Cops to schools: Keep sex offenders out

Police chief asks district for policy barring predators from property

Plymouth Township Police Chief Tom Tiderington was stunned to see that a township resident listed on the Michigan Sexual Offenders Registry was taking part in an athletic league at Central Middle School

So Tiderington is asking the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools district to do something about it He recently met with Superintendent James Ryan to discuss the possibility of approaching the district's Board of Education about instituting a policy that would prohibit sexual offenders

whose crimes involved children from participating in activities on school property

"This is the last place I believe a sexual predator should be allowed to be," Tiderington said "If we can't prohibit (them) from participating in activities next to or along with children, we can't

protect our kids'

The particular offender who prompted Tiderington's idea was released from prison in 2004, according to Tiderington He served time for kidnapping and seconddegree criminal sexual conduct involving a 7-year-old girl in Ann Arbor That followed incidents in Kalamazoo in which he tried to draw two young girls into his car

The man is among more than 40 sexual offenders required by law to register with

local police departments Among those are some 20 who are still incarcerated, leaving nearly two dozen sexual offenders registered in the 48170 ZIP code, which covers Plymouth and Plymouth Township

In the wake of recent tragedies, particularly two young girls killed by convicted sexual offenders in Florida, Tiderington has had officers in his department taking a more proactive approach in keeping tabs on these offenders, partic-

ularly those convicted of crimes against children

DOING MORE

That's how officers spotted the offender in question playing at Central Middle School


"I just think we need to do more," Tiderington said "Parents have the expectation that when they send their kids to a playground, a sexual predator is not going to be participating in an organized sport

Bills reflect higher costs of school vote



When a new state law went into effect in January giving municipal clerks the responsibility of running school district elections, Plymouth-Canton Schools officials immediately predicted the cost for a school board

election would double, if not quadruple

It appears they were right

Final tabulations indicate Plymouth-Canton Schools is being billed \$35,280 from seven of the eight governments for services and supplies involved in conducting the June 6 election, which was won by incumbent Tom Wysocki That compares to the \$16,000 it cost the school district when it conducted its own elections

"Why can't we run our own election which we can now see is more costeffective?" questioned Judy Mardigian, vice president of the Board of Education "Lansing made the decision, and Lansing needs to evaluate the impact of this law"

According to bills sent to Plymouth-Canton Schools from each of the municipalities within the district, Canton Township billed \$20,839, Plymouth 6,002, Northville Township \$2,126, Salem Township \$427, Washtenaw County \$201, and Superior Township \$143

Plymouth Township, by law, couldn't charge the school district because it had its own issue - a police/fire millage question - on the ballot

Wayne County billed the school district \$5,539 for the district's share of the board of canvassers certifying all the elections conducted in the county on June 6, including rental of Cobo Hall and security

"There's no win in this one, it's just terrible legislation, said Superintendent Jim Ryan "But, no one cares because that's always been the response'

In reality, the total cost for Plymouth-Canton Schools could have been more than \$70,000 However, half the bill was sent to Schoolcraft College, which had an election to fill a Board of Trustee position

When school officials first complained about the legislation, State

Hitting the high notes **Community Band still going** strong after all these years

When Bill Upton and some others founded the Plymouth Community Band in 1960, they didn't envision it going strong in 2005

'I was a trumpet player,' said Upton of Plymouth, who played until recently

"I guess I'm about the only one left," said Upton, who worked for nearly 40 years for Ford Motor Co and played in the University of Michigan's marching band while he studied engineering

The band has been presenting its summer concert series for 45 years The crowds keep on coming whether it's the big band sound,

marches or movie selections 'It's a long-standing tradition,"

said Carl Battishill of Plymouth, who has directed the group for 26 years The musicians are all volunteers "who play for the pleasure of playing"

The band presents six summertime concerts each year, with this vears final one 8 p m Thursday, July 28, at Kellogg Park, Ann Arbor Trail and Main. The summer music is picked to please both musicians and audience and to be both entertaining and thoughtful

The Plymouth Community Band has about 65 members, with a Plymouth-Canton core and musicians from Ann Arbor and other communities "We draw from a fairly wide geographic

range," said Battishill, band director at Abbott Middle School in the West Bloomfield school district

phones while driving 'Nine times out of ten, if I'm cut off or somebody is wandering over the line, they have

a cell phone in their ear," Stewart said "It's a total lack of attention to their driving When you re on a cell phone and engaged in a conversation, your thought process is in other places"

Stewart, who doesn t own a cell phone, has introduced legislation that prohibits the use of hand-held cell phones while driving, and only allows for hands-free cell phone use while driving

