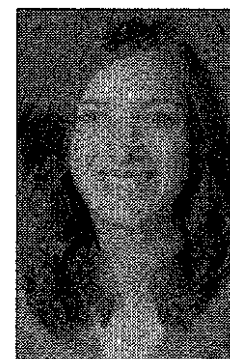

MHSAA is searching for whistle-blowers

Individuals interested in becoming a high school athletic game official for the 2005-06 school year now may register with the Michigan High School Athletic Association, and for the first time, new registrants and renewals will be accepted through the MHSAA Web site - mhsaa.com

Through July 1, Michigan's 12,000-plus game officials in 14 sports are urged to submit their applications. The July date is an important one, as it is the deadline for officials who wish to be listed in the MHSAA's annual printed Officials Directory.

"We always encourage officials to register before July 1, so they can be listed in the printed MHSAA Official's Directory," said Mark Uyl, MHSAA Assistant Director. "That is very beneficial for officials looking for work and schools looking for officials. Officials listed in the directory are also more visible candidates for approved association membership. Approved association benefits are numerous, so we encourage officials to either seek membership or be asked to join a local group well before the new school year begins."

Beginning with the 2005-06 school year, officials selected to work MHSAA post-season tournaments in basketball, football and wrestling will be required to be members of an

approved association. While early registration is heavily encouraged, new officials are free to register with the MHSAA any time during the year.

MHSAA registration fees are among the lowest in the nation.

A \$10 fee is charged for each sport an official wishes to work, and the processing fee is \$20.

Officials registered in 2004-05 will be assessed a late fee of \$20 for registration after July 1. The processing fee includes liability insurance coverage of up to \$1 million for officials while working contests involving MHSAA schools.

Registration for 2005-06 begins as the MHSAA comes off a year where through the addition of lacrosse, the total number of officials again topped the 12,000 mark, but registrations in all other sports were down.

The total of 12,084 registered officials for the just-completed school year ranks third overall. The all-time high came in 2003-04 with 12,268 registrants. Of this year's total, 206 were lacrosse officials.

Our recruiting efforts for new officials is an ongoing process, and this past year's statistics prove that we will be facing a lot of turnover in the future with the anticipated retirements of many officials, Uyl said. "We must continue to

promote the need for more individuals to become involved in officiating, and the recruitment, education and retention of new officials is a key to having younger folks ready when our veterans step down."

The MHSAA will continue to emphasize its efforts that allow high school students to become officials. The Legacy program allows 11th graders, 16 years of age and older, to officiate sub-varsity and junior high/middle school games with a mentor.

Twelfth graders, 17 and older, are also allowed to officiate sub-varsity and junior high/middle school contests without a mentoring official.

The changes made a few years ago in response to the concern that not enough high school students are being recruited into the officiating field through the Legacy Program, and that those who enter at that age tend to leave officiating shortly after graduating.

The 2005-06 school year will be the 14th for the Legacy program. Student officials will benefit from a waiver of the standard \$20 processing fee. Registration of \$10 per sport will be the only requirement. Last year, there were 68 students in the Legacy program.

"If every school and every officials association would deliver us just one young person each year, promoting officiating as a way to stay

active in sports beyond the high school playing days, we can keep our numbers strong," Uyl said. "But we also must remember that once we've recruited new officials, everyone - our officials association, our school administrators and coaches, and even spectators - must assist us in the retainment process by treating these officials - in fact, all officials - with respect."

There is an officials registration test, which is for first-time officials and officials not registered in the past year. The test consists of 75 questions derived from the MHSAA Officials Guidebook, which may be used during the open book test.

"The guidebook is a good reference that can answer many questions about the way the MHSAA operates," Uyl said. "We implemented this test as a way of insuring familiarity with the guidebook and to assure that new registrants are aware of the policies, practices and protocols expected of MHSAA officials."

