Central's future part of bond discussion

As the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education gets closer to deciding the parameters and costs of a 2006 bond issue, one thing that's becoming more clear is the future of Central Middle School

Six of the seven trustees made it evident at a workshop meeting Tuesday night that a bond issue should include money for a new middle school in Canton Township, at an estimated cost of \$28 3 million

'I don't think there's any question, said trustee Carol Saunders, a former district teacher and principal "Having worked in that building a number of years, there are so many drawbacks to its continued use as a middle school When you compare the facilities at Central with Discovery (Middle School), somebody is being shortchanged"

However, board members aren't ready to consign Central - which originally was Plymouth High School - to the wrecking ball

Central's original purpose and mission was to be a high school, and my heart goes out to students at Starkweather (Alternative Education Center) who are in a high school

without a science lab, without a media center without a cafeteria without a gymnasium,' said Vice President Judy Mardigian 'Repurposing Central back to its original mission is part of the life of that

When Canton is the largest contributor of students and growth, I have a hard time fathoming how we can just operate one middle school in Canton, added Mardigian That

would give us two in Canton, two in

Plymouth Township and one in the

city, and that matches the population"

Pastor impressed with hope in Katrina's wake

Maj Bill Hogg thought he'd seen some pretty bad stuff when he responded last year to Mobile, Ala, in the wake of Hurricane Ivan

But to twist an old phrase, Hogg, commander of the Plymouth Salvation Army, hadn't seen any thing yet

Hogg, back from a two-week pas toral visit to the Hurricane Katrinaravaged Gulf Coast, said the dam age caused by Ivan bore no comparison to the havoc wreaked by Katrına

'I had seen destruction last year in Mobile, but this was much, much worse, said Hogg, one of four Salvation Army officers from southeast Michigan dispatched to Biloxi and Gulfport, Miss Its going to be 18 months, maybe two years at least before some things will come back


The Michigan contingent was sent to the Salvation Armys com mand headquarters in Biloxi, but their actual work was more in Guifport, some 20 minutes away

They were sent on pastoral duty to provide emotional and spiritual care, and Hogg said there was plenty of need He said they talked to

Fire open house teaches safety

When 9-year-old Hunter Callender stepped into the boots of a Plymouth Community firefighter at the departments open house Saturday, she discovered on a very small scale what it's like to have to be ready to fight a fire

And that, after all, is what the annual open house is all about Giving visitors, namely children, a chance to see what the department does on a daily basis And hundreds of people turned out Saturday to find out just that

"It was hot and very heavy, Hunter said of the firefighter gear, which can add up to 80 pounds of weight to a fire-

Hunter tried on the gear during one of several demonstrations firefighters put on as part of the open house, held at the township complex at Ann Arbor Road and Lilley Among the demonstrations How to put out stove and oven fires and how firefighters use the 'Jaws of Life" to extract crash victims from

crumpled cars

It's all part of the plan to educate the public, according to fire Chief Randy Maycock.

We want our open house to be an educational event for everyone, Maycock said

'Hopefully, everyone has a good time and learns something

One teaching tool returned after several years' absence The Fire Safety House, built in 1991 in a cooperative effort between Plymouth, Plymouth Township, Northville and Northville Township as a means of teaching children how to escape a smoke-filled room

The house, sold to the city of Farmington in 2000, was brought back on loan for the open house It was a popular attraction Saturday

"We use it to teach kids about fire safety, and to teach parents some common problems,' firefighter Dan Phillips said It's an excellent teaching tool'

Reunion continues tradition

As the 1975 graduates of Plymouth-Canton Educational Park put the final touches on their 30year reunion this weekend looking back it was a different setting at P CEP as the first students from Plymouth Canton and Plymouth Salem high schools graduated as the Chiefs and Rocks

"A lot of dreaming went on that came true (at the park)," said Bill Brown, 74, who was Salem's first principal and served 17 years "Moving into Salem that first year (1970) was an exciting venture We really weren't ready to move in, and we moved much of it ourselves in cars and trucks The facilities weren't finished, the gym wasn't finished, but we got through it"

Before 1975, students who graduated were given diplomas from Plymouth High School. which had previously been located at what is now Central Middle School in downtown Plymouth Brown was principal at the old Plymouth High School before opening the new building

'There were 57 acres of wooded area, natural trails for the science and biology classes, a very unique experience," said Brown "There was a school farm that maintained a farm manager There were a few crops and had animals We tied it in with the 4-H program

'There was an attempt to keep the agriculture in front of kids, but we knew we were going to the Centennial Park concept." he said




'Dome delight

Marchers narrowly miss regional title

It was a real battle of the bands at the Pontiac Silverdome on Saturday as the Bands of America Regional Championships featured 32 of the top high school marching bands from 10 states

In what turned out to be a hair splitting difference between the top two spots, the Plymouth Canton Educational Park Marching Band took second place in finals performance, just three-quarters of a point behind the Centerville Jazz Band from Centerville, Ohio



preliminary performance at the Bands of America Regional Championships at the Silverdome Saturday

"I could not be more proud of these kids, said a grinning Marc Whitlock, director of bands at the Park They have really stepped up and have physically, mentally and emotionally worked harder than I've seen in my time here This has been one of the most outstanding weeks with a band that I ve ever had and that s saying a lot since I ve been doing this for 15 years'

That past week was one involving a tremendous amount of work for students and staff alike as some 40 sets of drill were added to the P CMB competition program, "Performing Inside Out which includes six movements subtitled 'Control," Breath, Tension, "Chaos, Release, and Structure

The first two complete runthroughs of the show took place just the night before the championship competition, first at practice and then the football game on Friday night The next two occurred during Regionals preliminary and finals competitions

'I thought we had really good performances, said Salem senior Andrew Kaump, a marımba player "My favorıte thing about this show is the diversity of it and how it goes through such extremes so quickly Even if we didn't come in first I m happy with how we played, so that's good enough

This year's regional competition featured the 32 bands per forming their 10-minute pro grams during preliminary competition Plymouth Canton took the second place trophy in class AAA (bands from the largest schools) along with caption awards for Outstanding Music

The Centerville Jazz Band took the top finals trophy with a score of 87 25, followed closely by Plymouth-Canton with an 86 5 Other Michigan bands qualifying for the finals competition were Jenison (10th), South Lyon (ninth) and Reeths-Puffer (sixth)

The band did really well, said tuba player John Noss, a Plymouth junior "We came back from prelims very strong

and it felt really good Our whole show is done now, so we ll have time to clean it By the time we get to States and Nationals, we're really going to rock it out