"This is a safety issue and I hope it will cause drivers to focus on their primary responsibility of driving their automobile," Stewart said

House Bill 5053 has been assigned to the House Transportation Committee, the chairman of which is Rep Phil LaJoy, R-Canton Township

"I see why it's needed because people are stupid when driving while on their phones," said Elizabeth Pierce of Plymouth Township "I find Michigan drivers aggressive, and when you see people driving with their phones it's worse"

Cynthia Granger of Plymouth Township said she has a cell phone, but is careful not to get into long conversations while driving

'I think it's dangerous, you need to concentrate on driving," said Granger "I've had people cut in front of me, or driving really slow, and they're talking on the phone

Sam Fauaz, who opened his Canton wireless phone business, Alpha Wireless, just two weeks ago said data about whether cell phone use behind the wheel is dangerous or not is needed before passing any legislation

Fauaz said such a law would not affect his business

"The bottom line is that people are. still going to use their phones in their cars, law or no law," Fauaz said "That's just the way people are " Staff writer Carol Marshall contributed to this storv

Plymouth heads to national muster

During the first weekend in August, Fort Ticonderoga in New York will reverberate with the thunderous sound of more than 600 fifes and drums as it hosts the National Fife and Drum Corps Muster Aug 6-7

The Plymouth Fife and Drum Corps will be among the 33 corps from throughout the United States and Canada who will perform at Fort Ticonderoga, a not-forprofit museum and restored fort maintained by the Fort Ticonderoga Association

Fort Treonderoga saw action in both the French and Indian War and the American Revolution and is the site of America's first victory in the American Revolution

The corps will re-enact 18th- and 19th-century miltary music on the Fort s Parade Ground and at two additional Fort locations The historic periods to be repre sented through music instruments and uniforms are the French & Indian War the American Revolution, the War of 1812 and the Civil War It's the first year the

National Fife & Drum Corps Muster will be held at an historic site Fort Ticonderoga, located on Lake Champlain in the Adirondacks of New York State, was built in 1755 by the French as Fort Carillon

It was the southernmost outpost of French territory in the Champlain Valley at the start of the French and Indian War In 1758 the British attacked Fort Carillon Despite being outnumbered four to one, the French managed to hold onto the Fort after the Battle of Carillon on July 8, 1758

In 1759, the Fort was evac uated by the French and became a British fort renamed Ticonderoga

The Fort remained in British hands until May 10 1775 when Ethan Allen, Benedict Arnold and the Green Mountain Boys captured the Fort in a surprise dawn raid Cannon from Fort Ticonderoga and nearby Fort Crown Point were transported during the winter overland to Boston to free the town from British occupation

In 1777, the British moved south from Canada to capture the string of forts, along the inland waterways of Lake Champlain, Lake George, and the Hudson River On July 5, 1777 the American forces abandoned Fort Theonderoga and fled south leaving the Fort again in British hands until after the American Revolution

In July and August, Fort Theonderogas Fife & Drum Corp perform daily and demonstrate firing the cannon In addition the Fort has four historic gardens including the King's Garden, a spectacular 1920s pleasure garden, an heirloom military garrison garden, a 3 Sister's Garden, and a Children's Garden

YMCA gets new wheels

When the National Highway Transportation Safety Administration issued rollover concerns involving 15-passenger vans, the Plymouth YMCA stopped using its vehicle to transport children to various programs

However, since the beginning of this year, that meant the youth organization had limited ability to deliver kids to those programs

"Our biggest issue was our day camp program, and our teens used it for almost everything they did,' said Gina Peterson, executive director of the Plymouth YMCA "As a result, we didn't do a teen camp this summer Instead, we had to send them to the Livonia "Y" and we had to drive them over there

Most parents don't have the tume to take the kids to different places," she said

Peterson's dilemma was solved when the Plymouth Community United Way came through with a \$38,000 grant to purchase a 15-passenger vehicle for the YMCA.