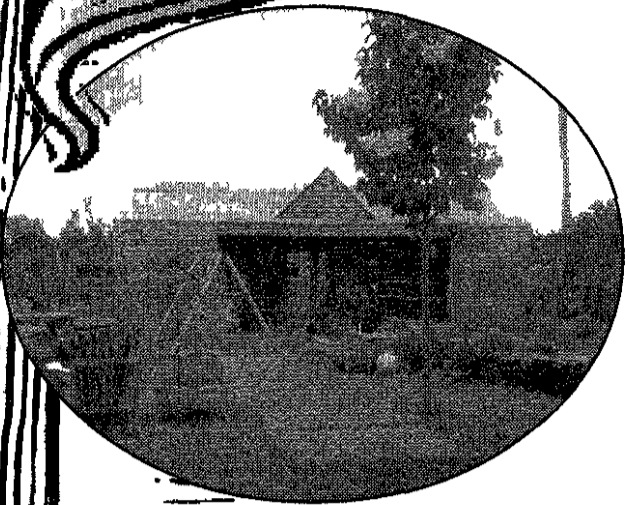

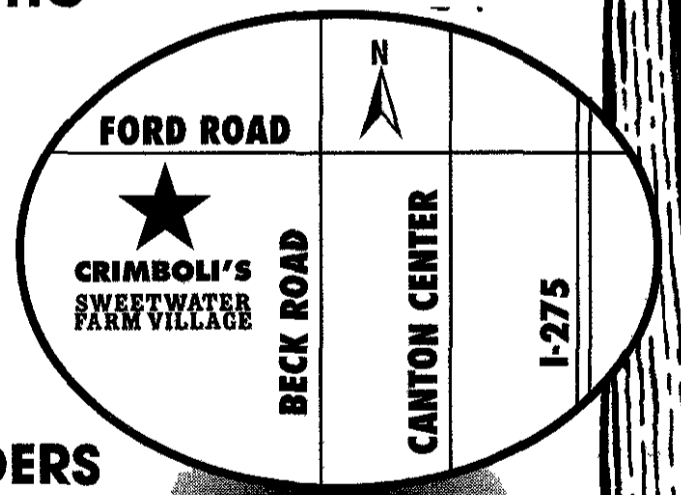

Bucks kick woes with 7-0 victory

The Michigan Bucks' minor league soccer team took out their frustrations Saturday night with a 7-0 win over the host Fort Wayne Fever in Premier Development League action.