Superintendent Jim Ryan proposed a \$103 5 million bond issue that could be pre sented to voters as early as May Along with a new mid dle school constructed on Cherry Hill Road, west of Canton Center, the bond would include \$12.9 million to refurbish Central to replace Starkweather The Starkweather facility on Holbrook Street in Plymouth

would likely be sold Trustees want more information before deciding on a middle school equity program that would renovate and add classrooms at Pioneer, East and West middle schools at a

cost of \$176 million Trustee Richard Ham-Kucharski said hes not in favor of another large bond issue, on the heels of \$109 million in bonds approved by district voters last September

I could seriously see us doing some work to maintain Central and Starkweather, and do some work on the Tanger Center (special education) at this point, but the rest of this list I see as wants, said Ham-Kucharski 'With Delphi going bankrupt and Visteon in that category - this is a huge Visteon and Ford community - I have some serious concerns about the economic stability in this community the next couple of years, and I don t want to put people at risk by adding to the tax burden, as well'

The administration proposed \$24 1 million to add gymnasiums and cafeterias to all elementary schools that don t have them, as well as classroom additions for dedicated art and music rooms and future growth at most of those buildings However, board members voiced concerns about a bond issue topping \$100 million, and instead appeared to be opting toward a \$13 million plan that would add 28 class rooms at five schools and construct gyms at Field, Isbister and Smith

Other proponents of the bond include \$1 4 million to improve special education facilities at Tanger Center, \$1 5 million for athletic facilities at the high school complex for Canton baseball and softball and varsity soccer, and \$2 3 million to reimburse the fund balance for the money already spent to purchase the middle school property

Board members will meet Nov 1 to discuss Ryan's plan for a career and technology education facility at the high school park, which is estimated to cost \$15 4 million If the board agrees to move forward with it, Ryan said the total bond would be about \$91 mil-

Plymouth Township resident Larry Martin told the board that while the community has been supportive of recent bond efforts, the school board shouldn't assume another bond issue will be backed by taxpayers

'The economic climate in Michigan is not as favorable today as it was last year," said Martin 'Maybe even less favorable next spring, as many voters will be receiving the last in a series of large heating

"On top of this there's a lot of uncertainty about jobs in the area," he said Many families may be seeing a significant increase in their expenses, and a significant reduction in their income A new building may not go over very well with voters who are struggling to meet their next mortgage payment'

Trustee Barry Simescu said he understands Michigans economy is lagging, but the future of the growing school district depends on the improvements

It's going to be a tough sell, certainly the economy isn t good,' Simescu said 'But, this is the time we need to do these things Even if we proceed now, it's still five-six years out before we can get it done

'We have to do a good job of convincing citizens we need it, he said

"hundreds of people' daily, most who chose to ride out the hurricane rather than evacuate

'The story was basically the same for a lot of them, Hogg said 'Some were saying, 'I don't know why I stayed Next time I hear the word evacuate. I'm gone

Hogg told the story of one man forced by rising water to climb a tree and hang on As the water receded, he made his way down the tree When it was over, he discovered he'd ridden out the storm some 38 feet in the air

'The first question we asked him was, 'Do you believe in God?" Hogg recalled 'He said, I didn't before, but I do now I did a lot of praying at the top of that tree

The mission was the first exposure to a disaster of this magnitude for Capt Matthew O Neil, pastor of the church at the Wayne-Westland Salvation Army O'Neil said although there was plenty of frustration, there was also a lot of hope

There were a lot of people who just wanted to tell their story, some who had come back for the first time to see their property, to see their home, O'Neil said "There was a lot of frustration because things weren't happening fast enough, and some just needed

Hogg estimated some 60 percent of Biloxi will have to be rebuilt What wasn't destroyed, he said, will have to be refortified The word of the approach of Hurricane Rita spread more fear, although the storm did little more than dump rain on the area, Hogg said

There was also something else that struck the officers, a determination among the victims to not dwell on what had happened to themselves, but instead focus on helping oth-

"We're talking a 90 mile long, mile wide stretch of nothing but destruction,"

this help center in Gulfport O'Neil said "We were down there to help them, (but) the awesome thing was people were asking how they could help us It's almost unexplainable"

Grants from Blues

Michigan nonprofit organizations and schools have until Nov 11 to apply for two Blue Cross Blue Shield of Michigan and Blue Care Network grants to help the elderly and children and adolescents cope with depression, estimated to affect up to 6 percent of seniors and up to 5 percent of youths under age 18

"Depression is a disease no one wants to talk about but it affects both young and old alike, often with tragic conse quences, said Beth Goldman, M D a medical consultant for the Blues and adjunct clinical assistant professor at the University of Michigan School of Medicine Untreated, depression can result in needless suffering and even suicide Up to 80 percent of those who receive treatment recover, often within weeks The grant funds being made available now will help positively affect lives across the state far into the future

A grant pool of \$160 000 is

available Of the nearly 35 million Americans age 65 and older, an estimated 2 million have a depressive illness Mental diseases can lead to or negatively affect other physical conditions, reduce the ability of the elderly to care for them selves or to obtain social sup port, and impair physiological functions This ultimately reduces the quality of life


In addition, older Americans are disproportionately more likely to die by suicide Individuals age 65 and older represent 18 percent of all suicide deaths while comprising only 13 percent of the US population

In 2004 through 2005, simılar grants helped an estimated 18,000 youths, their parents and teachers and more than 12,000 senior citizens in Michigan understand and combat depression To qualify







Fire options must key on residents

Officials in the city of Plymouth are entertaining other alternatives to depending on Plymouth Township for fire protection services, pushed to that point by an unflagging township board that relishes the fact it holds most of the cards

The two municipalities are negotiating on a new deal that currently calls for the township to pay 75 percent of the cost of running the fire department, with the city billed for the other 25 percent

The agreement also leaves the township with total control of policy and budget decisions. That part of it rankles city commissioners, most of whom weren't on the commission 10 years ago when the deal was struck, and most of whom believe the township could do a better job managing the department.

Consequently, the sides have arrived at the most divisive issue in the agreement. City commissioners want the proverbial "seat at the table' — a vote in how the department is run and how its budget is managed — and the township doesn't want to give it to them

That's not surprising, the anti-city mentality among some township board members being fairly virulent Jabs thrown by some city commissioners do nothing but fuel that fire, to the point where the township board clings to the power it holds in this particular situation

For the last several negotiating sessions, city representatives have asked for, and not gotten, some direction from the township team about key issues. And, while the township board at its regular meetings has provided that direction, it has for whatever reason not been relayed to the city.