'We were thrilled," said Peterson after receiving notification It will make a big difference in our day camp and other programs, like getting kids to the Salvation Army bell ringing

"We would have had to figure out something with our youth volunteer program, and our teen camp next summer would probably be gone," she said

Peterson said the vehicle is on order, and she's expecting delivery in early October

The grant is in addition to the annual \$30,000 allocation from the Plymouth United Way PCUW President Marie Morrow said the need for a new bus was obvious

"We were happy to help them " in providing transportation for their various programs, Morrow, said "When they approached us, it definitely was in line with our goals and objectives

Any time one of our agen cies or other non-profits need help in providing human serv ice programs that support the community we certainly want to be there for them she said

right alongside them " Ryan said he was surprised to learn a sexual offender was taking part in anything at one of the district's facilities, admitting perhaps to a little naivete on the subject

However, he said he will talk to members of the school board about Tiderington's suggestion, because the safety of the district's children is too important an issue

"I thought (Tiderington) was really being proactive, Ryan said "We were sitting there dumbfounded, to be honest It makes a lot of sense when we're talking about protecting our kids, because it's a new age Things have changed

'Parents are counting on this school district to protect their kids, to do the best we can to educate their kids and to give their kids a positive experience," Ryan added

He said he'll go before the board's policy committee and talk about the idea, and likely will invite Tiderington, as well The committee's research is likely to include what policies are out there," Ryan said, and

if the board is supportive, 'we'll start working with our local police agencies to make sure sexual offenders who commit crimes against children receive notification they shouldn't be on school proper-

It might not be as simple as that, though There are likely questions of civil rights violations to be addressed Wendy Wagenheim, a spokeswoman for ACLU Michigan, said there are "questions to be asked" before such a policy should be considered

"If there are children in the family of the offender, what would be done about events such as graduations or parent-teacher conferences?" Wagenheim said

"We don't disagree that if there are people who are dangerous to the community, the police should be aware of them (But) there are questions worth raising'

Both Ryan and Tiderington agree, but feel the protection of children should be paramount While the particular offender of whom Tiderington is concerned has paid his debt to society in terms of jail time, he contends sexual predators are often repeat offenders

'The recidivism rate among pedophiles is extremely high," Tiderington said This offender has paid his debt to society twice now How many times are we going to let him pay his debt?"

Ryan acknowledged he's concerned with maintaining everyones civil rights, but said he's got bigger concerns

"I worry about civil rights ramifications, which is why we wouldn't make any quick decisions,' Ryan said 'We'll do our research to see what's out there My number one obligation is to the 18,500 kids who go to our schools

"I don't believe you just ignore this information," Ryan said "We're going to move deliberately on this, but we are going to move"

The Observer did contact the registered offender with whom Tiderington 1s concerned, but the man declined to comment

Rep John Stewart, R-Plymouth Township, introduced a bill to amend the new state law in an effort to bring election costs in line, allowing school boards to conduct their own elections in the designated months of February, May, August or November That bill didn't receive support

If the state legislature doesn't move on the issue, the school district may have to contemplate moving the Board of Education election to November, when municipalities generally hold their own local elections, as well as gubernatorial and presidential elections In those cases,

the school district could piggyback on the ballot and not be charged It's a change Ryan 1sn't 1n

favor of, but may be forced to consider

"It will be a much larger challenge to create an awareness of the voters to look at us at the bottom of the ballot,' Ryan said 'Can I run a special election for a bond issue, now? I don't think so '

If the Board of Education were to decide to move the annual election to November, they would most likely have to extend the board terms another six months to coincide with a new election date

"My sense is most large districts won't want to elect their board in November, when the fiscal year 1s almost halfway through,' said Mardigian



the world Unfortunately, not all children have Aidan's advantages They aren't read to, they aren't played with, they aren t exposed to a word for everything This most crucial time is when they are neglected without the right stimulus, the stimulus that will determine their future

At a time when measuring educational success has become so essential, we are coming to appreciate how far behind some children are when they first come to a classroom Education doesn't begin in kindergarten or even in preschool, it begins when a child first opens his eyes and ears to the world around hım

A new understanding of how children develop has made early childhood education a priority for many in education

The Michigan In Brief Web site, a helpful nonpartisan discussion of major policy issues sponsored by the Michigan Nonprofit Association and the Council of Michigan Foundations, notes "Brain research shows that the young children warranting the greatest concern are those who (1) fail to get adequate nutrition, (2) do not receive physical, emotional and intellectual stimulation, and (3) are emotionally or physically neglected or abused Fortunately, research also demonstrates that children have a remarkable capacity to recover from the devastating effects of early deprivation and maltreatment if a nurturing environment is provided as early as possible

When MEAP scores roll out every year, it is obvious that some children start with a deficit that only increases with time Poverty, vio lence, neglect from an early age make it diffi cult for even the hardiest of children to compete with children who never face these challenges

In recent decades, with more two-income

families, more children are attending child care centers These vary from innovative socially and intellectually stimulating preschools to organized baby-sitting arrangements

Some educators have suggested that we need to look critically at early childhood education as the key to improving all levels of education In a recent interview, the new state superintendent for public instruction, Michael Flanagan, suggested that maybe we should be taking some resources that now go to secondary education and spend it instead on early childhood education