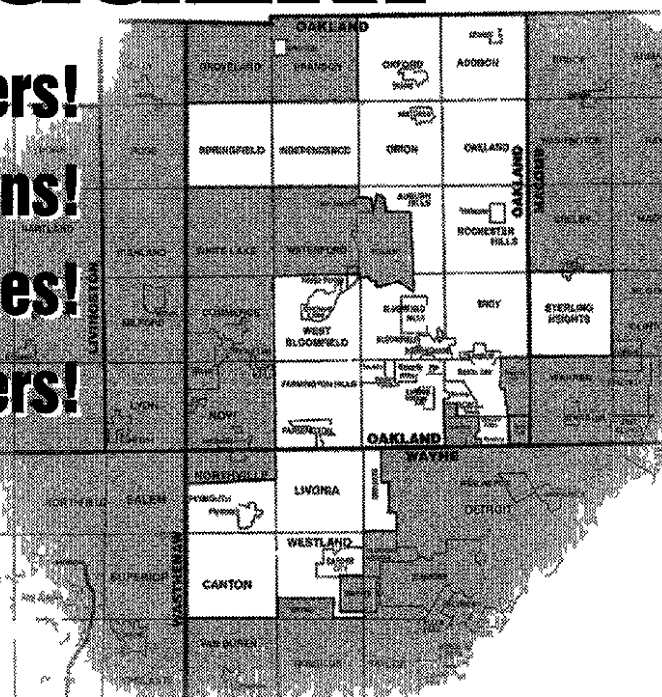

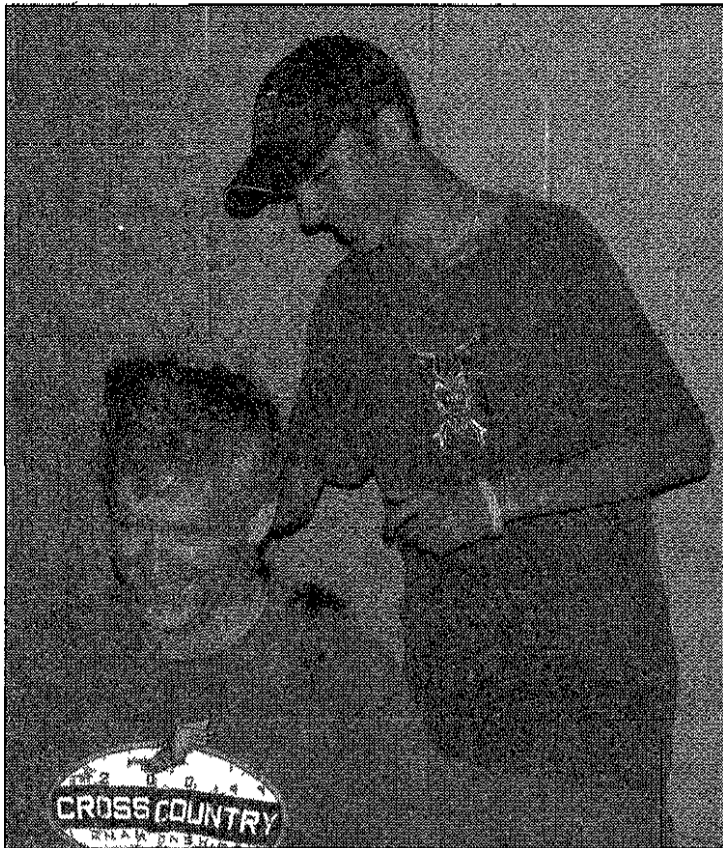

MHSAA participation record set

All-time records for participation in high school sports were broken by Michigan High School Athletic Association member schools across the state during the 2004-05 school year, topping the 300,000 mark for the first time.

Among all student-athletes, a total of 304,568 participants in sports in which the Association sponsors post-season tournaments during the past school year took part, smashing the 294,012 record set in 2002-03.

The girls numbers were record-setting for the third straight year - the total of 127,890 topping last year's mark of 124,978. Boys participation was also its highest ever, the 176,678 figure surpassing the previous high of 169,619 in 2002-03.

The totals count students once for each sport in which he or she participates, meaning students who are multiple-sport athletes are counted more than once.

The participation figures in MHSAA tournament sports for girls are up 22 percent since the 1994-95 school year. Boys are up 14 percent over the same time period, and overall participation is up 17 percent.

Volleyball continues to be the most popular sport for girls, with 21,564 participants in 2004-05, the sports third-highest total ever.

Girls sports hitting their all-time highs in participation last year for the second straight year were competitive cheer and soccer, while cross country, swimming and diving, and tennis all set new participation records.

The most popular boys sport continues to be football, with 44,253 participants last year.

Ice hockey set a new participation record in

2004-05 for the second straight year, and also setting marks were soccer and tennis.

Lacrosse, the newest MHSAA post-season tournament sport, had 3,032 male and 1,435 female participants.

Bowling saw increases in both genders in its second year, with 2,350 boys and 1,955 girls - a total addition of nearly 1,000 participants.

The participation figures are gathered annually from MHSAA member schools to submit to the National Federation of State High School Associations for compiling its national participation survey.

The results of the national survey from the 2000-01 school year to the present may be viewed on the NFHS Web site - www.nfhs.org. Nationwide results for 2004-05 will be available later this summer.

Foundation's scholarship program recognizes best and brightest

For 15 years the Canton Community Foundation has been helping local students realize their dream of attending college with its scholarship program. This year, the foundation recognized more than 30 students from Canton, Plymouth and Plymouth Township with scholarships.

The recipients received their awards at a ceremony last month at the Village Theater.