At its last meeting, township board members made it clear the consensus was not to give the city what it wants, which leaves the city looking at other options. The most popular appears to be establishing its own paid on-call department, a part-time operation that would save the city some \$700,000 on the surface

Of course, there are other considerations, most of them political Severing the relationship frees the city from the grip of the township board, although it would then be responsible for providing its own fire coverage Losing the agreement leaves the township scrambling to replace the some \$1 2 million the city would have contributed And obviously the firefighters themselves want the agreement to remain in force because they'll almost certainly lose jobs if it doesn't

The people city officials can't afford to let get lost in the shuffle are their residents. How are they going to react to what could be perceived as a cut in services if the city opts out and goes to a part time department? How is such a move going to affect homeowners insurance rates for city residents?

The city has not only the right, but the responsibility, to protect its residents, who are paying a hefty millage rate for that protection Whatever option the city chooses, commissioners must keep that in mind

Creative punishment will free up jail space

Hundreds of shoplifters, drug users, traffic offenders and embezzlers who should be locked up in Oakland County Jail are roaming free because there isn't enough space to keep them there

Since August, two groups of non-violent offenders were ordered released because of overcrowding

Oakland isn't the only county whose jail is bursting with prisoners Macomb County released non-violent prisoners in July and August, while Wayne County typically releases hundreds each month

These offenders are considered non-dangerous because they committed crimes against property and not people But they haven't finishing paying their debts to society and are back on the streets before judges planned It's

unlikely many of them have been rehabilitated
Building new jails isn't a practical solution Oakland
County officials say a new jail would cost about \$90
million Voters probably wouldn't approve of their taxes
being raised to pay for it anyway Besides, it takes time
to build new facilities, and the problem needs fixing

While judges make more use of alternative sentences, voters can do their part by having realistic expectations. Of course, we still expect judges to lock up dangerous felons. But not every law-breaker needs to go to jail Alternative sentences are often better options for non-violent offenders and may even help them turn their lives around.



Dingell's reputtion at that time was that of a sensible tough guy, appy to be a partisan Democrat, but prepared to ork with the Republican opposition when therevas a deal to be cut.

I remember be gave my boss, a fellow Democrat, greadvice time after time "Do what's right, ply tough, but play fair, get respected for wat you know, because it's better to be respectedhan merely liked

I saw him agn in the late 1980s, when he had become chairnn of the House Energy and Commerce Comittee Largely through the force of his personaly, he was turning the committee into the most twerful on Capitol Hill Something like 40 percent all legislation that went to the House floor diso through Dingell's committee

The Nation Journal, the authoritative publication on Congris, once claimed that Dingell claimed jurisdition over anything that 'moved, burned or wasold 'He was called "Mr Chairman" for good reaso, and when he stalked into a crowded room it wass hough the Red Sea was parting

His power vashiluted after the Republicans won control oth House in 1994 Not so his majestic presenc

I had a long conversation with Dingell several days ago What stands out, I wanted to know, after nearly 50 years in Congress?

'The goodness of the people that I served, their loyalty, kindness, decency, patience How hard they work, how much they love their country, how hard they try to make their communities better This applies to the huge swath of people I ve known for so many years black, white, Arabs, Republicans, Democrats, urban, suburban, rural'

What's it like today in the Congress, compared with the way it was when you started out? "Our system works best on collegiality, compromise and cooperation There's very little of that nowadays Today everybody wants openness, but we're now so open that we can t function

"When I was chairman, we'd have a hearing Then we'd go into a side room, close the doors, take our coats off and fight like hell. But the result was almost invariably a bipartisan bill, one that could pass with an overwhelming vote from the middle

How come things are so different? "It's partly changes in the society In the old days, when you went down to Washington you stayed there because you couldn't afford to go back and forth to your district As a result, members of Congress got to know each other, their families

'They'd socialize after work. They developed a store of goodwill, great friendships that helped make things happen even through the politics were tough That's gone now And the House now is mostly run by the Republican leadership They're hard right and aren't interested in compromises"

Dingell hasn t merely served for a long, long time, he's been at the core of many of the greatest legislative achievements of our times. He wrote most of the Endangered Species Act, introduced domestic content legislation that required Japanese auto manufacturers to produce parts in the United States and was the main force behind the Clean Air Act.

What advice would he give to young politicians? "The biggest trouble is not in doing right, it's in knowing what's right. If you know right, you'll do right, and you won't have anything to worry about."

At the end of our conversation, I asked how

John Dingell would like to be remembered "As a monument for sanity and effectiveness," he replied with barely a pause

We have the great good fortune to be represented in Washington by a living legend. The sad thing is that people of the caliber of John Dingell.

They convinced a whole town, including the emperor, that his new clothes were beautiful Of course, in reality, the poor emperor was dressed in nothing at all He looked quite foolish

America's public schools can learn much from this wonderful story written by Hans Christian Anderson

Standardized testing is robbing our schools of something that is very precious, something that cannot be replaced. Our

schools are being robbed of time Time to learn Time to teach Time to think Time to create

The amount of time that is now spent on administering standardized tests throughout our country's public schools is robbing our children of time that can never be recovered

In the Plymouth-Canton school district, third-grade students will spend approximately six weeks of a 42 week school year taking standardized tests Why? For what purpose?

Those who purport to know what is best for America's schools will say it is to make sure our children are learning Business leaders demand that schools be competitive After all, that's how business does it Others scream for accountability More tests, more accountability

It seems of late almost anything can be done to students and schools, as long as it s done in the name of 'raising standards' or "accountability' Adequate yearly progress (AYP) is just one example AYP is part of Michigan's School Report Card system

If Tonda Elementary School, where I am principal, comes in with low MEAP scores this school year, we won't receive recognition for AYP I guess it's irrelevant that the test was given in the fall this year instead of late winter It doesn't matter that third-graders have to take the MEAP test now for the first time, thanks to No Child Left Behind legislation

So what if some children who take the test are not even close to being fluent in the English language?

The special education students? Why, with all of the accommodations provided, certainly their score is an accurate measure of their cognitive development. Hey, some special education students even get to take a completely different test. I'm still not sure

what that's all about

And, if history proves to be a good teacher, next year's MEAP test will be very different from the 2005 model

Respected educators, neuroscientists and child psychologists from across the globe agree young learners can have as much as a three-year difference in the development of their brains. It is unrealistic to hold each learner to a specific standard or group norm that ignores what we know about neuroscience. Standardized testing does just that

Please consider this in the context of a fourth-grade classroom here in Plymouth-Canton, where the average chronological age is 9. An educational system powered by standardized testing lumps this classroom into one pile, disregarding individual brain development, spits out scores from highest to lowest and says to a school, "Way to go" or 'You have failed'

Rather than spending money on standardized testing (\$48 million was paid to an outside company to manage the MEAP test over the next three years), we could better serve our children by spending money on researching, planning, implementing and coordinating effective educational practices that help all children, in all environments, succeed in school

We are a very busy society We are almost frantic in our desire to do what is best, especially for our children. I suggest the public educational system in this country has become frantic. Frantic at the feet of emperors wearing new clothes.