It seems wrong-headed at first High school is the time that students have to buckle down and master the skills that will get them into college It's the time when they need all those electives that can be expensive

But Flanagan has a point Without that crucial first step, many won't be able to compete in high school, many will drop out or slide through the cracks long before they reach the secondary level

Our already heavily burdened public school systems are reluctant to add early childhood education to their responsibilities Their budgets are already strapped trying to meet the needs of the K-12 school population

Still, evidence suggests that any attempts to "fix" our weakest school systems and improve student performance are destined to fail without addressing the needs of the youngest children Prenatal care for mothers, strong, mandatory parenting classes, licensed, education-centered subsidized day care programs, and some form of early kindergarten are needed to reverse the trend

In the 1960s, the Johnson administration recognized how important early childhood education was The Head Start program ranks with landmark civil rights legislation as Johnson's greatest legacy It is a legacy that looms even larger as we try to quantify the success of our school systems



Education needs to start Signaling is 'best' option, but certainly not 'favorite'

t's summer, and the livin is easy I've also got a few random thoughts rattling around my brain that need to be explored

Not in my lifetime Perhaps thats not a great illustration, but many folks will go to their grave insisting that their "favorite (fill in the blank) is also the 'best' and no amount of persuading will convince them otherwise

Another pet peeve of mine is the blurring of the difference between 'entertainment and information' Each has its place in the world, but when I want to be informed, i e learn something useful or important, entertainment is not an essential requirement Try telling that to the talking heads on the local television newscasts

Every generation finds it necessary to break with previous ones and forge its own identity, however elusive that goal might actually be In other words, if there is something a parent likes, by defini tion their children likely won t. But how does one explain the rejection of traditional team sports by most of today's youngsters and the meteoric rise in extreme activities like skateboarding bicycle jumping and freestvle skiing?

When I was a child we had behind our house an old meadow that at one time was used to grow corn It was just a vacant field by the time I reached adolescence but all us neighborhood kids expended considerable time and effort to carve out a usable baseball diamond, complete

Golden 'Goose'

Engulfed in bright, southern California sunshine, Bryan "Goose" Finnerty had a plan as he boarded a Detroit-bound plane in the summer of 1990







Nor could the thousands of youth soccer players and coaches Finnerty has mentored over the past decade during his stint as the coaching director for the Canton Soccer Club

LASTING LEGACY

Finnerty's unwavering enthusiasm and knowledge of the sport have helped him establish a presence in the Canton youth soccer community that is unrivaled

Goose has really been an inspiration for all the kids who are in the club now or who have gone through it since he's been involved, said CSC President John Staub 'For example, as I talked to Goose at our club's picnic (Thursday night), I can't tell you how many kids came up to him and said, 'Hey, Goose, or 'How's it going, Goose?' Some of the kids were pretty young, so I don't know if they know Goose's background, but they sure know who he is

"Goose is an effective teacher because he is psychologically tuned in to the kids' needs and feelings He knows how to communicate with them More than anything, Goose has done a tremendous job of taking our club to the next level year after year He talks the talk and walks the walk

A NICKNAME IS BORN

Finnerty's competitive soccer future was hazy when he walked on to SDSU's team as a freshman in the fall of 1986 The 18 year-old net-minder couldn t have been any lower on the powerful Aztecs' depth charts during his first season

I was fourth-string goalie and part-time water boy," Finnerty remembered, chuckling "I only got a chance to stop some shots in practice if the first three goalies needed a break

'Then a few games into the season, the first-string goahe broke his leg, which put him out for the season and moved me up to No 2," Finnerty said 'About an hour before the next game was about to start, our new No 1 goahe came down with a bad case of stage fright, so I got to start We ended up winning eight games in a row, so I became the starting goahe"

With Finnerty serving as the last line of defense, the Aztecs advanced to the NCAA title game before falling to Clemson, 2-0 Along the way, his nickname was hatched

"In soccer, shutouts are referred to as goose eggs," Finnerty explained "After I had a string of shutouts that year, a sports writer for the *San Diego Tribune* referred to me in one of his articles as Brian Goose Eggs' Finnerty Well, my teammates saw that and shortened it to Goose

NEW FIELD, SAME SUCCESS

Following 11 productive seasons with the Rockers and one with the NPSL's New York franchise, Finnerty hung up his uniform and put on his business suit in 2000, the year he and a group of fellow investors developed the plan for High Velocity Sports, a 110,000square-foot indoor sports facility on Michigan Avenue in Canton that officially opened in December 2001