Many of the scholarships were provided directly by the foundation, while others were provided by local organizations and businesses. In total, the foundation granted out \$34,000 in scholarships to both graduating high school seniors and students already attending college. There were several new scholarships this year, including the \$500 Mans Lumber and Millwork Scholarship, \$300 Marvin Schulz Memorial Scholarship and the \$500 Canton Lions Club Scholarship.

It's all part of the foundation's goal of supporting higher education and helping students in the community prepare for a meaningful career, according to Canton Community Foundation President Joan Noricks.

"We have given out \$330,000 since the inception of the scholarship program in 1990. That is a powerful statement of what we're doing," she said.

A review committee, which included high school counselors, community members and one teacher, chose the scholarship winners.

"It truly is an unbiased committee," Noricks said. "We have developed a scoring matrix, which takes into account financial need, academic record, community service, and leadership."

Several of the winners overcame major challenges in life, including Brad Zonca, a Canton resident who recently graduated from Salem High School.

When he was in third grade, Zonca was diagnosed with brain cancer, which doctors were successfully able to remove with radiation. He went on to be an excellent student athlete at Salem.

Zonca said he will attend Michigan State University, where he plans to study engineering. He said the \$500 scholarship from the foundation will definitely come in handy.

"It is very generous," Zonca said. "It's nice to see the community giving something back to its people."

Most of the scholarships were \$500, but some were larger, including two \$2,000 scholarships provided by Yazaki North America. The Bittinger Team also gave out three \$1,000 scholarships. Noricks said the Yazaki scholarships, which are renewable as long as the recipients maintain a 3.0 grade point average throughout their college years, are the most competitive.

Today's TIMBIT! It happens more frequently than you might imagine. Some people are sitting on lots of equity in their homes, but they are cash-shy and rich in debt. Even with low credit scores, you can probably avoid bankruptcy and preserve your assets if you let your home's equity work for you.

THE 2005 CHEVROLET COBALT

Advertising Feature

Thursday Drive Time

It should - and could - have been a perfect Chevrolet moment. Here I was on a sun-dappled, summer Saturday afternoon, tooling down my local thoroughfare on the way to run a light errand, with the windows down in the new Chevrolet Cobalt that was getting me there.

The song "Cheap Seats," a stomping-good ode to minor-league baseball and accompanying bits of hometown charm, by the feel-good group Alabama, was playing loudly on the car's more-than-adequate Pioneer sound system. The only bits of iconic Americana that were missing were motherhood and apple pie.

And this was the morning after I had come out of a store to find, parked next to the Cobalt, an Infiniti G35 coupe, which by the way is priced at about \$15,000 more than the sticker reading of \$18,900 on the Cobalt I was driving. At first glance, I was stunned by how closely the profile of Cobalt resembled that of the G35 that was parked right next to it. Oh, sure, the G35 was a bit sleeker, with a sunroof, and with slightly bigger tires than were accommodated by the 15-inch aluminum wheels on the Cobalt. But in their basic profiles - low front end, swooping roof that rounds off the tops of the windows, slightly turned up rear - the two silhouettes were remarkably similar. And for Cobalt, that was impressive too.

But back to my errand of the next day. Beyond the better-than-expected sound system in such an inexpensive car, the 2005 Cobalt LS Coupe that I was driving didn't come through fully in sporting this sublime experience.

I was reminded more than once while accelerating toward my destination that the 2.2-liter, dual-overhead-cam, four-cylinder engine, while sufficient for most city-driving and freeway tasks, wasn't pulling me smoothly and effortlessly ahead of other vehicles when I wanted to do that. I was conscious of the fact that I was notching 24 miles a gallon in city driving (matched by an impressive 32 mpg on the highway), but it didn't make up for the fact that Cobalt wasn't coming through like even an economy-level pocket rocket.

When I got to the Laundromat, where I was picking up a load of big stuff that wouldn't fit into our washer at home, another shortcoming of Cobalt smacked me in the face. The trunk is impressively huge for a vehicle of this size, apparently able to accommodate several pieces of luggage, or at least three and maybe four sets of golf clubs. So I have no argument on that score.