Enough The emperor is not wearing any clothes We are being duped

Consider this "It is not enough to be busy,' Henry David Thoreau once remarked "The question is, what are we busy about?' Let's get busy doing what is right for our children, for our schools and for our future We must respond to clever robbers and emperors dressed in new clothes

We must question ideas, legislation, laws and programs that serve no purpose except to compare children and tear down an edu- a cational system that already struggles terribly under the weight of apathy, poor funding and misguided leadership

We must turn away the robbers who are trying desperately to steal our children's love for learning. We must not dress our leaders in the emperor's new clothes. Instead, let's clothe them in the truths about teaching, learning and a place called school.

Home theaters looked at by more homeowners

Homeowners are wiring up projectors and speaker systems to fill big screens, ranging up to nearly 12 feet wide, placing the viewers right at the touchdown, the liftoff or the Western shootout

"I guess it's just the generation out there today, said Dick Tudhope, president of TheaterXtreme of Auburn Hills They want everything bigger, brighter and faster

Lower levels and basements are the natural choice for these systems, but they are versatile and the technology also allows them to be created in a room as small as 10 by 12 feet, Tudhope said

'That's a room that a single guy can go to be by himself to watch a football game, a fight or NASCAR, or the kids can play X boxes," Tudhope said

Tudhope says today's systems are more affordable Systems range in cost from \$2,000 to \$10,000 and up at TheaterXtreme

Homeowners interested in such a system should check the logistics of where they would like to install one Projectors require a throw

Projectors require a throw of 10 to 15 feet. The systems should be in a lower level, but an extra bedroom can be used for home theater too, Tudhope said.

Light is the only factor that

can hurt (the picture), he said Most rooms can be made to suit home theater, but you will need certain blinds Lower levels are probably the best

The systems also allow for Internet access

'The versatility of it gives you a sense of wanting to have one,' Tudhope said 'But these systems are great for the big events where you'll have big party of people — Michigan gainst Ohio State, the World Series, the Super Bowl

The LifeStyle screen helps convert a regular room into a home theater, as the screen goes up into the ceiling A photograph or painting can be placed on the wall behind where the screen comes down from the ceiling Speakers are visible, but they also can be stored in the walls or ceiling

Homeowners can add seating, too, if they would like to check with local furniture stores on theater-style seating

"We have chairs in a seating system, said Dave Cal, salesperson for Art Van in Westland 'You can buy these by the piece and put them together Some have 30 seats or you can have 15 seats"

Entertainment centers once consisted of three pieces that highlighted the television set and sound systems

Today's systems still house that same equipment but they ve added a new wrinkle to incorporate the latest televi sion technology — the plasma TV

When plasma and flatscreen televisions first arrived in showrooms consumers bought them and placed them on the wall of the family room or great room either for view ers to see the new equipment, make a contemporary, modern statement or show off the lat est status symbol


And as long as these units arent too large they ll fit

little TV on a stand, and now with the flat-screens, they have to be put on a stand," Cal said "We're getting more of that"

Customers still look for the cabinetry in entertainment centers

They still want and look for attractive cabinets on either side," Cal said

More customers prefer cherry woods, he said Bill Wolf, president of Newton Furniture with stores

ın Lıvonıa and Bloomfield Hills, expects the entertainment centers will be scaled These pieces will be scaled

down because the TVs are getting larger and larger," Wolf said "They have cabinets now where the screens can be lowered into the cabinet They're using the big cabinets still, but they are more open"

CONSIDERATIONS

Wolf sees usually two different characteristics in shoppers seeking furniture for the television They either want a small stand, or they want to put it "in a room that they want to live





Smoke detectors can save lives

Its the time of year again when days grow shorter and nights longer and, for most of the US, clocks 'fall back" an

This twice-annual time change serves as an excellent réminder to replace smoke detector batteries

Though valuable, changing the battery in a smoke detector is only one step in ensuring that this live-saving device does its job to protect your family and

home from the threat of fire If you don't have smoke detectors, mstall them A smoke detector should be installed in " each bedroom and on every level of your home

If you do have smoke detectors, make sare that they are in good working order

When it comes to maintaining your smoke detectors, it doesn't stop with cleaning and battery changing

Every smoke detector should be tested at least once a month Every smoke detector is equipped with a test button which, when pressed and held down for a few moments, will activate the ourm

Safely use ontained soilirce of smoke - such as incense or "synthetic smoke" in an aerosol can - to test the detector

If your smoke detectors are more than 10 years old, consider replacing them

The National Fire Protection Agency recommends that residential smoke alarms be replaced after 10 years due to an accumulation of significant levels of dust, dirt and debris

A smoke alarm works 24 hours a day, seven days a week. That's more than 87,000 hours over a 10-year period It makes sense to be safe and replace your smoke alarm just as you would any other household appliance that has reached the end of its useful life

With smoke detectors cleanliness is important Adust or lint laden smoke detector can t

do its job properly It should be vacuumed with an upholstery attachment periodically to remove dust buildup

Keep in mind that a smoke detector is particle-sensitive Therefore, even if it tests as operational, a dusty smoke detector might not operate cor-

LINKING

Simply installing and maintaining smoke detectors may not offer your family the level of protection that new technology can provide

A recently released report by the Consumer Product Safety Commission on the audibility of smoke alarms found that linkmg, or interconnecting, smoke alarms could provide an earlier warning to fire and smoke

The study also found that wireless technology could be a solution to better protecting American homes

The two year study concluded that the location of a homes 'smoke alarms, as well as vari ables like the home's layout and whether children and/or older adults live there, determine how well and when a family will hear a smoke alarm

i Interconnected smoke alarms link together so that when one alarm detects smoke, it will trigger all other alarms to sound This immediate reaction pro vides more warning in more places, which can increase a family's available escape time

A family has on average only three minutes from when the first smoke alarm sounds to escape a house fire The sooner family members hear a smoke alarm, the sooner they can get out safely

For several years nonprofit agencies have been researching the indications that children under age 16 sleep too soundly to wake to the sound of a traditional smoke alarm

In addition, America's population is aging rapidly – nearly 20 percent will be over age 65 by 2030 bringing about ques tions regarding age related

hearing and mobility loss Alternative devices, such as lower frequency alarms or a

vocal warning, may be more effective at waking children and older adults, and also could be used to supplement a tradition al alarm in caregivers rooms

The findings also refer to a 2002 CPSC-sponsored study by the Naval Research Laboratory, which reported that wireless technology could offer a lower cost alternative for installing interconnected smoke alarms in existing homes