Last year, more than 600,000 people visited HVS, which is equipped with three large soccer fields, two minisoccer fields and a full-sized roller-hockey surface

"When I walk in here every day, I get the same feeling I used to get when I walked through the tunnel and onto the field during my playing days," said Finnerty, the facility's lead owner "This place and the people in it energize me"

MULTI-FACETED

Finnerty has proven to be as flexible in the business world as he was in front of the net In addition to his HVS duties, he is the president of Sports Facilities Advisory, a consulting firm that assists communities that are developing indoor sports arenas like HVS He is also a director for The Sports Leadership Centers of America, which helps members of corporations and athletic squads improve their leadership and team skills

While his business pursuits are impressive, the roles Finnerty cherishes more than any others are that of husband to his wife, Denise, and father of his 4-year-old twin boys, Joshua and Owen

"I think a lot of people assume that I'm going to coach my boys in sports when they get older," Finnerty said "I'll do whatever I think is best for them, but I'm not so sure it wouldn't be such a bad idea to just sit on the sidelines and be their biggest cheerleader"







Players from the early 1990s such as Michele Tyree, Sherry (Harper) Long and Lynn (Gowen) Rydzik - will join more-recent graduates for what usually is a pretty spirited affair against the players who are projected to play for coach Barry Patterson in the 2005 Mega Conference season

"It's kind of a reunion game, said Henry, who now enjoys retirement with his wife near



Big Rapids, Michigan "And they (alums) get the chance to show the current varsity what they've got Usually, the games are fairly contested'

When Henry started the annual game, it was at a summer team camp at Manistee (Mich) as a way to jumpstart the upcoming season and provide graduates the opportunity to come back and renew acquaintances while promoting the tradition of the Garden City girls cage program to younger players

Things really haven't changed all that much since then as far as the game is concerned

'We ll play some basketball and kibitz about the old times and check in with how they're doing now," Henry noted 'It's not just a game

mentally get tough and apply that to the classroom, and that it will spill off into college and


job situations," Henry said His emphasis on girls doing well off the basketball floor is not forgotten by his former players, such as 1998 graduate Melissa Bako



ow often I hear from clients, or parishioners, the comment that goes "I don't like change"

In some ways we are used to the way things are in our lives We may not like life the way it is, but it is predictable, familiar, and in some measure we know the drill When there is a job



Now there are really many changes which do not make a conscious impact Many things happen and they are expected Many things occur and the adjustments which come along with the change may not be any big deal But each of these new things makes an impact on us And these impacts are about saying goodbye It is the same dynamics as adjusting to a loss or a death One author writes about transitions

Transitions are a process of life When an ending comes it may be confused with finality But when something is finished it is the key to a new beginning Goodbyes are hard Change brings up all kinds of feelings The excitement and anticipation of the new is usually preceded by the cleaning up the cleaning out or at least the moving aside

When you move from one place to another think of all of the details to which you have to attend But the part





GUNDE LEADS TRAVELERS THROUGH TIME

Marker hunters know what fun it can be to spend an afternoon tracking down history. Here are a few of the highlights in the Observer communities from Traveling Through Time – A Guide to Michigan's Historical Markers. Published by the University of Michigan Press, the book was released June 1

Baker House (233 S Main) Italianate-style house built in 1875 by Henry W Baker, who helped found the Daisy Manufacturing Co best known for its BB guns

Plymouth (Ann Arbor Road and Main Street) The village was settled in 1825 and became a city in 1932

CANNEON Cherry Hill School (50440 Cherry Hill Road at Ridge) In 1876 this Italianate school house

that is usually the most difficult is saying goodbye, actually acknowledging the end of what has been. It is a time to say goodbye Goodbyes bring up all of the feelings of what kind of relationship this has been Your future is before you When you acknowledge that loss, that death, and have reflected and dealt with whom that person has been for you, you have the freedom, often with the recognition of how that person felt about you, to continue your life in wonderful ways

When you retire, and this and the kind of death I am describing are predictable changes, even though you know it is coming there is still a new life and lifestyle to adjust to

Yes, there is change It is woven into the fabric of life Face it, accept it, and allow yourself to move into it.