But the problem is, the opening to Cobalt's trunk is way too small. Don't count on squeezing your cargo into the rear of this car any more than one snug-fitting piece at a time, because it won't work. In my case, I was trying to shove a garbage bag full of linens into a trunk that I knew was more than spacious enough to accommodate the load. But I had real trouble, as malleable as my cargo was, fitting it into the trunk's narrow opening. Not a pleasant experience.

None of this is even to approach the problem of the inadequate amount of back-seat room in the coupe and in the Cobalt four-door LS sedan that I drove several weeks ago. Smaller cars than Cobalt have more room back there. Cobalt is a few inches longer than a Ford Focus or Toyota Corolla, but it has fewer inches of rear legroom and 3% to 8% less passenger space

overall, according to an analysis by James Healey of *USAToday*.

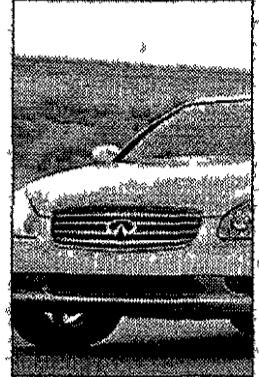
This is a crucial automobile for General Motors. Given the paucity of new-vehicle hits for the General these days, Cobalt is arguably GM's most important introduction this year. That's because it replaces Chevrolet's long-standard economy-car entry, the Cavalier, an important high-volume placeholder in GM's complete model lineup. And with the pressure on GM more than ever to bring out vehicles that create some buzz in the marketplace, the pressure on Cobalt to make a big impression is even larger.

Give GM lots of credit for many aspects of this car. Clearly, the quality of the vehicle overall is much better than in its predecessors (and so is the quality of the Saturn model, Ion, that is built on the same basic mechanical platform). Furthermore, GM has done a good job of insulating the vehicle and making the riding experience quieter and tighter than in any small car that it has produced before.

Clearly, if you're in this segment of the market, you should check out Cobalt and then judge for yourself. But at this point, it's hard to recommend the car to you.

Are you game? Dragon boats near Belle Isle highlight festival

Forty boats shaped like Chinese dragons and painted in bright colors will grace the waters around Belle Isle this weekend for the Third Annual Dragon Boat Festival.

Thousands of people come each year to see the 500 meter races by the nation's oldest rowing club, the Detroit Boat Club Crew. Celebrating its 102nd year, it's older than the clubs at Harvard and Yale.

"Dragon Boating is basically like canoeing, you stick a paddle in the water and go—but with 20 people trying to stay in time it gets really fun," said Dennis Wojdyla of Friends of Detroit Rowing.

Each boat also has one drummer who sits in the middle and plays heavy beats to help the rowers stay motivated. It also adds to the interesting ambiance.

Proceeds from the races (each rower pays a fee to enter) benefits Detroit's new YMCA and Friends of Detroit Rowing.

The races begin at about 9 a.m. There will also be live oldies rock, food, a traditional Chinese Lion dance, yoga and martial arts demonstrations and more.

The 45-foot, 1,500-pound teak canoes, shaped like dragons, are a tradition that began more than 2,000 years ago in China.

Currently teams racing against each other are GM, Price Waterhouse Cooper, TRW, Breast Cancer Survivors, Liberty Yacht Club and Irvin Automotive just to name a few.

Cuisine

New Center restaurant features a dynamic French connection

Everything about Detroit's Cuisine Restaurant revolves around the talents of chef/owner Paul Grosz, who lives in Troy. Born in Detroit and raised in Warren, Grosz began his culinary journey at age 18 under fabled French chef Jean Banchet at Le Francais restaurant in Wheeling, Ill., outside Chicago.

In Paris he studied pastry at Le Cordon Bleu and advanced his French-style culinary skills at legendary French restaurants Paul Bocuse, Pierre Orsi, Lyon de Lyon and Jacques Maxim.

Returning to Detroit in 1989, he served as executive chef at La Rotisserie in the Dearborn Hyatt-Regency, then at The Whitney for 10 years before achieving his

life-long dream in 2001 of owning his own restaurant, with the fitting moniker, Cuisine.