Currently, interconnected smoke alarm systems are wired into a home during its construction, and to retrofit a home involves significant rewiring and renovation Nearly 100 mil hon American homes either dont have interconnected alarms, or remain under-protected

Brought to market only this summer, these innovative products will enable families to quickly and easily install inter connected smoke alarms, and will include features aimed at providing additional warnings to children and older adults

ESCAPE

While installing smoke alarms is the first step, families must also know how to escape

Families should create and frequently practice a fire escape plan Make sure everyone, including children, knows what the smoke alarm sounds like



One place to get in the spirit of Halloween is in the kitchen Prepare a whole meal or a few dishes with the traditional orange-and-black color scheme, and you re at a Halloween party

Serve baby carrots with a black olive tapenade dip, pumpkin soup with black beans, or shredded carrots with dark raisins or chopped dates

As is appropriate for Halloween, the colors orange and black can be traced back to the occult and to commemorative masses that took place in the late fall

Some historians connect the orange color to the unbleached beeswax candles used in the ceremonies Others contend orange is the color of the autumn harvest All seem to agree that black came to Halloween as a symbol of death and darkness

A black and orange pasta dish would be a perfect centerpiece for a Halloween meal

There are black pastas available made from squid ink, but they can be difficult to find Either spinach linguine or a whole-wheat pasta will give much the same effect when paired with the other ingredi-

Black olives and bright orange bell peppers are almost enough to provide the appropriate color scheme



Whole-wheat pasta is a good source of dietary fiber and has a chewy texture that goes well with robustly flavored vegetable sauces

Sweet bell peppers come in pale to dark green, yellow, orange, red and purple They are all mild in flavor

Green bell peppers are picked when they are immature and are acidic and somewhat bitter As they ripen, they turn bright colors and become sweeter

Besides their pretty colors, bell peppers are an excellent source of vitamin C and contain good amounts of vitamin A as well as small amounts of calcium, phosphorous, iron, thiamin, riboflavin and niacin

Black olives provide the color contrast for this Halloween dish They add a little fat but it is unsaturated fat, the kind that lends flavor and texture to food without raising blood cholesterol

Some garlic, hot pepper and fresh herbs will make this a dish welcome to most witches and goblins

HALLOWEEN LINGUINE

4 large garlic cloves minced Pinch dried hot red pepper flakes (optional)



Kilpelainen chalked up his latest impressive feat Oct 2 in Las Vegas when his vault of 12 feet and 7 inches earned him the American outdoor record in the 60-64 age group Earlier this summer, he finished second in the 55-59 age bracket at the World Masters Track-and-Field Championships in San Sebastian,

The retired Detroit Public Schools physical education teacher has also earned first-place honors in four other events so far in 2005 the Ohio Indoor Masters Championships in Ada, Ohio, the Michigan Outdoor Masters Championships in Big Rapids, the Ontario Indoor Masters Championships in Toronto and the Canadian Outdoor Masters Championships in Toronto "As long as I feel good and I m

healthy, I'm going to continue to compete," said Kilpelainen, who works out six days a week The secret is to train consistently and not to indulge in certain things that could bring me down It's also important to give myself time to recover from workouts and to eat

The international meet in Spain attracted many of the most talented masters track-and-field athletes from around the globe In Kilpelamen's age group, there were competitors from Denmark, the Czech Republic, Germany and Finland, just to name a few

"We all talk and share training techniques — at least the ones who can speak English,' Kilpelainen revealed "It's good competition, but it's fun, too In fact, I loaned my pole to the guy who ended up winning the meet (Flemming Johansen of

Denmark)" Kılpelainen passes down his expertise on pole vaulting to members of the Canton boys track-andfield team, for which he has been an assistant coach for the past seven

'I really enjoy working with the young student-athletes," he emphasized "I have found that, like everything else, the ones who work the

hardest are the most successful Kilpelainen said he is dedicating any world records he may attain in the future to his late mother, Kirsti Kılpelainen, who passed away earlier this year at the age of 86




DR. MICHAELA TUCCI

Scientology says its techniques lead to spiritual healing, awareness

Scientology has been getting a lot of press these days with the Hollywood celebrities being their unofficial, if controversial, spokespersons And yet, many people don t know much about it They ve heard it's cutting edge" at best and "other worldly" at the other end of the spectrum But what exactly is it?

Rob La Montagne, an area representative for the Church of Scientology shared informa tion about the officially desig nated religion both in an interview and in a booklet called, Scientology Something CAN Be Done About It The booklet can be obtained free at the Church of Scientology on Inkster Road in Farmington Here one can also view a video that explains their philosophy and browse a library that contains the texts that form the basis for Scientology

Following are some major questions that La Montagne and/or the booklet address

What is Scientology?

According to the booklet, "Scientology is defined as the study and handling of the spirit in relationship to itself, universes and other life"

Is it a religion?


Scientology is a religion in its highest meaning, bringing man to total freedom and truth The essential tenets are You are an immortal spiritual being Your experience extends well beyond a single lifetime And your capabilities are unlimited, even if not presently realized

Furthermore, man is basically good He is seeking to survive His survival depends upon himself, his fellows and his attainment of brotherhood with the universe In Scientology, you are called a thetan, from the Greek letter theta, for thought or life or the spirit The thetan is the spiritual being himself It is you

Who founded this religion? When?

Scientology was founded by L Ron Hubbard, who was born in Tilden, Neb , in 1911 His formative years were spent in the American West and then ın Asıa, where he studied Eastern religious traditions

Hubbard studied engineering at George Washington University and later studied the belief systems of South Pacific, Caribbean and North American Indian tribes To fund his expeditions he wrote highly successful books Always his focus remained on a search for a "common denominator of existence" that he could use to build workable solutions for the improvement of the human condition



This booklet helps explain Scientology

During World War II, Hubbard received treatment for combat wounds at a US naval hospital Here he used his new technique of Dianetics to remove "mental blocks' from prisoners of war who did not respond to medicine They swiftly recovered Later he tested Dianetics on hundreds of people and wrote Dianetics The Modern Science of Mental Health It was an immediate best seller The text gave rise to 750 Dianetics groups from coast to coast and inspired the formation of Dianetics Foundations in six American cities Today there are nearly 200 million copies of Scientology works in circulation all over the world

How is man defined through Dianetics?