Laura Rose Ashlee grew up tobogganing at Cass Benton and skating on Wilcox Lake, so the historical markers in Hines Park especially captured her imagination when editing the second edition of a book including sites such as Nankin Mills in Westland

Traveling Through Time — A Guide to Michigan's Historical Markers brings together nearly 1,500 mini-histories in the handy reference published by University of Michigan Press

In the 1800s, Nankin Mills ground wheat into flour, but it's probably best known for housing one of the village industries Henry Ford developed after purchasing it in 1918 The Wayne County Road Commission acquired the mill in 1956 and converted it into a nature and interpretive center where turtles live in the lobby

'There aren't very many mills left and it's buffered by its location in Hines Park so it still has a rural feel," said Ashlee, who was intrigued with old buildings even as a child growing up in Plymouth Her interest never dwindled from the time she attended Plymouth Salem High School to graduating from Michigan State University with a master's degree in American studies

'The Wilcox and Baker houses, I would look at them and my imagination would go crazy wondering who lived there,' said Ashlee, who now lives in Okemos with her husband, Dean Anderson, an archaeologist I always loved history

In fact, it's difficult for Ashlee to choose a favorite site from the book As a historian with the State Historic Preservation Office and coordinator of the marker program, she has authored more than 500 markers since editing the first version of the book in 1991

At the top of her list is the Sutherland House in Plymouth The pre-fabricated bungalow was constructed by Lewis Manufacturing Co of Bay City in 1921 When the first historical marker was dedicated in 1955 at Michigan State in honor of the university's centennial, the designations focused on settlements, geology, geography, native peoples, historic events, military conflicts and a few buildings Over the years the program has grown to spotlight not only sites at least 50 years old, as originally required, but prominent Michiganians as well as lesser-known people, such as William Sutherland, who helped build the towns

"It's such a modest house you would never know it was important or deserving of a marker There's a lot of history we take for granted," said Ashlee, 43 "Mr Sutherland was responsible for platting Sunshine Acres, the subdivision where I grew up, west of Main Back then Ann Arbor Road was called Golden and the house was built from a kit Without a marker, you might drive by and not think too much about it."

Visitors to Nankin Mills rarely walk by without reading the two-sided historical marker dedicated in 1967, according to Carol Clements, naturalist for the interpretive center located inside Wayne County Parks offices

"I'm impressed with the number of markers

replaced a log school built in 1836 Henry Ford who operated a small factory in Cherry Hill paid for an addition to the building and the salary for a second teacher It became part of Ford's Greenfield Village school system where students benefited from art, music and dance curricula

Cherry Hill United Methodist Church (321 Ridge Road, one block south of Cherry Hill) In 1848, members raised \$600 to build their first church The present red brick Gothic-style church was completed in 1882

Clarenceville School District originated as the Fractional School District No 5 in 1837 and served the children of the present-day Livonia Farmington Hills and Redford The village of Clarenceville was the last stagecoach stop on the Lansing to Detroit plank road The Louis Schmidt Auditorium at Clarenceville High School (20144 Middlebelt) was home to a jazz series (1969-82) featuring legends such as Woody Herman Stan Kenton and Gene Krupa Joshua Simmons Farm at Greenmead Historical Park on the

southwest corner of Eight Mile and Newburgh Simmons was among the township's earliest white settlers. He built a log shanty for a home in 1826. In 1841, he constructed a Greek Revival-style home named Meadow Brook. It is listed in the National Register of Historic Places.

Newburgh Cemetery (Ann Arbor Trail, east of Newburgh) The burial place of veterans from the Revolutionary and Civil wars

REDECIRD: Redford Township District No. 5 School (18499 Beech Daly) Three schools have stood on this property since around 1842 The present structure built some-

'Sometimes I let the weeds grow," said George "Weed flowers are beautiful too'

When George finds too many irises have spread in his home garden, he digs them up and plants them at St Matthews Another member recently contributed a butterfly bush And so it grows

Mary Mull, 75, remembers when the gardens weren't as full of shasta daisies, marigolds, lavender, lihes, heliopsis, coreopsis, California poppy, ferns, hosta, and evergreen shrubs Back in 1981 when the Rev David Strong designed the Memorial Garden as a final resting place for the ashes of former members, the plants and bushes were young and much smaller Jack, Mull's husband, did all of the weeding while she watered That was long before there was a sprinkling system

For 19 years Jack did it almost by himself," said Mary Mull, 75 A Livonia resident since 1957, Jack, now 80, continues to volunteer as a player's assistant at Idyl Wild Golf Course in Livoma but has cut down the size of their home garden which includes raspberries, grapes, potatoes, and a few peanuts planted by the squirrels



TOXIC CLEANING Products may be a health hazard

BY HEATHER ASHARE CORRESPONDENT

WARNING Seek medical attention immediately if this product is swallowed or comes in direct contact with skin or eyes Read the back of any cleaning product and you will see a similar cautionary label