FRENCH-AMERICAN STYLE

Cuisine, seating 80 on the main floor, offers a Euro feel in a large house, built in 1923, that first became a restaurant in the late 1940s and has been several restaurants iterations since. Dark wood accents throughout are brought to life by light walls, attractive wall art and tables with white cloths and napkins. Understated lighting only serves to accent Grosz's dishes.

Dining at Cuisine offers several options. A la Carte and Progressions which are prix fixe (\$50 and \$80) menus that Grosz introduced less than two months ago. Components of the Progression menus

change daily, depending on what's freshest from purveyors.

Starters on the a la carte menu also change seasonally and with what's freshest. Ranging in price from \$9 to \$18, nibbling away from choices here is edible fun. Order several Starters to share with a large party or order the generous "Salad I had in Lyon, France" (frisse greens with tomato, hard eggs, bacon, Caesar dressing and brioche breaded goat cheese) followed by (in season until early July) Two

Crabs and a Broth (Almond soft shell crab, lump crab cake and a petite cup of richly-flavored lobster broth). You'll be more than satisfied.

Grosz's other starter favorites include Seared Sea Scallop with Creamed Leeks on Green Curry Sauce or Maine Lobster Creamed with Leeks and Tapioca topped with black truffles, and Foie Gras Torchon with Duck Rillettes, Port Wine Braised

Among Dimmers, Grosz recommends Loin, Rack and Leg of Rabbit with parmesan risotto cakes and oven-dried tomatoes. "Not many chefs prepare rabbit, he said

Since fish is delivered daily to Cuisine, seafood is always a good choice

Our wild sturgeon baked in an oven maintained at 40 percent humidity is another special preparation," Grosz noted. "Slow cooking in this special oven keeps the fish moist

Melange of Vegetables (always seasonal) is a vegetarians delight. Ten different preparations are a virtual tour of Grosz's creativity and sensitivity to vegetarians

WINE AND DESSERTS

Wine pricing at Cuisine is sensible. "I credit Mon Jin Lau's owner Marshal Chin (Troy) for my attitudes toward modest wine markups," Grosz said. One example: the delicious 2003 MacMurray Pinot Gris from California's Russian River

Valley is \$20 retail and on the Cuisine list for \$30. A fair restaurant markup. "I want to sell wine not just have it on the list," Grosz added. To create desserts, pastry chef Kevin Kearney has teamed with Grosz for 10 years. Cuisine signatures are Hot Souffles, Grand Marnier, Chocolate or

Wright's second is 'marvelous'

Lizz Wright, "Dreaming Wide Awake" (Verve Forecast)

The climax of Lizz Wright's marvelous second album comes toward the end, when she sings "I don't want to be the one who can't let go" and holds the final word for four bars, her warm, smoky alto lending beauty to the poignant sentiment.

That moment is transcendent but hardly an anomaly. Lovely from start to finish, *Dreaming Wide Awake* provides proof that Wright is a major young talent. The classically trained singer from Georgia shows impressive range in taste as she covers tunes that have been performed by

Madonna, Fats Waller and the Tijuana Brass. She also sings fine songs by Neil Young, Joe Henry and Marc Anthony Thompson, and takes a writing credit on three original tunes, all excellent.

Dreaming is more guitar-oriented than Wright's highly praised 2003 debut, *Salt*. Bill Frisell provides his distinctive touch on three cuts, and studio veteran Greg Leisz also contributes. The album was produced by Craig Street (Cassandra Wilson, kd lang), and he helps Wright explore the charms of jazz, pop, cabaret and the blues.

"Plymouth is really an established, solid community. The bench is usable functional art, so I think it's a perfect match for Plymouth. It's not real trendy. If you bring home a painted cow, what are you going to do with it?" Harrison said, referring to the public cow art display held in Chicago.

In addition to raising funds for cultural and beautification projects, the display will likely draw visitors to Plymouth, a walkable and quaint downtown, to spend a summer afternoon or evening.