Man consists of three parts The first is the spirit, the 'thetan," which is the individual himself The second is the mind The thetan uses his mind as a communication and control system between himself and his environment The third is the body. The body is not the person The most important of the three parts of man is the thetan, which is the spirit, or you

Scientology addresses man as a spiritual being and gives techniques for alleviating spiritual trauma. Dianetics holds that the reactive mind works on a totally stimulus-response basis, and exerts power over one's awareness, purposes, thoughts, body and action The central practice of Dianetics and Scientology is spiritual counseling called 'auditing" Through this, Scientologists reduce and ultimately erase the power of the reactive mind, which is a source of irrationality, fears and nightmares

Auditing leads to a clear state A person can then discover his or her true nature, and ultimately achieve full spiritual awareness and free-

What happens during auditing? Auditing uses a precise pro-

cedure It is delivered by an auditor, who is trained and expert in the exact techniques of Dianetics and Scientology The goal is to restore individual ability

The person being audited holds in his or hands an E-Meter, or electropsychometer This device with electrodes produces a tiny flow of electrical energy, about 1 5 volts, or less than a flashlight battery There is no physical sensation, nevertheless, when the person thinks a thought, there are electrical changes Those are registered on the meter and interpreted to find what the person needs to address

An auditor uses exact sets of questions. He does not offer solutions, advice or evaluation One of the fundamental principles of Scientology religion is that an individual can improve his conditions only if allowed to find his own answers to life's problems They can then improve their ability to face what they are and where they

Does Scientology or auditing allow or require hypnosis or psychotropic medication?

There is a vast difference between auditing and other forms of counseling There is no use of hypnosis or drugs during auditing, because it is believed that those limit a person's awareness and self-determination

In addition, it is believed that psychiatry leads to the butchering of human beings and their sanity, and is condemned by the Church Scientologists are trying to create a world without war, insanity and criminality According to Scientology, psychiatry is seeking to create a world where man is reduced to a robotized or drugged, vegetable-like state so that he can be controlled Scientology and psychiatry will always work at cross-purposes

Also, according to the Church, psychiatrists view man as an animal and not a spiritual being So Scientologists believe that psychiatry is opposed to all religions

What about treatment from medical doctors?

The Church of Scientology has always had the firm policy of not diagnosing or treating the sick Medical doctors are trained to deal with the physical aspects of illness and injury Once under medical treat-

ment, a Scientologist then addresses illness or injury with auditing to handle any spiritual trauma or other factors connected with the physical condition which may have predisposed him to illness or injury Many medical doctors are Scientologists themselves

"Then you're doing double duty I never rest on the weekend,' said Nelson, president of his homeowners association of some 640 homes He likes his neighbors and neighborhood


"I'm kind of a farmer at heart You can t do that in a condo," he said of planting and working outdoors When he's older, Nelson doesn t think he ll go to a condo

Recent low interest rates have made it possible for some of those singles to buy with family help, she said People often buy a home as a way to build equity, with some investing "sweat equity into improvements, selling and buying another home

Some people delay marriage or don't plan to marry, said Rands, 2006 president of the Metropolitan Consolidated Association of

Realtors 'I think it's very much across the board, she said

Singles often find a home offers greater privacy and control over the property, she added Those newly single through divorce or

widowhood are another part of the market "Many of those people need different kinds of configurations, Rands said, citing divorced people with shared custody of chil-

Some widows and widowers have fairly substantial homes and may be more comfortable in a property reflecting their new lifestyle, compared to what some people would call redundant spaces"

Check the prepayment penalties on mortgage

lender The note that you sign - your promise to repay so much money over so many years at such-and-such an interest rate - during your mortgage process is a valuable, tradable

commodity for the lender Lenders need these notes to yield them certain rates of return They also like stability and predictability

Prepayment penalties state that if you pay off your loan before a prescribed period of time has elapsed, you must pay the lender or note holder an extra fee Thus, prepayment penalties give stability to the note as an investment

Bad credit lenders almost all have mandatory prepayment penalties to prevent borrowers from bouncing from loan to loan However, if you are an A+" borrower and really desire a premium deal, you should ask your lender if you are eligible for a discounted interest rate by accepting a prepayment penalty on your new mortgage This can be a windfall, especially for borrowers in jumbo mortgages

grunt jobs, the low-level, entry-level jobs that many people do not want at any age? The answer is clear by understanding how they fit into the overall scheme of business, no longer thinking of them as deadends

Where better to begin than the fast food industry, which offers work stigmatized as a niche above custodial service At 16, Lee Szelog saw few options for herself in Bangor, Maine, not because of her location but because of lack of self-confidence She signed on as a windowperson at McDonald's for minimum wage at \$2 70 per hour (1976)

"I was shy and naive," she recalls "The company trained me well and instilled a sense of pride" Within three months, she received her first formal recognition, as Crew Member of the Month Six months later, in the same capacity, she was McDonald's State of Maine winner in the All-American Competition Her confidence was way up and she bought into the company's philosophy that "common customer courtesies and a positive attitude" will take you somewhere Indeed, it did -- a tour to the Azores, where she represented the company serving Big Macs to military

families Today Szelog is vice president of Education and Development at Camden National Corporation in Rockport, Maine Founded in 1875, it's a two-bank holding company with 350 employees, headquartered in her home state

Consider what can happen in a technical field After graduating from a technical high school in 1964, Frank Galuppo began as an installer for Western Electric for \$1.95 per hour, just \$ 70 above minium wage He worked indoors pulling cable to interconnect the switching equipment in central offices Galuppo kept moving up and, attending night school over a period of six years, earned a college degree in 1977 Eventually, he became president of Lucent's Optical Networking Group Today he's president, CEO and director of Amedia Inc, the Eatontown, N J, telecommunications hardware company, with markets expanding into China and the Americas He is rebuilding an established company with 32 employees with an entirely different product

When Galuppo started out, he didn't have a career path. He was focusing upon getting a job Szelog found that she loved working at McDonald's She spent a total of seven years in marketing there Meanwhile, things became unsettling when some of the stores were sold "I desperately wanted to stay," she says "I had to move to the regional office in Westwood, Mass I loved the company so much, but not the big city"

What did these two people learn? Galuppo sees now that in his 13 years in the

Bell system, his co-workers were union members "I got to know intimately how the telephone network worked, making communication possible," he states "After college, I left the union and went into management I could always empathize with people in middle or lower management jobs I never took them for granted As a young person, I remember being at the very end of the dog's tail As I grew in my career, I always made a point of keeping the communication deep down in the organization so the people there wouldn't feel as alienated as I did I also came to appreciate how better to develop products "

Galuppo mentions that the perspective of a person who's come up from the ground floor may be broader, more amenable to change and more cost-conscious For him, flying business class isn't essential "When I came," he remarks, "I recalled how frugal life was as an installer Returning to that kind of work lifestyle wasn't difficult"

Szelog looks back on her early experience as providing building blocks for solid interpersonal skills She speaks of common courtesies, politeness and "the value of a smile, an upbeat, enthusiastic, positive attitude," and filling orders efficiently She attributes much of her success professionally and personally to the culture she embraced at McDonald's