According to the Christian Science Monitor (Jan 23, 1990), a surprising number of our conventional household cleaning products contain hazardous chemicals Yet, we have become so accustomed to these warnings that we often neglect to realize that the effects of all our scrubbing and scouring may be doing us more harm than good

Edward Dawkins, the department head at SQS Inc , a recycling and environmental management company that handles the waste management services for Oakland County municipalities, said that some of the most commonly used corrosives and toxics found in household cleaning products are chlorine bleach, ammonia, phenols and cresol He strongly suggests reading the product s active ingredient list to determine its level of safety

Both ammonia and bleach contain fumes that are highly irritatmg to the eyes and respiratory tract and may cause skin or lung burns if used in high concentrations Mixing them together creates chloramine gas, a toxic substance that can be lethal The class of chemicals known as phenols is most commonly found in disinfectants and deodorizers Phenols are highly corrosive, flammable and toxic acids that can cause vomiting and circulatory collapse if ingested even in a small amount Cresols are colorless solids or liquids that are

also found in disinfectants Absorption of cresol liquids through the skin can cause intense burning and paralysis of the affected area. The chemical attacks the central nervous and respiratory systems as well as the liver, kidneys, skin and eyes

Suzanne White medical director of Children's Hospital of Michigan, cites that "household cleaning products are the second most common group of toxics that children come into contact with that result in an emergency to the Poison Control Center" If chemicals are brought into the house, White strongly recommends storing them up high as opposed to under the kitchen sink for easy access and out of your child's sight to prevent exposure accidents She further emphasizes that the best prevention starts by not bringing chemicals into the home

Children's Hospital of Michigan has found that 70 percent of chemical exposure occurs when the product is in use This happens when the adult leaves the product unattended just for a brief time to answer a phone call or a doorbell According to the EPA, there are four basic components needed to thoroughly understand a chemical exposure How was contact made with the chemical? For instance, was the toxin exposed to the skin, inhaled or swallowed? How long did the exposure last? How much of the chemical made contact with the affected area? For example, was it just a spray or half the container of the liquid cleaner? And how toxic is the chemical being used?

A customer relations representative from The Procter & Gamble Co, which manufactures and sells numerous household brand cleaning products, said that each product which contains a hazardous chemical carries product text and a picture warning label cautioning consumers of its potential dangers Also, Procter & Gamble attests to adhering to the guidelines mandat-



As an alternative to manufactured cleaners, Michael Peters, president of General Organic Services, a Detroitarea organic cleaning service, estimates that 90 percent of household cleaning can be done naturally by using a mixture of vinegar, fresh lemons and water For tough jobs like bathrooms and kitchens, Peters suggests using a solution of 60 percent vinegar and 40 percent water For easier jobs, simply combine equal parts water to equal parts vinegar Adding the juice of a lemon for extra fragrance will dissolve any lingering smell of vinegar

Since the Environmental Protection Agency estimates that any given household contains 25 pounds of toxic cleaning supplies, the agency recommends using household cleaners that are free of common toxins as well as fragrances Trader Joes, Whole Foods Markets and Mia Mahalo carry complete lines of chemical free, non-toxic and hypoallergenic cleaning products





Researchers say, watching sex on TV a predictor of teen sexual activity

esearchers from the Rand Corp and from the University of California, Santa Barbara, recently conducted a national longitudinal survey of 1,792 adolescents, 12 to 17 years of age

At the beginning of the study and in the one-year follow-up interviews, participants reported their TV viewing habits and sexual experience and responded to measures of more than a dozen factors known to be associated with adolescent sexual initiation TV viewing data were combined with the results of a scientific analysis of TV sexual

content to derive measures of exposure to sexual content, depictions of sexual risks or safety, and depictions of Teens sexual behavin 2005 ior (versus talk about sex but no behav-Alice 10r) McCarthy Analysis indicated that adolescents who viewed more sexual content were more likely to initi-

ate intercourse and progress to more advanced noncoital sexual activities during the subsequent year Young people in the 90th percentile of TV sex viewing had a predicted probability of intercourse initiation that was approximately double that of youths in the 10th percentile Exposure to TV that included only talk about sex was associated with the same risks as exposure to TV that depicted sexual behavior Approximately two-thirds of TV programs contain sexual content The researchers concluded

that watching sex on TV predicts and may hasten adolescent sexual initiation Reducing the amount of sexual content in entertainment programming, reducing adolescent exposure to this content, or increasing references to and consequences of sexual activity could appreciably delay the initiation of sexual activities Alternatively, parents may be able to reduce the effects of sexual content by watching TV with their teenaged children and discussing their own behefs about sex and the behaviors portraved (see Pediatrics, vol 114, Sept