"It's the perfect place to do this," said project co-chair Sheila Paton, who oversaw a similar project in the Cleveland area.

All the Amish-made benches - some are child-sized and smaller than the standard version - were crafted from poplar. The children's benches will be on display in store window displays and other indoor locales due to their fragility.

Foo Fighters' latest album is ambitious

Backstreet Boys, "Never Gone" (Jive)

Stuck the new Backstreet Boys disc in your computer and you'll see that it shows up in iTunes as part of the pop category

But don't be fooled. With their first release in nearly five years, the Backstreet Boys have plunged deeply and irreparably into the adult contemporary pool

The fivesome — Kevin Richardson, Brian Littrell, AJ McLean, Howie Dorough and Nick Carter — had already begun dipping their toes into these waters when their rivals, 'N Sync, were experimenting with two-step and beat-boxing and singing about one-night stands

But you can't be a boy band forever, and *Never Gone* represents what appears to be the inevitable, bland transition into musical adulthood

The first song — the promising

Incomplete — rises and falls and rises again with a simple but melancholy piano melody. From there it's an insipid mix of mid-tempo love songs and ballads — *I Still*, *Safest Place to Hide*, and the title track — any of which would be suitable on the soundtrack of a forgettable romantic comedy

Weird World is an anomaly, though — their well-intentioned but clunky attempt at social relevance, with overly literal lyrics like "Sent a message to a GI in the desert, said, 'Thank you, man, for bringing another dawn' Back here it's her and me, and we're having our first baby. Hes out there, takin' 'em on"

They're not normally mentioned in the same breath — in fact, this may be the first time in recorded history! — but the Backstreet Boys' new album calls to mind a classic line from Neil Young

"It's better to burn out than to fade away," Young sang on *My My, Hey Hey*

In this case, fading away — and leaving all those giddy fan-girl memories shining and intact — would have been preferable

Foo Fighters, "In Your Honor" (RCA)

The Foo Fighters aren't just trying to keep a following of fans with their newest album *In Your Honor*. One decade and three albums after rising from Nirvana's ashes after Kurt Cobain's suicide, they're out to become the greatest rock band of a generation

Lofty ambitions indeed for Dave Grohl, the former Nirvana drummer turned Foo Fighter frontman. But by striking a perfect balance on the 20-track, double album between hard driving anthems and pensive acoustic melodies, the band that few took seriously years ago just may have done it

Split between hard and loud on one disc, soft and quiet on the other, the album opens with the

title track *In Your Honor*, a toss-up between high-energy guitar riffs and machine-gun drums. The song comes on strong, never lets up and slaps listeners from the every direction they weren't looking

Friend Of A Friend incorporates chord structures reminiscent of Kurt Cobain's and seeps with the deep reverence Grohl knows

"He plays an old guitar with a coin found by the phone. It was his friend's guitar," Grohl whispers, only thinly veiling the period following Cobain's death. Ironically, the song sounds similar to Nirvana's own acoustic album

In Your Honor undoubtedly stands as the Foo Fighters' most profound effort to date

Dwight Yoakam, "Blame the Vain" (New West)

In these modern times, when many country hits sound like

those on pop radio, Dwight Yoakam's new album is cause to celebrate for connoisseurs of the Buck Owens-inspired *Bakersfield* sound and those who like their country a bit more honky tonk

At the movies

'Heights' is heavy, but insightful

"Heights" – Probably the first clue that something is awry among the film's articulate, attractive characters comes when an old friend asks young Isabel (Elizabeth Banks) how her

engagement ring feels "Heavy," she responds, half-joking. The film itself is a lot like that, too – sparkling and multifaceted, but ultimately heavier than it looks. That weight isn't a bad thing, actually. It's a rare display of confidence from two first-time film-

makers – director Chris Terrio and screenwriter Amy Fox – that they're willing to take their characters to complex, dark places, when it could have been easier to create yet another romantic comedy, set amid New York City's glitterati. Life changes

drastically over a 24-hour period for these people as they come to realizations and make choices, but in a way that's intelligently written and insightful. Besides Banks – who gives an effortless performance that should finally make her a star – the eclectic

cast includes a diva-licious Glenn Close, James Marsden, George Segal and a scene-stealing Rufus Wainwright in his first major screen role. R for language, brief sexuality and nudity. 93 min. Three stars out of four.