What can people starting at the ground floor do today? Szelog advocates channeling positive energy into skill development on the job "and supplementing those skills with lifelong learning" Galuppo

advocates interacting with other people, empathizing with them and recognizing that they do contribute to decisions made at the top Finally, he advocates developing tenacity "You have to be tenacious, use common sense and work hard to keep something alive and drive it to completion"

The 2006 Lexus GX 470

Lexus's mid-size, truck-type SUV is a luxury version of parent Toyota's 4Runner, but that description is highly inadequate. The 2006 GX 470 puts an exclamation point on the tremendous success that Toyota has had in using Lexus not only to penetrate the luxury-SUV market in the United States but, in many senses, setting the standard for that segment

Wisely, Lexus slightly upgraded the GX 470 - its middle-of-the-lineup SUV - for the new model year, but without tampering with anything that made the vehicle so fine in the first place Specifically, last year Lexus refined GX 470 with a new front-passenger airbag system, improved graphics in the optional navigation system, and a new Sport package that combines dynamic bodyroll control with a unique appearance inside and out For 2006, digital Lexus Link communication, based on and staffed by General Motors' OnStar service, becomes available, while minor interior updates enhance both function and appearance Neither, industry experts say, is Lexus planning to do much more for 2007 or even 2008 than a cosmetic freshening. For a product developer as nimble as Toyota to signal this far ahead of time that it's not planning to tinker much with a vehicle is a strong endorsement of the fact that GX 470 the way it is configured right now must be doing something – actually, a lot of things – right

What, exactly? Well, overall, GX 470 is a robust mid-size SUV with serious off-road capability, reportedly - though I didn't test it in this review And it is based on traditional truck engineering, including body-on-frame construction, a rugged four-wheel-drive system, and a live rear axle Yet GX 470 also oozes luxury It's roomy and quiet inside, with a luxurious cabin swathed in leather and bird's-eye maple And it seats seven in great comfort, even in the third row of seats

I've got to admit that I'm partial to Lexus,

and perhaps the biggest reason is what an unmitigated joy they all are to drive GX 470 is no exception Its 47-liter, overhead-cam V8 engine and smoothly responsive five-speed automatic transmission provide ample power and performance in any highway situation Now, the price for hauling around all this hardware is mileage that registers at only 15 miles a gallon in the city and just 19 mpg on the highway, but even those numbers are fairly respectable for a vehicle that offers all of this

The standard, full-time four-wheel drive features electronic traction control and a locking torquesensing center differential, automatically dispatching torque to the tires with the best grip A feature called Downhill Assist Control helps GX 470 negotiate slippery inclines, which is great feature that I have employed to significant effect in earlier drives with GX 470 during winter Another innovation called Vehicle Stability Control helps steady GX 470 on slippery turns

Outside, GX 470 doesn't offer much. It is decidedly large and rather box-like, all the better to squeeze in the enjoyment that it offers inside And without the fastback sort of look that its smaller cousin, RX 330, offers, GX 470's styling magnifies the differences between it and the vehicle just below it in Lexus's lineup Vertically oriented tail

lamp and other design cues contribute to the impression (echoing the reality) that GX 470 is a tall and capacious vehicle

Yet GX 470 still looks clean and contemporary, including nicely integrated body colored bumpers and massive headlamps The 17-inch alloy wheels add to GX 470's overall stance of big capabilities Options are few in GX 470, reflecting the Toyota philosophy that has helped it and Lexus gain such big and growing shares of the North American marketplace There's an available third-row seat with rear air conditioning for about \$2,000, a navigation system with Mark Levinson stereo system for about \$3,000, a rear-seat entertainment system with two headphones for more than \$1,500, a tow-hitch receiver for \$50, and a rear spoiler for \$550 Bluetooth also is available, allowing the driver to link wirelessly to his or her cellular telephone for hands-free communication inside the vehicle

But what GX 470 gives you before the options is substantial, including standard safety features such as front airbags, side-impact air bags for the front seats and side-curtain airbags For \$56,458 as a suggested retail price, the GX 470 version I drove demands a pretty penny But pound for pound within its segment, it couldn't be

'Z' sees My Morning Jacket evolving

If you like Southern rock bands that evolve music that doesn't stink

So you know that guy in high school who was mildly hippy-ish, really good at English and was the dictionary picture for "laid back?" This guy, he seemed to be admired for some future bank of cool—as though one day his love of Neil Young or Pink Floyd would be cashed in, proving in the long-run to be a better investment than Riot Grirl or whatever else your suburban high school friends were listening

I've always suspected My Morning Jacket's lead singer Jim James was that guy in high school * On its latest, Z, I'm even more convinced that I'm right (Please read the disclaimer again) The record was released on ATO Records, Dave Matthews label — hello, mildly hip pie-ish Its solid lyrics follow the MMJ tradition of touching the right chord with out being overwrought — hello, good at English And I have no idea how to tell you how this album sounds without a pot reference — and we're back to mildly hippie-ish

The stellar opening track, Wordless Chorus, starts with a pulsing beat, sounding like it was pulled from a sci-fi movie, and soon jams its way into a warm stream of backing chorus and rooty flair That description came out a lot grosser than I thought it would Regardless, Wordless Chorus is solid songwriting and its the perfect example of MMJs evolving sound Sure, the band lost two members before recording this album — undeniably this is a record with different influences - but I also get the sense that MMJ no longer wanted to be filed in the Americana" box James' is now crafting pop songs (What a Wonderful Man), albeit the kind of pop songs Nick Cave writes as opposed to, say, three-chordin -it bands like Green Day (though Gideon basically sounds like a Coldplay song)

They haven't totally walked away from their sound, though *Dondante* and *Lay Low* sound more classically like MMJ—twisty and guitar solo-y and spattered with James child like wail

Lay Low is great by the way, one of the strongest tracks on the album — it's a lot like if Elton John (country-rock, not the recycled Candles for Diana) and a straight Southern man (who maybe thinks The Allman Brothers (slightly hippie-ish) were the greatest thing ever) had a bastard song child Ooo, a weak critics cliche to a 'bastard child' littered with

parenthesis I'm back! Did you miss

Finally, I just have to mention that M Ward and Andrew Bird play on this album — two extremely under-played and under-adulated songwriters in their own right Now I'm done
My Morning Jacket plays Tuesday at St Andrew's in Detroit Kathleen Edwards opens

label with Cripple Crow Banhart sings

made him into the leader of 'Freak Folk,"
a media-generated moniker to describe a
group of California artists playing a type
of music the media feels it needs to label
And we all know how well musicians
accept a genre label Not well Not well at
all