2004, p 280-289) Your columnist's view is that continued vigilance regarding TV viewing, family-viewing discussions, and writing letters to producers may help

Royal Oak condos proving to be popular purchase



The purging and packing have already begun in the Rochester home of David and Alice Case But it will be another year before the emptynesters can move into their two-bedroom, two bath condo in the Main North Lofts in downtown Royal Oak

In the meantime, reservations for Main North Terraces, the second of the four-phase Main North project designed by Victor Saroki and Associates of Birmingham and developed by Joseph Freed Homes of Chicago, Ill, will be taken during an open house continuing through 6 p m Sunday

When completed, the project will encompass one square block on the northeast corner of 11 Mile Road and Main Street

The floor plans for the one-, two and three-bedroom units vary slightly and each feature concrete floors, extended ceil-

ing heights, balcomes or rooftop terraces, walk-in closets, baths with ceramic tile floors, gourmet kitchens with granite counters and maple mission-style cabinetry A fitness center and climate-controlled parking are also available to owners

Targeted toward young professionals and empty-nesters, the lofts range in size from 800 to 2,400 square feet and are priced from the mid-\$200,000s to the mid-\$800,000s

tect and longtime Royal Oak resident, said the focus on the design was a reflection of life in an urban environment He accomplished that task by creating interiors with walls that don't rise to the ceilings and door-less bedrooms, allowing light from the balcony and glass walls to infuse the space

Land surveyor John Sutherland, 35, of Troy, 1s looking forward to living in a community reminiscent of the one he left behind in Toronto

"What I miss about Toronto is that downtown where you can walk almost anywhere, he said "This project seems to

have that same feel"

Sutherland said he looked at several developments before he chose his two-bedroom, twobath condo in Main North Lofts "This one really caught my eye," he said "It was bigger and better than anything else going up," adding he was impressed half the units were sold before ground was even broken last year

David Case, president of Fox Portrait Studios, said he chose the new complex for its central location to his stores in Oakland and Macomb counties and looks forward to maintenance-free hving

"There's no shoveling and no lawn to cut," he said

Under the hood you'll find a 4 3-liter V8 and produces 275 horsepower, more than enough to get you where you have to go in a hurry Acceleration onto a quick-moving freeway is a breeze in this vehicle, as is taking off from a light or passing and maneuvering in heavy traffic

With its four-wheel electronic traction control, you'll get the added confidence of torque being applied to each individual wheel under slippery conditions And even if you loose traction on three of those wheels, the 4MATIC all-wheel-drive system will keep the car on track with just one wheel, on any corner of the car

Also standard equipment this year is an occupant safety system called PRE-SAFE The system actually detects a collision in advance and adjusts the seats, tightens the seat belts and can close the sunroof -- all on its own -- to better protect you during an impact situation

The S-class is also equipped with a seven-speed automatic transmission system (five-speed automatic

trans on the 4MATIC), a standard DVD navigation system with MP3 play and a tire pressure monitoring system The transmission can take the S430 from zero-to-60 mph in just a hair under seven seconds The seven-speed transmission is remarkable

because it can actually select the optimum individual gear to be in, given the type of driving That means there's a larger overall spread between the highest and lowest gears

The gears on this transmission are not chosen in order, as most transmissions Instead, it picks the gear most suitable for that driving condition For example, if you depress your brake quickly to ramp down, the transmission may skip gears It can switch from seventh gear to fifth, or even from sixth to second, depending on the situation That translates into better fuel economy and a reduction in noise

The S430 is a rear-wheel-drive automobile, making it desirable for many who still believe that rearwheel-drive is the best Mercedes-Benz has always felt that rear-wheel-drive is superior to front-wheeldrive

Another innovation on the S430 is the Tele Aid system You'll need a subscription to have this service, however, but it provides added security and convenience in the event of an emergency

In the case of a collision, for example, it will automatically call a central response center with trained personnel who will contact emergency responders If the driver or passenger cannot speak to the system on its prompts, the personnel will contact the local police, fire and ambulance service, providing a location of the vehicle

This, of course, is done through the vehicle's GPS satellite tracking system. It will even tell the response center the vehicle's model and color to speed response time. The system can also be activated by pressing the "SOS" button located on the overhead console


Of course the on-board GPS system has other uses, such as travel arrangement, lodging and dining reservations and even golf course tee times for golf courses around the country Roadside emergency service is also available, as is a direct link to a Mercedes-Benz customer service center or deal so you can ask questions about your car