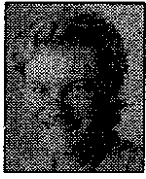

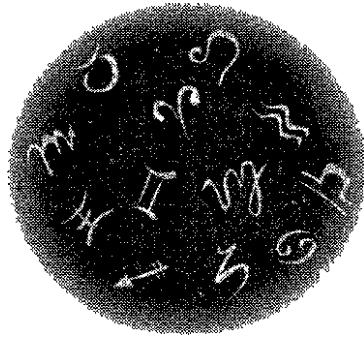

Family fun

Tour firehouse, watch rescue drills at fun fair

Firefighters no longer slide down the poles at the Downtown Detroit Main Firehouse

Built in the 1920s, the historic headquarters now serves as administrative offices for the Detroit Fire Department. The poles have long been removed.

But if you turn out for the Detroit Firefighters Fun Fair, you'll see a group of highly trained firefighters, members of the Michigan Urban Search and Rescue team, rappel down the nearby 28-story Pontchartrain Hotel.

"It's going to be something to see. These guys are the Navy Seals of firefighters," said Arnie Nowicki, a Detroit Fire Department sergeant involved in organizing the special event.

Slated 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday, the Detroit Firefighters Fun Fair commemorates the 200th anniversary of the Great Fire of 1805 with a host of activities and exhibits.

The rappel and rescue drill is scheduled at noon.

Visitors can take self-guided tours of the firehouse, talk with

firefighters, check out both new and antique fire apparatus and learn how the Great Fire of 1805 altered Detroit. The Detroit Historical Museum is co-hosting the event.

"It changed the way the city was laid out," explained Nowicki. The event, which killed no one but destroyed every wooden house in town,

also managed to make an official mark on the city. In 1827, Father Gabriel Richard suggested the seal of the city of Detroit contain a Latin inscription: 'Speramus meliora, Resurget cineribus,' which means "We hope for better things, It shall rise from the ashes."

Among the antique fire vehicles on view is a 1938 Safety Sedan Pumper, which was designed and built specifically for Detroit, said Nowicki. "It was known to people throughout Detroit as a pie wagon. Although other cities bought them about 85 percent went to Detroit."

About 15 fire "rigs" - some from other fire departments - are expected to be on display.

Of special interest to families is the safety smoke house, a small mobile home with a living room and bedroom

that simulates a fire escape. The unit fills with fake smoke and allows up to eight children to draw on their knowledge of safety and proper escape procedure.

"It's very safe, and it's all on camera so the parents can watch. And it gives the kids an awareness of what to do when there's a fire," Nowicki said, adding a safety instruction course precedes each 10-minute drill.

"This gets people talking," he said.

"But it's a fun educational thing without the perils, and it opens up dialogue with families. Dress rehearsals are very important."

Hey, if you're talking fire, you have to talk safety, too.

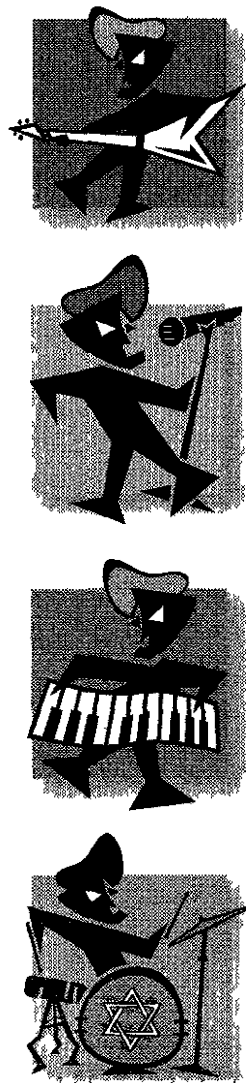