Cripple Crow sees Banhart bringing his warbly falsetto to a wider mix of songs some plugged in (Long Haired Child), some straight from a hootenanny workbook (Some People Ride the Wave), some reflective of Nick Drakes acoustic finger plucking (Hey Mama Wolf, Koreandogwood), some employing a sitar (Lazy Butterfly), and some very, um, Spanish-y (Santa Maria Da Ferra, Quedate Luna) Do these things scare you? They shouldn't Banhart makes beautiful, stripped away music Except on Cripple Crow, he is suddenly more polished There are less wild yelps (though some he does let a few fly) Less recorded through-a cassette-recorder sitting-on-a floor moments Less rushed whisperedcatching-of the-breath pre-song with-acrackled-string 1 2-3-4s What results is an album that despite its wide array of sounds seems to gel better than previous records And that seems aimed right at a wider audience

Which brings us to a discussion of music production that does and doesn t have to do with Mr Banhart Is anyone else getting sort of sick of musicians who take their record money and hire slicker producers or buy clearer sounding equipment? These are not evolved" moments The Shins sounded way better as Kinks knock offs on *Oh Inverted World*, and even better before that as Flake Music, than anything *The OC* has devoured in the name of pop culture reference Before

Seth Cohen, they were a shambly band who sounded as if at any moment the whole thing would fall apart. And yet didn't. This is far more interesting than the 'unfull' songs fancy equipment can produce. When you go too far down this path, you end up as Death Cab for Cutie (Listen to pre-OC Death Cab, you'll see what I mean)

I believe the reason behind this is simple It takes a lot more work to make something brilliant from no money Go ahead and accuse me of elitism here (because I fully realize stating this opens up the Pandoras Box of "selling out/high brow/low brow/the fact that hipsters exist") - but when it boils down to it, I would much rather hear the actual sound of plucked strings and banging keys than some idealistic version them Which brings us back to Banhart I fear that the production on Cripple Crow sees him starting down this path of slicker, more palatable music And I wonder if that move is in direct relation to shirking that pesky critic's label

Of course, I'm probably worried for no reason because anyone who has the butt to record *Luttle Boys*, a song on *Cripple Crow* written from a first-person perspective after Banhart saw a documentary about NAMBLA, is probably not that concerned with what people think of

Imagine what it would sound like if a Detroit garage rock band moved** to New York, specifically Wilhamsburg, while harboring an obsession for Supergrass (or maybe Sloan) and those band's obsession for hand claps Got that in your head? OK, good That is exactly what The High Strung's Moxie Bravo sounds like And now the question must be asked Is that a good thing?

Here are some facts to help you decide

- Approximately 46 bands are formed each and every hour in the United States with the exact same sound I'm not even counting England here, people ***
- Off the top of my head, I can think of at least five still-in-Detroit bands that do this formula much better
- I probably don't own any of their albums either
 - I like Sloan
 - Sloan is much better
- Why does everyone seem to be a grainy photocopy of someone else?

U2's early years: were you there?

U2's early years were you there?

There's two kinds of U2 fans those from the pre- and post-The Joshua Tree days

The Joshua Tree, released in 1987, is the album that pushed U2 into mainstream superstar-

Most don't remember the early days of U2 — the days of Boy (1980) and October (1981)

I feel lucky that U2 grabbed my attention the first time I heard I Will Follow in 1980 I grew more intrigued in 1981 when Bono stomped his bootclad feet to Sunday Bloody Sunday

The first time I ever stood in line overnight for concert tickets (before the Net made ticket-purchasing easy) was for U2 in 1981 It was outside the then-Hudson's store at Oakland Mall — n sub-zero degrees — for the second leg of the *October* tour at the Royal Oak Music Theatre Eight hours with a handful of other punks We'd get great seats, my sister and I told ourselves, but we didn't realize that at scores of other ticket outlets throughout metro Detroit, handfuls of other fans were thinking the same thing

The show sold out in about 20 minutes, right when it was our turn at the ticket counter It scarred my ticket-purchasing confidence for the rest of my life For the first Lollapalooza, I waited overnight with a total of six other people to avoid

Cameron Crowe has made his name with movies that strike just the right tone - a bittersweet balance that's funny and melancholy, romantic and observant Its one that his idol, Billy Wilder, perfected decades ago, and one that s hard to achieve Which is what makes Crowe's latest film so curious, and such a disappointment In telling the story of a young man (Orlando Bloom) who returns to his small-town Kentucky roots after his father's death, it's as if Crowe wanted to make several different movies but couldn't decide between them, so he just went ahead and made them all, then trammed for time Characters say and do things that real people don't say and do, and they frequently come up with poignant turns of phrase that are so perfectly timed, they clang self-consciously - especially Kirsten Dunst as the perky flight attendant with whom Bloom's character strikes up an unexpected romance (They do have some lovely moments together, though) Susan Sarandon, Alec Baldwin and Jessica Biel co-star PG-13 for language and some sexual references 123 min Two stars out of four





We were chosen to have this exhibit, Mansour said of Art Leaders Gallery, which also is hosting two receptions, Oct 21 and Oct 22, to open the exhibit Each reception features a lecture by Christine Argillet, the daughter of the late Pierre Argillet, an art collector and notable Dali publisher

As a result of her father's personal and professional relationship with Dali, Christine spent a tremendous amount of time around the artist. In fact, she lived across the street from Dali's villa in Spain each and every summer

Christine grew up with Dali when she was in her teens,' Mansour said, adding her lecture is sure to offer personal insight into how the artist lived and worked

Pierre Argillet also served as an agent for Dali and many other prominent 20th century artists said Mansour

- Melting watches The relativity of time or alternatively sexual impotence
- Swarming ants A favorite Dali motif that represents both sexual desire as well as death and decay

- Daddy longlegs A reference to a French legend that said the sighting of a daddy lon glegs in the evening hours is a good omen a portent of good luck
- Drawers Represent human memories
 Often Dali depicted drawers within body
 parts
- Vessels Symbolize femininity

Pierre and Dali began their association in the 1930s when Dali was engaged in creating works that ultimately became part of the Surrealist movement

Pierre commissioned Dali to illustrate numerous works, including a series depicting Greek mythology and another entitled *Hippies*

Both series are part of the "The Pierre Argillet Collection that's being displayed at Art Leaders Gallery In all, the collection features more than 200 etchings created by Dali between the late 1950s and early 1970s Of these works, more than 95 are hand-colored Also on display is a collection of 50 engravings by Dali that were published by Pierre Argillet and signed by the artist

Although many of the works seem quiet and mild-mannered relative to Dali's well-known and more absurd pieces, signature characteristics of the Surrealist style appear on closer inspection, said Mansour


'Truth Lies' in gritty setting
